

Report From Congress

Wicker Says Iraq Weapons Pose Threat To U.S.

The recent crisis in Iraq may have seemed far removed from Thanksgiving holiday dinner table across the country last week. It is likely many Americans view Saddam Hussein's dispute with United Nations weapons inspectors as a potential threat only to his Middle East neighbors but not to American lives or U.S. vital interests.

Iraq may be half a world away, but all Americans should be aware that this danger could hit very close to home if Saddam is allowed to have his way on this weapons inspector issue.

The sobering fact is that Iraq's possession of biological and chemical weapons, and perhaps components for a nuclear weapons, poses a worldwide threat worthy of the diplomatic and military actions which have produced a temporary agreement.

After the Persian Gulf War ended, Iraq admitted it had enough botulinium toxin to wipe out the earth's population several times over. Its supply of anthrax, the most toxic nerve agent known to science, is believed to be more than 2200 gallons. That is enough to kill one billion people. Saddam's refusal to let UN inspection teams continue their search for these and other weapons of mass destruction was not taken lightly, nor should it be.


If Iraq is allowed to thumb its nose at the international community, Saddam will be strengthened and perhaps encouraged to further threaten his neighbors and the stability of the entire region.

The stakes are high and not just for the countries within range

or Iraqi artillery shells. A lone terrorist, armed with a small amount of these deadly nerve agents, could bring this danger to any country in the world — even to Main Street, USA. This scenario has already been played out in Japan where terrorists used nerve gas to kill 12 people and injure 5,000 more on a Tokyo subway. Saddam's toxins are much more deadly.

While a diplomatic settlement has enabled weapons inspectors to get back to work, I am sure the

persuasive power of two U.S. aircraft carrier battle groups now in the Persian Gulf also played a role. The rapid military response to the crisis sent a message to

Saddam that we meant business.

Threats such as this one are the reason Congress has increased military spending for three years in a row, including a \$3.3 billion hike for Fiscal Year 1998. The added funding will speed production of a new aircraft carrier, a nuclear submarine, eight advanced Air Force fighter aircraft, and research increased development of "smart weapons" for the 21st century. These improvements will help ensure our ability to respond to a crisis in the Middle East or anywhere else our vital interests are threatened.

Preparing For Bifocals

You might think that wearing bifocal lenses would entail difficulty because there are two corrections in the lens. Don't underestimate your brain's adaptability. It just takes a short period of time to get used to them. The eyeglasses naturally, have to be properly fitted so they are centered in front of your eyes. The rest is up to you. You'll appreciate using one pair of glasses instead of two.

Your eyes will move up, as they always do to use the vision correction in the upper part of the lens.

Walking up or down stairs may be a problem in the very beginning. You have to look down to see where you are going. You may find it easier to use the upper part of your lens. All you have to do is bend your chin down a bit. The same goes for when you're stepping off a curb. It just takes a little practice.

Organically Approved **Fungicides For Home** Gardeners

Interested in giving organic disease control a try in your vegetable garden next season? Many gardeners question the effectiveness of this approach to handling diseases vegetable annually cause production problems. Organic disease control really does work satisfactory and provides protection from many vegetable diseases which commonly occur in Tishomingo County each season. This approach is based on sanitation, cultural, physical, biological disease management procedures, as well as application of organically fungicides. approved Alternatives to synthetic (nonorganic) fungicides such as maneb, mancozeb, benomyl, and chlorothalonil for control of vegetable diseases include such materials as sulfur and copper containing fungicides. Spraying or dusting with sulfur is an old remedy that still works on rusts, powdery mildews, and leaf spots on tomato, and other vegetable crops. Mix finely ground sulfur with water at the rate of 3 ounces per 3 gallons of water, or dust in an even coat over plant surfaces. Be aware that sulfur is easily removed from plants during rain frequent application may be needed to provide an adequate level of disease protection. One of the most popular organically approved fungicides is Bordeaux Mixture. This fungicide can be "homemade" and is effective for a number of common fungus and bacterial blights and leaf spots of vegetable crops. It's also

effective as a dormant season spray to help control black rot of grapes as well as other fruit diseases. The mixture can be prepared by combining hydrated lime or any type of finely ground lime with powdered copper sulfate (sometimes referred to as "bluestone"). Both materials should be available at farm and garden supply stores. While Bordeaux Mixture can be prepared in several strengths, the most popular and effective for general home garden and orchard use is the 4-4-50 formulation. The numbers refer to the ratio of copper sulfate and lime in 50 gallons of water. To prepare a gallon amount of a 4-4-50 Bordeaux Mixture Spray, measure out 6 1/2 teaspoons of copper sulfate and 3 tablespoons of hydrated lime. The lime should be mixed with a pint of water to make a "milk of lime" suspension. The copper sulfate should also be dissolved in a pint of water. The latter process may take several minutes. Before mixing the lime and copper components of the mixture, one additional step (but a very important one!) must be carried out. Each container of these materials should be strained through a cheesecloth filter. If cheesecloth isn't available, use cloth of a similar loose weave. The filtering is necessary to remove small pieces of lime or copper sulfate that won't dissolve; otherwise, you'll find these tiny pieces in the end of your garden sprayer tip, clogging up the works. The filtered copper sulfate solution is added to a one-gallon container, followed by addition of the filtered lime solution. Enough water (about 3 quarts) is then added to the container to bring the total volume up to one-gallon. For best results, use your Bordeaux Mixture the same day of preparation and keep the sprayer agitated. Bordeaux mixture may used to control early and late blight on tomatoes and Irish potatoes. On leafy greens, this fungicide controls most of the leaf spots that commonly occur on mustard and turnips. We have a nice new publication or Organic Pest Control. 





A Holiday Homecoming

"Queenie" Comes Home After Fifteen Days in 65-Foot Well

Ah, Thanksgiving, the time where we joyfully stuff ourselves so full of turkey, dressing and the like that we can hardly walk.

A bird dog named Queenie in Tishomingo got a couple cans of Alpo and about a pound of dry food for Thanksgiving. But she's awfully thankful for it, after her recent 15-day "fast" she spent in the bottom of a 65-foot hole.

On November 9th, the 18month-old pointer was out practicing for quail season with her trainer, David Durham. She was doing fine, Durham recalled, and then she ran into a honeysuckle thicket, and he didn't see her again that day.

Or for the two weeks

Queenie's owner, Charles Black, joined Durham in the search, and they were soon joined by all the surrounding neighbors, the mail carrier, the substitute mail carrier, and eventually even loach Black's science class rudents from Tishomingo Middle School

What followed were many days of searching the area, and evenings of calling neighbors and sitting by the phone waiting for news that someone had seen Openie said Black

A break in the search finally came when Durham asked his grandfather, Ed Durham, 93, if he remembered if there may be a well on the property in east Tishomingo where Queenie was last seen. Mr. Durham saved the day when he remembered that there was indeed a very old well on the site, and showed it to David

In the middle of his school day last Monday, November 24th, Coach Black was notified by Durham that a rescue team was meeting at the well site as soon as Black finished up his bus route. When Black arrived, several people, including Larry Hill, Billy Middleton, David Durham, Herman Durham, James Cosby and DeAnna Hill were there and ready to save Queenie with a pet shipping crate hooked onto a pulley and a pickup truck.

Queenie couldn't really be seen from the top of the hole, explained Durham. She had dug out all around the bottom of the well, making herself a hiding place that eventually helped her be rescued.

The rescuers lowered a dog shipping crate, with a bowl of food in it, down into the hole, and Queenie eagerly went after the food. If it hadn't been for the hiding place she made, there wouldn't have been room for her and the crate in the hole, Durham explained.

Though she was skin and bones when she came out, said Black, she was in good health. If she hadn't been in top physical shape before her "fall," it would have been much worse, veterinarian Rocky Hughes told Black.

A week after her rescue, Queenie was in fine spirits, and her ribs were just barely visible. She's enjoying a big bowl of food every day, and private quarters at Durham's house. Her owner and trainer feel sure it won't be long until Queenie will be able to start working again, and she doesn't appear traumatized from the experience.

The well, ironically on land owned by Charles' mother, Clara Black, was filled within 24 hours of Queenie's rescue.

Queenie probably doesn't realize it, but she had a really good Thanksgiving, and her owners and friends are very relieved to have her back. Both Durham and Black expressed appreciation to everyone who helped look for and rescue Queenie.

Open Wells A Real Hazard

Open wells are something no one thinks about much, until something like this happens, but they are a real hazard in a rural county like Tishomingo, said one Department of Wildlife official.

"If you think about it, every old homeplace in this county had a well," said Department of Wildlife Conservation Officer Royce Howie. "A lot of those homeplaces just grew up (with brush), or were abandoned, so the wells may still be open."

There are a large number of hunters, especially, out in the woods and fields of the county around this time of year, and Howie urged caution.

Anyone who sees an open, unmarked, or unfilled well is urged to call a Department of Wildlife official, your county supervisor, or the property owner, so they can take action to fill or mark the well, because the next time it may not be a dog that falls in a well.

Tishomingo Baptist Church Receives Award for Evangelism

Southern Baptist Theological Seminary recently recognized a Tishomingo County church as one of the most effective evangelistic churches in the Southern Baptist Convention.

November 17th, Dr. Billy Burge, pastor at Tishomingo Baptist Church, and other representatives of the church traveled to historic Southern Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky where they recited an award not only their effectiveness in evangelism, but in retaining and discipling those reached. The award was for the year ending 1995.

About 70 churches from all over the nation were represented at the conference, according to Grady Sutton, Assistant to the Dean of the Billy Graham School of Missions, Evangelism and Growth. They each received a certificate from Dean Thom S. Rainer, and participated in a conference, "Closing the Back Door," which offered insights and information about nurturing and keeping new members.

Out of 40,000 churches in the Southern Baptist Convention, 1,700 met the qualifications for the study on which the award was based, explained Sutton.

To qualify the churches had to have at least 26 baptisms in

1995, and also have a ratio of at least 20 regular members for each baptized person.

About 350 churches of the 1,700 responded and participated in an extensive survey. Seventy of those sent representatives to the conference.

Also studied and surveyed in other phases of the same study, explained Sutton, were about 800 churches of other denominations, which provided a control element for the survey.

"When Tishomingo Baptist

Church realized that we were not a reservoir with a limited amount of resources, but a channel attached to the Unlimited Divine Resource. . God did what only He can do, Give light in darkness and exchange death for life," said Dr. Burge of the church's recent success.

Though the time period of the study roughly coincides with the first year of Burge's term as pastor at Tishomingo, he is the first to say that the whole church deserves the credit for the award.

Poinsettias Accent The Holiday Season

The United States has not been the same during the holidays since Ambassador Joel Poinset brought a plant back from Mexico in 1825. Poinsettias have become a tradition, and some new gorgeous varieties will be showing up this

Pepride is a new variety that has caught my eye. Its dark green leaves and deep red bracts are shaped like oak leaves. Freedom is

a dark red variety with dark green leaves. It is awfully hard to find a prettier poinsettia than this one.

Silver Star is another poinsettia that has garnered my attention. This variety has dark red bracts but a variegated foliage of silver and green. I also like the Sonora Jingle Bells, which has dark red bracts with white flecks, giving it a peppermint look.

Monet is my favorite pink variety. Unless you prefer red, this may be the most beautiful poinsettia ever developed. The bracts are pink with drifts of a darker pink or burgundy, giving it a painted look. Marble Star is another great pink variety with a creamy white variegation that gives it a marble look.

One myth that has hung around for years is that poinsettias are poisonous. Research at Ohio State University has proven conclusively that the poinsettia plant and its juices are not poisonous.

Poinsettias can hold their color way past Christmas if you shop wisely. The colorful part of a poinsettia are actually modified leaves known as bracts. The true flowers are the small yellow buttons in the centers of the bracts. Look for plants with fully mature, thoroughly colored and expanded bracts, and small green flower

Select plants with dark green foliage down to the soil line. This indicates a healthy root system. Reject plants with damaged or discolored foliage and select to their containers. As a rule of thumb, poinsettias should be 2 1/2 times bigger than their pots. In other words, a 15- to 18- inch-tall plant looks best in a 6-inch

Durable plants promise weeks of enjoyment. Look for strong, stiff stems, good leaf and bract retention, and no signs of wilting, breaking or drooping. Carefully inspect packaged poinsettias before purchasing them. Poinsettias left in sleeves for an extended period of time may become unhealthy.

Transport poinsettias carefully. Strong winds or short term exposure to temperatures below 40 degrees can permanently damage the plants. Use plant sleeves or large shopping bags for added protection in cold weather.

During the holidays, use the poinsettia for decorative effects. When possible, place the plant in the sunniest exposure in your home. A window that faces south, east or west is better than one facing north. Don't let the bracts touch the cold window panes, freezing outdoor temperatures can cause damage.

Your poinsettia greenhouse grown at day temperatures of 70 to 72 degrees and night temperatures of about 60 degrees. Your plant will last longer if you provide similar temperatures.


