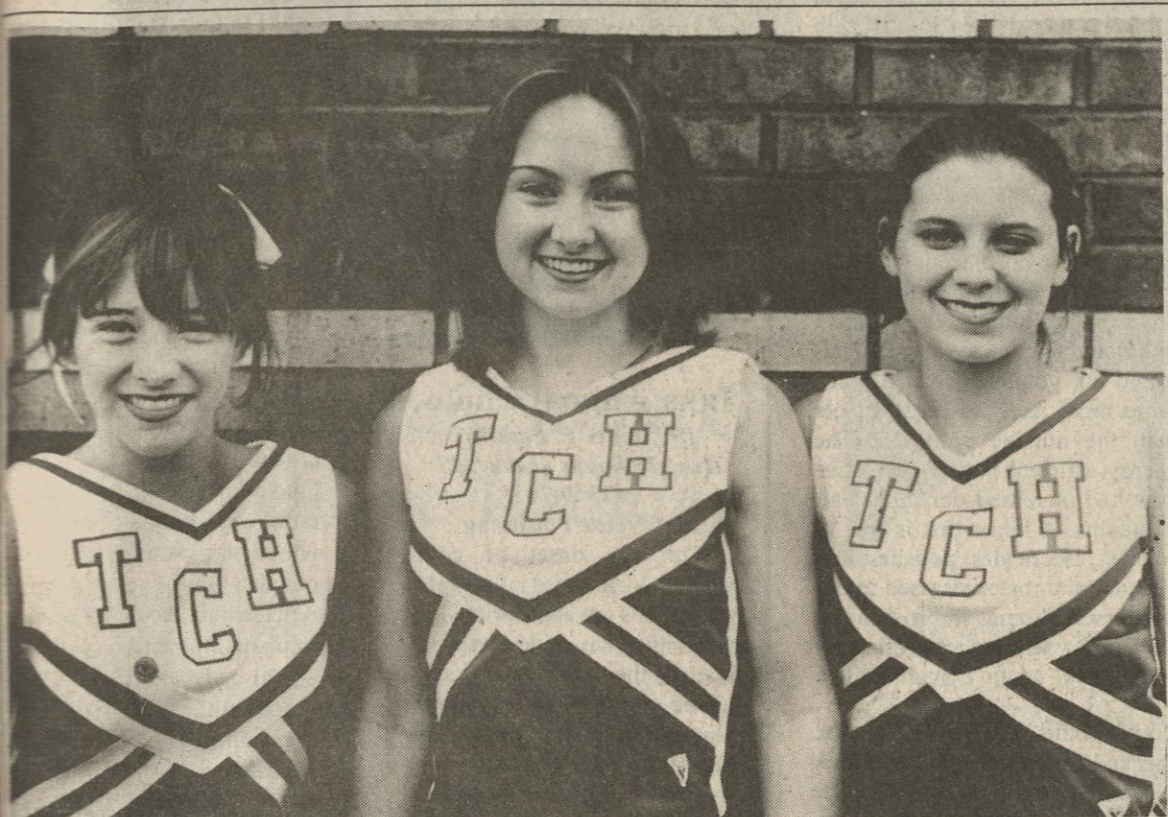

City Crews Will Complete Iuka City Hall Renovation Work

The Iuka Board of Aldermen voted Monday night to set aside the low bid for the Iuka City Hall renovations since the low-bidding contractor was unable to provide the city with a guaranty of adequate bonding.

The board had awarded the building modifications contract October 28th, with the provision that the low-bidding contractor, Keith Whipple, would be able to provide proof of payment and performance bonding.

As advertised, the city retained the right to reject all bids, and so the board opted to complete the building renovation work in the same manner as the rest of the work done to date on the renovation of the city hall. According to Mayor David Nichols, under the supervision of Iuka Public Works Director Don McNeely, much of the remaining work will be completed utilizing city personnel for some of the labor, and subcontracting out the craft work, like carpentry, brick masonry, and window installation.

The craft work will be subcontracted in accordance with normal procurement of goods and services, as has been done during the rest of the renovation work, said Nichols.

Normal procedures require the city to advertise on jobs estimated to cost more than \$5,000. For jobs under \$5,000, the

city is not required to advertise, but must have two competitive quotes for the work.

The reason this method was not chosen at the beginning of the renovation process, was an uncertainty that the city crews could perform the work satisfactorily, Nichols explained. But the board has been impressed with the results the city crews, along with smaller subcontractors, have produced so far.

Time and Money Saved

Additionally, utilizing this method will speed the process up about 4-6 weeks, said Nichols, since the contract will not have to be re-bid.

An approximate \$4,000 will be saved using this method, as well, said Nichols, and it will come in \$14,000 less than the next lowest bid for the work; one from Burton Builders in Belmont for \$44,143.

"The board took this action upon the recommendation of the project engineers, Dean McRae Engineering, because it was in accordance with the goals of the administration and the proposed plan allowed the work to be done within the confines of the budget, which was determined by the amount of the insurance settlement (\$106,000)," said Nichols.

The savings will go toward some "extras" for the city hall, like a drive-through window for utility bill drop-off, and

permanent seating for the court/board room.

By staying under the project budget, no general funds will have to be utilized for the repairs and renovation of the City Hall, which burned August 17th.

Renovation Budget

So far, of the \$106,000 insurance settlement for renovation of city hall, \$54,000 has been committed on the work done to date on the renovation. Additional expected costs are estimated as follows, according to Nichols: \$30,000 for the building modifications and building front work, \$5,000 for the drive-through window, \$5,000 for the new seating in the court/board room, and \$10,000 for engineering fees. That totals about \$104,000 with \$2,000 to spare, which would be utilized for any unforeseen costs.

The contents of the city hall were handled in a separate settlement that allows for a total of \$50,000 for replacement of contents like furniture and computers. So far only about \$20,000 of that has been spent on replacement of the city hall computer system.

Daugherty Refrigeration Sales and Service was awarded the city hall heating, ventilation, and air conditioning system (HVAC) contract October 28th, and they satisfied all bonding requirements and have been given a notice to proceed.

New Police Department Rules Adopted by Iuka City Board

In their regular meeting November 4th, the Iuka Board of Aldermen adopted a new set of police department rules and regulations.

The adoption of the new rules comes at a time of some unresolved differences in the Iuka Police Department. Personnel disputes regarding the department have been the subject of several "executive session" meetings of the board of aldermen, though details of personnel issues discussed by the board are not matters of public record.

The new rules and

regulations "clarify, and make more concise" the previously existing rules, which have been in effect since 1989, according to members of the board. The Board's statutory responsibilities as far as the police department are to set the budget, hire and fire, and enact policy for the department, according to Mayor David Nichols.

The day to day management of the department is the responsibility of the (elected) chief of police, Amos Bates.

Three officers have resigned in the last few months, Trip Lomenick's resignation was

accepted at the November 4th meeting, and J.C. Ledgewood officially resigned at the end of October, though he had been taking accumulated vacation time for a few weeks prior to that. Bobby Flynt resigned in August.

According to Iuka Police Chief Amos Bates, the three vacancies in the department will not be filled by new full-time officers.

Instead, the funds budgeted for department salaries will pay for two dispatchers that were hired in the last month, Wanda Sanderson and Cecil Phifer. They join dispatcher Ricky Green, hired a few months ago.

Additionally they now have funds for one part-time officer, but he or she will have to be already certified, as there is not money in the budget to send them to the academy, said Bates.

When asked if the new regulations addressed the personnel problems that the department had been experiencing, officials said that the rules are a starting place and a set of basic rules.

Chief Bates said he was not involved in the compilation of the new rules, and that as an elected official, they did not apply to him.

In fact, most of the rules do refer to "members" of the department, and members are defined in the rules and regulations as "all duly sworn police officers employed by the city either in a full-time or part-time capacity. The chief of police is not included within this category."

Currently the Iuka Police force consists of six full-time officers: Chief Bates, Assistant Chief Randy Stringer, Officer Glenn Whitlock, Officer Robert Till, Officer James "Red" Taylor, Officer Anita Mitchell, and Officer Chuck Dean.

A WEEKLY LOOK AT THE IUKA FIRE DEPARTMENT

Upon receiving the November issue of Firehouse Magazine at the Iuka Fire Department last week, firefighters were surprised to find an article entitled "Firehouse Fires: Firefighters Regroup After Flames Hit Home" within its pages. The article detailed several instances where fire stations and/or city halls were damaged or destroyed by fire. Some of these incidents held uncanny similarities to the fire that damaged Iuka City Hall in August.

In Burke, Virginia at Fire Station 14 in the Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department on Jan. 10, 1997, Firefighter Mark Lucas awoke to the faint odor of smoke at 1:47 A.M. Similarly, on August 17, 1997, at the Iuka Fire Department/City Hall, Firefighter Brandon Grissom was awakened around 4:30 A.M., not by smoke, but by the sound of electrical breakers clicking off. Like Lucas Grissom also found the apparatus bay area fully charged with smoke. In the first situation, bay doors could not be opened due to loss of electricity, but in the Iuka fire all doors but one were electrically raised allowing the fire trucks to be driven out. One door was jammed due to a malfunctioning cable; Assistant Chief Brian Grissom pushed the door down with Engine 1, which was in the building. Little damage was done to the apparatus. In the fire in Virginia, the doors could not be raised at all, thus preventing the firefighters from using their own apparatus to fight the fire; they were forced to rely on other

fire companies to respond. Just as Iuka Fire Department/City Hall had no smoke or fire alarms, neither did Fire Station 14. In both of these facilities, plans have been made to install alarms in the renovating or rebuilding process.

The fire at Fire Station 14 in Fairfax County, Virginia destroyed or heavily damaged almost all the fire apparatus in the building. A fire in a Lewisville, Indiana, Volunteer Fire Department destroyed its station and apparatus. In Oppelo, Arkansas, members of the Volunteer Fire Department were dispatched to an early morning fire at their own fire station, which was in the City Hall. All offices and the fire station were destroyed, along with much apparatus and equipment. In National City, Illinois, the Village Hall, police and fire station were destroyed by fire, and a fire station in Montgomery, Pennsylvania was damaged by fire. All these incidents happened within the past year.

In light of these disasters, the Iuka Fire Department is grateful that the damage to the City Hall was limited. If the fire had started in the fire station itself, things might have turned out differently. Because they were able to get their apparatus out of the building and begin fighting the fire before back-up arrived, the situation was not nearly as bad as it might have been.

Modifying Spousal Support

After a divorce, the parties sometimes want to change the amount of spousal support.

If one side won't agree to the change, the other can ask a court to order it.

To get spousal support modified, one side must show a significant change in circumstances. Thus, the person making support payments may be able to get them lowered if he or she now earns a lot less or if the recipient's income is much higher. For recipients, it's often harder to get higher payments just because the person paying now earns more. The recipient must show a significant change in his or her own circumstances to justify an increase.

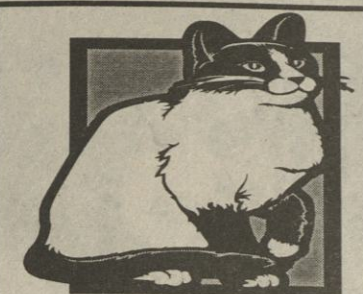

Antifreeze Poisoning

With the onset of cold weather, a number of simple precautions are appropriate for pets that live outside or spend much of their time outdoors.

The single most important wintertime hazard for pets is not the cold temperature, it's antifreeze. The highly toxic compound is particularly available in the fall and winter as radiators are drained and toilets in empty houses are winterized. CAUTION: Antifreeze has a very sweet taste that is attractive to dogs and cats. Consumption of even small amounts of antifreeze can result in irreversible kidney damage.

Treatment for antifreeze toxicity is essential if the pet is to survive, and treatment must be administered within 4 to 6 hours of consumption. Don't hesitate. If you even suspect a pet has consumed antifreeze, contact your veterinarian immediately.

There are other things to consider when protecting your pet during the winter. Make sure outdoor pets have an opportunity to get out of the wind. Wind chill factors can have a devastating effect on pets left to the elements.

Animals that get wet are particularly susceptible to cold, and may rapidly experience tissue damage if the temperature falls below freezing or may suffer the consequences of decreased body temperature.

Dogs and cats actually tolerate cold weather much better than humans. They actually seem to prefer winter over the summertime heat. However, sustained exposure to sub-freezing temperatures does pose a risk to any pet left outside on a cold night.

A dog house or a space in the garage is an excellent means of providing winter time protection to pets that don't live in the house.

How important is it to dress your dog or cat for a walk in the snow? Not very. Even in extremely cold climates, pets do very well for short periods of time outside.

What Is Involved In Placing Implants?

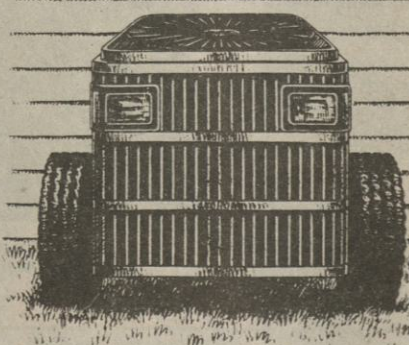
Implants cost significantly more than dentures or bridges and require a considerable investment of time the implant process involves several steps and may take up to nine months to complete.

First, surgery is performed to place the anchor. Surgeons can take up to several hours, and up to six months may be required for the bone to grow around the anchor and firmly hold it in place. Some implants require a second surgery in which a post is attached to connect the anchor to the replacement teeth. With other implants, the anchor and post are already attached and are placed at the same time. After the gums have had several weeks to heal, the next step is begun. The restorative teeth are made and fitted to the portion of the anchor. Because several fittings may be required, this step can take one or two months to complete. Implants surgery can be done either in a dental office or in a hospital, depending upon the type of implant, the patient's health and the dentist's preference. A local or general anesthetic may be used. Usually pain medications and, when necessary, antibiotics are prescribed. Your dentist will give you careful instructions on diet and oral hygiene.

What are the benefits and risks? Implants provide artificial teeth that look more natural. Many people also report that when they chew the implants feel more secure and more like natural teeth. People who cannot successfully use conventional dentures or people who need an alternative to removable partial dentures may be candidates for implants. Sometimes using implants can cause "stress" to the bones in the jaw. If bone loss occurs as a result, the implant may loosen. If the implant fails and needs to be replaced with a conventional denture, there may be problems in getting the denture to fit. Other possible complications include improper alignment, cosmetic problems, implant breakdown, inadequate healing or damage to adjacent teeth.

follow the written instructions. But, when people become careless with them, the danger of a fire becomes much greater. House fires often occur when people place a space heater too near combustible material. Avoid placing heaters closer than 2 feet to walls. Do not place heaters in the center of a room, either, where knocking them over is more of a risk.

Heaters that operate on kerosene, gas, propane or butane are most often responsible for causing house fires. Never, ever, add fuel to a warm heater.

When purchasing a heater, look for the Underwriters Laboratory (UL) seal of approval which indicates that the heater meets certain safety standards. Those standards may include a safety device that will automatically shut the heater off if it is tipped over. Select heaters that are bottom heavy for additional balance, and do not place them on a stand.

For fuel-burning heaters, select those with push-button ignitors to eliminate the use of matches. Oxygen depletion sensors, which will stop the fuel-burning heater if the oxygen level in the room drops below that necessary to sustain life, is a good safety feature as well.

Electrical heaters can cause fires when the voltage capacity of the electrical wall outlet is not adequate to support the heater and an overload occurs. Never use extension cords with any type of heating device, including irons and hair driers, unless the cords are rated for such heat-producing appliances. Most extension cords are not heavy enough to support the current needed.

An advantage of electrical heaters over fuel heaters is that the electrical heaters do not deplete the oxygen in the air or produce poisonous gases such as carbon monoxide. Fuel heaters need good ventilation, which may mean keeping a door or window slightly ajar. And, of course, no type of flammable solvents or aerosols, should be used in the same room where a space heater is operating because they can ignite and cause flash fires.

Iuka Police Department Rules and Regulations Adopted by Board

Police Department Rules and Regulations

Effective November 4, 1997

These Rules and Regulations are published for the guidance and administration of the Iuka Police Department and apply to all police department personnel. Members found violating any rule or regulation shall be subject to reprimand, suspension, demotion, forfeiture of pay, termination or other such disciplinary action as determined by the Chief of Police and approved by the Board of Aldermen.

The Personnel Policy Guidelines of the City of Iuka shall take precedent over the Police Department Rules and Regulations whenever the two shall conflict.

Definitions:

"Members" refers to all duly sworn police officers employed by the city either in a full-time or part-time capacity. The chief of police is not included within this category.

"Superior Officer" refers to the Chief of Police whenever he is on duty. Otherwise, it means the assistant chief when he is on duty. When neither the chief nor the assistant is on duty, "superior officer" refers to that officer with the longest period of continuous service with the City.

1. **Reporting for Duty**
Members shall report for duty at the police station prior to the beginning of their scheduled shift. Members shall wear the official uniform of the Iuka Police Department as determined by the Chief of Police.

2. **Obeying And Executing Orders Of Superiors**
Members shall strictly obey the orders of Superior Officers.

3. **General Conduct** Members shall conduct themselves in a socially acceptable manner at all times. Members shall not threaten, harass, intimidate, provoke or verbally abuse any person. Members shall not engage with physical confrontation except in matters of self-defense.

4. **Personal Appearance**
Members shall be neat, clean and well-groomed while on duty.

5. **Absences And Leave**
Members shall notify the department as soon as possible prior to duty time of any unauthorized absence. Members shall have all leave approved in advance by the Chief of Police. Sick and vacation leave will be administered in accordance with

the Personnel Policy guidelines of the City of Iuka.

6. **Overtime** Members shall have all overtime approved by the Chief of Police.

7. **Vehicles**
a. **Licensed Operators:** Only qualified and authorized members shall operate police vehicles. Members shall maintain a valid driver's license.

b. **Inspection Before Use:** Members assigned to operate police vehicles shall examine such vehicles and report any damage or operational defects to the Superior Officer and file the necessary reports with the Superior Officer.

c. **Cleanliness and Service:** Members assigned to operate police vehicles shall be responsible for the cleanliness and the orderliness of such vehicles during their shifts.

d. **Authorized Use:** Members shall not use department vehicles without the knowledge, authorization or permission of the Superior Officer.

e. **Operations:** Members shall operate department vehicles in a responsible manner.

f. **Unauthorized Passengers:** Members shall allow no unauthorized person to ride in patrol cars except in emergency situations. This shall not preclude law enforcement officers from other governmental entities from riding in patrol cars when they are engaged in joint law enforcement efforts with the City of Iuka.

g. **Tobacco Free:** Members shall not use tobacco of any form while inside police department vehicles.

8. **Dispatching** Dispatchers shall keep a shift log.

9. **Meal Period** Members shall be allowed a 30-minute meal period for each 8-hour shift. An additional 30-minute meal period shall be allowed for 12-hour shifts.

10. **Idleness** Members shall not sleep, idle or loaf while on duty.

11. **Forms And Reports** Members shall prepare and file an activity report daily and other required reports as soon as possible.

12. **Address And Telephone** Numbers Members shall have a telephone and shall keep the Chief of Police notified of their telephone number and current address.

13. Part-Time Employment

Members shall obtain the prior approval of the Chief of Police and the Board of Aldermen for any outside employment.

14. Drugs And Alcohol

Members shall not drink alcoholic beverages, use or be influenced by illegal drugs while on duty.

15. **Patrol** Members shall patrol within the city limits at all times unless their presence is required at the police station. Members shall leave the city limits only for justifiable law enforcement purposes.

16. **Personal Telephone Calls**
Members shall not have personal telephone calls directed to the police department except in emergencies.

17. **Grievances** Grievances shall be administered in accordance with the Personnel Policy Guidelines of the City of Iuka.

18. **Court Attendance** Members shall attend city court whenever required and shall appear in uniform.

19. **Firearms** Members authorized to carry a firearm shall be re-certified annually by July 1 with their primary firearm, in accordance with the standards and guidelines used by the state training academy.

20. **News Media** Members shall not release information to the press or news media.

21. Arrest or Court Action

Members shall immediately report in writing to the Chief of Police all information concerning any arrest or court action instituted by the member or against the member in any criminal or civil action.

22. **Wearing Uniforms While On Suspension** Members shall not wear any part of the official uniform while under suspension.

23. Performance Of Duties

Members shall enforce the laws of the City of Iuka and the State of Mississippi. Failure to do so shall result in disciplinary action.

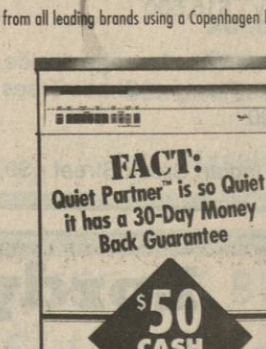

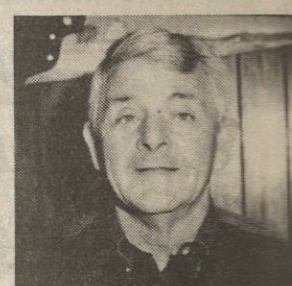
