## Tishomingo Little League Ball Fields Taking Shape, With Help From Friends

About a year ago, when the Town of Tishomingo designated some land for new ball fields the Tishomingo Dixie Youth Little League Association, it was hard to imagine the hilly, scrub-covered area would ever make any kind of ball field. But with the help of a few friends, a beautiful new field has taken shape, and should be ready for play next spring.

The Little League Association members know that the road ahead is still rough, with much fund-raising to do before the complete facility, including two fields and a concession stand, is complete. Plans at this stage include future ideas for a walking track and a playground, but getting the fields ready for next spring, and the more than 100 little baseball, tee-ball, and softball players who will utilize the new fields, is top priority. Little League officers say.

The best part of all is that the leveling of the once rolling hills has been done at no charge by trainees from the Southern Apprentice and Training (SAT) facility at the Tri-State Commerce Park.

SAT operates a training facility for OSHA-required training in safety, and operation of heavy equipment, according to Randy Norris, Training Administrator for SAT. The training often requires trainees to operate the bulldozers, scrapers and other earthmoving equipment for which they are being trained, so SAT does some community improvement projects like the little league ball field for only the cost of fuel. Since opening a year ago, SAT had trained a total of 529 individuals.

The ten acres on County Road

108 lie just east of the Tishomingo School campus. Initial earthwork should be done within the next few weeks, and the fields should soon be seeded for next spring's play.

## Belmont Receives \$320,346 Grant for Redmont Expansion

The Town of Belmont has been awarded a \$320,346 economic development grant to extend water and sewer services to a local industry, announced Jimmy Heidel, executive director of the Mississippi Department of Economic and Community Development (MDECD) on Tuesday.

The grant will be used to extend city sewer and water service to the Redmont by Jacuzzi, Inc. facility. The company manufactures fiberglass bathtubs, whirlpool baths and shower stalls. Redmont by Jacuzzi will invest more than \$1 million to renovate the building and purchase equipment and will create 40 jobs, of which at least 51 percent will be for low- and moderate-income persons.

The company currently employs about 86 people at its plant west of Belmont, according to Belmont Mayor Bob Yarber.

Redmont has been in Belmont about three years and they have plans for future expansion, said Yarber.

"The current expansion will be a 20,000- square-foot addition to connect two existing buildings," explained Mack Loyd Wadkins, executive director of the Tishomingo County Development Foundation. Currently the septic system they are operating on is at capacity, and the extension of the city sewer and water systems are needed for more employees, Wadkins said.

The water and sewer contract is currently being advertised for bids and should be awarded later in the next month.

"We are delighted to support Belmont in expanding this facility," Heidel said. "I want to thank Belmont Mayor Bob Yarber and others who provided the leadership to make this project a success."

## Tri-State Commerce Park Board Approves Proposal

At last Wednesday's meeting, the Tri-State Commerce Park Board approved a proposal by the state for locating an industry at the former Yellow Creek Site, but there is still much to be finalized before the Park gets its first tenant.

Local daily papers carried stories in the last week stating that Tri-State Commerce Park Board Chairman Jimmy Marlin had announced that Taylor Machine Works will be leasing Building 2031 on the site, to manufacture large industrial machines.

However, officials with the Mississippi Department of Economic and Community Development are not making any official comment on the potential tenant. Their policy is to allow individual companies to make any announcements of that sort, representatives said. MDECD officials did express optimism that the Taylor expansion would come to the Park.

A spokesperson with Taylor said that the report was very premature, and that while interest has been expressed in the Park, no final decisions have been made.

Marlin said the Tri-State Commerce Park Board approved the Taylor proposal that was presented by MDECD officials at last Wednesday's board meeting. Terms of the agreement are not finalized stated Marlin.

Taylor Machine Works is part of the Taylor Group, based in Louisville. It manufactures forklifts and employs 700 at a Winston County site.

At the Tri-State Commerce Park, Taylor would be expanding its operation and could employ as many as 50, Marlin stated.

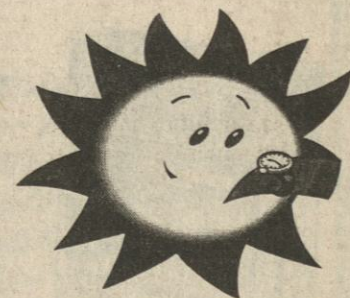
The state took control of the

4,000-acre site last year, and MDECD is responsible, along with the Tri-State Commerce Park Board, for marketing, developing, maintaining, and operating the site. The Board is made up of appointed representatives from Tishomingo, Alcorn, Itawamba and Prentiss Counties.

In recent business, the Board has also approved a proposal for a power generating plant that has been forwarded on to TVA for their approval.

In the past year that the Board and the state have been working together to locate an industry at the Park, many "proposals" have been considered by both MDECD and the Board. But the real-time negotiations of locating an industry, whether a McDonnell Douglas or a small tool and die shop, involves many complicated factors of which Board approval of a proposal is a very early step.

Approval by MDECD, approval by regulatory agencies, and gaining approval of company boards of directors are other steps that must occur before an industry hires the first person at the Tri-State Commerce Park.

## FLASHPOINT

A WEEKLY LOOK AT THE IUKA FIRE DEPARTMENT

It's 3:00 a.m.; and an elderly man calls 911 complaining of severe chest pain. The fire truck rolls. 11:47 a.m.; there's a traffic accident with injuries on Constitution Drive. The truck rolls. 6:15 p.m.; a man is badly cut with a chainsaw. The fire truck rolls. Why, some may wonder, does the Fire Department respond to all these non-fire calls? Is it because the fireman on duty just wants to get out of those four walls? Does he have an insatiable curiosity to see what's going on; an innate desire to be a part of the action? The truth is, the Iuka Fire Department doesn't just fight fires any more.

Within the past year, Iuka's firefighters have become certified Emergency Medical Responders, also known as First Responders. To obtain this certification, these men successfully completed a 40 hour First Responder Course. To maintain the certification, they must have a minimum of 28 hours of continuing education within two years, as well as attend a 12 hour refresher course and have a current CPR card. Many of Iuka's volunteer firefighters and volunteers in other local volunteer fire departments have received the training as well.

The Iuka Fire Department's participation in the EMR program and their response to medical emergencies are real assets to the ambulance service. Often, the fire department can arrive at a scene

before the ambulance and have the patient ready to be transported, thus saving valuable time. Dale White, County Coroner and employee of the Iuka Hospital Ambulance Service says of the EMR program, "I think it's one of the greatest things that could happen in Emergency Medical Services. It's something smaller towns like Iuka are doing that bigger towns (already) do."

Members of the Iuka Police Department are also enthusiastic about the program. Iuka's Assistant Police Chief, Randy Stringer said, "They provide a valuable assistance to the police, but more so to the ambulance service and in aiding the accident victim. They relieve the police so they can work the accident and control traffic." He further added, "They also clean up debris afterward."

Although participating in the EMR program does bring the Iuka Fire Department up to date with other fire departments, this is not the sole reason for the endeavor. "We are public servants and we want to serve our community in every way we possibly can," states Assistant Fire Chief Brian R. Grissom. "We want Iuka to have a fire department they're proud of."

Question: What is the first thing a man plants in his garden?

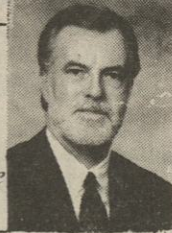

**NEMCC First Graduating Class In Radiologic Tech Has 100% Passage Rate On Board Exam**—Northeast Mississippi Community College has received notification that the first graduating class in the newly implemented radiologic technology curriculum had a 100 percent passage rate on the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT). The exam is administered to students who have completed no less than a two-year accredited program in radiography. Individuals that pass the exam are titled Radiologic Technologists (R.T.) and are licensed to work anywhere in the country. Northeast's radiography "class of '97" was the first class to complete the new program. At Northeast radiography students must complete two years of classes and clinical rotations. Clinical rotations for the two years include over 1000 actual hours in a hospital working with patients doing radiologic exams. Currently the program affiliates with Magnolia Hospital in Corinth, Tippah County Hospital in Ripley, Bay Memorial in Booneville and Union County (New Albany), and ECH Hospital in Florence, Alabama. ### Vision And School Performance

If your son or daughter is a bright child or just an average child, if he or she is not performing well in school you may need to have the child's vision checked. Poor vision can be a major factor in learning problems. Many children may not be aware that they have problems or be afraid to admit them to their teachers or parents.

Certain kinds of behavior can be very revealing of vision problems. For example, if the child dislikes close work, or while reading or writing places his head close to book or desk, this suggests a problem in seeing objects up close. Another club may be trouble in finishing written, timed assignments, or difficulty in remembering what is read.

Other signs may indicate some problem in seeing things clearly, whether close up or far away. If you're concerned about your child's vision, make an appointment for an examination by your eye doctor. If there is a vision problem, it makes sense to treat it expeditiously.

### If An Animal Bites....

Veterinarians frequently are contacted by persons in great fear and near panic. A member of their family has been bitten by a dog - or other animals.

The bite may be from a strange dog - or from a "Friend". Either way, it's a painful experience.

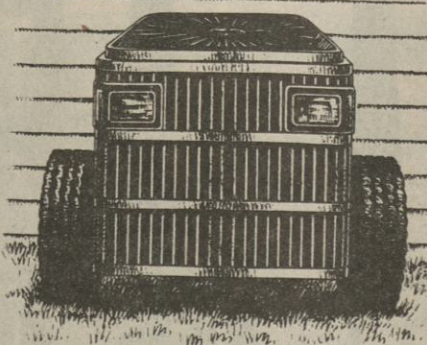
If bitten, remember not to panic. Make positive identification of the animal, if possible. Note details. Enlist the aid of witnesses in getting an accurate description.

Color, markings, size, breed, sex, collar and tag, where the animal came from and where it went are all important. Making a positive identification may make the difference as to whether the right animal is confined or not.

If possible, without the danger of further biting, get the animal confined until help can be secured. The animal should be confined for 10 days. If the dog or cat is alright at the end of 10 days, there is no danger of rabies transmission at the time of the bite. If the animal dies before 10 days are up, the head should be examined for rabies.

If bitten by a wild animal, it may be necessary to destroy the animal. Do not destroy the head or damage it. The head should be taken to the Health Department immediately.

## County 7th Graders Enjoy Day of Art Lessons with Art Expose '97

On Tuesday, October 7th, a warm October day dawned bright and sunny at Crow's Neck Environmental Education Center in Paden. Around 8:45 seventh graders from all over Tishomingo County began to arrive, and the quietness of Crow's Neck quickly evaporated. The air became filled with anticipation. Students knew the reason they were there had something to do with art.

"It has something to do with making arts and crafts—learning art," said some Belmont students. As they looked around and explored the beautiful Crow's Neck facility, some also said, "We are going to learn about art and the environment."

"I'm going to learn to do modern dancing and painting," responded a couple of students from Burnsville.

Another one asked, "Is this going to be hard?" Still another student said, "I'm going to make a T-shirt."

From Iuka Middle School, Dale Aldridge, Landon Courtney and Greg Butler said, "We're excited about being here, and we want to learn something."

Students from Tishomingo, Iuka, Belmont and Burnsville Middle Schools, about 250 in all, began Art Expose '97 with a short orientation and then began attending different sessions where they received instruction in the arts, ranging from modern dance and watercolor painting to storytelling and drama lessons.

### Months of Planning and Cooperation

The Junior Auxiliary of Tishomingo County, the Mississippi Arts Council, the Tishomingo County Fine Arts Council, the Tishomingo County School District, and Crow's Neck Environmental Education Center presented ART EXPOSE '97 for all seventh grade students in Tishomingo County. Also aiding in this project were the Pilot Club of Iuka, the Tishomingo County Fine Arts Guild, the Tishomingo County Extension Service and 4-H, and the Rescue Squad of Tishomingo County.

About a year ago Elaine Haggard, a Junior Auxiliary member, began seeing her dream of exposing the children of Tishomingo County to creative and cultural art come true, when the Junior Auxiliary received a matching grant from the Mississippi Arts Council. With approval of the grant, the program designed to expose students of the county to the many aspects of arts became reality.

JA Committee members responsible for planning and implementing the project

included: Chairman Elaine Haggard, Co-Chairmen Jean Crane and Vicki Bowen, and committee members, Jean Barlow,

Mariann Beals, Pam Brown, Brenda Kennedy, Sandra Northern, and Susann Strickland.

Plans were made to hold the event at Crow's Neck Environmental Education Center, and Center Director Matt Miller, and would assist with the overall management of the event, as well as teach a session on the fine art of storytelling.

The Tishomingo County Fine Arts Guild and Tishomingo County Arts Council assisted with the planning by nominating and recruiting artists to serve as instructors and the Council assisted with the grant application, as well.

The Tishomingo County School District assisted with the planning and grant application, arranged for and provided transportation for all the seventh graders, provided lunches, provided teachers for student supervision, and worked with parents and students in promotion and arrangement of the event.

The Pilot Club of Iuka assisted with planning, and they also helped with promotion and supervision for the event. JA volunteers provided the the overall leadership for planning, implementing and evaluating the worthy event. The Rescue Squad also provided assistance throughout the day.

**The Classes**  
In Matt Miller's storytelling class, he gave pointers for keeping eye contact, working an audience, and keeping the audience interested and involved as he told stories about African culture and creatures of our own surrounding environment. Students sat engrossed in Mr. Miller's presentations.

Local artist Carolyn Southward taught a scratch art class, and thrilled students as she taught them how to draw patterns and then scratch off the surface of their paper as they created beautiful pictures of cardinals and hummingbirds.

Barbara Curlee, an art instructor from Corinth, gave lessons in drawing and art appreciation, discussing "what all" is involved in drawing.

Lesia Allen, the art instructor at TCHS, gave instruction in print making. Students did some rubber fish prints, and were amazed to find that they had to carve their monograms backwards to get them to print forwards.

Local watercolor painter Joe Hardwick explained to students the basics of mixing watercolors paints to show value, space, and

hue of colors. The students quickly fell into producing their own paintings.

Tishomingo County 4-H Organizer Mary Baldwin taught a quilting class, and students learned to separate thread, thread a needle, and make pretty stitches

in their own miniature quilt wall hangings. The guys really enjoyed this sewing class.

Students enjoyed cutting pigs and turkeys in paper-doll fashion in the session with Jean Crane. They also did angels, carousel horses, rocking horses, fans, flowers, apples, and haystacks. "It's neat! I didn't think I could do this," said Mackenzie Sartain of Belmont.

Students also made their own Halloween T-shirts, Christmas decorations, and flower pots in one class. Mariann Beals, Nancy Daniel, and Sandra Foster taught students how to sponge paint on their shirts. And they learned painting techniques to use on aluminum can "reindeer", and jack-o-lantern flower pots.

Larry Jones of Tusculumbia, Alabama, provided musical training in handbells. Students listened reverently as Dr. Jones talked about not touching the bells with bare hands, and demonstrated his skill with the bells. With gloved hands, he quickly taught students to play a tune.

Jon Acostia of Guys, Tennessee, and June Doyle of Selmer, Tennessee, provided training in Drama. Jon quickly relaxed students in the class by doing a series of related voice and body exercises. He stressed that an actor's worst enemy is *tension*. Students participated in vocal exercises. The sound of the "aahs" and "umms" was hilarious, and the "baas", "paas", "gaas" and "taas" were so funny.

Mrs. June told about costume making, and the many techniques she used in designing the costumes for the Corinth Theater of Arts presentation of *Joseph and the Technicolor Dreamcoat*. She also explained how actors have to walk, move, and turn to make the costumes really show up on stage.

Iuka dentist and Corinth Theater activist Steven Blair also entertained students with fundamentals of choral music and drama.

The seventh graders also enjoyed the environmental art program done by Jaylene Whitehurst of Corinth. Students spent some time in the woods picking up articles they thought they could use in making a picture. Once back in the classroom, they actually made a painting using what they had picked up.

Students also "got into" the dance classes taught. Cassie Fulghum provided clogging lessons. Students quickly found that some of them had two left feet. Dianne Segars taught students some modern dance steps. Students quickly realized that "not invading" anyone else's space is vital to dance. Both boys and girls were really impressed with these dance classes which are applicable to real life whether playing football, basketball, baseball, cheerleading, running,



or dancing. Danny Nichols of Belmont said his favorite class was the modern dance class.

Another highlight enjoyed by all was the craft of making pinecone baskets, which was taught by Bessie Johnson of West Point. Ms. Johnson said that she had learned this talent from her mom, her aunts, and other ladies in the community when she was a little girl. As she got older she realized that this was a dying art, and she wanted to just do her part to the art alive.

### A Job Well Done

During the last few minutes of the sun-drenched day, students reflected on all they had seen and done. They talked about the possibilities of continuing the projects, and asked about where to buy scratch art supplies, when dance classes would be offered, and if they could come back to another program next week.

Teachers from the participating schools had only good things to say about the day. They wanted the same kind of workshop just for teachers.

"I haven't seen one kid who has not had fun today," one teacher said. Other teachers praised the hands-on experience of all the presentations.

The artists were also impressed with the well behaved and enthusiastic seventh graders.

June Doyle said was glad to have the chance to do a project like this which was so fulfilling to her. Joe Hardwick said that he was glad to see students introduced to all art forms. Jon Acostia said he was impressed that the student were introduced to a community theater background that might help students develop a natural love—a passion—for the theater.

Projects done by students are currently on exhibit in all of the county libraries.

### Plans for Next Year

As the students exited the building, got on the bus, and left, Crow's Neck again became quiet, except for the jubilant cries of the JA members who knew this experience would be remembered for years to come by these students.

And ideas of what to do, and what not to do next year began to dance in the heads of the JA members.
