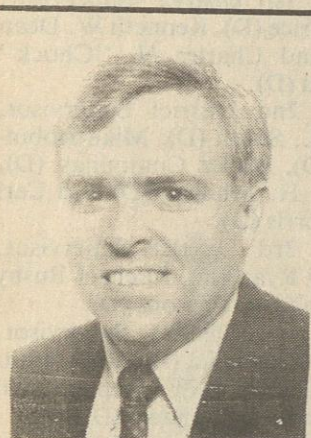

LITTERBOX WOES

Failure to use the litterbox is very often a source of conflict between cats and their caretakers. "Inappropriate elimination" (urinating and/or defecating someplace other than the litterbox) can be very difficult to deal with, but here are a few suggestions:

Cats can have a lot of different urinary tract problems. If a cat suddenly begins to urinate someplace other than the litterbox, he (or she) needs to be checked by a veterinarian to make sure that he does not have a medical problem. Most often, clearing up or controlling the urinary tract infection will stop the problem of inappropriate elimination.

A change in the type or brand of cat litter used can often be the onset of elimination problems. A cat may not like the new type of litter and will choose other spots to eliminate. Changing back to the old litter usually solves this problem.

Keeping the litterbox clean solves many problems, and even daily cleaning may be necessary. Some cats are so particular about their litterbox that they will not urinate and defecate in their own box, but require two separate boxes. Multiple cat households encounter this same problem, except on a larger scale - some cats will not use a box soiled by another cat. The solution to this problem is multiple litterboxes.

These suggestions are just a few of the possible answers to litterbox woes. We would be glad to discuss your individual situation and try to help you find a solution.

"THIRD EYE" THEME

We assume that "What we see is what we get", but that's not true. The eye has other functions besides perception. Did you know that approximately 20% of the information from the retina never goes to the visual cortex to be used for sight? Instead, it travels to other brain centers to be integrated with more data about the body's awareness. The retina uses light to stimulate the pineal and pituitary glands, the master glands of the body which regulate our entire system. This function appears to be a much older system than perception of objects.

Some animals, such as iguanas, retain a vestigial "third eye" on top of their heads which is thought to have been used to note the degree of heat of the sun, ergo, the season. This light stimulation seems related to fertility and may be the reason the seasons are related to the mating of animals.

In man, it is believed that this remnant of our evolutionary past dropped inside our skull and became the pineal gland. A tumor here can cause highly erratic sexual development.

Extension Service To Offer
Weight-Off-Wisely Classes

Are you interested in losing one to two pounds of weight per week for 10 weeks? If so, you will want to join the Weight-Off-Wisely classes, which will be taught on Monday evenings at 5:00 p.m. at the North Crossroads Fire Department, beginning Monday, March 13, 5:00 p.m.

Weight-Off-Wisely is a ten week program designed to help men and women lose weight through diet and nutrition planning, sensible eating, modification of existing undesirable behavior, and exercise. This program should be used as a tool or stepping stone for in-

dividuals to attain successful weight loss. Successful weight loss means losing any weight (two pounds or 20 pounds) and keeping it off. Success is not losing ten pounds during a program and then gaining that weight back within a year.

The first session requires about two hours of time, while the other sessions last somewhere between 1 and 2 hours. At each session there will be group interaction, a nutrition lesson and exercise. There will be a fee of \$5.00 to cover the cost of equipment for the ten weeks. These sessions will be offered through the Tishomingo County Cooperative Extension Service.

Soil Conservation News



The Proper Way To Plant A Tree....

I would like to mention a few things that may be important to you when planting. It is good to know the area you want to plant, and the size of the tree that would be proper for that area. Some trees have a tremendous root system, and should be planted in an area which will allow the roots to support the tree. A healthy tree depends on the soil in its root zone. The roots spread to a surprisingly large but shallow area, with most roots being less than 12 inches deep. The outer area of roots extend to a distance from 1-2 times the height of the tree. This may give you an idea as to how close to plant the tree from your house or driveway. Some of the problems caused by improper planting are lifting sidewalks, entering or moving water lines, and tangling with wires and power lines. You may want to plant smaller trees such as dogwoods, plums, and red buds in more confined areas and larger trees such as greenash, oaks, and sycamores in more open areas.

When planting the tree you need to remember that tree roots have to have oxygen, and if planted in a heavily traveled area a newly planted tree may suffer from lack of oxygen in the soil pores, causing it to suffocate. This often happens when concrete or dirt has been placed around a tree within the drip line.

Attend Model United Nations Conference

From February 14-20, two of Tishomingo County's former student leaders recently traveled to Toronto, Canada along with six other UNA students and a faculty adviser to participate in the North American Model United Nations. They joined over 450 students from around the globe at this conference. While most of the students were from the United States and Canada, some came from as far away as Croatia, Greece, Taiwan, Russia, and Kenya. James Monroe and Beth Wright, formerly of Burnsville, received firsthand experience on how the UN really functions. Both are senior political science majors focusing on international relations and American foreign policy and

diplomacy. James served as head delegate and Special Political and Decolonization Committee member representing Costa Rica. Beth Wright also served on the same committee as a representative of Ireland. Issues dealt with in the committee were the situation in Rwanda and the question of what to do about the Republic of China on Taiwan.

Shortly after the conference began, delegates were comfortably in the roles of their respected countries. As country stances on issues became apparent, coalitions were formed in an attempt to resolve the conflict and remain true to their country's foreign policy. After much debate and caucusing, workable

resolutions were obtained.

A formal gala and dance were part of the conference in which a member of the Canadian Parliament spoke of the UN's role in the world today. The final night of the conference was spent in downtown Toronto where the delegates went to the Hard Rock cafe in the Skydome and visited the CN Tower which is the tallest observation point in the world. While in Toronto, the delegates took in a performance of "Phantom of the Opera" in the prestigious Pantages theater—one of three theaters in the world where the set is specifically designed for "Phantom's" breathtaking special effects.

Of course, the conference was not all work. New friendships were formed as countries were forced to work with their allied states. After long days of debating, delegates were able to unwind at various entertainment spots. At the close of the conference, the General Assembly met to vote on resolutions passed in committee. After closing ceremonies, delegates exchanged E-mail addresses and fond farewells.

The delegates stayed an extra day and toured the Niagara Falls area. The tour began with viewing the sites of the Falls itself, several greenhouses, the Skylon tower overlooking the Falls, and ended at Brights' Winery (one of Ontario's oldest and most prestigious wineries). Meeting with German representatives and tasting the famous Ice Wine of Ontario were highlights of the winery tour. Other sights included the local monasteries, the Battle of Lundy's Lane historical museum, and the Henry Oakes mansion.

Early Morning Fire Destroys Tishomingo Business.....

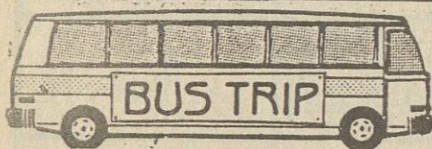
An early Sunday morning fire, March 5, completely destroyed a Tishomingo business, but caused only minimal damage to a building next door.

According to Tishomingo County Arson Investigator Thomas Walker, E-911 received a call at approximately 4:45 a.m. Sunday reporting a fire at Tishomingo Furniture, 1623 Main St., Tishomingo. When fire men from the Tishomingo Volunteer Fire Department arrived, flames were coming out of both the front and roof of the business, Walker said.

Also dispatched to the scene were fire departments from Paden, Midway, Carter's Branch and Iuka, Walker reported.

The blaze was brought under control by firefighters in about an hour with the business owned by Dale Cagle of Belmont, totally destroyed. The firemen were able to save the adjoining building, which houses the Masonic Lodge, which suffered only minor smoke damage and some broken and melted windows, reports indicated.

Walker said that the cause of the fire is still under investigation by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department and the State Fire Marshall's office. He also stated that there were no injuries reported as a result of the blaze.

MAKING THE MOST OF YOUR CLOSETS

Do you have to push and tug to make room in your closets for your clean clothes each week? Do you lay your clothes over a chair or chest until you get around to hanging them up? Do you complain because you always need more closet space?

A lack of clothing storage space is a major problem in many homes. Most homes have two few and too small closets.

Clothing storage areas are needed in at least three areas of your home: Near the front door for guests' and family's coats, near the back door for work and play wraps, and in each bedroom.

As with most things, having a plan will help you determine what is needed. The first thing to do when planning clothing storage is take inventory of your present wardrobe.

Divide your list into items to store on hangers, items stored in drawers, and items that would fit on shelves, racks or hooks. For a closet to be convenient, all the available space should be used.

After finding your storage needs using your inventory and the measurements of your available space, you can custom fit your closets using purchased closet organizers or making your own.

Once you have a place for everything, the next thing is to put everything in its place (and keep it there). Here are some tips for making your closet storage easy to use.

Shoes, purses, belts, ties, scarves, and even jewelry are easily accessible when stored on racks, rods, or hooks.

When two people use the same closet, it is helpful to divide it so that each person has his/her own section.

Plan the storage area so nothing sits on the floor.

Install pull-out trays for sweaters, shirts and other clothing.

Use adjustable shelf space or racks for shoes, purses, and ties.

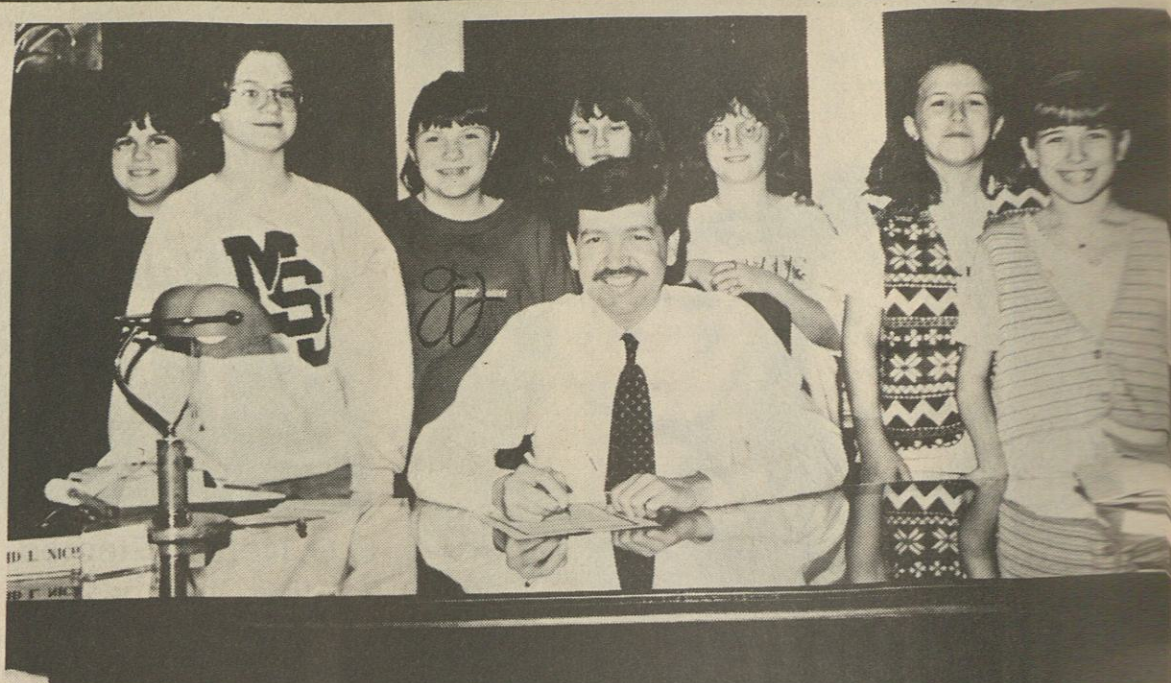
Install adjustable and removable rods in children's closets.

Group clothes according to length. Uniform space beneath hung clothes will be available for another clothes rod or for drawers or shelves.

To store belts attach hooks to the back of the closet door, mount a man's tie rack to the closet door, or screw cup hooks to the bottom of a large wooden hanger.

To store scarves, use a man's pants hanger or clip with clothes pin to a wire hanger.

To store jewelry, use a mug

rack or silverware organizer. To store shoes, use caddies that mount on the closet doors, hang from closet rods, or stand on the floor.

To store handbags, use vertical dividers on closet shelves.

To store mittens, stockings and miscellaneous items, install a wall hanging shoe bag.

These are just a few tips on organizing closet storage space.

In these days of high stress living, being able to find the clothes you want, when you want them will help relieve some of the stress.

Are you interested in losing one to two pounds of weight per week for 10 weeks? If so, you will want to join the Weight-Off-Wisely classes, which will be taught on Monday evenings at 5:00 p.m. at the North Crossroads Fire Department, beginning Monday, March 13, 5:00 p.m.

Weight-Off-Wisely is a ten week program designed to help men and women lose weight through diet and nutrition planning, sensible eating,

modification of existing desirable behavior, and exercise. This program should be used as a tool or stepping stone for individuals to attain successful weight loss. Successful weight loss means losing any weight (pounds or 20 pounds) keeping it off. Success is losing ten pounds during the program and then gaining weight back within a year.

The first session requires a two hours of time, while other sessions last somewhere between 1 and 2 hours. At a session there will be group interaction, a nutrition lesson, exercise.
