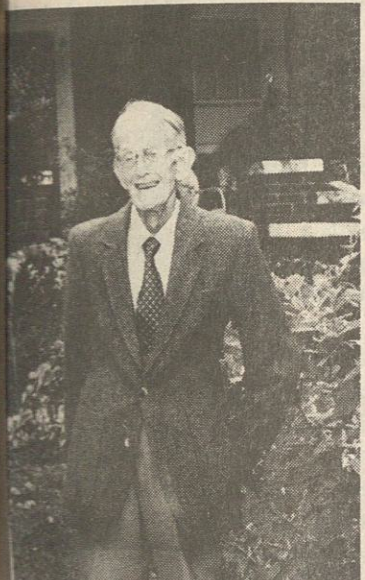

### Two Arrested For Eastport Cabin Break In

Two people were arrested for breaking into a cabin near Eastport Marina on September 7th.

Steve Smith, 31, and Karla Parrish, 39, were arrested September 14th and each charged with one count of breaking and entering and one count of grand larceny, according to Tishomingo County Sheriff David Smith.

Some of the stolen property has been recovered, but the investigation is ongoing, said Smith. Additional arrests are expected.

### Southern Apprenticeship & Training Opened Last Thursday; First Class to Come Through Next Week

About one hundred people gathered at Yellow Creek site last Thursday to hear how Southern Apprenticeship and Training's new industrial training facility would benefit the area by training local people to take their place in the workforce.

The new training operation is projected by the state to bring in at least \$410,000 yearly to the area. Businesses such as restaurants and hotels are expected to especially benefit from the 100 or so people per month that will have to stay in the area for days or a week at a time while taking training courses.

The SAT operation will occupy a portion of the administrative building at the site for classroom facilities to train industrial and construction workers in OSHA (Occupational Safety and Health Administration)-approved or required courses such as hazardous material handling, asbestos and lead abatement, and even radiation training. Participants will also be trained to operate the latest construction equipment, which is necessary to keep up with new machines that require more and more technological expertise, said Randy Norris, training administrator for Southern Apprenticeship and Training (SAT).

Norris said that the training operation will be two-fold. They

will train people with little or no skill who are interested in learning, and who are selected through the job service and the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training. To be certified through a typical apprenticeship program, 144 hours on-site training is necessary.

Another group coming in for training will be industry workers already operating in jobs across the region and country who need periodic or annual re-certification, said Norris.

Clients who will be sending workers for training, said Norris, will include the U.S. Departments of Energy and Defense, and the Tennessee Valley Authority, as well as private industry.

Norris stressed that SAT is a training organization that is not an OSHA compliance operation and that there would not be OSHA "inspectors" at SAT.

#### First Class Next Week

Norris said that they will be having their first class next week and expect 10 to 12 men to attend for hazardous material (HAZMAT) re-certification 8-hour course. Local residents will be the first to benefit, said Norris, as the attendees will be from Tishomingo, Alcorn and Prentiss counties.

#### SAT Background

The training operation is not a new one, according to Bennie L. Splain, Jr., one of the trustees of

SAT.

The original training operation began in 1978 in Crystal Springs, Mississippi, where it was located until this move to Yellow Creek, which has been in the works for years, said Splain. Funding to operate the operation comes from employers who recognize the need for training, said Splain. He also said that as a non-profit organization, they apply for and receive different grants for special projects.

#### Community Contributions

Splain explained that SAT is eager to make a contribution the community.

"This is a lease agreement with the state [to use the Yellow Creek facility]," Splain said. "But we look upon it as a partnership with the state and community."

SAT will be training construction workers to operate machinery in a hands-on fashion, explained Splain. So as they operate machinery, they will be making improvements to not only the Yellow Creek site, but will also be available for work for non-profit groups.

"The law prevents us from doing charitable work for 'for-profit' organizations," Splain said. But he went on to say they could do things like build ball fields, or prepare church parking lots.

### 5-Vehicle Pileup on Southbound Highway 25 Tues.

Five vehicles were involved in a collision Tuesday afternoon on Highway 25 south of Iuka, near New Prospect Church.

About 3:14 p.m., a pickup truck driven by Mindy Kay Phifer collided into the rear of Janice Slack's vehicle, who was then pushed into the rear of Milt Burton's vehicle, who had stopped behind a car turning left on southbound Highway 25.

Brenda Webb, of Tishomingo, had swerved to avoid the accident and was already stopped when she was hit by Hugh M. Bobo from behind.

A school bus was stopped behind the accident, but was not involved, according to Officer Jerry Boyd, MS Highway Patrol.

Four involved in the accident were taken by ambulance to Iuka Hospital, but no serious injuries were reported. All drivers were wearing their seat belts, said Boyd.

## Circuit Court Arraignments

### Job Service Manager Indicted For Chop Shop Operation

The manager of the Mississippi Employment Security Commission job service office in Iuka was arraigned in circuit court Tuesday on a four-count grand jury indictment, including one charge of running a chop shop in Tishomingo County.

Wilburn "Bud" Young, 52, was arrested late Monday by Mississippi Highway Patrol and Tishomingo County Sheriff Department officers and charged with owning and operating a chop shop, two counts of possession of a motor vehicle with an altered vehicle identification number, and one count of receiving stolen property, according to the indictment passed down by the grand jury on September 10, 1996.

Young, an Iuka resident, pled not guilty in Tishomingo County Circuit Court and was released on \$20,000 bond. The case was continued until the January court term at the request of his attorney, Richard Bowen.

#### Other Circuit Court Action

In other Tuesday circuit court action under the Honorable Barry Ford, Russell Wayne "Candy Man" Malone, 38, of Sheffield, Alabama, was arraigned on a multiple-count indictment including sale of marijuana, sale of cocaine, possession of marijuana with intent to sell, possession of cocaine with intent to sell, possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, and two counts of aggravated assault on a police officer.

Malone, indicted as a habitual offender for two prior felony convictions in Alabama according to Assistant District Attorney Jim Pounds, sought to get his bail reduced from \$100,000 to a maximum \$50,000. He had been incarcerated in the Tishomingo County Jail since an incident on May 14, 1996 in which Belmont police officers were fired at during a high speed

car chase.

Malone and two others were arrested at the time, and two pounds of marijuana, and 33 rocks of crack cocaine were seized when the suspects were taken into custody. Pounds said that Malone is in parole violation in Alabama, as well.

Last week in Tishomingo County Circuit Court, Matthew Queen, 26, of Haleyville, Alabama pled guilty to fondling a 17-year-old young man and, upon the recommendation of the victim and his mother, the court handed down a five-year sentence, which was suspended, and placed Queen under three years of probation. He is required to pay a \$500 fine, \$750 in attorney fees and court costs. Queen is permitted by the court to reside in Alabama until his probation can be transferred there, according to the September 9, 1996 supervised probation order.

Also on September 9th, Claudia L. Holloway pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance (placidyl) and was

sentenced to one year in the intensive supervision house arrest program, in which she is required to wear an electronic monitoring device 24 hours a day.

Also last week, Jeffery L. Puckett pled guilty to burglary and larceny of an occupied dwelling at night with a deadly weapon and was sentenced to ten years with the Mississippi Department of Corrections, nine of which were suspended. The remaining one is to be served concurrent with a Franklin County, Alabama case, and the defendant was required to pay court cost and a fine, and was remanded to custody of the sheriff until being transported to the Alabama Department of Corrections.

Circuit Court continues for the rest of this week, with more arraignments scheduled.

## Home Economics Tips

**Tips For Shopping Thrift Stores**

A week or so ago I spotted an article in a newspaper's feature section about the growing popularity of buying used clothing. I was reminded of this on seeing the abundance of good clothing at the Homemaker Volunteer's yard sale at Midway Saturday.

For various reasons, shopping thrift, secondhand or re-use stores is currently a very popular trend. Clothing costs that are skyrocketing, people turning over their wardrobes more often, and concern for the world's ecology all support this popular shopping craze. In addition, most of us love a bargain,

and it is a thrill to make a "find."

Thrift shops are frequently found under various names in most larger cities and some smaller ones, in both affluent and less-affluent neighborhoods. When I lived near Nashville, I discovered a great one in the Green Hills area. One of the largest thrift sales in Mississippi is held twice each year in Greenville. It's the Steinmart clearance sale, often called the Saks Fifth Avenue sale.

In shopping these stores and sales, it is well to consider that previously used clothes come in several categories with corresponding price tags. Some of the categories you will find are antique clothing

(recently popular among the college crowd), moderately priced (perhaps outgrown or undersize), extremely expensive (same reasons), and designer or designer originals which are still expensive but considerably discounted from the original price.

Much of the more expensive clothing is on consignment, where clothing or merchandise is sold for individuals and both they and the store earn a percentage of the discounted price.

Unlike new merchandise stores, thrift shops may not have adequate dressing rooms, good lighting or sales people to assist you. Clothing may be stuffed on racks and selections is not always consistent.

Successful bargain hunting is an art that can be acquired with great results simply by following a few guidelines.

\* Keep up with current styles, prices and colors. Just because an item is cheap, the value may be even less than marked if it is not considered fashionable. Classic styles that bridge over several seasons are usually the best deals.

\* A good quality, tightly constructed fabric that doesn't have a worn surface or obvious pilling will be your best choice. Watch corduroy, velvet and other pile fabrics for crushed or flattened naps that are sometimes impossible to revive.

Wool, linen, cotton and silk are excellent secondhand choices if they have been well cared for by previous owners. Avoid dated polyesters, fabric designs and colors.

\* Look past the junk and spot the truly valuable or functional pieces of clothing. Consider your findings valuable only if they work for your wardrobe needs. Shop with a purpose or a specific item in mind.

\* Take time to check the jammed racks and stacks for buried treasures. Also, take time to check garments carefully for stains, tears or missing pieces.

\* Keep in mind that the turnover is usually rapid in thrift shops and there is no guarantee for selection or replacement, so check the stock frequently.

Remember, too that one of the thrills in secondhand shopping is knowing you can "dicker" on price. Often the ticket price can be questioned for an even better bargain, whether shopping one of the upscale shops or a neighborhood garage sale.

It's not surprising that older individuals think their eyesight is improving when they find themselves able to read the newspaper without their glasses. The truth is they are becoming more nearsighted which can be a sign of early cataract development.

Cataracts can best be described as a clouding of the eye's natural lens. Today cataracts are the leading cause of vision loss among people 55 and older. The development of a cataract will vary from person to person, but as a general rule, cataracts develop over a period of time. It was once believed that a cataract had to be "ripe" before it could be removed. The time to remove a cataract is when it handicaps vision enough to interfere with your daily activities.

Cataracts are removed surgically - not by lasers. After cataract surgery, a membrane within the eye may become cloudy. An opening in this membrane can then be made with a laser. The use of the laser should not be confused with the surgical removal of the cataract.

Fulton Campground, located on Pool C of the Tenn Tom Waterway will remain open all winter.

Facilities north of Amory, MS that will be closed for the winter as of 1 November, 1996 are as follows: waterborne toilets at boat ramp areas, scenic overlooks and picnic areas. The boat ramps themselves will remain open, only the restrooms will be closed for the winter. All the above facilities that will be closing as of 1 November, 1996 will reopen in March 1997.

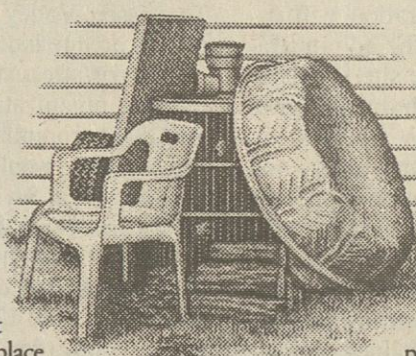
Army National Guard Pvt. Chip W. Martin has graduated from the motor transport operator course at Fort Leonard Wood, Waynesville, MO.

**WORMS ATTACKING OAK TREES**

I've received many calls this fall concerning worms eating the

leaves on oak trees. I get two questions. "What are they?" and "How do I kill them?" The ones that I have seen are yellowish green with a narrow white stripe

down the center of the back with a brown and yellow stripe down each side. The common name for this is the variable oakleaf caterpillar (scientific name - *Heterocampa mameo*). I have also gotten descriptions of what appears to be gypsy moth caterpillars. They are brownish gray with tufts of hair on each segment and a double row of five pairs of blue spots followed by six pairs of red spots. In many cases these caterpillars completely defoliate the tree. Control of these pests may or may not be easy. Natural controls such as parasites and predators or harsh weather usually gives good enough control. This year was not the case. Chemical control can be used but you must be able to get the chemical on the insect and many times we're talking about a large oak tree. The good thing is that trees can tolerate a lot of defoliation and still survive. If we see major defoliation next spring and following fall, then we need to be concerned about the health of the tree and take protective steps.

## Unemployment Rises to 10.8%

According to Jimmy Rowland, Manager of the Mississippi State Employment Service, unemployment in Tishomingo county rose to 10.8 percent in mid-July. This compares to 8.7 percent in June and 6.2 percent in July, 1995.

The civilian labor force for the county numbered 10,880, 360 more than June and 380 more than July, 1995. Approximately 9,710 Tishomingo county residents held jobs in mid-July while 1,170 were unemployed.

Manufacturing jobs in the county numbered 3,790, 20 less than June but 30 more than July one year ago. Nonmanufacturing jobs numbered 3,240, 20 less than June and 80 less than June, 1995.

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka, Mississippi, took up for consideration the matter of issuing general obligation bonds to said Municipality in the maximum principal amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000). After a discussion of the subject, Alderman Booker offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, TO ISSUE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF SAID MUNICIPALITY IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$250,000) TO RAISE MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING IMPROVING AND PAVING STREETS AND PURCHASING LAND THEREFOR, AND DIRECTING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF SUCH INTENTION.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka, Mississippi (the "Governing Body"), acting for and on behalf of the City of Iuka, Mississippi (the "Municipality"), hereby finds, determines, adjudicates and declares as follows:

1. It is necessary and in the public interest to issue general obligation bonds of the Municipality in the maximum principal amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) to raise money for the purpose of constructing, improving and paving streets and purchasing land therefor.

2. The assessed value of all taxable property within the Municipality, according to the last completed assessment for taxation Fourteen Million One Hundred Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Nine Dollars (\$14,108,794); the Municipality has outstanding bonded indebtedness subject to the fifteen percent (15%) debt limit prescribed by Section 21-33-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, in the amount of One Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$140,000), and outstanding bonded floating indebtedness subject to the twenty percent (20%) debt limit prescribed by Section 21-33-303, Mississippi Code of 1972 (which amount includes the sum set forth above subject to the 15% debt limit), in the amount of One Million Six Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$1,630,000); the issuance of the bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued, when added to the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the Municipality, will not result in bonded indebtedness, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid fifteen percent (15%) debt limit, of more than fifteen percent (15%) of the assessed value of taxable property within the Municipality, and will not result in indebtedness, both bonded and floating, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid twenty percent (20%) debt limit, in excess of twenty percent (20%) of the assessed value of taxable property within the Municipality and will not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation upon indebtedness which may be incurred by the Municipality.

3. The Municipality reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures for the Authorized Purpose prior to the issuance of the Bonds (as such terms are hereinafter defined), and that it should declare its official intent to reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of the Bonds upon the issuance thereof.

4. The Municipality is authorized by Sections 21-33-301 through 21-33-329, Mississippi Code of 1972, to issue the Bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued for the purpose hereinafter set forth, for which purpose there are no other available funds on hand.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Governing Body hereby declares its intention to issue general obligation bonds of the Municipality in the maximum principal amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) (the "Bonds") to raise money for the purpose of constructing, improving and paving streets and purchasing land therefor (the "Authorized Purpose"). Pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulation (the "Reimbursement Regulations"), the Governing Body hereby declares its official intent to reimburse expenditures made for the Authorized Purpose prior to the issuance of the Bonds with proceeds of the Bonds to the extent permitted by the Reimbursement Regulations. The Bonds will be general obligation of the Municipality payable as to principal and interest out of and secured by an irrevocable pledge of the avails of a tax to be levied annually upon the taxable property within the geographical limits of the Municipality, with tax, together with any other moneys available for such purpose, shall be sufficient to provide for the payment of the principal of and the interest on the Bonds according to the terms thereof.

SECTION 2. The Governing Body proposes to direct the issuance of the Bonds in the amount, for the purpose and secured as aforesaid, at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at its regular meeting place in the City Hall of the Municipality at 5:00 o'clock P.M. on October 14, 1996, or some meeting held subsequent thereto. If ten percent (10%) of the qualified electors of the Municipality, or fifteen hundred (1,500), whichever is the lesser, shall file a written protest with the Clerk of the Municipality against the issuance of such Bonds on or before the aforesaid date, then the Bonds shall not be issued unless authorized at an election on the question of the issuance of such Bonds to be called and held as provided by law. If no protest be filed, then such Bonds may be issued without an election on the question of the issuance thereof at any time within a period of two (2) years after the date above specified.

SECTION 3. This resolution shall be published once a week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in and having general circulation in the Municipality and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972. The first publication of this resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date fixed herein for the issuance of the Bonds, and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date.

SECTION 4. The Clerk of the Municipality is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of the publication of the resolution and have the same before this Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 2 hereof.

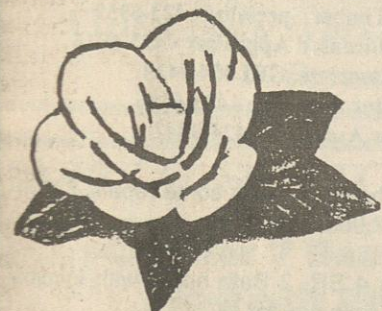

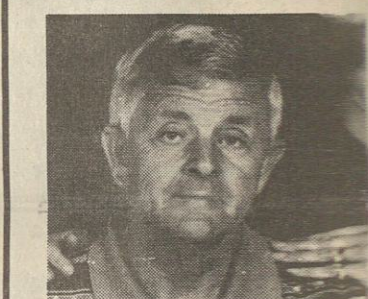
