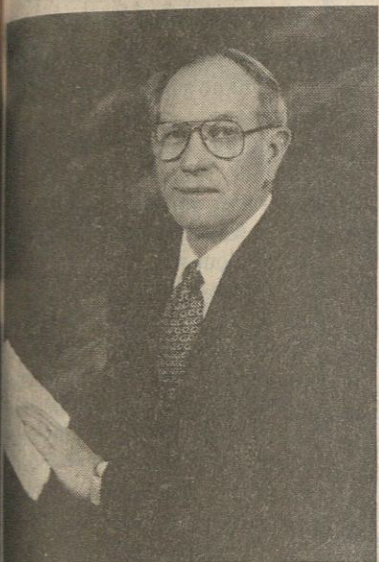

Based on these observations, Tishomingo County Sheriff David Smith would like to take this opportunity to warn residents to take extra precautions with valuable items left in your vehicle.

"Everyone needs to be sure that they do not leave their checkbooks, purses, wallets, gifts or anything else of value in plain view when they leave their

vehicles," Smith said. "A thief who spots any of these things can break into a locked vehicle, get the item or items and be gone in a matter of seconds."

The Sheriff advises residents to either take the item or items with them when they go in somewhere, or to put them out of view in the trunk of the vehicle, being careful of who might be watching.

"I hate that it has come to that," Smith stated. "But times are just different now."

Home Economics Tips

Are You Ready For That Thanksgiving Turkey?

There are many points to consider when purchasing your Thanksgiving turkey. If choosing a whole turkey, allow about one pound per person. This will still allow for a moderate amount of leftovers. However, if you want to have a lot of leftover turkey, allow up to 1-1/2 pounds per person. Before purchasing your turkey, be sure your roasting pan, oven and refrigerator can accommodate its size. Some cooks have found it easier to purchase two smaller turkeys rather than one larger turkey. The smaller turkeys take less time to roast and they tend to stay moister.

After purchasing your perfect turkey, you need to take the proper steps for storage. Turkeys need to be kept at a temperature of 40 degrees Fahrenheit or below. A whole, frozen turkey, kept at zero degrees Fahrenheit in its original packaging, may be kept for up to one year. A properly thawed turkey may be refrigerated in its original packaging, may be kept for up to one year. A properly thawed turkey may be refrigerated from 1 to 5 days if kept in its original packing. Fresh turkeys may only last one to two days in a refrigerator at 40 degrees Fahrenheit or below.

Several days may be required for proper thawing of your turkeys, depending on its size. Never thaw your turkey at room temperature! Thawing in the refrigerator is the most recommended method. Microwave ovens do not heat evenly and tend to heat quicker along the bone. When using the refrigerator method, allow five hours per pound. For example:

WEIGHT (LBS.)	THAWING TIME (DAYS)
8-12 lbs.	1-2 days
12-16 lbs.	2-3 days
16-20 lbs.	3-4 days
20-24 lbs.	4-5 days

Once your turkey has been properly thawed, you may begin to prepare it for roasting. Preheat your oven to the temperature specified by your recipe making sure that the temperature is no lower than 325 degrees Fahrenheit. Be sure to remove the giblets from the inside of your turkey. After removing the giblets, rinse the whole turkey under cool running water. Rub your hands over the turkey to help remove any bacteria or lumps of fat. Pat the turkey dry and season according to

your recipe. The turkey may cool to room temperature, but do not let it sit out for longer than one hour.

If you choose to stuff your turkey, do not insert the stuffing until you are ready to roast it. If you pre-stuff your turkey, you run the risk of food poisoning. Stuffing is easily contaminated, especially if it is left inside the turkey. Allow a half-cup of stuffing per pound of turkey. Do not pack the stuffing inside the turkey because it will expand as it cooks. If you want extra stuffing, cook it separately. Stuffing cooks unevenly, so a stuffed turkey needs to cook longer than an unstuffed turkey.

Always check the temperature of the turkey before deciding that it is done. The turkey must reach a minimum of 180 degrees Fahrenheit in the thigh, the stuffing should reach 165 degrees Fahrenheit and the breast should reach 170 degrees Fahrenheit. If pricked, the juices from the turkey should be slightly pink or clear.

The following table shows the approximate roasting times for a turkey in a 325 degree Fahrenheit oven:

WEIGHT (LBS.)	ROASTING TIME (HOURS)
8-12	2 3/4 - 3
12-14	3-3 3/4
14-18	3 3/4-4 1/4
18-20	4 1/4-4 1/2
20-24	4 1/2 - 5

Once your roasting is complete, do not let the turkey sit on the kitchen counter or dining room table all afternoon! Uneaten turkey needs to be refrigerated within two hours after cooking. Debone the turkey and refrigerate in shallow containers. Another point to remember is that the turkey and leftover dressing should not be stored together. Any refrigerated turkey and/or dressing should be used within three days after cooking or frozen for later use. Leftovers should be reheated thoroughly to a temperature of 165 degrees Fahrenheit or until hot and steaming.

Make-Up And Contacts

When a woman switches from glasses to contacts it's natural for her to begin using more eye make-up. That's perfectly all right if its done carefully and properly.

Put the lenses on before applying make-up. Use water soluble products, and avoid getting any on the contacts. Be careful with mascara which contains tiny hair-like fibers. Soft lenses can actually be pierced by these particles and are generally vulnerable to any make-up. Any make-up, however, has the potential for irritating the eye and contaminating the lens.

Aerosol sprays of any type are a disaster for soft lenses and also bad with hard ones. If you do use a spray, close your eyes during use and move to another area or room when done. Make sure there is not make-up on your fingers when you handle the lenses. This also applies to soaps which contain lotions, creams, or perfumes. Use a mild soap and some common sense to eliminate problems.

Understanding Your Vet

When you're in your veterinarian's office, do you ever get the feeling he or she is speaking a foreign language? Your vet is probably trying very hard to make himself understood, but technical words for diseases and body parts still creep in. This column will explain terms that you're likely to hear from your veterinarian and help you better understand the health of your pets.

Anemia: A loss of red cells in the blood. This can be caused by injury, poor diet or severe parasite infestations, among other things.

Ascites: Excess fluid that has collected outside the blood circulatory system. If occurs in the abdominal cavity and is often seen with heart disease. Compare Edema.

Edema: Excess fluid that has collected outside the blood circulatory system and causes swelling, especially in the legs and lower abdomen. It is often seen with heart failure or anemia. Pulmonary edema (excess fluid in the lungs) occurs with forms of heart failure.

Kidneys: A pair of organs in the abdominal cavity that filter the blood, excrete by-products from the body and conserve water.

Urolithiasis: A condition in which substances in the urine build up to form a stone or stones in the urinary tract, usually in the bladder or a kidney.

Running and Swimming Bad for Your Teeth?

Unknowingly some fitness-conscious people may be damaging their teeth. Long distance running tones muscles and raises aerobic endurance, but it can cause dental damage in a roundabout way.

Some runners suck wedges of lemon to prevent the mouth and throat dryness that results from exertion and perspiration. Although the lemon stimulates saliva flow, the acids from it can erode the tooth's protective enamel. The result can be an outbreak of cavities and the need for extensive restorative dental treatment.

Tooth erosion itself can be painful. Often marked by yellow or chalky-white discoloration and a feeling of grittiness, the condition can make teeth sensitive to temperature and pressure.

Individuals who swim the way to fitness in gas-chlorinated pools are at increased risk from "swimmer's tooth." Erosion of dental enamel and other changes in the teeth can occur when water in a swimming pool reaches higher-than-recommended levels of acidity. When the chlorine mixes with the pool water, it produces hydrochloric acid, which can destroy enamel. To use a gas-chlorinated pool, remind the pool manager that pH (acidity) level of the water is just as important as the chlorine level. If your teeth feel gritty, chalky or sensitive to hot or cold after swimming, give our office a call.

The above tips are temporary emergency measures for when you are away from home. Call our office and we will be able to advise you on what to do until your return home, or give you a referral. You can also call local or state dental society for a referral, or ask the hospital emergency room to recommend a dentist. If you're out of the country, contact the U.S. Embassy or consulate, or ask local personnel to refer you to a dentist.

What's That Big Green Box?

This type of transformer poses little danger, but even a slight risk isn't worth taking. Never dig near these transformers and never plant or build anything within 10 feet of them. Also, teach children not to play on or near the transformers. Remember to always think safety around electrical equipment!

This annual event encourages smokers to give up cigarettes that day in order to prove to themselves that they can quit for a day, or possible even a lifetime.

Tobacco use is responsible for nearly one of every five deaths in the United States. Smoking is the most preventable cause of death and disease, yet more than 419,000 people will die this year from smoking-related illness. The American Cancer Society estimates that tobacco use will cause about 173,000 cancer deaths in 1999, accounting for about one-third of all cancer deaths. Nearly half of all smokers between ages 35 and 69 die prematurely. Smokers may even be giving up an average of 20-25 years of their lives.

As part of the North Mississippi Health Services' Live Well community health initiative, the staff of Iuka Hospital challenges all smokers in our community to participate in the Great American smokeout. Information on tobacco use, cancer and tips for quitting smoking will be provided in the hospital's lobby. The information is also useful for non-smokers who are encouraging friends and relatives who smoke to participate in the Great American smokeout.

Letter To The Editor

The 1996 poverty rates recently released by the Census Bureau reveal a "good news-bad news" situation for Mississippi. While data show Mississippi remains among the poorest states, the Bureau's report also shows Mississippi led the nation in the reduction of child poverty in all but one age group since the 1990 Census.

Mississippi ranked first in the

overall decline of poverty with a 4.4 percent reduction for the period. The state also led the nation with a 3.8 percent decline in the population under age 18. This included a poverty rate decline in children between the ages of 5 and 17 of 5.3 percent. The smaller, but significant decline of 1.1 percent in child poverty rates was reported for children under five years of age, ranking Mississippi fifth among all states in the decline of poverty in this age group.

Although far too many of our children and their families continue to live in poverty, these new numbers are encouraging. They are also a reminder of the

importance of the upcoming 2000 Census.

Children are more likely to be overlooked in the Census than other age group. Low-income, younger and minority children are particularly vulnerable to being undercounted. Many of the programs and services that support low-income families as they move out of poverty are based on Census data.

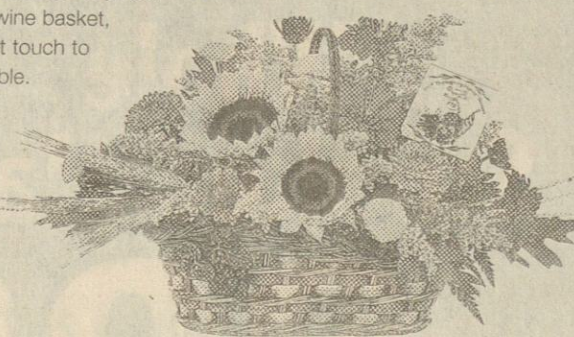

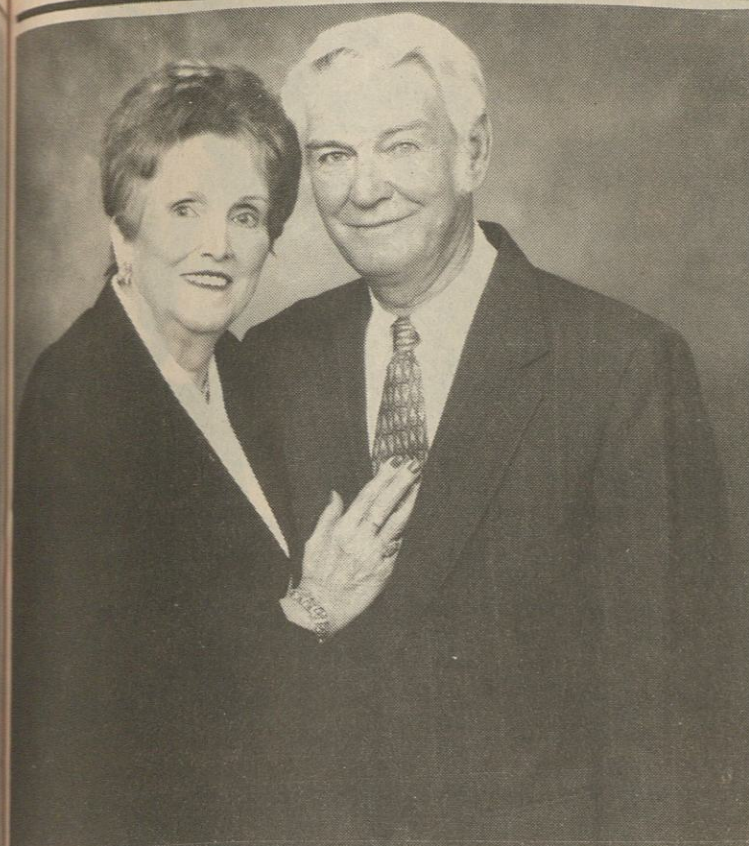

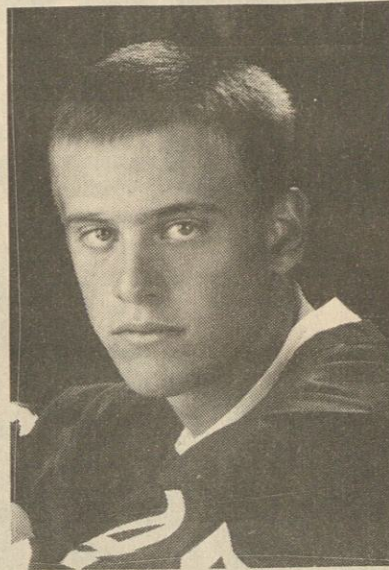

The AAFP represents more than 88,000 family physicians, family practice residents and medical students. The AAFP was instrumental in establishing the specialty of family practice in 1969. It was also the first medical specialty organization to require its members to earn 150 hours of approved continuing education every three years.

Unemployment In County Drops In Sept.

According to Jimmy Rowland, Manager of the Mississippi State Employment Service, unemployment in Tishomingo County dropped to 7.6 percent in mid-September. This compares to 8.4 percent in August and 10.6 percent in September, 1998.

The civilian labor force for the county numbered 8,570, 50 less than August and 510 less than September of last year. Approximately 7,920 Tishomingo county residents held jobs while 650 were out of work.

Manufacturing jobs in the county numbered 2,600 and nonmanufacturing jobs numbered 3,390.

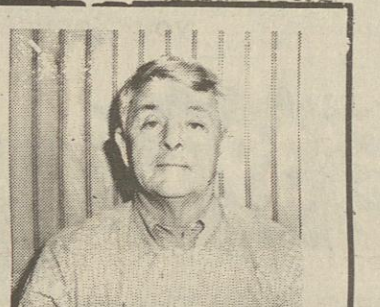

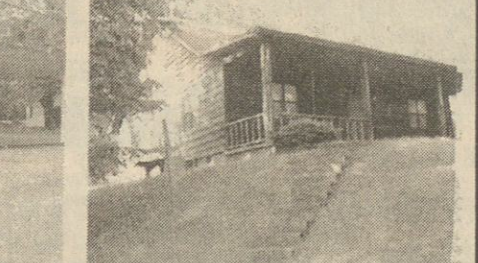

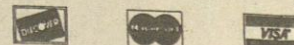
