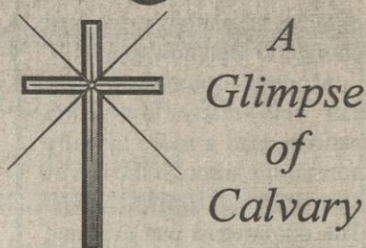

Randy Stringer Voted In As Iuka's Chief Of Police In Tuesday's Election

In a good voter turnout Tuesday, April 18, in the city of Iuka, candidate Randy Stringer defeated his opponent, Robert Till, for the city's office of Police Chief.

According to Iuka City Clerk Benny Gray, the unofficial totals were Stringer—584 and Till—194.

Gray explained that there were a few affidavit votes left to confirm Tuesday morning, but that these would not be enough to change the overall results.

Gray said that a total of 823

voters came to the polls Tuesday.

Stringer, who served as assistant Chief of Police for the city under retired Chief Amos Bates, was scheduled to be sworn in sometime Tuesday, according to the Clerk. Stringer had been appointed and served as interim chief of the city until this election could be held. Chief Stringer will complete the unexpired term of approximately one year which remains after Bates' recent retirement.

Gray said that the regular election for the office will be held next year.

Two-Vehicle Wreck On Natchez Trace Claims Life Of Iuka Man

A wreck Monday morning involving two vehicles on the Natchez Trace Parkway claimed the life of an Iuka man and left a Marietta woman in critical condition.

Myron J. Green, 48, of Iuka, was killed when his vehicle collided head-on with another vehicle, driven by Teresa Baker, 38, of Marietta.

According to Natchez Trace Parkway Assistant Chief Ranger Tim Francis, Green, who was northbound on the Trace in his 1999 Ford Contour, was headed home from his night shift job at Cooper Tire in Tupelo when he collided with the southbound 1994 Ford Explorer driven by Baker.

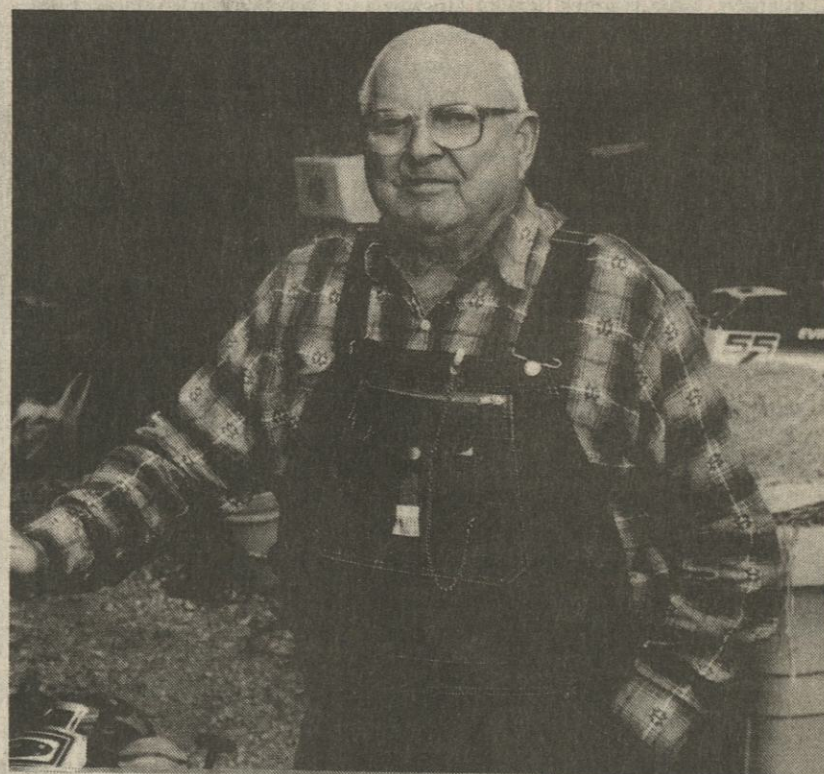
Francis said the accident occurred at about 7:30 a.m. near

where the Natchez Trace intersects with Mississippi Highway 371 in Itawamba County.

Green was pronounced dead at the scene by the Itawamba County Coroner. Baker was airlifted to North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo where she remained in intensive care at press time with internal injuries and multiple fractures, according to Francis.

There were no eyewitnesses to the accident, but it is suspected that Green may have gone to sleep while driving. The Park Ranger said Green was not wearing his seatbelt at the time of the collision. Baker was wearing her seatbelt, he confirmed.

Francis said the exact cause of the accident is still under investigation.



Funeral Services Held For Longtime Iuka Businessman Virgil Ledbetter

Longtime Iuka Fisherman and Businessman Virgil Ledbetter, 85, died Monday, April 17, 2000 at Eliza Coffee Memorial Hospital in Florence, Ala.

Virgil, known to many as "Poppa," settled in Iuka in the 1930s. Over the years, he owned and operated several businesses in the Iuka area. He is probably best known for his business, Ledbetter & Sons Fish Market and Sporting Goods, which he operated for over sixty years.

Through the years, thousands and thousands of pounds of Virgil's fish has fed everyone from dignitaries to everyday working people. In 1972, he catered the groundbreaking ceremony for the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway feeding about 3,000 people, including the governors from six Southern states.

Virgil was a member of Mount Evergreen Methodist Church.

Virgil was born Jan. 25,

1915, in New Hope, Ala., to parents Charley Eugene and Icie Dora Saint Ledbetter.

He was preceded in death by his wife of 50 years, Madine Pruitt Ledbetter; two sons, Hubert Ledbetter and Varnell Ledbetter; one daughter, Helen Ledbetter; two brothers and two sisters.

Survivors include four sons, Charles Ledbetter of Lancaster, South Carolina; J.A. Ledbetter of Yellville, Arkansas; Johnny Ledbetter and Clyde Ledbetter, both of Iuka; two daughters, Kathy Haataja of Cloverdale, Alabama and Carolyn Zagrodzky of Iuka; 11 grandchildren, 13 great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandchild.

Services were at 2 p.m. Wednesday, April 19, at Ludlam's Funeral Chapel in Iuka with Pastors W.T. Dexter and Dan Minnix officiating. Burial was in New Prospect Cemetery.

Pallbearers were Donny Williams, Bob Pannell, Kenneth Mobley, George Hudson, Barry Lee Dees and Curtis Seago.

Bill Hanna, Director of Local Government Records Program, Department of Archives and History was the speaker of the evening. Mr. Hanna began working with the MDAH in 1974 serving in many capacities before assuming his new role as Director of Local Government Records.

The Local Government Records Bill gives the MDAH the authority to become involved in the management of local records management. This bill is being used to make the jobs of all County Courthouse officials much easier. Non participating counties operate under the old law with scattered retention periods mentioned in the code, but ultimately one section of the bill says that if you want to throw anything away, you must have written permission from the department of archives.

With this new law, the MDAH can assist participating counties in designing a constructive plan for archiving and/or destroying county records based on their administrative and physical

Mr. Hanna reported that the ground breaking of the new building for the Mississippi Department of Archives and History was held in March of this year and is scheduled to open in June.

Since its creation in 1903, the MDAH has been housed in several locations. It is the second oldest state archives in the nation and is 30+ years older than the national archives. The new building will triple the amount of storage that they now have. Amongst its many accomplishments and improvements is the research room, which will accommodate 140 researchers. A photo of this new building can be viewed in the genealogy department of the Iuka Public Library.

Playing It Safe With Eggs

Fresh eggs may contain bacteria that can cause an intestinal infection called salmonellosis. Most healthy people recover from these infections within 4 to 7 days but they can lead to severe and even fatal illness, especially for those most vulnerable to foodborne disease - children, the elderly, and persons with immune systems weakened by health problems. You can avoid illness from eggs by knowing how to buy, store, handle and cook them - or foods that contain them - safely.

BUY SAFE

*Buy eggs only if sold from a refrigerator or refrigerated case. Open the carton and make sure that the eggs are clean.

*Store eggs in their original

carton and refrigerate as soon as possible.

KEEP CLEAN AND DON'T

CROSS-CONTAMINATE

*Wash hands, utensils, equipment, and work areas with hot soapy water before and after they come in contact with eggs and egg-containing foods.

*If a recipe calls for eggs that are raw or undercooked when the dish is served, replace it with a

One murder every 31 minutes.

One robbery every minute.

One woman is raped and/or sexually assaulted every three minutes.

Approximately six children are reported abused or neglected in America every minute.

Statistics have shown that 31 million Americans were victimized by crime last year.

While the national crime rates are lower now than in the 1990s, the numbers are still high.

Local Soldier Michael C. Johnson Attends Navy School Of Explosive Ordnance Disposal

In the movies, our hero always finds and defuses the bomb seconds away from detonation. Armed with only a set of wire clippers between him and oblivion, he always cuts the right wire just in the nick of time to save the world and foil the bad guys.

In real life, simply clipping the red wire doesn't disarm bombs, and it isn't left up to Hollywood's latest leading man to deal with the threat. In real life, it's the son of a Tishomingo couple who will have the dangerous responsibility of disarming explosives.

Michael C. Johnson, son of Charles R. and Patricia P. Johnson of 363 Highway 365, Tishomingo, is learning the dangerous business of disarming munitions as a student at the Navy School of Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) at Eglin Air Force Base, Fla.

"The reason I chose EOD is because I wanted to further my military career and I thought this field would be the best for me," explained Johnson, a 1997 graduate of Tishomingo County High School.

While attending the seven-month, joint-service EOD course, Johnson's days are filled with a curriculum that includes everything from pipe bombs to advanced nuclear weapons.

Students must make it through eight divisions, including the core division, demolition, tools and methods, biological and chemical, ground ordnance, air ordnance, improvised explosive devices and nuclear weapons. Navy students attend an additional underwater ordnance and operations division.

With such a diverse curriculum, and the inherent need for students to learn their craft well, EOD school is a challenge for all who enter its classrooms.

"The worst part of EOD would have to be the long hours and being away from my family,"

Johnson said.

The first paragraph of the Air Force EOD training manual sums up the lot of detonation experts. "EOD is a science of vague assumptions, based on debatable data, taken from inconclusive experiments, with instruments of problematic accuracy, by persons of questionable mentality." The training, which involves detonating live explosives and working hands on with some of the most destructive munitions in the world, is not for the faint of

heart.

The decision to work with live munitions isn't an easy one to make and it's a decision that may be hard for students' families to accept.

"After I explained to everyone what EOD is they were shocked," Johnson said. "All my friends and relatives think I'm a little bit crazy, but everyone wishes me good luck."

It's hard to disagree with the fact that rendering safe unexploded ordnance is a dangerous job, but with a classroom ratio of one instructor to every 25 students - which increases to a one-to-one ratio on the demolition range - the EOD school has a history of safety.

Since the school was built in 1988, more than 7,000 EOD students including international students from 72 different countries, have made it through without an explosive accident.

"The hardest thing for me is going to be performing a recon on a live ordnance for the first time," Johnson said.

"Initial success or complete failure" is a saying in the EOD world, and although Johnson probably won't star in a Hollywood blockbuster, EOD school will prepare him for "initial success" in places like Bosnia, Kosovo, Laos, Cambodia and the Arabian Gulf where EOD technicians are saving lives.
