Iuka Man Arrested In Tupelo By Vice-Narcotics Agents

An Iuka man was one of four people arrested Monday at a Tupelo motel after Lee County Vice/Narcotics agents found evidence of drugs and prostitution at the site.

Bruce T. Grosso, 47, of 67 County Rd. 274, just off Turnpike Mountain Road in the New Salem Community, and another man, David Mayes, 40, of Pontotoc, were charged with possession and conspiracy to distribute a controlled substance and misdemeanor conspiracy to commit prostitution.

Two women, Christy E. George, 27, of Pontotoc, and Jennifer R. Young, 27, of Tupelo, were charged with drug possession and misdemeanor prostitution.

Apparently the Lee County Vice/Narcotics agents responded to a call at about 1 a.m. which reported heavy activity in a motel room in the city. After investigation of the motel room, the agents found cocaine, drug paraphernalia, video equipment and a disc with X-rated pictures, according to Lee County Sheriff Harold Ray Presley.

At press time, all four remained in the Lee County Jail.

Iuka's Long-Time Cable Man, Ellis Strickland, To Retire

In Iuka, Ellis Strickland could be known as the undisputed "King of Cable Television," since he has been in that business for about 36 years now—not as a performer, but as a cable technician.

This Friday, however, will mark the end of his reign (at least in cable service) as he begins his retirement.

Actually, Ellis will still be working part time for Galaxy Cablevision in sales, but he will no longer be available to install your lines or fix any problems you might have with your service.

One cable customer said that she did not like the idea of having someone new taking over for Ellis.

"I just always knew that if I had a problem with my service, I could call Ellis and, no matter what, he could fix it," she said. "He has always been our cable man. We'll miss him. He will certainly be hard to replace."

Ellis said he began his career in the cable industry in 1963 in Iuka. He helped build the first service ever available which had between 100 and 150 subscribers and offered only five stations.

As time went on, the service passed from owner to owner, but Ellis stayed on with each new company. The local cable service is now owned by Galaxy Cablevision and has around 2,000 customers in the Tishomingo County area. Customers now enjoy 39 channels. In addition to working in Iuka, Ellis works part of the time in Red Bay, Ala. where they have about 1,200 customers.

Ellis has worked for five different companies during his career and has done about every job you can do in the business. Sometimes his job went beyond the call of duty, Ellis remarked, referring to the times he has had to get children out of trees with his bucket truck.

Ellis remembers that some of the most trying times for him as a cable employee were during the ice storm of 1994 and, more recently, the ice storm of 1998.

"In '94 it took us about three

weeks to get everybody's cable service back on," he said. "It took a lot of long hours and weekends."

He said that during the '98 storm, they worked through Christmas. He said it took about two weeks to restore cable to subscribers throughout the county.

While Ellis does plan to sell cable service to subscribers on a part-time basis, he said he is looking forward to having more time he can spend in his woodshop and gardening. Retirement will also give him more time to spend with his family, including his wife, Bonnie, his four children, eight grandchildren and his one great-grandchild, who all live in the area.

Tim Jones of Galaxy Cablevision said that it will be hard to replace someone with the dedication and know-how of Ellis Strickland.

"We will miss him," Jones said. "He is well-loved in the community. I haven't heard anything bad said about him by anyone."

Jones would like to let the area's cable customers know that they will have someone available to serve them after Ellis' retirement on Friday. At this time, however, the final decision on who will be assigned to the area permanently has not been made.

Brown Rot On Fruit Trees

Taking care of peach tree business means the home orchardist has to take care of diseases and other pests. In most years the fruit season starts with early season fungicide sprays for brown rot, since this damaging disease has to be kept in check before quality fruit can be

harvested. Brown rot is the number one disease of peaches, plums, and nectarines. The fungus responsible for brown rot attacks blossoms, twigs, branches, and ripening fruit. Most of the fungus inoculum that kicks off the disease cycle in the spring originates from an overwintering structure referred to as a "mummy". A mummy is nothing more than a dried up peach, plum, or nectarine fruit remaining from the previous season. Most mummies are loaded with brown rot fungus spores, and it is these spores that infect blossoms and other peach, plum, or nectarine susceptible tissues at the beginning of the season during periods of rainy weather. How do you remove the "curse of the mummy." Mummies should be raked from beneath trees (it may be necessary to use the rake handle to knock off a few that are still clinging to branches) and destroyed by burning or burial. Mummy removal is one of the single most important sanitation practices that can be carried out in home peach production, since it results in the removal of so much

fungus inoculum from the orchard. For a more comprehensive approach to brown

rot (fungicides to use, which to apply, how often, etc.), check with the County Extension Office.

Plan Better Forages

This is a good time for cattle producers to get the most from their cool-season grazing crops such as ryegrasses, small grains and fescue. Don't let these crops get off to a poor start. Since the main production time for forages is approaching, producers need to pay special attention. If a good stand of forage has established, they should be attuned to grazing management, nitrogen fertilization and weed control.

1. Grazing management: make sure livestock don't overgraze forages. At least 2 to 3 inches of growth with some green leaves should remain below the grazing height. Overgrazing in

cold weather can damage young grasses, thus stunting growth.

2. Nitrogen fertilization: February through early March is an appropriate time to apply nitrogen to cool-season forages. If a good stand of clover is grown with the grasses, nitrogen can be reduced. (This depends on how much nitrogen the clovers supply.)

3. Weed control: Late winter is also a good time for weed problems to arise. Weeds such as buttercup, dock and wild mustard can be easily controlled with specific herbicides. If not controlled, they often will reduce forage growth.

Pet Parenthood

Parenthood for your pet also means parenthood for you! Pet owners must share the responsibility of caring for the newcomers, especially if they become ill or have other problems with which their mother cannot cope.

Additionally, pet owners must bear the expense of additional food for the mother until the babies are weaned and, once weaned, for the newcomers as well.

Of course, there is the cost for inoculations for the new pets.

But the most important aspect of parenthood for your pet is finding good homes for each new kitten or pup.

The number of new dogs and cats born in the United States annually is staggering. Some estimates range from 2,000 to 10,000 an hour - roughly 5 to 10 times the human birth rate.

Due to this high birth rate, most animal shelters are overflowing with unwanted cats and dogs. Most agencies do well to find a home for one or two animals out of 10. Those that cannot be placed in a new home must be humanely killed.

But the fate of those animals that do not reach a shelter is even worse. They must fend for themselves and many young animals die of starvation and disease. Others are killed by automobiles, accidentally poisoned or injured by wild animals.

The alternative to this tragedy is the surgical neutering of your animal to remove certain reproductive organs.

Despite what many believe, the operation has no effect on the animal's intelligence. Most neutered pets tend to be more gentle and affectionate, become less interested in other animals and more interested in you and your family.

Drugs Affect Your Dental Health - and Your Dental Treatment

You may not have considered the impact prescription medications and even over-the-counter drugs can have on your oral health, and on the dental treatment you receive.

Informing us about your medication history and what drugs you are currently taking is essential because of dental health effects, potential side effects and possible interactions with drugs the dentist might use during treatment or prescribe.

We sometimes prescribe antibiotics with certain dental procedures. But, if you are taking oral contraceptives, be sure to let our office know. Taking tetracycline or penicillin could reduce the effectiveness of an oral contraceptive. This includes drugs often used in dentistry, such as ampicillin, amoxicillin, oxacillin and penicillin V.

If you have heart disease or a special heart condition, it is critical that we know your medical status. During dental treatment, bleeding may occur and cause bacteria from the mouth to enter the bloodstream and work its way to the heart.

This presents a risk for bacterial endocarditis, a serious inflammation of the heart valve. We can prescribe antibiotics for appropriate procedures, such as teeth cleaning, to prevent endocarditis.

Knowing what drugs to avoid in patients with medically complex conditions is also important. For example, if you have peptic ulcer disease, we will avoid prescribing drugs that irritate the gastrointestinal tract. If you are on anti-depressants or beta blockers, your doctor can reduce the amount of epinephrine used, if necessary.

A very common side effect of many drugs, such as antihistamines, antidepressants, is dry mouth. Inadequate saliva flow in the mouth can contribute to cavities and gum disease. We can help you deal with this condition.

Inform our office:

- If you have ever had an unusual reaction to any drug.
- If you are taking any prescription or over-the-counter drugs, including vitamins;
- If you are planning to have surgery with a general anesthetic in the near future;
- If you have any serious medical problems;
- If you are pregnant or breastfeeding a baby.

During power outages, here are some suggestions to assist TCEPA employees in restoring your service:

- 1) Before calling TCEPA, check your fuse or breaker box for blown fuses or tripped circuit breakers. If you don't see any, ask your neighbors if they have lost their power, too.
- 2) When you call to report an outage, be prepared to provide the name on your account, your 911 address (house and road number), and your telephone number.
- 3) In an outage during extreme cold or hot weather, turn off all major electric appliances, and heat or air conditioning. Leave a single light switch turned on so you will know when the problem is solved. Five to ten minutes after power has been restored, you may begin turning on electrical appliances and heating or cooling as necessary.
- 4) Put up a 911 address sign to help us locate you.
- 5) Turn on an outside light after power has been restored so that repair crews will know that their work has been successful.

Home Economics Tips

Plan For Low-Fat Meals

If you are like many Americans, you may be struggling to lower the fat in your diet. Use these meal planning techniques to help.

There are five major food groups. Each group provides some, but not all, of the nutrients you need. Foods in one group can't replace those in another. No single food group is more important than another - for good health, you need them all.

Within each food group, foods contain different levels of fat. It is helpful to know which foods in each of the five major food groups are the lower fat foods.

Here is a rundown on each of the five food groups indicating which foods are low in fat and ways to keep them low in fat.

Group 1: Bread, Cereal, Rice, and Pasta Group

Most of these foods are low fat. Remember, it is what you put in foods (such as butter, margarine, cream cheese, high-fat sauces) that make them high in fat, so limit the "put-ons."

Some low-fat bread choices include bagels, pumpernickel, rye, whole wheat, white, hamburger/hot dog rolls, English muffins and French bread. Low-fat cereals include cooked cereals such as oatmeal, grits, cream of wheat or cream of rice and some ready-to-eat cereals. Read the labels to be sure they are low fat.

Low-fat crackers include graham crackers and some others - check the label. Pancakes and waffles can be low-fat (read the label or make your own low-fat version).

Other low-fat choices include pasta (macaroni, spaghetti, other noodles), popcorn (with little or no oil, butter, or margarine added), pretzels, rice (brown or white), and tortillas (corn and flour - baked, not fried).

Higher fat foods from this group are biscuits, cake (unfrosted), cookies, cornbread, croissant, Danish pastries, doughnuts, some muffins, pie crusts and tortilla chips.

Group 2: Vegetable Group

Foods from this group are all low fat. Remember to watch the put-ons that can make these foods high in fat if you are not careful. Put-ons include fats used in cooking vegetables, such as bacon drippings, vegetable oils, butter, margarine, shortening and lard.

Salads also fit into this group. They are great low-fat foods, but salad dressings can make the fat (and calories) in a salad skyrocket with the flick of a wrist! Each tablespoon of regular salad dressing contains 5 to 11 grams of fat.

If you don't like salad without dressing, don't panic. There are many salad dressings on the market that are either low fat or nonfat. Read food package labels to find them.

Group 3: Fruit Group

Fruits are another group that are low fat. The exception is avocado, a fruit which is high in fat. When making fruit salads, beware of high-fat salad dressings.

Group 4: Milk, Yogurt, & Cheese Group

Low-fat foods in this group are low fat or nonfat buttermilk, cottage cheese and yogurt as well as skim milk and low-fat milk (1 percent and 2 percent).

Milk products with more fat include whole milk, cheddar and Swiss cheeses, ice cream and light ice cream. (Light ice cream, formerly called ice milk contains less fat than ice cream). There are also new low-fat cheeses on the

market. Read food package labels to find nonfat/low-fat cheeses.

Group 5: Meat, Poultry, Fish, Dry Beans, Peas and Nuts Group

Low-fat foods in this group are dry beans and peas, tofu, fish poultry and lean cuts of beef and pork. Lean cuts of eat include beef round, rump and sirloin tip, pork loin; ham; liver; leg of lamb; and all veal cuts.

Dry beans and peas (legumes) include black peas, black-eyed peas, chickpeas (garbanzos), kidney beans, lentils, Lima beans (mature), navy beans, pinto beans and split peas. They can be used in a variety of ways, including soups, stews, salads, main dishes, and as a side dish served plain.

Tofu, also known as soybean curd or bean curd, is made from

ground, cooked soybeans. It has a mild, nut-like taste, and takes on the flavor of foods with which it is combined. Tofu can be sliced, diced or mashed and used in many dishes such as soups, stir-fries, main dishes, casseroles, salads, sandwiches, salad dressings and sauces. Tofu is available in many supermarkets.

There are some foods that do not fit into the five major food groups, because they provide few nutrients and minerals, but they do provide calories. They include fats, oils, sweets and alcoholic beverages.

High-fat foods which are not included in the five major food groups are listed below. Choosing a diet that is low in fat does not mean you should never eat these foods. It's the total amount of fat in your diet that matters.

While you don't have to give them up completely, use smaller portions of these foods or use them less often to keep your meals low in fat: bacon, salt pork, butter, cream (dairy, nondairy), cream cheese, lard, margarine, mayonnaise, mayonnaise-type salad dressing, sour cream and vegetable oil.
