## Iuka Civil War Site On National Funding List

National Civil War Preservationists gathered in Iuka, Mississippi on Thursday, April 15th to discuss funding for Iuka's Civil War Battlefield. The visiting group consisted of Paul Bryant, Jr., Tuscaloosa, Alabama, Vice Chairman Association for Preservation of Civil War Sites; Jim Lighthizer, Annapolis, Maryland, Vice Chairman Civil War Trust; and John D. Haynes, Baldwin, Mississippi, Chairman of Government Affairs APCWS. Officials met with Iuka Mayor David Nichols, Nick Phillips, Hayden Ables, Harold Lomenick and Charles Sweeney.

Iuka was recently designated as one of 24 sites in America to divide \$8 million in federal funding. Federal funds, however, must be matched with state and local funding to acquire battlefield property by June 2000. The specific federal funding was obtained through the efforts of Senator Trent Lott and Congressman Roger Wicker of Mississippi. This funding is only available for non-federal sites, which are outside of current national park boundaries.

Bryant stated, "We look forward to working with Tishomingo County officials and citizens to help secure additional

funding to preserve its Civil War sites." Possible funding sources include State of Mississippi, national interests such as APCWS, and Civil War Trust, and local contributions. "The two national organizations look forward to working closely with Iuka and Tishomingo County over the next 15 months to preserve this national landmark," Lighthizer added.

Iuka could also benefit from the statewide Civil War Trail's Proposed grant, which is being reviewed by the Mississippi Department of Transportation. The State of Mississippi funded \$1,000,000 for state-wide trails and if the grant is approved, it would allow some interpretation and signage for Iuka battlefield sites.

"The economic impact of Civil War tourism is one important benefit of preservation. The Iuka sites, coupled with the Corinth Civil War sites and the new Brices Crossroads Battlefield in Baldwin, will attract thousands of additional tourists in Northeast Mississippi each year. These sites, developed together as one regional trail, will help to capture a portion of the ten million tourists who visit Civil War sites each year," Haynes added.

### Summer Youth Employment Training Program To Begin

Northeast Mississippi Community Services, Inc. would like to invite disadvantaged youth to participate in the summer youth employment training program.

This program provides low-income youth ages 14-21 with meaningful job skills training and allow them to earn an income to offset their financial short falls. Many times this program provides positive role modeling for other youth in the household.

Seventy five percent of the youth participating in the 1999 SYEPT will be concurrently enrolled into work experience, 20 hours per week and remediation classes for 20 hours per week. Only 25 percent of the youth will be allowed to work 40 hours per week. This program is a seven week training program. It will begin on June 14, 1999 and end on July 23, 1999. Participants will be paid \$2/hr for each hour of classroom time and \$5.15 per hour for work experience.

## Alcorn County Drowns Near Old Steel Bridge

An Alcorn County resident drowned Sunday afternoon in an area of Pickwick Lake in Tishomingo County.

Roger D. Melton, 47, was pronounced dead around 4:30 p.m. Sunday after his body was recovered from about 7 ft. deep water near the Old Steel Bridge at Yellow Creek, a section of Pickwick Lake.

Apparently Melton was swimming with a 6-year-old boy about 30 feet from the bank when he began yelling and went under, according to witnesses at the scene. The boy was retrieved from the water, but Melton could

not be found.

Wildlife Officer Rick Cornelison explained that he was in the Old Steel Bridge area when he was called to where Melton went down. He dove into the water and attempted to locate him, but was unsuccessful. A diver was called in to find the body.

An autopsy indicated that the cause of death was indeed drowning, Tishomingo County Coroner Dale White confirmed.

Melton, a native of Fort Worth, Texas, was a veteran of the Vietnam War. He was buried in the Corinth National Cemetery.

## Iuka Middle School Principal Benny McClung Takes Position In Saltillo

After 21 years as an educator, coach and administrator in Tishomingo County, Iuka Middle School Principal Benny McClung will be leaving the school district for a position as principal at Saltillo Elementary School.

McClung began his career in the Tishomingo County school

system at Tishomingo High School where he taught history and coached baseball and football for four years. He then moved to Iuka High School where he was assistant principal and basketball coach for nine years. McClung has held his position as principal at IMS for the past eight years.

McClung said he will continue his duties at IMS as usual until the end of the school year which includes ordering textbooks, working on schedules, etc. for next year. He will begin his duties at Saltillo on July 1.

"This will be my first job with kids in K-5," McClung said. "I really enjoy working with younger children."

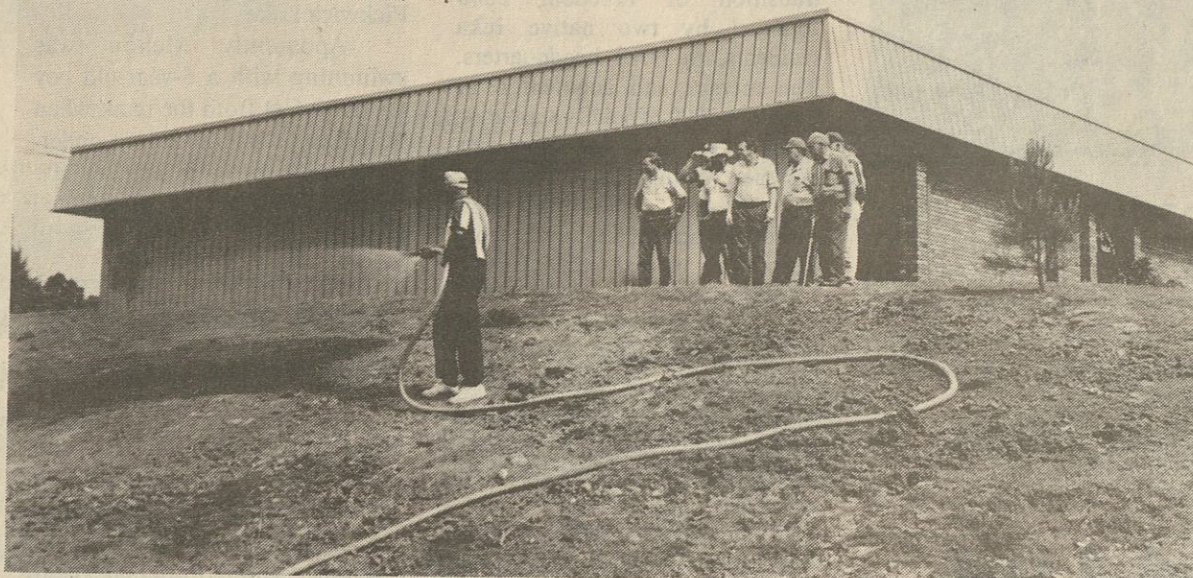

**Tishomingo County SWCD Demonstrates Hydro-Seeding**—In May of 1998 the Tishomingo County Soil & Water Conservation District (SWCD) began discussing a working agreement with Tennessee Valley Authority/Clean Water Initiative Representatives Lee Hill and Richard Starkey. District Conservationist Phil Purvis submitted proposals to develop Best Management Practices on croplands, pasturelands and woodland tracts with a monitoring system to evaluate results and Non-Ag Quality Treatment Plans for critical area road bank stabilization. The District voted to accept the proposals in June of 1998 with a cost share ratio of 60/40 with time and use of equipment counted as "in kind". In the picture above Mr. Lee Hill is "hydro-seeding" the eroding road bank beside the District Office located at 240 Kaki Street in Iuka. This demo-project will reduce soil erosion and improve the appearance. The bank was sown using a mixture of selected seeds, lime, mulch, and fertilizer, dispersed in a high-pressure stream of water. This application dries into a firm matrix that minimizes soil erosion and promotes revegetation. The matrix retains its form despite rewetting. Plants are able to grow up through the matrix, but the matrix will retain its protective formation. Those present for the demonstration were District Commissioners Jim Carson and Sherrell Umfress, District Clerk Barbara Shook, Tishomingo County Supervisors Dale Price, Arlie South, and David Sanders, Natural Resource Conservation Service Representatives Phil Purvis and L.C. Taylor, and TVA/CWI Representatives Lee Hill and Richard Starkey. The District would like to thank the City of Iuka for preparing the site for the demonstration and for providing the water hose to fill the hydro-seeder tank. Iuka is always anxious to assist in projects that will protect our natural resources and beautify the city. The District would also like to thank Richard Starkey for bringing Tishomingo County to TVA's attention. He is a native of the county. Without the 60/40 funding from TVA the projects would not have been possible. This was the first time a hydro-seeder had been used in Tishomingo County. Thank you, TVA.

## Your Dental Health



### Bonding: The Dental "Face-Lift"

Even perfectly healthy teeth can look less than perfect. Unsightly stains resulting from coffee, tea, tobacco or certain childhood medication; front-tooth gaps, accident induced cracks or chips, these are just a few of the cosmetic malades that can afflict otherwise sound teeth and mar overall appearance.

But now, thanks to a relatively quick, painless procedure called bonding, dentistry can do for your teeth what a health club can do for your physique.

Bonding works its cosmetic miracles with the aid of plastic and ceramic substances called composite resins. "Painted" on by a dentist, and then hardened, sculpted and polished, the tooth-colored resins produce bright, shapely grins where craggy, dingy ones once lurked.

The simpler procedure of crowning or capping preserves tooth structure, but reduces a tooth in size to accommodate the cap. With no drilling, bonding generally requires no anesthesia. Bonding isn't the answer for everyone, however, and the procedure has its drawbacks. It doesn't last as long as a cap and usually needs periodic touch-ups.

If you smoke or drink lots of coffee or tea, bonded areas can stain. If unshapely teeth are crooked or crowded enough, then braces might be warranted, not merely bonding's cosmetic cover-up.

In short, although bonding has some limitations, it can also mean a transformation from drab to shiny, irregular to even. Of course, professional advice - which we'll be more than happy to give - will help you decide whether bonding is the best solution for you.

### Eye Protection for Sports

Good visual skills are important, no matter what you happen to be doing, work or at play, but your eyes need protection, especially in high speed sports like tennis and racquetball. For instance, a racquetball often travels up to 60 miles per hour. If it hits an eye, it can cause severe or permanent vision damage.

Eye injuries can also occur when a player is hit by an opponent's or teammate's racket during the course of play. There are several types of protective goggles available in sports eyewear to choose from, and they should be worn any time you step on a court. Ordinary eyewear will not give you the protection you need. Low quality sports goggles may give you a false sense of security.

Sports protective eyewear recommended by optometrists consist of sturdy, impact-absorbing frames and industrial strength, impact-resistant lenses. Knowing your eyes are fully protected will leave you free to concentrate on other aspects of your game.



### The Dental Corner

It takes a little time, but by age three, 8 out of 10 dogs show some signs of gum disease (gingivitis). This disease is the first stage of periodontal disease. Here's how the disease progresses and what you can do to help prevent it:

Plaque is a sticky film of bacteria that covers tooth surfaces. The bacteria attack the gum tissues (gingivitis), causing infection (gingivitis). The gums may become swollen, painful and bleed easily.

If the area is not cleaned, gingivitis gets progressively worse and the supporting tissues that hold the tooth in place are destroyed. This leads to oral pain, discomfort, reluctance to eat and eventually tooth loss. In small dogs with very little jaw bone, this infection can even contribute to jaw fractures.

To help prevent your pet from being affected by gingivitis or periodontal disease, see your veterinarian regularly for dental checkups. Your veterinarian will examine the mouth of your pet and provide any necessary treatment. But that's just the first step. To control the plaque bacteria, you must continue to maintain your pet's oral health at home, which may include regular brushing of your pet's teeth. Your veterinarian may also recommend a food from Hill's called Prescription Diet Canine t/d. This dog food helps reduce plaque, stain and tartar.

## April 19th, your Mississippi area code may be changing to 662.

Northern Mississippi needs phone numbers. Numbers for the kids, numbers for the office, numbers for pagers, faxes, and cell phones. And don't forget about computer modems. Each one needs a number, and there are only so many to go around. It's just a mathematical fact. So to open up a few million more, northern Mississippi is getting a new area code: 662. If your area code is currently 601 and your phone number begins with any of the prefixes below, 662 will be your new area code.

On April 19, 1999, a portion of Mississippi will be assigned the new 662 area code. Then, through April 30, 2000, you can dial 601 or 662 to make long distance calls to or within northern Mississippi. After this transition period is over, only the new 662 area code can be used to complete calls to and within the 662 area. Local calling rates will not be affected.

Please make a note of 662 and begin preparing for the change. You may need to reprogram telecommunications equipment like speed dialers, fax machines, PBXs - virtually anything that dials numbers automatically (consult your vendor if you're not sure). And if you live in northern Mississippi, be sure to let friends and loved ones know that your area code is changing.

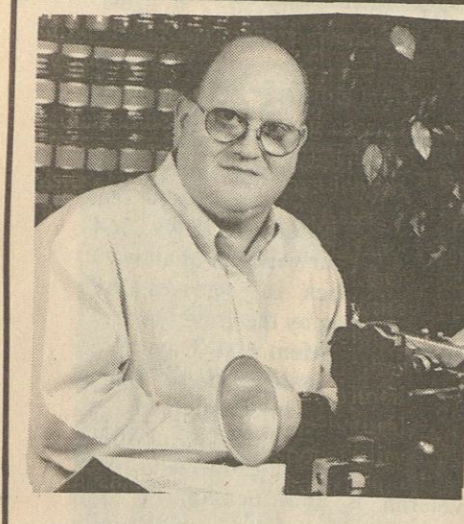

## An Angel Among Us - Edna Earl Tapp

"I BELIEVE THERE ARE ANGELS AMONG US . . ." rings the chorus of a song by the group Alabama. In the video to the tune are unsung heroes who have made a difference in the lives of others for their unselfishness, courage and compassion. Lives can be touched with as little as a kind word, a hand to hold or just a warm caring smile. For over twenty-five years, if a child or an elderly person needed assistance from the Tishomingo County Health Department, they were usually touched by the hand, heart and smile of a very special earthly angel . . . Mrs. Edna Earl Daugherty Tapp.

"Earl and I were just teenagers when we married," said Nancy Daugherty, Edna Earl's mother. "She reflected, 'I was only seventeen when we married and just over a year later we had our first sweet little girl, Edna Earl!' The first born of the Daugherty children, Edna Earl was as much a sister to her young mother throughout her life as a loving and devoted child. Mrs. Nancy smiles when she said sincerely, 'Edna Earl was more than a daughter and closer than a sister, she has always been my friend!'"

This sentiment was not only shared by her mother, she was also very close to her Dad, Earl Daugherty. At a very young age, she enjoyed hunting and being outdoors with her father. She always made her dad happy with a sweet smile. Edna Earl was a friend to everyone.

From an early age, this lady dedicated herself to taking care of others. She was close to her baby sister, Dennie, and always looked out for her "baby sister". Later, a baby brother completed the family. The eldest sister helped her mother by taking care of the young ones. Whether in helping with her siblings or the other young cousins or neighborhood kids, Edna Earl was a natural leader and took responsibility from an early age without being asked or told. "I never had to worry about my children or anyone else's children when Edna Earl was around," says Mrs. Daugherty. "She was my eyes, ears and many times, my right arm!"

Edna wrote of her brother and sister with fond memories looking back as an adult. From "A SISTER'S LOVING TOUCH" she writes, "My baby sister, how I wish I could see you every minute and wish you lived in the house next door. You have been gone from me too much-NOT YOUR FAULT-JUST LIFE! Even though you have been gone, I have depended on you when times got tough and you have been there for me!"

Her baby brother Butch, held a special place in her life as a child that grew into a special brother-sister love as an adult. Of Butch, she set her thoughts to paper by a passage titled, "A BABY BROTHER GROWS UP TO BE MY ANCHOR". She wrote of him, "You are such a fine good person! I worry about you because you worry so much. I want your life to be full of love and laughter and want everyone to fuss and pamper over you because you deserve it!"

You are the first one I think of in emergencies and run to for help. Just promise to be there for me and share your strength and

goodness with me." It is evident that this sister always had enough love to go around and evidently, it came back ten fold!

"Edna Earl had many loved ones that she cared for almost as much as Dennie and Butch," said Mrs. Daugherty. One of these was her first cousin, Charlotte Biggs McVay. Charlotte, an only child, looked up to Edna Earl as the others in the family did. Edna wrote of Charlotte years later, "Charlotte, my first cousin and 'almost sister', she has been in my life forever. We have been busy with our lives and never had time to be together as I would have liked but we have shared happy, happy times and a few bad times. I hope I have been there for her when times were tough and I've called on her 'just to talk'."

She once said, "I thought I had a million friends, now I think that must have been TEN MILLION!" From a young girl to a grown woman, she gave herself as a confidant, a leader and most of all as a friend. Full of wonder and childlike curiosity, Edna Earl reached out into the world with both hands grabbing boldly at the world.

This was a trademark of the girl as she grew. The pretty little girl was smart as a whip! She excelled in school and in her many interests. She joined the church at an early age and dedicated her life to her Savior. She was active in many school and community activities through her adolescent years. She was a leader in school, even an honor student! She was crowned Little Miss Iuka, a title Dennie later earned. Behind the glowing eyes and ever present smile beat the heart of an ambitious, motivated and dedicated young woman.

In 1966, Edna Earl graduated from Iuka High School and entered the nursing program at

Northeast Community College. She was a model student and excelled in her classwork. She couldn't wait to get into the hands-on caregiving of patients. The human contact of the nursing profession is not taught in the classroom. Edna Earl was a natural born "caregiver". When I use this term, it does not apply to those who provide physical aid and comfort to the sick and needy, it also includes the ministering of emotional needs that can be as vital to a patient's recovery as any drug. A smile, a kind word and again, a warm hand was given to countless patients over the career of this special nurse.

Edna Earl graduated from the Northeast Nursing Program. She worked in the health field before taking a permanent position with the Tishomingo County Health Department. She quickly found her desire to help people fulfilled. Children came to know her as the kind lady who gave them their shots. Adults trusted her with their children and their own health needs. Edna Earl was eventually promoted to Nurse Coordinator for the Tishomingo County Health Department.

Throughout her career, Edna continued to serve as an example to her coworkers of what a nurse was supposed to be. She expected the same high standards of the entire health department staff that she set for herself . . . NOTHING BUT THE BEST WOULD DO!"

She loved her job and the people she worked with. Edna Earl wrote of them, "As I look back, I continue to realize what a great bunch I work with. They are my second family. We spend more daylight time together than we do with our real families. We work together like a well oiled machine."

Over the years, we've shared births, deaths, marriages, divorces, husbands, in-laws, children, grandchildren, joys, sorrows, worries and delights." It is quite apparent the strong bond this county coordinating nurse had with her staff. She garnered respect and admiration from those

who knew her at her professional best!

No matter what Edna Earl did, she pushed herself to be the best she could be. She was a tireless reader, with an unquenchable thirst for knowledge in many areas. She loved history and traced her own family genealogy in great detail. "Mrs. Daugherty recalls, 'Edna Earl would come in all the time with a new story or information on the family and just say 'MOMMA! SIT DOWN AND LISTEN . . .!' and she would have me as excited about the news

as she would be!'"

Edna Earl was proud of her heritage. She organized the Chief Daughters of The American Revolution. She was Organizing Regent spearheading the establishment of this group. This organization remains strong through her initiative and strong dedication to the group. She was also a member of the John Marshall Stone Chapter of the Daughters of the Confederacy. Edna Earl was also a past president of the Twentieth Century Club from 1978-1980. Work and social activities were always an important part of Edna Earl's life, but no matter how busy or involved she was with anything else, her family was first and foremost in her mind and heart.

Edna Earl and Dale Tapp were married in 1969. Together, they raised four fine men. They have always been involved in every facet of the lives of their children. Her husband, Dale, and her sons Derrick, Glenn Earl, Jon Denver, and Nicholas were the sun, moon and stars that she loved and cherished. Edna Earl once wrote of daughter-in-law, Nicki, poetically, "Though I never had my daughter, I was granted four fine sons and even if I wished for it, I couldn't hope for finer ones. I guess I'll have to ponder on the good and bad of fate and be grateful for the daughter who's my oldest son's life-mate."

Along with their sons, the Tapps supported nieces, nephews and cousins in all of their various activities. She was very fond of her nephews Chris and Chad Daugherty as they grew up with her own sons. From another of her poems, she stated, "Even though I didn't grow them, I give that credit to my brother Butch and Debbie, his wife. These two special nephews have a place in my heart that will always be in my life."

Also special in her life was

Jessica Hayley McVay - A Girl! She wrote, "I called you Jessica Hayley McVay - A Girl so long you thought it was your name." Hayley was the first girl to arrive after six boys, and cousin Jon gave her this special name. She was Edna's "little angel from above", the daughter of cousin Charlotte, and granddaughter of special aunt and uncle Daisy and Johnny.

No matter how tired she was from work, Edna Earl never missed a baseball game or school event involving her sons. Armed with a bag of peanut M & M's and cheering until she lost her voice, this mom smiled with pride if either of her boys struck out or hit a home run!

Edna Earl took on other interests as well in her "spare time". (Wherever she found it is a real mystery to me!) From an early age Edna Earl showed a flair for poetry and other writing skills. She was published in a national anthology of poetry. One of her works titled, "My Angel" comes from an interesting personal experience with an angel!

The story goes that Edna Earl had gone through surgery but was not heavily medicated and totally aware of her surroundings when a figure appeared at the foot of her bed. It was a young woman with a glow about her. The presence did not frighten her but to the contrary seemed to be there as a comfort to Edna Earl. Awake the entire time, she experienced a peace as if somebody was looking over her with love and deep concern.

The spirit hovered with a hand near the bed rail. Edna Earl waited until the spirit disappeared before she reached out for the rail where the entity's hand had been. The rail was warm at that spot. It was cool every other place but in that spot. She pondered all these things and stayed wide awake contemplating the things she had just witnessed.

She told family members what had happened and it was dismissed as a post operative dream, though Edna Earl fully knew what she had seen. A week after she returned home, a cousin brought a picture of Edna Earl's grandmother to the home. It was a wedding picture taken when the silver hair lady she remembered as "Bobo" was a beautiful young bride. In wide eyed amazement Edna Earl stared at the picture and exclaimed, "THAT'S HER! THAT'S MY ANGEL!"

Word quickly spread through the family and other pic-

tures of the young woman were shown to Edna Earl. There was no doubt in her mind that the angel watching over her was someone who had always loved her and was there to watch over her at a time when she needed comfort and security the most.

In light of this experience, Edna Earl took pen to paper and wrote of her visitor in a poem:

### "MY ANGEL"

Angels live in heaven and look down on us below  
They play in fluffy billowing clouds and cast a golden glow  
They are capable of ending pain and stopping all of this earth's sorrow

But they await a high command that may come today or tomorrow  
A command to spread their wings on high and fly to our domain  
For someone they once loved on earth is about to suffer pain  
We each have a guardian angel, but only when the need is enough  
She doesn't stay around for little things, just when it's really tough  
We can't will her to come or to stay no matter how hard we try  
For when she's done her job on earth, back to heaven she must fly  
I never believed in angels 'till I needed one of my own  
Then I saw her smile and felt her warmth then I sang a thankful song  
For she was sent to be with me that long dark painful night  
To let me know she loved me and that God would

try to make things alright.  
I have not seen her form again  
I feel her with me night and day  
So to those who seek to save  
heaven's helping hand,  
I only wish to say  
Thanks to our creator  
watches from above  
Thanks for sending me an angel  
carry His healing love  
Lately I saw a sign on a billboard

The year 2000 computer problem, or Y2K as it is commonly known, is an issue that almost all businesses face as we near the Year 2000. Tishomingo County Electric Power Association is no exception. We are preparing for Y2K by taking a positive approach to analyzing, modifying, and testing critical computer applications and devices that are controlled by computer chips or processors that may be affected.

Tishomingo County Electric Power Association has developed a plan to address this problem. We have conducted an inventory of automated systems, including computer hardware, computer software, communication systems, embedded chips and key service vendors. The critical components identified through this process either have been or will be remediated in time for the new millennium. In addition, we have also requested certification of readiness from our vendors to determine the status of critical systems and we are requiring that current and future purchases be compliant. TVA as our power supplier has and continues to implement a comprehensive Y2K review and remediation plan. Finally, TVA and Tishomingo County Electric Power Association are in the process of developing a contingency plan so that we can resume normal operations in the event of a system failure.

We believe our distribution facilities will be capable of operating without significant interruption caused by the transition into the next century.
