Power Out For 1,380 Iuka Homes After Accident on Eastport Road

About 1,380 Iuka citizens were without power Sunday evening after a Corinth driver hit a power pole on Eastport Road.

According to Tishomingo County Electric Power Association Manager Robert Grisham, power was out for about 40 minutes after the accident which occurred about 6:30 p.m. It took quite a while for power crews to get through the onlookers at the scene of the one-car wreck, Grisham said. But they soon managed to get to the substation and isolate the affected pole to repair the damage and restore power to all but one home, he explained.

Jason C. Cooper, 21, of 1101 Phillip Street in Corinth, was charged with reckless driving following the one-vehicle collision. According to the accident report filed by the Iuka Police, Cooper, driving a friend's 1995 Mercury, was going southbound on Eastport Road near the Corner Store when he entered a curve too fast, losing control of the vehicle, which then struck a fire hydrant, a light pole and a tree, coming to rest off the road on an embankment.

Cooper suffered cracked ribs during the accident, and was taken to Iuka Hospital, and then on to North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo where he was released the next day.

A minor passenger was also taken to Iuka Hospital and then transferred to Magnolia Hospital in Corinth. He received stitches for a cut over his eye, according to Cooper.

Two Men Injured In Head-On Collision Near Paden Saturday

Two Paden men were seriously injured in a head-on collision last Saturday evening on County Road 127 between Midway and Paden.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff Deputies on the scene of the 7:30 p.m. accident, the two vehicles, a 1979 Datsun driven by Jimmy Lee Borden, 34, and a 1986 Ford Ranger pickup driven by Chris Griffin, 25, met on a hill on what is known as Friendship Road and collided head-on about 1 1/2 miles north of Paden.

Both drivers had to be extricated from the vehicles by the "jaws-of-life", deputies reported. Emergency First Responders were quickly on the scene with the equipment, said Deputy Ricky Enlow.

Borden was airlifted from Iuka Hospital to North Mississippi Medical Center and was expected to have surgery on a broken leg Wednesday. He also suffered broken ribs.

Griffin was transported to Iuka Hospital, where he was treated and released.

Red Bay Man Killed Last Friday In Accident

A Red Bay man was killed when his car was struck by a log truck last Friday at the intersection of Allsboro Road and U.S. Highway 72 in Cherokee.

According to an Alabama State Highway Patrol spokesman and Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies at the scene, at about 10:15 a.m. March 21st, a 1980 Buick driven by Frank Owens, 77, was struck by a log truck as he attempted to pull onto Hwy. 72 from Allsboro Road near the Alabama-Mississippi state line.

The driver of the 1989 white GMC truck was Bobby Taylor of Vernon, Alabama, and he was not injured.

I am George A. Long, the latest candidate for the position of Alderman of the City of Iuka.

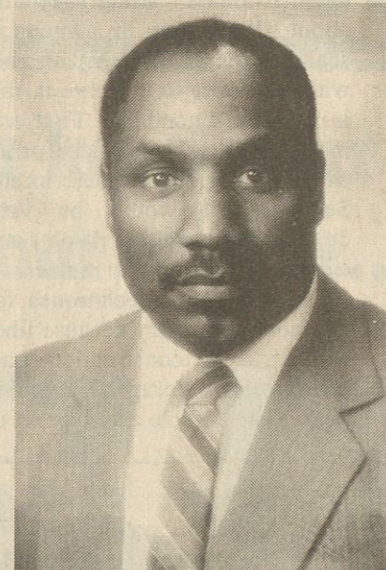

Home Economics Tips

Time And Thyme Again

After the past two weeks' column about time management, I couldn't resist a play on words when the newsletter from Porter's Creek Thymes crossed my desk. I'll leave it to Lelia Kelly to provide more information about growing herbs, but according to the newsletter, thyme has been named the "herb of the year" by the International Herb Association, and with good reasons. It is relatively carefree and has many uses, from ornamental to aromatic to culinary.

I hope you have plans to grow and use herbs this year. Most are easily grown in little space, and can be used fresh, or dried for future use. I grew one plant or thyme last year in a soil-filled center of a concrete block. It thrived, especially since thyme needs a slightly sweet (lime) medium, but unfortunately I let it get too dry last fall and the early freeze did it in. I will replace it soon, and add basil, dill, rosemary, and perhaps others to the mint, sage and garlic held over from last year.

If you're interested in gardening, the Alcorn County MHV Clubs will study "Small Space Gardening" as their April program. Unlike in some places, almost everyone in this area has space to grow a few plants. Many vegetables and herbs can be very decorative, contributing not only flowers, but fruit or foliage for the table as well. And, there are benefits from getting fresh air and exercise!

Some folks in Tishomingo

County got their exercise last week preparing for and carrying out their annual Quilt Fair at Midway Community Center. Some gorgeous quilts were exhibited — some old some new. It is mind-boggling to contemplate the hours of work that went into one, not to mention all, that were there. Between 9:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. several ladies demonstrated and almost finished the hand-stitching for one quilt, which they will finish and bind at their club meeting.

Quilting is one of America's true cultural arts that is not yet lost. Artistry, creativity, industry and patience are all evident in the many variations of piecing, applique and embroidery the quilt-maker puts together. Many are passed down through generations and treasured as heirlooms, with both their monetary and sentimental value increasing with age.

It is always with trepidation that I respond to occasional requests for recommendations on care of quilts, for many are priceless to the proud possessor. One gentleman asked recently about placing one in a vacuum-sealed bag. While sympathizing with his desire to preserve it, this is really not a good idea. First, and most importantly, this lack of air causes fabric to deteriorate. Secondly, it would be very difficult to take out for display and enjoyment, and then to replace.

Conservation techniques for heirloom quilts vary because fiber content, dyes, construction, past treatment, and storage all combine to give each article a unique set of

conservation needs a problem. What may be good for one quilt is not automatically good for another.

One recommendation that applies to most is to remove airborne dirt and dust before attempting any other type of cleaning technique. Vacuuming may be the only type of cleaning possible and even this may be too rough for very dry, fragile fabrics.

To vacuum, cover the quilt with a piece of fiberglass-coated screen and run a low-power hand vacuum cleaner over it. The screen acts as a shield and allows and vacuum cleaner to pull the dirt out without sucking up the quilt and damaging it.

Corneal Ulcers

A whole range of microorganisms (fungi, bacteria, viruses, parasites) can infect the cornea and cause ulcers and abscesses. When moderately deep, these ulcers can cause permanent scarring. Still deeper ulcers can spread the infection inside the eye itself. This condition is called *endophthalmitis*. With infection inside the eye, damage to the ocular contents can cause blindness. A corneal ulcer deserves immediate, careful treatment.

The condition may appear to the patient as a simple red eye, but most often it is associated with pain, sensitivity to light, watery or thick discharge, and variably blurred vision, depending on the location. The patient may even see a white spot on the cornea, appearing as a white spot over the iris (the colored part of the eye) or over the central black pupil. The cornea is the clear, crystal dome that covers the iris and the pupil. Bacterial ulcers should be treated immediately, before they have a chance to spread.

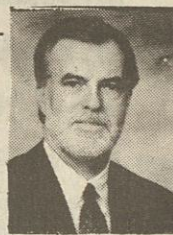

Most Claims Are Settled Out-of-Court

Many people who have valid — and very valuable — legal claims do not make them. Why? Some people fear that making a claim means they will have to go to court. Others do not know that their claim is valid. Still others drop their claim to avoid upsetting the other party.

Ignoring a valid claim can mean losing valuable damages that you are entitled to. Most legal disputes — over 90% — are settled out-of-court. Many claims are paid not by the wrongdoer, but by an insurance company. So making a claim usually does not mean there will be a trial or that the other party will have to pay.

Walk For Your Life

By: Tara W. Ray, RN, CCU, Eliza Coffee Memorial Hospital Heart Disease is the NUMBER ONE killer in America. In Mississippi, more than 12,000 deaths occur annually from Heart Disease. According to the American Heart Association, in 1995 Tishomingo County had 246 deaths. Of the 246 people who died, 103 was related to heart disease. This means that 44 percent of our deaths are accountable to

heart disease.

Physical inactivity is one of the major risk factors which leads to the development of heart disease. One enjoyable way to increase physical activity is to walk.

Walking has many advantages. Among other benefits, walking can decrease blood cholesterol, improve immune response, improve circulation, burn calories, lower blood pressure, assist to control diabetes, and help people to stop smoking. Brisk walks can improve flexibility, build muscle strength, and improve efficiency of the heart. Walking also will give you a sense of well-being.

When you begin walking, proceed with caution. Before beginning an exercise program, contact your physician if you have a history of heart disease or chest pain, obesity, greater than 40 years old, currently live a sedentary life style, or have other medical problems. Also, if at any time if you develop chest pain, shortness of breath, or your heart starts beating too fast (palpitations) stop your exercise immediately and contact your physician.

Commit to a schedule for walking. Encourage other

members of your family to walk with you. You can start an evening walk with the entire family which will not only decrease your chance for heart disease as, but will allow you to spend quality time with your family away from the telephone and television.

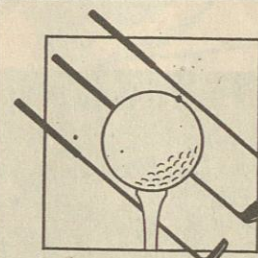

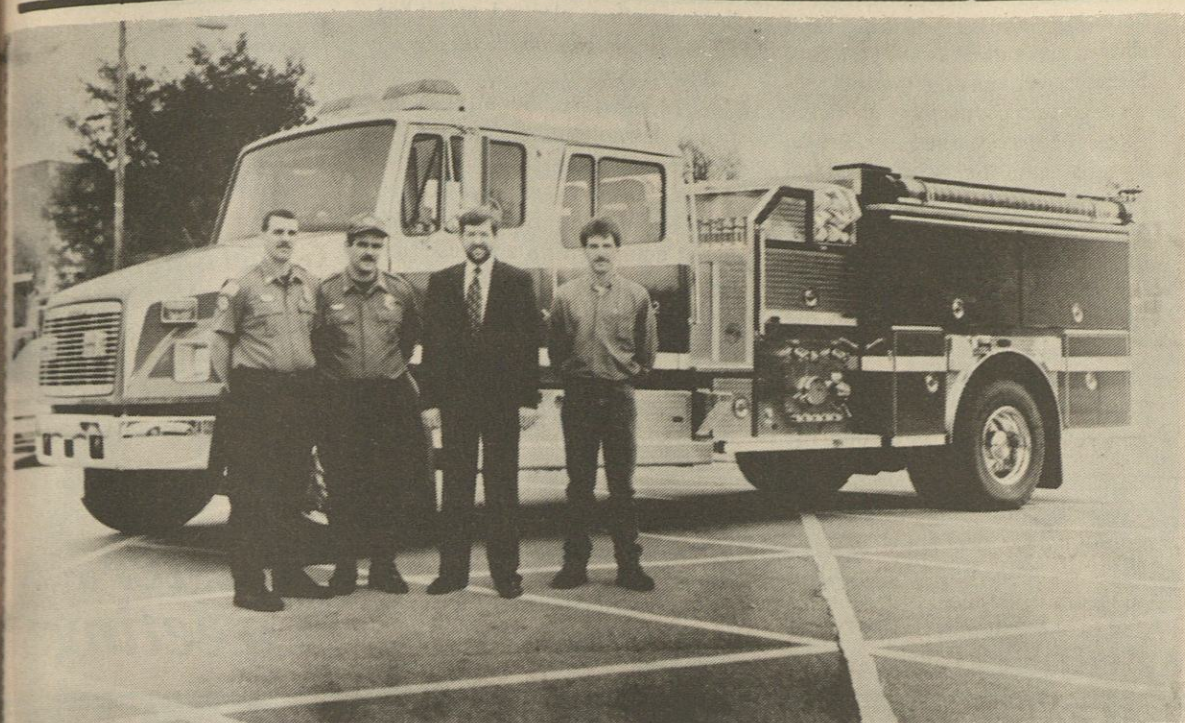

New Fire Engine Next Step Toward Reduced Insurance Rates For Iuka

The city of Iuka has acquired a new state-of-the-art fire engine pumper truck as part of its ongoing efforts toward reducing city fire insurance premiums, announced city officials Tuesday.

The new 1,000-gallon pumper can pump 1,250 gallons a minute and is equipped with the latest and most modern fire fighting features available for use today, according to a statement from the Iuka Fire Department.

The new Emergency One (E1) truck was purchased with funds from the fire rebate monies the city receives from the Mississippi State Insurance Commission, said Mayor David Nichols, so there is no cost to the taxpayers of Iuka.

"This new piece of equipment is a welcome addition to our community," said Iuka Fire Chief Travis South. "The department is very pleased with the new equipment and is dedicated to providing the highest quality of service to a very deserving community."

The purchase of the fire truck was one in a series of actions taken recently by the IFD to improve the city's fire protection system and get the state fire rating bureau to reclassify Iuka to a Class 7 rating, which will result in a 22 percent decrease in homeowner fire insurance premiums, say fire fighters.

Recent changes in the city made by the department include

some improvements to water lines in several areas of the city, and academy certification of all fire fighters. Items required by the bureau that are still to be completed include the addition of an auxiliary engine at the city water plant that will ensure maintenance of daily capacity in case of a power failure, said fire department spokesmen.

When all the state requirements are met, representatives from the state bureau will reevaluate the system and make a decision. That is estimated to happen in the next few months, according to a statement made at the last city board meeting.

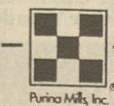

The Kellogg's All-Brn Extra Fiber Muffin

- 1 1/4 C. All-purpose flour
- 1/2 c. sugar
- 1 T. baking powder
- 1/4 t. salt
- 2 c. Kellogg's All-Brn Extra Fiber Cereal
- 1 1/4 c. milk
- 1 egg

New Entrance Fee Procedures For Shiloh Park...

Beginning this spring, during periods of heavy visitation, on holidays, and for special events, the National Park Service will collect Shiloh National Military Park entrance fees as visitors first drive into the park, Park Superintendent Woody Harrell announced today. "Faced with the need to balance the budget, Congress has indicated they would like to see more of each park's operating costs borne by actual park users. Park entrance fees are clearly one way to help accomplish this goal. For the past decade, we've asked visitors to pay the parkwide fee only upon entering the Shiloh Visitor Center. Over the years, we've found many visitors, to avoid paying the fee, bypass the Visitor Center altogether. This not only lowers our fee revenues, it also makes it more difficult to provide Shiloh visitors with orientation and information on the battlefield." Nationwide, recent fee collection legislation has allowed individual parks to keep a larger portion of funds they collect, rather than having to turn them in to the national Treasury.

"When park traffic justifies it, we'll now set up a roadside collection station on Pittsburg Landing (Grant) Road. When entering the park, visitors will pay a fee of \$4.00 per family car. Visitors will then be provided tour information and a dated permit, valid for seven days. This permit must be prominently displayed on

the car dash while motorists drive park grounds." Harrell hopes the new system will relieve congestion at the Visitor Center information desk during the periods of heaviest visitation. During less busy times, the park entrance fee will continue to be collected at the Visitor Center, as it has been since 1987.

Educational groups, and persons entering park grounds solely to visit the National

Cemetery or the Shiloh United Methodist Church, remain exempt from paying the entrance fee, as are persons under 17 years of age. For frequent visitors, Superintendent Harrell points out a yearly Shiloh entrance pass is available for \$10.00. Annual "Golden Eagle" permits which

allow entry into any of the 370 units of the National Park System are still a bargain at \$50.00 per year. For persons age 62 or older, a one time fee of \$10 will secure a lifetime "Golden Age" permit which provides entrance to most Federal lands, as well as a discount on some user fees.

participation, and we're happy to help in any way we can," Caldwell said.

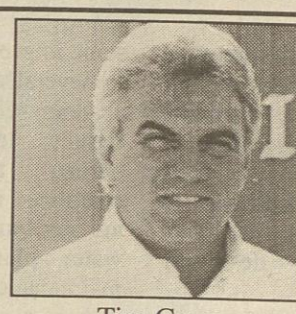
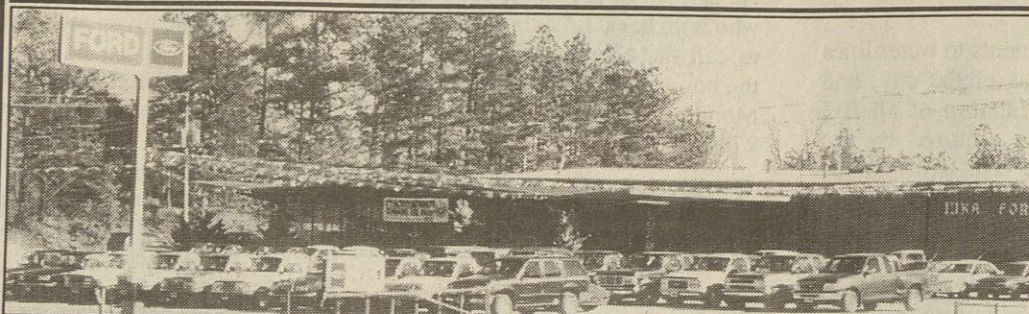

What Causes Bad Breath?

Report From Congress

Rep. Wicker Backs Legislation To Provide More Computers In Local Schools

In an effort to bring more computers to the classrooms of America, I have co-sponsored legislation to provide tax incentives to corporations and non-profit organizations who donate computer technology, equipment, and software to our schools.

The 21st Century Classrooms Act provides incentives for the private sector to put more computer equipment into the hands of the nation's students. The legislation would allow corporations and non-profits to deduct up to half of the depreciated value of the equipment. Another provision provides a 110 percent tax credit for companies which donate cash to schools for the purpose of purchasing computer equipment.

The General Accounting Office (GAO) found in 1995 that, "America's schools are not designed or equipped for the 21st century." The finding was not a reflection on the abilities of teachers or the commitment of parents or students. The conclusion reached by GAO was that our classrooms have not been able to keep up with changes in a high-tech world.

By the year 2000, estimates are that more than 60 percent of American jobs will require significant technological skills. To meet that challenge, students will need a solid foundation in the basics of education, but they will also need a high degree of technological literacy.

Most classrooms today lack the resources to take students into the high-tech world of the 21st

century. For example, 14 percent of our classrooms do not even have the capability to connect to the Internet. Only one out of 50 classrooms around the nation are connected to the Internet. Most of the schools fortunate enough to have computers are using equipment that is outdated.

The federal government already provides grant money for this purpose through Title I, Technology Challenge Grants and other programs. In fact, Congress is now investing about \$1 billion annually on education technology, but the cost of bringing our classrooms up to date would run into the tens of billions of dollars. The best solution to this problem is not in Washington, D.C. We should look to the innovation and creativity of private enterprise to expand technological

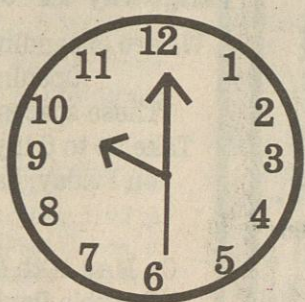
