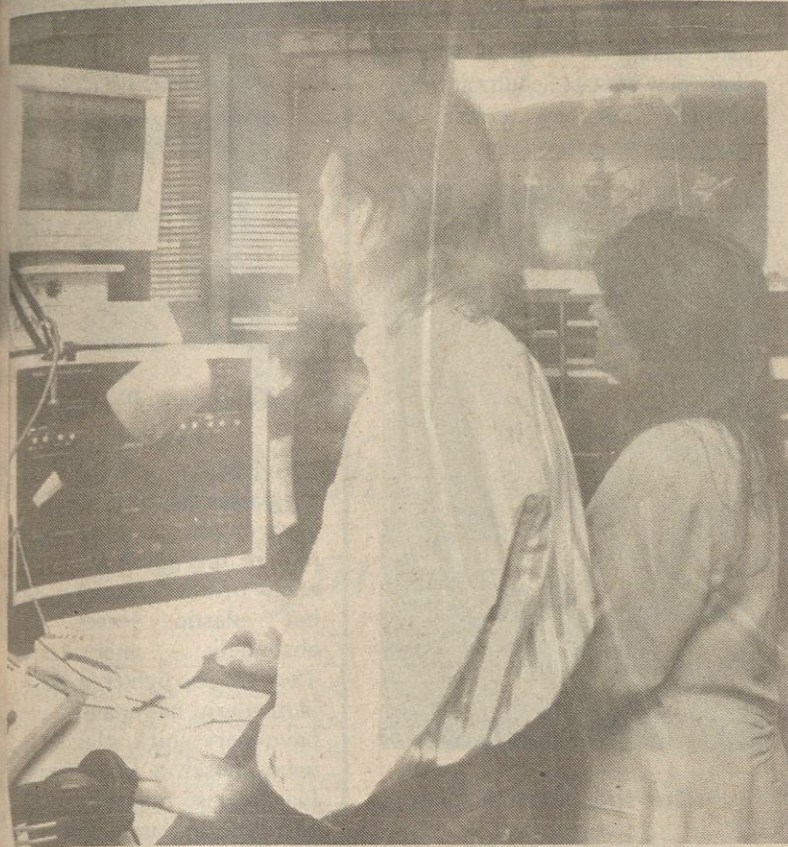

### Radio Station, Fun 91.9, Offers State-Of-The-Art Weather Coverage For Local Area

Who do you turn to when bad weather is approaching? How can I find out if torrential rain, hail or maybe even a tornado is headed toward my community?

While the local television and radio stations have been able to give very general information about our area, a newly installed service at the county's newest radio station—WOWL-91.9 Burnsville, Miss.—can now give very specific weather reports.

According to Fun 91 Operations Manager Tom "Doc" Clifton, the station's new 24-hour a day weather radar system, can pinpoint specific communities in Tishomingo County and 10 surrounding counties.

The system offers two single sight radars, where most systems offer only one. There is always the possibility that one system could go out. With Fun 91's two systems, there is a back-up so that the people in the area are not left without weather information.

Fun 91 Manager LeeAnn Robertson explained that their goal was to have somewhere for the people in this area, often overlooked by other radar systems, to tune in to in the event of bad weather.

The Doppler radar updates every six minutes. It gives a satellite picture and NEXRAD (or next generation radar) from Columbus and also radar from the

Memphis Weather Center.

Clifton said that accurate predictions for our area can be made for weather that is approximately 16 hours away or less. The only weather which could not be seen heading for the area in advance would be something which develops immediately overhead, which happens from time-to-time.

Fun 91 Owner Rick Biddle said that the station has safeguards for weather which moves into the area during the night. A notification system which monitors the weather 24-hours a day is part of the system. It will broadcast information on the air about the on-coming storms, as well as paging him and others to have them come to the station.

Clifton said that in the event of a power outage, the station is equipped with an emergency generator which will automatically start, ensuring that the system is never down.

"We think it is important to let our listeners know the weather for their specific area, not just what it is doing in Memphis or somewhere else," Robertson said. "We are very pleased to be able to provide this service to our listeners."

### School Board Approves New Principals For Iuka Elementary and Burnsville Elementary

At its May 8th meeting, the Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District Board of Education finalized the selection of principals for Burnsville and Iuka Elementary Schools. Pat Jones was approved as the principal of Burnsville Elementary School and Nancy Parker was approved as principal at Iuka Elementary School. The recommendations of both principals received the unanimous consent of the board.

Mrs. Jones comes to Burnsville Elementary from Perry County, Mississippi with twenty-five years experience and an Educational Specialist degree. In Perry County, Mississippi Mrs. Jones successfully served as a teacher, a principal, and as superintendent.

Mrs. Parker also possesses an Educational Specialist degree and a highly impressive array of related experiences. In her career she has taught first grade for six years and fourth grade for twelve years. For the past decade she has

served the Colbert County School District as Principal of Cherokee Middle School. Mrs. Parker is the wife of Tishomingo County native and Iuka High School graduate, Larry Parker.

Both principals will begin work at the respective schools in June.

In other business the Board approved a routine assortment of requests for use of facilities, fund raisers, and field trips.

In a report to the board, Superintendent John Mullins indicated that Burnsville Elementary School, Iuka Elementary School, and Tishomingo Elementary School all had recently met, without any violations, the standards prescribed by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. All three schools were recently visited by a SACS evaluating team. Mullins commended the staffs and students of these schools for their efforts.

### House Bill Gets Priority Attention To Iuka Airport Work

Rep. Wicker says Appropriations Bill directs FAA to consider grant application

The House Appropriations Committee has approved legislation giving priority consideration to funding improvements at the Iuka Airport, U. S. Rep. Roger F. Wicker said Tuesday.

The Department of Transportation Appropriations Act of 2001 contains language directing the Federal Aviation Administration to give its highest priority to the grant application for work at Iuka.

The proposed \$3.9 million project includes extending the runway an additional 2800 feet and widening it by 40 feet. Additional work would consist of relocating an existing county road to accommodate the runway improvements.

The designation does not guarantee funding in Fiscal Year 2001, but directs the FAA to consider the project within the limits of its discretionary grant program.

Wicker, who serves on the Appropriations Committee, said, "I am pleased we were able to include the Iuka Airport project on the priority list. It reflects the Committee's intent that the FAA give every consideration to funding these much-needed improvements."

Dr. Kelly Segars, president

of the Iuka Airport Board, a continual advocate of improvements to the Iuka Airport said he had contacted Rep. Wicker who had graciously agreed to help with the project.

"A longer runway is crucial for the continued economic development of this area and the Tri-State Commerce Park," Segars stated. "The key to the terrific success of the Corinth Industrial Park has been the city's ability to handle corporate jet aircraft."

Dr. Segars and other members of the Airport Board have worked with county leaders to get this project underway.

"Intelligent people are aware that money has to be spent for development of infrastructure before industrial development will occur," Segars commented. "I'd especially like to thank third District Supervisors Danny Ryan for his assistance."

Segars said he expects to meet with Rep. Wicker and also Sen. Trent Lott (R-Miss.) this weekend to ask for their continued assistance with this project.

The members of the Iuka Airport Board, who have worked tirelessly for community improvements, are Segars, O.C. Nelson, Jimmy Pyle, Jack Thorne and David Murrah.

Mr. Franks, a District Fisheries Biologist with the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks in Aberdeen, MS, presented a slide presentation on Farm Pond Management. Bro. ## MSU Project Studies Black Walnut Trees

Mississippi landowners with naturally occurring black walnut trees have an opportunity to participate in a Mississippi State University research project.

Funded by the John and Jane Player Endowment, the study by the MSU Forest and Wildlife Research Center is designed to characterize good walnut planting sites and the time needed to produce marketable trees.

"The black walnut has highly-valued wood that is used in fine furniture, cabinetry, interior paneling, gunstocks, and other specialty products," said forestry professor Emily Schultz, leader of the study. "Little is known, however, about the distribution, growth, and site requirements of walnut trees in Mississippi."

The majority of information concerning site and management requirements for black walnut has come from the Midwest and the eastern U.S. where the trees are grown for planned future income and attracting and enhancing wildlife populations.

"In general, walnut in the deep South has received very little attention except for the harvest of high-value individual trees," Schultz said. "We know, however that it requires proper site and soil conditions, as well as intensive management to increase the value of the wood and decrease the time it takes to produce marketable logs."

In addition to identifying planting sites and determining economic returns, the MSU study will identify management techniques and select trees to be included in a breeding program for

superior trees adapted to Mississippi.

To complete the study, the researchers are seeking the assistance of Mississippi landowners who have naturally occurring black walnut trees in a wooded environment.

"We would like to take soil samples and collect height, diameter and age data for walnut trees and surrounding trees on forested sites," Schultz said. "This information will help us understand the requirement of the black walnut tree in the South."

### Glass vs. Plastic Lenses

Corrective lenses in eyeglasses can be made up in glass or plastic. Most states require that glass lenses be made of shatterproof glass, but plastic lenses are absolutely unbreakable. They are also lighter, which is particularly important if you have very thick glasses or have chosen a large frame. Plastic lenses may add to the cost of your glasses, but most people would agree that they are worth the difference.

Although plastic lenses do scratch more easily than glass ones, scratches can be avoided if proper care is taken. Scratches occur only when you allow the lenses to come in contact with a hard surface. If you do not drop them or lay them down on a table or other hard surface, and if you are careful when you clean them, the chances of their becoming scratched are greatly reduced. Plastic lenses will not become scratched from normal wear-they get scratched only when someone or something scratches them.



### Parvovirus - A Serious Disease

Parvovirus infection continues to be one of the most serious disease problems that we deal with in dogs.

Parvovirus is a highly contagious virus that causes a severe gastroenteritis. Signs of infection are depression, appetite loss, vomiting and severe bloody diarrhea. The disease is often fatal due to dehydration and other complications.

One of the major factors that makes parvovirus difficult to deal with is that the virus lives for a long time outside of a dog's body and can be transmitted by shoes or other objects that become contaminated by feces from an infected dog.

Vaccination is the most important part of preventing parvovirus infection. Puppies should receive a series of vaccinations starting by 8 weeks of age and continuing through 6 months of age.

It is very important that young dogs get the full series of vaccinations because a couple of vaccinations in a young puppy will not usually produce immunity to this disease.

Puppies showing signs of illness suggestive of parvovirus should be seen by a veterinarian as quickly as possible so that treatment may be started.

### Zapping Decay With Lasers

In the 21st century, lasers may become as common to dental practice as hand mirrors are today. They may be used to detect tooth decay and treat it.

By passing the laser across tooth surfaces, dentists may be able to detect tooth decay at its earliest stages. In contrast, conventional methods frequently don't detect tooth decay until it has passed through the enamel and entered the vulnerable underlying tissue, where it spreads rapidly and can destroy the tooth structure.

Once the dentists of the future detect the slight changes in enamel with the laser, they could vary the laser's intensity to wipe out the decay, leaving behind a small trough in the tooth. They would then sprinkle a synthetic powdered enamel on the trough and fuse it to the tooth - again with the use of a laser.

Researchers predict that the sealed material would be more resistant to decay than natural tooth structure, and that the laser would remove tooth decay without pain. Unfortunately, this technology is not yet available.

## Conservation Corner

Black bears are making a comeback in the lower Mississippi River Valley, due largely to the efforts of state and federal agencies, conservation organizations, universities, timber companies, farmers and other landowners.

Currently, the black bear is listed as a threatened species under the Endangered Species Act. These groups have united to form the Black Bear Conservation Committee to improve the bear's population so that it will be removed from the "threatened" status.

Because of its low population, seeing a bear in the wild in Mississippi is very rare. Learning more about bears and being aware of their habits should help citizens fully appreciate these unique animals and the habitat in which they live.

Almost all conflicts between bears and humans occur as a result of the animals' search for food. According to Rob Ballinger, a Field Biologist for the Mississippi Fish and Wildlife Foundation, "Under no circumstances should anyone knowingly feed a bear. Bears will lose their instinctive fear of humans quite easily and often become nuisances as a result. Problems vary from the simple presence of a bear, perceived as dangerous, to actual property damage. Nuisance activities are generally more common in years when there is a

shortage of natural foods. An acute sense of smell enables the bear to find other sources of nourishment, often garbage or pet foods."

Ballinger recommends that the best way to avoid trouble with bears is to avoid activities that create problem situations. Preventive measures, such as proper disposal of garbage, should be initiated first. If bears are in the area, efforts should be made to secure all garbage containers or deposit all edible wastes in separate containers that are stored where bears cannot gain access. The same goes for pet foods. If pet food is allowed to remain out for extended periods of time, a bear could find it, eat it, and will come back looking for more.

In most conflict situations, no one control technique will provide absolute security from bear problems. However, certain measures that are initiated in a timely manner, maintained properly and applied with an understanding of bear habits and behavior, can greatly reduce any problems associated with bears.

Although bears are generally shy creatures, they are very intelligent and possess excellent long-term memory capabilities. Bears will continue to return to areas where they have found food in the past.

The following miscellanea are from unnamed sources:

Samuel Flynt was born in 1843 in Florence, Ala. He entered service as a private on Oct. 1, 1862 at Florence in Co. F 4th Ala. Cav. He was captured before the close of the war and held prisoner at Camp Chase, Ohio until the surrender. He arrived home in June, 1865.

Caroline Emily Millsaps, youngest daughter of Judge Thomas J. Goforth of Kansas City, Mo. was born in Johnson Co., Mo. Nov. 12, 1845. She married H. P. Millsaps in 1869. In 1877 the family moved to Sherman, Texas; to Iuka in 1880 and to Glynn, La. in 1903. She died there July 1, 1910 of Bright's disease.

Mrs. Sarah J. Sprouse, Route 8, Booneville, Miss. widow of G. R. Sprouse. He enlisted in Calhoun Co., Miss. and served until close of war. Married Sept. 25, 1866 and died Oct. 4, 1910 in Prentiss, Co.

Benny Null, brother of Till Null, born Sept. 11, 1891, drowned Aug. 1, 1916 at Riverton, Ala.

Paid to J. D. Powell \$7.00, the amount allowed him by the Board of Supervisors of Tish. Co., Miss. for a coffin and robe for Billy Millsaps, a pauper, Aug. 1906.

Tom Whitehurst married Helen Moore, by Rev. W. C. Harris. Cake contained a ring, a copper cent and a needle August 1894.

Julius T. Clark of Belmont, Miss. in Louisville, Ky. Military Prison, Jan. 5, 1865. Captured near Huntsville, Ala. Dec. 23, 1864 and shipped to Nashville, Tenn. Died from pneumonia Jan. 28, 1865. Grave No. 934, 3 miles from Camp Chase, Ohio.

Besides the sad epitaphs we find when we stroll through cemeteries searching for ancestors, there are the humorous ones. One says, "I expected this, but not so soon." Another says, "Gone to see for

myself."

Robert S. Hodges, M. D. was born in Smith County, Tenn. in July 1830. He was the youngest of a family of four children of Robert and Elizabeth (Turner) Hodges. His parents were natives of N. C. and moved to Tenn. with their father's families when they were small children and were there reared and married. The father was previously married to Susanah Turner sister of his second wife by whom he had two children, Berryman and Susannah. Dr. Hodges married Elizabeth Turner in 1822. In Dec. 1838 he moved from Tenn. to Tishomingo Co., Miss. having his stock with him. On the

road the family camped near Franklin one evening and during the night the notorious outlaw and horse thief, John A. Murrell and his band stole six horses from him, leaving him only two horses with which to continue his journey. He finally arrived safely with his family and their personal effects, but had to return to Tenn. for horses with which to make a crop. Dr. Hodges was one of the pioneers and was obliged to go 15 miles for men to help build his house. He purchased two sections of land and soon opened up quite a plantation. He accumulated a considerable amount of property just before the Civil War and had about thirty slaves. During the latter part of his life, he was a local Methodist preacher and did ministerial work in different parts of the county. In the early part of the Civil War, he was arrested by the Federal troops because they thought he was for the Confederate cause and he was taken prisoner to Alton, Ill. where he died Nov. 1, 1862.

Mrs. Sallie Reeves, wife of A. L.

Reeves and sister of M. C. Campbell died Dec. 1, 1915 at her home east of Iuka.

On April 2, 1882, Mrs. Henry Krause was paid \$85.00 for a metallic burial case for John M. Nelson.

During the Civil War, a young Illinois officer stationed in north Miss. informed his homelink, "Snuff dipping is a universal custom here and there are only two women in Iuka who do not practice it. Sometimes girls ask their beaux to take a dip with them during a spark. I asked one if it didn't interfere with the old fashioned habit of kissing. She assured me that it did not in the least and I marvelled."

From Archer, Miss. - Miss Ida Archer's school closed last Friday. Her students always look forward to a nice time at the close and they were not disappointed, for Mr. and Mrs. Hannon gave them a social entertainment at which they had a pleasant time. Music was furnished by seven fiddlers. (June, I believe this is at Oldham where Ida Archer lived and at one time ran the post office there. IB).

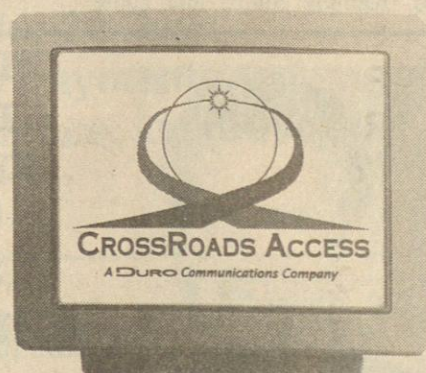

## March DAR Meeting

The Constitutional Minutes were read by Mrs. Mildred Hill. The President General's message was read by Mrs. Durham. The National Defense Report and minutes of the February meeting were read by Mrs. Jeannie McKee. Two officers gave their reports; Mrs. Nixon, Corresponding Secretary and Mrs. Sweeney, Treasurer.

The following officers were nominated by the committee and approved by attending members for office for the next two years: Regent, Mrs. Barbara Sweeney; First Vice Regent, Mrs. Mildred Hill; Second Vice Regent, Mrs. Marquita Mathis; Chaplain, Mrs. Martha Dobbins; Recording Secretary, Mrs. Jeanie McKee; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Lessie Newcomb; Treasurer, Mrs. Fredda Sanderson, and Historian, Miss Eugenia McKee.

Mrs. Durham reported receiving a letter from Mrs. Miriam Fox concerning the Summer Workshop 2000 on Wednesday, July 26th at the Itawamba Community College in Fulton. Also, the membership of the chapter and their national numbers will be on a disk. The member status will be done on the computer. Mrs. Cindy Nelson is VIS Chairman.

Our chapter received twelve awards in Jackson at the State Conference including Gold which each chapter strives to win. Mrs. Durham read the awards: Recognition Awards for Conservation, Support of the MSSDAR Washington Bicentennial Events and Volunteer Information Specialists Comm.; Special Observance Certificate for Constitution Week 1999; Outstanding Report and Constitution Sidelights and Bells; Participation Certificate for Constitution Week Display Contest (Mrs. Mildred Hill is Chairman of Constitution Week. The chapter is very appreciative of Mrs. Sheila Thorne for all the work she does.); Achievement Award for Honoring Six Chapter Regents; 1st Place for Best Overall Chapter Reports; Second Place for American Indians - Program; 3rd Place for "Old Shoes in DAR Museum"; Excellent Chapter for MSSDAR Pressbook (due to the support of the Vidette) and Gold for MSSDAR

Chapter Achievement Award. Mrs. Nixon presented the first program: Literacy. What God-given talent does a person use every day? Reading. An illiterate person is unable to read the Bible or newspaper, balance a checkbook, use a street map or read the numerous items one encounters everyday.

One of the first things a child learns to write is their name. This is an enormous accomplishment. Mrs. Nixon stated that in her enthusiasm, she wrote her name on every white piece of wood on their house in Paden.

Reading is a favorite pastime or hobby for numerous people. A book can transport one to other country, time, an exciting adventure, be educational or fill other wise lonely hours.

Often a person has difficulty learning to read because they require glasses. Many people have now been diagnosed with the learning problem, dyslexia. This is a visual confusion by which similarly shaped letters cause the person to transpose letters while reading.

During Mrs. Nixon's sixth grade of school, she began reading David Copperfield by Charles Dickens. She was only allowed to read fifty pages per night after her errands for the night members and chores were completed. She eagerly looked forward to sitting quietly and reading.

After her retirement, Mrs. Nixon returned to Iuka in 1993. She became involved in various organizations, clubs and groups. One of these was the Iuka Literacy Program. Nancy Beard, Mildred Hill, Mr. Wynn and Charles Turner were the other teachers meeting with the students at the cafe. Nancy Beard taught math. Mildred Hill taught the younger students to read and the multiplication tables. Mrs. Nixon taught reading comprehension. A student of Mr. Turner's passed the GED test. The teachers are to be commended for their good work. After the location was moved to the library, the students quit attending. Last year Mrs. Nixon became ill. She gave her textbooks to Sister Dolores of the St. Mary's Church. Sister Dolores is continuing this important program.

One of the objectives of the DAR is promotion of education. In all great nations, education is the corner stone of its' success. Parents and grandparents are the first teachers a child has. The only degree you need is a degree of caring.

The second program, Chil-

dren of the American Revolution, was presented by Mrs. McKee. Harriet Mulford Stone Lathrop (1844-1924) founded the NSCAR in 1895. She was a DAR member and well-known author of books for children. Five Little Peppers and How They Grew was her best-known work written under the pseudonym Margaret Sidney in 1881. This book sold more than two million copies in 50 years. The library has a copy of this wonderful book.

The children of the American Revolution is the oldest youth patriotic organization in the United States. This organization is for the training of young people in true patriotism and love of country. Membership is open to any boy or girl that can trace their ancestry to patriots of the American Revolution. Members are under the age of twenty-one. The may transfer to DAR or SAR at ages 18-21.

Examples of some of the work the CAR sponsors include: American History; American Indians, Conservation, Government Studies, Kids Helping Kids, Mountain Schools and activities pertaining to American Heritage.

The following is excerpted from the National Society's web page: "Each year, the NSCAR creates a National Theme and a National Project that will benefit America. This year's theme is "Light the Future".

The Old North Church in Boston, Massachusetts, a symbol of the American Revolution, is still visited today by sightseers and history enthusiasts. The steeple recently underwent partial restoration and the Old North Foundation

is now ready to properly light the steeple. This National Project will provide exterior light fixtures on the steeple.

On the night of April 18, 1775, Paul Revere watched from across the harbor for a signal from the steeple of the Old North Church. For the first time, visitors to Boston will see the steeple illuminated from all sides, including across the harbor as did Paul Revere. That night, this Light of Liberty touched American Patriots, igniting the War for Independence and leading to the birth of our Nation. This new electrical system will replace the existing means of lighting the tower, one floodlight mounted on the building across the street. The contributions of the CAR will make the bell tower a breathtaking sight for future generations.

CAR has unique opportunity to honor a National Landmark which holds a special place in our heritage. This project will Light the Future of the church and allow CAR to leave an indelible mark."

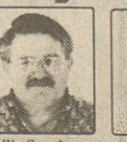

Driver, Marquita Mathis finally found us a motel and we engaged in shopping and had a nice dinner.

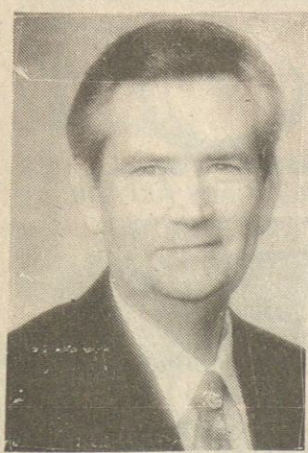

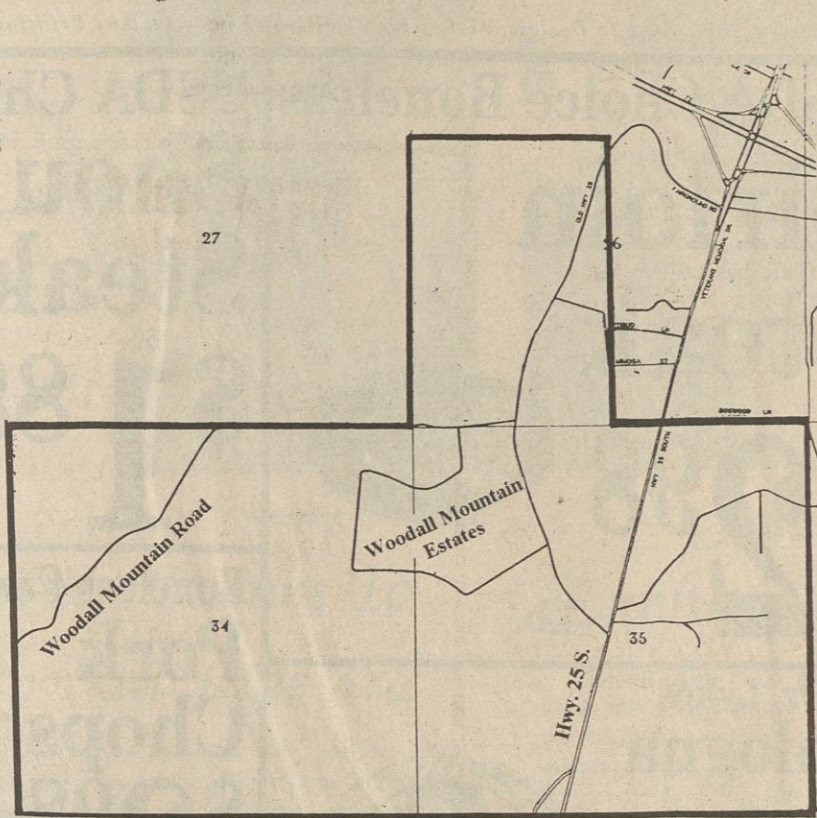




## Hearing Monday To Discuss Annexation To City Of Iuka

### Unemployment In County Rises

According to Jimmy D. Rowland, Manager of the Mississippi State Employment Service, unemployment in Tishomingo County rose to 7.9 percent in mid-January. This compares to 6.8 percent in December and 10.8 percent in January, 1999.

The civilian labor force for the county numbered 9,060, 80 less than December and 290 less than January one year ago. Approximately 8,340 Tishomingo County residents held jobs while 720 were unemployed.

Manufacturing jobs in the county numbered 2,770 and nonmanufacturing jobs numbered 3550.

### NMMC Women's Hospital Offers New Infant Ventilation Options

Neonatologists at the North Mississippi Medical Center Women's Hospital are the first in the state to provide two types of high frequency ventilation to infants in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit.

High frequency oscillatory ventilation, which actively moves gas in and out of the lungs, has been used with 40 infants since it became available at the NMMC Women's Hospital in 1997. Recently, the facility became the

first in Mississippi to offer high frequency jet ventilation, which uses very short, high pressure jets of air and relies on passive exhalation. High frequency jet ventilation differs from conventional infant ventilation in that a smaller volume and more rapid rate are used.

Jet ventilation is especially beneficial to infants who have pneumothorax or pulmonary interstitial emphysema, caused by air leaking outside the lungs into the chest.

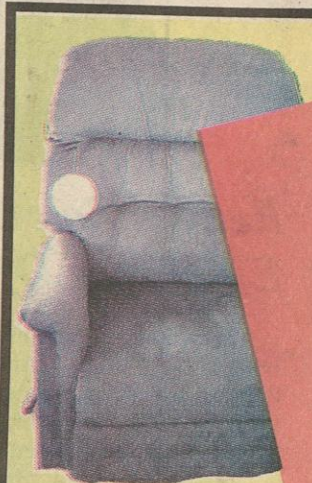

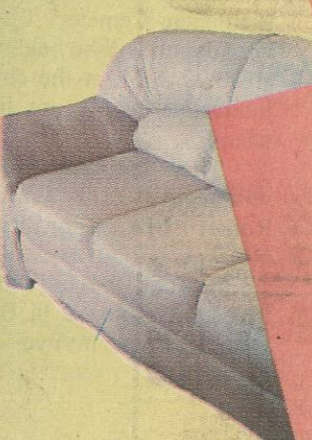

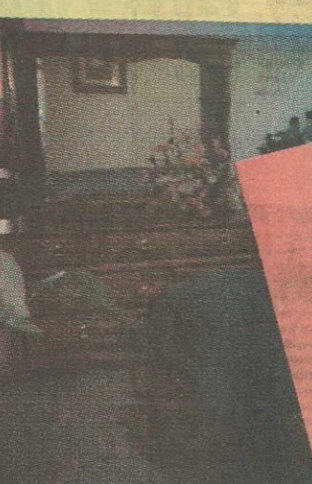

## At Risk

...not being counted in Census are thousands of homebound elderly and disabled Mississippians.... Thousands of homebound and disabled Mississippians living alone may not be counted in the 2000 census. Cyndi Sullivan, president of the Mississippi Association for Home Care, explains, "Although it is a fact that older adults are more likely than younger adults to mail in the census forms, there is a segment of that population who are unable to or won't fill out the

forms, answer the phone or the door because they are either incapacitated or they live in fear of strangers knowing that they are alone and vulnerable."

"Many times, the only people that come into their homes are pastors and home care visiting staff" says Sullivan. "If we visitors don't assist these vulnerable adults in returning the census forms, they are at extreme risk of not being counted."

As of April 7th, only 53% of households in Mississippi had mailed in the census forms. Most of those forms came from households whose members were

very active in mainstream Mississippi. According to Sullivan, it can only be assumed that the percentage of homebound elderly and disabled response is much lower.

The number of Mississippians receiving home care is estimated to be 50-60,000 people. The potential uncounted members of that segment of the population alone could be serious. In response, the Mississippi Association for Home Care (MAHC) has initiated "Homebound Census 2000" within its ranks and members have pledged to ensure that their home

care patients are counted in this census. Shirley Anderson, coordinator for the Jackson Bureau of Census says "We are trying so hard to cover all of the bases and these vulnerable adults are important to us." Jean McCary, executive director for MAHC says, "Our members have always been activists for this industry and their patients. I'm confident that our member's patients will be counted in this census."

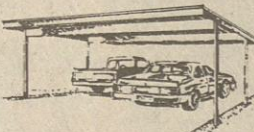

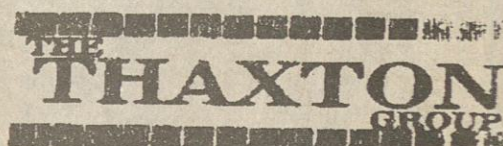

## Tishomingo County Vocational Center Signs Articulation Agreement With Northeast Mississippi Community College

The Vocational Center has recently initiated an articulation agreement with NMCC. Under this articulation agreement, students who attend the Vocational Center for two years can earn up to six hours of college credit at NMCC. The requirements for the articulation

program are as follows: Students must have completed a 2-year program of study at the Vocational Center. The program must be a direct link to the related Northeast program. The student must have a B or better on each articulated course to be eligible. The student must complete an application for

credit consideration in an approved program. The student must enroll in a direct-related program at Northeast and complete 15 semester hours before credit is awarded. A grade of "Z" will be awarded for approved high school courses, which will count toward college graduation but will not count toward grade point

devotion.

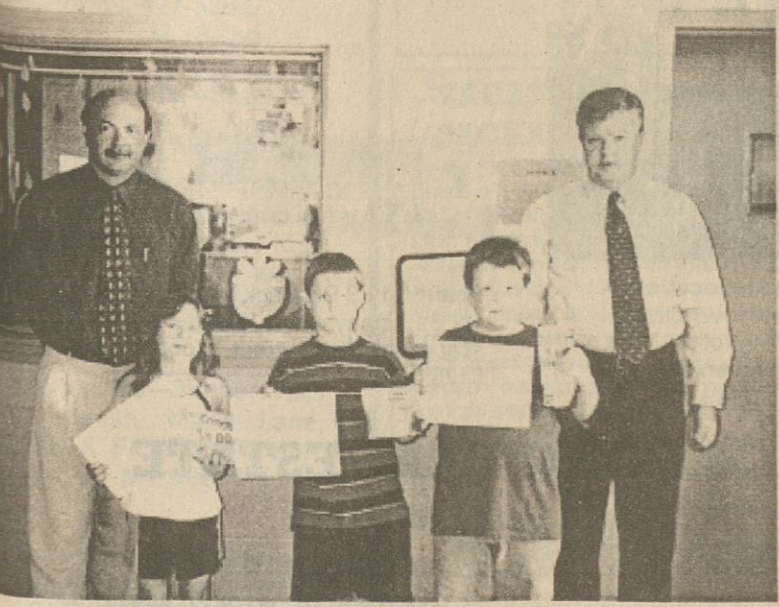
