### Plane Crash Leaves Two Injured . . .

On Monday morning, a single-engine plane crashed at the Iuka Airport, sending the pilot and his passenger to the hospital. According to reports from the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office, the pilot, Dave Jameson, and the passenger, Steve Roddy, were transported to Iuka Hospital following the crash which occurred around 10:30 a.m. From there, they were airlifted to the North Mississippi Medical Center. The pilot was listed in critical condition at press-time and the passenger was listed in stable condition with some broken bones and lacerations resulting from the crash. Officials from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) were scheduled to investigate the incident on Tuesday. The cause of the crash was not known late Monday. One witness stated that the plane appeared to be trying to land when it got caught on power lines near the end of the airport property and finally came to rest, upside down, on a fence. Initial investigations by local officials indicated that the plane was full of fuel. The plane, a Lake Amphibious, had apparently taken off from Olive Branch, Miss. Officials were unsure of the plane's planned destination.

### Man Charged In Death Of 11-Month-Old Daughter

Alcorn Co. Authorities Report Man's Story Inconsistent With Child's Injuries

A Rienzi man has been charged with murder in the drowning death of his 11-month-old daughter.

According to Alcorn County officials, the man, 24-year-old John D. Page, of Rienzi, called 911 and reported that his daughter, 11-month-old Victoria Page, had drowned in the bathtub after he allegedly left the room to answer the telephone. He said that after he had been on the phone for

about 10 minutes, he returned to find the child floating, face down, in the water.

Reportedly, he and the child were the only ones home when the incident occurred. The child's mother, Amanda Ramey, was at work.

Alcorn County Sheriff Jimmy Taylor stated that injuries to the child's body were inconsistent with Page's story. A preliminary report from the coroner on an autopsy indicated

that the cause of death was from drowning. The forensic pathologist stated that he would be ruling the death as a homicide.

Other details concerning the injuries to the child would be released later, according to reports.

Funeral services for Victoria Page, 11 months, were Monday at Ludlam's Funeral Home Chapel in Iuka with Bro. Johnny Hamblin officiating. Burial was in East Prentiss

Cemetery.

Survivors include her mother, Amanda Ramey and father John Page, both of Rienzi (formerly of Tishomingo County); her grandparents, Wayne and Roberta Ramey of Tishomingo, Rickey and Marie McLemore of Rienzi and David and Myra Page of Iuka.

Pallbearers were Eddie Goss, Bud Blair, Josh Blair, Kevin Mitchell, Kirk Dill and Jason Underwood.

### Byrom Found Guilty Of Capital Murder, Sentenced To Death By Circuit Judge

The Tishomingo County woman accused of having her husband killed in June of 1999 was found guilty of capital murder by a jury on Friday and was sentenced to death by the judge on Saturday.

The 8-woman, 4-man Tishomingo County jury took less than an hour late Friday afternoon to find the defendant, Michelle Byrom, 44, guilty of capital murder in the death of her husband of 20 years, Edward "Eddie" Byrom, Sr., 56.

After the verdict, Circuit Court Judge Thomas Gardner ordered that the jury be sequestered until Saturday morning when they would hear testimony in the sentencing phase of the trial. However, the jury never got the opportunity to make the decision on Byrom's sentence because Byrom signed a waiver giving up her right to a jury trial in the penalty phase of the trial. Instead, Judge Gardner was asked to sentence the defendant.

Judge Gardner took only about 20 minutes Saturday to render his verdict, sentencing Michelle Byrom to the death penalty. He said that based on the evidence presented in the case, he found, beyond a reasonable doubt, that the killing was motivated by monetary gain.

The judge ordered that Byrom be transported Saturday evening to the Mississippi Department of Corrections facility in Rankin County. The transport officer stated that Byrom remained silent on the trip to the correctional facility. She had been housed until that time in the Tishomingo County Jail in Iuka.

Research of records by some county officials indicated that this is the first time a woman defendant has been convicted of capital murder and sentenced to death in Tishomingo County.

The prosecution, made up of Asst. Dist. Attorneys Arch Bullard and Jim Pounds, rested at about 10:30 a.m. Friday. The defense, made up of attorneys Terry Wood and Sunny Phillips, called no witnesses and also rested.

In testimony Wednesday and Thursday, Edward Byrom, Jr., 20, who made a plea bargain with the prosecution, said that his mother had made a deal with Joey Gillis to kill his father.

Byrom stated that he dropped Gillis off at a point on Airport Road, behind their house which has its entrance on Hwy. 172. He waited approximately 30 minutes, as instructed by Gillis, and returned and picked him up.

The two then drove toward Gillis' home in the Tishomingo area. On the way there, Byrom stated that they disposed of the gun by placing it behind a tree and also Gillis tore the shirt he had been wearing—a black shirt he had allegedly borrowed from young Byrom—and threw it out of the window. Byrom testified that Gillis had supposedly worn a glove at the time of the shooting, but he did not know what had happened to it.

Byrom said that after he let Gillis out, he went to the hospital to see his mother and to let her

know that "it was done." Byrom Jr. stated that his father had stayed home from work to take his mother to the hospital that morning. When he told his mother, he said she had him go to the house and see if his father was dead. Byrom said when he arrived at the house, he found his father and called 911.

In Edward Byrom Jr.'s plea bargain, he agreed to tell the truth in the case against his mother and enter a guilty plea. In return, he would be sentenced to 50 years, with 20 suspended, leaving 30 years to serve.

On Thursday, Sheriff David Smith testified. Taped interviews conducted by Sheriff Smith, and also by Ralph Dance with the Mississippi Highway Patrol Criminal Investigation Bureau, with Michelle Byrom made in the days just after the murder, were played for the jury. In the tapes, Byrom admitted that she was going to pay Joey Gillis \$15,000

to kill her husband. When asked where she was going to get the money, she said from insurance money she would collect because of her husband's death. Testimony revealed that Byrom would receive more than \$350,000 in proceeds from the estate of her husband, who was an employee with the Tennessee Valley Authority. She had plans to set up Gillis and her son in Florida and then later meet them when she collected the money, according to testimony.

The defense attorneys tried to portray Byrom as a woman crying out for help and attention. They also said that she and her son often suffered both mental and physical abuse from Edward Byrom Sr.

The third defendant in the case, Joey Gillis, is awaiting trial; however, at press time, no trial date had been set.

Asst. Dist. Attorney Arch Bullard said the state was pleased with the jury's verdict and the judge's sentence. He said he would like to acknowledge the assistance and hard work put into this case by Sheriff David Smith, Chief Deputy Rodney Pannell, Investigator Bobby Flynt and all the other members of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, including the dispatchers, bailiffs, deputies and jailers, who all came together to put this case and trial together.

"This is a small county sheriff's department and everyone's contribution was important," Bullard stated.

### IPD Begins Crackdown On Drunk Drivers And Drivers Who Don't Buckle Up Kids

Officers Will Be Out In Full Force Beginning This Week

Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer has announced that beginning this week, his department will be targeting drivers who are drinking and driving, as well as those who don't buckle up their children.

What is worse—an adult who allows a child to ride in a vehicle unrestrained, or an adult who drives while intoxicated with children in the car?

As far as Iuka Police Department is concerned, either of these situations needlessly puts children in danger. During the nationwide crackdown known as Operation ABC Mobilization: America Buckles Up Children, IPD officers will be stepping up efforts to look for both kinds of offenders, according to Chief Stringer.

For the first time ever, the Mobilization—a week of intensified enforcement of child passenger safety laws—will also

focus on coordinated enforcement of drunk driving laws.

Officers in Iuka will use checkpoints, saturation patrols and stepped-up enforcement from November 20 through the Thanksgiving holiday weekend.

Drivers who fail to buckle up their child passengers will be ticketed.

Anyone driving above the legal blood alcohol limit will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of

the law. This can mean heavy fines, losing a license, losing a vehicle, or jail, depending on how many previous offenses the driver has had.

Traffic crashes are the leading cause of death to children, killing 2,000 kids each year. Nearly one fourth of those deaths are alcohol related. And six out of ten children who die in crashes are completely unrestrained.

IPD officers are joining with more than 8,000 law enforcement agencies nationwide to participate in the Mobilization.

The message the officers are sending out is clear: if you put innocent lives at risk by not buckling up kids or by driving drunk, they're going to find you and strict law enforcement action will be taken against you.

### Special Headstart Recruitment

Head Start is conducting a Special Recruitment Drive/Survey of the entire County from November 17 to December 1. We will attempt to identify all children under 5 years old, as compared to the Census. Staff from Belmont, Burnsville, and Iuka Centers will be going door to door. We want to register children from ages 1 to 5 regardless of income. As of now only 3 and 4 year old children are being served, but the results of our survey might show a need for other services as well.

The town of Tishomingo and surrounding area will be surveyed. If we find enough eligible 3 and 4 year old children we are considering a classroom site at the Tishomingo School for the remainder of this school year. Please welcome our staff and assist with this survey.

Endangered Species Permits may be issued for the following: 1) scientific research; 2) enhancement of propagation or survival of the species; 3) incidental taking; economic hardship situations involving endangered species. Threatened

Species Permits may be issued for all of the activities listed above, as well as zoological, horticultural or botanical exhibition.

Captive-Bred Wildlife Permits may be issued to qualified persons who register with the Service to buy and sell live endangered or threatened animals not native to the U.S., that have been born in the United States, for enhancement of propagation and survival of the species, provided the other person is registered for the same species. These species may be advertised for sale provided the advertisement contains a statement that no sale may be consummated until a permit has been obtained from the Service. The permit must be

obtained prior to the sale. Permits are not issued for keeping or breeding endangered or threatened animals for pet purposes. The use of protected species as pets is not consistent with the purposes of the Act, which is aimed at conservation of the species and recovery of wild populations.

There are situations that are exempt from the prohibitions of the Act. Pre-Act or "Grandfather" Clause species held in captivity or in a controlled environment on December 28, 1973, or the date of publication in the Federal Register for final listing, whichever is later, are exempt from prohibitions of the Act provided such holding or use of the specimen was not in the course of a commercial activity. A pre-Act exemption does not apply to wildlife parts and products offered for sale in interstate or foreign commerce. Endangered or threatened animals born in captivity from pre-Act parents are fully protected and cannot be considered pre-Act.

## Conservation Corner

This is the first of a 2-part series on endangered species.

The Endangered Species Act, passed in 1973, is designed to regulate a wide range of activities affecting plants and animals designated as endangered or threatened. It also provides measures to help alleviate the loss of species and their habitats to ensure their survival. With some exceptions, the Act prohibits activities with these protected species. An "endangered species" is an animal or plant in danger of extinction. A "threatened species" is an animal or plant which is likely to become endangered in the future.

Without a permit, it is unlawful to commit, attempt to

commit, solicit another to commit or cause to be committed any of the following activities involving endangered and threatened wildlife and plants: 1) import into or export from the U.S.; 2) take (includes harass, harm, pursue, hunt, shoot, wound, trap, kill, capture or collect) any wildlife within the U.S.; 3) take on the high seas; 4) possess, sell, deliver, carry, transport or ship any species unlawfully taken within the U.S. or on the high seas; 5) deliver, receive, carry, transport or ship in interstate or foreign commerce in the course of a commercial activity; 6) sell or offer for sale in interstate or foreign commerce; 7) remove and possess any plant from areas under Federal

## Home Economics Tips

### SPLENDIFEROUS SILVER Regular Use Helps Prevent Tarnish

In most households the silver is tucked away for special occasions. But frequent use is one of the best ways to keep silver beautiful. That's because regular washing will reduce tarnishing, especially in the case of silver plate. Too frequent or too vigorous polishing may wear away some of the silver layer, making re-plating necessary.

Tarnish is a natural occurrence as the result of chemicals, such as sulfur compounds in the air. In addition, certain foods, such as eggs, mustard and mayonnaise, can cause tarnish. Salt can both corrode and tarnish silver. To prevent the damaging effects of these and other tarnish-inducing foods, wash both sterling silver

and silver plate as soon as possible after finishing the meal. For best results, wash by hand, using hot water and dishwashing detergent. Rinse with hot water. Towel dry, using a soft, clean dishtowel. Do not leave silver to drain-dry on a rubber mat. Contact with the rubber can also promote tarnish.

While washing by hand is the recommended method of cleaning, silver and silver plate can also be washed in the dishwasher, if caution is used. Take care to separate silver utensils from stainless steel utensils. Contact between the two can cause the silver to pit. Serving dishes and the like should be positioned so there is sufficient space between pieces to avoid scratches. Because steam drying can leave spots, it's best to remove the silver immediately after the rinse cycle and dry it with a soft, clean dishtowel.

### Lazy Eye

Both eyes are open, so they must both be seeing - Right? The answer might well be - "Wrong!" Many things, including a very slight difference in the shape of an eyeball, can change vision dramatically. When this happens, the eyes no longer work in balance and the brain receives different information from each eye. To resolve this, the brain just ignores the information from one - producing a "lazy eye".

If you hold your hand a few inches from one eye, you can still read even though you are aware of the hand's presence. Over a period of time, the brain would learn to ignore the eye covered by the hand and normal binocular vision would be altered. It might even be lost entirely if the obstacle were there long enough. The brain avoids double vision or other distortions by simply ignoring the images it is receiving from one eye. Children do not "grow out" of this condition. It only gets worse and more difficult to cure. Have your eyes checked regularly to discover and correct this problem.

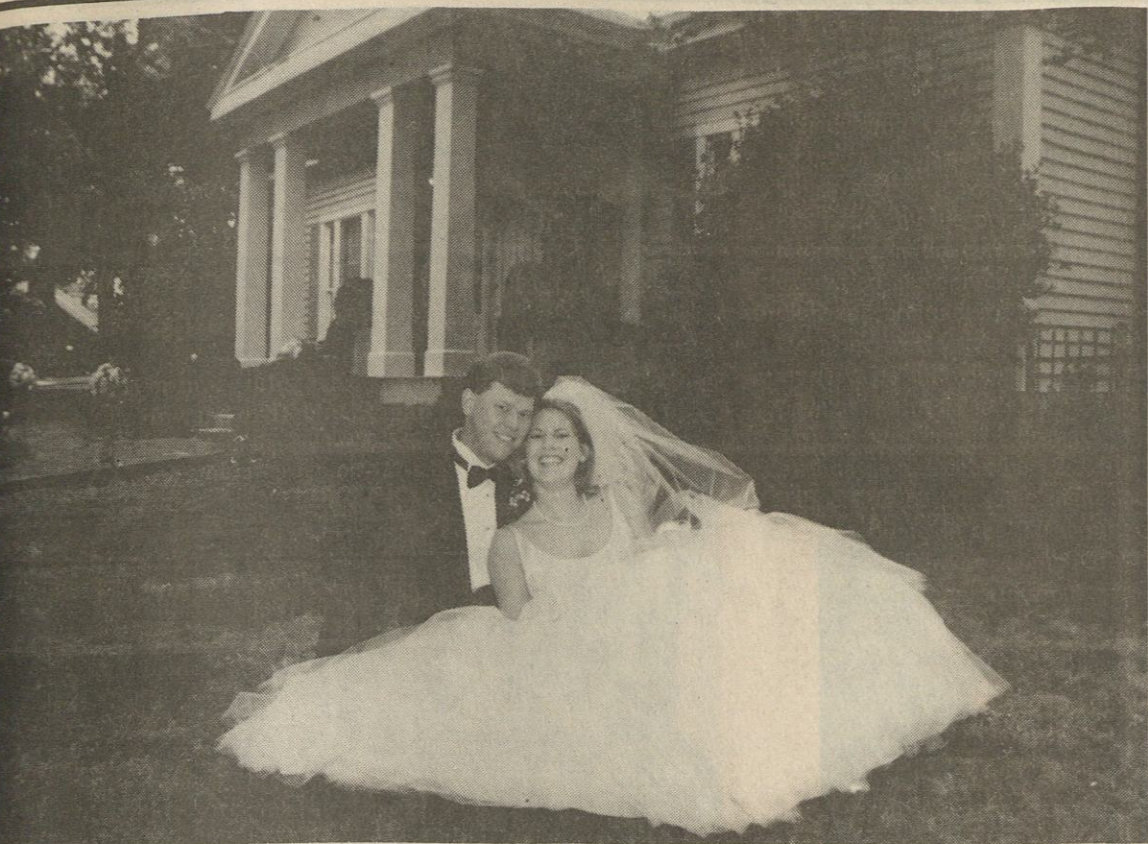
#### HOUSETRAINING

Puppies instinctively know not to mess near their food or where they sleep. Your job is to teach him where to go. He should be taken to this designated area often until he is able to get into a routine. Take him out immediately after waking, after naps, after eating or drinking, and after play time. Or, if he starts to whimper, sniff the floor, or turn in small circles. These are all signs that he has to go. When the puppy goes in the desired place, he should be praised extravagantly. Some people use food rewards. If he goes in the wrong place, thoroughly clean and deodorize the spot right away or he'll be attracted to go there again. Paper training is a convenient method for people living in an apartment building or for people who don't have immediate access to a yard. ## Replica Of Columbus' Ship —The Niña— Makes A Stop At Aqua Yacht Harbor

On Monday, November 6, a replica of Christopher Columbus' ship, the Niña, arrived at Aqua Yacht Harbor near Iuka.

The ship was opened for viewing by the public on Tuesday, November 7, and remained at the site until Sunday November 12.

Built completely by hand and without the use of power tools, Archaeology magazine called the ship "the most historically correct Columbus replica ever built. The craftsman ship of construction and the details

in the rigging make it a truly fascinating visit back to the Age of Discovery. The "Niña" was used in the production of the film "1492" starring Gerard Depardieu and directed by Ridley Scott.

The ship has been touring continually since 1992 as a sailing museum. The Niña is an example of a Caravel ship—a Portuguese ship used by early explorers. These ships were common trading vessels used during the Age of Discovery. Caravels were also used as cargo carriers, warships,

patrol boats and even corsairs (pirate ships). They had the advantage of speed, a shallow draught and maneuverability, plus the fact that they were good sailing ships. Caravels have always been linked with Portuguese and Spanish explorations and explorers.

According to records, the Niña was Columbus' favorite ship. She logged at least 25,000 miles under Columbus' command.

# To The Citizens Of Tishomingo County:

Mississippi law places many duties on the board of supervisors. In addition to having the responsibilities for the maintenance of all roads and bridges in the county, we manage the county's finances, we are regularly called on to deal with personnel issues, and we oversee all county property. Included in this last area of responsibility is allocating space in the courthouse. Our county presently has 90 full and part-time employees. A number of those work for various elected officials who need office space within the courthouse. We as a board are frequently asked by various officials to make changes in their office space. Seldom do officials give up space. Most of the time, they need more. This typically puts us in the position of trying to accommodate more and more people in the same building. Over the past several months, after we moved the Department of Human Services to the old health department building, we have

been trying to determine how best to use the space within the courthouse that DHS left. It has not been an easy process. A decision was made to apportion part of that space to the sheriff's department. We have not determined yet how the rest of the vacant space would best serve the needs of the county. The purpose of this letter is to assure you that this is a responsibility we do not take lightly. We have been dealing with this for several months in an effort to be sure that the right decision was made. We are committed to being fair to everyone concerned and to using county resources in the most efficient way. We trust that everyone who is affected by this process will understand this commitment and will work with us to serve the best interests of Tishomingo County.
