Lady Braves Advance To North Half Play

Will Now Face Pearl At 8:30 Friday In Oxford

The Lady Braves from Tishomingo County outlasted the Lady Hilltoppers from Houston Monday evening in the opening game of the quarterfinals of the Class 4-A North State Tourney. The game, which was held in Houston, according to coaches, players and fans, was very frustrating with miscues, ball handling mistakes, and missed shots throughout the entire game. The Lady Braves, who shot 5 for 27 in the third quarter finally outlasted the Lady Toppers, who also struggled and were just 1 for 22 at one time.

The Lady Braves will now advance to the semifinals at the Oxford High School Gym on Friday night at 8:30 against Pearl. A win in the semifinals or in Saturday's consolation finals will put Tishomingo County in the State Tournament. As only three teams advance to the State Tournament, the loser of the consolation game will stay at home.

Monday's game, according to Coach Larry Johnson, found the kids tight. "This was the first time they had been in this situation, but every time they needed a big basket, they scored. The girls played great defense, and we're really pleased to be one of the top eight teams in the state. We're tickled to death to be where we are; and Friday and Saturday, we'll turn them loose and see what happens."

Courtney Barnes, a TCHS senior, said, "That's two close ones we've pulled through. I'm glad God has given us the strength not to lose our cool in these tight games." Courtney led the Lady Braves with 11 points and scored seven of the Lady Braves' final 8 points. Sylvia Powell and Christy Glidewell each added 10 points for the Lady Braves.

Kristy Pendergrast said of Monday night's win, "We didn't know what to expect; our shooting was not very good, but our defense took care of it all. We got the job done, and we were ready to chalk up another win and head toward the "Big House" in Jackson."

Nicole Lambert, TCHS's only other senior, is side-lined with a knee injury.

County Farmers To Receive FSA Loans

Emergency loans for farmers, ranchers, and operators are available through the Prentiss County Office of the Farm Service Agency, Harold Mills, FSA Agriculture Credit Manager, said today.

Mr. Mills said this authority is pursuant to Secretary Glickman's declaration on November 9, 1995, of a major disaster in Mississippi, caused by excessive rainfall, insufficient rainfall, extreme heat, drought, and insect infestation which began March 1, 1995. As a result of this major disaster, Tishomingo County, as a primary county in Mississippi, is named as an area eligible for Federal disaster assistance pursuant to Section 321 (a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act.

Applications for assistance in the disaster-stricken county will be accepted by FSA through July 9, 1996, for physical and/or production losses.

Farmers qualifying for emergency loans may borrow up to 80 percent of their actual production loss, not to exceed a maximum of \$500,000 or that actually needed, whichever is less.

FSA Emergency Loans cover losses from designated disaster and are made to qualified farmers who cannot obtain necessary credit from other lenders in the local area.

The owners and operators of M & M Sales, Steve and Quthel McNatt, take pride in the products and workmanship of the utility trailers they manufacture. "We want the customers to be happy with our products, so we build a quality trailer," said Steve McNatt.

Steve and Quthel are a father-son team who work in the family owned business near the Town of Tishomingo. They are primarily a wholesale manufacturer but do sell locally. The business currently has eight full-time employees and should be up to 15 in the near future.

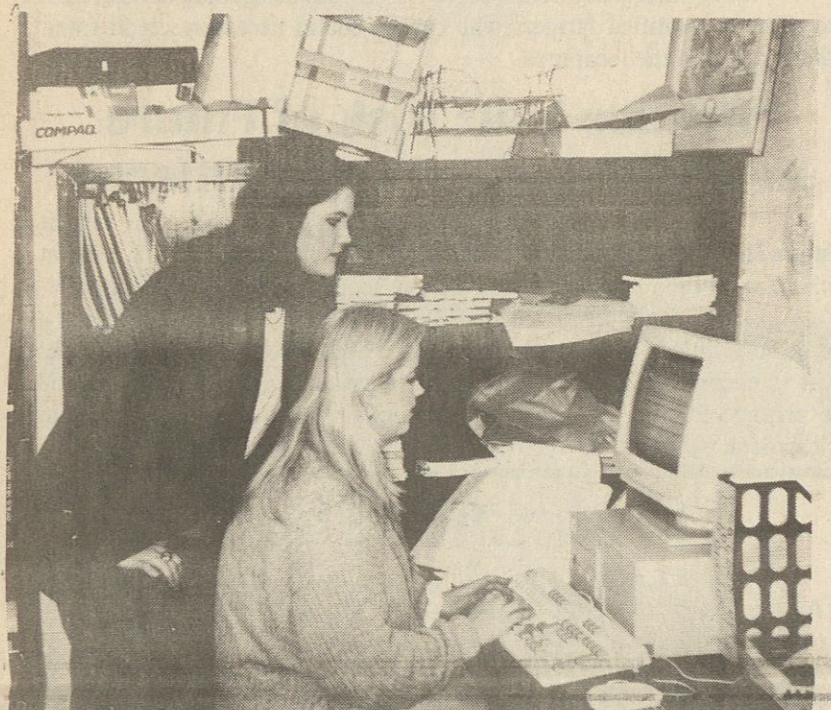

Home Economics Tips

Automatic Dishwashers Getting Great Results

Obtaining the best results from an automatic dishwasher begins with the water that enters the appliance. Dishwasher detergent is designed to work best in hot (140 degrees F.) water.

Water that is hotter can lead to etching. Water that is cooler can cause hard water filming and poor cleaning results.

To check the water temperature, run water in the sink nearest the dishwasher until it's hot, then use a candy thermometer to test the temperature of the running water. If the water temperature is too low, increase the water heater setting. Many newer dishwashers offer the option of heating the water in the dishwasher, which allows the house's main water heater to be set at a lower temperature. If the temperature is too high, lower the water heater setting and do not use the dishwasher's water heating option.

The hardness of the water will affect the amount of detergent to use. There are many ways to determine this hardness. Check with the local utility or water company. The Cooperative Extension office has this information available. If the hardness is 7 to 12 grains/gallon, use extra detergent. If water hardness is greater than 12 grains/gallon, consider installing a water softener.

Scrape or wipe food and bones from the dishes. Load the unrinse dishes following the

dishwasher manufacturer's instructions. Avoid nesting, overlapping or double stacking items. Alternate fork and spoon handles up and down so they do not fit tightly or stack together. Use a detergent specifically designed for automatic dishwashers. Consult the dishwasher manufacturer's instructions and the detergent label to determine the proper amount. Too little detergent can cause soil deposit on dishes, lingering food odors, spotting and filming. Too much detergent may cause detergent residue, fading and etching.

Finally, a rinse agent can help minimize spotting and filming. It can also speed up the drying process by causing water to sheet off dishes and glassware. If there is an automatic rinse agent dispenser, fill it with a liquid rinse

agent. If not, consider using a solid rinse agent.

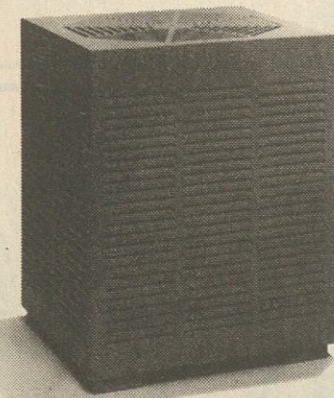

What it will do is keep your male from roaming and getting into fights and your female from attracting all sorts of suitors and winding up pregnant.

On the other hand, if you do wish to breed your dog, you should be prepared to keep a family of puppies eight weeks or more and be sure that you can find a good home for each and every one.
