### St. Mary Catholic Church To Celebrate First Mass In New Location This Weekend

After two years of prayers, planning, paperwork and lots of hard manual labor, Iuka's St. Mary Catholic Church will be officially opening its doors to parishioners at its new location this weekend.

This new larger facility, located just down the street from the previous church building, was formerly occupied by the Iuka office of the U.S.D.A.

St. Mary's Pastoral/Social Minister, Sister Dolores Partsch said that the first mass at the new church building will be celebrated at 6:30 p.m. this Saturday, Nov. 13.

"We'd like to welcome everyone to our new facility," Sister Dolores said. "We are excited about the move. We have so much more room. We can seat 40 here. In the old building, we could only seat about 40."

She explained that Father Thomas Burns serves as St. Mary's priest.

This facility will be the new home to the office of Catholic Social Services, as well, Sister Dolores explained.

"The Catholic Social Services office is located in the rear of the building," she said. "Anyone needing to visit this office needs to use the Fulton Street entrance to get to the parking lot."

Bishop William Houck of the Jackson Diocese will be coming to bless the new church in a special ceremony on Sunday, Nov. 21.

In addition to the regular Saturday Mass, the church offers a Wednesday morning Bible study at 10 a.m.

Sister Dolores said the church project was sponsored by Sacred Heart Southern Missions.

The front of the building needed only a cross placed at its pinnacle, since most people said it already resembled a church. The completely renovated interior of the church houses the spacious

sanctuary with a large cross, bearing a likeness of our Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, as its focal point. Additionally, the building contains a large kitchen and



bathrooms, a church office and the office of Catholic Social Services.

St. Mary Catholic Church has been in existence in Iuka since the early 1980s. Sister Dolores, who is originally from Johnstown, Penn., came to the church in 1994 and since that time has brought the church to the community through her tireless work with children and those in need.

In addition to directing Catholic Social Services for the area, she has initiated and participates in such worthwhile programs as Samaritan Food Pantry, after-school student-to-student tutoring programs for kindergarten and first grade students at Iuka and Burnsville Schools, and adult literacy tutoring. She has been an advocate and a voice for those who often don't have a voice in the community. She works with Project Homestead and supports efforts of the Junior Auxiliary and other area organizations concerned with the needs of the community.

Sister Dolores also has been involved in community church services held in the Iuka area, along with other area ministers.

"We hope that this new building will be a comfortable place for our church members," Sister Dolores said. "I'd like to encourage Catholics from throughout the area to join us here."

### VETERANS DAY

#### The Military "Job" By Senator John Glenn

This exchange between Senators Glenn and Metzenbaum is worth reading.

May 3, 1974, Ohio Senate Democratic primary. Howard Metzenbaum to John Glenn:

Metzenbaum: "How can you run for Senate when you've never held a 'job'?"

Glenn: "I served 23 years in the United States Marine Corps. I went through two wars. I flew 149 combat missions. My plane was hit by anti-aircraft fire on 12 different occasions. I was in the space program.

It wasn't my checkbook, it was my life that was on the line. This was not a 9-to-5 job where I took time off to take the daily cash receipts to the bank.

"I ask you to go with me... as I went the other day, to a Veterans Hospital and look those men, with their mangled bodies, in the eye and tell them they didn't hold a job.

"You go with me to any Gold Star mother, and you look her in the eye and tell her that

her son did not hold a job.

"You go with me to the space program, and you go as I have gone to the widows and orphans of Ed White and Gus Grissom and Roger Chaffee, and you look those kids in the eye and tell them that their dad didn't hold a job.

"You go with me on Memorial Day coming up, and you stand on Arlington National Cemetery - where I have more friends than I like to remember and you watch those waving flags, and you stand there, and you think about this nation, and you tell me that those people didn't have a job.

"I tell you, Howard Metzenbaum, you should be on your knees every day of your life thanking God that there were some men - SOME MEN - who held a job. And they required a dedication to purpose and a love of country and a dedication to duty that was more important than life itself.

And their self-sacrifice is what has made this country possible. "I HAVE HELD A JOB, HOWARD!"

\$962.25 and won the trophy for the 1998-1999 school year.

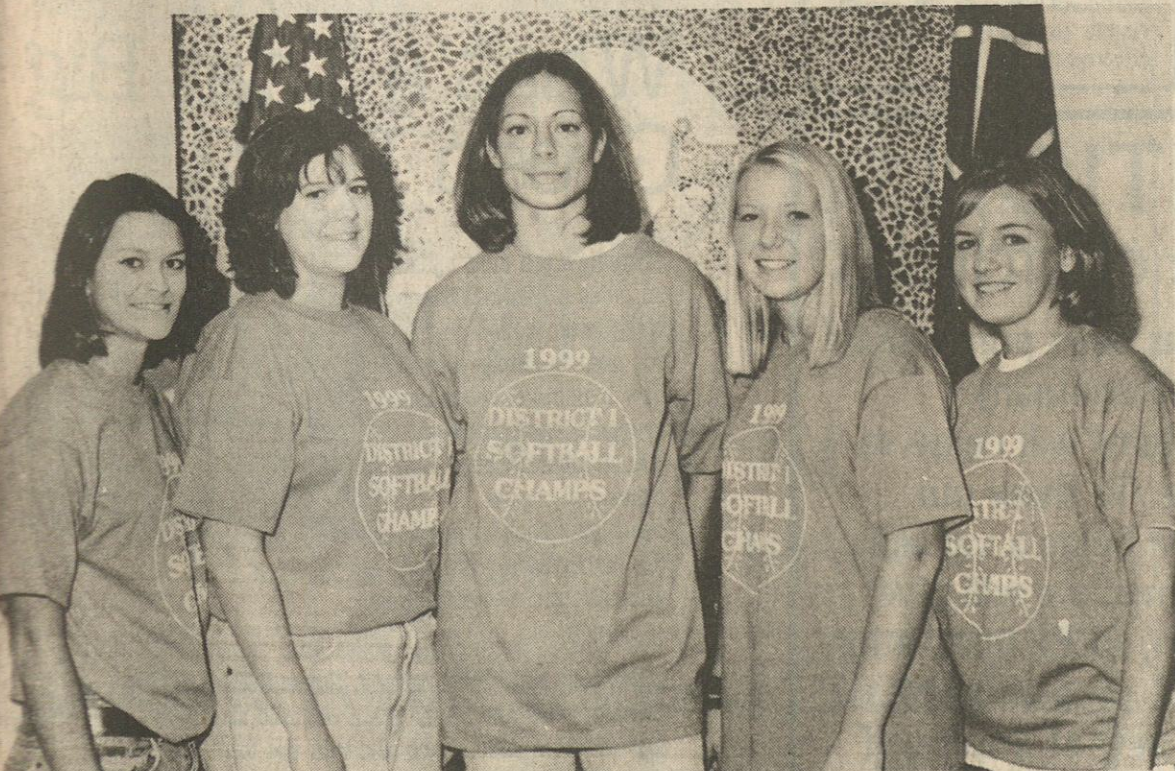

year. Eggs should not be frozen in their shells. To freeze whole eggs, beat yolks and whites together. Egg whites can also be frozen by themselves.

\*Refrigerate leftover cooked egg dishes up to 3 to 4 days. When refrigerating a large amount of a hot egg-containing leftover, divide it into several shallow containers so it will cool quickly.

#### Egg Safety Away From Home

\*Cooked eggs for a picnic should be packed in an insulated cooler with enough ice or frozen gel packs to keep them cold. Don't put the cooler in the trunk - carry it in the passenger compartment of the car. If taking cooked eggs to work or school, pack them with a small frozen gel pack or a frozen juice box.

#### Avoid Hidden Risks

\*Foods containing raw or lightly cooked eggs, such as Caesar salad, homemade ice cream or eggnog, hollandaise sauce, and French toast, can be dangerous, especially for people in the high-risk groups (young children, the elderly, and individuals with weakened immune systems). Many grocery stores carry pasteurized egg products but, since they include only egg whites, they may not work well in traditional recipes for egg-containing foods. Commercial forms of such foods are safe to serve if they are made with pasteurized liquid eggs.

#### Twitching Eyelids

People are often annoyed and even embarrassed about a tic or twitching of the eyelid. This is usually not a medical eye problem, although it is definitely a nuisance and source of embarrassment. People feel self-conscious about the twitch and are certain others not only notice it, but are viewing them as one who is nervous and has a lack of self-assurance. Although it feels very obvious, the twitch is often barely perceptible. It is caused by a fibrillation, or quivering, of the muscles around the eye, invariably the result of fatigue, tension or anxiety. It is not any kind of eye disease or eye muscle disorder.

Once the patient understands that the cause is one of fatigue or tension rather than some potentially serious physical problem, the twitch often vanishes. Anything that can be done to promote internal tranquility and relaxation will help. Resting the eyes, ignoring the tic, covering the eyes with a warm moist cloth, and feeling confident that it is not grossly visible to others, is the most effective therapy.

#### Rabies

Rabies isn't the only disease animals can pass on to humans. There are several zoonosis diseases humans should be aware of. A Zoonosis disease is one that is transmitted between animals and humans. They are contagious diseases and have public health significance.

Most people are unaware of the most common zoonosis diseases, which include contagious internal parasites such as hookworms, roundworms, two forms of tapeworms and possibly giardia. These are common diseases in cats and dogs that everyone has heard of, but you may not know you can get these parasites from your pets.

The eggs of the parasites are transmitted with fecal-oral contact, but you don't have to directly touch the stool to be infected by the parasite. The worms are usually not in the stool, but the eggs are, and the eggs are responsible for passing along the parasite. Everyone should assume a kitten or puppy has internal parasites until proven otherwise.

These internal parasites are easy to detect with a stool sample, and they can be controlled with proper medication. Like the rabies vaccine, the annual stool sample is just as important for humans' health as for pets' health.

Worms can cause a wide variety of signs such as intestinal problems, weight loss and unthrifty coat. Hookworms will also burrow into the skin. The most important thing about these internal parasites is prevention. This includes having your pet examined regularly by a veterinarian, covering the children's sandbox so cats can't use it as a litter box and keeping the yard free of stools.

Pet owners should also control external parasites such as fleas, scabies, chitella and chiggers, which cause red, itchy rashes. The solution to these parasites is to keep the environment mite-free. This can be done with prescribed insecticides.

We are end-stage hosts, so we won't pass on the mites, but we will sure be miserable until we get rid of them.

### Dental Emergency Tips For Vacation Travel

Dental emergencies can happen anywhere and at any time. Being prepared can make the difference between handling a dental problem and resuming your fun, or having plans ruined. Pack these basics for your trip: aspirin or a substitute, gauze, cotton, floss and paraffin.

While you should go to an emergency room or a dentist's office if needed, here are some tips on how to handle possible minor dental problems:

#### Toothache

Rinse your mouth well with warm water and gently floss between the teeth to remove any trapped food. Use a cold compress on the outside of the cheek if there is swelling and take a pain reliever. Never place an aspirin directly on the tooth or gum.

#### Knocked-out Tooth

Rinse the tooth lightly with running water but don't scrub it and touch it as little as possible. Put the tooth back in the socket and hold it firmly in place. If you can't re-insert the tooth, keep it in a glass or container of milk or a special tooth preserving solution available at your local drugstore. Get to a dentist within 30 minutes, if possible, to improve the chances of the tooth being saved.

#### Objects Wedged Between Teeth

Gently remove the object with floss and avoid cutting gums. Do not use a sharp instrument.

#### Lost Filling

Cover the cavity with paraffin, and take aspirin if needed.

#### Bitten Tongue or Lip

Put direct pressure on the bleeding area with a clean cloth and apply a cold compress to minimize swelling. If the bleeding doesn't stop, go to a nearby hospital.

#### Possible Fractured Jaw

Immobilize the jaw by means, such as a handkerchief necktie or towel tied around the head, and go to a hospital emergency room as quickly as possible.

## Home Economics Tips

#### Playing It Safe With Eggs

Fresh eggs may contain bacteria that can cause an intestinal infection called salmonellosis. Most healthy people recover from these infections within 4 to 7 days but they can lead to severe and even fatal illness, especially for those most vulnerable to foodborne disease - children, the elderly, and persons with immune systems weakened by health problems. You can avoid illness from eggs by knowing how to buy, store, handle and cook them - or foods that contain them - safely.

#### Buy Safe

\*Buy eggs only if sold from a refrigerator or refrigerated case. Open the carton and make sure that the eggs are clean and the shells are not cracked.

\*Store eggs in their original carton and refrigerate as soon as possible.

#### Keep Clean and Don't Cross-Contaminate

\*Cook eggs until both the yolk and the white are firm. Scrambled eggs should not be runny. Casseroles and other dishes

containing eggs should be cooked to 160 degrees F (72 degrees C).

\*If a recipe calls for eggs that are raw or undercooked when the dish is served, replace it with a recipe that contains only thoroughly cooked eggs.

\*Serve cooked eggs and egg-containing foods immediately after cooking. For buffet-style serving, hot egg dishes should be kept hot, and cold egg dishes kept cold. Eggs and egg dishes, such as quiches or souffles, may be refrigerated for serving later but should be thoroughly reheated to 165 degrees F (74 degrees C) before serving.

Refrigerate or Freeze for Safety's Sake

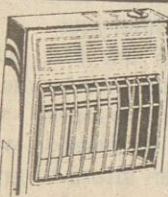
#### \*Refrigerate raw shell eggs

immediately after purchase and use them within 4 to 5 weeks.

\*Use hard-cooked eggs (in the shell or peeled) within 1 week after cooking.

\*Cooked eggs, including hard-boiled eggs, and egg-containing foods should not sit out for more than 2 hours. Within 2 hours, either reheat or refrigerate.

\*Use frozen eggs within 1

## What's That Big Green Box?

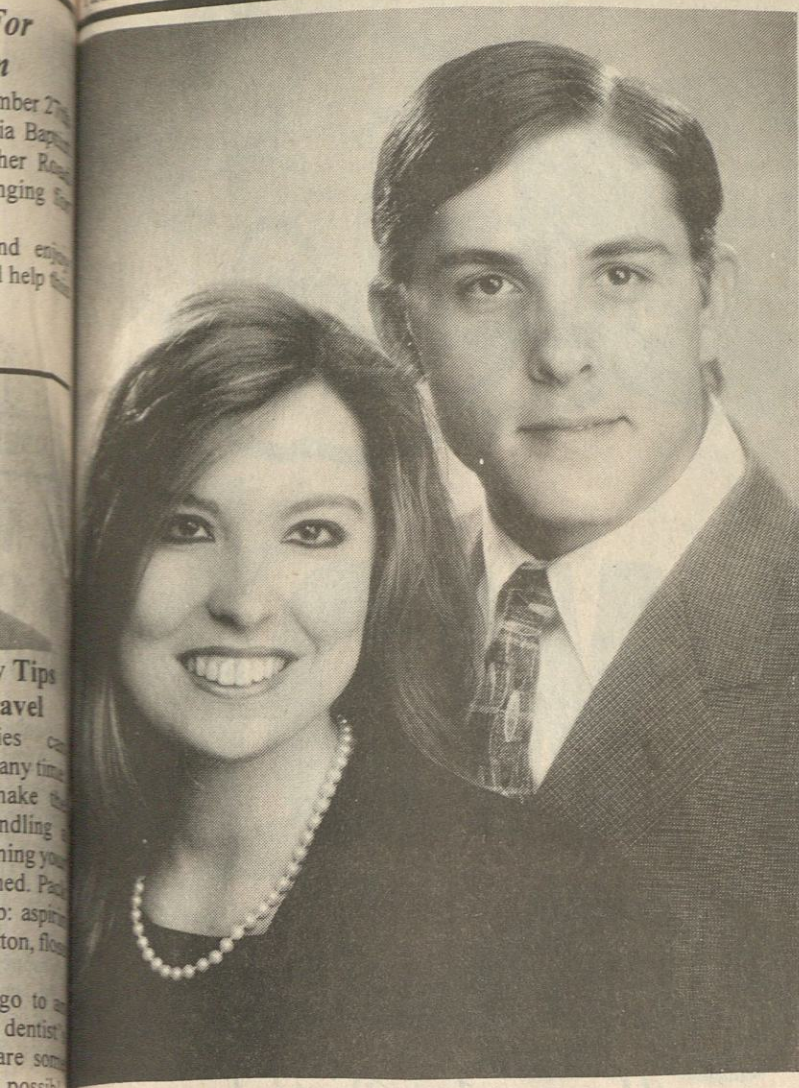
Transformers aren't just on poles anymore. The large green boxes you see near buildings and in new housing developments are called pad-mounted transformers. They contain electrical equipment that serves as the distribution point for underground electrical lines.

This type of transformer poses little danger, but even a slight risk isn't worth taking. Never dig near these transformers and never plant or build anything within 10 feet of them. Also, teach children not to play on or near the transformers. Remember to always think safety around electrical equipment!

## CELTIC Lab for District Technology

The Technology Committee of the Tishomingo County School District in conjunction with the Northeast Regional Library was awarded \$21,000 from the LST Major Library Service Grant to equip a computer lab with eighteen new computers, two printers, a digital camera, a scanner, a multimedia projector and software. The Tishomingo County School board provided matching funds of \$9000. This lab

is located on the Tishomingo County High School campus in the old NASA training center. This lab is called the CELTIC Lab.

CELTIC (Community Electronic Library, Training, and Information Center) will provide a flexibly-scheduled multimedia computer facility, equipped with library online resources, available first for training our local (school and public) Media Specialists and

then for resources and equipment available to students, teachers, and the community. The center will be available during and after school hours. The intent of the center is for projects such as: library software training, MAGNOLIA usage, group school projects, teacher training, parent involvement, Internet access, and community resource center. Ms. Eva Mae Strickland, president, gave a good devotion, using as her scripture Psalm 26, and then read a poem, "Walk With Him". Ms. Shirley Thorne then led in prayer.

Jeanette led the group in the pledge of the flag.

The secretary, Shirley, read the minutes of the previous meeting and did the roll call, and the treasurer, Willard, gave the financial report.

Club members brought their homemade Christmas tree orna-

ments they had made for the Christmas tree at the Holiday House, and everyone was encouraged to attend the Holiday House at the Midway Community Center on November 12.

Final plans were made for the club's bake sale on Saturday, November 20, at the Tishomingo Bank Annex with proceeds going to the club.

Club members are planning to participate in the Tishomingo Christmas Parade on December 4.

The club is giving a \$100 donation to the Tishomingo School Park.

The club was proud to recently nominate two, whom we thought were very deserving of being "Outstanding Citizens of Tishomingo", Mrs. Ila Trimm and Dr. David Sanders, and we want to congratulate Mr. Sanders for winning this great accomplishment!

Our club was well represented at the Northeast Area Fall Leadership Program of the Mississippi Homemaker Volunteers, Inc. at Fulton on October 28 by Ms. Eva Mae Strickland, Ms. Shirley Thorne, and Ms. Louise Puckett. The speaker was a nurse from the North Mississippi Medical Center's Women's Health Institution, and she gave a very good program on "The Difference in a Woman's Heart".

Shirley gave an interesting report on "Hypertension - The Silent Killer." The stress we are under in our environment today helps in-

crease our change of hypertension, or high blood pressure. Another factor that contributes to high blood pressure is the extra weight we carry around which makes our heart have to work harder to pump the blood to the extra areas. However, high blood pressure is not what kills us but instead the problems caused by this, such as stroke, heart attack, hardening of the arteries, and congestive heart failure. A good blood pressure reading is one that is under 140/90. Some of the ways we can prevent hypertension and its problems are to watch our sodium intake, lose a few pounds, and limit our caffeine intake.

Shirley then gave an informative program on "Why Get Mammograms". Just being a woman and getting older puts us at risk for breast cancer. By age 30, our chance is 1 out of 2,525; by age 50, our chance increases to 1 out of 50; by age 70, it increases to 1 out of 14; and by age 80, our chance jumps to 1 out of 10. Other increased risk factors include women over 40 whose mother or sister has had breast cancer, women who have had no children or started their family after the age of 30, women who have had cancer in one breast, and women who are overweight. You can reduce your risk of developing breast cancer by having a baseline mammogram by age 40 and an annual

mammogram thereafter, do breast self-examination every month, and have an annual clinical breast examination by your doctor.

The meeting was adjourned with Ms. Michelle Strickland, parliamentarian, reading the creed, and everyone enjoyed a potluck meal.

The door prize was won by Mrs. Gail Strickland.

Also present, not already mentioned, were Mrs. Sabrina Welch and Ms. Louise Puckett. We were glad to have Mrs. Sue Berryman and also Mrs. Cindy Butts, and her son, Robert, visiting with us, and we hope they decide to come back and visit with us again.

Everyone is looking forward to next month's meeting which will be our Christmas Party at the home of Mrs. Willard Strickland on December 10, at which time secret pals will be revealed.

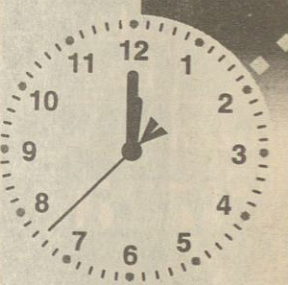

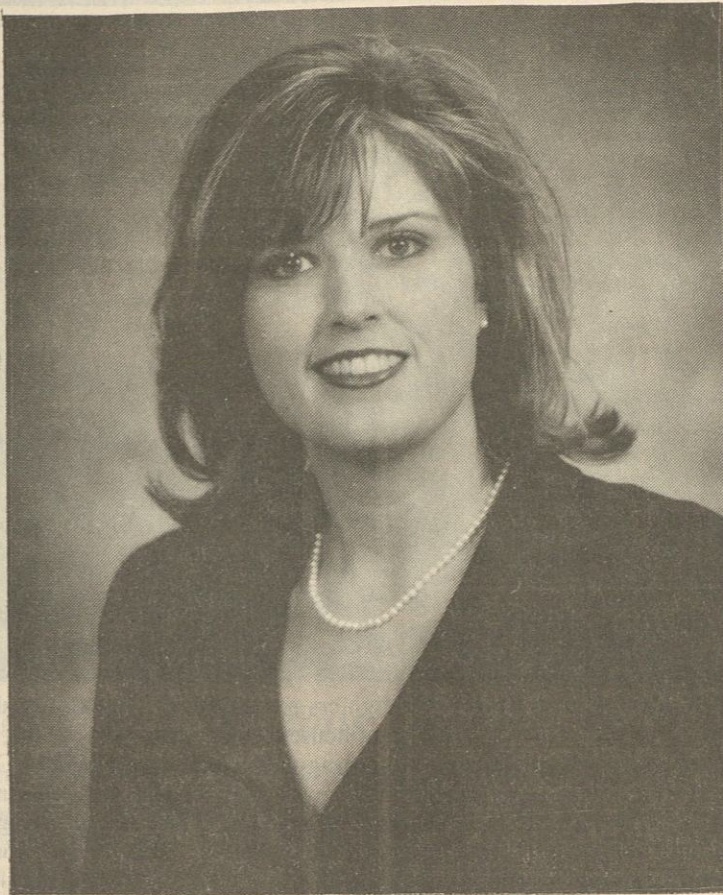

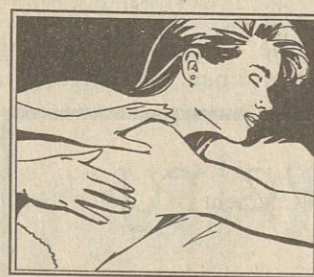

### Tishomingo County Middle School Students Speak Out For The Great American Smokeout Day

In 1971, the first "Smokeout" day was held in Randolph, Mass. Arthur P. Mulvaney asked citizens to give up cigarettes for a day and donate the money they would have spent on cigarettes to a high school scholarship fund. In just five years the event spread across the country.

The American Cancer Society is sponsoring its 23rd "Great American Smokeout". Its aim is to encourage smokers to permanently give up tobacco. Smoking is the single most preventable cause of death in our nation. Everyday 3,000 young people become regular smokers. It is responsible for one in every six deaths. Smoking causes 90% of all lung and throat cancers. Passive smoke kills some 50,000 Americans each year. One nonsmoker dies of secondhand smoke for every eight smokers.

As times have changed, the focus to the Great American Smokeout has evolved from simply helping adults quit smoking to helping children and teenagers understand they should never start smoking in the first place. Our children are learning the dangers of tobacco through the T.I.P. Program. Many have told me that their parents use tobacco and these children are concerned about the health of their parents as well as their own health.

Join this year's 23rd Annual Smokeout and commit to a healthy, smoke-free environment. If you can quit for one day, you're closer to quitting for good. If you need help quitting tobacco, consult your doctor or call Cheryl Clark at the Iuka Hospital.

Participating students wrote a public service announcement promoting the Great American Smokeout Day on November 18. ## Bad Checks: Procedures, Penalties And Prevention

Writing a bad check is a crime in the state of Mississippi.

A bad check is a check the bank will not honor whether it be because of insufficient funds, a closed account, no such account, a forged signature or any reason it is not honored by the bank.

A judge is mandated to issue an arrest warrant for violation of this law if and when the judge is satisfied there exists probable cause to believe that a crime has been committed and the defendant being accused has committed it. Issuance of a bad check with intent to defraud is a crime even though it may have been passed by the president.

**What Do If You Have Received A Bad Check?**  
A bad check complaint may be filed with the Justice Court of the county or with the District Attorney's office. It must be accompanied with the original check and each check must be filed as a separate offense according to Mississippi Code 97-19-35.

In order to start a criminal proceeding on a check returned by insufficient funds, a person or business must first send by registered mail written notice to the defendant advising him the draft or check has been returned and allow him 15 days in which to pick up the check.

Upon filing, the court must have the original check, plus the postal receipt to show written notice was given.

For any other reason other than insufficient funds, you must only sign an affidavit, plus present the original check in order to start proceedings.

#### Penalties For Writing Bad Checks

A bad check with a face amount of less than \$100 is a misdemeanor for a first conviction and is punishable by a fine of not less than \$25 or more than \$500, plus court costs, or imprisonment in the county jail for a term of not more than six months or both imprisonment, plus a fine.

A second offense for a misdemeanor, upon conviction, shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$50, nor more than \$1,000 or imprisonment in the county jail for a term of not less than 30 days, nor more than one year, or by both fine and imprisonment.

Upon a third or any subsequent violation of this section regardless of the amount of the check, the person committing such offense shall be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the state penitentiary for a term not less than one year nor

more than five years.

Upon a conviction of any check where the face amount is \$100 or more, the person convicted has violated a felony punishable by not less than one year nor more than five years.

In addition to and in lieu of any penalty imposed under the provisions of this section, the court may, at its discretion, order any person convicted of this section to make restitution to the business for the check, plus up to a \$30 service charge (Allowed by Miss. Code 97-19-57).

## Highlights Of Monday's School Board Meeting

The Monday night meeting of the Tishomingo County School Board turned out to be relatively short with mostly routine business being conducted including approval of additional substitute teachers, fundraisers, field trips and the use of facilities by outside organizations.

One matter of business worth noting was the awarding of the bid for the proposed communications system for the District's buses.

According to Superintendent John Mullins, after advertising for bids in three area newspapers for a two-way radio system, the District received seven bids. The proposal required, among other things, several mobile and hand-held units and a repeater to be placed on an area tower.

Mullins confirmed that the lowest bidder was Citizens Page of Corinth; however, he said he did not think the company met the specifications set forth in the bid proposal, citing the company's plans to use a 100 watt repeater which would be amplified up to a 110 watt repeater asked for in the original specs.

Mullins said the repeater needed to be a continuous repeater and he did not know if by amplifying the signal, if this would prevent the repeater from acting as a continuous repeater. If it would, he asked the Board to go with the next low bidder, Precision Communications of Amory. Of the seven companies which submitted bids for the project, Precision was the only one to have representatives present at the meeting Monday evening.

Mullins cited that there was only \$50 between the two lowest bidders. The Board decided to let Mullins check and see if the lowest bidder's proposal did meet the requirements and if it did not, to go ahead and award the bid to the second lowest bidder, Precision Communications.

Mullins estimated that the school district will spend between \$32,000 and \$33,000 for the two-way radio system which will include radio units on 60 buses, 24 handheld units, and units at each school, the bus shop and at the

Superintendent's office.

At the last meeting, Board members discussed the possibility of hiring additional help so the roofing project at the Vocational Center could be completed more quickly. Mullins reported to the Board Monday night that two students from the GED program offered by the school district have been hired to help complete the project.

He explained that one student had been required to complete 80 hours of community service by the court system in Alcorn County and is using this as his community service time. Mullins said after these 80 hours, the student will be paid minimum wage. The other student is also being paid minimum wage, Mullins confirmed.
