35 Marijuana Plants Found In House on Mill Creek Rd.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department confiscated 35 marijuana plants from a Mill Creek Road residence early Saturday morning.

One man, Chris Moore, 36, is in custody in the Tishomingo County Jail, and is charged with possession of marijuana, more than a kilogram, with intent to distribute, in connection with the incident, according to Sheriff David Smith.

Thirty-five plants were found hanging to dry in Moore's attic, at the house at 171 County Road 257, according to Smith.

4 County Youths Injured In One-Car Accident On Trace Halloween Night

Four county young people were hospitalized following a one-car accident on the Natchez Trace late Friday night.

According to District Ranger Johnny Sims, of the Cherokee District of the Natchez Trace Parkway, the accident happened near the 311 mile marker on the Trace, just a few miles into Alabama, headed north. The cause of the accident is still under investigation, said Sims.

Steven Lynn Gray, 20, of Burnsville was taken to University of Alabama Hospital in Birmingham, according to the ranger. Friends of the family have reported that he is in a coma, and had to have his spleen removed.

Mary Alison Strickland, 17, and Kristy Thrasher, 23, both of Burnsville, were both taken from the scene to Iuka Hospital, and

transferred to North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo. Strickland was listed in "stable" condition, and Thrasher was listed in "very serious" condition, in a Monday afternoon report from NMMC officials.

Charles Casey Parsons, 21, of Iuka, was taken to the emergency room at Helen Keller Hospital in Muscle Shoals that night, but was not admitted.

The name of the driver was not being released, said the Ranger.

According to the ranger report, a 1994 blue Ford Mustang lost control when it slid on the wet pavement of a curved bridge, going onto the southbound road shoulder and slid into a drainage ditch. The vehicle then flipped, and landed upside-down on the bank of nearby Bear Creek.

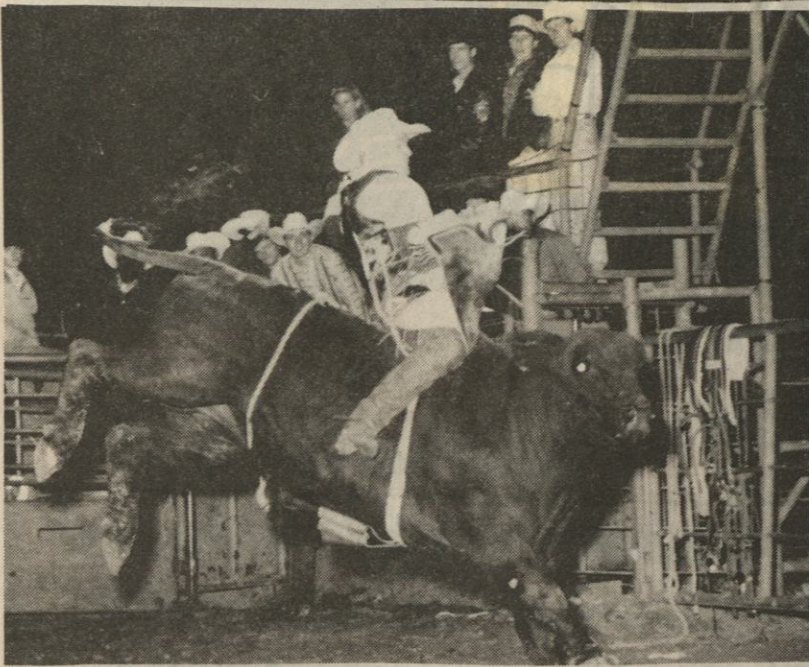

FLASHPOINT

A WEEKLY LOOK AT THE IUKA FIRE DEPARTMENT

In 1996, Tishomingo County fire departments responded to over 500 calls. This total includes residential, commercial, woods, grass, and auto fires, as well as false alarms and EMS calls. All but 105 of these were responded to by volunteer departments. The Iuka Fire Department is the only combination department in the county; in other words, they have both volunteer and paid personnel, having someone on duty 24 hours a day. They employ 5 full time firefighters, but they are fortunate to have 12 volunteer firemen as well. Volunteers are important to Iuka Fire Department, but they are absolutely crucial to all-volunteer departments.

They are 17 volunteer fire departments in Tishomingo County, which boasts the second largest number of fire departments in the state of Mississippi. Our county is blessed with volunteer fire departments filled with dedicated men and women who give of their time and energy to provide adequate fire protection to its citizens. If any one of these departments did not exist, the community it served would have

to depend on the departments in the surrounding areas, which could be too far away to be of any real assistance.

Volunteers to the fire service go through a 38 hour certification course, and many of them have also taken emergency medical response courses and various other classes. These individuals volunteer their time for schooling, training meetings, fund-raisers, and fire and emergency calls with little or no compensation except perhaps a pat on the back or a word of thanks. Without these volunteers, communities outside the City of Iuka would have no fire protection.

The people who make up the volunteer fire departments throughout the county risk their safety and sometimes their lives, not for a paycheck, but for the satisfaction of helping their fellowman and their communities. The Iuka Fire Department salutes these dedicated men and women, and thanks them for their hard work and determination to provide their communities with competent fire protection. Keep up the good work!

Hail Storm On Natchez Trace Parkway October 25, 1997

Saturday afternoon, my husband, Tom, and I were shopping in Wal-Mart Super Center at Barnes Crossing in Tupelo. Loud thunder rumbled overhead. I walked to the front entrance to check on the weather. A small strip of light was all that separated the trees and house tops from a huge black cloud that covered the entire sky. The squall line appeared so ominous and threatening and I rushed to find Tom. We hurried to the check-out register. At 4:10 PM, we left Wal-Mart Super Center.

As we drove onto the Natchez Trace Parkway, we noticed a heavy layer of leaves all over the roadway - so deep that passing cars left tracks in them. Also, fog, like swirling clouds, was beginning to make visibility poor. We noticed that approaching cars had their emergency lights blinking and Tom remarked that there must have been an accident somewhere. Then, the groundcover of leaves began to disappear under a layer of hail. Warm air mixing with the cold air from the hail, was causing dense fog - making it necessary for us to drive very slow. As the hail along the way became deeper, I reached into my purse for a notepad and pen and began to record the events taking place.

Marker 270 - 4:35 PM - Hail had been on the trace for several miles. The hail mixed with so many leaves was amazing. Fog was extremely dense.

-At one place, two cars were parked on side of road covered in leaves. Passengers were outside rubbing leaves off the windshield and the windows. Further on, a car had run off the trace down a steep slanting embankment. Another car had stopped and passengers were standing by to help.

-When we drove over an over-pass, the ground below was white - just like a winter snow.

Marker 278, 4:50 PM - Hail accumulation very deep. Ruts from car tracks in the hail were so deep that the accumulation of ice between the ruts on the roadway scraped the underside of our car. Fog was an increasing problem.

-Later on, the tracks became frozen over and slick just like in freezing weather.

4:55 PM - Rain and lightning very severe. Visibility only a few

feet. Tail lights and flashing emergency lights of cars ahead helped some. Did not dare try to pass.

5:10 PM - Turned on radio and learned that a tornado watch was in effect for Tishomingo, Itawamba, and Lee Counties.

-Next song played on radio was a song about God being with us in the storm and the valleys. It was a comforting reminder added to our prayers.

At all times, cars lined up behind us as far as we could see. We met very few cars coming from the opposite direction. When it wasn't raining, the fog made visibility possible only for a few feet.

5:16 PM - Radio still giving tornado watch warnings.

Junction, Hwy. 371/370 Hail started again - mixed with heavy rain. Rained so hard, windshield wipers provided only glimpses of the roadway. Lightening was very frightening. Small ditches full of water. Rain over the fields appeared to be coming down in sweeping sheets. Drove 5-15 miles per hour. Some cars pulled off and stopped because of the downpour of rain mixed with hail.

Marker 285, 5:22 PM Rain slacked somewhat - but still very heavy. Driving speed 25-30 miles

per hour.

Marker 291, 5:33 PM Still downpour of rain - not much hail on ground.

Marker 295 - Still downpour of rain.

Marker 298 Visibility still poor - but could drive 45 MPH.

Marker 300 - Increased speed to 50 MPH

5:51 PM - Left Natchez Trace at city of Tishomingo marker.

5:59 PM - at Mid-Way, only light rain.

6:08 PM - Rain started again - but not downpour.

6:23 PM - Arrived home - said prayer of thanks that we had made the trip home safely, and that our house had not been damaged.

Dental Implants - What Do They Have To Offer?

NMMC's Mobile Unit Travels To Area

North Mississippi Medical Center's Mobile Mammography Unit will travel to area communities during November to provide women with convenient access to mammography services.

The mobile Mammography Unit will be at the following locations: Nov. 19-21, Iuka Hospital, 1777 Curtis Drive.

Two types of mammograms are available. A screening mammogram is used to detect breast cancer, and usually the test detects cancer long before it can be found by physician examination or other methods of diagnosis.

Screening mammograms are available through self-referral. Diagnostic mammograms can rule out or confirm the presence of breast disease or abnormalities, which may include cancer.

The cost of a screening mammogram is \$68. The results of the mammograms are read by NMMC's radiologists, physicians who specialize in interpreting x-ray, ultrasound and other types of imaging studies.

Appointments for all

mammography services are scheduled in advance. To schedule a screening mammogram, call (601)841-4158 or 1-800-843-3375. Appointments for diagnostic mamograms are scheduled by the women's physician.

Report From Congress

Wicker Backing Renewed Effort To Promote Human Rights, Religious Freedom In China

Last Friday night the Public Broadcasting System aired the public affairs program Firing Line which was taped recently at the University of Mississippi. The event brought nationally-known figures to Oxford to debate U.S. Trade policy toward China. The telecast coincided with the visit of Chinese President Jiang Zemin to the U.S., placing Ole Miss in the national spotlight and underscoring the interest this international issue has generated.

The President and Congress recently allowed normal trade relations with China to be extended for another year, but Chinese human rights abuses also continue to be of great concern. The House of Representatives will soon consider legislation aimed at forcing Chinese leaders to ease the harsh treatment of their own people.

The issue has also prompted interest here in Mississippi with legitimate concerns being raised on both sides. China is our state's seventh largest trading partner. In 1996, that amounted to \$2.8 billion in exports. Thousands of manufacturing and agricultural jobs are dependent on normal

business relations with China. At the same time, many Mississippians strongly object to the U.S. dealing with a country which has such a miserable human rights record.

The new legislation expresses the will of Congress that the President make freedom of religion a major objective of U.S. foreign policy toward China. It would deny U.S. visas for Chinese officials who have been responsible for religious persecution and repression. In addition, it would prevent use of any tax dollars for expenses incurred by Chinese representatives attending exchange programs sponsored by U.S. agencies.

Another bill I am cosponsoring, called the China Human Rights and Democracy Act, would provide funds for 24 hour broadcasting into China through Radio Free Asia and promote a code of conduct for American businesses operating there. The bill increase the number of human rights officers at the U.S. Embassy in Beijing to equal the number of commercial/trade officers at the embassy. Monitoring and reporting of human rights abuses would also be increased.

The question at the Ole Miss

Firing Line debate was whether the United States should continue normal trade relations (MFN) with China or interrupt trade until the communist government in Beijing improves its human rights record.

But trade is not the only tool the United States can use to bring change to China. There are other effective foreign policy options available to improve human rights and religious freedom in the world's populous country,

Forestry Department Gets National Honor

The extension program at Mississippi State University's Department of Forestry received a top national honor when it was given the Non-Industrial Private Forest Landowner Education Award.

Dr. Doug Richards, head of the forestry department, and Dr. Tom Monaghan, leader of the extension forestry program, received the award Oct. 4 in Memphis on behalf of the department. 1997 is the first year the award has been given.

"We're very gratified to have received this award, which is a credit to our extension faculty who work so hard to put on these educational programs," Richards said.

The award was given by the National Woodland Owners Association and the National Association of Professional Forestry Schools and Colleges. It recognizes educational programs that positively impact private forest landowners.

"We were selected on the basis of the breadth, scope and impact of our programs," Richards said.

Among the Educational programs conducted by MSU's forestry department are forest landowner short courses, forestry field days, demonstrations and presentations, special projects, publications, radio and TV programs, and exhibits.

With an estimated delivered value of more than a billion dollars in 1996, forestry ranks just behind poultry as the state's top ag commodity.
