Young luka Man Killed In One Vehicle Accident Near B'ville

Injuries sustained during a Thursday morning, one-vehicle crash has led to the death of a 24year-old Iuka man on Saturday.

Samuel Craig Woodruff, died Saturday, Nov. 15, at North Mississippi Medical Center in According to reports from

the Mississippi Highway Patrol and family members, Woodruff was traveling from his home on Mt. Gilead Road (between Burnsville and Iuka) to his place of employment at Burnsville Discount Carpet in Burnsville when he apparently flipped his 1979 International pickup near the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway on Hwy. 72. The cause of the wreck is unknown at this time.

He was transported by ambulance from the scene to the Iuka Hospital, then was transferred again by ambulance to NMMC, Tupelo. According to a close family member, he sustained severe head injuries as a result of the accident.

Craig Woodruff died at the North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo. He was a carpet layer for Burnsville Discount Carpet and a Pentecostal.

255 Jobs Lost; H.I.S. Closing **Belmont Plant**

More than 250 families have received unwelcome pre-holiday season news; H.I.S. is closing its blue jean manufacturing plant in Belmont, and sent home most employees last week.

Roland Kimberlin, President of the Henry I. Siegel Company, made the announcement in a release November 13th, stating. "In spite of all the efforts the company has made to increase its jeans sales, we have continued to lose market share to both private label jeans and designer name jeans. Consequently, a decision has been made to close the plant."

Kimberlin expressed his appreciation to employees and assured them they had performed well and had not failed.

Sweet Potatoes: The South's **Comfort Food**

It's nearly Thanksgiving and you're starting to think about Thanksgiving dinner and what to serve and how to plan your time. The traditional turkey and dressing, perhaps? Along with potatoes and gravy and green beans and rolls and ...? But such a spread isn't truly Southern if it doesn't include a pie or something made with Mississippi sweet

Sweet potatoes in Mississippi are more than tradition - they're practically an institution when it comes to entertaining in the Magnolia State. As you already know, there are many different dishes you can make with sweet potatoes, from appetizers to dessert, so there's no reason not to make them part of your holiday

You probably have you favorite family recipes for sweet potatoes, but if not, there are numerous ones to be found. The Mississippi Sweet Potato Council has a new and excellent brochure of which I have a few extra copies for the asking. There are entire cookbooks devoted to sweet potatoes, so I will concentrate on basics for buying, storing and preparing rather than recipes.

When buying, look for firm, well-shaped potatoes with bright, clean and smooth skin, avoiding those that are bruised or show signs of decay. Always keep sweet potatoes dry and never refrigerate except after cooking, as cold temperatures alter their taste and

When stored in cool, well ventilated areas, above 55 degrees, sweet potatoes will maintain their quality for several weeks.

Unwashed potatoes keep better than washed and waxed ones.

Freshly-dug sweet potatoes are better if boiled and used in dishes that include fruits or syrups. The curing process makes the potatoes sweeter and improves the baking quality.

Canned sweet potato's are excellent in recipes calling for boiled or mashed potatoes. Frozen sweet potatoes are good for pies, puddings and souffles. Most sweet potato dishes freeze well, so you can save time and energy by making one dish to serve now, and another to freeze for later use.

An easy cooking method is to simply grease the skins of clean potatoes and bake them on a baking sheet at 350 to 400 degrees until soft, 30 minutes or longer, depending on the size of the potato. Equally easy is to cook

them in boiling water for about the same length of time as above, drain, then remove skins. The cooked potatoes may then be mashed, candied, glazed or used in any recipe calling for mashed

Two methods recommended in the Vardaman Sweet Potatoes Cookbook, are to charbroil or french fry. For charcoal broiling, grease the sweet potato skins and wrap double-foil loosely around them. Cook in coals for about 45 minutes.

To French fry, slice mediumsized sweet potatoes into 3/8 inch strips or circles. Crisp in cold water for 1 to 2 minutes. Drain and fry in oil heated to 370 degrees F. Fry a few slices at a time in deep oil until golden brown turning occasionally. Remove and drain on paper towels. Sprinkle with salt or confectioner's sugar and serve

Nutritionally, sweet potatoes

are high in vitamin A and contribute vitamin C, iron, and fiber to the diet. They are similar in calorie value to white potatoes. Remember that calories can be increased significantly with additives like butter and sugar, but that you can reduce calories in your favorite recipes by using a lower measurement. For example: when the recipe calls for 1 cup of sugar, reduce the amount to 3/4

So, enjoy your favorite dishes made from sweet potatoes while they're in season - and try out some new ones. I've already decided on one for my Thanksgiving dinner that uses sweet potatoes and apples together - a recipe I found+ in the November Southern Living Magazine. They're plentiful, inexpensive, nutritious and delicious - and worthy of being called a Southern comfort food.

Do You Have A Cataract? Cataracts can happen at any age, but they are found most often in people 55 or older. A cataract is a condition in which the normally clear lens of the eye becomes cloudy and opaque. They can vary from extremely small areas of cloudiness to large cloudy areas that cause a noticeable loss of vision.

If you have a cataract in one or both eyes and it is causing only minor problems, your eye doctor can prescribe changes in eyewear that will help you see more clearly. Some cataracts progress to the point where they need to be removed. Others will eventually require surgery to remove them.

After cataract surgery they are several vision correction options, including glasses, contact lenses, intraocular lenses. Intraocular lens implants are inserted into the eye at the time of surgery to serve as a "new" lens. This is, by far the most common procedure used today.





While the department was not exactly pleased with their new location, they made the best of the situation by installing window, an air conditioner, a bed and a sink in the room. These additions, along with the desk, table, and refrigerator they already had, made the room more pleasant to work and live in. But these things couldn't solve some provoking problems. The restrooms and showers were located well away from the room, there was no nearby exit to the outside, the Engines 1 and 2 were too far away to get to quickly. Visitors to the fire department had difficulty locating the office, since it was effectively hidden behind the two older fire trucks.

In an effort to solve these problems, the department received permission to build a new structure to house their office and sleeping quarters. After some deliberation, it was decided that the best site for the office would be in the lower bay, attached onto an existing bathroom. This was accomplished by widening the right-lower-bay door so the fire truck in that area could be parked closer to the center of the bay, rendering enough room next to the wall to build an 8 ft.wide room. The room runs the length of the bay and is actually three separate



County Agents Notes

I Fought The Lawn And The Lawn Won

If your lawn hasn't lived up to expectations this season, don't despair. There's still time to determine what may have gone wrong, and problem diagnosis is the first step in setting up a good lawn maintenance program. Remember, your lawn doesn't have to win every season!

One of the most common practices leading to disease is the excessive use of nitrogen fertilizer. This leads to lush growth of grass that is readily attacked by the brown patch fungus. Mowing practices also can lead to problems. don't let susceptible turf varieties get too tall and thick between mowing. as this creates a favorable environment for disease. Mow regularly recommended mowing height.

Thatch accumulation could also have promoted disease problems. Thatch is a layer of partially decomposed leaves, stems, and roots at the soil surface. This layer builds up over a period of years and decreases the vigor of grass by restricting the movement of air, water, and fertilizers into the soil. Under heavy thatch conditions, the roots are generally shallow which brings about increased damage from

drought. Brown patch and other diseases are generally much more severe in lawns with heavy

practices Watering frequently play a part in turf grass disease development. Watering late in the afternoon allows the grass to remain wet for long periods of time and

creates the moist conditions needed for brown patch infection to occur. If possible water on weekends or at times when you can start early enough in the day for grass to dry down.

At this point in the season, if you haven't made a fertilizer winterizing application, it's still not too late to do so. A fertilizer containing the proper amounts of phosphorous and potassium will increase turf hardiness and allow grass to break dormancy next spring in better condition to ward off diseases and other pests.

For additional information about turf winterizing, brown patch, other diseases or turf, and general guidelines on setting up a program for a winning lawn, check with us at the County Extension Office.

When selecting and pay close attention to disease allowing cattle to glean row crop fields is a sound practice. Use caution in gleaming plants in the sorghum family immediately after frost because of the possibility of prussic acid poisoning. There should be no problem after the plants have dried. Wicker Praises Congress' **Education Report Card**

An ambitious package of education initiatives was on the legislative agenda when the House of Representatives reconvened in September from its summer break. That work has been completed and the report card is a good one, reflecting the passage of several bills to strengthen classroom instruction and reduce the influence of the federal education bureaucracy.

These measures give local and state school officials more authority to make decisions and implement effective programs from kindergarten through high school. This legislative package is in addition to tax incentives already enacted which offer

parents and students significant tax breaks to make higher education more affordable.

Among the intiatives:

*A resolution urging the Department of Education to send at least 90 percent of federal education dollars directly to the classroom. Analysis done by an education research group in 1995 showed only about 60 cents of the total education dollar goes to regular classroom instruction. On a 310-99 vote, members of Congress in both parties sent a message that trend should be changed.


*The Reading Excellence Act which provides funds for research and more teacher training to help improve K-12 reading instruction.

*Authorization of funding to

allow states to create public charter schools where innovative and more specialized programs have proved to be successful.

*The Pass A+ Education Savings Accounts Act which permits parents to save \$2,500 a year and make withdrawals for a wide range of K-12 education

*Prevention of the use of any funds to develop President national Clinton's initiative. Congress will now have the ultimate authority over any decision to move ahead with new






