## Four Suspects Arrested On Charges Of Arson

Two men and two women were arrested Thursday August 10, in connection with the burning of a building in which a newly hired Tishomingo County deputy was storing his belongings.

Arrested were Scott Moss, 28, of Tishomingo; Michael Jason Taylor, 19, and Jennifer Taylor, 28, of Burnsville; and Shirley Mills, 46, of Corinth.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff David Smith, all the suspects have been charged with conspiracy to commit a crime and arson.

Smith explained that the building which was burned was located in Burnsville, behind the temporary residence of Tishomingo County Deputy Mike Dodson, the newest member of the Sheriff's Department, hired under the COPS grant program. Dodson recently moved to the location and

had stored many of his belongings in the building, which belonged to his aunt, until he could locate a house to move to.

The Sheriff said that the deputy believed that the presence of a law enforcement officer in the neighborhood was unwelcomed due to drug trade in the area. Getting him out of the neighborhood may have been the motive for the burning.

According to Dodson, the building which burned contained items such as his family's refrigerator, computer, other furnishings, pictures, items he collected while overseas in the military, family photos and documents. He said that while the material things could be replaced, the personal items—such as the photographs and mementos from the past—could not and meant the most to him and his family.

Sheriff Smith said it was

reported that the building was burned for a small price, compared to the items which were lost.

"It was reported to us that the building was burned for \$100 cash, a case of beer and a gun," Smith said.

Smith stated that law enforcement officers, including his men, do not make the money they deserve for the job that they do.

"The officers have to endure personal attacks even when they are off duty and these attacks often are not only against them, but affect their families too," Smith said. "They really make great sacrifices in order to keep the people in our communities safe."

At press time, the Taylors and Mills were out on \$10,000 bond each. Moss remained in the jail under a \$10,000 bond.

## Only One Week Left To Take Care Of Old Fines And Warrants

Tishomingo County Sheriff David Smith would like to remind those who have old fines and/or warrants in the county or in any of the cities of Tishomingo County to take care of those this week or be prepared to be picked up and brought to jail.

"We have many warrants which have been issued with our department," Smith said. "We intend to do a one-day saturation which will include all our duties, the Mississippi Highway

Patrol, our county constables and the cities' officers. These officers will be given stacks of warrants and sent to pick up those who are named on them."

Smith said the best thing to do, if you know that a warrant has been issued for your arrest or if you owe an old fine or did not show up for your day in court, is to go up to the courthouse—to the Justice Court office—or to the Sheriff's office and see that it is taken care of.

## Iuka Police Asking For Help In Solving Iuka Drug Store Break-In

Iuka Police Department is asking for help from the public in locating the suspect or suspects involved in a break-in at a local drug store which took place in July.

According to Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer, around 5 p.m. on Wednesday, July 12, someone pried open the front door of Super-Sav-On Drugs, located

on Quitman Street in Iuka, and took a large amount of scheduled narcotics.

Approximately \$2,400 worth of narcotics were taken with most of the pills being hydrocodone and oxycontin.

## Iuka Jewelry Store Robbed, Suspect Still At-Large

A jewelry store in downtown Iuka was the scene of a robbery Wednesday, August 9, and the female suspect has not been caught.

According to Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer, a woman entered Moore's Jewelry Store, located on Front Street in Iuka, Wednesday afternoon around 2:30 and asked to see some men's gold nugget rings. The store attendant took out a tray of rings and allowed the woman to look through them. When the attendant's attention was directed away, the woman dumped the tray into her hand and ran out of the store.

Stringer said the Iuka Police Department needs help from the

public in locating this suspect. The suspect is described as a white female, between 50 and 55 years of age, with blond-gray hair which she was wearing pulled up in a bun. She was of medium height and slim build, the Chief said. When the suspect left the store, she was driving a late 1980's model dark, gray Dodge Omni. Local businessman/pharmacist Ben Burns, whose business is next door to the jewelry store, helped officers by obtaining a description of the vehicle and its tag number. The tag turned out to have been switched from another vehicle, Stringer stated.

"We found the vehicle the tag matched in Prentiss County, but there was no connection

between it and the suspect we are looking for," Stringer stated.

When the vehicle left the jewelry store, it headed north on Main Street and then turned west on 5th Street. Contact with the vehicle was lost after that.

Chief Stringer is asking that anyone who might have seen someone matching the description of the suspect or who might have seen a vehicle matching the description, to please contact Iuka Police Department at 423-6340. Any help will be greatly appreciated.

Between 10 and 12 men's gold nugget rings were taken in the robbery. The rings were valued at between \$100 and \$300 each, according to police reports.

The Iuka Lamination Division annually produces over 22 million pounds of high-quality laminated foil for the insulation, food packaging, gift wrap and label stock markets.

Ormet's local facility is located on Paul Edmondson Drive in Iuka and employs 32 active production employees.



## Long Range Paving Plan First Phase Of Paving Completed

The Bond's Company was the lowest/best bidder for all hot asphalt mix to be installed for a one (1) year period beginning last January. They were responsible for preparing the streets for paving, including all sweeping, filling pot holes, leveling, and grading. A class of medical technology students recently completed their final year of training at North Mississippi Medical Center learning hands-on skills in the NMMC Pathology Department.







Many of the health challenges facing our young people today are different from those of past decades. Advances in medication and vaccines have largely addressed the ravages once wrought on children by infectious diseases. Today, the health of young people, and the adults they will

become, is critically linked to the health-related behaviors they choose to adopt.

#### Damaging Behaviors

A limited number of behaviors contribute greatly to today's major killers, such as heart disease, cancer, and injuries. These lifestyle choices, often established during youth, include:

1. Tobacco use. Every day, more than 3,000 young people take up smoking.

2. Unhealthy dietary habits. Three-fourths of young people do not eat the recommended number of servings of fruits and vegetables.

3. Inadequate physical activity. Nearly 1 in 10 high school students is overweight and 16% are at risk of becoming overweight. Daily participation in high school physical education classes has dropped just 25%. Video games and prolonged TV watching are large contributors to a sedentary life-style.

4. Alcohol and other drug use. Nationwide, half of students reported current alcohol use and one-fourth currently use marijuana.

5. Sexual behaviors that can result in HIV infections, other sexually transmitted diseases, and unintended pregnancies. Mississippi continues to lead the nation in births to teens and ranks 11th in teen pregnancy rates. In 1997, twelve 12 year olds, 53 thirteen year olds, 205 fourteen year olds, and 564 fifteen year olds became mothers in Mississippi. 70% of young people in the 12th grade today report being or having been sexually active. Each year about one in

four sexually experienced teens contracts a sexually transmitted disease.

6. Behaviors that may result in intentional injuries (violence and suicide) and unintentional injuries (motor vehicle crashes). In the United States, nearly three-fourths of all deaths among persons aged 10-24 in 1999 resulted from only four causes: motor vehicle crashes (31%); other unintentional injuries (11%); homicide (18%); and suicide (12%).

#### What Can We Do?

Every school day, 50 million young people attend more than 110,000 schools across our nation. Given the size and accessibility of this population, our schools can make an enormous, positive impact on the health of the nation. The teachers and school nurses in the Tishomingo County School District realize we have a unique opportunity to impact the lives of our children. We are working together to provide youth with information and skills needed to avoid the risk behaviors mentioned above. In addition to receiving instruction, students practice decision-making, communication, and peer-resistance skills to enable them to make positive health behavior choices.

The schools can only do so

much. We need the involvement of every parent if we are going to be successful in this awesome task. Get the family together and do a life-style check-up. Do you recognize any of the at risk behaviors in your family? Agree that you are going to work together as a family to change these unhealthy life-style behaviors. Get actively involved in your child's education. Join your school's PTO or Booster Clubs. Together we can help young people, and the adults they will become, to live healthier, longer, more satisfying, and more productive lives. \*Information obtained from the Center For Disease Control.
