St. Mary Catholic Church has been in existence in Iuka since the early 1980s. Sister Dolores, who is originally from Johnstown, Penn., came to the church in 1994 and since that time has brought the church to the community through her tireless work with children and those in need.

In addition to directing Catholic Social Services for the area, she has initiated and participates in such worthwhile programs as Samaritan Food Pantry, after-school student-tostudent tutoring programs for kindergarten and first grade students at Iuka and Burnsville Schools, and adult literacy She has been an advocate and a voice for those who often don't have a voice in the community. She works with Project Homestead and supports efforts of the Junior Auxiliary and other area organizations concerned with the needs of the community.

Sister Dolores also has been involved in community church services held in the Iuka area, along with other area ministers.

\$962.25 and won the trophy for the 1998-1999 school year.





Home Economics Tips

Playing It Safe With Eggs

Fresh eggs may contain bacteria that can cause an intestinal infection salmonellosis. Most healthy people recover from these infections within 4 to 7 days but they can lead to severe and even fatal illness, especially for those most vulnerable to foodborne disease - children, the elderly, and persons with immune systems weakened by health problems. You can avoid illness from eggs by knowing how to buy, store, handle and cook them - or foods that contain them - safely.

Buy Safe

*Buy eggs only if sold from a refrigerator or refrigerated case. Open the carton and make sure that the eggs are clean and the shells are not cracked.

*Store eggs in their original carton and refrigerate as soon as

Keep Clean and Don't Cross-

Contaminate *Cook eggs until both the yolk and the white are firm.

Scrambled eggs should not be

containing eggs should be cooked to 160 degrees F (72 degrees C). *If a recipe calls for eggs that

are raw or undercooked when the dish is served, replace it with a recipe that contains only thoroughly cooked eggs. *Serve cooked eggs and egg-

containing foods immediately after cooking. For buffet-style serving, hot egg dishes should be kept hot, and cold egg dishes kept cold. Eggs and egg dishes, such as quiches or souffles, may be refrigerated for serving later but should be thoroughly reheated to 165 degrees F (74 degrees C) before serving.

Refrigerate or Freeze for Safety's

*Refrigerate raw shell eggs

immediately after purchase and use them within 4 to 5 weeks.

*Use hard-cooked eggs (in the shell or peeled) within 1 week

after cooking. *Cooked eggs, including hard-boiled eggs, and egg-

containing foods should not sit out for more than 2 hours. Within 2 hours, either reheat or refrigerate.

year. Eggs should not be frozen in their shells. To freeze whole eggs, beat yolks and whites together. Egg whites can also be frozen by themselves.

*Refrigerate leftover cooked egg dishes up to 3 to 4 days. When refrigerating a large amount of a hot egg-containing leftover, divide it into several shallow containers so it will cool quickly.

Egg Safety Away From Home *Cooked eggs for a picnic should be packed in an insulated cooler with enough ice or frozen gel packs to keep them cold. Don't put the cooler in the trunk - carry it in the passenger compartment of the car. If taking cooked eggs to work or school, pack them with a small frozen gel pack or a frozen juice box.

Avoid Hidden Risks

*Foods containing raw or lightly cooked eggs, such as Caesar salad, homemade ice cream or eggnog, hollandaise sauce, and French toast, can be dangerous, especially for people in the high-risk groups (young children, the elderly, and individuals with weakened immune systems). Many grocery stores carry pasteurized egg products but, since they include only egg whites, they may not work well in traditional recipes for egg-containing Commercial forms of such foods are safe to serve if they are made with pasteurized liquid eggs.

Twitching Eyelids

People are often annoyed and even embarrassed about a tic or witching of the eyelid. This is usually not a medical eye problem, although it is definitely a nuisance and source of embarrassment. People feel selfconscious about the twitch and are certain others not only notice it, but are viewing them as one who is nervous and has a lack of self-assurance. Although it feels very obvious, the twitch is often barely perceptible. It is caused by a fibrillation, or quivering, of the muscles around the eye, invariable the result of fatigue, tension or anxiety. It is not any kind of eye disease or eye muscle disorder.

Once the patient understands that the cause is one of fatigue or tension rather than some potentially serious physical problem, the twitch often vanishes. Anything that can be done to promote internal tranquility and relaxation will help. Resting the eyes, ignoring the tic, covering the eyes with a warm moist cloth, and feeling confident that it is not grossly visible to others, is the most effective therapy.






What's That Big Green Box? Transformers aren't just



160,000 will die from the disease. Hope for lung cancer lies in early detection. Currently, more than 85 percent of those diagnosed with lung cancer have late-stage disease. Recently published research in the scientific journal, The Lancet, indicates that the use of computerized tomography (CT) scans can dramatically improve those statistics. CT scans can detect lung cancer in its earliest stages, years before it will show up on a conventional chest x-ray.

The key is knowing if you're

at risk. Anyone with a history of smoking, especially those who began to smoke in adolescence, are at risk for developing lung cancer. Other risk factors include exposure to second-hand smoke, family history of lung cancer and exposure to environmental carcinogens such as radon, asbestos and diesel fuel.

The Alliance for Lung Cancer advocates that people at risk for lung cancer be carefully monitored by their physician and discuss lung cancer options including pulmonary function tests, chest x-rays, sputum cytology, PET (position emission tomography

(magnetic resonance imaging), as well as CT scans.





Shirley gave an interesting report on "Hypertension - The Silent Killer." The stress we are under in our environment today helps in-

on "The Difference in a Woman's

crease our change of hypertension, or high blood pressure. Another factor that contributes to high blood pressure is the extra weight we carry around which makes our heart have to work harder to pump the blood to the extra areas. However, high blood pressure is not what kills us but instead the problems caused by this, such as stroke, heart attack, hardening of the arteries, and congestive heart failure. A good blood pressure reading is one that is under 140/90. Some of the ways we can prevent hypertension and its problems are to watch our sodium intake, lose a few pounds, and limit

our caffeine intake. Shirley then gave an informative program on "Why Get Mammograms". Just being a woman and getting older puts us at risk for breast cancer. By age 30, our chance is 1 out of 2,525; by age 50, our chance increases to 1 out of 50; by age 70, it increases to 1 out of 14; and by age 80, our chance jumps to 1 out of 10. Other increased risk factors include women over 40 whose mother or sister has had breast cancer, women who have had no children or started their family after the age of 30, women who have had cancer in one breast, and women who are overweight. You can reduce you risk of developing breast cancer by having a baseline mammogram by age 40 and an annual

mammogram thereafter, do breast self-examination every month, and have an annual clinical breast examination by your doctor.

In order to start a criminal eding on a check returned by efficient funds, a person or ness must first send by registered written notice to the defendant ising him the draft or check has ten returned and allow him 15 days which to pick up the check.

Upon filing, the court must re the original check, plus the stal receipt to show written notice

For any other reason other than fficient funds, you must only sign affidavit, plus present the original beck in order to start proceedings. Penalties For Writing Bad

Checks
A bad check with a face amount less than \$100 is a misdemeanor a first conviction and is ishable by a fine of not less than 15 or more than \$500, plus court ts, or imprisonment in the county for a term of no more than six or both imprisonment, plus a

A second offense for a demeanor, upon conviction, shall punishable by a fine of not less \$50, nor more than \$1,000 or risonment in the county jail for a of not less than 30 days, nor tre than one year, or by both fine imprisonment.

Upon a third or any subsequent ation of this section regardless of amount of the check, the person itting such offense shall be alty of a felony punishable by sonment in the state penitentiary more than five years.

Upon a conviction of any check where the face amount is \$100 or more, the person convicted has violated a felony punishable by not less than one year nor more than five

In addition to and in lieu of any penalty imposed under the provisions of this section, the court may, at its discretion, order any person convicted of this section to make restitution to the business for the check, olus up to a \$30 service charge (Allowed by Miss. Code 97-19-57). Best Defense Is

Prevention Even though the laws are very stiff for this offence, sometimes it is very hard to get a person arrested and prought to court for prosecution for these crimes. If the business owner or employees, or an individual taking the

fice. It must be accompanied with check would spend a few seconds to check an I.D. to be sure the person presenting the check is the one he or she says they are and write on the check a driver's license number or some type of identification, it really helps the law officer who is trying to arrest the person since we have several people with the same name. We have several people who move around a lot from county to county which makes it very hard to locate the right person without something to go

We have officers who will do the job and courts which will prosecute, but we need your help to slow down this problem. If you don't know the person wanting to write you a check, or they are not a regular customer and have no identification, then be safe rather than sorry—don't make the sale. It's better to lose a sale than to lose everything for a bad check that can't be collected because no one knows the person, the address where to locate the person or, in some cases, the person doesn't exist.

We have had several cases lately where checks were stolen and couldn't be prosecuted because the businesses didn't check any I.D. and had no idea who passed the check so they lost their money. The person with the stolen checks could not prosecute for the theft because no one knew who to charge.

With everyone's help and a little extra effort, maybe in the coming months we can make an improvement in this growing

Highlights Of Monday's School Board Meeting

by Angela Lambert

The Monday night meeting of the Tishomingo County School Board turned out to be relatively short with mostly routine business being conducted including approval of additional substitute teachers, fundraisers, field trips and the use of facilities by outside organizations.

One matter of business worth noting was the awarding of the bid for the proposed communications system for the District's

According to Superintendent John Mullins, after advertising for bids in three area newspapers for a two-way radio system, the District received seven bids. The proposal required, among other things, several mobile and hand-held units and a repeater to be placed on an area tower.

Mullins confirmed that the lowest bidder was Citizens Page of Corinth; however, he said he did not think the company met the specifications set forth in the bid proposal, citing the companies plans to use a 100 watt repeater which would be amplified up to a 110 watt repeater asked for in the original specs.

Mullins said the repeater needed to be a continuous repeater and he did not know if by amplifying the signal, if this would prevent the repeater from acting as a continuous repeater. If it would, he asked the Board to go with the next low bidder, Precision Communications of Amory. Of the seven companies which submitted bids for the project, Precision was the only one to have representatives present at the meeting Monday evening.

Mullins cited that there was

only \$50 between the two lowest bidders. The Board decided to let Mullins check and see if the lowest bidder's proposal did meet the requirements and if it did not, to go ahead and award the bid to the second lowest bidder, Precision Communications.

Mullins estimated that the school district will spend between \$32,000 and \$33,000 for the twoway radio system which will include radio units on 60 buses, 24 handheld units, and units at each school, the bus shop and at the
