Three Arrested After Car Chase Through Tish.

Three persons were arrested after leading a Tishomingo policeman, county deputies, Belmont police officers, a Department of Fish and Wildlife officer, and the county sheriff on a car chase through the backroads of Tishomingo early Saturday morning.

About 12:45 a.m. Saturday, Tishomingo Policeman Russ Hollis signaled a car driven by Rhonda Vick, 25, of Red Bay, to slow down as she was driving through downtown Tishomingo. As Hollis, on foot, flashed a flashlight at the vehicle, the driver allegedly swerved to hit him. He then got into his car and pursued, calling for backup from the county.

The chase at times reached 85 miles per hour and eventually involved Hollis, about five other units, and a dozen officers, including Sheriff David Smith. Vick led the pursuing vehicles south through Tishomingo, toward the Natchez Trace, on backroads north towards Inez's Diner on Highway 25, and then south through Tishomingo again, where she was finally stopped near Bozo's Used Cars on Highway 25.

Vick and passenger Gary Davis, 28, of Golden, were charged with assaulting a police officer and public drunkenness. Another passenger, Rodney Roe, 24, of Golden was also charged with public drunkenness, said Sheriff David Smith. All but Davis have been released on bond.

Couple Faces Drug Charges

A Germantown man and an Iuka woman were arrested on drug possession charges October 20th following a weekend incident at a Mill Creek residence.

Dr. George Barnes, 52, of Germantown, and Linda Barnes, 48, of Iuka, were both charged with felony possession of a controlled substance, Schedule II narcotics, according to Tishomingo County Sheriff David Smith. Both have been released on a \$5,000 bond each.

Smith and his deputies were called to the Barnes residence near Mill Creek on October 18th to respond to a domestic disturbance, Smith said.

Iuka Board Awards Contracts for Completion of City Hall Renovation

The City of Iuka has awarded bid packages on the two construction jobs that will complete renovations to the Iuka City Hall, which was damaged in an August 17th fire.

In a special meeting Tuesday night, October 28th, the board of aldermen concurred with the recommendation of the engineers, and awarded a contract for the heating, ventilation and air-conditioning system to Daugherty Refrigeration Sales and Service, of Iuka.

They also awarded a contract for building modifications to Keith Whipple of Iuka. The board agreed to waive some bid requirements that Whipple's submission apparently did not include.

City Attorney Nick Phillips assured the board that in his review of the bids, he found "no statutory problems" with the submission. The waived items were city bid requirements only, and were "within this board's purview to waive."

A deciding factor may have been that the next lowest bid was almost \$10,000 higher.

Any contracts awarded by the city are conditional upon the contractors satisfying all necessary bonding requirements, the mayor pointed out in the meeting.

Facelift for City Hall

The drawings for the renovated city hall call for an updated, more attractive "Southern traditional" design for

the front and entryway. Otherwise, the interior of the building is remaining essentially the same.

The new front will feature columns and a gable front, which will all work together to change the look of the building that was originally built as a grocery store.

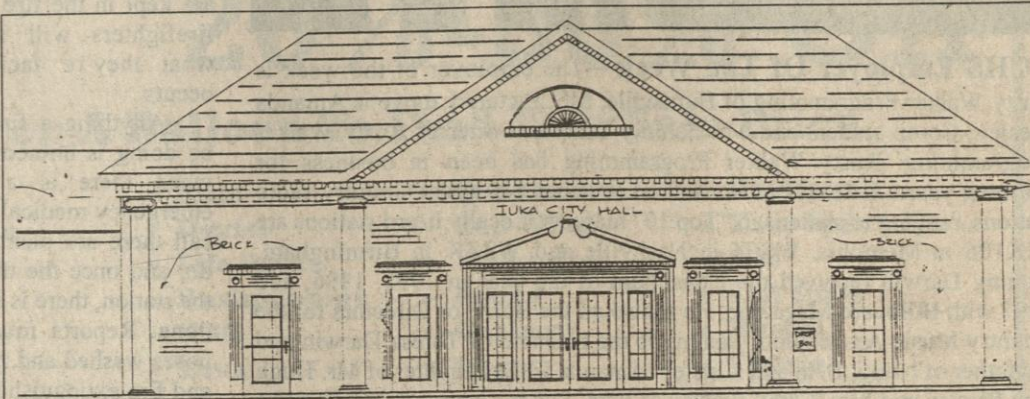
The new design comes within the budget that was determined by the \$106,000 insurance settlement for the fire damage to the building, according to Mayor David Nichols.

"I want to take this opportunity to say how much we appreciate the prompt response of State Farm on the insurance settlement," said Nichols.

HVAC System

For the heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) package, estimated by the engineers at \$12,500, Daugherty Refrigeration Sales and Service, of Iuka, was the apparent low bidder with their \$10,494 bid. The next closest bid of \$13,100 was from Southern Air Comfort, of Iuka. Contractual and bonding requirements for the HVAC contractor were projected to be satisfactory.

In Tuesday's meeting, aldermen expressed satisfaction with the Daugherty bid, and were pleased with the quality Trane unit that was proposed.

Building Modifications

For the second package, Building Modifications, the low bid was \$34,500 by Keith Whipple, of Iuka. The engineer's estimate was \$35,000 and the next lowest bid of \$44,143 was submitted by Burton Builders, of Belmont.

The building modification work consists of reconstruction of the new facade for the City Hall, complete with all the required doors, windows, and lighting, according to the bid advertisement.

"Any contractor will have to provide proof of payment and performance bonding as a minimum requirement," said Nichols. "If the contractors are bonded, the city will get the quality we require."

Since the August fire, city crews, under the supervision of Public Works Director Don McNeely, have been performing demolition and rough carpentry work in the city hall. So far, the work has been done by smaller (under \$5,000) contracts, with McNeely supervising the work.

"This approach allowed more local participation in the renovation," explained Nichols. "One big lump sum contract could have excluded most of our local smaller contractors, who may not have been able to bid a larger job."

Contents Covered Separately

The contents of the city hall were handled by a separate insurance settlement that allowed a total \$50,000 for replacement of the contents, according to Nichols.

Only about \$20,000 of that has been spent so far, mostly on replacing computers and some office equipment, and officials were pleased that much of the existing furniture was salvageable.

Sheriff's Round Up Tuesday Nets Many More Outstanding Warrants

A joint campaign by the county sheriff and the county justice court officials to clear up outstanding warrants has been deemed a success after a final "round-up" Tuesday.

Every sheriff's deputy and officers from the Belmont and Iuka Police Departments were out in force Tuesday "rounding up" persons in the county who had outstanding justice court warrants, said Sheriff David Smith.

By 3 o'clock they had brought in 28 persons, some with as many as five warrants each. Many bonded out or came up with the money as soon as they were brought into the jail, said Smith.

This is the latest step in a campaign that began about a month ago with a newspaper notice for people to come in and take care of their own outstanding warrants before a deputy had to come knocking at their door.

In one two-day period, more than \$15,000 was collected in fines, said the sheriff.

FLASHPOINT

A WEEKLY LOOK AT THE IUKA FIRE DEPARTMENT

There is a stereotype which suggests that firemen sit around the firehouse all day, complete with red suspenders and spotted dog, playing checkers and waiting for a fire to happen. While this might have been an accurate

depiction years ago, today it is little more than a myth. Today's firefighters have their work cut out for them.

At the Iuka Fire Department there are tasks that must be carried out each day, while others are done on a weekly, monthly, or yearly basis.

Every day, the firefighter on duty makes a Daily Apparatus Check. Each fire truck is cranked, the relief valves are exercised and set, and the water levels are checked manually and visually. The firefighter checks all SCBA to insure they are full of air. He makes sure all fire extinguishers are properly charged and all power tools are cranked and run, and oil and gas are checked. Each truck has a list of tools that is checked off daily to insure every tool is in place. Sirens, emergency lights, and air horns are also checked. At the end of each day the firefighter must type a Daily Activity Report.

After the apparatus check, the bathroom, office, and truck bays are swept out and mopped if necessary. On Saturdays the firefighter hand washes all the firetrucks. Also, once a week, oil, power steering fluid, antifreeze, and transmission fluid is checked in all trucks.

Every Spring and Fall, over 230 fire hydrants are flushed out

and oiled, and painted if needed. Firefighters also clean debris and weeds from around the hydrants so they will be easily accessible.

Yearly, over 5,500 feet of hoses are pressure-tested for leaks and weaknesses.

One duty a firefighter may be found doing at any given time is walk-through inspections of businesses and factories. These inspections can more accurately be termed "pre-planning", because during this process the firefighter draws a floor plan of the building indicating the locations of the meters and shut-offs for gas, water, and electricity. The floor plan also indicates the locations of hazardous materials and combustibles, fire exits, and the nearest fire hydrants. The plans are kept in the fire trucks so that firefighters will know exactly what they're facing if a fire occurs.

Anything a firefighter might be doing is immediately dropped when there is a fire call or emergency medical call. During a call there are plenty of things to do, and once the truck is back at the station, there is still more to be done. Reports must be written, hoses washed and rolled, airpicks and fire extinguishers refilled, gas and water put back into trucks; the list goes on and on.

All firefighters work 24 hour shifts, except the Fire Chief, who works five 8 hour days in the administrative capacity. The firefighter on duty works from 7 a.m. until 5 p.m. doing the tasks listed above. After 5 p.m., the fireman can relax, have supper, and do fitness and exercise. The TV cannot be turned on until after five, except during lunch hour and inclement weather.

Like the rest of the city, the firefighter goes to bed at night, but like firemen the world over, he only sleeps lightly, knowing he must always be on the alert in case of an emergency. At 7:00 the next morning he is off-duty, but always on call.

Letter To The Editor

I have just completed my fifth year of a ten-year sentence for Burglary. My sentence is mandatory because I've been convicted of a felony on two prior occasions.

"A career criminal", you say? Not by far. I grew up in Tishomingo County, graduated from Tishomingo High in 1987. My parents raised me in church. In fact, I was a song director and lead the church in other capacities.

So what happened? While still in high school, I began drinking alcohol. From that I tried marijuana. Soon that high wasn't enough, and one of my "friends" introduced me to powder cocaine. It was cool, or so I thought.

Soon I graduated to crack cocaine. That's when I began to have trouble with the law. My first time resulted in two years probation. Before the paperwork was processed, I had met my second encounter with the law. This resulted in a prison sentence in Mississippi and a subsequent prison term in Alabama. In all, since January of 1989, I've only been out of prison a total of eight months and a few days. Hence, I'm now on my fourth prison term.

It all began one step at a time. My plea is to the youth of my

home county and elsewhere. The common attitude of "Just one joint won't hurt anything" is a lie. Since 1988, I have seen twenty-three of my "friends" meet an early death due to alcohol and/or drugs. In addition, forty-eight more of my "friends" are now in prison. One is even on death row.

Out of roughly 125 people that I associated with, 92 are dead, in prison, or in drug rehab. The numbers don't lie, and these aren't statistics compiled by some government agency. These are people just like you. So remember these words when someone offers you alcohol or drugs. The end result isn't worth it. Say no, and encourage your friends to do the same.

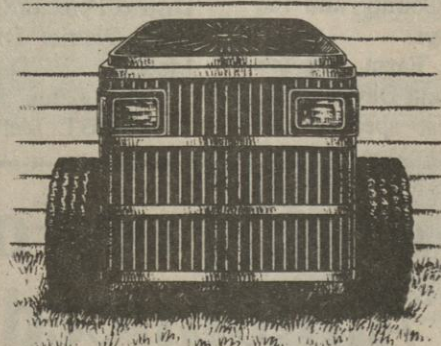
Trouble Seeing At A Distance

Autumn Is Time For Apples

"An apple a day keeps the doctor away"...well, maybe not, but it sure is a pleasant way to get tasty, low-calorie, convenient snack.

Apples are one of America's favorite fruits, and there are literally thousands of varieties. Colors range from lemon yellow (such as Golden Delicious), to bright green (Granny Smith) to purplish-red (Winesap). Textures vary from tender (Jonathan) to crisp (Red Delicious). Flavors go from tart (York) to sweet (Fuji) and many variations in between.

Some varieties that are well-suited for eating out-of-hand or raw in salads include Red Delicious, Golden Delicious, Gala, Jonathan, McIntosh and Winesap. Apples that are excellent for pies and sauces tend to be tart, such as Granny Smith, Jonathan York. For baked apples which hold their shape well, consider firm-flesh ones, such as Rome Beauty, Winesap and York.

These fruits are available year-round thanks to modern commercial storage techniques, although they are especially good in the fall months, when freshly harvested. You usually will find them meet economical in the fall.

Apples are best when they are allowed to ripen on the tree before picking. Look for firm and well-

colored apples; those that lack color for the particular variety are probably immature. Also avoid those that are overripe, as they become "mealy" in texture. (Gently press your thumb into the apple. If it "gives" very easily to pressure, the apple is probably overripe.)

Look for apples without defects such as bruises, skin-breaks, shriveled skin and decayed spots. Irregularly-shaped tan or brown spots on the outside of apples (called "scald") do not usually affect flavor.

Notice any bruised or injured areas caused by handling of apples after purchase, cut portions away and use the remaining portion as possible. Store only firm, good quality apples for later use.

Store apples in the refrigerator humidifier compartment (fruit and vegetables drawer) or in a moisture-resistant container, such as a plastic bag. Cut a few scattered small holes in the bag to permit ventilation. For optimum quality, use apples stored in the refrigerator within a few weeks.

One medium raw apple (with skin) contains only 80 calories, less than one-half of a gram of fat and no sodium. It also provides fiber and potassium to the diet. Apples can be used in a variety of ways. They can be used

in main dishes, main dish accompaniments, salads, breads, cakes and cookies, other deserts and beverages.

Freezing, canning or drying will preserve apples for later use. They can be made into butter, pie filling, chutney, jelly, preserves, relish, spiced rings or applesauce. (To create one of the wonderful spicy smell of fall in your home, start homemade applesauce cooking in the kitchen). Contact this office at 423-7016 for safe ways to preserve your apples for later use.

One pound of apples is equivalent to about three medium apples, which pared and sliced, will yield about 2 3/4 cups. Made into applesauce, the pound of apples will make about 1 3/4 cups of applesauce.

BellSouth's entry into the long-distance business will encourage other companies to build telephone networks in Mississippi so they can offer new and innovative products and services to attract customers. Providing a little something extra or unique is one way companies compete for business.

And speaking of competing for business, real long-distance competition will result in lower long-distance rates for the average customer, not just for large businesses or other high-volume customers. 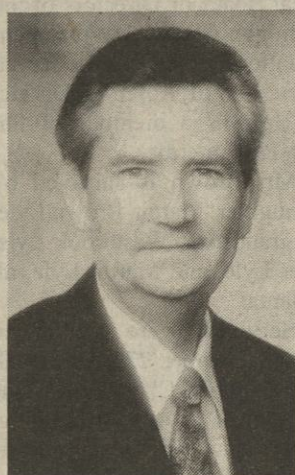

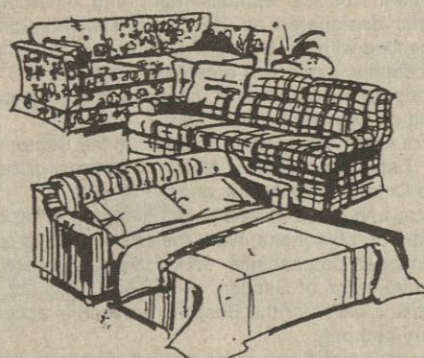
