Circuit Court Action Continued Through Friday

Tishomingo County Circuit Court Judge Barry W. Ford continued his busy week in the county with several cases and pleas heard Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

Lorene Allison Hall Allen pled guilty to the charge of accessory after the fact of grand larceny, and was placed on 2 1/2 years probation and ordered to pay court costs and fines in the amount of \$948.

Jose Earnesto Cruz pled guilty to charges of uttering a forged instrument and received a sentence of five years that was suspended. He was placed on probation for three years and ordered to be immediately transported to the Hinds Co. Restitution Center where he is to remain until \$2,287.90 in restitution, fines, court costs and attorney fees are paid.

Daniel J. Brown pled guilty to the charge of burglary and larceny of a dwelling and was placed on probation for five years, and ordered to pay \$1,448 in restitution, fines, court fees and attorney fees.

Lisa Michael Bowden Stacks pled guilty to two counts of uttering a forgery and was placed on five years probation, and was ordered to pay \$2,914.08 in restitution, fines and attorney costs.

David Vuncannon pled guilty to the charge of false pretense (bad check) and was placed on probation for 1 1/2 years, and ordered to pay \$1,678.14 in fines, costs and restitution.

Jason Driskell was brought for hearing on petition to revoke his probation due to several violations. His probation was revoked and he was ordered to the Regimented Inmate Discipline Program (RID) for 120 days of military-style boot camp at the Mississippi State Penitentiary. He will then go to the Hinds Co. Restitution Center until \$2,615 in restitution, fines, court costs, and attorney fees are repaid.

Christopher Scott Alexander pled guilty to charges of willfully, without authority, taking possession of a motor vehicle. Sentencing was deferred until the June 1997 term of the court. He was remanded to the custody of the Tishomingo County Sheriff until sentencing.

On September 13, a jury awarded Ricky Dean Young \$50,000 for bodily injury, medical expenses and loss of earnings in a suit filed against Randy Sparks, DBA Silver Dollar Sales.

The Parents Club Support Group's first meeting will be held at the Iuka Public Library at 7 p.m., September 26th.

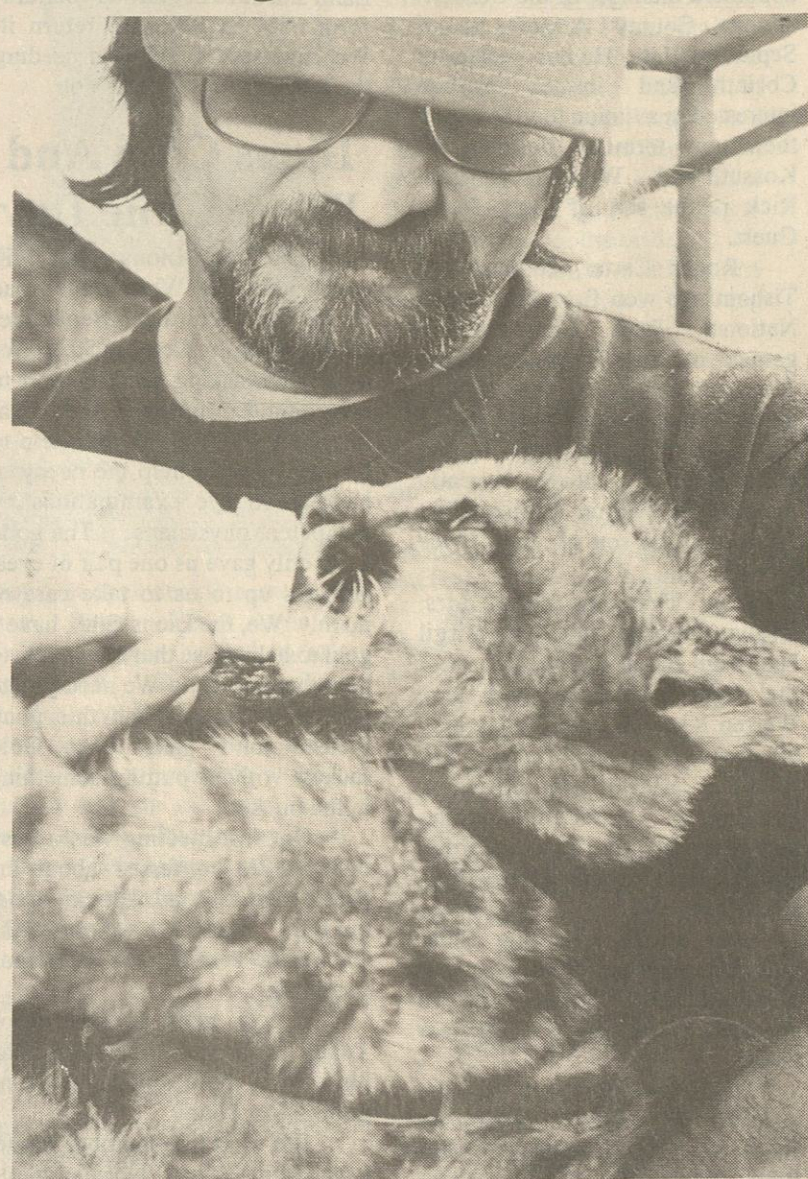
The Parents Club is not a fundraising group, but a group of parents, teachers and community leaders with the goal of helping each other and our children.

Circuit Court Clerk Office Open Late To Register Voters For November Election

October 5 is the last day to register to vote before the November 5th general election, and the Tishomingo County Circuit Court Clerk's office will be open at special times to help ensure that everyone gets registered.

Circuit Court Clerk Donna Henry Dill said that her office will be open until 7 p.m. from September 30 through October 4, and also on Saturday, October 5 until noon, so that people can come register after regular working hours.

Dill said that about 190 people in the county have registered through the National Voters Registration Act ("motor-voter") process, but reminds them that since Mississippi is one of the few states that does not recognize the federal motor-voter registration act, those people still need to register to vote in state, county or city elections. Some state and county candidates will be on the November 5 ballot along with the federal candidates.

Dill has already sent notices

to those affected by this Act.

Yellow Creek Port Authority Receives \$250,000 Grant

The Yellow Creek State Inland Port Authority has been awarded a \$250,000 grant for infrastructure improvements to the Port industrial park, according to federal lawmakers in a release issued last Thursday.

The Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) has awarded the grant to assist in development of the Port's access roads, water and sewer systems, and in the renovation of the existing barge-loading facilities. The improved port facility is expected to attract additional industries dependent on water transportation, said federal lawmakers U.S. Rep. Roger F. Wicker, and Senators Thad Cochran and Trent Lott.

Approximately 70 additional acres are available in the industrial park for future development. The Prosser Company's assembly facility that opened this summer is currently in operation on the site.

Chairman of the Yellow

Creek Port Authority Board Archie Riley said, "We appreciate the support of ARC, Pat Faulkner and the Northeast Mississippi Planning and Development District, and others in obtaining this grant."

"This will enhance the Port's master plan to meet short and long term goals," Riley said.

"This will put us in a position to be competitive in attracting new business," said Port Director Eugene Bishop. "It will enable us to support new industries. The infrastructure improvements will have an immediate impact through creation of jobs and long-term benefits for northeast Mississippi."

"We have worked hard to secure development funds for the area. I am confident this ARC money, combined with the efforts of local and state leaders, will help make Tishomingo County one of the most attractive industrial sites in north Mississippi," Rep. Wicker said.

In order to quickly and efficiently administer shots without a long wait, these times are set up when other patients are not scheduled.

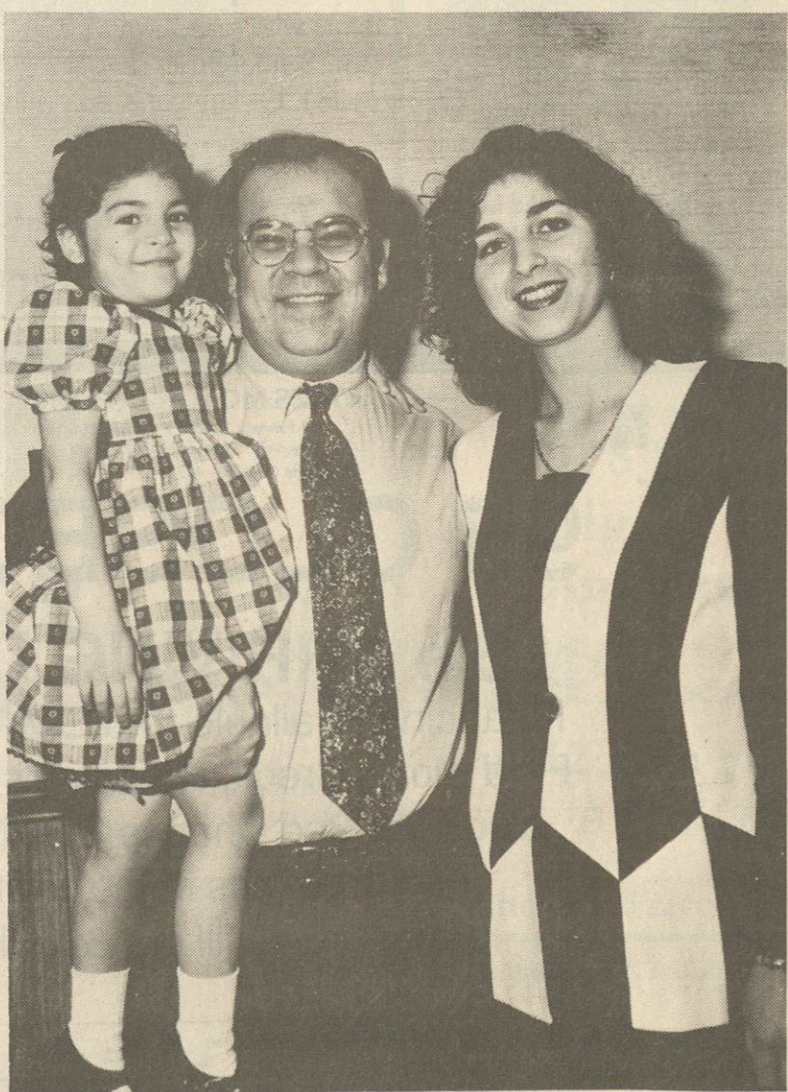
Dates are for the clinics are: Tuesday, October 1, Thursday, October 3, Saturday, October 5,

Doctor Opens Specialty Practice In Iuka; Affiliates With Hospital

Iuka's newest doctor is looking forward to making a valuable contribution to the local community, and this northeast Mississippi county will benefit from the practice of a gastroenterologist right here at home.

Until now, patients suffering from bleeding ulcers, extreme abdominal pain or heartburn, or other digestive system problems would have been referred by local doctors to Tupelo, or another city for treatment.

Now, with the addition of Mounzer Soued, M.D. to the Iuka Hospital staff, local residents can receive excellent care from a specialist at their hometown hospital, and at Dr. Soued's new clinic they can get treatment for gastroenterological ailments before they get to an emergency stage and end up in the hospital.

"I can help people who are having difficulty swallowing, having chest spasms, chronic heartburn or have a condition known as a hiatal hernia," Soued said. Other gastroenterological ailments would be gall stones, colon problems, and hepatitis, all of which can be diagnosed and treated at his clinic, Family Medical and Gastroenterological Clinic, which is in the Medical Arts Building near the new health department, Soued continued.

"My practice includes both internal medicine and

gastroenterological patients. These two specialties are a perfect combination because they draw upon similar skills," he said. Like other doctors in the area, Soued will also see patients with common medical problems.

Gastroenterology is the subspecialty that deals with diseases of the esophagus, stomach, liver and bowels, along with the gall bladder and pancreas, and Dr. Soued's background in this field is extensive. He has published more than 15 papers in national medical journals and his post-doctoral research (at the University of California, San Francisco) included lipid (fat) metabolism and related illnesses such as the effect of elevated cholesterol/triglyceride on the digestive system.

He has worked with Iuka Hospital to upgrade their endoscopy equipment and facilities to the "state-of-the-art" level that he has been accustomed to in his other positions at hospitals in Memphis and San Francisco.

Robert Northern, Iuka Hospital administrator, said, "We are extremely pleased that Dr. Soued has agreed to practice in Iuka and be affiliated with our hospital. His training and experience will be invaluable to our medical community and hospital as we further develop the level of medical and surgical services offered to the residents of

Tishomingo and surrounding counties."

Soued is particularly pleased to have his practice in Iuka, because, he said, his previous experience in larger cities made him appreciate the benefits of small-town life. He and his lovely wife Abir have a four-year-old daughter, Zeina, and want to raise their child in the family-friendly atmosphere they first experienced when he was with the Booneville hospital.

"I was attracted to Iuka because I enjoyed north Mississippi during the time I spent working as an emergency room physician in Booneville. The patients were very friendly, appreciative and gracious," Dr. Soued said.

"In the city you are exposed to so much," he said. "We want to live where we are not lost in the crowd." He said that he wants to be able to know his patients' families and be somewhere he can make a difference. "I am pleased to be able to offer a service this community needs."

Dr. Soued is a board-certified internist and gastroenterologist, and a diplomate of the American Board of Internal Medicine. He holds membership in the American College of Gastroenterologists, American College of Physicians, American Gastroenterology Association and the American Medical Association.

Home Economics Tips

KEEP YOUR CHILDREN SAFE

Several timely topics have crossed my desk recently, one of them being child safety. Since the Wal-Mart stores are emphasizing child safety this month and have asked Extension Home Economists to provide information on this subject, I will pass along some safety tips in today's column.

I trust that parents of young children will take particular note, but those of us past the child-rearing age as well as others who provide occasional care sometimes forget how to safeguard children.

There is a saying that "the Lord above looks after children and fools" - but there is also another that says "He helps those who help themselves." We all need to help by being more aware of dangers and providing as safe an environment as we can.

Young children have a natural curiosity and use all their senses and skills to explore and learn. They will pick up, taste, climb, open, and do whatever else their motor skill development allows them to do. They are dependent on us to monitor both their environment and their actions.

Even before they can get around on their own, young children need protection from falls from their crib, from crib bars that allow them to get their heads between them, from coverlets and plastic liners and bags that can smother, and from toys and small objects that they can choke on or swallow.

Toys for infants should be twice the size of the mouth. They also should be kept clean and should not have sharp edges. Sometimes those cute little stuffed animals that grandparents like to give have furry exteriors from which a baby can get a mouthful of fuzz. Or the animal, or even the child's clothing may have buttons

or eyes that can be swallowed.

Make sure that the toys chosen are age-appropriate. Toys do not have to be purchased; often common household items that I remember my mother giving to my children can provide hours of safe entertainment. Such things as large empty thread spools, plastic mixing bowls, a spoon or a sponge are at hand and are generally safe.

As the child begins to crawl or walk, however, there are many household items that should be kept out of reach. Young children

have no sense of danger, and will often find ways to get into cabinets and to open containers and bottles.

Most of us are aware of the dangers in household cleansers: detergents, bleach, ammonia, furniture polish, etc. We may be less aware of many other supplies that are often stored in bathroom cabinets or other easy to reach places. Shampoos, after-shave lotions, nail polish remover, hair preparations, perfume, and shoe polish smell good enough to taste, but can cause severe nausea or worse. Keep such items as well as medicines out of reach or in locked cabinets, and don't depend on the plastic locks to keep the child out!

Another exploratory item is usually the wall outlet. Children like to stick objects in it, so caps over them are a good investment. Such commonplace things as mini-blind cords can present another danger; cut those cords in half. Also, make sure that all lamp cords are out of reach of little hands.

As the child gets older you can teach safe ways to handle toys and how to avoid many dangers. Until then, it is pretty much up to you.

PREVENTING EYE STRAIN

Anyone who spends hours upon hours focusing on words or items close-up without any intermission takes the risk of suffering from eyestrain. Those tell-tale bloodshot, sagging, dry or itching eyes, blurred vision or even purple dots floating across the retina are not only uncomfortable, but may in time lead to nearsightedness.

Eyestrain occurs when muscles surrounding the eyes work overtime. There are steps you can take to discourage the discomfort of eyestrain: Taking frequent breaks from time-consuming tasks tops the list. Your workplace should be well lit (From behind and without shadows falling on the subject matter). Close-up work should be scheduled for morning hours when most people are fresh - not a night.

Tired eyes may be bathed in warm water with a little salt added. When eye fatigue is chronic and accompanied by headaches or blurred vision, it may mean that you either need glasses (or contacts) or you have the wrong ones. Step one is to call for an appointment.

ON REMOVING TICKS

Everyone has a different home remedy for getting ticks to release their bite and remove them. Beware! Most of these methods can be harmful to your pet. Never use burning matches or heated materials for this purpose. Nor should you use caustic substances such as kerosene or lighter fluid. These can irritate a pet's skin and eventually lead to infection.

The simplest and best bet for tick removal is to spray it with an insecticide. This will cause the tick to die and fall off of dog. Should the head break off, try to get it out with tweezers. Even if left behind, it seldom causes any problem. Should an abscess form, however, you can try to compresses or, preferably, take the animal to your veterinarian for treatment.

While this solves the problem of the adult tick, it does nothing to eliminate the thousands of offspring which they undoubtedly left behind. Your veterinarian can advise you on the best method of getting rid of these and preventing future infestations.

Saturday afternoon I had a surprise visit from my daughter's best friend and her husband, Bobby and Shirley Feazel from Corinth.

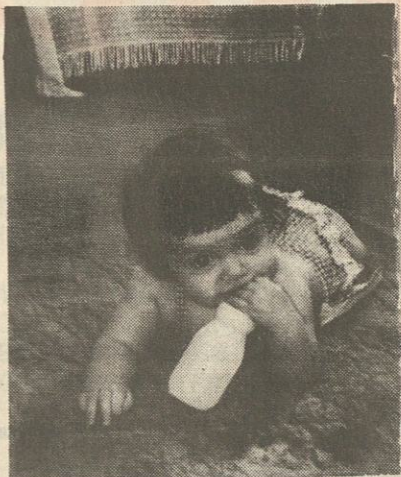

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL RESIDENCES AND BUSINESSES WITHIN THE GOLDEN CORPORATE LIMITS TO CONNECT TO THE MUNICIPAL WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM, ESTABLISHING RATES FOR SERVICES AND PROVIDING FOR ASSESSMENT OF CHARGES AND PAYMENT, PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS AND FOR ENFORCEMENT; AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Golden, Mississippi, that an Ordinance requiring all residences and businesses within the Town corporate limits to connect to the municipal water and sewer system where such system is accessible, establishing rates for services, providing for assessment of charges and payment, providing penalties for violations and for enforcement, and for related matters, be adopted as follows:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS

The following terms when used in this Ordinance shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Town means the Town of Golden, Mississippi, with administrative offices at Town Hall, Golden, Mississippi 38847.

Residence means any private dwelling inhabited as a place of abode within the corporate limits of the Town.

Business means any privately owned commercial establishment operated for profit to which the public is invited, including but not limited to

any place of amusement or entertainment.

System means the water and sewer system operated and maintained by the Town.

Rate means the price charged for service of water and sewer.

Customer means a person responsible for the connection of the system to either a residence or a business and who shall be responsible for the payment of all bills for service connected therewith.

SECTION 2. MANDATORY CONNECTION

All residences and businesses within the corporate limits of the Town having access to the municipal water and sewer system shall be required to connect to the system no later than January 1, 1997. Thereafter, all new residences or businesses having access to the system and within the Town corporate limits shall also be required to connect to the system. There shall be no separation of services for water, sewer and garbage pickup.

SECTION 3. RATES

3.1. The Town shall keep in effect a rate schedule that will generate sufficient revenue to operate and maintain the system and to retire debts on schedule which have been incurred against the system.

3.2. Monthly rates for the following services are established as follows:

RESIDENTIAL**WATER:**

First 4,000 gallons	\$9.00 minimum
All over 4,000 gallons	\$1.50 per 1,000 gallons water used

SEWER:

\$9.00 plus \$1.20 per 1,000 gallons water used

GARBAGE PICKUP:

\$8.00

COMMERCIAL (BUSINESS)**WATER:**

First 4,000 gallons	\$9.00 minimum
All over 4,000 gallons	\$1.50 per 1,000 gallons water used

SEWER:

\$9.00 plus \$1.20 per 1,000 gallons water used

GARBAGE PICKUP:

\$8.00

3.3. New Users shall be charged the following connection fees:**RESIDENTIAL**

Water Tap	\$130.00
Water Meter Deposit	\$25.00
Sewer Tap	\$25.00

COMMERCIAL

Water Tap	\$130.00
Water Meter Deposit	\$25.00
Sewer Tap	\$25.00

3.4. The Town may increase the above rates, and all future rate increases shall be made by amendment to this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. ASSESSMENT OF CHARGES AND PAYMENT

4.1. Customers shall be assessed charges monthly for services for water, sewer and garbage pickup according to the above rates and shall be furnished a bill reflecting the charges.

4.2. All bills must be paid in full no later than the 15th day of the month the bill is received by the customer.

SECTION 5. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES

5.1. Unless a customer pays a bill in full no later than the 15th day of the month, a penalty of 10% of the amount of the bill will be assessed and added to the next monthly bill. Failure to pay any bill or any penalty by the 25th day of the month will result in termination of services without further notice.

5.2. Any termination of service occasioned by nonpayment of any bill will result in an additional fee of \$25.00 to reconnect services.

5.3. Any customer or other person violating any provision of this Ordinance where no specific penalty is provided shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$1,000.00, or imprisonment not to exceed 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 6. ENFORCEMENT

6.1. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be enforceable by any law enforcement officer of the State of Mississippi or the Town of Golden, and by the Town, its employees and agents.

6.2. Any officer, employee or agent having probable cause to believe that a person has violated any provision of this Ordinance may, in lieu of obtaining a misdemeanor warrant for arrest of such person, issue a written citation requiring the person to appear at a certain date and time before the Municipal Court of the Town to answer the charges specified in the citation.

6.3. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to limit the power of the Town to enforce by any appropriate civil proceeding in a court of competent jurisdiction any provision contained in this Ordinance against any person.

SECTION 7. CONFLICTING ORDINANCES

All other ordinances of the Town which are in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY

If any part of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, its invalidity shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance, and for this purpose the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

SECTION 9. PUBLICATION

The Clerk of the Town is hereby directed to publish this Ordinance one time in the Belmont and Tishomingo Journal and in the Tishomingo County News.

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect one (1) month from and after its passage.

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, TO ISSUE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF SAID MUNICIPALITY IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$250,000) TO RAISE MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING, IMPROVING AND PAVING STREETS AND PURCHASING LAND THEREFOR, AND DIRECTING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF SUCH INTENTION.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka, Mississippi (the "Governing Body"), acting for and on behalf of the City of Iuka, Mississippi (the "Municipality"), hereby finds, determines, adjudicates and declares as follows:

1. It is necessary and in the public interest to issue general obligation bonds of the Municipality in the maximum principal amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) to raise money for the purpose of constructing, improving and paving streets and purchasing land therefor.

2. The assessed value of all taxable property within the Municipality, according to the last completed assessment for taxation, is Fourteen Million One Hundred Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety Four Dollars (\$14,108,794); the Municipality has outstanding bonded indebtedness subject to the fifteen percent (15%) debt limit prescribed by Section 21-33-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, in the amount of One Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$140,000), and outstanding bonded floating indebtedness subject to the twenty percent (20%) debt limit prescribed by Section 21-33-303, Mississippi Code of 1972 (which amount includes the sum set forth above subject to the 15% debt limit), in the amount of One Million Six Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$1,630,000); the issuance of the bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued, when added to the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the Municipality, will not result in bonded indebtedness, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid fifteen percent (15%) debt limit, of more than fifteen percent (15%) of the assessed value of taxable property within the Municipality and will not result in indebtedness, both bonded and floating, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid twenty percent (20%) debt limit, in excess of twenty percent (20%) of the assessed value of taxable property within the Municipality and will not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation upon indebtedness which may be incurred by the Municipality.

3. The Municipality reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures for the Authorized Purpose prior to the issuance of the Bonds (as such terms are hereinafter defined), and that it should declare its official intent to reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of the Bonds upon the issuance thereof.

4. The Municipality is authorized by Sections 21-33-301 through 21-33-329, Mississippi Code of 1972, to issue the Bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued for the purpose hereinafter set forth, for which purpose there are no other available funds on hand.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Governing Body hereby declares its intention to issue general obligation bonds of the Municipality in the maximum principal amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) (the "Bonds") to raise money for the purpose of constructing, improving and paving streets and purchasing land therefor (the "Authorized Purpose"). Pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulation (the "Reimbursement Regulations"), the Governing Body hereby declares its official intent to reimburse expenditures made for the Authorized Purpose prior to the issuance of the Bonds with proceeds of the Bonds to the extent permitted by the Reimbursement Regulations. The Bonds will be general obligations of the Municipality payable as to principal and interest out of and secured by an irrevocable pledge of the avails of a tax to be levied annually upon the taxable property within the geographical limits of the Municipality, with tax, together with any other moneys available for such purpose, shall be sufficient to provide for the payment of the principal of and the interest on the Bonds according to the terms thereof.

SECTION 2. The Governing Body proposes to direct the issuance of the Bonds in the amount, for the purpose and secured as aforesaid, at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at its regular meeting place in the City Hall of the Municipality at 5:00 o'clock P.M. on October 14, 1996, or at some meeting held subsequent thereto. If ten percent (10%) of the qualified electors of the Municipality, or fifteen hundred (1,500), whichever is the lesser, shall file a written protest with the Clerk of the Municipality against the issuance of such Bonds on or before the aforesaid date, then the Bonds shall not be issued unless authorized at an election on the question of the issuance of such Bonds to be called and held as provided by law. If no protest be filed, then such Bonds may be issued without an election on the question of the issuance thereof at any time within a period of two (2) years after the date above specified.

SECTION 3. This resolution shall be published once a week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, Tishomingo County, Mississippi, a newspaper published in and having general circulation in the Municipality and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972. The first publication of this resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date fixed herein for the issuance of the Bonds, and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date.

SECTION 4. The Clerk of the Municipality is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary form of the publication of the resolution and have the same before this Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 2 hereof.
