## Animal Control Ordinance Adopted By City

### Licensing Of All Animals To Be Required

The Iuka Mayor and Board of Aldermen voted unanimously during the October 4 City Board meeting to adopt an ordinance providing for the care, control and vaccination of all animals within the city.

According to a spokesman for the Board, the exact time that the ordinance will go into effect has not yet been decided. Also, several of the details concerning the formation of a animal control department and hiring of an animal control officer is still in the works, but should be discussed at the November City Board meeting.

Among the items listed in the ordinance is the requirement of all animals over three months of age, within the city limits, to possess a license. The license must include the name and address of the applicant, a description of the animal and a rabies certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian. After the license is accepted by a licensing authority, an identification tag will be issued. This tag must then be worn at all times, the law states.

"An animal shall not be allowed to run at large," section 3 of the ordinance states. If an animal is found to be running at large, it will be subject to impoundment.

Another item calls for the secure confinement of vicious dogs or animals in a child-proof, locked pen or structure. It goes on to say that vicious animals or dogs should not be taken off the owner's premises unless leashed or muzzled and a "Beware of Dog" sign must be posted on the owner's property.

If you hit an animal while driving, the ordinance states that you should report it at once "to the Animal Control Department or to the Iuka Police Department, providing certain information to the authorities."

In section 15 of the ordinance, it says that "any unrestrained animal constituting a public nuisance may be impounded by the Animal Control Department or by police officers."

Wording of the Document in Section 25 states that this ordinance will take effect 30 days from the date of its passage-which was October 4, 1994.

Violators of any part of the ordinance will be guilty of a misdemeanor and may be punished by a fine of up to \$1,000 and up to 90 days in jail according to section 19 of the ordinance.

## Tishomingo Chamber of Commerce Receives Grant

The Tishomingo Chamber of Commerce recently received a grant in the amount of \$789.50 from the Mississippi Department of Economic and Community Development Tourism Division. The grant is to be matched by funds from the Tishomingo County Tourism Council a division of the Tishomingo County Development Foundation. The grant will be used to publish a Color Tour brochure to be used to bring tourists into the county during the peak of fall leaf color. The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors have purchased 50 signs to mark the route of the color tours. The brochures are being printed and should be available soon. "We are very excited about the new brochures and are also developing a driving audio cassette for driving tours in the county," stated Mary Mason, Director of the Tourism. Anne Taylor, President of the Tishomingo Chamber of Commerce said, "We hope to bring people into the entire length of the county through the several tours that will

be offered."

Once brochures are printed, they will be placed in city halls, Chamber of Commerce offices, the TCDF, visitor centers, local businesses, and libraries.

### Home Economics Tips

BACK TO HEALTHFUL EATING

Indulgent foods can take a toll on an otherwise healthful diet. To get back to a healthful eating habit, Barbara Guinn, Extension Home Economist, offers these suggestions:

\*Be sure to eat breakfast. It supplies energy you need to get through the morning. Some research has linked eating breakfast to a more positive attitude.

\*Eat three meals a day that include a variety of foods, such as fruits, vegetables, lean meats, lowfat dairy products and whole grains. Eating a wide variety of foods helps ensure a well-

balanced diet.

\*Supplement meals, if you like, with nutritious snacks, such as bananas, raw vegetables, non-fat yogurt and other favorite treats that provide important nutrients.

\*Keep staple foods on hand that will help you quickly make healthful meals. Stock up on pasta and rice, frozen vegetables, spaghetti sauce, seasonings, tuna packed in water, dried and frozen fruit and cereal.

\*Shop for groceries when you're not hungry. Have a healthful snack first to reduce unneeded purchases.

\*Sip flavored water while you prepare a meal to discourage nibbling and to help you feel temporarily satisfied.

\*When preparing meals, double the batch and freeze half

to reheat later in the week. This makes it easy to serve a nutritious meal on those days when you don't have time to cook.

\*Eat slowly. Remember, it takes time for the food you've eaten to satisfy your appetite.

Guinn also encourages everyone to approach meals as a pleasurable activity. Eat consciously and enjoy each bite to its fullest, she says.

#### LOW VISION AIDS

Low vision optical aids can improve vision for people with eye diseases that cannot be cured. In such cases, reduced vision can only be enhanced by mechanical means. Many different types of magnifying devices are available. Spectacles, hand or stand magnifiers, telescopes, closed circuit television for viewing objects are some of the available resources. Bright illumination and special lamp properly directed for reading and close work are often beneficial. Books, newspapers, and other items available in large print can further help. Aids are either prescribed by your eye doctor or by referral to a low vision specialist or center.

Fortunately, visual aids are available to assist many patients in leading comfortable and relatively normal lives. With these devices and proper motivation, people with visual loss can often read, do modified close-up work and continue to take care of themselves. Patients with reduced vision can be helped.

appointment with Dr. Hafiz at his office in the Medical Arts Building.

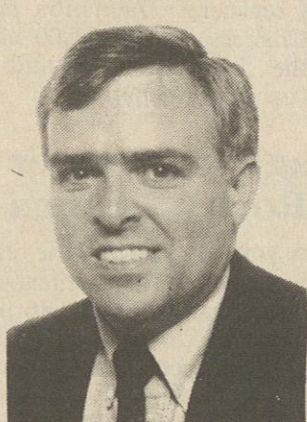

- ☐ Yearly checkup by veterinarian (includes checking teeth)

- ☐ Vaccination for FIP (feline infectious peritonitis) if at risk (ask your vet)
- ☐ Daily dental home care - brush teeth or other measures to keep teeth and gums healthy
- ☐ Have teeth cleaned when needed to control gum disease (checked at yearly physical exam)
- ☐ Daily attention and playtime
- ☐ Keep haircoat brushed and clean
- ☐ Feed a high quality diet with limited treats or "people" food
- ☐ Good flea and tick control.

Casey James scored the first touchdown on a pass from Aaron Foster. Scott Dilworth scored the second touchdown.

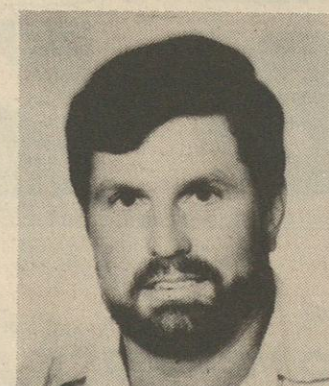
Lafayette usually had in fresh

### Term Limits Initiative To Be Voted On In 1995

The Secretary of State's Office today informed supporters of a term-limits initiative that they have gathered enough signatures for the proposal to appear on the November 1995 ballot.

According to the ballot summary, the term-limit amendment would do the following:

--Limit all state, county and municipal elected officials to 2 terms in succession

--Limit circuit, chancery, and county court judges to 3 terms

--Limit Mississippi's U.S. Representatives to 3 terms

--Limit Mississippi's U.S. Senators to 2 terms

The Secretary of State's Office will file the petitions and present the issue to the 1995 Legislature, where 3 things could happen:

1. The Legislature approves it. The issues would go on the Nov. 7, 1995, ballot to be considered by the voters, as any other constitutional amendment.

2. The Legislature declines approval. The issues still would go on the Nov. 7 ballot.

3. The Legislature passes its own version. The original issue and the legislative version would both appear on the ballot to be voted on, or to be rejected by the voters. Also, an initiative issues must receive a "super-majority" to gain approval -- in other words, to be ratified into the Constitution an initiative issue must receive a majority of the votes on the issue, and that number must be at least 40% of those persons voting in the entire election.

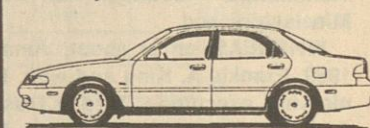

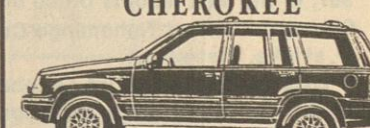

## LEGAL NOTICE

### AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CARE, CONTROL AND VACCINATION OF ALL ANIMALS WITHIN THE IUKA CORPORATE LIMITS

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka, Mississippi approved, passed and adopted an Ordinance on October 4, 1994 providing for the care, control and vaccination of all animals within the Corporate Limits. The substance of this Ordinance is being published herein in lieu of the full text of the Ordinance pursuant to Mississippi Code Annotated §21-17-19. Anyone desiring to see a copy of the full text of the Ordinance may view same at the Iuka City Hall, at the Iuka Public Library, and in addition thereto, a copy of this notice has been posted on the bulletin board at the Tishomingo County Courthouse. The substance of the public measure is stated as follows by sections:

SECTION 1. Section 1 defines all words, terms and phrases used in the Ordinance, including, but not limited to "animal", "animal control department", "animal control officer", "feral animal", "impoundment", "owner", "public nuisance", "serious injury", "severe injury", "vicious animal", "vicious dog", and "wild animal".

SECTION 2. This section requires any person having an animal over three months of age to obtain a license. Licensing is exempt for seeing-eye dogs, hearing dogs, governmental police dogs, and other dogs designed to help the handicapped. All license shall include the name and address of the applicant, a description of the animal or animals, and a rabies certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian. Upon acceptance of the licensing application, the licensing authority will issue an identification tag for the

animal. All animals shall wear their identification tags at all times. The licensing authority may revoke an animal license for violations of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. An animal shall not be allowed to run at large. Any animals running at large are subject to impoundment by the Animal Control Department.

SECTION 4. It shall be unlawful for anyone to expose any animal to any poison substance of any nature.

SECTION 5. It shall be unlawful for any animal to be left unattended inside a motor vehicle when such action is potentially harmful to the animal.

SECTION 6. It shall be unlawful for a person to beat or treat cruelly any animal or cause an animal to fight for sport. The Animal Control Department has the authority to take an abused animal into protective custody.

SECTION 7. Any person who strikes an animal with a vehicle shall at once report same to the Animal Control Department or the Iuka Police Department, providing certain information to the authorities.

SECTION 8. No one shall be allowed to keep any wild animal on display or for exhibition purposes unless they are a licensed zoological park or circus.

SECTION 9. Each animal owner is responsible for the control and proper care of his animals. It shall be unlawful for any animal to be kept in an unclean, filthy or unsanitary condition. Owners shall keep animals in pens large enough to provide freedom of movement for the animal and shall provide sufficient food and water, shelter and protection from the weather for the animal. This section provides a procedure whereby the Animal Control Department determines that an animal is creating a public nuisance. It provides for fines of an owner violating this section of the Ordinance.

SECTION 10. Every animal owner shall have any animal three months of age or older vaccinated for rabies. Each animal shall wear a metal tag indicating the serial number of the vaccination and the year in which the animal was vaccinated. Failure of an owner to comply with this section is a misdemeanor and this section provides for fines for such violation.

SECTION 11. Owners of vicious dogs or animals are required to securely confine those animals in a childproof, locked pen or structure. Any vicious animal or dog shall not be allowed to go off the premises of the owner unless it is leashed or muzzled. Anyone keeping a vicious animal within the City Limits must post a "Beware of Dog" sign of certain dimensions on their property. Any owner of an animal or dog which has attacked someone shall be required to show proof of liability insurance to the Animal Control Department. The Animal Control Department shall be allowed to enter the premises of anyone owning a vicious animal or dog and if the owner refuses, the owner shall be subject to an appearance before the Municipal Court of the City of Iuka. This section provides penalties for persons violating same.

SECTION 12. This section allows the Animal Control Department to inspect any pet store or kennel for sanitary and humane conditions.

SECTION 13. This section prohibits anyone from allowing a wild animal to engage in unnatural behavior, such as wrestling, or displaying such wild animal in a manner where it is physically or mentally abused, or where it is controlled by chemical, mechanical, electrical, or manual devices that will cause it physical injury.

SECTION 14. Any animal determined to be a vicious animal or a feral or vicious dog may be destroyed by the Animal Control Department under certain guidelines. Any animal or dog that aggressively attacks or causes severe injury or death to any human or other domestic animal can be immediately confiscated by the Animal Control Department and placed in quarantine. Such animal may be humanely euthanized under certain conditions.

SECTION 15. Any unrestrained animal constituting a public nuisance may be impounded by the Animal Control Department or by police officers. The animal shall be kept for five days unless claimed by the owner. If the owner claims the animal within five days, there shall be a fee paid to the City of Iuka for its expense. Any animal not claimed can be put up for adoption if the adopting party pays the necessary fees to the City of Iuka and the local veterinarian. Anyone violating this section may be proceeded against pursuant to this Ordinance.

SECTION 16. Any livestock may be captured and impounded by the Animal Control Department and the owner notified, with the right to reclaim the livestock, for a fee, within a five day period. If no owner claims such livestock, the City of Iuka can sell the livestock at a public auction.

SECTION 17. Any owner or anyone having an animal that has been impounded is entitled to a hearing before the Municipal Court within ten days following the impoundment, upon the filing of a written petition requesting the hearing. The Municipal Judge may determine, at the hearing, what shall happen with the animal.

SECTION 18. The Animal Control Department has the authority to immediately destroy any animal running at large who is suffering from rabies or is reasonable believed to be suffering from rabies.

SECTION 19. Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance where there is not a specific penalty is guilty of a misdemeanor and may be punished by a fine not to exceed \$1,000 and jail time not to exceed 90 days or by both such fine and jail time.

SECTION 20. The enforcement of this Ordinance shall be through the Animal Control Department and the Iuka Police Department. Violators may be arrested or issued written citations to appear at a specific time in Municipal Court.

SECTION 21. The Mayor and Board of Aldermen have the authority to contract for animal control services at their discretion.

SECTION 22. All prior Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed. Those specific Ordinances repealed are those Ordinances passed on June 3, 1958; April 6, 1948; June 3, 1920; and April 1, 1912.

SECTION 23. If any section of this Ordinance is determined invalid, it shall not affect the validity of all other sections.

SECTION 24. This section directs the City Clerk to publish this Ordinance one time in the Tishomingo County News.

SECTION 25. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days from and after its passage of October 4, 1994.

This Ordinance was reduced to writing and considered section by section with all Aldermen voting in favor thereof. This Ordinance was then considered as a whole and was approved by all Aldermen voting therefor. There were no Aldermen voting against the Ordinance and there were no Aldermen absent or not voting. This Ordinance was declared approved, passed, and adopted on the 4th day of October, 1994 as witnessed by the signature of the Mayor, David L. Nichols and City Clerk, Benny Gray.

RIGHT OF REJECTION, CANCELLATION: The Governing Body has the right to reject any or all bids submitted, as well as to withdraw or irregularity or informality in any bid. The successful bidder shall be bound, at its option, to cancel its agreement to purchase the Bonds if the Bonds are not tendered for delivery within sixty (60) days from the date of sale thereof, and in such event the Governing Body shall return to the bidder its good faith deposit. PAYING AGENT, TRANSFER AGENT, AND REGISTRAR: The successful bidder may designate a bank or trust company located within the State of Mississippi to serve as paying agent (the "Paying Agent") for the Bonds within forty-eight (48) hours of the date of sale of the Bonds, subject to the approval of the Governing Body. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the explanatory statement of the substance of this proposed constitutional amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed constitutional amendment authorizes the Legislature to enact laws establishing a state grand jury and authorizes such grand jury to return indictments in criminal cases regardless of the county where the crime was committed. The jurisdiction of a state grand jury is limited to drug offenses which occur in more than one circuit court district. Venue for the trial of indictments returned by a state grand jury shall be as prescribed by general law."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that House Concurrent Resolution No. 79, 1994 Regular Session, supersedes House Concurrent Resolution No. 21, 1993 Regular Session (Chapter 624, Laws of 1993). BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State shall give public notice of an election in the manner and for the time provided by Section 273 of the Constitution, for the purpose of submitting the amendment to Section 26, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, as proposed by House Concurrent Resolution No. 79, 1994 Regular Session, in substitution and in lieu of the amendment to Section 26, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, as proposed by House Concurrent Resolution No. 21, 1993 Regular Session, to read as follows:

"Section 26. In all criminal prosecutions the accused shall have a right to be heard by himself or counsel, or both, to demand the nature and cause of the accusation, to be confronted by the witnesses against him, to have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses, in his favor, and, in all prosecutions by indictment or information, a speedy and public trial by an impartial jury of the county where the offense was committed; and he shall not be compelled to give evidence against himself; but, in prosecutions for rape, adultery, fornication, sodomy or crime against nature the court may, in its discretion, exclude from the courtroom all persons except such as are necessary in the conduct of the trial.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Constitution, the Legislature may enact laws establishing a state grand jury with the authority to return indictments regardless of the county where the crime was committed. The subject matter jurisdiction of a state grand jury is limited to criminal violations of the Mississippi Uniform Controlled Substances Law or any other crime involving narcotics, dangerous drugs or controlled

Notice to public of no significant impact on the environment and notice to public of request for release of funds.

To all interested agencies, groups, and persons:

On or about November 7, 1994, the County of Tishomingo will request the Department of Economic and Community Development, Division of Community Services, to release federal funds under Title 1 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, for the following project:

The construction of a 4,800 square foot Public Health Department facility which will enhance and expand programs and services offered through the local health department for low income persons.

## FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and, accordingly, the County of Tishomingo has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (PL 91-190). The reasons for such decisions not to prepare such a statement are as follows:

The County did an Environment Assessment, so there is not a need for an Impact Study.

An Environmental Review Record respecting the within project has been made by the County of Tishomingo which documents the Environmental Review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such statement is not required. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination and copying, upon request, at the Tishomingo County Courthouse between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of funds.

## PUBLIC COMMENTS ON FINDING

All interested agencies, groups, and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the County of Tishomingo to the Board of Supervisors. Such written comments should be received by the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors on or before November 4, 1994. All comments so received will be considered and the County of Tishomingo will not request the release of federal funds or take any administrative action on the within project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence. The County of Tishomingo will undertake the project described above with Block Grant funds from the Mississippi Community Development Block Grant Program under Title 1 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended. The County is certifying to the State that the County of Tishomingo and Ricky Cummings, in his official capacity as President of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors, consent to accept the jurisdiction of the federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environ-

mental reviews, decision-making, and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal affect of the certification is that upon its approval, the County of Tishomingo may use the Block Grant Funds and the State will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, as amended.

## OBJECTIONS TO STATE RELEASES OF FUNDS

The State will accept an objection to its approval only if it is in one of the basis set forth in 24 CFR Part 58, 75, and submitted in accordance with the required procedure set forth in 24 CFR Part 58, 76. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance to Ms. Alice Lusk, Associate Director, Mississippi Community Development Block Grant Program, Division of Community Services, P.O. Box 849, Jackson, Mississippi 39203-3096 (Attention: Mary Miller)

Objections to the release of funds on basis other than those referenced above will not be considered by the State. No objection received after November 23, 1994, will be considered by the State.

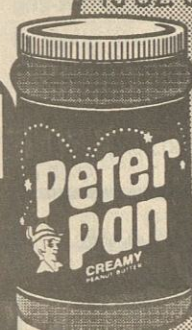

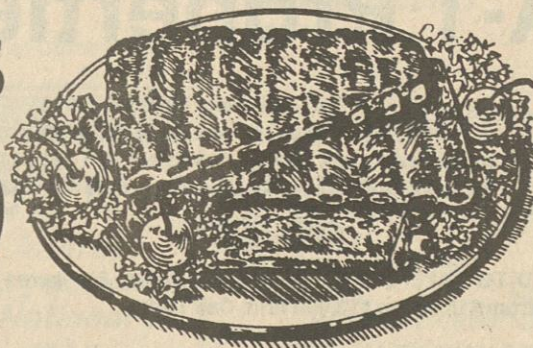

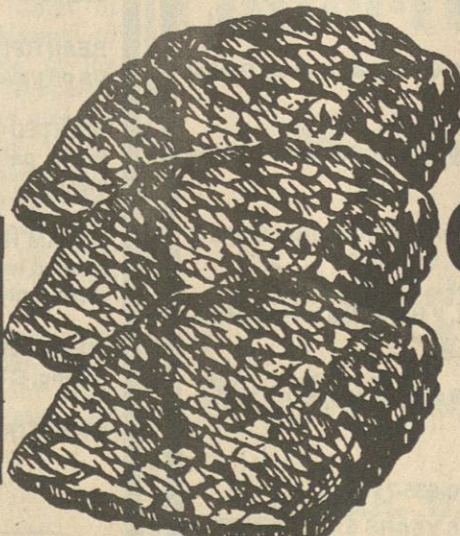
