Clinton Re-elected President; Wicker, Cochran Remain In Washington

Mike Mills Elected As State Supreme Court Judge - District 3

Across the country, state and our own county, incumbents held their own in Tuesday's election.

Though Tishomingo County and Mississippi gave the majority of their votes toward Republican challenger Bob Dole, President Bill Clinton won re-election by about 49% of the popular vote and 361 of the possible 471 electoral

In Tishomingo County, unofficial results from all 19 precincts gave Dole 2,749 votes for 45 percent, with Clinton close behind at 2,678 and about 44 percent. Independent Ross Perot earned 604 votes in the county giving him 9.97 percent of the vote, quite close to his stated goal of obtaining double digit percentages of the

Mississippi First District Congressman Roger Wicker(R) easily won re-election to a second term as expected. Democratic challenger Henry Boyd, Jr. only earned 33 percent of the vote to Wicker's 65 percent. The other two candidates received less than one percent of the first district

In Tishomingo County, Wicker earned 64 percent of the vote with 4,053 in unofficial returns. Boyd received 33 percent with 2,084 votes.

The county also overwhelmingly re-elected Republican Thad Cochran to his fourth term, giving him 4,253 votes and 67 percent of their votes. His opposition, James W. "Bootie" Hunt got 1,896, or 30 percent of Tishomingo County

In the election for Mississippi State Supreme Court, District 3 (northern) Position No. 3 seat Mike Mills retained his appointed seat for a full term over Judge Tommy Gardner. In the county, Mills received 57% of the vote (3,481) to Gardner's 42% (2,576) in what was billed as Northeast Mississippi's most hotly contested

Tishomingo County Election Commissioners remained the same, with all incumbents retaining their positions for the next

In school board elections, Jeanette C. Mann won 57 percent of the vote to take the First District seat vacated by Earl Walker. Her opponent, Gregory Enlow won 42 percent of the vote.

In a close race in the Fifth District, incumbent Harold C. Sparks retained his school board seat with 38 percent of the vote against challengers Kim Wells with a close 33 percent, and Danny Brandon with 27 percent.

Overall, voter turnout in the county was about average at 45 to 55 percent, according to Election Commission Chairman David Rushing, with 6,695 voters coming to the polls.

Select Microwave-Safe Containers

Alcorn County Homemaker Volunteers have been quite busy lately, hosting the 9-county area council and doing fall maintenance on their intersection landscape project. Members in Tishomingo County are equally busy, with the upcoming "Holiday House" at Midway on November

With these extra activities as well as the usual ones, their November program on "Time Management" is very appropriate. We are all beginning to fill our calendars and feel pressured as we move into the holiday season.

Technically speaking we really can't manage time, for the minute hand is out of control. We can only manage ourselves with respect to the clock!

Once we accept this concept we can begin to cope with the problem and find ways to prioritize our activities, use time more

Among tips for homemakers is an admonition to streamline those necessary household chores by learning new or different ways to accomplish them. Using machines and appliances is "old hat" to most of us, but we can often use them more efficiently than we usually do. The dishwasher, for example, can be used to wash things other than dishes, like the vent cover over the kitchen range.

The microwave oven is a lifesaver to many of us in getting meals on the table quickly. It can be a very handy, convenient appliance that can save time in the kitchen if used correctly. Cooking - even reheating - is different, however, than with a conventional oven, and often we make assumptions about use and utensils that are not safe.

The first step, of course, is to become familiar with your particular microwave. Read the owner's

manual for the basic information concerning its operation, cooking times and special features.

New utensils for microwave use are not always needed, as you can use many you already have. The trick is to learn which ones are safe, both from the standpoint of withstanding the high heat and transfer of contaminants to the food.

Glass and glass ceramic cookware are safe for heating, defrosting or cooking in the microwave. The type of glass is not important for reheating, but use only ovenproof glass for cooking. An acceptable glass does not become hot during cooking but the heat of the food may break glass that is not heat tempered.

A hint I picked up from Heloise for testing glass containers is to put a glass measuring cup of water next to an empty dish (never metal or metal-trimmed). Heat on full power for one minute, then check the temperature of the dish. If the dish is cool and water very warm, the dish can be used for microwaving. If the dish is hot and the water only lukewarm, do

Avoid use of cold storage containers, like plastic freezer Margarine tubs and whipped topping bowls have not been approved for microwaves. High heat could cause chemicals to transfer into the food.

Waxed paper is safe, but other paper goods such as towels or plated have not been tested, so, if using these items, use only plain white paper goods.

Never use brown grocery bags and newspapers. These contain recycled materials and metals which could start a fire. They may also contain inks and dyes, not intended to come in contact with

It is fine to cover utensils with plastic wrap, but unless the wrap is heavy-duty, it could melt in contact with the hot foods. Follow package directions when heating microwavable foods with special browning or crisping devices, and never try to reuse these special devices. Also do not re-use trays and containers provided with microwave convenience products, as they have been designed for onetime use with that specific food THE LEERS LYES CHEEK

Remember, appliances and new products can help you manage yourself and spend your time better, but they can't think for you.

One of the nicest things about the retina is that it is very easy for your eye doctor to examine it. In the course of the routine eye examination, he will dilate your pupil and look inside your eye, directly at your retina. The retina is the only place in the whole body where living blood vessels are visible for direct examination. Therefore, your eye doctor can look at your retina and see how well your circulatory system is working.

One of these conditions is arteriosclerosis, often referred to as "hardening of the arteries." This term is misleading since arteries do not become hard but merely clogged with fatty deposits and are less elastic, providing narrower passageways for the blood flow. The overall effect of arteriosclerosis is less efficient circulation of the blood/ If arteriosclerosis is discovered during an eye examination, the patient will be informed and referred to his or her family physician. This is just one other good reason for regular eye examinations.

headaches, and a persistent cough, influenza usually occurs in epidemic proportions every 1-3 years, says Dr. Robert Collins, director of , Mississippi State University's Longest Student Health Center.

While people sometimes mistake the flu for sinus problems or the common cold, Collins says it has specific symptoms and specific remedies. The illness and recovery can last for several weeks.

To avoid this wintertime illness, Collins recommends:

Getting a flu shot. Shots create an immunity that lasts from 6-8 months. "Side effects of the vaccine include minor aching at the site of injection and a low-grade fever that affects less than 5 percent of recipients," Collins says.

Avoiding crowds. Shopping malls, basketball games and other indoor events make exposure to the virus more likely.


Focusing on healthy habits. Eat right, get plenty of sleep and exercise, and avoid stress.

If you do get the flu virus, lots of rest should be at the top of the treatment list. Also, drink plenty of fluids and take acetaminophen (Tylenol is one brand name). Doctors may also prescribe other medicines.



The trail is south of Counce ennessee on the Mississippi ennessee state line in the Sandy Creek Wildlife Restoration area. his demonstration area has been nated by the company to how how a well-managed forest an produce both wood products and abundant wildlife populaons. A well-designed road sysem, diversity of forest stands, nunerous wildlife food plots, and a arge population of deer and turkey are hallmarks of this

The Environmental Educanon Trail has been design to enable school classes and other groups an opportunity to study forestry, wildlife, tree identificafion and soils. The quarter-mile rail starts on a hardwood ridge and progresses through a stream ottom and a pine plantation to a ildlife food demonstration area.

There are six study stations with signs that teach the students about the forest.

An amphitheater seating approximately 35 students is located on a hillside overlooking the hardwood bottom. Twenty-six signs identifying trees along the trail have detailed information about the tree with pictures of the leaves and fruit.

The second grade class taught by Mrs. Becky McNeely from Iuka Elementary was invited to be the first school group to tour the trail. McNeely was chosen as Mississippi's Outstanding Project Learning Tree Educator for 1995, and she uses environmental education activities as a teaching tool almost every day in her classroom.

The trail and all improvements were designed and constructed by Wildlife and Forest Management Assistance Program personnel employed by the Woodlands group of Tenneco Packag-
