Alcorn County Burglaries Solved; Merchandise Found In Tishomingo County & Four Arrested

About \$7,000 worth of stolen merchandise was recovered in Tishomingo County and four men have been arrested in connection with a string of house burglaries in Alcorn County.

Approximately \$10,000 worth of merchandise was stolen during six break-ins over a three-month period, according to Alcorn County Sheriff Jimmy Taylor. Last weekend approximately \$7,000 worth of the merchandise was recovered.

According to Taylor, those facing felony charges of burglary of a dwelling or grand larceny include: Raymond Petrey, 18, of Tishomingo County, charged with three felonies; Michael Brown, 23, of Iuka, charged with seven felonies; Jeremy Ross, 17, of Alcorn County, charged as an adult for one felony and Jason Ross, 20,

of Alcorn County, charged with three felonies. The Rosses, who are brothers, had recently moved to Alcorn County from Tishomingo County.

Taylor said a fifth suspect, who moved to Tishomingo County in recent months from Florida, is believed to have fled back to Florida. A warrant for his arrest for committing four felonies has been issued.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department was integral in breaking the case.

Taylor had received a telephone call from one of the property owners who said they had received information their guitar was at a Burnsville business, and they checked it out, but did not find the guitar on the first check.

Sheriff David Smith called last Friday to tell Taylor he had a subject in jail who was possibly

connected with the Alcorn County burglaries. Taylor and Alcorn County Investigator Houston Brown went to the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department to interview the subject, and later went back to the business with a warrant and located the items from two of the Alcorn County burglaries.

Additional subjects were questioned about the house burglaries. They were later charged and more items recovered. Taylor said all the recovered items were located in Tishomingo County except one camera recovered in Alcorn County.

Three of the burglaries occurred south of Glen near Jacinto, and three of the burglaries occurred north of Corinth. They occurred from September 25th to November 21, 1996.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department has been bombarded with calls and inquiries regarding a supposed FBI raid on a local business.

Chief Deputy Neil Edmondson was kind enough to set the record straight for our publication.

Rumors describing an FBI raid on the local floral/decorative business "The Ivy House" are completely false, Edmondson said in a statement Tuesday.

Regardless of what many, many people have stated and

circulated as fact, the FBI has not been involved in any investigation related to the business, or any of its owners or employees.

Edmondson said that he himself confronted the FBI on their supposed involvement, and was assured that the rumors had no basis in fact.

This story that so many quoted was apparently never printed in any newspaper, or carried on any media outlet, as far as our investigation revealed.

If you are not part of the problem, or have a solution to the problem, you should not be discussing it.

Plans to Control Indian Creek Flooding To Be Discussed At Public Hearing Thursday Night

The City of Iuka will hold a public hearing Thursday night on a proposed \$3.6 million project for flood control of Indian Creek in Iuka.

According to Iuka Mayor David Nichols, the hearing will be to advise the public of plans and specifications already developed by the U.S. Soil Conservation Service to deepen and widen Indian Creek throughout Iuka, beginning near the Tishomingo

Living Center (old hospital) all the way past Mineral Springs Park, and also to get citizen input on the project.

The project has been in work for about five years, said Nichols. During heavy rains Indian Creek often exceeds its banks, flooding some areas of Iuka, especially near Mineral Springs Park.

Present at the hearing, scheduled for 7 p.m. in the Iuka City Hall courtroom, will be Mississippi State Conservationist Pete

Heard, his staff, and several other government personnel, as well as city officials, according to Nichols.

The funding for the project is not assured, said Nichols, but is in the final stages.

Sure to be discussed are plans on how the traffic and property disruptions will be handled in areas where the creek goes by culvert under major thoroughfares, like Battleground Drive, and Quitman Street.

Boll Weevil Eradication To Be Voted On Again...

Tishomingo County cotton producers will join growers in a majority of the state in an upcoming referendum for boll weevil eradication efforts in Mississippi. If you will recall, the program was voted in two years ago, voted out a year ago and now its up again even though a majority of the cotton producers have always supported it. Cotton growers and eligible landowners in the hill areas and the south Delta—known as Regions II, III and IV—will vote the last of December. Ballots probably will

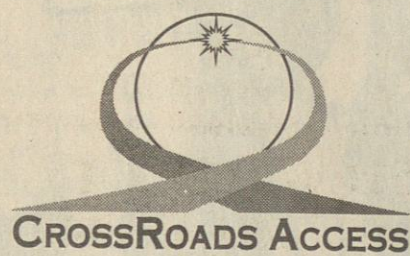

Baby Talk

How do you ask an infant to read an eye chart and tell you which line is the clearest? By creative communication! One of the problems facing doctors assessing an infant's eyesight is determining whether or not a problem actually exists. An MIT neuroscientist has recently tested babies as young as one month old by using a technique called "preferential looking." This is a new means of monitoring the child's visual development. The doctor places an infant before two video screens which are round-shaped. While one displays a slowly changing pattern of lines and dots, the other has a neutral background. The pattern gradually becomes finer until the child can no longer tell the difference between the moving pattern and the neutral one and the infant ultimately becomes disinterested.

The instant at which this occurs will vary with the sharpness of the child's vision, thus giving the examiner an excellent insight to the child's ability to see.

about 700 acres of cotton in 1996, compared to 1100 acres in 1995. Mississippi's Farm Service Agency will mail ballots to 1996 cotton growers and landowners who have financial equity in the cotton crop. Eligible voters will have about 10 working days to return the ballots. Mississippi Boll Weevil Management Corp. Leaders requested the vote for three Mississippi regions to help ensure profession of the program and eradication of cotton's No. 1 pest. Growers must approve the program before Feb. 1 to be assured of receiving \$2.43 million in federal assistance for boll weevil eradication. Cotton growers east of Mississippi who have eradicated the boll weevil have voted to contribute more than \$3 million to help the program move west. If Regions II, III and IV approve the program, Region I (the majority of the Delta) may vote in February. For more information on the eradication program or the referendum

procedure, contact the Tishomingo County Extension Office at 423-7016 or the Farm Service Agency at 423-5036. **WHOLE COTTONSEED AS FEED FOR CATTLE**

The nutritional value of whole cottonseed make it a very popular feedstuff for beef cattle. Price and availability are the major factors involved in using this feed. It is higher in TDN, fiber, and fat than corn, soybean

meal or cottonseed meal. High is good within limits. Excess can cause diarrhea and reduce overall feed digestion. For reason it is best to consume to 1 pound of per 200 pounds of body weight. Cottonseed also has a moisture content which can be a seed quality problem. It is not to offer this feed as free-choice but rather hand feed. Handling and storing can be a problem because cottonseed does not flow well out of a grain. The best way is to use a clean commodity shed. Goats poisoning is an occasional problem with young ruminants whose stomach has not fully developed and is a common problem with non-ruminant animals and should not be used in this manner (do NOT feed horses).

Recipe of the Week

If you are still serving cranberry sauce straight out of the can, try this recipe and you will never again settle for less!

Mrs. Clara Black of Tishomingo has been making this recipe since 1953 and believe me, she has it down perfect! She got it from Mrs. Lizzie Nettles, whose husband was school superintendent at Tishomingo for years.

Fresh Cranberry Salad

1 pound bag of fresh cranberries
1 20 oz. can of crushed pineapple (drained, reserve liquid)
1 3 oz. box of orange Jello
1 3 oz. box of strawberry Jello
2 c. sugar
1 c. chopped nuts
3/4 c. chopped celery
1. Drain pineapple, reserving liquid.
2. Add pineapple juice and sugar to cranberries in a saucepan. Cook on about medium high until all berries pop, stirring often.
3. Remove from heat and add both boxes of Jello. Let cool about 15-20 minutes.
4. Add nuts, celery, and pineapple, mix well.
5. Pour into serving dish - it looks pretty in a nice glass dish. Refrigerate until congealed. This keeps several weeks in the refrigerator and freezes well.

AN OPEN LETTER TO THE MEMBERS OF REDSTONE FEDERAL CREDIT UNION

Dear Members:

We wish to clarify my recent letter regarding the lawsuit brought forth by the American Bankers Association concerning the fields of membership of credit unions nationwide. **The court's ruling does not affect current members.** The ruling only affects persons seeking membership in Redstone Federal Credit Union.

Current members are not affected because several years ago, Redstone Federal Credit Union changed its by laws to read "once a member, always a member." The court's ruling did not change this provision; therefore, the status of current members remains unchanged. However, we can only accept new members who qualify through Redstone Federal Credit Union's core charter (see below).

Redstone Federal Credit Union's core charter consists of the following:

- * Civilian and military personnel of the U.S. Government who work at or are stationed at Redstone Arsenal in Madison County, Alabama;
- * Contractors and employees of contractors who work regularly at Redstone Arsenal under contract with the U.S. Government;
- * Contractors and employees of contractors who work regularly in Madison County, Alabama under contract with the U.S. Government and constitute 100% of the work in Madison County, Alabama;
- * Employees of American Federation of Government Employees, Lodge 1858, and non-appropriated fund activities attached to Redstone Arsenal in Madison County, Alabama;
- * Other employees of the U.S. Government who work in Madison County, Alabama; and
- * Members of the U.S. Armed Forces, active or retired, or their dependents or dependent survivors who are eligible by law or regulations to receive and are receiving benefits or services from the above military installation.

Again, we urge you to write the legislators of your district and voice your opposition to the restrictions placed upon Redstone Federal Credit Union and all federal credit unions.

We will keep you posted of any new developments in this matter.

Parents Go Back To School In Program To Encourage More Community Involvement

I went back to high school last week to participate in a program designed to get parents more involved in their local schools. Tupelo High School invited parents to attend two class periods in place of their children to provide a first-hand look at high school life in the 1990s. More than 600 parents took part locally in the event which was part of a national initiative sponsored by the National Parent Teacher Association and the Department of Education.

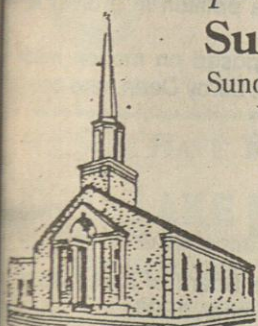

Home Economics Tips

Words To The Wise

Having just returned from eye repair surgery only to fall victim to one of the infections raging about, a word to the wise regarding infections and antibiotics appears timely. Even though I have written on this subject before, a reminder never hurt.

Unfortunately, viruses, bacteria and some other one-celled organisms can infect people with unpleasant, sometime serious, effects. An infection occurs when a disease-causing organism enters a body system (like the respiratory, reproductive or digestive systems) where conditions allow it to live, multiply and interfere with normal body function.

When body defenses fail to protect you from bacteria or viruses that have entered the body, an infection can become established, and you should contact a physician about possible medical treatment. Antibiotics are often life-saving when an infection interferes with a critical body function like breathing or circulation. However, many doctors are becoming convinced that all infections should not be treated with antibiotics.

Become an active partner with your doctor in protecting your health. Find out what the likelihood is that you will heal without antibiotics. If you and your doctor reach a decision to use antibiotics, find out how to take them correctly.

Antibiotics will not help a viral infection, and frequent or ineffective use of antibiotics can reduce your body's defenses against later infection. Ask the doctor about carefully waiting to give the body time to fight the infection without antibiotics. Find out the risks if you do not take antibiotics at this time and what to do if the infection gets worse.

If you must take antibiotics, consider using some source of acidophilus and/or bifidus for a while after the medication is completed. These two helpful bacteria are often removed from the intestines by antibiotics, and their absence can allow the growth of unwanted bacteria. Sources include the active cultures in yogurt, some milk products, and the refrigerated tablet form sold in pharmacies.

Take care of your body's defenses by eating a well-balanced diet. Balance the need for rest and exercise, and use antibiotics carefully.

Another thing to use carefully, especially this time of

year, is your credit card. It is well at all times to be aware of your credit limit and use it wisely, but sometimes we lose track at Christmas.

When you use a credit card in a store, the merchant takes the card, runs it through a computer and punches in a few numbers, or places a phone call. Either way, these merchants are contacting a credit card guarantee company that has a record of your credit status. Based upon the information the merchant receives, your purchase on the card will be approved or rejected.

The following information is checked:

*Your overall credit limit. If you've exceeded your line of credit and attempt to make further purchases, the guarantee company will tell the merchant to reject your card.

*Your daily limit. Many credit card companies do not let cardholders use their card more than a certain number of times a day or spend more than a given amount. This is meant to protect against the use of stolen cards.

*Whether you are late on a payment. If you are often late, the guarantee company may tell the merchant to reject your card.

This season, manage your credit as well as your cash. Don't let your generous spirit overwhelm your good judgment or your budget.
