Man Accused of Leaving Accident Scene Turns Self In

A man accused of leaving the scene of an accident that left a Tishomingo County pastor seriously injured has turned himself in to the Tishomingo County Sheriff.

Michael K. Turner, Iuka, turned himself in Saturday, July 6, to the sheriff according to Chief Deputy Neil Edmonson. He remains in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail until traditional proceedings are completed and he goes to Alabama to stand trial.

There was a felony warrant issued on Turner by the Alabama Highway Patrol after he was reportedly involved in an accident the night of June 12, 1996 on Highway 1 (County Road 1) in Colbert County, Alabama.

Rev. Kobe Fitzgerald received serious injuries in the collision. In Alabama it is a felony to leave the scene of an accident with injuries.

City of Burnsville Rating For Fire Insurance Improved

City Government, Fire Department, Bank & Community Cooperate to Save Residents Insurance Costs

Due to the hard work and cooperation of the members of the Burnsville Volunteer Fire and Rescue with city officials and businessmen, the fire insurance classification for Burnsville has been improved to Eighth class.

The improved rating is due to planned water line extensions throughout the town of Burnsville. There are two contracts to add additional 6-inch water lines with fire hydrants in the works at this time, according to Mayor Bobby H. Johnson.

"We want to cover all the areas that don't already have a hydrant," Johnson said.

The new rating, which was raised from Ninth class to Eighth, has been in effect since March 6, 1996, and will help reduce fire

insurance rates for those covered.

The public fire protection insurance classification number is used as only one of several elements in developing some individual property fire insurance rates, according to a notice from the Mississippi State Rating Bureau. Individual property fire rates are also dependent upon specific construction, occupancy, private protection and exposure from adjacent buildings.

Individual residents can let their insurance agent know about the new rating to, in many cases, get their rates reduced, according to Donnel Timbes, chief of the Burnsville Volunteer Fire and Rescue.

"Call your insurance company and tell them where you live, and tell them to call the [Mississippi

State Rating] Bureau," Timbes said. He said his own insurance had been reduced \$164.

The changes resulting in this rating change have been in the works for five or six years, according to Timbes.

"This is due to good firemen, good support from the community and support of First American National Bank and Charlotte Orrick," said Johnson of the town's improvements. "We have got a great bunch of aldermen," he added.

"The goal is, once these two contracts are completed, to continue letting contracts and installing 6-inch lines until the whole city is fully protected," said Alderman David Nixon.

Union vs. Ormet Waiting Game Continues; Strike Still On After 19 Days

The waiting game continues at the Iuka Ormet Plant, where 38 members of Local 206 have been on strike since midnight June 21st.

The open gates of the plant this Tuesday afternoon were unfortunately not indicative of a more open stand for either the Aluminum, Brick and Glass Workers Union or the Ormet management. Neither side has made any move to end the strike.

Striking worker Leon Holt said there was no change when asked Tuesday afternoon. He has worked 30 years at the aluminum plant.

Ormet's Vice President of Administrative Services Debbie Boger said Monday that the plant is operating with salaried employees.

"We are operating and shipping product to keep our customers committed and will continue to do that for the foreseeable future," Boger said.

"It is just a waiting game," said Delton South, who was taking his turn on the strike "line" Tuesday, "till they offer us something. If it's not better than what the other [offer] was, it'll be a long while."

"We have had a lot of community support," said Hugh Presley on the line Tuesday.

People have brought by money, ice, drinks, they said. "We have gotten support from many you would not expect."

There have been reports of malicious activity thought to perhaps be connected to the strike, but union representatives on the picket line that day said that they were not personally involved in any activity like that.

When asked what they would do if the plant decided to hire new workers, the union workers said they "would cross that bridge when we get to it."

They said they hoped it didn't come to that.

Local plant officials are out of the negotiations, and Ormet's national office in Wheeling, West Virginia is in charge.

For the union, some Local 206 members are involved, but their negotiations are also handled by national union representatives.

According to Local 206 President Troy South the disagreement concerns insurance that was previously paid for by the company. Some union personnel have said under the offered agreement that the workers would be making less in four years than they are now.

Ormet has said that the four-year-agreement offered by them would provide industry-standard pay increases.

Two Killed In One Vehicle Collision

A one vehicle crash near Counce, Tennessee claimed the lives of two young men early Sunday morning, July 7th

Halbert "Bubba" Ray Crum, 28, of Memphis, formerly of Burnsville, and Brian K. Parrish, 21 of Arlington, TN were both killed when the pickup they were in struck a tree. According to reports the accident happened on TN Hwy. 57 16 miles south of Savannah in a curve near Counce. The 1995 Chevy pickup owned and driven by Crum left the road on the right hand side in a right hand curve and struck a tree.

Bubba Crum was a self-employed roofer and had lived in Burnsville and attended Burnsville High School during his youth.

See Your Veterinarian At Least Once A Year For Happier, Healthier Pets

All Vaccinations should be brought up to date. These include:
For cats: Panleukopenia (Feline Distemper), Feline Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus, Feline Pneumonitis (Upper Respiratory Diseases). Discuss vaccination for Feline Leukemia (Feline Rabies and other concerns with your veterinarian.

For dogs: Canine Distemper, Hepatitis, Parvovirus, Parainfluenza, Coronavirus, Rabies.

Rabies vaccinations required by law in most states should be given to all dogs and cats at intervals recommended by your veterinarian.

Your pet should be checked for internal parasites (fecal analysis). Dogs should be checked annually for Heartworm Disease by a simple blood test.

Your pet should be checked for external parasites (fleas, ticks, etc.).

Your veterinarian will examine your pet's eyes, ears, mouth, skin and haircoat for any evidence of problems.

Your veterinarian will listen to your pet's heart and palpate its abdomen for abnormalities.

Your pet will be weighed. Discuss proper diet with your veterinarian and be sure your pet does not become overweight.

Ask your veterinarian to care for your pet's teeth at home. Your veterinarian will recommend professional cleaning.

If you pet has not been spayed or neutered, discuss the procedures with your veterinarian. Spaying and neutering can decrease the risk of some health problems and help prevent serious overpopulation problems in homeless pets.

Home Economics Tips

Plug Into Electrical Safety

Here are some simple dos and don'ts to ensure safe use of plugs, cords, switches and receptacle outlets.

* DO use extension cords only on a temporary basis.

* DO put safety covers on unused receptacle outlets and extension cords.

* DO unplug the appliance and call an electrician if the receptacle faceplate feels hot or if

there is sparking, smoke or odor coming from the outlet, plug or appliance.

* DO examine cords (appliance and extension cords) regularly for signs of wear and tear and damage to insulation.

* DO unplug all nonessential electrical appliances when not in use.

* DO test GFCEs periodically according to manufacturer's instructions to determine that they

are working properly.

* DO only use extension cords listed by a recognized certification organization such as UL.

* DON'T attach extension cords to the wall with nails or staples.

* DON'T put extension cords under rugs or in high traffic areas, or rest anything on an extension cord.

* DON'T overload cords with more than the proper electrical load.

* DON'T touch any appliance that has emitted an electrical shock until the appliance has been unplugged.

* DON'T place any appliances near water, such as a sink or a bathtub.

* DON'T place any appliance cord so that it will come in contact with a hot surface.

* DON'T leave any wiring exposed in outlets and switches; obtain the correct sized faceplate.

* DON'T ignore switches or receptacle outlets that don't work. Obtain the help of a qualified electrician.

* DON'T let cords hang over counter tops where children can pull an appliance off the counter.

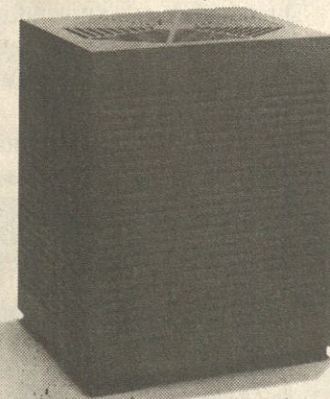

CHILDREN AND STIES

The common sty is simply an infection of one of the small glands that lie along the eyelid margin. Sties first appear as painful, red lumps on the edge of the eyelid. In their later stages, a head of whitish puss will appear. If sties appear often, a chronic infection of the eyelid may be the cause.

Sties occur more frequently among school children than adults. This is not, as you might assume, because children tend to "pick up" infections in school. Sties are not contagious and cannot be passed from person to person. Rather, it is more likely because children's glandular secretions are more erratic, particularly during puberty. Also, children tend to be less careful than adults about keeping their hands clean and away from their eyes.

Sties are treated with hot compresses. Antibiotic drops or ointment to control infection are often prescribed. If treatment is begun early, it will usually clear up the sty in a couple of days.

With Gold Medals Won At 5th Annual State Games

Lambert & Holly Lead North Team to Gold Medal in State Games of Miss.

The 1996 North District Baseball Team made history this year by winning the State Games of Mississippi Gold Medal for the first time in tournament action June 28-30.

The North squad finished the 3-day tournament in Meridian with a 3-1 record, including two thrilling come-from-behind wins.

On Friday, June 28, the North upset the favored South squad 6-4 behind the hitting of Tishomingo County High School's Ricky Lambert. After falling behind 2-0 in the top of the first, the North put a runner on first and Lambert set the stage for the rest of the tournament.

Pascagoula pitcher Blair Varnes (15-0, .74 ERA) delivered a fast ball and Lambert crushed a Mickey Mantle-style home run deep to right center. This mammoth home run seemed to shake the South squad and the North went on to capture a 6-4 victory.

The North came back on Saturday and defeated the South Central team 4-3 in extra innings, again behind the hitting and pitching of Lambert and several defensive gems by shortstop Blake Holly.

The North advanced to the championship game on Sunday, and had to face the North Central team, which featured seven players from the 43-0 New Hope team.

The defending North Central team crushed the North 23-0 in the first game Sunday, forcing a second game for the state title.

In the second game, the North trailed 3-0 going into the bottom

of the sixth inning before the North rallied again behind the hitting of Ricky Lambert, and Chris Jones of Amory to tie the score at 3-3. The score tied, the North came to bat in the bottom of the 8th inning.

Ben Moore, of Alcorn Central, led off with a walk, and he was sacrificed to second by Eddie Eldred (Southaven). Blake Holly was intentionally walked to put runners at first and second. Josh West (Hamilton) hit a ground ball to second that looked like a

sure double play, but Blake Holly, with some great base running, took out the shortstop, preventing the double play. Holly was called safe at second, to load the bases with one out.

Then North Central brought in a relief pitcher from Noxapater who threw in the high 80s. He struck out Lambert in three pitches and had two strikes on two pitches against Chris Jones.

The sixth pitch of the inning hit Jones in the back, forcing home the winning run and giving the North squad the Mississippi State Games Championship and first ever Gold Medal in baseball.

Coach Steve Lyles, an Iuka native and member of the 1974 state championship team from Iuka High School, led the North team. Lyles is head baseball and football coach at South Pontotoc.

Now in their fifth year, the State Games of Mississippi are open to amateur athletes. The all-star format baseball tournament was played by high school players that will graduate in 1997 and 1998. They were chosen from tryouts held state-wide.

150 Gather for 48th Annual Reunion and Meeting of Tishomingo High School Alumni

The Tishomingo Alumni Association celebrated its 48th Annual Reunion last Saturday with 150 alumni, spouses and faculty members attending a banquet and the annual meeting in the Tishomingo Elementary Cafeteria.

One of the main items on the agenda for the annual meeting of the association was to write a letter to the Tishomingo County School Board stressing the importance of rebuilding the principal's house, a turn-of-the-century stone structure on the campus that was heavily damaged in an April fire. Current Principal Danny McClung, as well as Association President Lowell Wynn, stressed the importance of maintaining the old house, which dates from the days when Tishomingo Agricultural High School was a boarding school.

Other infrastructure projects at the school will receive alumni association funds this year, including repair of steps and sidewalks at the school. These kinds of items are the kind that sometimes must be cut from the increasing demands of the school's budget. They usually donate \$200 to the school library, as well. The school is fortunate to have alumni who still make a contribution to the maintenance of their alma mater.

In addition to all her contributions to the association over the years, she has been doing the association's obituary report for years, and scours all the area papers throughout each year for reports of deaths of former Tishomingo students. Mrs. Timbes was a teacher for years at the school, as well as the senior graduate attending reunions for the past several years.

The class of 1946 celebrated 50 years since graduation with 8 of the original 12 graduates attending, which gave them the award for largest percentage attending for honored years. Coker McRae, Evelyn Mills, Christine Morgan, Rachel Pennington Thornton and Jim Vanos, who travels from Ohio for almost every year's meeting.

Malcolm Holley and Orville Bostick were recognized for having attended all 48 class reunions the association has had.

Current Tishomingo Principal Danny McClung welcomed the group and thanked them for their support throughout the years. He reported that Rodney Johnson and Angela Grisham were the graduates that received the alumni association scholarships this year. Johnson, who graduated from Belmont, plans to attend Northeast Mississippi Community College this fall, and Grisham, a TCHS graduate, will go to Mississippi State.

The always entertaining Karl Underwood gave away many door prizes, generously donated by local businesses, and after quite an ear-piercing encounter with the public address system, donated \$100 toward a new PA system for the school. SEASON LISTINGS: Bag limits are the same as statewide unless noted in the "COMMENTS" section. No other seasons shall be open and no other animals shall be hunted or molested without written permission from area manager.

WATERFOWL: All man-made impoundment areas, where waterfowl hunting is allowed, will be open on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays from one-half hour before sunrise until 12:00 noon. No waterfowl hunting allowed from river mile marker 360.8 south to Aberdeen Lock and Dam. The remainder of Canal Section WMA may be hunted each day from one-half hour before sunrise until sunset.

PERMITS: All visitors must obtain a daily use permit from one of the self-service stations. This permit must be filled out by each user and carried on their person. Before leaving the area, users must complete the reverse side of the permit card and deposit it in the drop box at one of the permit stations.

PREDATORS: Beaver, coyote, and hogs may be taken during any open season (daylight hunting hours only) with weapons and ammunition legal for that season.

GUNS: Only .22 caliber rimfire rifles and shotguns with No. 2 shot or smaller shall be allowed for small game hunting. No .22 magnums allowed for night hunting. Only centerfire rifles, centerfire handguns, shotguns with slugs and primitive weapons shall be used for hunting deer. No other firearm may be possessed with a handgun.

DOGS: No dogs for deer hunting. No dogs allowed on the area during closed seasons.

VEHICLES: Vehicles allowed only on roads shown on map unless closed by gates, cables or signs.

CAMPING: No camping allowed.

HORSES: Horseback riding is prohibited on the area except on levee roads from March 1 to August 31.

HANDICAPPED ACCESS: The designated area for special access is all land from Hwy. 6 south to Hwy. 278 between Town Creek and the old Tombigbee River included in the Canal Section WMA. Persons eligible to hunt on Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks handicapped access hunting areas are those who are:

1. Quadriplegic
2. Paraplegic
3. Disabled, requiring mobility support from braces and/or crutches.

Call or write the Holcut Office for permit and additional information.

FIRES: No fires allowed on the area.

LITTER: Trail marking material will be considered litter and is illegal.

TITLE 36-CFR REGULATIONS will be enforced on all U. S. Corps of Engineer property.

CLOSED AREAS: Only primitive weapons may be used for deer hunting on those areas between the old Tombigbee River and the Tenn-Tom Waterway: (1) from Walker's Levee Road south to old Hwy. 78, (2) from the Ironwood Bluff Road south to Hwy. 6 and (3) from Hwy. 45 south to the southern end of the Hickleson Lake Cut-off (river mile marker 351.7). Archery equipment only for deer on the island between Matubby Creek and old Tombigbee River. No deer hunting from Tenn-Tom Waterway Levee.

NIGHT HUNTING: Night hunting only for raccoon, opossum and bobcat. Hours are one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise.

BAITING AND FEEDING: No bait or feed is allowed on the area at any time. Hunting over bait or feed is prohibited. No food plots may be placed on the area.

SEASON LISTINGS: All bag limits are the same as statewide unless noted in the "COMMENTS" section. No other seasons shall be open and no other animals shall be hunted or molested without permission from Area Manager.

YOUTH AND HANDICAPPED HUNTERS: Deer hunting on the Jackson Camp Peninsula is restricted to youth and handicapped hunters. Saturday hunting on this area will be reserved for handicapped hunters only. Vehicular access will be allowed to individual hunt stations on Saturdays only. All youth and handicapped hunters must register at the Holcut Office prior to hunting deer on the Jackson Camp Peninsula. Call or write for information. Youth hunters (ages 8 - 15) must be accompanied by an adult twenty-one (21) years or older at all times. * Persons eligible to hunt on Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks handicapped access hunting areas are those who are:

1. Quadriplegic
2. Paraplegic
3. Disabled, requiring mobility support from braces and/or crutches

PERMITS: All visitors must obtain a daily use permit from one of the self-service stations. This permit must be filled out and displayed on the dash of the vehicle so that the name and address are visible from the outside. Before leaving the area, users must complete the reverse side of the permit and deposit it in the drop box at one of the permit stations. A U.S. Army Corps of Engineers permit is not required for hunting this area.

DATA COLLECTION: All deer harvested must be checked at area headquarters for biological data collection before leaving the area.

PREDATORS: Beaver, coyote, and hogs may be taken during any open season (daylight hunting hours only) with weapons and ammunition legal for that season.

NIGHT HUNTING: Night hunting only for raccoon, opossum and bobcat. Hours are one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise.

GUNS: Only .22 caliber rimfire rifles and shotguns with No. 2 shot or smaller shall be allowed for small game hunting. No .22 magnums allowed for night hunting. Youth and handicapped hunters may use primitive weapons, centerfire handguns, centerfire rifles or shotguns with slugs (no buckshot) for deer hunting during the gun seasons on Jackson Camp Peninsula. No other firearm may be possessed with a handgun.

NO DOGS: No dogs allowed on the area during closed seasons.

VEHICLES: Vehicles allowed only on roads shown on map unless closed by gates, cables, or signs. ATVs are not allowed on the area.

CAMPING: No camping allowed.

HORSES: Horseback riding is prohibited on the area except on hard surface roads from March 1 to August 31.

FIRES: No fires allowed on the area.

LITTER: Trail marking material will be considered litter and is illegal.

TITLE 36-CFR REGULATIONS will be enforced on all U. S. Army Corps of Engineer property.

CLOSED AREA: Jackson Camp Peninsula will be closed to small game hunting each Saturday from Nov. 23 through Jan. 18.

BAITING AND FEEDING: No bait or feed is allowed on the area at any time. Hunting over bait or feed is prohibited. No food plots may be placed on the area.

A union activist throughout his working life, Grisham was appointed in 1950 to his first job as an organizer for the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America.

He soon won elective office in the union and repeated that victory in popular membership elections every two years for the next 36 years, until his retirement in 1986 as the statewide secretary-treasurer and business manager of the Michigan Carpenters' Council of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America.

In his retirement, he returned to small-scale farming, growing a wide variety of Michigan apples, grapes, and berries, magnificent tomatoes that were the envy of everyone in his neighborhood, and an occasional watermelon that never lived up to those he and his father had raised on their farm north of Iuka.

He and his wife created their own design and used their own labor to build their orchard Lake home to which they moved from Northwest Detroit in 1978.

He was a lifelong member of the Free and Accepted Masons.

At his request, there was no funeral service.
