Home Economics Tips

Fibers For The Home Developments In Fashion, Care & Wear

With the home becoming more of a fashion environment, consumers are looking for textile furnishings that look great, wear well and are easy to care for. New developments in the fiber and fabric markets are answering these needs.

Fiber companies are creating techniques that make the outside fabric more durable and fade resistant. One trend is toward colored fibers that can be used to create yarns that are able to withstand texturizing better than down dyed fibers. Solution-dyed fibers can also be treated with UV protection. High-end fabrics created with these fibers can now make the transition from indoors to outdoors and sunrooms.

Fiber companies are also looking to improve the inside components of upholstered pieces. One problem with the soft, plump furniture is that so compatible with today's lifestyle has been its tendency to too quickly lose its loft. Recently introduced versions of Dacron

hold their plumpness longer and ensure a uniform blend of binder and base fiber.

Fabric companies are exploring new manufacturing processes that give consumers higher fashion at lower prices and impart a softer hand. A new type of finishing equipment allows the manufacturer to create a softer upholstery fabric that has the look and hand of velvet, but not the price tag. Many historically fragile fabrics, such as velvet and chenille are now warranted for colorfastness, durability, seam strength and resistance to pile pullout.

Chemical companies are refining familiar fabric finishing treatments and developing new ones to create easy-care fabrics that match today's casual lifestyle.

When applied at the mill, stain-repellent treatments such as Teflon provide the obvious benefit of a fabric that stays cleaner longer. But it also means that, when treated, lighter fabrics become more durable, thus opening up new fashion possibilities.

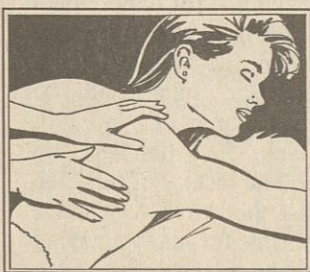


Cause and Treatment of Dry Eye

Like many other conditions, dry eye is a part of the natural aging process, although it can occur in younger people. As you might expect, dry eye occurs when the eye does not produce enough natural tear fluid. The causes can range from environmental factors like sun, wind, pollution, smoke, low humidity or a dry, arid climate. Physical problems, such as an irregular blinking pattern or medications such as antihistamines can cause dry eye. The symptoms of dry eye can be quite irritating and include redness, a burning sensation and the feeling that something is in the eye.

Dry eye cannot be "cured" unless it is caused by medication that can be discontinued, or by an infection that can be treated. Many individuals find relief from lubricating eye drops (artificial tears).

If not treated by an eyecare professional, dry eye may result in damage to eye tissue, leading to impaired vision. Dry eye also has the potential for scarring the cornea.

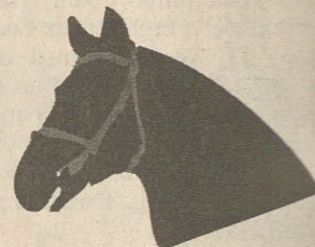

after the danger of frost has passed. Once established (one growing season) most will survive our mild climates and can be left in the ground and thinned every few weeks. It may be wise to mulch during the winter for additional protection. This applies to everything except caladiums. Plant when the soil temperature is near 70 degrees F. Dig before the first fall frost and store in a dark warm (60 degrees) place.

Buying a Horse

Buying a horse or pony can be a challenging endeavor, especially when buying your first horse. Careful planning and foresight results in a suitable horse, and a satisfying relationship between animal and rider.

The most important thing to consider is the cost that goes into keeping a horse. The amount paid for the animal is small compared the financial burden of feeding, stabling, shoeing, and medical expenses, that are required for as long as you keep the horse. You can also add in the cost of riding clothes, boots, protective hats, tack, saddles, blankets, grooming tools, and feeding and watering supplies.

You won't only spend a lot of your money, but you'll spend a lot of your time in routine maintenance. If you plan to ride your horse frequently, plan on at least one hour every day cleaning out (mucking) the stall, grooming, and feeding, outside any time spent riding. If you don't have this kind of time or money, hiring a horse from a riding school or keeping your horse at a boarding stable are some other options to consider.

Before embarking on your search, know exactly what the horse will be used for and who will be riding it. What someone needs in a competition horse isn't necessary for a horse that will be used for pleasure riding. The suitable age, breed, size, and temperament of a horse varies with the age, size, and experience of the rider. For younger or inexperienced riders, an older, well-schooled horse is a good choice, while stallions and young colts should be left to experienced horsemen.


Deciding what type, age, and size horse you need is easy. Finding one is a different story. Advertisements, auctions, and horse dealers offer a variety of seemingly good horses. As a first time buyer, avoid auctions where there little time and few facilities limit careful evaluation of the animal.

When considering a horse from a horse dealer or private owner, ask questions about his temperament, breeding, medical history, and any certificates or papers. Contact a reputable veterinarian for a pre-purchase exam. Make sure you tell the veterinarian exactly what you are looking for in the horse and who will be riding it.

Contact anyone else that has worked with the horse, including farriers, veterinarians, trainers, or other riders, so you can find out the horse's medical history and temperament from outside sources. Getting a second opinion from an experienced rider can also be helpful in making a decision about a particular horse.

Tishomingo County To Receive FSA Disaster Loan Applications

Emergency loans for farmers, ranchers, and operators are available through the Tishomingo County Office of the Farm Service Agency, Harold Mills, FSA Farm Loan Manager, said today.

Mr. Mills said this authority is pursuant to President Clinton's declaration on 01-15-99, of a major disaster in Alabama, caused by severe winter storms, ice and freezing rain that occurred from December 23 through December 29, 1998. As a result of this major disaster, Tishomingo County, as a contiguous county in Mississippi, is named as an area eligible for

Federal disaster assistance pursuant to Section 321 (a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act.

Applications for assistance in the disaster-stricken county will be accepted by FSA through 09-15-99. This designation is limited to applicants that suffered physical and production losses.

FSA Emergency Loans cover losses from designated disasters and are made to qualified farmers who cannot obtain necessary credit from other lenders in the local area.

During power outages, here are some suggestions to assist TCEPA employees in restoring your service:

- 1) Before calling TCEPA, check your fuse or breaker box for blown fuses or tripped circuit breakers. If you don't see any, ask your neighbors if they have lost their power, too.
- 2) When you call to report an outage, be prepared to provide the name on your account, your 911 address (house and road number), and your telephone number.
- 3) In an outage during extreme cold or hot weather, turn off all major electric appliances, and heat or air conditioning. Leave a single light switch turned on so you will know when the problem is solved. Five to ten minutes after power has been restored, you may begin turning on electrical appliances and heating or cooling as necessary.
- 4) Put up a 911 address sign to help us locate you.
- 5) Turn on an outside light after power has been restored so that repair crews will know that their work has been successful.

Mrs. Mamie Clark Culver

"I was thought to have whipped every child at the Iuka School," laughs retired teacher Mrs. Mamie Clark Culver. "If the truth be known, I likely whipped the fewest. I loved each and every one of the children I taught!" Clark exclaims. Everybody had Mrs. Mamie at some point if they attended Iuka during her many years of teaching. "I think they all heard things about me and did not want in my class but their parents wanted them in my class, every one of them," she comments. Mrs. Mamie Clark has had an extraordinary life for a female of this century.

She has served her community in public service as a teacher, a rural mail carrier, and public official. She is one of the most revered citizens of the county. The members of the Clark family have, for generations, served as leaders in state and local affairs while gaining the friendship and respect of people from all walks of life. Mrs. Mamie has truly touched countless lives.

She was born to Thomas and Drucilla (Hallmark) Clark in 1908. She had two sisters, Gertrude and Ruby and two brothers, James Orville "Click" and Ezekiel Candler "Zeke" Clark. Her father was a respected attorney who became the Circuit Judge for the area. He also served as the attorney for the Southern Railroad for this area. Clark was a well connected man with powerful friends and associates locally and at the state and regional level.

Mamie grew up in a loving family. They were strong and faithful Christians belonging to the Methodist Church. She recalls that whenever a visiting minister came to the Belmont area for a revival or other meeting in the church, they were hosted by the Clarks. She recalled many visiting pastors who may have only stayed for dinner or overnight to hosting them for a week.

Thomas Clark had many friends and dignitaries. Among those his home hosted was Gov. Theodore G. Bilbo. Mrs. Drucilla Clark was famous for her coconut cake. One time, while the Governor and Mrs. Bilbo were visiting, Mrs. Clark planned to serve homemade ice cream with one of these cakes for dessert. Mrs. Mamie said, "We had a man employed who did odd jobs for our family. He was told not to open the lid on the ice-cream as he turned it by hand." The story went on that when the ice cream was served, it had been opened while turning and had not been properly resealed. The rock salt

leaked into the container and ruined the ice cream. "Mama was terribly embarrassed but Mrs. Bilbo consoled her by saying there was plenty of delicious cake and that she and her husband did not give a second thought whether or not they had ice cream with the cake," Mrs. Mamie recalled.

In 1917, Thomas Clark moved his family to Iuka. Here, he was now a judge and needed to be close to the Courthouse. "Daddy loved all of us and wanted to be around his children as much as he could," she says. Though Judge Clark owned an automobile,

he hated to drive. The roads were not paved in that era, few were even gravel. "One time we were coming off of a hill and got stuck in a deep rut. It was raining and coming a flood!" Mrs. Mamie recalls. "We all got out of the car, Daddy and Click pushed while we walked to the bottom of the hill while Zeke drove the old car," she told. (Note: Zeke Clark went on to become one of the first highway patrolmen in the state of Mississippi. He graduated in the first class of troopers and went on to retire as one of the states highest ranking highway patrol officials.) Mrs. Mamie continued, "We all met at the bottom of the hill, soaking wet. All got in the car except daddy," she chuckled. She remembered him saying, "You can ride in this thing back home if you want to. I'm not going to get out and push this thing anymore, I'M WALKING HOME!"

Judge Clark was close enough to walk to work or town. He had a rail pass from being the Southern Railroad's attorney for the area, so he and his family could travel anywhere the passenger train went. He and his family took full advantage of this.

"Momma would go shopping in Memphis every other week riding up there and back on the train," said Mrs. Mamie. She says fondly, "We took a number of trips while growing up. My parents wanted us to see as much of the country as we could. We were fortunate to experience seeing new things, but Tishomingo County was always home."

The girls traveled to St. Louis, Missouri and Texas on two of the most memorable trips. "We were in sleeper cars," Mamie recalls. "Momma and Gertrude had the larger berth on the bottom while Ruby and I had the smaller berth or bunk on top." This was exciting to sleep on the rumbling train in that era. "We were small then and after about the third trip to go to the bathroom, the old porter did not bring the ladder for us to climb up and down on, he

just lifted us out of the top, one at a time and returned us up there when we came back," she happily remembered. Mrs. Thomas Clark had an eagle eye on her girls. Mamie remembers well, "Gertrude was a mature teenager by then will all kinds of suitors after her so mother REALLY had her hands full with the three of us!"

Mamie started school at the age of five. She was an outstanding student and showed her intelligence throughout her childhood. At that time, if you finished the work for one grade, such as second grade, you could then start on third grade work. The bright young girl excelled and for several years would complete two years of work in a seven month school year. She graduated Iuka High School, with honors, at age 14. Young Mamie now had to decide on what path to take, she recalls, "I could not decide where I wanted to attend college, so my father decided for me!"

In the fall of 1922, Mamie Clark enrolled in Grenada College, now part of Millsaps, in Grenada Mississippi. At age 18, she had earned her degree. She had not particularly thought about a job and had dreams of working away from the area. Her father told her that Mr. Nettles at Tishomingo County Agricultural High School in Tishomingo wanted to talk with her. "Mr. Nettles offered me a teaching position at TCAHS and I accepted," she stated.

The eighteen year old teacher was younger than many of her students. She can remember many current area residents who attended the school. "They had both men's and ladies dormitories," she said. "I recall playing tennis and attending music recitals and plays at the school. We had football, baseball and basketball games and all sorts of activities at school and

in the evening," says the former teacher. She claims there were a number of budding romances at the school that resulted in many marriages and happy marriages to follow.

Mr. Nettles approached Mrs. Clark every year asking if she wished to return so he could present the faculty list to the board. After six years, she decided to answer "no" one year. "There I was, sitting at my parents house, the Depression started and there I was without a job!" Her father, who was devoted to his family told her, "I am so glad to have you home, I will take care of you!" and for a year she helped her mother around the house and enjoyed a rest.

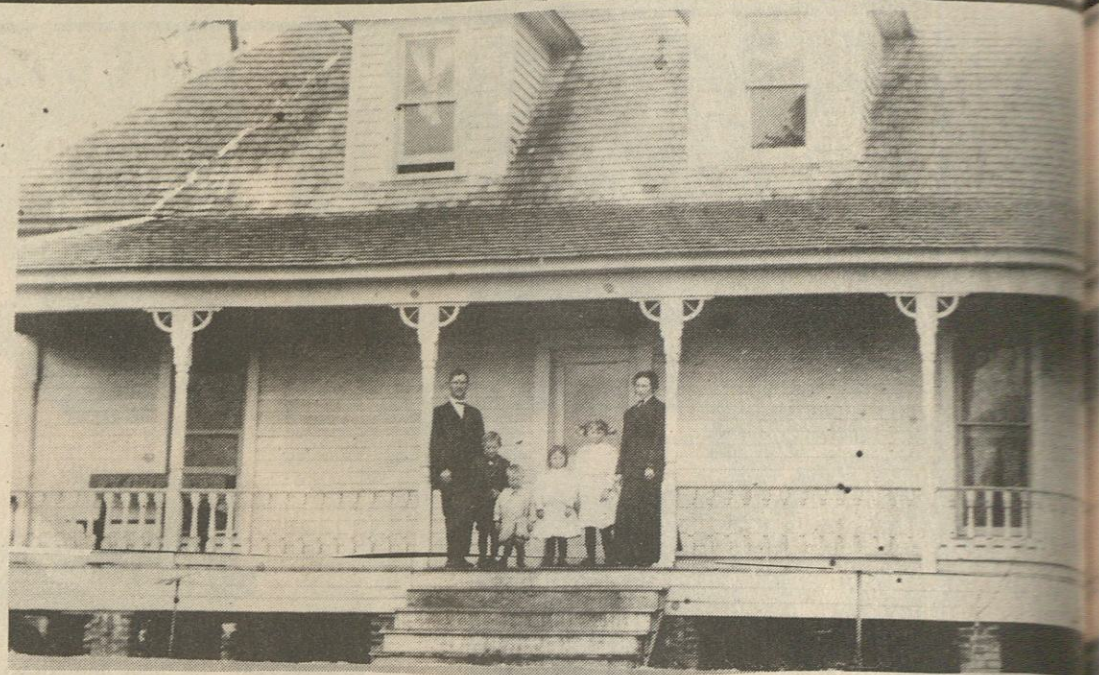
Mamie was told by Mr. Howard that there was an elementary position at Iuka School but that there were several applicants. "He said I had as good a chance as any and that I should apply," she said. She got the job and began her duties that fall. Mrs. Mamie noted, "I loved working with the little children. They heard tales about me and did not want in my class but the parents wanted them in there because they knew I would work with them and be fair."

Gene Jourdan, a former student of "Mrs. Mamie", spoke fondly of Mrs. Culver. He said, "Mrs. Mamie was an outstanding teacher and a strong disciplinarian! I was one of 'the few' who got my share of those paddlings. I admit I needed every one of them!" He recalled Mrs. Mamie being the first teacher at school every morning. Mr. Jourdan commented, "We would be waiting to play checkers with her. All of us would get into all kind of mischief before classes began but no one DARED try anything when SHE was around! We all loved and respected her, and still do."

In the 1930's, TVA set up offices in town for the various area projects that were going on such as the construction of Pickwick Dam and Reservoir and bringing electric power to the area. Mr. Dewey Culver, a TVA employee originally from Georgia, came in with the Authority. Dewey began courting the young school teacher and eventually the two married. "I was teaching at Iuka and Dewey was still working for TVA when World War II broke out. Dewey lacked only six months being too old for the draft. They drafted him anyway!" she said. Culver was assigned as a drill sergeant at Ft. Knox, Kentucky. His wife moved to Kentucky for a year to be close to him. Sgt. Culver was in poor health and was eventually discharged from the army due to it. The couple resided near Chattanooga, TN after he rejoined T.V.A. after his discharge. They had only been there a few weeks when he fell ill. "Dewey was sick one day when I went to the store for a bit. When I returned, he had suffered a heart attack and died," recalls Mrs. Culver of her husband's passing. She returned to Iuka where she again resumed teaching.

Mrs. Mamie taught at every grade level at one time or another. She also taught returning soldiers at night school so that they could finish their high school degrees. She stayed busy for several years. She laughs recalling, "Jess Oaks

used to tease me that I caused him to join the army because he couldn't recite Julius Caesar's speech in my literature class. I

would call on him every day and he never knew it. He finally up and joined the Army and told me (jokingly) it was my fault he had to sign on in the service because he knew he would never make it out of my literature class!" Zenobia Oaks said her late husband, Jess, really loved, admired and respected Mamie. Mrs. Mamie was his teacher at TCAHS in the late 1920's. After high school, he served a four year Army hitch, was recalled to service during WWII and served in the National Guard until retirement. Oh! and by the way, Mrs. Mamie, he DID get his high school diploma after all!

It was while she was working with the veterans in the early 1950's that one of her former students, a local mail carrier, urged her to take the civil service test to join the post office as a rural mail carrier. There had not been a female rural mail carrier ever in Tishomingo County. On a whim, she took the test and scored very high. A position opened up and Mamie was in competition with several men for the job. Rep. John Rankin, a close friend of her brother, "Click" Clark, asked Mr. Clark one day if he wanted his sister to have the job because her name had come up to fill an opening in competition with several men. She had scored higher but she was a woman. Click replied, "John, if she wants the job and is fairly qualified for it, I want her to have it if she wants it." So, that is how Mamie Clark Culver joined the postal service.

For about six years, Mamie Clark Culver served as a rural mail carrier in the area. It was a good job and I enjoyed it," she says of her time with the postal service. Eventually, she longed to return to teaching, which she did. "It takes hard work and dedicated people to help children and adults. It is a special calling to work in the education profession. I had to go back to what I loved!" she proudly said. She returned to the classroom again in the late 1950's. On the field of teaching, Mrs. Mamie stated, "I could not keep from going back and teaching the children. That, Chris, is a calling just like a preacher or some other field. I take it as being blessed with a gift and a calling from the Almighty Himself. Most folks couldn't or wouldn't teach!"

After over thirty-six years of teaching out of the forty-four since she had started at TCAHS, Mrs. Mamie Clark Culver retired

from teaching in August of 1970. This beloved teacher lived with her sister, Gertrude for many

years. Drucilla Clark lived with her daughters until her death. Mamie and Gertrude lived in Belmont for several years but returned to Iuka in the mid 1970's.

When a vacancy opened on the board of aldermen for the city of Iuka in 1977, a group of close friends urged Mamie to run for the spot. "I think my sister, Gertrude, had more to do with it than anybody," Mrs. Mamie laughs. Her father, Thomas, had been elected Judge and had some political experience in his day. Her brother, Click Clark, had been elected to both the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Mississippi Senate. He made an unsuccessful bid for the position of Lieutenant Governor of the State.

She campaigned hard for the position. Though there had been a few women elected to county offices before this time, no woman had served on the Iuka Board of Alderman. On the night before the election, a strong wind blew a tree into the living room of Mrs. Culver's Iuka home. She says she called and summoned help from the Iuka Fire Department and Police Department. She laughs, "While the boys were securing the house and doing their paperwork, I reminded each of them to vote for me in the election the next day!" It must have worked because the next day, Mamie Clark Culver was elected to the Board of Aldermen as the first female to serve in this capacity. She served two terms from 1977-1985.

Former Mayor John Biggs, a dear friend and former student describes "Miss Mamie" as being very dedicated and conscious about the city's business while in office. She took a stand, followed her beliefs, and never backed down on an issue. It was a pleasure to serve with her. She took her position seriously and still had a wonderful sense of humor. We had some great times over the years.

Iuka Mayor David Nichols said, "Mrs. Mamie is an extraordinary individual who has blessed our community by her dedication and service to all." He further notes, "She is loved by everyone, especially me!"

"Mrs. Mamie is a local treasure!" current alderwoman Beth Davis exclaimed. In gratitude, she said, "I celebrate her life and particularly appreciate her gifts to Iuka in her capacity as our first alderwoman." Davis, who also at one time served as a rural mail

carrier, feels Mrs. Mamie was a pioneer for local twentysix women. "She has affirmed and encouraged me. I value her and experience."

At ninety years of age, Mamie is still alert and active. After her sister, Gertrude, passed away a few years ago, Mamie brought in a faithful companion to keep her company. She doesn't know what I would do without my little dog, Prissy. She is right there with me. She loves to be scratched and attention. "She is a loving dog but she won't leave me alone. I will bark if anyone comes near. She is my faithful companion and said of her best friend."

She never forgets her students. "I loved every one and have them scattered all over the place. I told them to Tinbuck Tu I reckon," she didly remarked. One of her students who left Iuka, teenager recalled the time Mrs. Mamie when the mother passed away several years ago. Virginia Merrill, who has daughters Ruby and Olive, all in Iuka, said, "Mamie as their teacher home when their mother died. Several of them had not been but for an occasional visit leaving the small town. I don't know if anyone would have known if anyone would have been in us," said Virginia. They laughed, "Unexpectedly, she was around in the funeral home. I saw Mrs. Mamie coming and I hugged each one of us and she just wanted to come home. I forget the love she showed us. The fact that even after all these years, she never forgot us."

After I began this series of articles, Mrs. Mamie sent me one of the most requested items to cover. Even though I had a student of the legendary To I have known her most of my life. She was my friend and her knowledge can see through all the stories to share of her, that and still is a "special person."

Many people remember her in different ways, as a neighbor, a mail carrier, a teacher from church or community functions. Others, like me will remember her for all these things. Any as for being a friend and importantly, she has a place in our area's history and science as a true "HERO".

Last week Mrs. Minnie Scruggs of Iuka wrote expressing her appreciation for the story about Uncle Tom and Aunt Josie Sprouse by Inez Johnson of Byron, Georgia. Following is her letter in its entirety: "I want to say how much I enjoyed the article about Uncle Tom and Aunt Josie Sprouse. I had heard of mother Willie Mae Linton Honeycutt speak of them but never much about them. Emma Sprouse, Tom's sister, was born January 26, 1872, in Ala. and died December 1893. She married Dempsey Honeycutt on December 7, 1893. He was born January 6, 1866 and died May 24, 1936. My father Kendrick Honeycutt was born December 30, 1893 and died January 1954. He married Willie Mae Smith on April 29, 1933. She was born August 12, 1909 and died September 9, 1992. Carol Kendrick Honeycutt was the only child of Emma Sprouse and Dempsey Honeycutt. Emma died when Carol was born. Anyway, when mother and father married they were by Uncle Tom and Aunt Josie a couple of years. Mother had a real bad from the land being there at Doskey. My dad bought from mother's side of family and moved to Iuka about 2 miles west of Iuka. Mother went to Burnsville to Aunt Josie but I can't remember my sister would take her. I remember a lot of times mother saying that she wished she knew where to go to New Salem Cemetery. Emma's, she would put a marker for dad died when I was only 16. I never got down there before and just had the mules and wagon and in. If you have anything on the subject or would send this lady in my address, I would sure appreciate it. Had a wonderful conversation and told me more about my Aunt. She has pictures of her and Tom. She had lost contact with Patterson and had been searching for several years. I gave her address. After talking about our Happy Hollow and Doskey, we got together later this week, she has promised to write about memories for "Traces". ANOTHER CONNECTION IS!! Several days ago I received following "Thank You" from Harry, 138 Parkway, Montgomery, Texas 77356. Thank you so much for placing for my grandfather Howard G. Sr. Some cousins saw the ad mailed it to family in Arlington. Mother had brother that we never

knew about. We will be meeting him soon. He has the genealogy on the Sanders which he will be sharing with me. Thanks again for being kind enough to help. It has been a blessing. God bless you. I will send you a picture of our meeting. I am still searching for Browns, my grandmother's side. I have confirmed it was the Omar J. Bullen family that she lived with. Take care. Donna. It is indeed gratifying to know that families are being reunited
