### Iuka Aldermen Pass Resolution For Union

Iuka City Aldermen voted to adopt a resolution during their most recent meeting to allow a group of the city's employees to join the Office Professional Employees International Union.

According to City Clerk Benny Gray, the resolution to admit the union passed during the meeting by the vote of 3-1. Aldermen Marvin Baker, James Bates and Leroy Dean voted in favor of the resolution, while Alderwoman Bess Young voted against it. Alderman Herbert Booker was present at the meeting.

Among the City of Iuka employees to be offered membership in the Union will be the public works employees, the policemen and firemen, according to OPEIU Organizer Howard Turberville. He went on to explain that office personnel would also fall under the guidelines for union membership if they wished to join.

Turberville said that the city employees will gain much by joining the Union.

"One major advantage will be the fact that the employees' job security will be taken out of the political arena," Turberville said. "They will not have to have their job security threatened just because a new crop of political figures come into the system."

They will also be given job classifications-something they do not presently have, safety guidelines, order to their pay scales, guidelines for overtime, etc., the Union representative said.

The OPEIU, with its regional office in Birmingham, Ala., is an affiliate of the AFL-CIO. Turberville said that since March of this year, the OPEIU had added 17,000 new members from the Mississippi/Alabama area. One of the organizations largest memberships comes from the Tennessee Valley Authority, he stated.

### Judge Rules In Favor Of Former Tishomingo County Inmate

After hearing testimony during a day and half trial, Judge Joe Pigott has entered a ruling in the 1993 civil rights suit by Billy Cruse against former sheriffs Johnny Nunley and Richard Dobbs and seven present and former supervisors.

The order awarded Cruse \$5,000 in compensatory damages against Nunley and directed that Tishomingo County take immediate action to ensure that there is adequate fresh air ventilation in the cell-blocks of the county jail.

The original suit had asked for punitive and compensatory damages totalling \$1,800,000 as well as an injunction requiring the Board of Supervisors to correct all jail conditions that violated the U.S. Constitution. The order signed by Judge Pigott on July 26, 1995, did not award any punitive damages and focused the injunction on only the ventilation of the jail.

Board of Supervisor attorney Nicholas B. Phillips, who represented the defendants, stated that the county began immediately to follow the injunction part of the order. Phillips said that no decision has been made yet on whether an appeal would be taken on the damages portion of the judge's order.

Cruse was represented by attorney Luke Fisher of Tupelo.

### Bingo Comes Into Iuka City Limits

There's a new kid in town — in Iuka that is — and he's ready for action.

On August 2, a new bingo parlor — AMVETS — opened its doors to the public.

Located in the former Sunflower Supermarket building on old Highway 25 in Iuka, AMVETS opens at 5 p.m. daily for VLC and pull tag bingo play. Regular bingo games start at 6:30 p.m. nightly.

AMVETS, a state and nationally chartered veterans organization, will use its proceeds to benefit veterans organizations, including the Mississippi Veterans Hospital in Jackson.

Though always happy to see the players come who know all about how to play the game, AMVETS welcomes newcomers as well. If it is your first time to play, AMVETS employees will be on hand to assist you.

AMVETS is the second large-scale bingo establishment to locate within Tishomingo County, following Tishomingo Bingo.

## Bates and Smith Lead Democratic Ticket For Sheriff Run-off Election Planned For August 29th Several County Offices To Be Decided

### UNOFFICIAL COUNTY RETURNS

Returns were slow coming in after Tuesday's election due to some hold-ups concerning the Burnsville and Coles Mill boxes. The addition of these boxes could affect the outcomes on several of the races. Therefore, the following local totals are very unofficial.

The top two vote getters, where 50 percent of the total votes cast were not received by any one candidate, will proceed to a run-off in three weeks on August 29. If 50 percent of the total vote was received by any one candidate, he or she will progress to the general election, November 7.

In the race for sheriff of Tishomingo County, Democrats David Smith and Amos Bates will advance to the run-off election. Smith received 2,800 votes to Bates 1,918. Other candidates for sheriff and their totals were Marshal Adams, 193; Donald Deaton, 142; Richard Dobbs, 886; Alvie Johnson, 147; Hubert Lambert, 347; Jackie L. Pruitt, 382; and Steve Rye, 553. On the Republican ticket, the candidates and totals were as follows: Tommy Timms, 103; James Skinner, 149; and Millard Broadway, 20. At press time, it appeared that Timms and Skinner would be in a run-off.

Incumbent Chancery Clerk Hayden Ables (D) received 5,057 votes over opponents James Bates (D), 1372 and Essie Conaway (D), 860.

For the office of Circuit Clerk, incumbent Gerald Parsons did not seek re-election so the person elected will be a newcomer. At press time, it appeared that there would be a run-off between Donna Henry Dill who received 1,746 votes and Bobbie Sue White who received 1,840 votes. Other candidates and totals are as follow: Horace Ledgewood, 1,097; Lynn McBride, 1,231; and Mack Wilemon, 1,556, all Democrats.

For the office of Tax Assessor, incumbent Gaylon Lovelace (D) will be in the run-off with Jimmy "J.T." Trussell (D). Lovelace received 3,314 votes to Trussell's 2,576. Other candidates and their totals were Diana Hester, 1,103; and James "Jim" Kennedy, 400.

The newly created office of tax collector had the following candidates and totals: Paul Whitlock led the pack with 2,846 votes followed by Lynn Harris with 2,071; Carl Booker with 1,234 and Joyce Feltman Murray with 1,134. Whitlock and Harris will progress to the August 29 run-off. All candidates for this office were Democrats.

In the Supervisors' races the following unofficial totals were given at press time: District 1 (All Democrats) Dale Price 1,214; Kenneth W. Dean, 235; and Charles "Chuck" Bullard, 156. Price was the unofficial winner. He has no Republican opponents.

District 2 - (All Democrats) Arlie South 798; Bobby Johnson, 672; Mike Robinson 139; and Carl M. Morris 93. South and Johnson will run it off in three weeks. In District 3- (All Democrats) incumbent Danny Ryan, 883; Michael Busby, 435; and Lyn Parsons, 290. Ryan faces no Republican opposition and is the unofficial winner. In District 4 - (All Democrats) incumbent M.R. Whitehead received 668 votes; David Sanders with 698; Rick Whitfield with 85 and Jerry Stephens with 66. Whitehead and Sanders will run it off August 29.

In the race for Southern District Justice Court Judge, incumbent Willie Joe Sparks, received 1,961 votes over opponent Jack Vaughn, who received 1,070. Sparks (D) has no Republican opposition.

Since incumbent Southern District constable Donald Deaton did not run for the post again the person elected will be a new to the office. Democrats Bryan Southward, who received 844 votes, will progress to the run-off with Roger Young, who had 838 votes. Other Democratic totals were as follows: Luther Troy Goddard, 543 and Bob Kemp, 766. The winner of the Democratic run-off will face Republican Richard Slayton who received 119 votes over his opponents Doyle Wells, 47 votes and Roy Wehrman, 32 votes.

In the race for Northern District Justice Court Judge, incumbent J. R. Blakney, who received 2,024 votes will face Billy D. Glover, Jr., who received 1,147, in the run-off A.T. Marljar, Jr. received 1,017 votes.

In The Northern District Constable race, incumbent Democrat Tim Bivins received 2,650 votes over Roy Lomenick's 1,450 votes. Bivins will face Republican candidate Donny Richardson in November.

### UNOFFICIAL STATE RETURNS

Unofficial primary election results in the state race for governor shows that incumbent Kirk Fordice [R] will be facing Democrat Dick Molpus in the November 7 general election.

Fordice came away with 94 percent of the Republican vote with 97,605 votes. Molpus garnered 329,800 Democratic votes or 77 percent.

In the race for Lieutenant Governor, incumbent Eddie Briggs [R] of DeKalb will face Ronnie Musgrove [D] of Batesville in November. Briggs did not have a Republican opponent in the primary. Musgrove eased past William Guy 229,540 to 199,067.

Since present secretary of state Dick Molpus is making his bid for the office of governor, the office of secretary of state will be filled by a newcomer. Unofficial results show that Democrats Rep. Eric Clark of Taylorsville and Sen. Amy Tuck of Starkville are headed for the August 29 run-off election. The winner of this runoff will face Republican Barbara Blanton, who passed her opponent Chris Webster by a slim margin.

For the State Auditor's race on the Republican ticket Ryan Hood of Clinton led Carl Zimmerman 30,893 to 22,043 votes. Hood will face incumbent Steve Patterson [D] in November.

Insurance Commissioner George Dale [D] easily defeated his opponent, Brad Chism 177,440 votes to 118,794 votes. On the Republican side, J.A. "Jay" Baxter defeated Roy Travis Lewis, 29,008 to 20,244. Dale will run against Baxter in November.

Another office which will welcome a newcomer for this term is the office of commissioner of agriculture and commerce. Incumbent Jim Buck Ross chose not to seek re-election. Ten candidates - five Republicans and five Democrats were vying for their party's nomination. Unofficial results show Lester Spell and Roger Crowder headed for a Democratic run-off in three weeks. On the Republican ticket, it was an extremely close race - at press time it was still too close to determine which candidates will be in the run-off election.

At press time, complete totals for the following State Senate and House races were not available.

In the state senate, District 5 race, incumbent John White [D] defeated Jack Hancock [D], 2691 to 1494 in local returns [Tishomingo County]. Locally on the Republican ticket, Bobby Jarrell received 177 votes and Sam Grisham received 62.

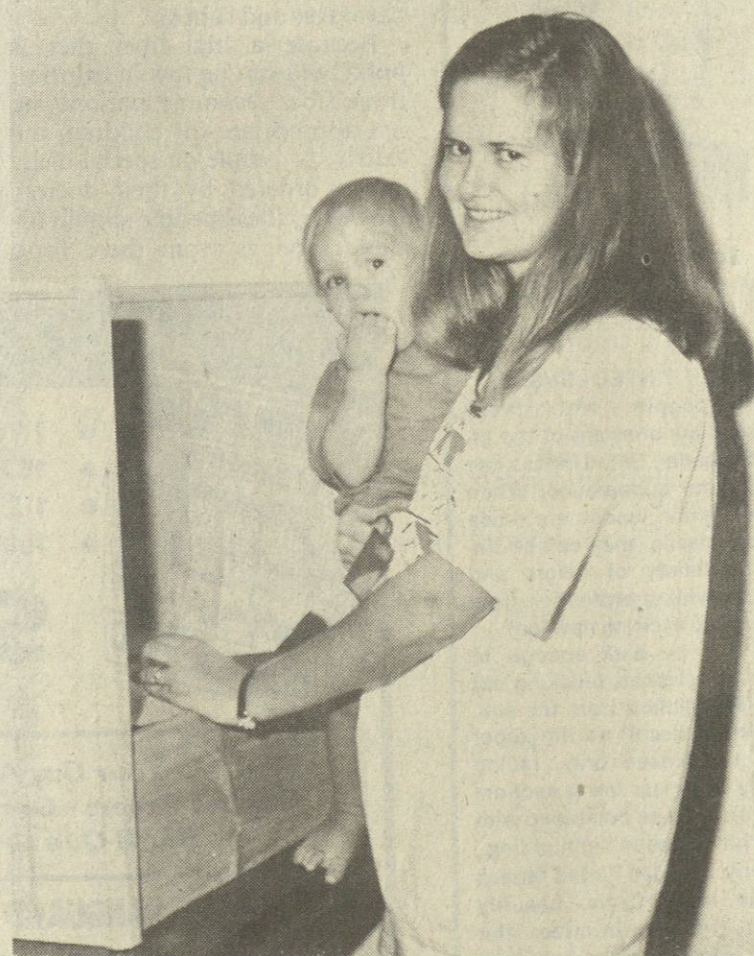
For State Representative, District 1, locally Democratic candidate Ricky Cummings won his party's nomination over write-in candidates Betty Benderman and Lamar Skinner. He will face Republican J.R. Long in November.

In the District 19 House race, Republican Phillip Whitehead will face Democrat James Franks in November.

In the District Attorney's race [District 1], incumbent John Young will face Republican Michael Thorne in the general election, November 7.

The State Treasurer race will also be decided in November as Marshall Bennett [D] faces Walter Michel [R].

Incumbent Attorney General Mike Moore [D] will face Bill Jordan [R] in November.

## Letter To The Editor

Dear Editor:

I have been reviewing your July 27, 1995, issue and would like to pass on to you some comments concerning the Letter to the Editor by Milford W. Jones.

I sincerely hope that Mr. Jones' encounter with a female doctor in the Emergency Room area of the Iuka Hospital was not typical of the service of that facility. He indicated that the doctor refused to stop reading her book and take care of a patient in pain. I would like to hear the doctor's side of the story. If this is typical of her behavior, I hope that I never have to rely on her for medical care. I doubt that such behavior would be condoned by the American Medical Association - or the citizens of Tishomingo County.

You may wonder why someone in Tampa, Florida would show any interest in such an occurrence. (Particularly at a time when Tropical Storm Erin is currently sending torrents of rain against the widow next to me). I assure you that my wife and I maintain strong ties with Tishomingo County, and follow the news with interest. We hope to live in the area when we retire, and we are weighing many factors, such as medical care, that would affect our retirement location.

We purchased a home in Paden, MS many years ago. We also owned a home in Iuka for many years. It served as a place for my wife and children during my lengthy overseas tours. I served almost 33 years with the Air Force, and, as a pilot, was required to spend considerable time in areas where our families could not go.

Three years ago we purchased three additional homes and two mobile homes adjacent to our Paden home. One of these is the old "Paden Hotel." When renovated, this will be our primary home. As you can see, we have quite an investment in the area.

My wife is the former Bobette Nixon. She was born in Tupelo and grew up in Tishomingo County. She graduated from Paden High School, and holds a Ph. D. degree in Adult Education and Linguistics. She is an Adult Education and English as a Second Language instructor for Hillsborough County, Florida. I received a General Agents License and currently work as an agent for an insurance company.

We feel that we would be an asset to any community. We are strong supporters of our church, many other charities, our government, and of our community. We sincerely hope that Mr. Jones' experience is not typical of the staff at the Iuka Hospital. This would force people like us to look elsewhere for a place to spend our senior years.

## Home Economics Tips

### INCREASE FIBER IN YOUR DIET

Grandma called it roughage, health authorities today are considering fiber's potential health benefits while some faddists are touting it with miraculous unproven health benefits. But what is the real story?

Fiber's benefits in the prevention and treatment of constipation have been well established. However, benefits such as protection against heart disease, colon cancer and diabetes are attracting new attention.

To look at possible associations between diet and health, scientists look at whole populations of people. These population studies suggest that a fiber rich diet protects against heart disease, colon cancer and

diabetes. However, the protective effects of fiber are not found in one magic food but in a high-fiber diet. But how much fiber is needed in a healthy diet?

There is not a Recommended Dietary Allowance for fiber. However, The National Cancer Institute recommends from 20 to 35 grams of dietary fiber per day. This recommendation is two to three times higher than what the average American diet contains.

A diet following the recommendations of the Food Guide Pyramid can easily supply the suggested 20 to 35 grams of dietary fiber. This recommended diet includes three to five vegetable servings, two to four fruit servings and six to 11 bread servings daily.

In selecting high fiber foods, remember that variety is an important key to a healthful diet. And that increasing fiber in the diet should be done slowly to avoid any unpleasant effects such as bloating or gas.

Since fiber draws water into the large intestine, be sure to drink plenty of liquids - eight or more cups per day. These fluids can come from a variety of liquids such as milk, juice, other beverages and soups.

Because a high-fiber diet is bulky and can be low in calories, these fiber recommendations are not appropriate for children, the elderly, or people on special diets, unless ordered by their doctor. However, these people should include servings from these food

groups in their diets daily.

Here are five quick tips to increase fiber in your diet:

Try a whole-grain breakfast cereal such as hot oatmeal, bran flakes, raisin bran or wheat flakes. It doesn't have to be 100 percent bran. Look for a cereal with 2 or more grams of dietary fiber per serving listed on the nutrition label.

Choose baked goods made using whole grains, such as wholewheat bread, oatmeal bread or muffins, multigrains bread, bran bread, graham crackers and whole-wheat bagels. Make sure the whole-grain ingredient is listed first or second on the label.

Eat fresh fruit or stewed fruit for dessert or snacks.

Eat fruit and vegetables with their peels. The more processed a fruit or vegetable is the less fiber it potentially has. For example, a whole medium apple has 3 grams of fiber, while a half cup of applesauce has 1.5 grams, and 3/4 cup of apple juice contains only 0.2 grams.

Add cooked or canned dry beans, split peas and lentils to your favorite soups, stews and salads.

Fiber is found in many foods. Include a variety of foods in a variety of forms and you can well see you do not need to take fiber supplements or sprinkle fiber on your foods.

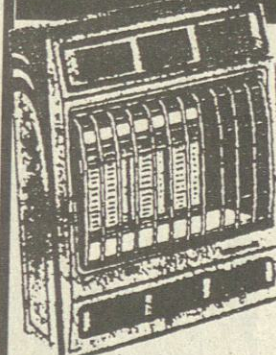
### VALUE OF TINTED LENSES

Many people who wear eyeglasses are unaware of the effect that wearing tinted lenses can have on your appearance. When the prescription lenses are made of optical plastic, they can be tinted in a variety of colors and shades, providing protection from the sun, or an exciting new look.

Tints can be dark enough to serve as sunglasses, blocking out ultraviolet radiation from the sun. Tints can be placed on the upper half of the lenses only, fading gradually to a clear lower section; or one color can be combined with another for cosmetic highlighting.

Properly selected tinted lenses can hide facial flaws, beautify features, and minimize the negative aspects of strong lens prescriptions. Besides the cosmetic benefits, tints can provide functional benefits as well. Many tints afford glare reduction, which is especially important to people who work on video display terminals. Gradient tints can also dim the glare from overhead fluorescent lights thus reducing fatigue.

school or center. Additional copies of the application are available at the administrative office of each facility.

For the school/center officials to determine eligibility, the household must report income information or provide a food stamp or AFDC or FDIPIR (Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations) case number. ## Public Policy Center Assists Local, State Legislators

Only weighing about seven ounces, it can fit in the palm of the hand and serve as a compass, of sorts. When not in use, it slips conveniently in a coat pocket, purse or briefcase. But don't underestimate this tool because of its size.

The Handbook for Mississippi Legislators is packed with information vital to navigating the labyrinth of rules, regulations and organizational structure of the state's House and Senate.

"This handbook is quite useful to the legislators because it takes three sets of rules -- Senate, House and Joint -- and puts them into order," says Dana Brammer, director of the University's Public Policy Research Center (PPRC).

Ole Miss has published the handbook every four years since 1947, and Brammer has edited the last three editions. This summer, Brammer has been working with the clerk of the House and

secretary of the Senate to make any necessary revisions before newly elected officials report for orientation.

The handbook is not the only resource the University provides to lawmakers.

Since 1948, Ole Miss' PPRC and Center for Public Service and Continuing Studies have coordinated a short practical course every four years to help freshman lawmakers.

Founded in 1945 as the Bureau of Public Administration, the PPRC is associated with the Department of Political Science. The Center's mission is to conduct research and public service activities on government and policy issues of interest to public officials and citizens. It publishes research and public policy findings through reports and monographs, as well as a quarterly issues-oriented publication which is indexed by the Public Affairs Information Service for distribution to the Mississippi governmental community.

Brammer is currently conducting preliminary research for the fifth edition of "A Manual of Mississippi Municipal Government." He is a resource for the "State Legislative Sourcebook," a nationwide legislative guide,

and is the author of numerous articles pertaining to local and state government in Mississippi.

"There appears to be an increasing need for universities to participate in the current problems and issues of state and local government," Brammer says. "As society becomes more complex we need more input from people whose business it is to look at legislative acts in other states and other alternatives."

I'm looking outside and the grass looks real neat, after wife mowed it yesterday. She made statement that she didn't like being wife and husband. She even has to take out garbage, and that's bad. Maybe after today I can do a little more to help, the cast comes off my right hand. If it wasn't for her I don't think I could have come thru this as I have. She stayed every minute with me for 3 weeks in the hospital. She even helped me out of bed, and into wheel chair, when I could hardly move. She's short, but she is very strong, and got me to going. I guess I would have still been laying there if not for her. Thanks Dianne, from husband Leon, I love you*

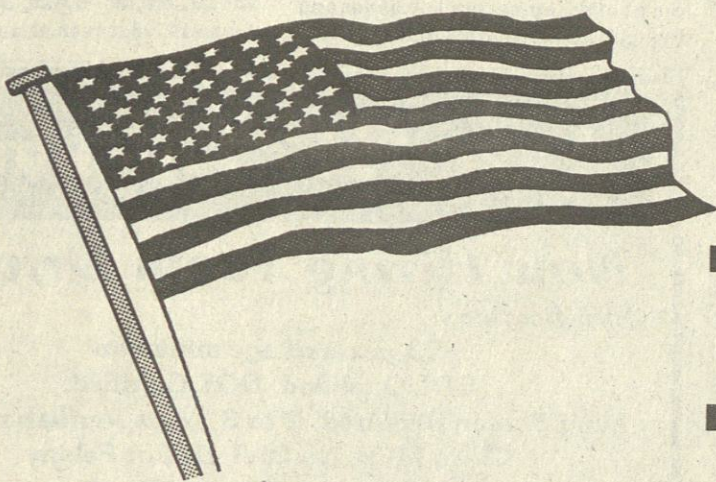
