## Happy Valentine's Day!

### Sweethearts for 68 Years

Millard and Edna Lard will celebrate 68 years of marriage this September, and are an example of lifelong commitment to us all on this Valentine's week.

Though the focus of this holiday is usually "love at first sight," brought on by the impetuous and random aim of Cupid's arrows, Millard and Edna's commitment to each other remind us of what love is truly meant to be - lasting, dependable and true to name just a few. They have shared a lifetime of working together, raising two children, enjoying grandchildren, and now great-grandchildren.

The former Edna Higgins was the daughter of James and Mary Ann Higgins and lived in the Hubbard Salem community when she met Millard Lard about 1927. Millard regularly accompanied a relative across the river from his hometown of Waterloo, Alabama, to her home where his relative was courting some of her kinfolk, Millard recalled. He said they had to cross the Tennessee River in a boat and he would come on Sunday to attend church together. "I'd just come and sit all day with her," he said.

They knew each other about two or three years before they got married. He was 19 and she was 21. Mrs. Edna said, when they had Mr. Rob Grisham, who was then a county supervisor, marry them. "I went to school under him, so he didn't even charge us anything," she said.

They were married on September 8, 1929, and there is a lovely painting in their home depicting the event in detail, including the A-Model car that they used for transportation at the time. Their daughter-in-law, Melvia Lard, painted the historic scene, which even includes a lady who was obviously crying about the event. "That was his (Millard's) sister," Edna pointed out.

Their first home was in the Hubbard Salem community, which is near the old TVA/NASA site. Millard worked as a farmer for years, and "made a big garden" all his life until just the past few years. When TVA started in about 1935 clearing all the bottomland to prepare for the Pickwick reservoir and dam, he worked with them. Later he worked in Iuka at the old Sweeney Service Station (now Williams' Service Station, at Battleground Dr. and Hwy. 172). Throughout their marriage they have lived in the Hubbard Salem area and more recently in Iuka.

They raised two children, Virginia and James Calvin, who gave them six grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

They tried living in Alaska for a time, when their son, James Calvin, had them come there to

run a hotel of his for a time. "It took us six days and four nights just to drive there," Millard said. They said that the waist-deep snow convinced them to come on back home to Mississippi.

Their son now lives in Waterloo, and visits them regularly. They lost Virginia about six years ago to cancer, but their home is still filled at Christmas time with the grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Edna now uses a walker to help her around the house, but it doesn't seem to slow her down too much. Millard does

cook her breakfast now, she said.

When asked the secret of such a long marriage they both smiled. They didn't recall many of the details of their courting life, but the little things like candy and

flowers many couples will be exchanging this Friday just are outweighed by the commitment these two have exemplified by their years together.

### Residential Water Heater Incentive Program Announced By TCEPA

#### ELIGIBILITY:

Any residential service served by Tishomingo County Electric Power Association.

#### INCENTIVE:

1. \$150 per unit to the owner/builder member who installs an electric water heater in a new residential service (40 gallon minimum unit size)
2. \$150 per unit to the owner/builder member who replaces a gas water heater with an electric water heater (40 gallon minimum unit size)
3. \$75 per unit paid to the owner/builder member for replacement of an electric water heater.

Incentives limited to one per residential unit. New units installed must have a five (5) year warranty or greater.

All installed units must be inspected prior to awarding of the cash incentive.

Tishomingo County Electric Board of Directors reserve the right to discontinue the program without notice.

## Man Charged With Murder In Death Of 21-Month-Old Boy

A Tishomingo County man has been charged with murder in connection with the February 3rd death of a 21-month-old boy.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff David Smith, Curtis D. Lawrence, 29, who moved to the North Crossroads community two months ago from Marion, Illinois, was arrested last Thursday, February 6th, in connection with the death of Johnathan Smith, the toddler son of his girlfriend, Kelley Smith.

According to the sheriff's investigation, the toddler was taken by Ms. Smith and Lawrence

to Iuka Hospital and was not breathing and had no pulse.

He died at 4:51 in the morning Monday, February 3, 1997 at the hospital as a result of trauma to the head, suggesting the child had been struck, according to preliminary autopsy results, said Tishomingo County Coroner Dale White.

After subsequent investiga-

tion, Lawrence was charged.

Lawrence, Ms. Smith and the toddler moved to the county about two months ago. Previously, Johnathan had been living with an aunt in Marion prior to the move. Lawrence was working at an area furniture factory, said Sheriff Smith.

Lawrence is being held in the Tishomingo County Jail on \$150,000 bond awaiting preliminary hearing. No other charges have been filed but the investigation is ongoing, said the sheriff.

Johnathan Smith, age 21 months, was born in Carbondale, Illinois on April 13, 1995 to Kelley Smith.

A funeral service was held on Thursday, February 6, 1997 in Wilson Funeral Home of Marion, Illinois with Rev. Murle Jack officiating. He was buried in Lakeview Cemetery of Johnston City, Illinois, next to his grandparents.

Johnathan is survived by his mother, Kelley Smith; five aunts, four uncles, and several cousins.

### Healthy Weight: Myths & Realities

About this time of year as stores begin displaying Spring clothes, or we begin sewing for Spring, we become more conscious of our weight and body shape. Weight — too much or too little — is an important part of our overall health as well as our self-image.

With an estimated 26 percent of the population overweight, obesity has been linked to increased risk for diabetes, high blood pressure and stroke, heart disease, some types of cancer and gallbladder disease.

Being too thin also has associated health risks, such as osteoporosis or the development of eating disorders such as anorexia nervosa and bulimia. So how do you determine if you are at a healthy weight?

Whether your weight is healthy depends on more than what the typical height and weight tables indicate. One issue is how much of your weight is fat and where that fat is located.

Other factors include whether you have a family history of medical problems associated with weight or if you have a weight-related medical problem such as high blood pressure.

To help judge if your weight is healthy, answer the following questions:

Is your weight within the range suggested in the height-

weight tables?

Height/weight tables give rough estimates of proper weight. Use them only as a baseline or a starting point for they do not take

into account the amount of body fat, the amount of lean muscle tissue or the individual's frame size.

What is your waist-to-hip ratio?

Measure around your waist while you stand relaxed, not pulling in your stomach. Measure around your hips at the largest point. Divider waist measurement by hip measurement to get your waist-to-hip ratio.

A value greater than 1.0 means your waist is larger than your hips and you are carrying too much fat in the abdomen area. Values above 0.80 for women or 0.95 for men have been linked to increased risk for several diseases. Do you have a medical problem for which your doctor has advised that you lose weight, such as high blood pressure or diabetes?

If so, then changing your weight may have a health benefit. However, if you check OK on the above questions, there appears to be little health advantage to changing your weight.

With all the health-related information and publicity about weight it is often difficult to know what is myth and what is reality. Following are a few of the common myths associated with

weight:

**MYTH:** You can never be too thin.

**REALITY:** Being too thin or too heavy increases your chance of developing health problems. In fact, a recent study published in the International Journal of Obesity suggests there is as much risk to being moderately

underweight as overweight. The key word is "moderately," re-read the above.

**MYTH:** The scale is the best way to determine if you're fit or fat.

**REALITY:** The scale does not reflect your body composition; it does not discriminate between fluid or fat weight.

Consider this, it takes 3,500 calories to make 1 pound of fat. Two cups of water weigh 1 pound. Sudden weight changes are usually from fluid shifts in the body.

**MYTH:** A low-calorie diet is the best way to achieve a healthy weight.

**REALITY:** Chronic dieting, under-eating or skipping meals can contribute to a sluggish metabolism, which could make it harder to lose weight. To fuel our metabolism we must consume a sufficient number of calories or our bodies will slow down to compensate.

**Blindness U.S. Vs. World**  
Blindness occurs because any part of the optical system - from the cornea in the front of the eye to the brain - becomes damaged.

The leading cause of blindness in the United States, in order of frequency, are: glaucoma, macular degeneration (dense scarring of the most sensitive part of the retina), senile cataracts, optic nerve atrophy, diabetic retinopathy, retinitis pigmentosa (progressive loss of field of vision due to atrophy of the retina, usually hereditary). These conditions cause 51% of all blindness.

Unlike the United States, most of the blindness in the rest of the world is caused by trachoma, a chronic infection of the cornea and conjunctiva, from Chlamydia trachomatis (a bacteria-like microorganism), onchocerciasis - a roundworm infection that can involve the eyes - and xerophthalmia, a dry eye condition due to a deficiency of vitamin A.

Treatment exists for all three of these conditions.

### Boll Weevil Eradication Vote To Be Held Again

Once again, the producers in Region 4 (East Mississippi) will get a chance to pass the Boll Weevil Eradication Referendum. Ballots will be mailed out this week and must be turned in by February 21st. We will vote along with Region 1 (North Ms. Delta). The rest of the state has overwhelmingly passed the referendum. Even though we had a majority, we lacked three percent having the necessary 66 2/3 majority needed. In the last vote, Tishomingo County cast all 9 of their eligible votes in favor of the program. These nine votes are still important and I encourage each producer to vote.

### FORAGES

Producers in the county might have questions about seeding forages in spring. As a general rule, cool-season forages are best seeded in the fall and warm-season forages are best seeded in the spring. But some forages can be seeded at any time. Tall fescue, white clover and red clover are suitable for fall seeding. If they are planted in early spring and have ideal growing weather, they can be successful.

The main problem in planting cool-season forages in spring comes from its competition with annual summer weeds. Weed

control in this instance is "crucial" and a chore that some producers won't want to tackle.

Warm-season forages can better handle weed problems. Some choices producers have include sorghum-sundagrass or bermudagrass.

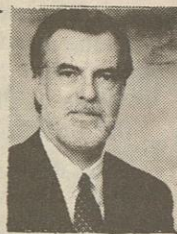
### Health Seminar For Goat Producers And Their Veterinarians

### When To Update Your Will

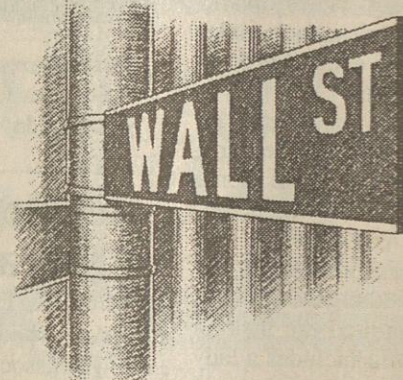
Most people know they need a will. But wills get older like the people who make them. Thus, it's a good idea to review your will periodically to see if it needs updating.

### Having trouble getting started? Here's a sample to give you an idea...

Glenn Boyd Williams, descendant of early settlers of Marietta, Prentiss County, Mississippi was born on May 27, 1912. His parents were Oscar Hiram and Lora Dell Alexander Williams. Glenn's great grandparents came over by wagon train from Habersham County, Georgia about 1842 and named the community Marietta.

From the time he was seventeen years old, Glenn has always been interested in education and being a teacher. He attended Freed Hardeman College in Henderson, TN, Murray State Teachers College in Murray, KY, Union University in Jackson, TN, and earned his master's degree from Mississippi State University in Starkville, MS. He served as a recruiter for Freed Hardeman College for several years.

Some of the schools he has taught include Blythe's Chapel, Zion's Rest, Marietta, Rienzi, Dennis, Belmont, Alva, Hatley, Hamilton, and Burnsville. From 1951 to 1956, he worked for the Mississippi State Department of Education where he had responsibilities for the north half of the state. While Glenn taught school and served as principal, he frequently coached the basketball teams. He was coach of the Girls State Championship Belmont Lady Cardinals in 1948.

Glenn has always taught a bible class for the Church of Christ wherever he and his family lived. He is a member of the order of the Red Rose and past president of the Tishomingo County Retired Teachers Association and a 32nd degree mason. In 1941, Glenn was sent to the Bermuda Islands

as part of a National Defense work with the Merchant Marines.

Glenn married Mary Catherine Patterson on April 29, 1944 while he was stationed in Goldsboro, NC in the Air Force during WWII. Mary Catherine was born and raised in Rockwell, TN. She taught English and French for 28 years with the last 13 being in Iuka, MS.

Mary spent her years in retirement as an active member of several organizations. She was a member and president of the Chief Tishomingo Chapter of the DAR and president of the Retired Teachers Association of Tishomingo County. She was a member and state president of the Kappa Kappa Iota. Mary loved to travel and made many trips all over the United States, Europe and China.

Glenn and Mary had two children: 1. Sylvia Eve, who married Travis Taylor Rushing of Burnsville and; 2. Dale Stuart, who married Margie Wadkins of the Oldham Community near Iuka. Travis and Sylvia have one son, James Taylor Rushing who lives in Kenosha, WI. Dale and Margie have one daughter, Holly Angela Williams Ramsey who has a daughter Rhiannon Melissa Ramsey. They all live in Iuka.

After Mary's passing, Glenn married Carolyn Crawford McHaffey of Iuka on Oct 15, 1994. Carolyn worked for the Tishomingo County Electric Power Association for 38 1/2 years and served as president of the North Mississippi Power Accountants Association in 1972 and 1980.

## Lady Braves of '96 Hang 4-A Runner-Up Banner

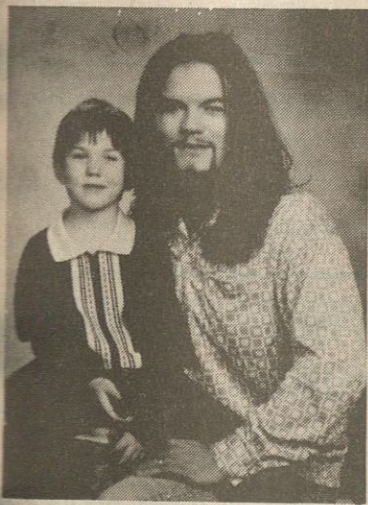

### Arkansas Man Busted For Selling Bird Parts

An Arkansas man has pled guilty to a one-count felony indictment for violations of the Lacey Act in selling migratory bird parts, according to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks.

On February 3, 1997, Robert E. Austin pled guilty in Jackson before a U.S. District Court Judge for the Southern District of Mississippi for selling parts of bald eagles.

In February 1996, special

agents and refuge officers with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and conservation officers with the state Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks arrested Austin in Durant, Mississippi for selling an eagle head dance stick, an Indian head bonnet and other migratory bird parts.

Officers said Austin was offering to sell eagle feathers for \$55 each.

Austin was subsequently indicted by a federal grand jury.

Officials say Austin faces a maximum possible sentence of \$250,000 in fines and/or five years in prison.

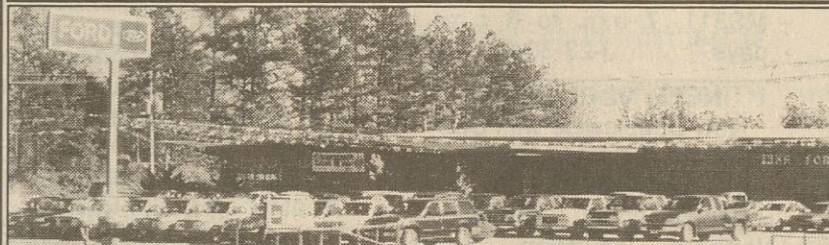

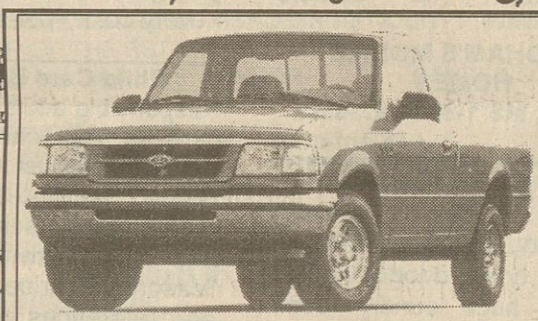

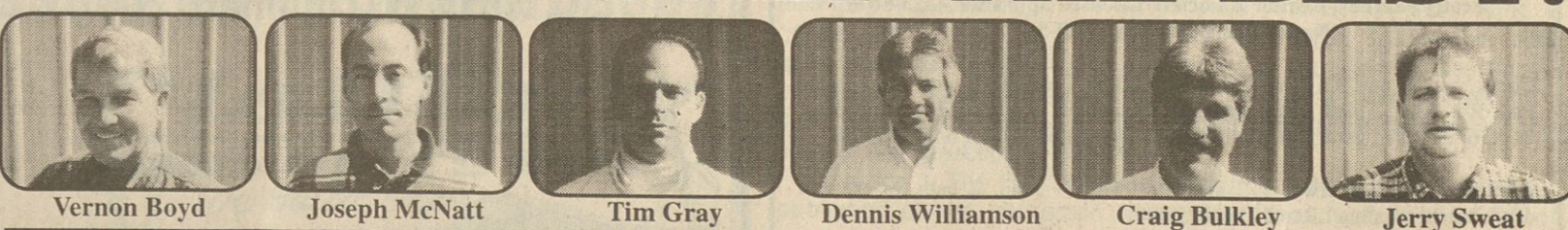

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi (the "Town"), took up for consideration the matter of issuing revenue bonds of said Town in the maximum principal amount of One Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$140,000), to raise money for the purpose of improving the combined water and sewer system of the Town consisting primarily of the improvement of the sewer facilities of said systems of the Town. A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF BURNSVILLE, MISSISSIPPI, DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE TOWN OF BURNSVILLE, MISSISSIPPI (THE "TOWN"), TO ISSUE A COMBINED WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM REVENUE BOND IN A TOTAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND FORTY DOLLARS (140,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVING THE COMBINED WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM OF THE TOWN OF BURNSVILLE, MISSISSIPPI CONSISTING PRIMARILY OF THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE SEWER FACILITIES OF SAID SYSTEM OF THE TOWN.

WHEREAS, the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi (the "Town"), is authorized under the provisions of Miss. Code 1972 Ann. §21-27-23 and 21-27-41 through 21-27-69, as amended, to issue revenue bonds in such amounts as it may find necessary and proper in order to provide funds for the improvement of the combined water and sewer system of the Town consisting primarily of the improvement of the sewer facilities of said system of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen finds and determines that it is necessary and proper to improve the combined water and sewer system of the Town which improvements are to be done substantially in accordance with plans and specifications prepared by engineers employed by the Town and approved by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the health and well-being of the citizens of the Town to issue revenue bonds in order to accomplish the aforesaid improvements; and

Said revenue bond shall not constitute an indebtedness of the Town within the meaning of any statutory or charter restriction, limitation, or provision, and the taxing power of the Town will not be pledged to the payment of said revenue bond, but the same, together with the interest thereon, shall be payable solely from revenues of the water and sewer system.

Section 3. Unless a protest in writing signed by not less than twenty percent (20%) of the qualified electors of the Town objecting to and protesting against the issuance of said revenue bonds is filed with the Mayor and Board of Aldermen on or before 7:00 o'clock p.m. on March 11, 1997 which date shall be more than ten (10) days after the date of the last publication of this resolution, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town will provide for the issuance of the said revenue bonds at said time or at some meeting or meetings subsequent thereto. If such protest and objection is filed on or before said date and hour, the question of the issuance of said revenue bond shall be submitted to an election to be held as provided in Miss. Code 1972 Ann., Section 21-27-43, as amended.

Section 4. This resolution shall be published once a week for at least three consecutive weeks in the *Tishomingo County News*, a newspaper published in the City of Iuka, Mississippi and having a general circulation in the Town of Burnsville, Mississippi and qualified under the provisions of the laws of the State of Mississippi, and the last publication of this resolution shall be more than ten (10) days prior to the date hereinabove set forth as the deadline for the filing of any objection or protest.

Section 5. The Town Clerk is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of publication of this resolution and have the same before the Mayor and Board of Aldermen on the day and hour hereinabove specified.

Alderman Nixon seconded the motion to adopt the foregoing resolution, and the question being put to a roll call vote, the result was as follows:

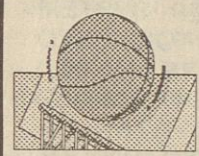




### Iuka Hospital Volunteers Get In Valentine Spirit Membership Drive for New Volunteers During February

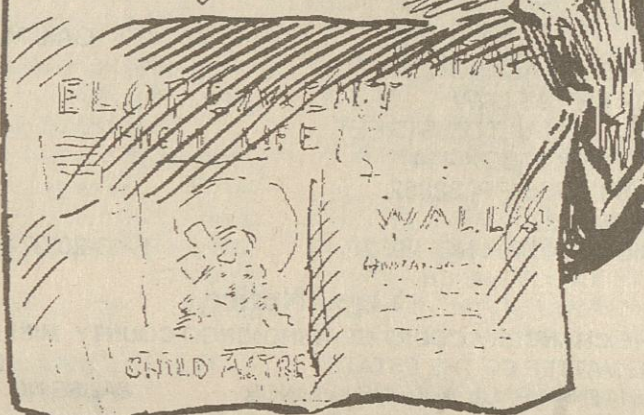
