Open Clinic Set For Animal Licensing, \$10.00 Fee Set

In compliance with the newly adopted City of Iuka Animal Control ordinance, an open clinic will be held at the Animal Medical Center, 709 W. Eastport St., Iuka, on Wednesday, Nov. 2 from 2 to 5 p.m. [or later if needed] for pet licensing and rabies vaccinations.

The new law, enacted by the City, goes into effect Nov. 4, 1994 and includes both dogs and cats within the Iuka City Limits.

The cost of the city pet license will be \$10 per animal. Those needing to get their pets vaccinated for rabies as well, will have to pay an additional \$8 per pet.

The cost of the license goes toward an administrative fee with the remainder being put in a special fund to be used for animal control equipment and personnel, reports stated.

Paul Welton, business manager of the Animal Medical Center, said that pet owners can acquire the license and vaccination after the Nov. 2 date during their clinics regular business hours. Clinic hours are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, from 7 a.m. until 6 p.m. and on Wednesday and Saturday from 7 a.m. until 12 noon.

Welton, whose wife, Dr. Gina Welton, Veterinarian, will be administering the vaccinations, said that since there is no city pound at this time, strays should be reported to Iuka City Hall or to the Police Department. Someone at one of these locations will be responsible for investigating the complaint. Animals picked up by the city will be housed at either the Animal Medical Center or at Iuka Animal Clinic. Welton does remind everyone that only stray animals brought by the city will be taken at these locations so if you have complaints, please direct them to the city officials.

Hot-Dog Fundraiser Planned For Iuka Chamber

The Iuka Area Chamber of Commerce will be selling Coca-Cola and Hot-dogs at the Wal-Mart Parking lot this weekend as a fundraiser. We will be set up Friday, October 28th from 11:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m., and again on Saturday, October 29th from 10:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m.

Registration tickets for donations will be \$1.00 and the drawing will be held at our Annual Membership Banquet, November 10th, at the TCHS Cafeteria. Tickets will be on sale until the day of the drawing and will be available by calling the Chamber at 424-0000 and Chamber of Commerce businesses and individuals.

Body Of Iuka Man Found

The body of an Iuka man who had been missing since Wednesday, October 19 was found Sunday afternoon in a wooded area approximately six miles east of Iuka.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff Johnny S. Nunley, the body of 63-year-old Robert L. Nagle of Iuka was found at about 3 p.m. Sunday approximately 50 yards from his 1973 Oldsmobile 98 by a member of a search party who was looking for him. The car was at the dead end of County Road 251, off Snowdown Road.

Nunley said that the cause of death appeared to be of natural causes. However, he explained that more will be known when the results from the autopsy, being done at the state crime lab in Jackson, are returned.

Old Iuka Hospital To Be Tishomingo Living Center

2008, LLC, a Mississippi Limited Liability Company, has entered into a contractual agreement with the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors to assume operations of the Iuka Nursing Facility. North Mississippi Medical Center has set a tentative date of December 7, 1994, to move the current hospital operations to the new Iuka hospital facility. At that time, the Iuka Nursing Facility will be renamed Tishomingo Living Center and will be increased from a thirty-six bed nursing facility to a forty-bed facility. 2008, LLC, plans to work in close cooperation with the members of the community and the Board of Supervisors to provide the best possible care to residents of the nursing facility. A full press release will be forthcoming within the next few weeks.

Gunshot Wound Fatal To Iuka Man

A gunshot wound to the chest proved fatal to an Iuka man Saturday night, who was apparently shot by his neighbor.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff Johnny S. Nunley, Robert E. Wright, 27, 1009-A North Fulton Street, Iuka, was shot in the chest with a 12-gauge shotgun through the windshield of his car at about 7:10 p.m. Saturday after an altercation with his neighbor, James Anthony Cooksey.

Cooksey, 29, of 1009-B North Fulton Street, Iuka was arrested and charged with the murder of Wright several hours after the incident. Jonathon W. Ross, 20, of 1244 Highway 365 N., Burnsville, was arrested and charged with accessory to murder on Monday, Oct. 24.

Nunley explained that the cause of the altercation between the Wright and Cooksey is still under investigation. Cooksey remained in the Tishomingo County Jail at press time under a \$25,000 bond. Ross had been released on a \$20,000 bond.

Assisting the Sheriff's Department in the arrests were Iuka Policemen Bobby Flynt and Trip Lomenick, Iuka Police Investigator Ricky Cornelison, North Half Constable Tim Bivins, and later, the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol Criminal Investigation Bureau.

Robert Earl Wright was an employee of Gann Construction Company in Iuka.

Services for Wright were at 3 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 25, at Deaton Funeral Home Chapel with the Rev. William Burcham officiating. Burial was in the Rutledge-Salem Cemetery.

Survivors include his wife, Candrice Wright of Tishomingo; one daughter, Savannah Elizabeth Wright of Tishomingo; his mother, Wanda Wright of Tishomingo; one sister, Deborah Nunley of Tishomingo; one brother, Kenneth Wright of Iuka; his grandmothers, Gloria Bryce of Hoenwald, Tenn., and Mozell Smoak of Cordell, Ga.; nieces and nephews.



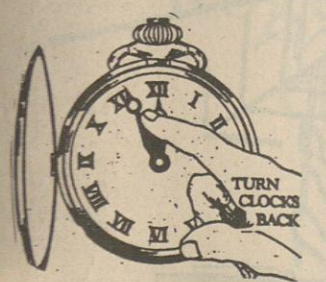

Home Economics Tips

GET THE SKINNY ON/
LEAN FOOD CHOICES

A diet lower in fat doesn't need to leave you feeling deprived. Today, a number of foods are available in reduced fat versions, making it relatively easy to lower your daily intake of fat, says Barbara Guinn, Extension Home Economist. In addition there are many basic food alternatives that can help you cut back on fat.

Guinn, suggests these choices:
*Drink skim or 1-percent milk instead of whole milk and select reduced-fat salad dressings instead of regular.

*Use plain nonfat yogurt to top a baked potato instead of sour cream, butter or margarine.

*Buy leaner, lower fat cuts of meat. Select beef round and loin instead of chuck or rib cuts.

*Select lower grades of meat. For example, choice or good grades have less fat than U.S. Department of Agriculture prime

PET ODORS

If your pet is giving off an unpleasant odor, naturally you'll want to do something about it. There is no breed of cat or dog, no individual animal, which "normally" smells bad. Either the animal is just plain dirty or suffering from a health problem.

First of all, if you have become aware of unpleasant pet-related odors around your house, try brushing out your pet's coat. If this doesn't work, try bathing with a good shampoo or brushing an oil absorbing substance such as baking soda or baby powder into the coat. Be sure to brush out all the powder, particularly with cats, who groom themselves.

If the unpleasant odor remains after these measures, then it is time to consult your veterinarian. Unpleasant pet odors can be associated with various health problems. These problems include infections of the mouth, ear, intestine and other areas. An examination by your veterinarian will pinpoint the source of the odor and the health problem so that appropriate treatment can be started.

CONTACT CONSIDERATIONS
Contact lenses are a way of life for 21 million Americans. If you are considering joining the ranks, here are some considerations.

Follow instructions on handling and caring for lenses. Use the solutions and disinfection system that your eye doctor recommends. Don't mix different brands of solutions.

Follow up with regularly scheduled eye exams, including tests for glaucoma, cataracts and retina evaluation. If you choose extended-wear lenses, be extremely careful to follow your doctor's instructions to the letter.

Take precautions. Not all persons selling contact lenses are licensed to provide contact lens care. The contact lenses should be fitted by an eye doctor. The doctor should be the one to follow you on a regular basis to ensure that the cornea stays healthy. The doctor's office staff should provide in-depth instruction on inserting, removing, and caring for the lenses.

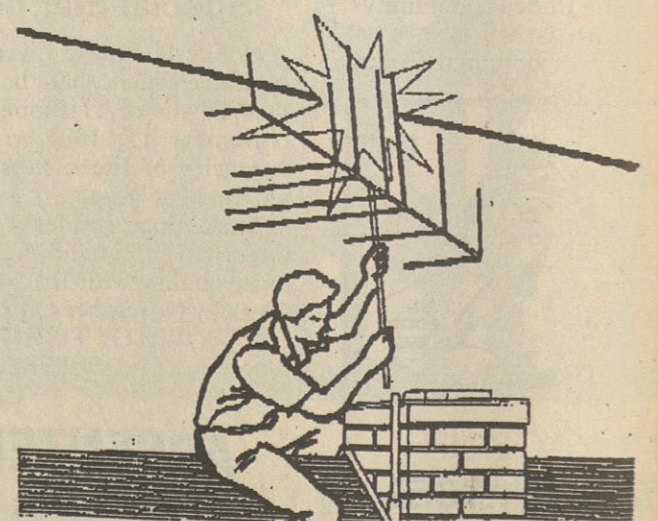
SAFETY FIRST




MOTION FOR CONTINUANCE

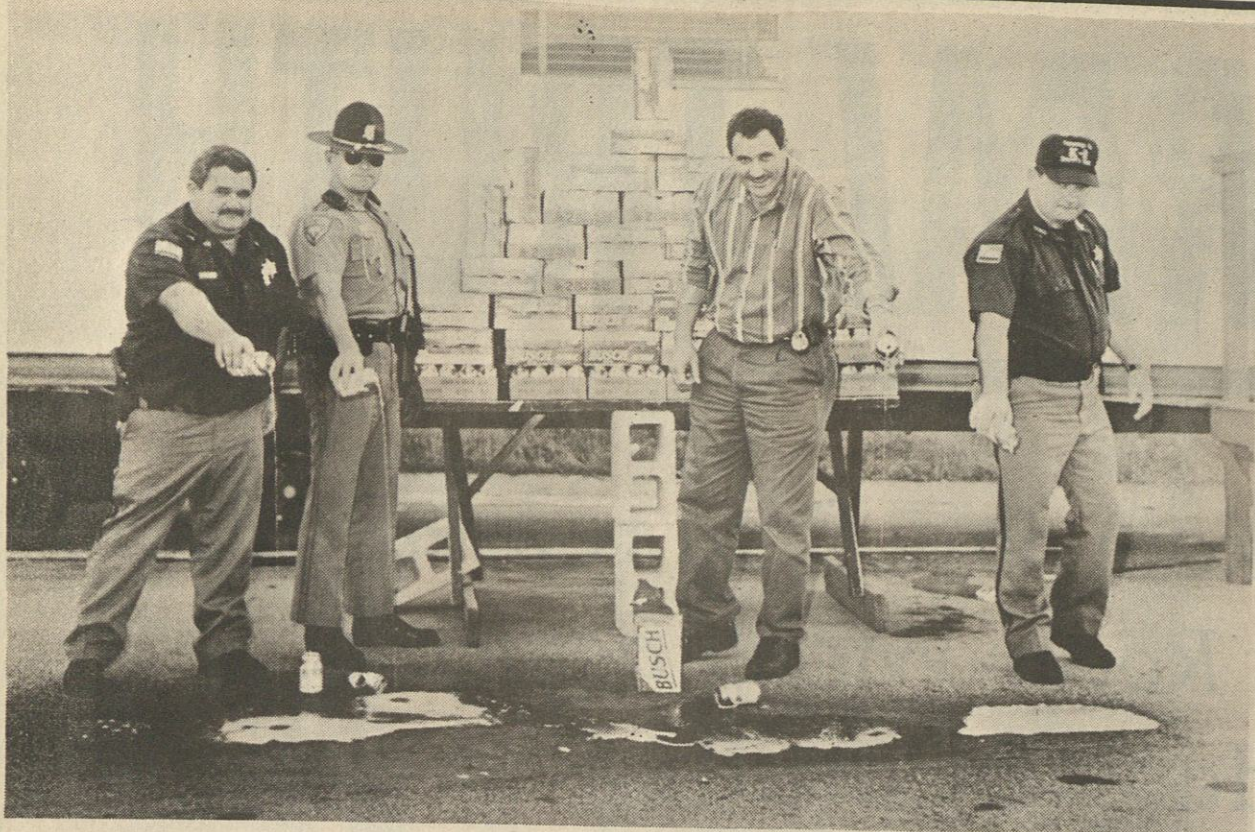

Iuka Woman Injured After Train/Car Collision

An elderly Iuka woman was injured Monday, October 24, trying to escape from her car which had stalled on the tracks in the path of an oncoming train.

Mrs. Robbie Skinner, 84, of Iuka was traveling north on Fulton Street when her car apparently stalled at the railroad crossing, according to Iuka Policeman Randy Stringer. Witnesses said that Mrs. Skinner was attempting to escape from her 1978 Oldsmobile and the path of the westbound Norfolk Southern train when the collision occurred. The car was knocked around, hitting her, reports indicated.

The engineer saw Mrs. Skinner's car in his path. He reportedly hit the train's emergency shutdown and had slowed to about 30 MPH at the time of impact.

Mrs. Skinner was taken to Iuka Hospital where she underwent some plastic surgery and was released Tuesday, according to reports. Iuka Police Chief Amos Bates assisted at the scene, along with Officer Stringer.

Implemented in 1991, NASA's Tri-State Education Initiative (TSEI) is an innovative process fully consistent with the national education goals. Encompassing areas of Alabama, Mississippi and Tennessee within a 50-mile radius of Iuka, Miss., the TSEI advocates total community involvement in the education process and tries to reach community members of every age group with its "Break-the-mold" approach. The TSEI is nationally recognized as a demonstration program for education for the nation's future.

The Burnsville Parent Teacher Organization met twice since the opening of the new school year to have open house, elect new officers and decide on how some of the organizations money carried over from last year would be spent.

OFFICERS ELECTED, FUNDS SPENT

On September 29, the P.T.O. met in the cafeteria after dues were collected from new and returning members. The election of officers took place. Elected were Lynn Dill - President, Bobby Crab - Vice President, Bonnie Dill - Secretary, Hilda Hyde - Treasurer and Angela Lambert - Reporter.

In other business, the need of the school for a copying machine was addressed. In a special committee meeting, Mr. Mike Haynie, Burnsville School Principal, had confirmed that the school did not have a copying machine that was in working order to start the new school year. He further expressed that he did not have the money in his budget to purchase one for the school. 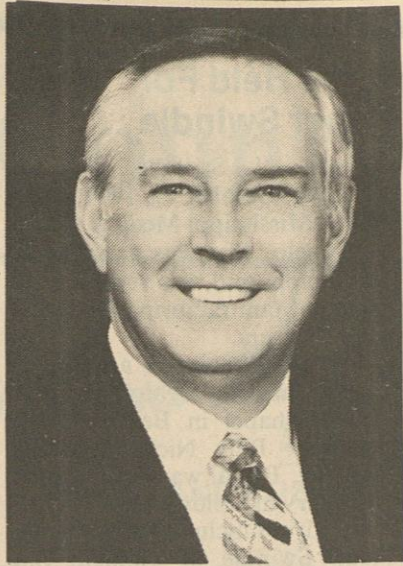
Youth Hunt Set For Divide Section WMA

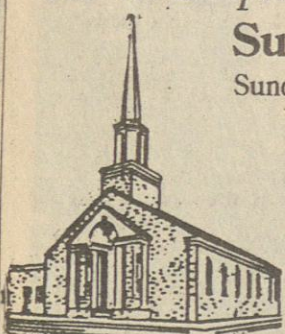

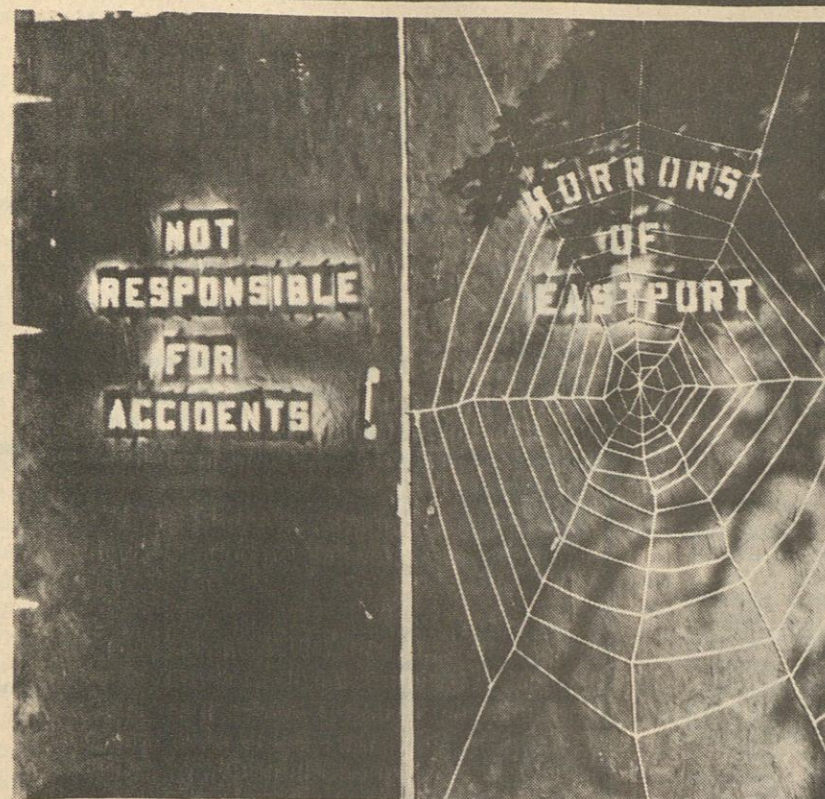

If less than all of the outstanding Bonds of a maturity are to be redeemed, the particular Bonds to be redeemed shall be selected by the Municipality by lot or random selection in such manner as the Municipality shall deem fair and appropriate. The Municipality may provide for the selection of portions of the principal of the Bonds (in integral multiples of \$5,000), and for all purposes of the Bond Resolution, all provisions relating to the redemption of the Bonds shall relate, in the case of any Bond redeemed or to be redeemed only in part, to the portion of the principal of such Bond which has been so selected to be redeemed.

AUTHORITY AND SECURITY: The Bonds will be issued pursuant to the provisions of Sections 21-33-301 through 21-33-329, Mississippi Code of 1972 (the "Act"), and shall be general obligations of the Municipality payable as to principal and interest out of and secured by an irrevocable pledge of the avails of a direct and continuing tax to be levied annually without limitation as to rate or amount upon the taxable property within the geographical limits of the Municipality. To the extent other moneys are available, the Municipality will levy annually a direct and continuing tax upon all taxable property within the geographical limits of the Municipality which tax, together with any other moneys available for such purpose, shall be adequate and sufficient to provide for the payment of the principal of the interest on the Bonds as the same falls due.

PURPOSE: The Bonds are being issued to provide funds for the purpose of constructing and equipping an addition to the public library, repairing and improving the public library, and purchasing equipment and books therefor.

FORM OF BIDS: Bids should be addressed to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and should be plainly marked "Bid for General Obligation Library Bonds, Series 1994, of the City of Iuka, Mississippi," and should be filed with the City Clerk of the Municipality on or prior to the date and hour hereinabove named. All bids should be submitted substantially in the form prepared by the Municipality, copies of which may be obtained from the Clerk of the Municipality at the address shown below.

INTEREST RATE AND BID RESTRICTIONS: The Bonds shall not bear a greater overall maximum interest rate to maturity than eleven percent (11%) per annum, nor shall the interest rate for any one maturity exceed eleven percent (11%) per annum. No Bond shall bear more than one (1) rate of interest; each Bond shall bear interest from its date to its stated maturity date at the interest rate specified in the bid; all Bonds of the same maturity shall bear the same rate of interest from date to maturity; and the lowest interest rate specified shall not be less than seventy percent (70%) of the highest interest rate specified. Each interest rate specified in any bid must be a multiple of one-eighth of one percent (1/8 of 1%) or one-tenth of one percent (1/10 of 1%) and a zero rate of interest cannot be named.

GOOD FAITH DEPOSIT: Each bid must be accompanied by a cashier's check, certified check, or exchange, issued or certified by a bank located in the State of Mississippi, payable to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka, Mississippi, in the amount of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000) as a guaranty that the bidder will carry out its contract and purchase the Bonds if its bid be accepted. All checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned immediately on award of the Bonds. If the successful bidder fails to purchase the Bonds pursuant to its bid and contract, then the amount of such good faith check shall be retained by the Municipality as liquidated damages for such failure. No interest will be allowed on the amount of the good faith deposit.

AWARD OF BONDS: The award, if any, will be made to the bidder complying with the terms of sale and offering to purchase the Bonds at the lowest net interest cost to the Municipality, which shall be determined by computing the aggregate interest on the Bonds over the life of the issue at the rate or rates of interest specified by the bidder, less premium offered, if any. It is requested that each bid be accompanied by a statement of the net interest cost (computed to six decimal places), but such statement will not be considered a part of the bid. All bids shall remain firm for three (3) hours after the time specified for the opening of bids, and an award of the Bonds, or rejection of bids, will be made by the Governing Body within said period of time.

RIGHT OF REJECTION, CANCELLATION: The Governing Body reserves the right to reject any or all bids submitted, as well as to waive any irregularity or informality in any bid. The successful bidder shall have the right, at its option, to cancel its agreement to purchase the Bonds if the Bonds are not tendered for delivery within sixty (60) days from the date of sale thereof, and in such event the Governing Body shall return to said bidder its good faith deposit. The Governing Body shall have the right, at its option, to cancel its agreement to sell the Bonds if within five (5) days after the tender of the Bonds of delivery the successful bidder shall not have accepted delivery of and paid for the Bonds, and in such event the Governing Body shall retain the successful bidder's good faith deposit as liquidated damages as hereinabove provided.

PAYING AGENT, TRANSFER AGENT, AND REGISTRAR: The successful bidder may designate a bank or trust company located within the State of Mississippi to serve as paying agent (the "Paying Agent") for the Bonds within forty-eight (48) hours of the date of sale of the Bonds, subject to the approval of the Governing Body. The Governing Body's approval of the Paying Agent shall be contingent on a determination as to the willingness and ability of the Paying Agent to perform the duties of registrar and transfer agent and on the satisfactory negotiation of service fees. The Paying Agent shall be subject to change by order of the Governing Body under the conditions and in the manner provided in the Bond Resolution under which the Bonds are issued. Both principal of and interest on the Bonds will be payable by check or draft mailed to registered owners of the Bonds as of the 15th day of the month preceding the maturity date for such principal or interest payment at the addresses appearing in the registration records of the Municipality maintained by the Paying Agent. The Bonds will be transferable only upon the books of the Paying Agent, and payment of principal at maturity shall be conditioned on the proper presentation and surrender of the Bonds to the Paying Agent.

DELIVERY: The successful bidder must designate within thirty (30) days of the date of sale, or at such other later date as may be designated by the Governing Body, the names and addresses of the registered owners of the Bonds and the denominations in which the Bonds of each maturity are to be issued. If the successful bidder fails to submit such information within the required time, one Bond may be issued for each maturity in the full amount maturing on that date registered in the name of the successful bidder. The Bonds will be delivered at a place to be designated by the purchaser and without cost to the purchaser, and payment therefor shall be made in immediately available funds.

CUSIP NUMBERS: It is anticipated that CUSIP Identification numbers will be printed on the Bonds unless specifically declined by the purchaser but neither the failure to print such number on any bond nor any error with respect thereto shall constitute cause for a failure or refusal by the purchaser thereof to accept delivery of and pay for the Bonds in accordance with the terms of the purchase contract. All expenses in relation to the printing of CUSIP numbers on the Bonds shall be paid by the Municipality; the CUSIP Service Bureau charge for the assignment of said numbers shall be the responsibility of and shall be paid for by the purchaser.

LEGAL OPINION: CLOSING DOCUMENTS: The Bonds are offered subject to the unqualified approval of the legality thereof by Watkins Ludlum Stennis, Jackson, Mississippi, Bond Counsel. In the Opinion of Watkins Ludlum & Stennis, interest on the Bonds is exempt from federal and Mississippi income taxes under existing laws, regulations, rulings and judicial decisions with such exceptions as shall be described in the Information Statement for the Bonds. A copy of the opinion of Bond Counsel which will be printed on the back of each Bond, together with the usual closing papers, including a non-litigation certificate dated the date of delivery of the Bonds, evidencing that no litigation is pending in any way affecting the legality of the Bonds or the taxes to be levied for the payment of the principal thereof and interest thereon, and a transcript of the proceedings relating to the Bonds will be delivered to the successful bidder without charge. The Municipality will pay for all legal fees and will pay the printing and validation of the Bonds.

INFORMATION FROM PURCHASER: The purchaser must certify to the Municipality the initial offering price to the public (excluding bond houses, brokers and other intermediaries) of each maturity of the Bonds at which a substantial amount of Bonds of that maturity were sold, to enable the Municipality to compute the yield on the Bonds for federal arbitrage purposes.

FURTHER INFORMATION: The Municipality has prepared an Information Statement relating to the Bonds which the Municipality deems to be true and complete as of this date. The Municipality will furnish up to 25 copies of the Information Statement to the successful bidder of the Bonds without charge within seven (7) business days after the award of the bid. The successful bidder must notify the City Clerk of the Municipality in writing within five (5) business days of the award of the bid if the bidder requires additional copies of the Information Statement to comply with applicable regulations. The cost for such additional copies will be paid by the successful bidder requesting such copies. A copy of the Information Statement including the bid form may be obtained from the Office of the City Clerk, 118 S. Pearl, Iuka, Mississippi 38852.

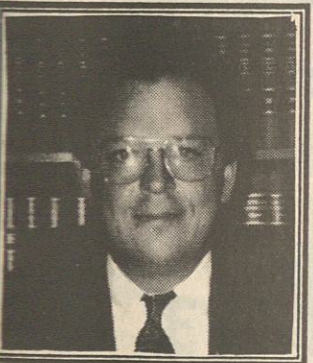

District Attorney Bobby Williams asks Promotion to Appeals Judge



Robert L. (Bobby) Williams of Hernando, district attorney of the 17th Circuit Court District and one of Mississippi's senior prosecuting attorneys, is asking voters of the First Congressional District to promote him to judge on the new Mississippi Court of Appeals, Position 2 in the November 8 General Election.

For the past 17 and a half years, Williams has been a prosecuting attorney on the district attorney's staff. He has been elected to the post three consecutive times, twice without opposition and once with an overwhelming margin of more than 68% of the vote.

"I am grateful to the people of the 17th Circuit Court District for the opportunity they have given me and the support I have enjoyed at election time," Williams said. "Now I humbly ask for support of the people throughout the First Congressional District for a promotion to this new post."

Williams pointed out that because the U.S. Justice Department delayed approval for this position until early September and because he has been busy preparing for the prosecution of a capital murder trial he has been unable to get out into the district earlier to meet with the voters.

"Bobby Williams has earned a statewide reputation as a hard working, no nonsense district attorney with a conviction rate of more than 98%," said fellow District Attorney Frank Carlton of the 4th circuit court district.

"District Attorney Bobby Williams can be counted on by local law enforcement officers because they know that he will work with them by fully prosecuting those charged with crimes," stated David Bryan of Batesville, Panola County Sheriff and a past president of the Mississippi Sheriffs Association.

"We support Bobby Williams, our district attorney, because he prosecuted the man who killed our daughter," Mr. and Mrs. Nelson Browning of Tutwiler said. "He went beyond the call of duty because he really cared about how we felt."

The Mississippi Prosecutors Association endorsed District Attorney Williams for this post citing his experience and dedication to professionalism and called him a "tough but fair prosecuting attorney."

"Bobby Williams is extremely well-suited by virtue of education, experience, integrity and temperament to ably serve this state in a judicial capacity," the endorsement statement said.

Williams joined the District Attorney's staff in 1977 and has been innovative in organization of the office and the services it provides through investigative assistance and aid to victims and families of crime victims.

He is a graduate of Water Valley High School, the son of Murray L. Williams of Taylor and the late Kate Calk Williams of Byhalia. He was a standout quarterback in high school and at Northwest Community College. He earned his undergraduate degree from the University of Mississippi in 1967.

Bobby Williams was a teacher and coach at Belzoni High School for two years and then attended Law School at night while working with the legal department of the Mississippi State Highway Department. He received his JD Degree from Jackson School of Law in 1971 and has been a practicing attorney since 1972.

He served as municipal judge of Water Valley from 1973 until 1977.

He is a member of the Mississippi Prosecutors Association, the National District Attorneys Association and is the father of two children, a son, Lee, and a daughter, Paige. He also has a seven-month-old granddaughter, Tori Elaine.

In his statement to the voters, District Attorney Williams said:

"While serving as District Attorney, it has been my responsibility to prosecute some of the most horrible and gruesome crimes one can imagine. In so doing, I have become particularly sensitive to the victims of crimes and their families. I have worked with victims' rights advocacy organizations throughout the state and nation."

"My background as a district attorney has prepared me to help understand problems facing our legal system and society in general. I will work to make our new Appeals Court responsive and efficient. I sincerely seek your support as I ask for a promotion to this new office, not held by any person at present."

"Remember, this office is non-partisan and there will be no party distinction in this race."
