Iuka City Hall Now Located In Former ASCS Office On East Eastport Street *Next To The Old Post Office Building*

Iuka Starts Picking Up Pieces After City Hall Fire

An early morning fire Sunday at Iuka City Hall interrupted city business for a while on Monday, but by Tuesday afternoon, basic services of the city hall were back, and plans for repairing the fire and smoke damaged building were already in process.

Actual fire damage was limited to a copier room, where the fire is thought to have started, and the adjoining office of the police chief.

The report of Mississippi State Fire Marshall Mike Ivey stated that the cause of the fire was accidental and that it started in and around a receptacle where the copier was plugged in.

Though the courtroom/boardroom, and the offices of the city clerk and utility clerk only received heat, smoke and water damage, some of the furnishings and almost all the computer equipment suffered extensive damage.

The fire department area and the police department headquarters, both in the same building, received less damage, and are operating as usual, Mayor David Nichols said.

City records were kept safe in the vault, and utility bills that may have been in the drop box at the time of the fire were recovered and processed as usual, said City Clerk Benny Gray.

Messy Cleanup Begins

Monday morning city employees from every department put on surgical masks and work clothes to get down to the business of cleaning out the offices of the city clerk and the city utility clerk department.

New City Offices On Eastport

By Monday afternoon, services and personnel of the city clerk's and city utilities clerk's offices were transferred to the new temporary location on Eastport Street in the former ASCS office, next door to the law offices of Langston, Langston, Michael and Bowen.

City Clerk Benny Gray said that all city utility bills can be paid at the new location, which will be open regular hours, and the same phone numbers are already in service. Driver's license services will not be held in Iuka until the city hall is repaired (see story in this issue).

"We really appreciate the help of all the citizens and city employees who came to help move and clean up," said Gray. "We especially appreciate the patience of the public during this time of transition."

Damage Assessment and Repair

An insurance adjuster (from Lomenick's State Farm) came Monday morning to assess damage, Nichols said. There was a meeting Tuesday night to give an official update on repair plans to the Iuka Board of Aldermen.

Nichols discussed with aldermen preliminary plans for an aggressive schedule for getting moved back into a refurbished city hall as soon as possible.

Plans include doing an inventory of damaged equipment and furniture, getting an estimate from engineers and contractors on repairing the damage, and getting a contract to do the actual repair work as soon as possible. Though he said it is probably optimistic, Nichols hopes for repairs to be complete in the next 30-60 days.

Iuka Hires Dispatcher

The city of Iuka has hired a police dispatcher to handle all police department dispatching duties at Iuka City Hall.

Ricky Green, of Iuka, began his duties as dispatcher this week, and was hired at last Thursday's meeting of the Iuka Board of Aldermen.

Green will be answering the 423-6340 number at City Hall primarily for the police, although if someone calls needing the fire department, he will dispatch firemen.

This will give the city dispatching from 7 a.m. until 11 p.m. daily, said Mayor David Nichols. Daytime hours when the dispatcher is not on duty will be handled by police officers rotating dispatch duties.

Green will soon be attending a 2-day seminar to receive 911 certification, as is required for dispatchers.

The board plans to address the need of other dispatchers in the new fiscal year budget, Nichols said.

Incumbents Re-Elected to TCEPA Board Saturday

All incumbents that ran in Saturday's Tishomingo County Electric Power Association board election were re-elected for another three-year term, according to election results released by TCEPA Executive Director Robert Grisham.

Five board members were up for re-election, but only one, Edward Hubbard of the First Supervisor District, faced opposition. Hubbard defeated challenger Aubrey Wayne Helton with a total of 127 votes, to Helton's 22 votes.

Iuka City Hall Damaged By Fire Early Sunday Morning

Extensive Smoke Was Challenge To Firefighters At The Scene

The quiet and relative peace of the past few months for the Iuka Fire Department ended suddenly early Sunday morning when the Iuka City Hall, which also houses the city police and fire departments, caught fire.

About 4:15 a.m., Iuka Fireman Brandon Grissom, who was close to wrapping up his 24-hour shift that began Saturday at 7 a.m., was awakened by the sound of breakers flipping off in the building's main breaker box just a few feet from the department sleeping quarters.

Grissom, who has only been with the department 2 1/2 months, said he jumped up and opened the door only to have smoke from the garage/truck storage area of the fire station flood into the sleeping quarters, blinding any view of the room or the garage.

He crawled out to the roll-up doors and lifted them to let smoke out, tried the police department door to try to get to the nearest phone, and finding it locked, then headed back to the sleeping quarters where he called the central dispatching/911 office at the Tishomingo County Sheriff's

Department.

Dispatchers paged J. C. Ledgewood, who was the Iuka police officer on duty, Iuka firemen, and then also other area volunteers.

Grissom also called Iuka Assistant Chief Bryan Grissom who arrived in about 2-3 minutes.

Together, Brandon and Bryan Grissom opened three of the engine bay doors manually, to get the trucks out. Unable to make the last door work with the manual pull chain, the assistant chief drove the 1993 E-1 protector pumper truck through the

partially-opened door.

"It suffered little damage, just a crack to the windshield and some scratches, and a deck gun on top that we can repair," assured Assistant Chief Bryan Grissom.

Meanwhile, in the next 10 minutes all the Iuka firefighters and many volunteers from surrounding departments were on the scene, Chief Travis South said.

Firefighters were certain there were no other people in the building since the police department was locked up. Then firefighters set up a ventilation system to get smoke out of the building, by opening the doors and cutting a hole in the roof, Firefighter Gene Gober explained.

After Bryan Grissom opened the back door to city hall and a positive pressure ventilation (PPV) fan was set up, rookies Brandon Grissom and Tony Williams entered the building to find the fire, which apparently started in the copier room, near the city clerk's office.

The major flames were put out within two minutes, said Gober, and it was confined to the area surrounding the copier room and the adjoining office of Iuka Police Chief Amos Bates. Surrounding offices suffered major smoke and heat damage, but city records, stored in a vault were undamaged.

The firefighters and many volunteers from North Crossroads, Harmony Central, Burnsville, Coleman Park, Midway and Snowdown-Pleasant

Hill worked to keep down flare ups, the last of which was reported to dispatchers at 5:48 a.m.

"There were fire trucks and pumps as far as you could see," explained Gober. The Iuka department members could not say enough about how grateful they were for the assistance they received from not only volunteer firefighters, but from citizens who came and helped in any way they could.

Chief Travis South said [Brandon] Grissom, the fireman on duty, did a "marvelous" job, and all those who responded performed as they were trained.

"The quick action of the Iuka firemen and all the volunteers combined contained the fire to only two rooms," said Mayor David Nichols.

No Smoke Detectors

The city hall was not equipped with smoke detectors or alarms. Brandon Grissom said he did hear the burglar alarms going


off, which went off automatically when the power switched off.

"When the building was remodeled from a grocery store to the city hall in 1981, there were no fire codes to require sprinkler systems, or alarms," said Gober.

Authorities have said that a fire protection system, including smoke detectors and possibly a sprinkler system will be included in the refurbishing of the City Hall.

Brandon Grissom, who is scheduled to attend the fire fighting training center in Pearl as soon as a space is available, said he was just thankful to have gotten out of the building in time.

Chief South praised him, and all the others who "did a marvelous job" while risking their lives to save the building.

Cherokee Toddler Drowns In Tub

An 11-month old Cherokee, Alabama toddler drowned in the bathtub of his parents' house Monday afternoon, according to the Cherokee Police Department.

The child, James Skyler Hogeland, was pronounced dead at Helen Keller Hospital at 4:07 p.m., several minutes after his mother discovered him in the tub of their Brotherton Street residence.

Hogeland was the son of James Aaron Hogeland and Katina Lynn Ganza, authorities said. He was less than one week away from his first birthday.

An autopsy on the child has

been ordered, which Colbert County Coroner Joe Morrison said is routine. Cherokee Police Chief Paul Norman said that foul play "isn't even being considered. It's just an unfortunate accident."

Norman said the residence at 425 Brotherton Street is not air conditioned, and the family uses a lone circulating fan as its only means of relief from the heat.

Norman said that the child and his 3-year-old brother were "playing in cool water" at the time of the drowning.

The two children and their mother were taking a nap under the living room fan Monday afternoon. With the mother still

asleep, the children woke up and went to the bathroom, where the 3-year-old child began running cold water in the tub.

The mother woke up to the sound of running water and ran to the bathroom only to find the child dead, said authorities. Norman said the tub was filled with water when the mother arrived in the bathroom.

She grabbed the child and ran outside, soliciting help from the neighbors. They quickly transported the child to the Sheffield hospital.

Funeral arrangements for James Skyler Hogeland were incomplete Wednesday morning.

Commonly Asked Personal Injury Questions

Q. I was injured in an accident. How much can I recover?

A. The answer depends on many factors, including the type of injury, how severe your pain is, your medical expenses, and your lost income. Your attorney can evaluate these factors and then, based on settlements and jury awards for similar injuries, estimate how much you might recover.

Q. Can I still get damages if the accident was partly my fault?

A. Yes. In most states, accident victims can recover money even if they are partly at fault. Your damages will just be reduced by the amount of your fault.

Back To School Shopping

With area schools back in session many families are experiencing new, or at least different, demands on their time and resources. Not the least of these right now is the need for new clothes for those school-age children.

Now if you're an average parent (or grandparent), have an average (or limited) income, you may be feeling dread of those back-to-school expenses. You've seen the price tags on children's clothes.

A cotton jumper for a 7 year old costs \$70. A pair of jeans for an 11-year-old costs \$50. Let's not even mention the cost of shoes.

What do you do? The kid is whining. MasterCard is calling. The Discover card people want to discover where you live because they've discovered that you can't pay. Well, take heart. There are alternatives. It's called management.

Before you shop, consider needs as well as "wants" in relation to the clothes already in the closet. The beginning of a new season is a good time to evaluate both your own and your children's wardrobes in terms of number of clothing items, condition of garments, fit, and coordination of separates into different outfits.

Once you decide what items are needed and how much money you can spend, keep the following in mind for getting the best buy:

- *Shop a variety of stores before making a decision.
- *Read labels carefully for fiber content and care instructions.
- *Make a decision based on

cost of garment, cleaning cost, and how often the garment will be worn.

Since school clothes often receive hard wear and frequent washings, quality is especially important. Check for these quality features:

*Stitching should be straight, secure, small enough to hold seams in stress areas and free of loose threads.

*Horizontal and vertical grain construction in the fabric's weave should be straight, and patterns should match at seams.

*Buttons, buttonholes and zippers should be functional and securely stitched to the garment.

*Elastic waistbands should be completely enclosed inside fabric for comfort and durability.

When buying brand-name or expensive items, figure the cost per wearing by dividing the cost of the garment by the number of times you expect it to be worn. Frequently worn items, such as jeans, can have a very low cost per wear.

Informed, prepared shoppers can find the best prices and quality. Planning your purchases is like having 20 percent more spending power, because if you make a list and stick to it, you are less likely to overspend.

Don't neglect considering the child's age and attitude as you try to accommodate "wants" within the confines of the family budget.

Diabetes Can Lead To Dental Problems

Diabetes, a chronic, metabolic disease, affects more than 11 million people in the United States. In addition, millions of people have undiagnosed diabetes, symptoms of which may first be detected in a dental exam. The importance of maintaining healthy teeth and gums is magnified in a diabetic dental patient who may be especially prone to oral health problems.

The most consistent oral problem for people with diabetes is the development of periodontal, or gum, disease. Diabetic patients may have rapid development of periodontal disease and jaw bone loss in response to relatively small accumulations of dental plaque and calculus (tarter).

Detection of diabetes in a dental patient is also important because it may make longer for gum tissues to heal after surgery, with an increased likelihood of infection developing. Acute dental problems should be treated as soon as possible in a diabetic individual.

Why Check Peripheral Vision?

The eye chart with letters measures only visual acuity, your fine central vision. The visual field is the total area in which the eye sees. In certain instances (suspicion of glaucoma, retinal abnormalities, optic nerve disorders, neurologic disorders, headaches, and so on) a test of your peripheral (side) vision is important.

To measure your peripheral vision, a special computerized instrument is used. If you like video games, you'll love this part of the test. First, each eye is tested separately, then together. Your head is kept immobile as you face a large dome, perforated with a scattering of pin-sized holes. As you gaze ahead steadily at a red-lit cross in the center of the dome, miniscule flashes of light go off through the holes, one at a time at various distances from the center cross. Every time you see a "star" light up in this mini-planetary, you hit a button. Meanwhile the computer keeps score by adding up the correct "strikes".

Canine Bloat

"Bloat", better known among veterinarians as gastric dilation-volvulus, or GDV, remains one of the most serious and deadly threats facing the large dog breeds.

As it implies, Bloat is a serious medical condition associated with the accumulation of incredible quantities of gas in the stomach, but it's more than just a case of bad gas. Bloat is also a severe, life-threatening obstruction of the stomach at the intestine that results when the stomach actually rotates or flips, within the abdomen. Bloat is most likely to occur in large, deep-chested dogs such as the German Shepherd, Irish Setter, and Great Dane. Bloat is most likely to occur within one to three hours following a meal.

The most common sign of Bloat is sudden onset lethargy and reluctance to move. The enlarged stomach makes the abdomen look unusually large or bloated, causing pain and difficulty breathing.

There is no home remedy for Bloat. Treatment must be administered by a veterinarian, and it should be administered within 3 to 4 hours following the onset of signs to avoid serious complications.

The specific causes of Bloat are now known. If you do own a large, deep-chested dog, it is recommended to feed frequent, small quantities of food, regardless of whether you feed your dog canned or dry dog food. Although Bloat is not associated with a particular brand or type of food, it is most likely to occur subsequent to a large meal.

County Agents Notes

Cool Season Forages

If you get through the summer and you think that you may be short on hay, now would be a good time to start planning on cool season grazing with something like fescue, ryegrass, legumes, or mixtures. The first step is to determine the fertilizer and lime requirements by taking a good random soil sample. Lime needs to be applied as soon as possible to allow time for the pH to adjust as much as possible before planting this fall. Use quality seed and plant at the proper time. We have an information sheet that shows varieties, planting dates and rates. Call or stop by and pick one up. Tilled seedbeds should be relatively firm after lime and fertilizer is applied especially for

small seeded forages like the clovers. If a large amount of weeds have been tilled into the soil, allow enough time for decay since this will harbor insects and can tie up plant nutrients. Fields should be smoothed so that harvest will be more efficient and equipment damage is held to a minimum in future years. For more information contact the Extension Office at 423-7016.

It's almost that time of year again. The 45th Annual Tishomingo County Fair is just around the corner. Dates will be September 30th through October 4th. There will be a Draft Horse and Mule Show plus a Mule Pull on Saturday, September 27th. A great week of festivities are being planned so mark your calendar and make plans to bring the whole family.

Brown Recluse Spiders

People generally do not like insects or spiders in the home. Most spiders are harmless, but there is one (the brown recluse) that will invade the home and it is

poisonous. Bites from this spider will cause severe tissue damage. The body is about 3/8 inch long and 3/16 inch wide with long legs. The abdomen is dark brown while the cephalothorax (upper body) is lighter in color. There is a violin shape on the cephalothorax that is darker than the surrounding color. These spiders get there name because they are very shy and nonaggressive. They will be in areas such as closets, unused bedrooms, or any area that is unfrequented by people. Look

behind and inside cardboard boxes, old books, newspapers, etc. Control can be do-it-yourself or a professional can be contacted. Two products may be used within the living area. These are: 0.5% chlorpyrifos (Dursban) which is sold under various names or phenothrin (Bengal Roach Spray) which may also be found under different names. You can monitor the effectiveness of your spray by using sticky traps set at various locations in the home.

Iuka Students Pre-Teen Finalist In Jackson

Whitney Bowling, a fifth grade student at Iuka Middle School qualified as a state-finalist in the 1997 Pre-Teen Mississippi Scholarship and Recognition Program. Whitney, along with Erin Wade and Amiee Kirk, sixth grade students, attended the three day event August 1-3 in Jackson, Mississippi.

The Pre-Teen Program is a national event designed to recognize the nation's outstanding Pre-Teens as well as provide an avenue to promote high morals, standards of excellence, fellowship, family values and social development. Girls ranging in age from 7 thru 12 are recognized for their positive qualities and commitment to excellence in learning and character.

205 girls from across the state qualified as state-finalists. Due to the large number of participants this year's program was divided into North and South divisions. The Iuka girls competed in the North Half Division with 99 other young ladies.

Whitney elected to compete in the all around areas of speech, talent and achievement. The speech contestants chose their topics from various categories selected by the National Directors of Pre-Teen. Whitney's speech was entitled "Violence in America - The Causes and Effects". Each contestant prepared a two minute speech to be presented on stage to the panel of judges, parents and participants. Whitney stressed the points of "self-respect, self-discipline and self-control".

In a separate competition, all three young ladies entered the Talent Show.

There were 45 girls competing in this area, entertaining the judges and audience with their singing, dancing, gymnastics, dramatic readings and art displays.

Erin Wade sang the LeeAnn Rimes' hit "Blue Moon of Kentucky". Whitney selected the song "Jesus Has a Rocking Chair", and Amiee Kirk sang the song "Hopelessly Devoted". Whitney and Amiee were thrilled to be awarded trophies as 4th Runner Up and 2nd Runner Up, respectively. The girls received engraved trophies and were asked to perform during the closing ceremonies on Sunday.

One hundred two girls from the North-half were presented for their on stage review. Prior to the review, each contestant was given a general knowledgeability test and was personally interviewed by the panel of judges. The girls' composite score consisted of: Academic Achievement (20%); Volunteer Service to Community and Church (10%); School Honors and Activities (10%); Development of Personal Skills and Abilities (10%); General Knowledgeability Test (15%); Communicative Ability (20%) and On-Stage Expressiveness and Overall Pre-Teen Image (15%). Each contestant was awarded a Certificate of Participation as a State Finalist.

As each of the girls were presented they introduced themselves and told a little bit about their hometown. Whitney announced that she was from Iuka, "The Best Kept Secret of the South." In Amiee's introduction she described the beautiful Pickwick Lake and the "wonderful Tennessee River Catfish" (which she said her Daddy cooked the best!). Erin proclaimed that her hometown was famous for its healing Mineral Springs Water.

Amiee was honored as a Pre-Teen Merit Award Winner. Erin was selected as a winner of the Judges' Special Award. Both girls received beautifully engraved trophies.

From the field of 102 contestants the top 25 were announced. Whitney was selected as one of semi-finalists, receiving a Pre-Teen Semi-Finalist Trophy. Each semi-finalist was then asked an impromptu question from the master of ceremonies. The girls were judged on their composure, wit and knowledge. Whitney was asked what advice she had for President Clinton. She recommended that he cut taxes and raise salaries!

Tabulating all scores, the winners in the Junior and Senior age divisions were selected. Madison Loden, age 9, from Batesville was chosen as the 1997 Junior Pre-Teen Mississippi/North Half. Eleven year old Madison Kilgore, also from Batesville, was selected as Senior Pre-Teen Mississippi/North Half. These girls will go on to the national finals to be held in Baton Rouge, La in July of 1998.
