Rubbish Landfill To Open Tuesday For Public Use

The newly completed Tishomingo County rubbish landfill will open Tuesday, October 11, at 8:00 a.m.

The landfill is located just off Hwy. 25 South, to County Road 147, then turn on County Road 148 — near the old landfill site. Regular landfill hours will be from 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday and from 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. on Saturday.

The landfill can be used for the disposal of non-household garbage such as limbs, brush, contractor materials, concrete blocks and related items.

"Toxic materials, chemicals, batteries, tires, or household garbage will not be taken at the new rubbish landfill," Tishomingo County Board of Supervisor's President Ricky Cummings said.

There will be no charge for county residents who use the rubbish landfill for their personal dumping; however, businesses, contractors and industries will be charged \$4.00 per compacted yard or \$2.00 for loose yardage, Cummings explained.

This rubbish landfill was built in conjunction with new state and federal laws. It was developed on a 20-acre tract of land within the 150 acres purchased by the county for landfill development. Cummings stated that the purchase of the 150 acres should take care of the county's landfill needs for many years to come.

One advantage of the rubbish landfill will be the reduction of cost to businesses and industries who were having to place all their debris at the transfer station. There the cost had been \$38.00 per ton, Cummings verified. "These new rates at the rubbish landfill are considerably lower," he said.

The old landfill site will continue to be used as a transfer station for household garbage.

Those in attendance will have the opportunity to submit their written questions to the panel. The panel will be made up of a cross section of our community.

The Tishomingo Chamber of Commerce does not officially endorse either candidate for office. They are sponsoring the debate as a public service to enable the citizens of Tishomingo County to engage in informal participation in democratic electoral process.

The Tishomingo Chamber cordially invites and encourages the public to attend.

are isolated in the eight gambling counties. Statewide, two-thirds of all new jobs are attributed to gambling, he said.

This boom economy has brought in \$240 million more than last year, and Mississippi must be prepared in at least two ways when that bubble bursts, he said.

"First, let's save part of this windfall. Where it makes sense, let's pay cash for those one-time needs and not burden ourselves with payments for the next 20 years.

"Secondly, let's use this windfall to build for our future by putting in place the economic infrastructure that attracts the higher paying jobs; by dramatically improving our schools from the elementary level through college; and by making people safe in their homes."

He contrasted "talkers" and "doers" as the opponents in 1995 elections.

"The talkers will tell us things are just fine in Mississippi. They will tell us what we want to hear. They have a bumper-sticker mentality and bumper-sticker solutions. If you look at their record, you will see one thing -- it was all talk," Molpus said.

The Doers will offer bold ideas.

On education, they know vibrant public schools are the path to our future.

On crime and public safety, Doers know that building jail cells is only half the answer. The Doers will offer solutions to prevent crime.

Molpus cited examples in Tupelo and Hattiesburg of ideas working to prevent teen pregnancies, dropouts, and helping at-

risk children from becoming juvenile offenders or teen mothers.

"If Mississippi will use this boom money wisely, we can keep jail cell costs from swallowing our budget. We can stop a lot of the fear that many live with every day and every long night," he said.

On the subject of jobs, the difference between the Talkers and Doers is dramatic.

"The Talkers still think we can build our future on low wages and tax giveaways. The Doers know we build high-paying jobs on a well-educated, well-trained work force," Molpus noted.

"If in 1995 you send the Doers to the Capitol -- men and women of decency and good hearts -- we will rekindle the better nature of Mississippi. If we are faithful to our vision, our children and grandchildren will look back on our lives and they will know we used our talents, we saved the future...and they will say to us: 'Well done...well done.'"

HEALTHIER LUNCHES ARE IN THE BAG

The brown bag lunch. A sandwich. It seems you can't have one without the other. Unfortunately, many sandwiches use high-calorie, high-fat luncheon meats and spreads. But it's easy to have a sandwich without sacrificing good nutrition. These ideas for healthful sandwiches are offered:

*Lowfat cheese and a tomato slice on a toasted whole wheat English muffin.

*Pita bread and favorite raw vegetables topped with a lowfat dressing. Try shredded cabbage, sliced tomato, diced peppers, thinly cut cucumbers and shredded carrots.

*Fat-free dressings to dress up tuna, chicken or turkey salad. Try fat-free versions of ranch, creamy Italian or thousand island.

*Chutney or salsa combined with a fat-free mayonnaise, cream cheese or sour cream as a tasty spread for bread or topping for lowfat meats.

*Lowfat cottage cheese mixed with applesauce or with chopped

and dried fruits, such as apricots, peaches or pineapple. Carry in a container to enjoy on cinnamon or oatmeal bread.

*A bagel topped with herb-flavored cream cheese. Accent with crisp salad greens, shredded carrot, sliced cucumber and alfalfa sprouts.

*Lean cooked pork, chopped and mixed with celery, onions and plain lowfat yogurt. Tuck in a French roll with a little lettuce and tomato.

ASCS Farm News

The Community ASC Committee election for Local Administrative Area (LAA)2, which consists of Midway, North Tishomingo, and Paden communities, will be held this year on December 5, 1994.

Eligible voters have the right to nominate candidates(s) of their choice by petition. Blank petitions (ASCS-667-2) may be obtained at the County ASCS Office. Each petition submitted must be:

1. Limited to one (1) nominee.

2. Signed by at least (3) eligible voters in the community.

3. Signed by the nominee.

4. Postmarked or delivered to the County ASCS Office no later than October 31, 1994.

Persons nominated should be currently engaged in the operation of a farm or ranch and be well qualified for committee work. A farmer is eligible to be a community committee member if the farmer lives in the community in which that individual is eligible to vote.

The duties of the community committee members include:

1. Serving as delegates to the LAA convention to elect a County ASCS Committee member and two alternates and the County Convention, as applicable, to select the Chair and Vice Chairpersons of the County ASC Committee for the next year.

ANTIFREEZE CAN KILL

As cold weather approaches, antifreeze is found around more and more homes. This substance can be fatal to pets and children if accidentally ingested. Even a small amount can kill or cause serious illness.

The problem is that ethylene glycol, the main ingredient of antifreeze, smells and tastes sweet, so animals and even small children may drink it.

If you drain the old antifreeze out of your car or truck, you should not leave it sitting open for even a few minutes. Any antifreeze that has spilled on the driveway or street should be thoroughly washed away, leaving no puddle for children or pets to get into.

All antifreeze should be stored well out of the reach of children and pets.

Signs of antifreeze intoxication may develop within one hour after ingestion. The animal becomes depressed, reluctant to move and weak. It may show signs of vomiting, loss of appetite, excitement and convulsions. Insoluble crystals form in the tubules of the kidneys, causing kidney failure with resulting uremia and death.

Successful treatment for poisoning of this type is difficult. It depends on early diagnosis so that treatment can begin at once. If you suspect that your pet has ingested some antifreeze, even a small amount, contact your veterinarian immediately.

Letter To The Editor

Dear Editor,

I was born and raised in Tishomingo County and have raised my children in this county. My parents and grandparents were also born here, lived here and died here. Obviously, my roots run deep and I care about any situation which I believe would negatively impact Tishomingo County. Therefore, I would like to express my thoughts and feelings to the people of Tishomingo County regarding an issue which currently confronts us.

I am very concerned about the potential development called "River Trace", which the elected officials of our county seem determined to push down our throats. This development project has already been voted on by the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors, and the Tishomingo County Economic Development Foundation, the Lions Club, and the Iuka Chamber of Commerce have wholeheartedly endorsed it. River Trace calls for an influx of millions of dollars into Tishomingo County, north of Iuka, to build a convention center, two golf courses, a marina, hotel, condominiums, etc.

The investors behind this project have asked the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to authorize this project by designating the land around J.P. Coleman State Park as a "resort" area. This means that alcohol will be served in the "resort area" without any input or vote from the citizens in Tishomingo County. It concerns

me that our elected officials would attempt to approve this proposal without any kind of public meeting to gather opinions from the residents of the county.

The most disturbing aspect of this project to me is that the investors of this project can bring the development project to the county without the sale of alcohol. Therefore, I am standing up in opposition to the River Trace project as long as it calls for the sale of alcohol, and encourage other Christians to do the same. We are called to be salt and light to the world, and I believe we have been silent too long. It is time for Christians to come out and let their voices be heard. Paul says in Ephesians 5:8-13 (NIV):

For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light (for the fruit of the light consists in all goodness, righteousness and truth) and find out what pleases the Lord. Have nothing to do with the fruitless deeds of darkness, but rather expose them. For it is shameful even to mention what the disobedient do in secret. But everything exposed by the light becomes visible, for it is light that makes everything visible. This is why it is said:

'Wake up, O sleeper, rise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you.'

America is under attack from all sides, and this is true even in Tishomingo County. This is proven by the ever-increasing rates of abortion, drug abuse, teenage pregnancy, pornography, alcohol abuse, etc. If River Trace is allowed to build in Tishomingo

County, here are a few statistics gathered from the National Center for Statistics and Analysis that the people of this county look forward to:

1. 25,000 people are killed each year in alcohol-related accidents.

2. 500 people are killed each week in alcohol-related accidents.

3. One American life is lost every 20 minutes in alcohol-related auto crashes.

4. It is estimated that one of every two Americans will be involved in an alcohol-related accident in their lifetime.

5. Alcohol-related crashes are the leading cause of death of Americans between 16 and 24 years old.

6. Of every 200-2,000 drunk drivers on the road, only one is arrested.

7. According to a recent Allstate Insurance Company study, drunk drivers are estimated to cost American taxpayers \$21-24 billion dollars each year.

It should be obvious from these statistics that alcohol is a liability, not an asset, to our county.

I encourage each citizen who is concerned about this project to let their concerns be heard, to encourage the churches in our county to do the same. It is the destined purpose of the church to engage in battle with the spiritual forces of darkness. However, before the church goes to war, she must learn to walk and before she walks, she must decide where she stands. Where do you stand?

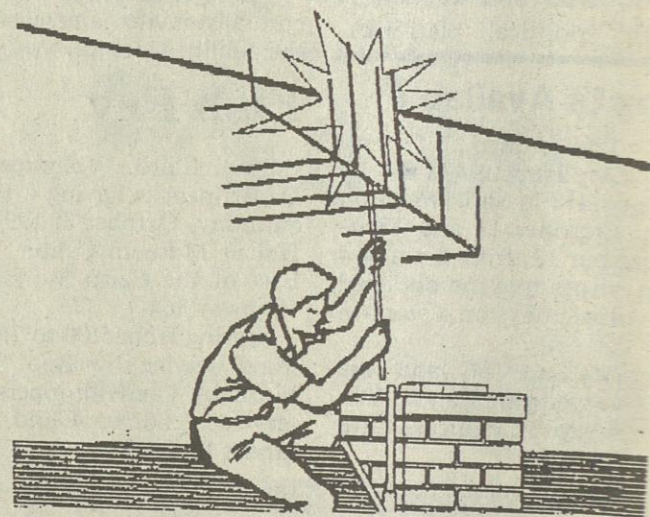
SAFETY FIRST

DANGEROUS TOYS

There will be over 140,000 toy-related injuries in the U.S. this year and 22 percent of them will be eye injuries. This injury rate increases to ten times the usual frequency during Christmas.

A hand launched helicopter that could lacerate a child's face and eyes when sent into the air, a toy rifle that shoots hard pellets over 40 feet and a makeup kit for little girls that contain real eye shadow and applicator are typical of such dangerous-to-the eye toys available in stores.

When a child tries to imitate the picture on the box, they will often use another child as a target. Many toys that are claimed to be "safe" or non-toxic most often apply to the skin or digestive system but not the eyes. The eye is a very sensitive organ. A light blow to that would not hurt any other part of the body could cause serious damage to a child's eye. Also, a toy meant to be safe in the hands of an 8-year-old can often be lethal in the hands of a 4-year-old.

The Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks has provided the following information on Mississippi Hunting Season.

1994-95 Miss. Deer Season
From Oct. 1 - Nov. 18, Archery season for either sex deer is open. Nov. 19 - Dec. 1 is the season opens for guns with dogs on bucks only.

Primitive weapons will be permitted for either sex deer on Dec. 2 - Dec. 15. If you enjoy still hunting, Dec. - 16-23 is gun without dogs season for either sex deer (on Private land only).

Statewide "Doe Day" will be Dec. 17. Either sex may be hunted on this day.

Bucks only can be hunted on Dec. 24 - Jan. 18 during gun with dogs season. Archery season opens again (either sex) Jan. 19-31.

1994-95 Dove Season
The following dates are open for dove season in Tishomingo and other surrounding Mississippi counties: Oct. 15 - Nov. 13 and Dec. 26 - Jan. 1. Bag limit is 15 per day and shooting hours are 1/2 hour before sunrise until sunset. Shotguns must be plugged and incapable of holding more than three shells.

Rabbit - Oct. 15 - Feb. 28;
Rabbit - Oct. 15 - Feb. 28;
Squirrel - Oct. 1 - Jan. 31;

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMAN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, TO ISSUE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF SAID MUNICIPALITY IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000) TO RAISE MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING AND EQUIPPING AN ADDITION TO THE PUBLIC LIBRARY, REPAIRING AND IMPROVING THE PUBLIC LIBRARY, AND PURCHASING EQUIPMENT AND BOOKS THEREFOR, AND DIRECTING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF SUCH INTENTION.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka, Mississippi (the "Governing Body"), acting for and on behalf of the City of Iuka, Mississippi (the "Municipality") hereby finds, determines, and judges and declares as follows:

1. It is necessary and in the public interest to issue general obligation bonds of the Municipality in the maximum principal amount of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) to raise money for the purpose of constructing and equipping an addition to the public library, repairing and improving the public library, and purchasing equipment and books therefor.

2. The assessed value of all taxable property within the Municipality, according to the last completed assessment for taxation, is Eight Million Five Hundred Twenty Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$8,042,500); the Municipality's outstanding bonded indebtedness subject to the fifteen percent (15%) debt limit prescribed by Section 21-33-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), and outstanding bonded floating indebtedness subject to the twenty percent (20%) debt limit prescribed by Section 21-33-303, Mississippi Code of 1972 (which amount includes the sum set forth above subject to the 15% debt limit), in the amount of One Million Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$1,605,000); issuance of the bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued, when added to the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the Municipality, will not result in bonded indebtedness, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid fifteen percent (15%) debt limit, of more than fifteen percent (15%) of the assessed value of taxable property within the Municipality, and will not result in indebtedness, both bonded and floating, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid twenty percent (20%) debt limit, in excess of twenty percent (20%) of the assessed value of taxable property within the Municipality and will not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation upon indebtedness which may be incurred by the Municipality.

3. The Municipality reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures for the Authorized Purpose prior to the issuance of the Bonds (as such term is hereinafter defined), and that it should declare its official intent to reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of the Bonds upon the issuance thereof.

4. The Municipality is authorized by Sections 21-33-301 through 21-33-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to issue the Bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued for the purpose hereinafter set forth, for which purpose there are no other available funds on hand.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Governing Body hereby declares its intention to issue general obligation bonds of the Municipality in the maximum principal amount of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) (the "Bonds") to raise money for the purpose of constructing and equipping an addition to the public library, repairing and improving the public library, and purchasing equipment and books therefor (the "Authorized Purpose"). Pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations (the "Reimbursement Regulations"), the Governing Body hereby declares its official intent to reimburse expenditures made for the Authorized Purpose prior to the issuance of the Bonds with proceeds of the Bonds to the extent permitted by the Reimbursement Regulations. The Bonds will be general obligation of the Municipality payable as to principal and interest out of and secured by an irrevocable pledge of the avails of a tax to be levied annually upon the taxable property within the geographical limits of the Municipality, which tax, together with any other moneys available for such purpose, shall be sufficient to provide for the payment of the principal of and the interest on the Bonds according to the terms thereof.

SECTION 2. The Governing Body proposes to direct the issuance of Bonds in the amount, for the purpose and secured as aforesaid at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at its regular meeting place in the City of Iuka, Mississippi, at 10 o'clock A.M. on October 14, 1994, or at a meeting held subsequent thereto. If ten percent (10%) of the qualified electors of the Municipality, or fifteen hundred (1,500), whichever is the less, shall file a written protest with the Clerk of the Municipality against the issuance of such Bonds on or before the aforesaid date and hour, then the Bonds shall not be issued unless authorized at an election on the question of the issuance of such Bonds to be called and held as provided by law. No protest be filed, then such Bonds may be issued without an election on the question of the issuance thereof at any time within a period of two years after the date above specified.

SECTION 3. This resolution shall be published once a week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in and having a general circulation in the Municipality, qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972. The first publication of this resolution shall be made not less than two (2) days prior to the date fixed herein for the issuance of the Bonds and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date.

SECTION 4. The Clerk of the Municipality is hereby directed to prepare from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of publication of this resolution and have the same before this Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 2 hereof.

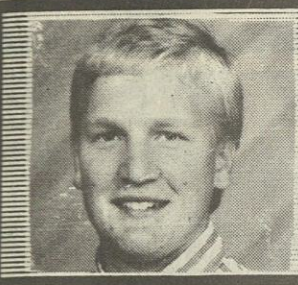
Tishomingo County High School 1994-95 DECA Officers
