### Former Iuka Resident Dustin Pate Signs With Chicago Cubs

Dustin Pate is armed and ready after being the 260th overall pick in the 8th round draft by the Chicago Cubs on Wednesday, June 2.

Dustin graduated Tuesday, June 1, from D.W. Daniel High School in Clemson, SC, where he was a standout pitcher. With a young staff backing him, Pate posted a 7-4 record with a 1.62 ERA. He went on to strikeout 83 batters in 65 innings pitched, while surrendering just 17 walks.

Mark Russo, a scout for the Cubs, stated that size was only part of what marked his interest in Pate. "He also had a good body as a pitcher, with good arm action, not to mention, he was all business on the mound," said Russo.

All his life Dustin has dreamed of this day. "It was like a dream come true. It was pretty exciting when I got the call," said Pate.

The decision to play professional ball was not made in haste; Dustin gave much thought and consideration to his future. "It took a lot of thought," said Pate. "I know I will have a lot of responsibility living on my own, but I think it's worth it to play professional baseball."

Although Dustin gave up a scholarship with Wake Forest to

pursue his dream, he will still be given the opportunity to pursue a college education up until two years after retiring from baseball.

Unlike the NBA, the NFL, or the NHL, major league baseball provides a trust fund in the name of the players who come straight out of high school.

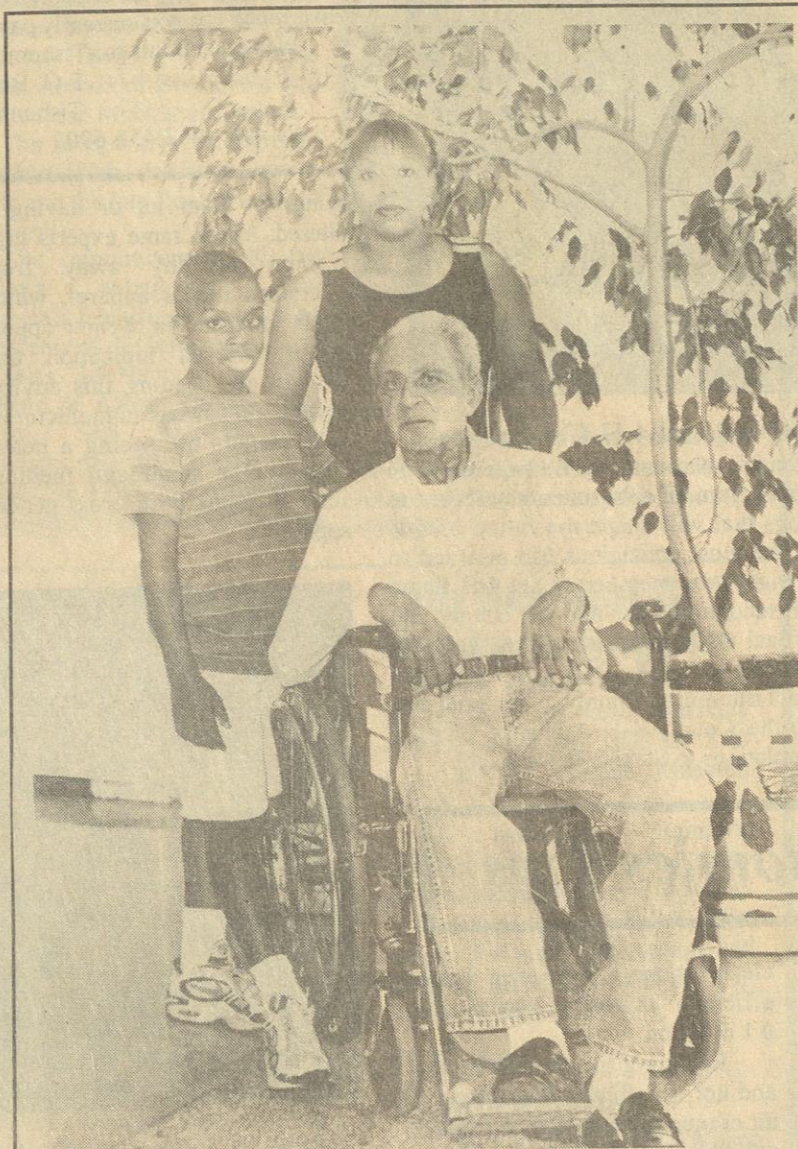
The 6-foot-5 right hander reported to rookie camp with the Cubs on Sunday, June 6, in Mesa, Arizona.

The Tishomingo County News and the staff at Tishomingo Living Center would like to wish Mr. Bennett and all fathers a happy and wonderful Father's Day.

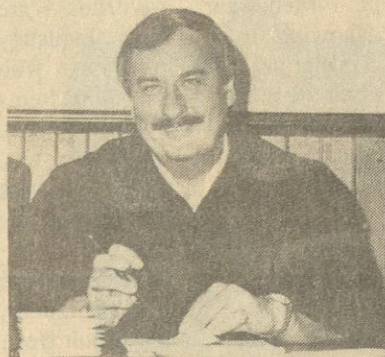
### J.R. Blakney Seeks Re-election To Office

### Iuka Airport Board Given Authority To Expand Runway To 9,000 Ft. To Accommodate Corporate Aircraft

Expansion Will Aid In Industrial Development Of County

While Tishomingo County can offer potential industries looking to locate in the county excellent locations and access to water transportation, railways and highways, the county is lacking one essential element that is required by most all large industries of today—an airport which is able to accommodate their corporate aircraft.

Now, with the passage of a new resolution by the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors, this deficiency can be remedied under the direction of the Iuka Airport Board.

In a recent resolution adopted by the Board of Supervisors, the five-person Iuka Airport Board was given the authority to "regulate, maintain and oversee the operation of the airport."

With this authority vested in the Airport Board, they may now apply for grants which will help provide the money needed to get engineering done, purchase land for expansion of the runway and actually expand the runway to the length needed so that any industry wanting to locate within Tishomingo County will be able to fly in and out without problems.

In remarks made at a June 1 meeting of area leaders and Supervisors of districts one, two and three, Airport Board Chairman Dr. Kelly Segars stated that the county would be eligible to receive money from the state, as well as federal assistance, if the Airport Board were given the authority to apply for it. This money could then be used to expand the existing runway's 3,200 ft. length to the 9,000 ft.

needed to accommodate commercial air traffic. Presently, any industry who wants to view industrial sites in the county must fly into the Corinth airport in Alcorn County and make the lengthy drive into Tishomingo County, an inconvenience which deters many prospects. Segars pointed out that since Corinth's airport board expanded to accommodate corporate jet aircraft, their industrial park has grown to include 61 industries and 14,640 jobs with companies such as World Color, Intex, Kimberly Clark, Caterpillar, etc.

Segars said that among one of the first questions asked by potential tenants, many of them leaders of multi-million dollar corporations, looking to locate in this county is "do you have an airport where we can fly in our people or fly out our products?"

The first priority of the Iuka Airport Board, made up of members Dr. Kelly Segars, Jack Thorne, O.C. Nelson, Jimmy Pyle and David Murrah, is to acquire the land needed for the runway expansion. First District Supervisor Dale Price reported that land acquisition of approximately 45 acres is already underway by the county at the north end of the existing runway. After the needed land is acquired, engineering of the site will need to be done.

"We need to get this done as quickly as possible," Segars said. "At this time, we have multi-million dollar industries wanting to locate here. The county cannot afford to lose these. However, they require an airport with a runway that is adequate to accommodate their needs."

### Tish. Co. Sheriff's Department Brings In 12, So Far, As Result Of Grand Jury Action

The most recent session of the grand jury in Tishomingo County has had the Sheriff's Department busy picking up suspects who must now plead or go to court for the charges against them.

At press time, 12 persons had been brought in by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department on capias (arrest warrants) requested by the grand jury and issued by the Circuit Clerks office. Approximately 20 more are scheduled to be arrested, according to Sheriff David Smith.

When a capias is issued, that means that the grand jury found sufficient evidence in the case to take it to court, Smith said.

Following are a listing of persons brought in at press time and their charges:

Kevin Lam—possession of marijuana with intent to distribute; Kim Puckett—

possession of marijuana with intent to distribute; James Darrell Lee—count 1, breaking and entering a building, count 2, auto theft, count 3, assault on a police officer; Mark Biggs—three counts of sale of marijuana and one count of sale of cocaine; Angie Biggs—sale of marijuana; Joshua Walls—breaking and entering of a dwelling and aggravated assault; Jay William McCaplin—count 1, fondling, count 2, sexual battery of a child under 14 years of age and count 3, sexual battery of a child under 14 years of age; Jamie Laird—aggravated assault; Jackie Lovelace Sumler Murphy—aggravated assault; Danny Todd—four counts of sale of marijuana; Robert "Junior" Voyles—felon in possession of a firearm; and Thomas Crosby, Jr.—breaking and entering of a dwelling.

More arrests will be reported in the near future, Smith said.

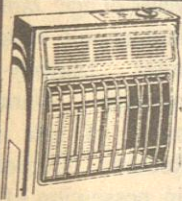

## Home Economics Tips

### Miscellany

#### Baked To Perfection

When the editor of a leading gourmet cooking magazine set out to test a variety of baking sheets, the results were quite interesting. The same cookies were baked on three types of sheets - insulated sheets, sheets with sides and sheets without sides. Nonstick sheets were included in each category. The outcome showed that high cost is not necessary related to high performance.

For easy cookie removal, insulated baking sheets turned out to be the most satisfactory. Cleanup, however, was more difficult. Cookie sheets with sides produced the most evenly baked cookies, but the resulting product was a little dry. Sheets without sides performed similar to the insulated ones, but the cookies tended to be a bit too brown.

Regardless of category, lighter and shinier baking sheets consistently produced moist, golden cookies. Cookies baked on sheets with darker coatings were a darker color and had a less soft texture.

#### Filtering Out Allergens

Although vacuum cleaner filters are not a new idea, recent improvements are a boon to those who suffer from allergies and asthma. Targeted pollutants include allergens such as smoke, pollen, dust mites, animal dander, cockroach droppings, mold and mildew.

New developments have produced HEPA (High Efficiency Particulate Air) filters that, according to manufacturer claims, trap more than 99 percent of all particles down to one micron in size. ULPA (Ultra Low Particulate Air) filters, which are equivalent to those used in semiconductor manufacturing

clean rooms, are even more efficient, capturing particles to 0.1 microns.

Retaining the dirt in the bag and not expelling it back into the air or onto the carpet is of primary concern. Innovations include foam seals to insure that all the air flows through the filter and into the exhaust and high velocity

airflow systems that suck dirt directly into the bag.

#### High Tech Hair Care

Sales in the hair care market are healthy and constant but growth is relatively flat. To counteract this, some manufacturers are focusing on products that help repair and maintain healthy locks. Market segmentation is an important strategy for sales growth. As a result, many of these new products are part of branded, upscale lines aimed at women over 35 who tend to color their hair more and have a higher disposable income.

Innovations include a hair dryer that automatically senses whether the user's hair is getting too hot and adjusts the temperature accordingly, a steam straightener, and a combination curling iron and shaping brush that uses a moisturizing steam mist to protect hair from damage. Comfort featuring include rubberized, softer handles for a better grip.

#### Manning Her Wardrobe

Menswear favorites are showing up with great frequency in the wardrobes of women who crave comfort and fashion. Items to note include guys' 501 jeans, aviator watches, boxer shorts, ties, baseball caps and cotton dress shirts. The resulting look is practical, relaxed and sexy.

Often the wearer gives the look her own dose of femininity, such as a man's tailored suit worn with a camisole and high heels, or a tie that functions as a belt rather than a neck adornment.

### Detecting Color Deficiencies

Amazingly, many color-blind people don't realize they have any difficulty at all. It is, however, possible to test for color blindness, although it requires a professional to interpret the test result., since color vision defects may be mild, moderate, or severe.

The most widely used test employs charts that contain numbers (or other familiar figures, like a question mark) represented by dots of various tints. These dotted numbers or figures are set on a background amid dots of the same size but of tints that people with color-vision deficiencies most often confuse with those of the figures.

Individuals with color-vision problems typically are unable to see any numbers or patterns on some of the plates, or they see ones different from those identified by persons with normal color-vision.

Statistically, men are overwhelmingly more apt to be color blind than women. In our total population, about 8 percent of men have color vision problems and less than 1 percent of women.

### Preventic Collars For Dogs

The preventic collar for dogs kills ticks for 3 months. The collar also aids in protection from tick-borne disease and prevents attachment of ticks. The preventic collar detaches existing ticks within 48 hours. Over 95% of attached ticks are detached after 24 hours and the collar prevents 95% - 98% of new ticks from feeding.

The collar must be worn tightly enough to contact skin and so that dog cannot remove it. Activity against ticks starts within 24 hours and continues as long as the collar is worn (up to 90 days). Ticks present in the dog's environment that may reappear on the dog will not attach and will be killed in less than 24 hours. Replace collar when effectiveness diminishes. The effectiveness of the collar is not diminished by normal wetting such as rainfall; however, it is suggested that the collar be removed before bathing. The active ingredient is not an insecticide. Therefore, use other means for control of fleas.

### Solving the "Sensitive Teeth" Problem

Sensitivity can be caused by a number of different situations such as eating ice cream, drinking hot coffee or brushing your teeth. It may also mean that you have hypersensitive (excessively sensitive) teeth. We can help determine the cause and rule out any underlying dental problem such as a cavity, tooth grinding, degenerating nerve, a fracture tooth or toothbrush abrasion.

Hypersensitivity is common and usually results when the dentin, the tooth layer under enamel, is exposed. Microscopic tubules found in dentin are the open to such irritations as heat, cold or acidic foods. Overzealous brushing or constant tooth grinding thins the enamel and may be responsible for the excess sensitivity. Hypersensitivity usually decreases or disappears later in life as the tubules narrow. Desensitizing toothpastes contain compounds such as strontium chloride which seals the dentin tubules or potassium chloride which appears to block the transmission of pain through the nerves. These toothpastes are usually used for a limited time and generally require a number of applications before they are effective. Ask our office about their use.

The dentin tubules can also be covered by sealants (plastic materials that are painted onto the tooth surface) and resins (tooth colored restorative materials). Fluoride treatments can also reduce or eliminate sensitivity.

## Smith Hired As IMS Principal, Brewer Hired As Burnsville Asst. Principal At Monday Night School Board Meeting

Approval of a principal for Iuka Middle School and an assistant principal for Burnsville School were among the actions taken by the Tishomingo County Board of Education during their meeting Monday night.

Coach Jimmy Smith was hired as the new principal of Iuka Middle School after being recommended to the Board by Tishomingo County Superintendent John Mullins. Smith will take the position left vacant by Ben McClung who has taken a position as principal at Saltillo Elementary School. Smith resigned his position as head football coach at Tishomingo County High School at the end of the past school year.

Hired by the Board as full-time assistant principal at Burnsville School was Debra Brewer. Brewer served as a part-time assistant principal during the past school year at Burnsville.

In other personnel matters, Mullins asked the Board to approve Linda Patrick of Corinth as a speech pathologist for the district and Christy Hughes, a teacher hired only as a part-time teacher/ part-time aide last year, be promoted to full-time teacher at Belmont.

Nineteen students were approved for transfer either into schools in Tishomingo County or within schools in the county.

Fourth district Board Member Charles South voted against the transfers saying that some of those wanting to transfer did not fall under the policy adopted by the Board last year that required proof of extenuating circumstances before students could change schools within the county. Second District Board Member Gary White explained that since the parents in the county pay taxes and that the transfers would not cause any school to be overloaded, he felt they should be approved. First District Board Member Jeanette Mann agreed and made the motion to approve the transfers.

The Tishomingo School PTO presented some ideas to the Board on improvements they hope to make to the school grounds and sports areas. A PTO spokesman asked the Board for approval of the improvements and also for monetary help. The Board tentatively promised to give \$5,000 to the school since they had previously given that amount to two other schools in the district for similar projects.

The Board went into closed-door executive session twice during the meeting on personnel matters. White voted against going into the first executive session which dealt with cheerleading selection at Tishomingo County High School.

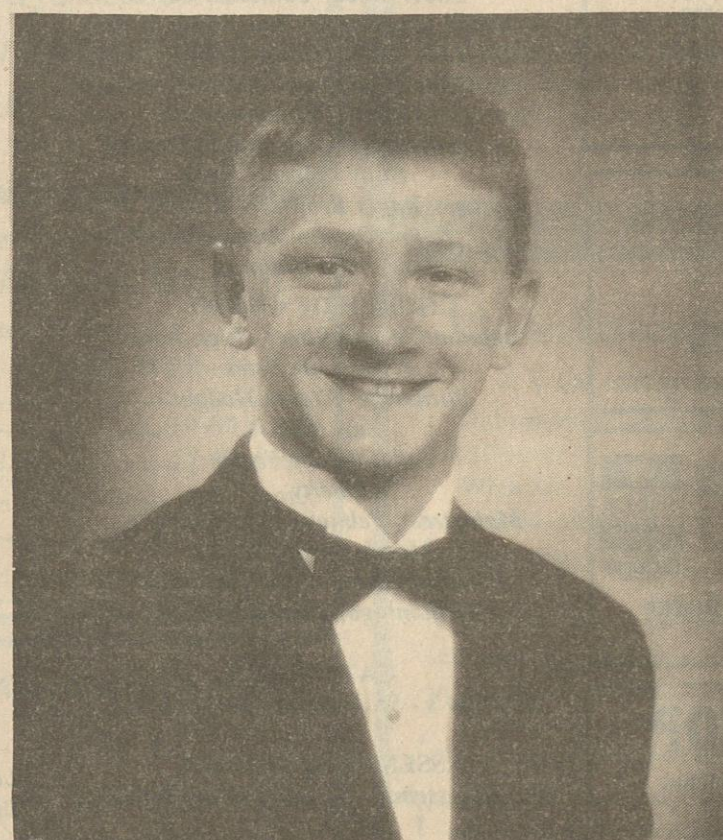

Devotional: "The Light of the Gospel" 2 Corinthians 4:3-4. Verse 3. An unselfish ministry. But if our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are lost. Hid means to cover or veil the bride. The Gospel is hidden from some men because they have wishfully closed their eyes to it. If the heart of any man who hears the Gospel is veiled it is definite that he is lost and fully under the power of sin and Satan. commandments of the Lord your God which I command you. Also do not add to it. The word makes one wise. Contrary to popular opinion, obedience to the Word enhances one's reputation. "Keep therefore and do them. Read the rest in verses 6 and 7.

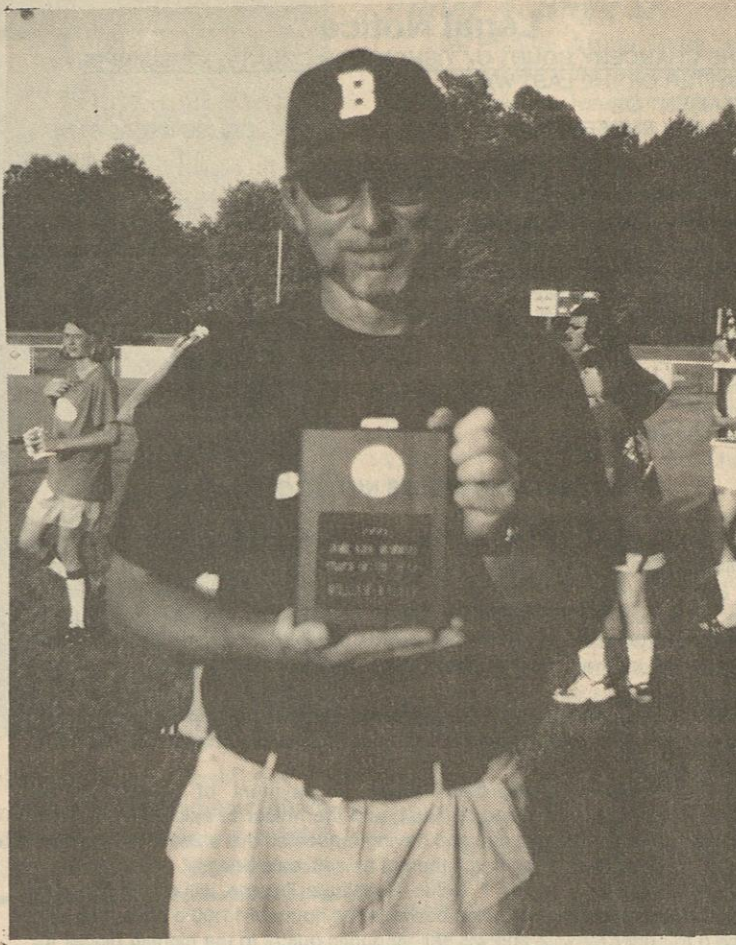
Joshua Alan McNatt, who attends Tishomingo Middle School, will appear in the All-American Scholar Yearbook, which is published nationally.

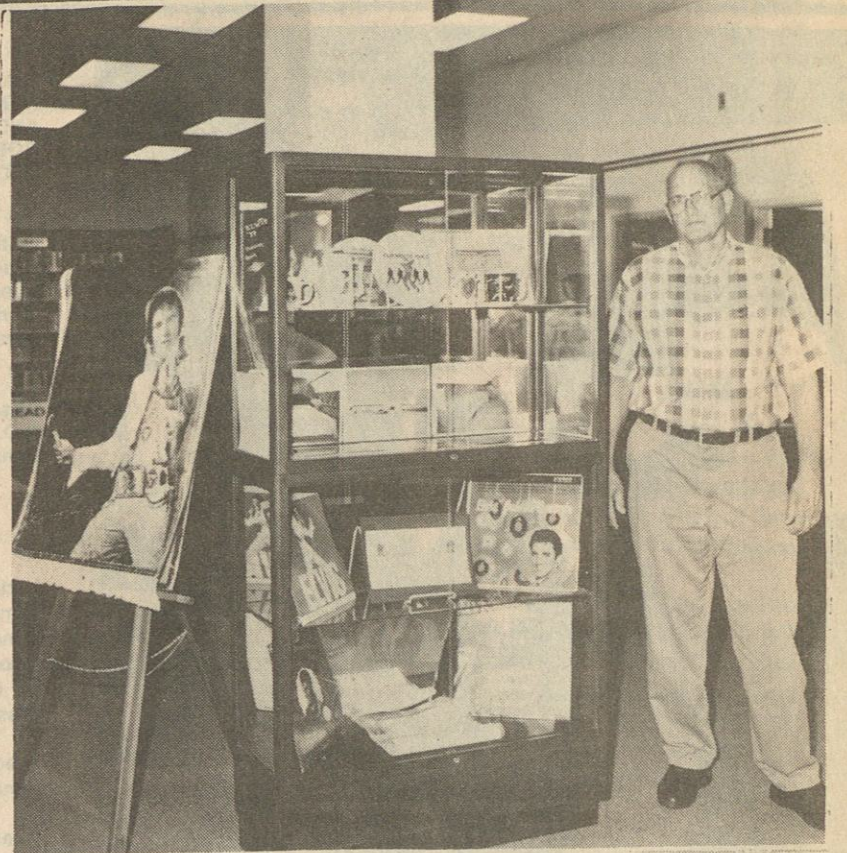

#### Y2K READINESS DISCLOSURE PURSUANT TO PUBLIC LAW 105-271

The year 2000 computer problem, or Y2K as it is commonly known, is an issue that almost all businesses face as we near the Year 2000. Tishomingo County Electric Power Association is no exception. We are preparing for Y2K by taking a positive approach to analyzing, modifying, and testing critical computer applications and devices that are controlled by computer chips or processors that may be affected.

Tishomingo County Electric Power Association has developed a plan to address this problem. We have conducted an inventory of automated systems, including computer hardware, computer software, communication systems, embedded chips and key service vendors. The critical components identified through this process either have been or will be remediated in time for the new millennium. In addition, we have also requested certification of readiness from our vendors to determine the status of critical systems and we are requiring that current and future purchases be compliant. TVA as our power supplier has and continues to implement a comprehensive Y2K review and remediation plan. Finally, TVA and Tishomingo County Electric Power Association are in the process of developing a contingency plan so that we can resume normal operations in the event of a system failure.

We believe our distribution facilities will be capable of operating without significant interruption caused by the transition into the next century.

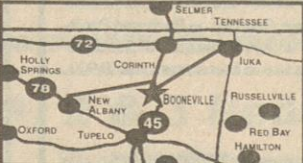

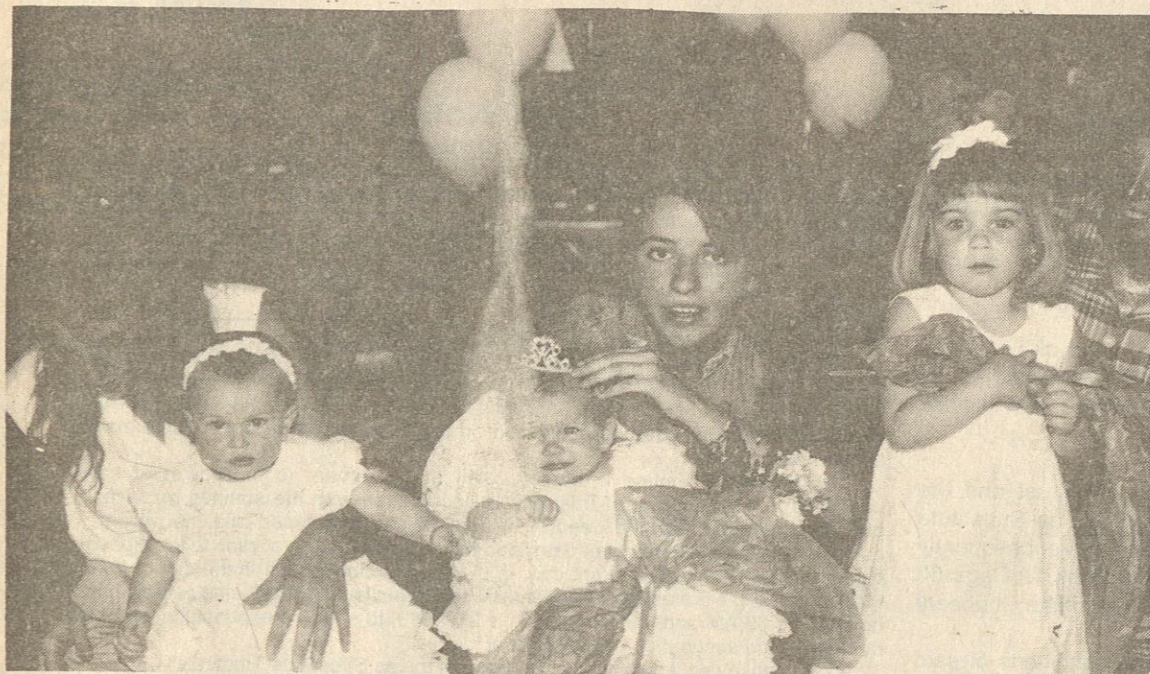

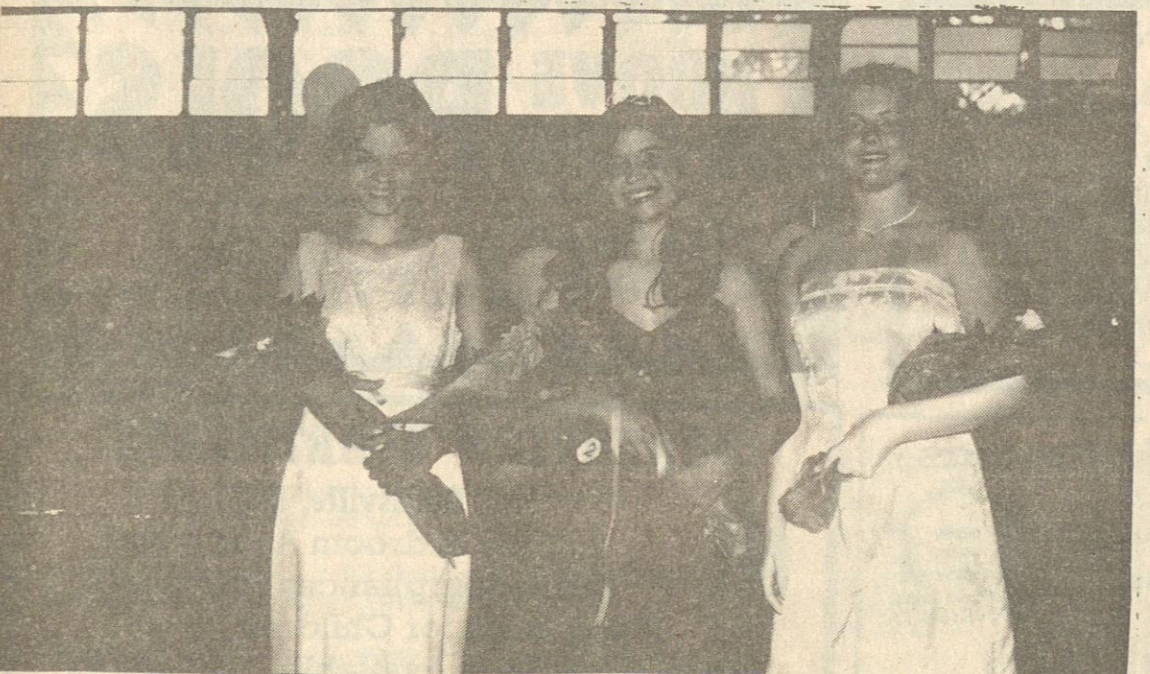

## April DAR Meeting

At two o'clock on April 18, 1999 an educational meeting of the Chief Tishomingo Chapter of Daughters of the American Revolution was held at the Iuka Library. Mrs. Vicky Durham, Regent, called the meeting to order.

The Scripture and Prayer were led by Mrs. Helen M. Nixon. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mrs. Lessie Newcomb. Mrs. Barbara Sweeney read the American's Creed. The Preamble was read by Mrs. Cindy Nelson. Mrs. Mildred Hill read the Constitutional Minutes. The President General's Message was read by Mrs. Durham. Mrs. Jeanie McKee read the National Defense Report and the minutes of the March meeting. Mrs. Durham gave the Chaplain's fund report. Mrs. Sweeney, Treasurer, gave her report of the funds in the treasury.

The guest speaker was Mrs. Charlotte Daniel. She gave members seeds and pamphlets from the MS Soil and Water Conservation Commission. Included in her presentation about wildflowers was a video. The video identified, gave the season the flowers bloomed, localities, and often history about these plants.

The kudzu was first introduced into the United States in the late 1800's as an exotic ornamental plant. This is a native plant of China and Japan. Kudzu blooms in the late summer and has highly fragrant flowers. It was

used for erosion control in this state because of its capacity for producing many roots. Kudzu is now considered a problem.

The difference between goldenrod and ragweed was explained. The pollen from ragweed is windborne in the late summer.

This plant is a common source of hay fever.

Two other wildflowers that are very similar are black-eyed Susans and clasp cone flowers. Both of these have flowers that are yellow and are almost the same size and shape.

The video was a sampling of wildflowers found in MS. Our state is abundantly blessed by the beauty of wildflowers. Their brilliant colors illuminate our roadsides and parks.

Mrs. Daniel explained we live in the southeastern region. If you order or plant wildflowers, the flowers need to be for your area.

There are many benefits gained from planting wildflowers. Natural native wildflowers adjust

to our temperature and precipitation. They do not need to be watered like other flowers. So many of our weeds are wildflowers like the bitterweeds. Wildflowers are not to be cultivated. Her advice was to plant them and leave them alone. Many areas are difficult to mow or maintain. Wildflowers add color and help prevent erosion. Many are food sources for bees, butterflies and hummingbirds. Wild life eat the seeds of many varieties.

Mrs. Daniel advised us to use caution when gathering wildflowers for our gardens. Snakes like flowers too. Many of the wetland plants are poisonous. To protect yourself always wash your hands after handling wildflowers. Many plants are on the endangered list. If you take them, you could face a hefty fine. Also, know what plant you are getting, because after all your trouble it may not even live.

Before closing the meeting, Mrs. Durham asked members to fly the flag when weather permits and buy postage stamps bearing the flag.

Also attending was Mrs. Janice Ervin, a prospective new member.

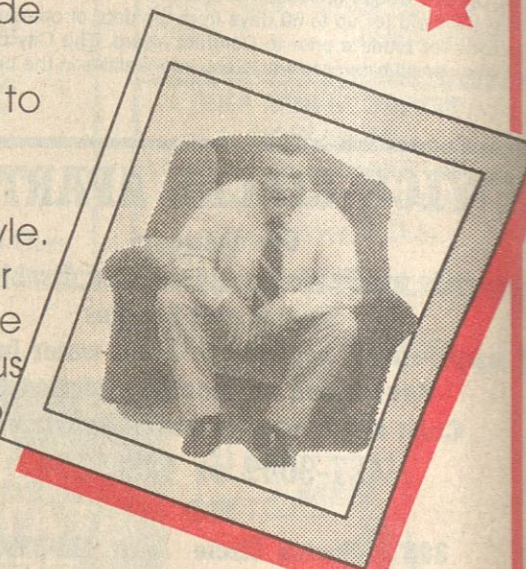
