Accusations Not Confirmed

Accusations against a local law enforcement officer which were published in area daily newspapers last week have not been confirmed by state investigators.

Terry Cox, an investigator with the District Attorney's Office, told the Tishomingo County News Tuesday, December 6, that the District Attorney's office and the U.S. Attorneys office believe that any comments concerning an investigation of Tishomingo County Sheriff Johnny Nunley for any misconduct including bribery, are "premature and improper".

Cox further stated that he "could not confirm or deny that an investigation against Nunley is

For several months rumors and accusations have circulated attempting to connect the sheriff with the recent charges of bribery against an auxiliary deputy in Tishomingo County. This newspaper has been told on numerous occasions by the Justice Department that if any further charges were made in the case they would notify the press.

No one other than Larry Wilson, auxiliary deputy, was named in the statement released by the U.S. Attorney's office in September outlining the events surrounding Wilson's involvement in the bribery case.

Home Peonomies Tips

By: Barbara F. Guinn, Extension Home Economist EIGHT "GREEN" TIPS FOR NEW HOME BUILDERS

Here are a few ideas for new home builders or remodelers to consider that will help save the environment by saving energy, saving water, and saving landfill

1. Build a recycling center. This could be a bin with compartments under the counter, in the kitchen, in the porch, basement or garage. Put it where it is handy and easy to use so that you will use it. And make it easy to transport the items to wherever they will be collected. Consider a recycling chute from the kitchen to the garage with a small hanged door on the wall between the kitchen and garage.

2. Build an under-the-counter bin for collecting vegetable scraps to put in the compost pile. This will save water and energy by reducing the use of the garbage

3. Look for energy-savings appliances for your new home. Read the tags on the appliances for the energy efficiency ratings.

4. Buy energy-saving compact fluorescent light bulbs for the light fixtures. These light bulbs fit into fixtures designed for regular incandescent light bulbs but they are actually small fluorescent lamps that use half as much energy as regular light bulbs. Do not be put off by initial high cost-they will save you money in the long run.

5. Consider a programmable thermostat. These thermostats let you preset the temperature

designed for certain times of the day. Because they can be set to automatically reduce the temperature when you are away or asleep and return the temperature to a comfortable level when you are home, they can save you

6. Buy bathroom fixtures which use less water. Low-flow shower heads use about half as much heated water as regular shower heads. New low-flush toilet fixtures use only a fraction of the water that a regular toilet uses. Equip faucets with screw-on aerators that slow the flow of water from the faucet.

Consider a point-of-use water heater in a half-bath located far from the main water heater. These small units provide a small amount of hot water on demand and eliminate the need for piping hot water from the larger water heater. However, remember to provide a flue for venting exhaust fumes from small gas heaters.


8. Install a clothesline and use it on nice days instead of your clothes dryer.



Prevent Frozen Pipes

Last winter nearly a quartermillion homes nationally and approximately 36,000 in Mississippi were damaged when water pipes froze and broke, spewing water over walls, floors, furniture and appliances.

With winter fast approaching, State Farm Insurance, the nation's and Mississippi's largest insurer of homes, warned of the potential for frozen pipe damage, pointing out that this is one of the prevalent yet least recognized catastrophes.

"Aside from hurricanes, frozen pipes rank at the top in terms of both the number of people put through the trauma and inconvenience of having their homes damaged and claim costs," said Lu Mixon of State Farm's Public Affairs Depar-

For example, since 1984, State Farm has paid over 300,000 frozen pipes catastrophe claims, 20,355 in Mississippi. This translates into insurance industry claims over that period ap-

We've all heard people who have recently lost their pets declare that they'll never get another. Here are some tips as to how: *Leave the heat on and set no lower than 55 degrees. If no one will be home for several days, have someone check the home daily to make sure the heat is on.

*Insulate pipes most susceptible to freezing. Typically, these are near outer walls, in crawl spaces and in the attic. *Disconnect all garden hoses.

If there is an indoor valve, shut off and drain the water supply to outdoor faucets. *If pipes do freeze, don't try to

thaw a pipe with an open flame or torch. Be careful of electric shock in areas of standing water.

*Make sure all family members know the location of the home's water shut-offvalve. If a pipe bursts, shutting off the water promptly can help minimize damage.





WHAT IS A CATARACT?

A cataract is a clouding of the normally clear and transparent lens of the eye. It is not a tumor or a new growth of skin or tissue over the eye, but a fogging of the lens itself. Normally, the lens of the eye is clear. When a cataract develops, the lens becomes cloudy, not unlike a frosted win-

Located near the front of the eye, the lens focuses light on the retina which is at the back of the eye. Light passes through it to produce a sharp image on the retina. When a cataract forms, the lens can become so opaque and unclear that light cannot be easily transmitted to the retina.

Often, however, a cataract covers only a small part of the lens and, if sight is not greatly impaired, there is no need to remove the cataract. IF a large portion of the lens becomes cloudy, sight can be partially or completely lost until the cataract is removed. If you vision is becoming blurred or less sharp, you should arrange for an eye examination.





County Agents Notes

By: Danny Owen, County Agent PROPER DISPOSAL OF ANTIFREEZE

Antifreeze (ethylene or propylene glycol) used as a freeze protection in water cooled engines is changed periodically because the rust inhibitor breaks down. The basic compound is still present in its original form. It should not be dumped on the ground or left in containers so that pets can consume it. The glycol will crystalize in the kidneys resulting in death of the animal. According to the manufacturer, proper disposal is by flushing with plenty of water into a sewer or septic system. Since antifreeze is biodegradable when diluted, the bacteria in the septic system will break the compound down to harmless carbon, hydrogen and oxygen. Antifreeze

WAIT UNTIL THE PROPER TIME TO PRUNE FRUIT

Generally speaking, the earlier in the dormant season you prune, the earlier the tree tends to flower. Prune blocks that you've had frost problems with last. You may event wait until early bloom to start. Wounds actually heal faster and reduce the chance for pest entrance into the trees. Growers with a small number of trees may want to wait until the threat of frost is over before pruning. Brush removal is important in insect and disease control. Remove the brush and burn it immediately.

We are writing you this letter today simply because we are concerned with the Health Care people of this area.

On Thursday night, November 24th, Thanksgiving, our Dad was taken to our area hospital - with chest pains - he is one that is or has never been sick so we knew when he asked for help something was wrong.

He was admitted that evening around 7 or 8 p.m. and put in a room with a heart monitor although the ER Doctor stated (Quote) "All he had was a bad case of indigestion and possibly a gall bladder attack"

Although he was admitted and two IV's were going, he seemed to not be getting any better.

The family was very concerned but we were told the test that was done showed only abnormalities. The ER doctor at that point was upset because we did not think our Dad was getting the care he needed by a physician, so we asked for our Dad to be transfered. The ER doctor became very agitated and called us up to talk to us and told us the best thing for us to do was go home and get some sleep the last thing Daddy needed in his room was a hell-raising family, and for us to come back in the morning. By this time he had his 4th IV, which was blood thinner and nitroglicerin. "Please tell me if all Daddy had was indigestion and gall bladder attack why did he have all these IV's?"

At our request he called ECM and a cardiologist. But it was unreal what he said to him. He told him that all Daddy had was a bad case of indigestion and a gall bladder attack but he wanted him shipped out of his hospital. We were really surprised the cardiologist took Daddy. But he was transferred and the doctor was waiting on him upon arrival - It did not take them 20 minutes to figure out Daddy had a Heart Attack. What if he had stayed at our home town facility? His family doctor was not on call therefore he had to wait til morning to see him. We, the people of Tishomingo County, if we don't start speaking out and action against carelessness, who knows what it will cause us in the future! This is supposed to be a place where we can count on getting the care we

I was told that me nor my family would have to worry about this ER doctor giving us Health Care again yet he is still employed with this facility. Words cannot explain the attitude of this doctor and the rude way this family was treated. Everywhere you go there is excitement in the air about our new hospital. May we suggest we need something besides dermatologists trainees in our ER. It is a pittiful shame we have to go out of town to get the Health Care needed. The Family Of

Zenobia Oaks gave an inspirational program on leadership. Since good leaders have to have good followers, the job of





Large Crowd Attends Opening Of luka Hospital

The newly completed Iuka Hospital, 1711 Curtis Drive, was overflowing with enthusiastic visitors Sunday, December 4, during the facility's open house, despite the dismal weather.

About 600 visitors attended the grand opening festivities that lasted from 2 to 4 p.m. at the modern \$8.7 million health care complex. Among the areas toured by guests were a fully-equipped surgical suite and office space for surgeon Adel Abdel-Hafiz, M.D., areas dedicated to physical therapy, respiratory therapy, educational services, a convenient and expanded emergency services area, large lab, pharmacy, a food court which will be open to the public, 40 private hospital rooms and an eight-bed Intensive Care Unit [ICU].

North Mississippi Health Services Interim Chief Executive Officer Gerald D. Wages said the Iuka Hospital is one of the only new health care facilities that has been built in these times when health care is seeing a decline in many areas.

Even with the vast improvements of the new hospital there are mixed emotions among hospital staff members and physicians about the move from the old facility which opened 35 years ago in January of 1959. Dr. Kelly Segars, medical staff chairman told the audience that last Monday morning he realized he was pulling into his parking space for the last time at the old hospital - the same one he had been parking in since he became a member of the medical staff there in 1960. He expressed that the employees will help the new hospital have the same atmosphere as the old facility, even though the surroundings will be different.

After touring the facility, visitors were making lots of positive remarks concerning the new building's contemporary design, decorating and additional services.

The new hospital will be fully operational by today, December 8. The old facility will be converted completely into a nursing home by a private company.

More than 1,100 Mississippi State University students are candidates for degrees at the conclusion of the 1994 fall semester.


December graduates will join those from the spring semester formally receiving diplomas at the May 13 commencement ceremony in Humphrey Colisum.
