

ready after being the 260th overall pick in the 8th round draft by the Chicago Cubs on Wednesday,

Dustin graduated Tuesday, June 1, from D.W. Daniel High School in Clemson, SC, where he was a standout pitcher. With a young staff backing him, Pate posted a 7-4 record with a 1.62 ERA. He went on to strikeout 83 batters in 65 innings pitched, while surrendering just 17 walks.

Mark Russo, a scout for the Cubs, stated that size was only part of what marked his interest in Pate. "He also had a good body as a pitcher, with good arm action, not to mention, he was all bon the mound," said Russi

All his life Dustn. dreamed of this day. "It was like a dream come true. It was pretty exciting when I got the call", said

The decision to play professional ball was not made in haste; Dustin gave much thought and consideration to his future. "It took a lot of thought", said Pate." I know I will have a lot of responsibility living on my own, but I think it's worth it to play professional baseball".

# **luka Airport Board Given Authority** To Expand Runway To 9,000 Ft. To **Accommodate Corporate Aircraft** Expansion Will Aid In Industrial Development Of County

While Tishomingo County can offer potential industries looking to locate in the county excellent locations and access to water transportation, railways and highways, the county is lacking one essential element that is required by most all large industries of today—an airport which is able to accommodate their corporate aircraft.

Now, with the passage of a new resolution by the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors, this deficiency can be remedied under the direction of the Iuka Airport Board.

In a recent resolution adopted by the Board of Supervisors, the five-person luka Airport Board was given the authority to "regulate, maintain and oversee the operation of the airport."

With this authority vested in the Airport Board, they may now apply for grants which will help provide the money needed to get engineering done, purchase land for expansion of the runway and actually expand the runway to the length needed so that any industry wanting to locate within Tishomingo County will be able to fly in and out without problems.

In remarks filade at a June 1 meeting of area leaders and Supervisors of districts one, two and three, Airport Board Chairman Dr. Kelly Segars stated that the county would be eligible to receive money from the state, as well as federal assistance, if the Airport Board were given the authority to apply for it. This money could then be used to expand the existing runway's 3,200 ft. length to the 9,000 ft.

needed to accommodate commercial air traffic. Presently, any industry who wants to view industrial sites in the county must fly into the Corinth airport in Alcorn County and make the lengthy drive into Tishomingo County, an inconvenience which deters many prospects. Segars pointed out that since Corinth's airport board expanded to accommodate corporate jet aircraft, their industrial park has grown to include 61 industries and 14,640 jobs with companies such as World Color, Intex. Kimberly Clark, Caterpillar, etc.

Segars said that among one of the first questions asked by potential tenants, many of them leaders of multi-million dollar corporations, looking to locate in this county is "do you have an airport where we can fly in our people or fly out our products?"

The first priority of the Iuka Airport Board, made up of members Dr. Kelly Segars, Jack Thorne, O.C. Nelson, Jimmy Pyle and David Murrah, is to acquire the land needed for the runway First District expansion. Supervisor Dale Price reported land acquisition of approximately 45 acres is already underway by the county at the north end of the existing runway. After the needed land is acquired, engineering of the site will need to be done.

"We need to get this done as quickly as possible," Segars said. "At this time, we have multimillion dollar industries wanting to locate here. The county cannot afford to loose these. However, they require an airport with a runway that is adequate to accommodate their needs.

The most recent session of the grand jury in Tishomingo County has had the Sheriff's Department busy picking up suspects who must now plead or go to court for the charges against

At press time, 12 persons had been brought in by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department on capias (arrest warrants) requested by the grand jury and issued by the Circuit Clerks office. Approximately 20 more are scheduled to be arrested, according to Sheriff David Smith.

When a capias is issued, that means that the grand jury found sufficient evidence in the case to take it to court, Smith said.

Baked To Perfection When the editor of a leading

gourmet cooking magazine set out to test a variety of baking sheets, the results were quite interesting. The same cookies were baked on three types of sheets - insulated sheets, sheets with sides and sheets without sides. Nonstick sheets were included in each category. The outcome showed that high cost is not necessary related to high

For easy cookie removal. insulated baking sheets turned out to be the most satisfactory. Cleanup, however, was more difficult. Cookie sheets with sides produced the most evenly baked cookies, but the resulting product was a little dry. Sheets without sides performed similar to the insulated ones, but the cookies tended to be a bit too brown.

Regardless of category, lighter and shinier baking sheets consistently produced moist, golden cookies. Cookies baked on sheets with darker coatings were a darker color and had a less soft texture.

### **Detecting Color Deficiencies**

Amazingly, many colorblind people don't realize they have any difficulty at all. It is, however, possible to test for color blindness, although it requires a professional to interpret the test result., since color vision defects may be mild, moderate, or severe.

The most widely used test employs charts that contain numbers (or other familiar figures, like a question mark) represented by dots of various tints. These dotted numbers or figures are set on a background amid dots of the same size but of tints that people with color-vision deficiencies most often confuse with those of the figures.

Individuals with colorvision problems typically are unable to see any numbers or patterns on some of the plates, or they see ones different from those identified by persons with normal color-vision.

Statistically, men are overwhelmingly more apt to be color blind than women. In our total population, about 8 percent of men have color vision problems and less than 1 percent of women.

Devotional: "The Light of the Gospel" 2 Corinthians 4:3-4. Verse 3. An unselfish ministry. But if our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are lost. Hid means to cover or veil the bride. The Gospel is hidden from some men because they have wishfully closed their eyes to it. If the heart of any man who hears the Gospel is veiled it is definite that he is lost and fully under the power of sin and Satan. ### Y2K READINESS DISCLOSURE PURSUANT TO PUBLIC LAW 105-271

The year 2000 computer problem, or Y2K as it is commonly known, is an issue that almost all businesses face as we near the Year 2000. Tishomingo County Electric Power Association is no exception. We are preparing for Y2K by taking a positive approach to analyzing, modifying, and testing critical computer applications and devices that are controlled by computer chips or processors that may be affected.

Tishomingo County Electric Power Association has developed a plan to address this problem. We have conducted an inventory of automated systems, including computer hardware, computer software, communication systems, embedded chips and key service vendors. The critical components identified through this process either have been or will be remediated in time for the new millennium. In addition, we have also requested certification of readiness from our vendors to determine the status of critical systems and we are requiring that current and future purchases be compliant. TVA as our power supplier has and continues to implement a comprehensive Y2K review and remediation plan. Finally, TVA and Tishomingo County Electric Power Association are in the process of developing a contingency plan so that we can resume normal operations in the event of a system failure.

We believe our distribution facilities will be capable of operating without significant interruption caused by the transition into the next century.



The kudzu was first introduced into the United States in the late 1800's as an exotic ornamental plant. this is a native plant of China and Japan. Kudzu blooms in the late summer and has highly fragrant flowers. It was

used for erosion control in this state because of its capacity for producing many roots. Kudzu is now considered a problem.

The difference between goldenrod and ragweed was explained. The pollen from ragweed is windborne in the late

This plant is a common source of hay fever.

Two other wildflowers that are very similar are black-eyed Susans and clasping coneflowers. Both of these have flowers that are yellow and are almost the same size and shape.

The video was a sampling of wildflowers found in MS. Our state is abundantly blessed by the beauty of wildflowers. Their brilliant colors illuminate our roadsides and parks.

Mrs. Daniel explained we live in the southeastern region. If you order or plant wildflowers, the flowers need to be for your area.

There are many benefits gained from planting wildflowers. Natural native wildflowers adjust

temperature precipitation. They do not need be watered like other flowersmany of our weeds wildflowers like the bitterweed Wildflowers are not to cultivated. Her advice was to Plan them and leave them alone. Many areas are difficult to mow maintain. Wildflowers add color and help prevent erosion. are food sources for butterflies and hummingbird Wild life eat the seeds of many varieties.

Mrs. Daniel advised us to gather caution when wildflowers for our garden Snakes like flowers too. Many the wetland plants are poisonou To protect yourself always your hands after handli wildflowers. Many plants are the endangered list. If you ta them, you could face a hefty fine Also, know what plant you getting, because after all trouble it may not even live.
