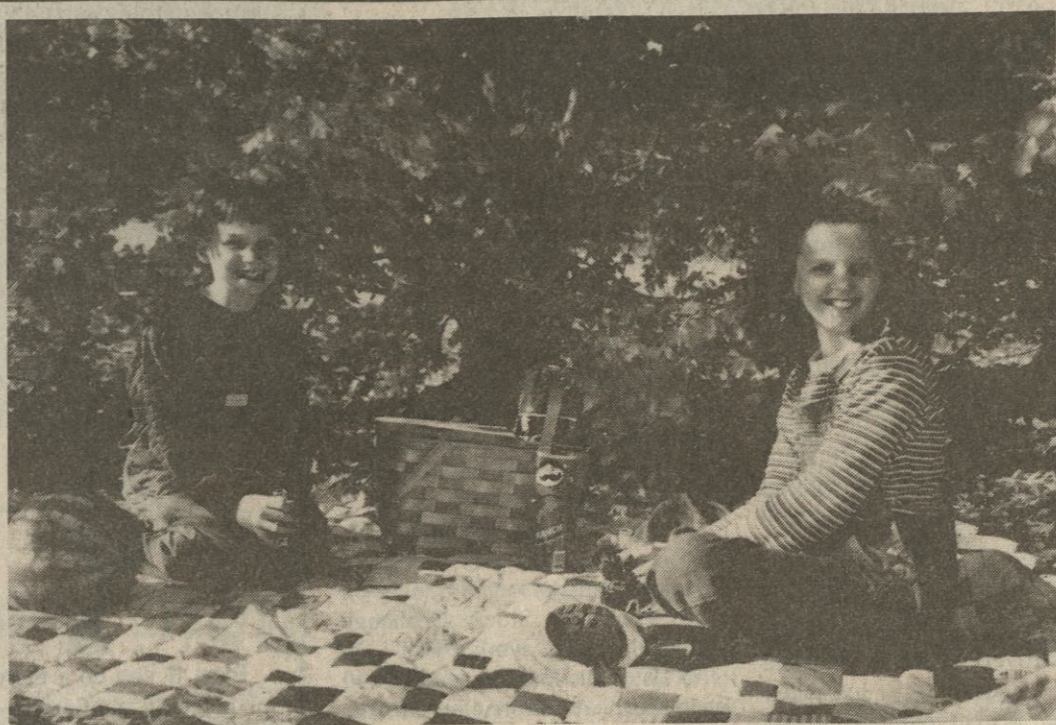
Letters to Santa

Iuka Family Loses Home to Fire

An Iuka family's vacation to the mountains was cut short last week when they called relatives at home and found that their house had been destroyed by fire.

Members of the Burnsville Volunteer Fire Department responded to a 4 a.m. alarm last Friday morning. The home on County Road 169 belonged to Jeff and Beverly Ragan, and by the time firefighters arrived on the scene about 4:08, part of the roof had already fallen in, according to Chief Donnel Timbes.

Iuka, Harmony Central and Eastport-Mill Creek fire departments responded to requests for backup, but there was little they could do besides try to get some furniture and personal items out of the 2-story brick and wood house before it all burned, said Timbes.

"We had plenty of water and men, but some fires you can't do that much about," Timbes said.

Both Jeff and Beverly Ragan are members of the Burnsville Volunteer Fire Department, and Beverly is an EMR as well. They have three children.

Family members and friends

said that the family had just left on Thursday for a vacation to the Smoky Mountains. When they called home to let relatives know they had arrived at their destination, they were alerted to the fact that there was some trouble at home. They arrived home on Saturday around noon to the devastating news that their home was destroyed.

Cause Undetermined

Though the cause of the fire was undetermined, Timbes said that it may have been caused by a lightning strike.

A passerby on his way to work reported the fire to 911, said Timbes.

Helping in Time of Need

Friends and family are pitching in to help the Ragan family, who lost most everything in the fire.

Bauhaus Announces Expansion; Thirty More Jobs Next Year

Bauhaus U.S.A., Inc. has announced a 20,000 square foot expansion to its current Iuka furniture manufacturing facility that is projected to result in thirty additional jobs next spring.

According to a release from Larry Gentry of Bauhaus, construction is expected to begin soon on a 20,000-square-foot addition to the current 100,000-square-foot facility on Paul Edmondson Drive in Iuka. Officials project the construction will be complete by April 1, 1998.

The expansion is to accommodate two additional production lines of the upholstered furniture that the facility already produces, said Iuka Plant Manager Jim Gearren. Currently they employ about 200 people.

Bauhaus will be making the \$250,000 investment for the expansion to the facility that is owned by the Tishomingo County Development Authority.

"Bauhaus is showing great and welcome confidence in the area and workforce by making this investment in their local facility," said Mack Loyd Wadkins, Executive Director of

the Tishomingo County Development Foundation.

"Bauhaus is fast becoming one of the leading furniture manufacturing companies in Northeast Mississippi," said Wadkins. "They have been very good members of the community, and have made major investments in other areas, like education and contributions to civic groups."

"We have had a great four years up here, and we have great people," said Gearren.

The company manufactures upholstered furniture and its products are generally sold throughout the United States, Canada Europe and Japan.

The Air We Breathe

As we move into the winter months, sealing up windows and otherwise making our houses as tight as possible to keep out the cold air, there are other considerations to keep in mind in addition to warmth. We also need to be concerned about the quality of the indoor air we will be breathing in our homes, offices and school.

Air pollution has traditionally been presumed to be a troublesome phenomenon associated with the atmosphere outside the home and work place. Until recently it was believed that a person was protected from contaminated air when inside the home.

Research studies now suggest however, that indoor air pollution may pose a potentially more

serious problem than outdoor pollution.

MHV Clubs in both Alcorn and Tishomingo Counties have been studying this situation and have learned that scores of government studies, scientific investigations and case histories document the scope and severity of the indoor air quality problem.

Many of the air pollutants may trigger allergic response while others have been documented as causing cancer in humans.

While indoor air pollutants are not new, their presence and the resulting effects on human health have been intensified with the move to more energy-efficient housing. It is now recognized that many of the measures intended to reduce energy use are contributing significantly to higher levels of

indoor air contamination as pollutants are confined and concentrated.

Harmful pollutants are present in all types of indoor air environments. There are variations of course in the specific chemical substances contributing to indoor pollution as well as in the concentration levels of the polluting substances. Not all homes contain the same pollutants in the same concentrations.

Generally interior pollutants are derived from two major sources: (1) products used in the day-to-day activities carried out within the home, and (2) the house itself. While we may not have complete control over all sources, there are some things we can do.

To look at the first one: many of our daily activities make use of products which release potentially harmful substances into the atmosphere. Among the more common are tobacco smoke, insecticides, paints/varnishes and removers, cleaning solvents, all kinds of polishing compounds and soft plastic materials.

One of the most widespread and underestimated sources of indoor air pollution is tobacco smoke. Following the "Great American Smokeout" this week, I hope you are more aware of the effects of smoking on health and are taking effective measures to stop - either yourself or others. Remember that the difference between smoking and breathing someone else's smoke is only a matter of degree. Respirable particles emitted from tobacco smoke contain such harmful compounds as carbon monoxide, formaldehyde, nicotine and the highly poisonous hydrogen cyanide. Recent publicity about illegal use of pesticides for termite control serve as a reminder that many pesticides are potentially

lethal, additional so if mixed with a petroleum-based solvent. The solvents in paints, cleaners and adhesives can be released in large quantities during use, as can ingredients from shoe, floor, furniture, silver and other polishing compounds. Disinfectants, hairsprays, deodorizers, air fresheners, glues and a multitude of other products contain ingredients which can prove harmful in a confined environment.

What should we do? For some we can discontinue use. Read labels and caution warnings. Use some materials only outdoors or

Facts About Age Discrimination

A federal law, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act (ADEA), protects people 40 and over from employment discrimination based on age. The law's protections apply to both employees and job applicants. Under the law, it is illegal to discriminate against a person because of his or her age in all aspects of a job, including hiring, firing, salary and promotion.

The law applies to employers who have 20 or more employees, including government agencies.

If you think you've been discriminated against based on your age, seek legal help to find out your rights and remedies under the ADEA.

Peoples Announces Stock, Cash Dividends

At the monthly meeting Tuesday, November 11, The Peoples Holding Company board of directors approved a three-for-two stock split to be effected in the form of a 50% stock dividend to be issued January 20, 1998, to shareholders of record January 1, 1998. The board also approved a 2.25% increase in the quarterly cash dividend concurrent with the stock dividend, from fourteen and two-thirds cents (\$.1467) per share on a split-adjusted basis to fifteen cents (\$.15) per share. This will be the eleventh consecutive year in which the quarterly cash dividend has been increased. Prior to the 50% stock dividend, the current dividend remains \$.22 per share.

Earnings per share have moved upward at a three-year compound growth rate of 8.06% (9/30/94-9/30/97). During the same period, book value per share has grown 9.21% while market value has grown 21.04%.

On Monday, August 18, 1997, The Peoples Holding Company shares began trading on the American Stock Exchange under the ticker symbol PHC. On that date, the stock opened at \$40 per share. At September 30, the price was \$41.44 (1.69 times

Matching Frames & Faces

Selecting the right frame can do wonders for your appearance. Depending upon the shape of your face, a frame shaped the right way can accentuate its strong points, and minimize its weaker ones.

If you're lucky enough to have an oval face, just about any shape will be flattering.

If your face is squared, a good choice would be a frame shaped oval or round. Avoid a geometric or square shape.

If your face is round, you should select a frame with straight, angular, or geometric lines. Do not select a round or oval shape, as this will cause your face to appear rounder.

If your face is long and thin, select a frame round at the bottom, with strong horizontal lines, or emphasis on the top outer corners, such as a wide rectangle. Avoid a small round shape.

If your face happens to be triangular, or heart-shaped, you would select a frame where the lower sides round outward from the face. Don't choose one with a straight top bar, as this will emphasize your broad forehead and pointed chin.

Your Dental Health



Even if you do a thorough job brushing and flossing each day, your smile needs and deserves a regular professional cleaning at the dental office. Here's why: Plaque, an invisible sticky film of bacteria constantly forms on teeth. As it collects, it forms a hard layer of tartar, or calculus, especially in hard-to-reach areas near the gumline. The bacteria create toxins that irritate the gums, causing them to become inflamed and bleed easily. If the irritation persists over time, the gums pull away from the teeth, forming pockets that collect more bacteria. Eventually, the infection destroys gum tissue and underlying bone. The teeth may become loose and fall out.

Daily brushing and cleaning between teeth with floss or an interdental cleaner helps prevent plaque from accumulating. Once it hardens into tartar, the only way to remove plaque is to have your teeth cleaned in the dental office. During the cleaning, your dentist or hygienist will remove the hardened deposits using manual scalers. Or, they may use an ultrasonic machine that sends sound waves through a probe-like tip, which vibrates and loosens the hard deposits. The loose particles are removed with a stream of water. Then the Dentist will check for any cavities.

Kennel Cough

Technically called infectious tracheobronchitis, "kennel cough" is the most common respiratory infection affecting dogs. Usually caused by one or more viruses acting alone or in combination with certain bacteria, virtually all dogs are susceptible regardless of age. The greatest risk of exposure and infection comes at times when a susceptible dog is housed with or has direct contact with several other dogs.

Boarding kennels, pounds, and shelters, because of the high concentration of dogs, are the most likely source of infection; hence the term "kennel" cough.

The signs of infection typically develop 5 to 7 days after exposure to a boarding facility or infected dogs. A dry cough is the first sign of trouble. The cough quickly becomes persistent. Owners frequently complain that their dog is coughing so much it keeps them up at night.

Characteristic of the cough is a high-pitched "honk" that accompanies each cough. Most dogs will wretch after coughing and some will expel white phlegm. Despite the persistent coughing, dogs will usually remain relatively healthy, active, and have a good appetite.

Treatment is usually very effective. Cough suppressants and antibiotics to prevent complicating infections are usually prescribed. Within 10 days, the signs should abate. If, after 2 weeks of treatment, the dog is still coughing, the dog should be re-examined.

If your dog is subject to exposure to other dogs, or must be boarded in a kennel, the so-called kennel cough vaccination is indicated. Vaccines against kennel cough are available as either a shot or as a topical liquid administered directly into the nostrils. The topical route of administration is considered to offer superior protection.

For dogs that are subject to being boarded, annual vaccination is indicated. If you know ahead of time that your dog will need to be boarded, a booster vaccination, administered topically, should be administered about one week prior to actually entering the kennel.

The viruses that cause kennel cough are highly contagious to other dogs, but are not capable of being transmitted to humans. Cats can become infected with one of the bacteria associated with "kennel cough", however, infections are rare and vaccination of cats is not recommended.

Christmas Holiday Mailing Season

Iuka Postmaster Thomas M. Bunch reminds the public of the upcoming domestic Christmas holiday mailing season which runs from Thanksgiving, November 25, until after Christmas, December 31. He also noted that during the holiday season the Postal Service receives an increase of 34 million pieces of mail a day. On an average day from October through December, 603 million pieces of mail are received in comparison to 637 million pieces per day during the upcoming season, he said.

The Postal Service offers the following tips to help customers with their holiday mailing:

*Always use complete address information including the apartment number and correct directions such as "N", "W", "E", and etc.

*Don't let an incorrect Zip Code delay delivery of cards and letters. Local post offices offer ZIP code information.

*Use filament tape for sealing packages for mailing. Make sure that contents are well padded and the box is sturdy. The only writing on the outside of the package should be the addresses of the sender and the intended recipient.

*Always use a return address

when mailing cards, letters of packages.

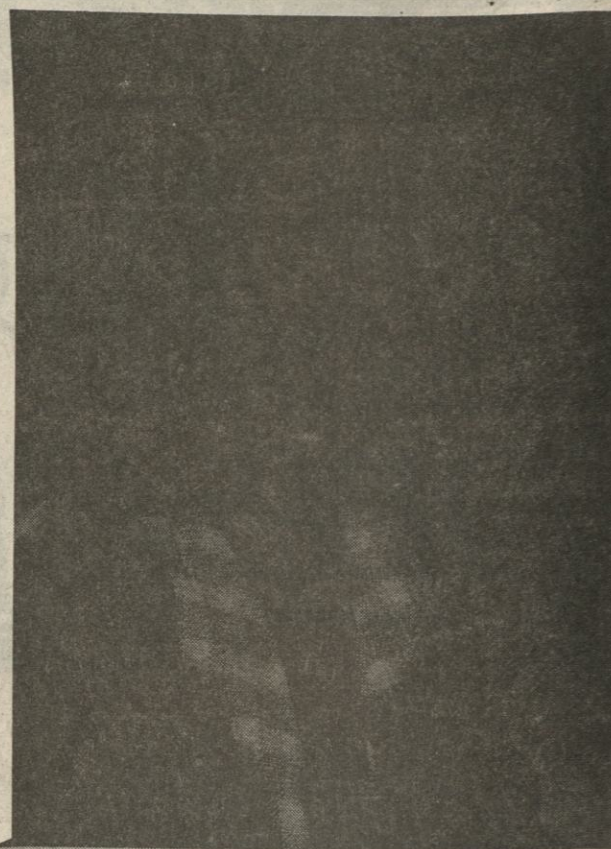
*Purchase convenient packaging materials including boxes and padding materials at your post office. Express and Priority Mail Boxes, envelopes, and tubes are free.

*Avoid waiting in line for holiday stamps by buying them early. Or, try one of the alternate holiday stamp-purchasing options now available that include stamps-by-phone (1-800-STAMP 24), stamps-by-mail, and stamps from postal vending machines.

*Make an impression and send gifts by Express Mail guaranteed overnight service that is delivered 365 days a year — even on holidays.

*Request Insured or Registered services for your holiday valuables.

As an added convenience, postal customers are reminded that they may also contact their local post office to arrange to have uninsured parcels left at their residence in their absence.

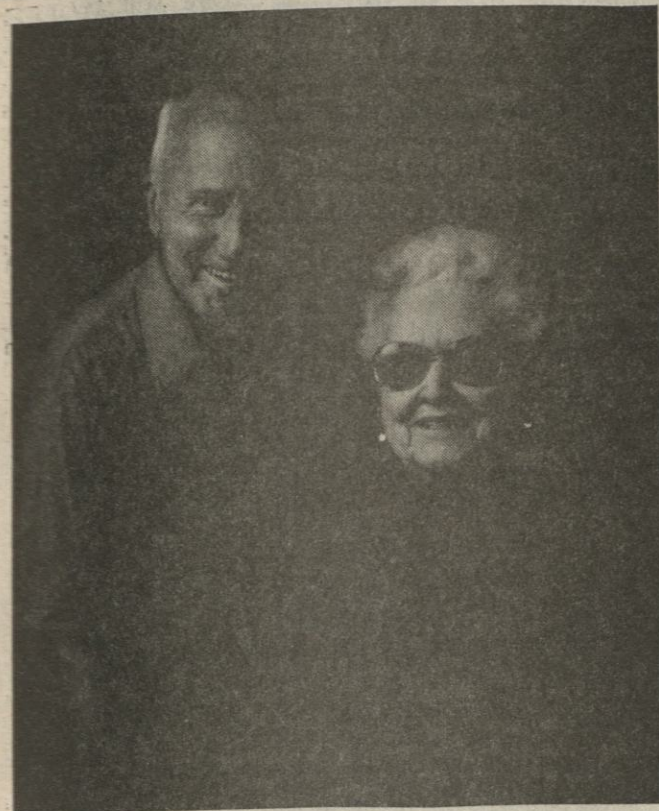

NMMC's Mobile Unit Travels To Area....

North Mississippi Medical Center's Mobile Mammography Unit will travel to area communities during December to provide women with convenient access to mammography services.

The Mobile Mammography Unit will be at the following locations: December 10-12, Iuka Hospital, 1777 Curtis Drive.

Two types of mammograms are available. A screening mammogram is used to detect breast cancer, and usually the test detects cancer long before it can be found by physician examination or other methods of diagnosis.

Screening mammograms are available through self-referral. Diagnostic mammograms can rule out or confirm the presence of breast disease or abnormalities, which may include cancer.

The cost of a screening mammogram is \$68. The results of the mammograms are read by NMMC's radiologists, physicians who specialize in interpreting x-ray, ultrasound and other types of imaging studies.

Appointments for all mammography services are scheduled in advance. To schedule a screening mammogram, call (601)841-4158 or 1-800-843-3375. Appointments for diagnostic mammograms are scheduled by the women's physician.

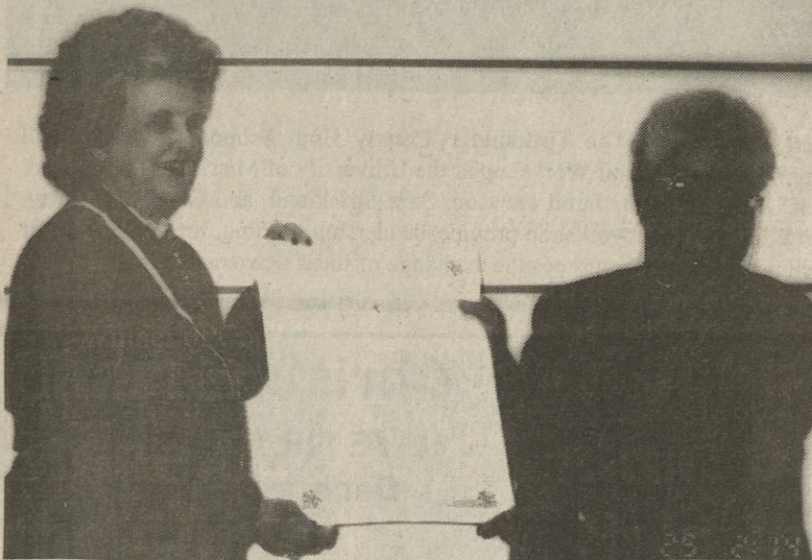

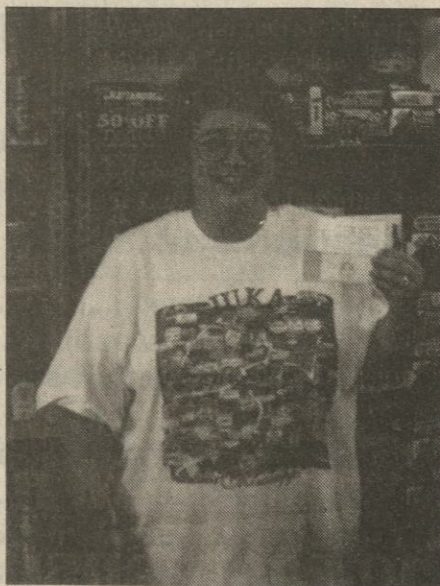

A Christmas tree will be in the Rose Parlor of the governor's Mansion, and the rest of the historic portion of the house will be decorated with fresh

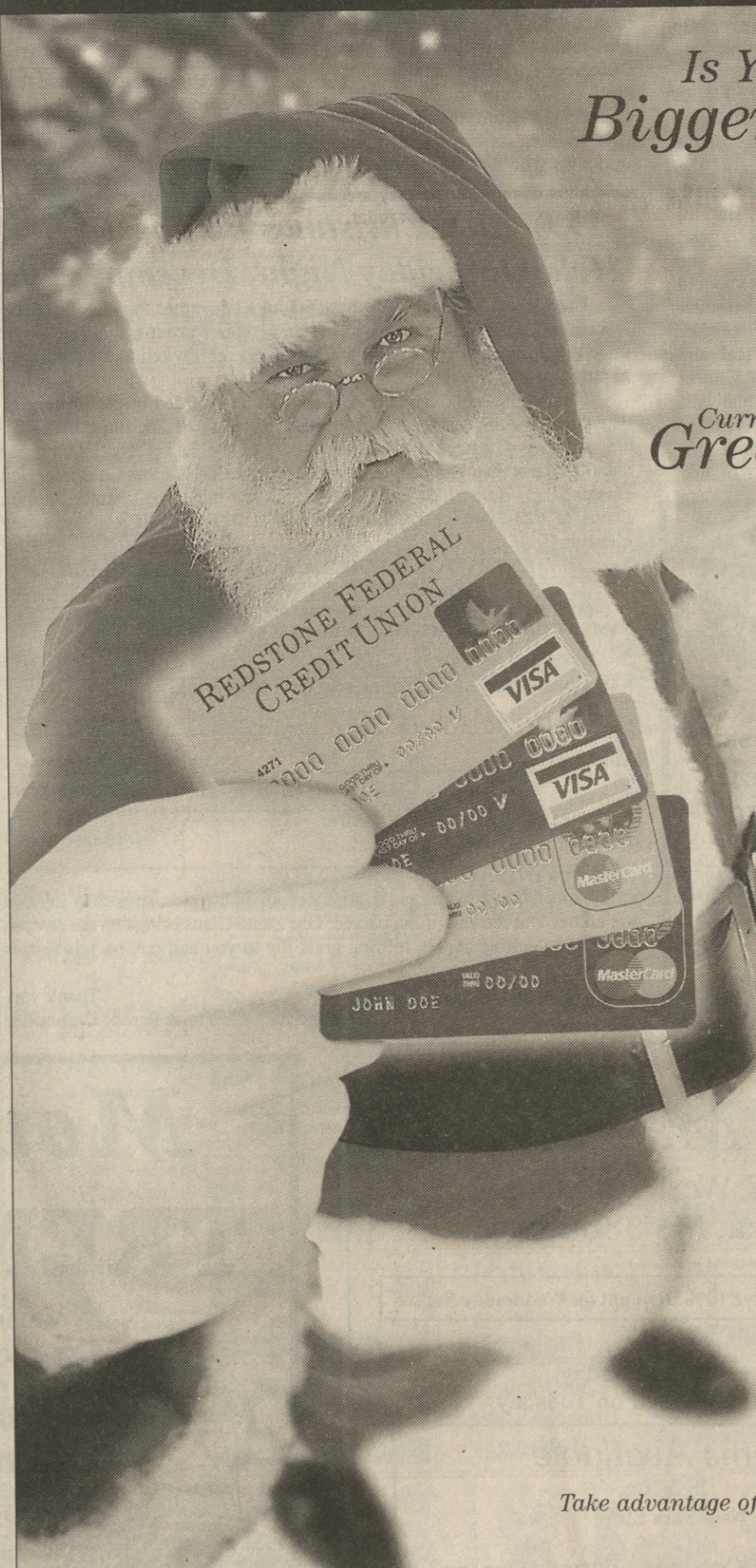

County Agents Notes

Was Your Pecan Crop Zapped By Scab?

Pecan scab was tough this season and caused poor nut harvests for many home orchardists in the county. The rainy spring was ideal for early infection of young leaves of susceptible pecan varieties by the scab fungus, and young nuts also became infected as wet weather continued through early summer. Although drier conditions returned by mid-summer, nut quality was already affected, and many home pecan growers are seeing evidence of this in poorly filled nuts. Scab wasn't the only problem, however, since insect infestations also contributed to poor yields. Scab isn't a new problem for pecan production. This disease has been around for years and is considered to be the most destructive disease of pecans in the South. During seasons when rainfall is abundant early in the spring, susceptible pecan varieties such as Schley, Success, and Stuart are particularly vulnerable to scab infection. Scab infected leaves frequently fall in late summer, and premature leaf shed deprives trees of the means to manufacture food supplies needed for continued nut development. Heavily infected

nuts take on a blackened appearance and drop prematurely. If you aren't sure whether you have a scab problem on your trees, bring several nut specimens by the County Extension Office for examination and disease identification. While there's nothing which can be done to

control pecan scab on the past crop, there are control measures which can be taken to reduce the impact of this disease in the future. For example, if you plan to add new trees to your pecan planting during the fall or spring planting season, it's important to realize the easiest and least expensive route to scab control is through the planting of scab-resistant pecan varieties. For a listing, see MCES publication 966 "Fruit and Nut Recommendations for Mississippi", available at the Extension Office. Some of these varieties include Barton, Cheyenne, Davis, Elliott, and Owens. Additionally, the following cultural practices should be part of a production program since vigorous growing trees are much less susceptible to scab and other diseases and insects: Collect a soil sample for nutrient analysis. Apply recommended amounts of fertilizer before next season. Carry out sanitary measures to reduce

the amount of scab fungus carryover into next year. Sanitation practices include removing leaves, old shucks, and other pecan debris from around the trees this fall and winter. Cut low hanging limbs. This will be important next season as a way of improving air circulation to speed drying of foliage and nuts following rainfall. The shorter the drying time, the better the chances for escaping infection by the scab fungus. Many homeowners want to spray their trees as a means of preventing disease and insect problems. This is a difficult task since highly specialized application equipment is necessary to cover large trees. Also, several applications of

fungicide are needed each season.

Chicken and Dressing Skillet Bake Wins National Cornbread Festival

Chicken and Dressing Skillet Bake captured first prize at the 1997 National Cornbread Festival Cook-Off sponsored by Martha White Foods and Lodge Cast iron. The \$500 cash prize was awarded to Sue Gullede of Springville, Ala.

The top prize winner appealed to the judges because it combines an easy cornbread batter with cooked chicken and traditional cornbread dressing flavors for an all-in-one dish reminiscent of Sunday dinner. The casserole has a hearty, crisp crust, thanks to a hot iron skillet, and a moist texture inside that is surprisingly akin to classic southern cornbread dressing.

CHICKEN AND DRESSING SKILLET BAKE

1 cup chopped celery
1 cup chopped onion
4 tablespoons butter

1 tablespoon oil
2 cups buttermilk
2 eggs, beaten
1 (8 1/2 oz.) can cream style corn

Medieval Projects by Accelerated English IV Students

With the haunting melody of Medieval music and candlelight, the Accelerated English IV students in Mrs. Shelia Bates' class enjoyed a medieval feast prepared by their classmates. Third period enjoyed the cathedral and its history presented by three robed monks - Brent Bonds, Justin Wilkins, and Jonathan Pharr - who along with Nikki Darwin and Deresa Patrick, gave an informative look at the symbolism of each part of the church. The toothpick furniture models added a complete picture.

These students found that research can be enjoyable and that working together requires great effort. A year-end project they are planning will be a cookbook of the recipes from each time period we will study this year. The projects were excellent, and the students found themselves more informed about the Medieval Ages.

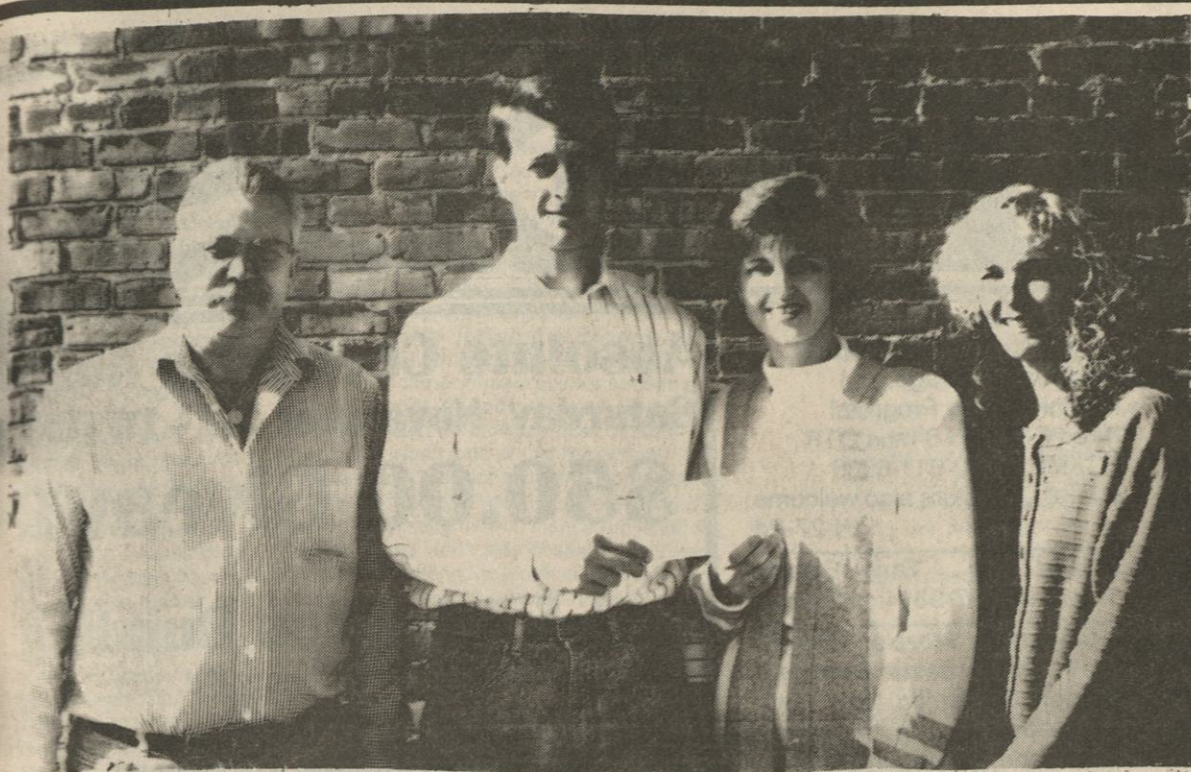

God removed all desire from me to use drugs. But He had to let me hit bottom before I would listen. In the meantime, He graciously kept me alive and fairly safe in spite of my self-destructive path. When I finally was put in a position where I had no other alternative left, I completely turned back to God.

I've tried every drug there is,

chased almost every lifestyle there is, and associated with every class of people there is. It's an amazing thing that the only totally fulfilling

life that I found, is the one that I departed from almost ten years ago. The answer to life is found only in God.

Sure the story of the gospel is over 2,000 years old. But the name God who created this earth so many years ago is still the source of answers for any problem. The bottom of a whiskey bottle doesn't have it, the end of a joint doesn't have it, and the point of a needle full of cocaine doesn't have it. The only thing in drugs and alcohol are an early grave or a prison cell.

So, I want to admonish the young people once more to see what I have said as a warning: not an example. The future holds endless possibilities, but only if

you stay drug-free. If you wish to talk one-on-one, I'll be happy to share with you. I'm only twenty-nine years old. Things haven't changed that much since I was in school. Except for the fashions.

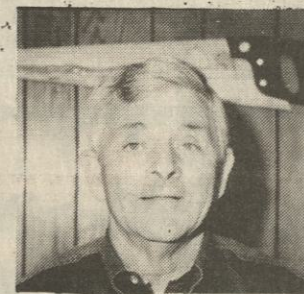
