Dale White Resigns As County Coroner To The People Of Tishomingo County

To the Tishomingo County Board
of Supervisors:
Dear County Board,

After getting hurt in March of this year, sustaining a back injury, I have not been able to work at the hospital. The results of a second M.R.I. on 8-13-99 revealed a second lumbar disc bulge since the March M.R.I. The results of neurological studies 8-27-99 showed probable permanent nerve damage to my left arm and hand.

Even though it hasn't happened since my March injury, I can't take the chance that I may be put in a situation where I will have to lift and cause further injury to myself. I find it necessary to resign my position as coroner/medical examiner of Tishomingo County, effective as of 8-31-99.

Belmont Police Dept. Takes Down Crystal Meth Lab

An Indiana man wanted for bail jumping on drug-related charges, along with another suspect, were apprehended in Belmont by local authorities Sunday and were arrested on additional drug charges.

Arrested were Laura Ellington, 35, and Robert E. Johnson, 50, both of Evansville, Ind. The two were charged with possession of crystal methamphetamine lab, plus other misdemeanor charges.

According to Belmont Chief of Police Donald Reno, Belmont Police officers responded to a call at approximately 1:30 a.m. Sunday, Aug. 29, alerting the officers that a person wanted in Posey, Ind. for bail jumping on a crystal methamphetamine lab charge was at a location inside the Belmont City limits.

When Belmont Police Officer Russ Hollis confronted the suspect, he took off running, Reno said.

According to Chief Reno, Hollis subdued the suspect after an altercation.

Chief Reno then obtained a permission to search order. From the suspect's car, the officers found approximately 2,000 pills, a large amount of lithium, a large amount of acids, a large amount of ethyl ether, and methyl alcohol. Reno explained that these items are used to make crystal methamphetamine, better known as crank.

Reno said the penalty for this offense can be up to and/or a \$1 million fine and 30 years in the state penitentiary.

Assisting in the investigation, along with Belmont Police Chief Donald Reno, were Belmont Police Officers Russell Hollis, Wayne Ivey and Greg Mitchell.

Watershed Project Steadily Progressing

The Natural Resources Conservation Service project, sponsored by the City of Iuka to correct flooding and erosion problems on Indian Creek, has been steadily progressing since its beginning in May of this year.

According to Iuka Mayor David Nichols, Hill Brothers Construction Co., who was awarded the contract for the project, including clearing the channel and lining it with rip-rap for erosion control.

Presently, culvert work has begun. Anyone passing through the traffic light in Iuka has seen the towering crane and huge culverts in the parking lot of the Elm Shopping Center on Battleground Drive.

Nichols said he estimates that the culverts all should be in place within two to three weeks. According to initial project reports, the culverts, which will span a total distance of approximately 245 feet, will begin at Battleground Drive (Old Hwy.

25), behind Subway Sandwich Shop and continue along the creek. They will then be covered to eliminate future erosion in that location.

Also, construction will begin soon on the bridges which have to be constructed as part of the project, Nichols said.

"The company has until the first of the year to complete the bridges; however, the pile-driving equipment has arrived and they should begin work on them very soon," Nichols stated.

He said the bridges could be complete in six weeks, at a minimum, but it is likely to take longer. Bridges are to be constructed over Pearl, Main, Gaines and Eastport Streets.

When complete, the project, which has a price tag of just over \$2 million, will eliminate erosion and flooding problems along Indian Creek.

It is ironic, however, that since this project to eliminate problems caused by too much water began, there has been little or no rain in the area.

Tishomingo County Native Senior Master Sgt. Anthony L. Bishop Wins Air Force Award

Senior Master Sgt. Anthony L. Bishop, first sergeant for the 347th Operations Support Squadron, was selected as the 1999 Air Force First Sergeant of the Year.

Bishop, who is now stationed at Moody Air Force Base in Valdosta, GA, is a 1980 graduate of Tishomingo High School. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. James R. Moore of Iuka and has one brother, Mike Morrill.

Bishop, assigned to Moody on April 2, found out he won the award on June 28.

"I was overwhelmed when I found out I won the award," Bishop said.

Bishop is recognized for his accomplishments while he was first sergeant for the 18th Civil Engineer Group, Kadena Air Base, Japan, prior to coming to Moody. The 18th is the largest civil engineer group in the Air Force.

"We had more than 1,700 assigned personnel," Bishop recalled.

While at Kadena, Bishop orchestrated several "town meetings" for spouses of troops who were deployed in support of Operation INDY BACKFILL.

"When the USS Independence was pulled out of the Pacific to support operations in the Persian Gulf in February 1998, our unit was required to go and set up a collocated operating base on the Korean Peninsula as a show of force," Bishop explained.

"We had over 400 people deploy from our wing and my part in that was to support the families of those deployed."

"I worked with the wing com-

mander, commanders from virtually every squadron on base and representatives from all the referral agencies to hold monthly town meetings. We had representatives from all the banks, the credit union, housing, finance, legal, everybody."

"During the town meetings, we would update the spouses and family members of those who were deployed. If the spouses had problems, on base or off, we would listen to their problems or concerns and try to resolve those problems, so we could make the absence of the spouse a little easier."

Bishop was also responsible for creating "brown bag" leadership luncheons.

"The purpose of the luncheon was to bring in all officers within the group and teach them about administrative actions, disciplinary actions and all the tools a commander uses to maintain discipline within a unit. We would also discuss programs like weight management and enlisted performance reports as well as the other programs administered in the group. During the luncheons, we would pose scenarios in which a member would not be performing up to standards or need some kind of disciplinary action, we would then ask the officers what they would do in each case with the bits of information he or she had. Then the squadron commanders would tell what action they actually took in each case. This would help the young officers learn. The importance was to give these young officers who had never had any command experience, the tools they need for when they finally become a commander."

Bishop was also responsible for creating promotion recognition ceremonies.

"Each month we would have a promotion ceremony to formally recognize everyone who was being promoted—whether it be their first stripe or their last stripe. We recognized the officer ranks, as well," Bishop stated. "That was something I was very proud of because it put the recognition on the members of the unit—the men and women who deserved it," Bishop said.

Bishop has been a first sergeant for eight years. His first sergeant assignments include Charleston Air Force Base, S.C., Kadena and now Moody. "I love being a first sergeant," Bishop said.

"The hardest thing about being a first sergeant is overcoming the perception the first sergeant has as the disciplinarian and getting people to talk to us. If people would talk to us, tell us what their situation is, then we can help them solve it before it becomes a problem. Most people fear the stigma of the first sergeant and are afraid of being known by the first sergeant. Unfortunately, that prevents us from being able to help solve their problems," Bishop said. "Overcoming that barrier is the greatest challenge for any first sergeant."

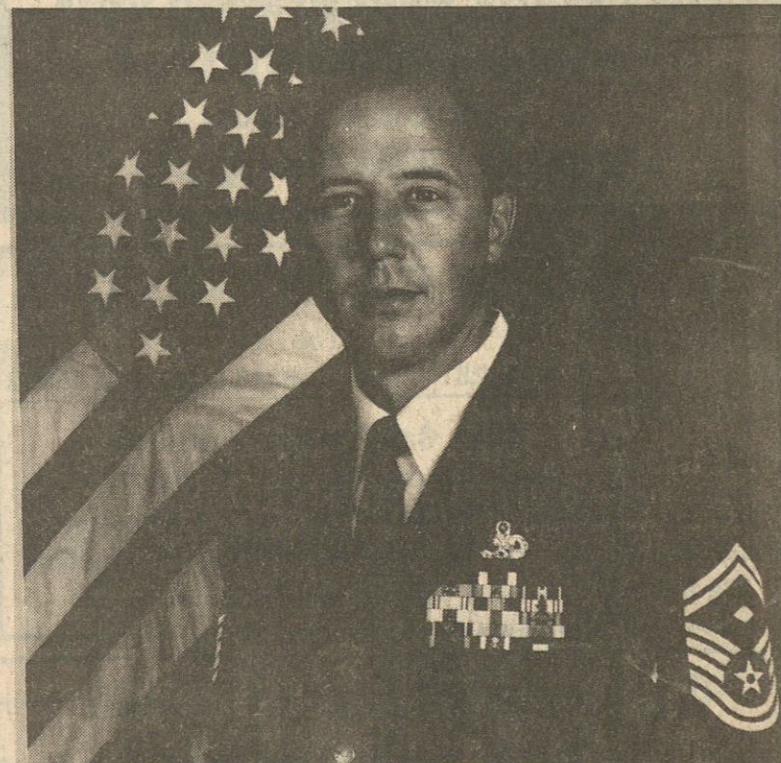
"The absolute, number one satisfaction I get from being a first sergeant is to have an airman who is experiencing difficulties in his or her life or military career, being able to help that airman through the hard times and then later, be it months or years, to run into that airman and see

that he or she has gotten a promotion, is doing well, has decided to stay in the Air Force, and to say nothing to you but 'thanks,'" Bishop said. "Thanks for being hard on them, pushing them to a new level. To see someone who is on their last straw, getting through to them and helping them understand what they were doing to themselves and their career and to watch them turn it around is without a doubt, the greatest feeling a first sergeant can have," Bishop stated.

While at Moody, Bishop plans to initiate some programs within his unit.

"Moody has some great mentoring programs . . . programs such as the NCO Enhancement program, senior NCO enhancement courses, senior NCO induction and so forth. I would like to start up a formal promotion recognition ceremony for my unit. I would also like to start up a similar program for officers and senior NCOs that would help them understand their roles and responsibilities as flight chiefs, flight commanders and potential superintendents or commanders," Bishop said. "The biggest thing I would like to do is to support the leadership within Moody's different groups, so that we are all working together toward the same goal. If we do that, it would be really easy to make Moody a premier base for everyone to be assigned to."

Bishop, as a first sergeant, lives by making tough calls and hard choices always with the member in mind. "It's not about the first sergeant, the squadron, it's about that member. Ultimately, it's that member's life that will be affected."

One important thing Bishop would like to convey is that "although I'm the one being recognized, there are countless great first sergeants around the Air Force doing incredible jobs and taking care of people. This award recognizes the job they do every day. First sergeants don't do anything by themselves, ever. Without the support of their commanders, their chiefs, their supervisors, their fellow sergeants, their base referral agencies, it would be impossible to do any of the things that make a unit better."

I was very fortunate to have such support within the 18th Civil Engineer Group and from everyone on Kadena Air Base."

Bishop will be formally recognized as the AF First Sergeant of the Year during the Air Force Sergeant's Association International Convention in Reno, Nevada on Sept. 2. His wife, Linda, will accompany him on the trip. He has two daughters, Amy and Ashley. His parents also will be traveling to Reno to attend the awards ceremony.

Home Economics Tips

Defrosting - Better Safe Than Sorry

Using the microwave oven to defrost food is quick, easy and convenient - especially when there isn't much time.

For busy households, the microwave oven can be a real life - and dinner - saver.

The following food safety tips are recommended for microwave oven defrosting.

Remove food from store wrap prior to microwave defrosting. Foam trays and plastic wraps are not heat stable at high temperatures. Melting or warping of them may cause chemicals to migrate into food.

Don't use cold storage

containers. Margarine tubs, whipped topping bowls and other plastic containers can warp or melt from hot food, again possible causing chemical migration.

Cook meat and poultry immediately after microwave thawing. Because some bacteria may be present after defrosting, don't delay cooking.

Use the right wraps and bags. Wax paper, oven cooking bags, parchment paper and white microwave paper towels are safe to use. Avoid letting plastic wraps and thin plastic storage bags touch foods during microwaving. Never use brown grocery bags or newspapers in the microwave.

Conservation Corner

Black bears are making a comeback in the lower Mississippi River Valley, due largely to the efforts of state and federal agencies, conservation organizations, universities, timber companies, farmers and other private landowners. Currently, the Louisiana subspecies of the black bear is listed as a threatened species under the Endangered Species Act. Many groups have united to form the Black Bear Conservation Committee that works to improve the bear's population so that it can be

removed from the list.

Because of its low population, seeing a bear in the wild is very rare. Learning more about bears and being aware of their habits should help citizens fully appreciate these unique animals and the habitat in which they live.

Almost all conflicts between bears and humans occur as a result of the animal's search for food. According to Rob Ballinger, a Field Biologist for Wildlife Mississippi, "Under no circumstances should anyone knowingly feed a bear. Bears will lose their instinctive fear of humans quite easily and often become nuisances as a result. Problems vary from the simple presence of a bear, perceived as dangerous, to actual property damage."

Ballinger recommends that the best way to avoid trouble with bears is to avoid activities that create problem situations. Preventive measures, such as proper disposal of garbage, should be initiated first. If bears are in the area, efforts should be made to secure all garbage containers or deposit all edible wastes in separate containers that are stored where bears cannot gain access. In most conflict situations, no one control technique will provide absolute security from bear problems. However, certain measures that are initiated in a timely manner, maintained, properly and applied with an understanding of bear habits and

behavior, can greatly reduce any problems associated with bears. Although bears are generally shy creatures, they are very intelligent and possess excellent long-term memory capabilities. Bears will continue to return to areas where they have found food. According to Bo Sloan, Supervisor for USDA's Wildlife Services in Stoneville, "Problems have occurred when people, fascinated by a bear near their home or workplace, have tossed food out the door so that they can watch or photograph the animal. In these situations, both the humans and the bear quickly lose fear of each other and problems surface."

If you experience any problems with bears, there are several agencies and groups available to assist you. Wildlife Mississippi and USDA's Wildlife Services Agency are committed to do whatever it takes to avoid human/bear conflicts and to work to resolve any that may develop. Eyeglass Care And Maintenance

A certain amount of care is required when you get eyeglasses so that they will continue to provide you with good visual correction.

The most obvious point is that you should keep your glasses clean. Oil from your skin and dust and grit in the air will cling to your eyeglass lenses. You should clean them off at least once a day. The best way to do this is with a clean, soft cloth or one of the special lens-cleaning papers that are available at drugstores. Some eyewear professionals recommend that glasses, especially the plastic ones, be cleaned when they are wet, in order to reduce the chance of scratching. You can use special lens cleaning fluids for this or plain tap water with or without a bit of soap.

It is also a good idea to keep your glasses in a case when you are not using them, especially if you carry them in a purse or pocket.

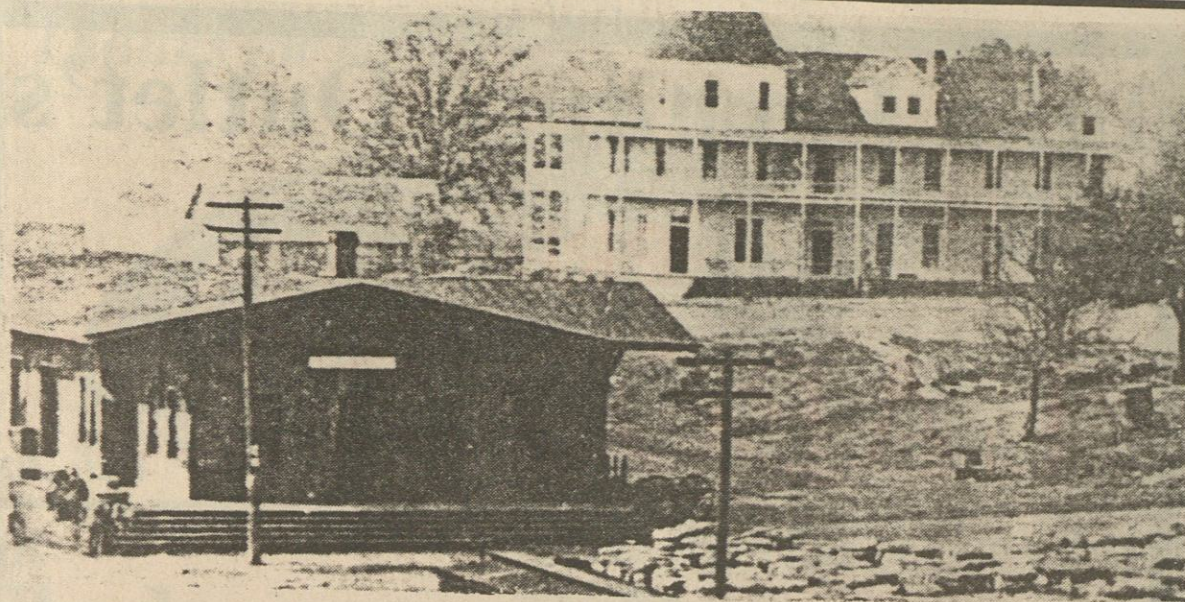

Old Tishomingo Traces

By: June Bullard

Irene Barnes sent the following excerpts from various old sources:

August 9, 1904, The Vidette:

Open letter to General Superintendent of Southern Railway - Memphis

Dear Sir:

The citizens of Iuka, Miss. would respectfully set forth the following facts for your earnest consideration, believing that if you will set upon our suggestion, we will fully convince you that what we ask is of as much interest to your road as to our town. Your depot was built in 1856 or 57 - a strong box structure, flat roof, size about 30 x 50. It was enlarged about 20 feet some 15 or 20 years ago and has been painted several times. When it was built, our town had a population of less than 100 and about 4 or 5 small frame structures for store houses, one small frame hotel, or boarding house. We have had gradual growth surviving the terrible war in 1861 to 1865, and from the number of houses, we have a little city dotted with many cottages of modern structure, a population of 1000 to 1500. We have six churches, a school point of noted interest and about 25 business houses. The trade of the place has grown from the handling of 1500 to 2000 bales of cotton to 6500 last season and we calculate on 8000 this fall. We have built one large frame hotel of modern style in last few years costing about \$5,000. We built some few years a brick costing \$30,000. One now in construction costing between \$9,000 and \$10,000. We have telephone, electric light plant, planing mill, cotton gins. The best mineral springs water in the south with many visitors which requires a number of boarding houses. We are surrounded with saw

mills and timber getters of all descriptions. There is at least 25 or 30 country stores that most of them transact their business here and in order to impress you with the magnitude of our business, we tell you we have two banks running with all they can do. Now for the point that we trust you will really see. We are forced to transact our business with you with the same facilities furnished fifty years ago. True you have extended your side tracks but it has only complicated the matter, and the town is endangered by the immense lumber piles waiting for shipment. In your present condition, you cannot handle the business of this place. Your passenger facilities, you have none that are commensurate with the travel. Ladies and children must drag through the mud and water to get on and off the train. The men of course can stand it. Much more can be said but we respectfully and earnestly beg you to come to see us in person, for as before said, our interest is yours, and if you will come and look over the ground, we will convince you.

Signed: Citizen

From the Iuka Reporter of 1889:

John Woodall of Iuka showed us a trunk check that was used by M&CRR before the Civil War that he took from a cow's paunch that was butchered for beef one day last week.

From the Vidette of August 14, 1913:

Circuit Court: State vs A.B. Adams, plea of guilty, fined \$50 and 30 days in jail. State vs John Scruggs, disturbing public worship, not guilty.

From WPA Preliminary Manuscript, Tishomingo Co. Vol. LXXI:

Mrs. Charlie Daugherty of

Snowdown has a ring her grandfather Thomas Smith carved out of a black celluloid comb while he was in prison in Ohio where he was sent when captured during the Civil War.

Mrs. Salina Dexter carried her wool to the Bay Springs Carding Factory to have it carded and made into thread. This mill made bedspreads and other articles to exchange for wool with customers. At one time, while Mrs. Dexter was there, she exchanged a part of her wool for a spread.

Mrs. John Walker north of Iuka has an old Bible about 200 years old known as the Old Wingo Bible. It is approximately 12" x 14".

Ford House northeast of Burnsville built before Civil War was owned by many: Mr. Burns, Dr. A.F. Whitehurst just after marriage, Jim White and wife who fell into fire and burned to death, Mr. Harris had been visiting Menairy Smallwood and cut her throat there, Whit Bryant, Mr. Clement, Jack Ford and Paul Ford.

Mr. Alvin Butler brought a couple of coins he plowed out of the ground near old Jackson Camp Church on Natchez Trace. One 5-cent piece smaller than a dime dated 1834 and the other was a foreign coin dated 1738.

Mr. J.W. Whitaker has land deed on sheep skin, the first deed made for his land. The deed was made to Thomas Pate of Tishomingo Co. for 159.4 acres (Land Patent Deed) dated August 14, 1844.

Civil War Pension Applications: C.C. Bullard, September 11, 1905, 61 years old, born in Tishomingo County at Short, Miss. Lived in Mississippi all his life. Married, enlisted 1862, 7th Ala. Cav., Col. Moreland's Co. J with Capt. John B. Brown. In until surrender 1865. Command surrendered at Iuka, Miss., has rheumatism, farmer, has property valued at \$250, owns home, has eight children all married except one girl. Another application dated July 18, 1916, 70 years old, in service nearly two years, unable to work, lives with wife and daughter. Witnesses: A.T. Scruggs, W.W. Walker, E.A. Payne, Chancery Clerk.

Martin Sprouse, Burnsville. Application rejected August 4, 1898, 70 years old, lived in Miss. 23 years, enlisted in Alabama Sept. 1861, Commander Capt. Gabbit. In for 4 years, Discharged May 15, 1865, steam injury in eyes, Command surrendered Blue Mountain Cave,

Alabama. Has three children. Another application Sept. 16, 1919, Rejected, 81 years old. Lived in Miss. 36 years, resided Cherokee Co., Alabama in 1861, worked in nitrate plant making powder for Confederate Army, blind and lives with son.

W.M. Milligan, Short, Miss. applied Sept. 9, 1902, 61 years old, lived in Miss. 36 years, enlisted fall of 1861 in 4th Tenn. Confederate Inf. with Col. McMurray Co. B with Ezekiel Polk, in for about three years, transferred to William Powers Battalion just before Battle of Chickamauga where he was wounded, shot through right leg and eyesight gone, eyes injured from measles while in service, surrendered in Georgia, has three sons and three daughters, one son will be 21 next March (1903).

Y2K READINESS DISCLOSURE PURSUANT TO PUBLIC LAW 105-271

The year 2000 computer problem, or Y2K as it is commonly known, is an issue that almost all businesses face as we near the Year 2000. Tishomingo County Electric Power Association is no exception. We are preparing for Y2K by taking a positive approach to analyzing, modifying, and testing critical computer applications and devices that are controlled by computer chips or processors that may be affected.

Tishomingo County Electric Power Association has developed a plan to address this problem. We have conducted an inventory of automated systems, including computer hardware, computer software, communication systems, embedded chips and key service vendors. The critical components identified through this process either have been or will be remediated in time for the new millennium. In addition, we have also requested certification of readiness from our vendors to determine the status of critical systems and we are requiring that current and future purchases be compliant. TVA as our power supplier has and continues to implement a comprehensive Y2K review and remediation plan. Finally, TVA and Tishomingo County Electric Power Association are in the process of developing a contingency plan so that we can resume normal operations in the event of a system failure.

We believe our distribution facilities will be capable of operating without significant interruption caused by the transition into the next century.

Studies In Isaiah 53

The atoning work of Christ is set forth in Scripture as reconciliation. Propitiation focuses attention on the wrath of God and provision for the removal of that wrath. Reconciliation focuses attention on man's alienation from God and Divine method of restoring him to God's favor. Alienation is twofold: man from God and God from man.
