Burnsville Man Arrested On Drug Charges Following Sunday Night Raid By Tishomingo Co. Authorities

Members of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department raided a Burnsville residence on Sunday, Jan. 28, and arrested one man on drug charges.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff David Smith, arrested was Timothy L. Byrd, 36, of Jefferson Street in Burnsville. Byrd has been charged with possession of marijuana, more than an ounce, with intent to distribute and possession of cocaine with intent to distribute. The charges will be enhanced because he was arrested within 1,500 feet of a church, Smith said.

Tishomingo County Chief Deputy Rodney Pannell said he received information about illegal drug activity at Byrd's residence. This information, along with other information gathered by Sheriff Smith led to the execution of a search warrant at the residence Sunday evening.

After searching the premises, the officers found a substantial amount of the illegal drugs and also paperwork which listed names of customers which had apparently been purchasing drugs from the suspect, according to Smith.

The Sheriff stressed that there will be more arrests in connection with this case.

Items seized during the raid, in addition to the drugs and paperwork, included guns, approximately \$2,000 cash and a 1996 Ford F-150 pickup truck.

Byrd has been released from jail on \$15,000 bond.

Officers participating in the raid included Sheriff David Smith, Chief Deputy Rodney Pannell, Deputy Scott Hyde, Deputy Wayne Ivey, Deputy John David Murphy, Deputy Tommy Rolfeigh, Deputy Jon Denver Tapp and other auxiliary officers.

Chase With Tishomingo County Deputy Ends With Two Arrests

A Cherokee, Ala. man and his brother, who lives in Iuka, were both arrested Friday after the Cherokee man ran from a Tishomingo County deputy to his brother's house where his brother pulled a gun on the officer.

Arrested were Randy Keller, 35, of Cherokee, and Andy Keller, 29, of 577 Poplar Circle, Iuka. Randy Keller has been charged with reckless driving, failure to yield, possession of beer, resisting arrest, driving on suspended driver's license and D.U.I.—other substance. Andy Keller has been charged with aggravated assault on a police officer and obstruction of justice.

According to Sheriff Smith, a call came into the Sheriff's office reporting that Randy Keller was making harassing phone calls to a female subject from a pay phone on Eastport Street in Iuka. After checking the files, it was determined that the Sheriff's department held three active warrants on him.

Tishomingo County Deputy Scott Hyde went out to see if he could locate Keller. The officer was able to locate Keller's vehicle traveling down

County Road 261 and attempted to pull him over. Keller did not stop, but instead led the officer on a chase through the city of Iuka which ended in the Bart Smith Subdivision, in front of his brother's house, Andy Keller, on Poplar Circle.

Smith said that when Randy Keller got to his brother's residence, he jumped out of the vehicle, leaving it running. The vehicle ran into a basketball goal post, the Sheriff explained.

The subject then darted into a nearby wooded area in an attempt to elude the officer. Deputy Hyde left his vehicle and pursued the man on foot. He soon apprehended him and brought him out of the woods. At this time, Andy Keller, who was outside, told the officer to let his brother go. When the officer did not comply with the man's request, Andy Keller pulled a gun from his side and pointed it at Hyde.

Deputy Hyde pulled Randy Keller in front of him and told Andy Keller to put down his weapon, while he began backing up toward his patrol car. During this time, other officers from Iuka Police Department and the Sheriff's Department began arriving on

the scene. Andy Keller went back into his house, Smith said.

Randy Keller was placed in the patrol car of IPD Officer Anita Mitchell. During this time, Andy Keller's girlfriend, who also lived at the residence, had arrived. She and Officer Mitchell entered the house to get him to come out.

When Andy Keller came out of the house with Mitchell, he was taken into custody. During this time, Randy Keller, who was already in the IPD patrol car, had kicked out the car's back window, according to the Sheriff. Andy Keller told authorities that the gun he had pointed at the officer was not loaded, Smith explained, but when the .380 automatic handgun was confiscated, it was indeed loaded.

According to Smith, the investigation of the incident was turned over to Officer Ricky Marlar of the Mississippi Highway Patrol Criminal Investigation Bureau.

At press time, Andy Keller had been released on a \$10,000 bond. His brother, Randy Keller remained in custody at the Tishomingo County jail on a \$10,000 bond, plus other cash bonds for fines.

Iuka Resident Arrested After Disrupting Funeral Procession In Florence, Ala.

An Iuka man, apparently upset because he had to wait for a funeral procession, was arrested Monday, Feb. 29, after he threw a bottle at a mourner's car, caused a wreck and then got into a fight with the car's occupants.

According to reports from the Florence, Ala. Police Department, Robert Clay Jr., 20, of Iuka, was arrested and charged with disorderly conduct following the incident which occurred in the street on busy Dr. Hicks Boulevard, located in downtown Florence.

Two of the occupants of the other vehicle were also arrested for disorderly conduct, Florence Police Lt. Spencer Butler said.

Apparently, a funeral escort from the police department had traffic stopped

at the cemetery entrance so that mourners could leave. Clay, who was accompanied by a female passenger, began to yell and cuss at passengers in a 2001 Mercedes, driven by Anthony Baugh of Country Club Hills, Ill. (near Chicago).

The report stated that Clay then pulled up alongside the Mercedes and tossed out a bottle that hit the car, and then speeded up and got in front of the car, slammed on his brakes, causing the Mercedes to slam into the rear of his Chevrolet Lumina.

The officer working the funeral escort said that at this point, everyone from the vehicles jumped out and began a heated verbal exchange. This exchange soon escalated into a full-blown fight.

Police officers were able to stop the incident soon after it

started, the reports indicated.

Clay was taken to Eliza Coffee Memorial Hospital where he was treated and released for minor injuries he suffered in the fight.

The police report indicated that the incident had traffic backed up for approximately 25 minutes. Butler said Clay had apparently gotten mad because he had to wait on the funeral to pass and took it out on the Baugh's. The funeral was for Anthony Baugh's brother, Sammy Smith. Butler said Mr. Baugh said he didn't know what to do when this occurred because he had never seen anything like it happen before. Lt. Butler admitted that he, too, had never heard of anything like this happening before.

All three suspects arrested have been released on bond.

Home Economics Tips

KEEP GOOD RECORDS

A house is considered a capital asset. Like any other investment, if it is sold for a profit, capital gains tax may be owed. Taxes can be deferred, however, if a house of greater or equal value to the one being sold is purchased within 2 years. Persons over 55 (or couples with at least one spouse over 55) who have lived in a home for at least 3 of the 5 years prior to its sale, are also eligible for a \$125,000 capital gains tax exclusion, which can be used only once in a lifetime.

It is important to save all records pertaining to capital improvements on your house from the moment you buy it. These records should be placed in a file separate from your annual tax records and maintained for as long as you own the house, plus 3 years. When you finally sell the house, you can reduce your capital gains taxes to their lowest legal limit by increasing your tax basis.

Your tax basis is the purchase price of your house,

plus certain acquisition costs paid at closing, plus capital improvements made over the years of home ownership. The higher your basis, the lower your capital gain and potential tax will be. Examples of capital improvements are landscaping, wall-to-wall carpet, addition of a room, a new roof, a garage-door opener, vinyl or aluminum siding, a finished basement, and a new furnace, septic system or water heater. Note

that capital improvements are not the same as repairs or maintenance, such as painting walls or fixing broken windowpanes. A capital improvement must add to a property's value, prolong its life, or adapt it to a new use. Repairs merely maintain a house in an acceptable condition.

Each time you sell a house, you must complete IRS form 2119, Sale or Exchange of Principal Residence. This form asks questions such as how much you paid for your house

and how much you sold it for.

Always keep a copy of the forms because you will need to refer back to them for future house purchases and sales. One house sale affects the cost basis for the next house, and you need to keep track of how much profit you are deferring. You may wish to ask for professional tax preparer for help.

MONITOR ESCROW ACCOUNTS

An escrow account is a fund established by your lender to pay for property taxes and homeowners insurance as they become due on your house during the year. The escrow account protects both the bank's and your investment in your house. For example, if you did not pay your homeowners and flood insurance premiums, a fire or flood that destroyed your home would also destroy the lender's collateral.

Most mortgage loans

require an escrow account, but not all do. You may be able to negotiate with the lender for the right to pay your own taxes and insurance. By doing this, you may avoid having your money tied up until it is needed. However, mortgages insured by the Federal Housing Administration (FHA) or Veterans Administration (VA) require escrow accounts. Mortgages insured by Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) may or may not require an escrow account, depending on your lender.

To have enough money to pay taxes and insurance when due, the lender adds 1/12 of the estimated annual amount due for taxes and insurance to your monthly mortgage payment. If the actual amounts due are greater than the amount in the escrow account, you will have to pay an additional lump sum. If the lender charges substantially more each month, than is needed, that ties up your money unnecessarily. Most lenders send you an annual statement showing what has been paid from your escrow account and how much money (if any) remains. If there is a large amount of excess money

you can ask for a refund and an adjustment of the amount you pay into the account in the future.

Be aware that changes in your property taxes or insurance premiums can cause your mortgage payments to change.

New Technology Aids In Treating Cavities

A new dental technology helps diagnose and treat tooth decay at an early stage. The technology uses equipment called air-abrasive technology to "blast away" some areas of the tooth surface without using the dental drill.

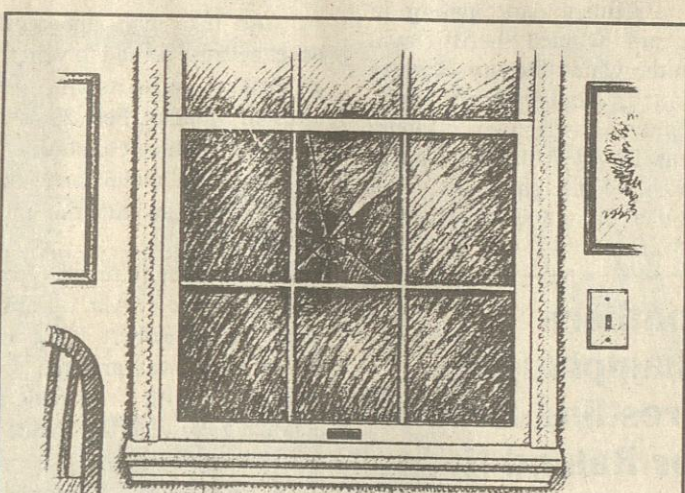
Air abrasive technology uses minute alumina particles that are almost invisible to the naked eye and carried to the tooth by a stream of air. These particles spray away areas of the tooth with no drilling sound, vibrations or need for anesthesia. Because the technology is a conservative means of removing portions of the tooth, it allows early diagnosis. The dentist can use short blasts from the device to better view the suspicious looking darkened areas. The pits and fissures of the back teeth (chewing surfaces) are areas where decay are often seen.

Air abrasive technology can also be used to remove stains and organic debris before the application of sealants (protective plastic coatings) on the teeth and can also remove areas of early decay for replacement with resin fillings.

Air abrasion, however, is not well-suited for removing all decay. Moist or soft dentin (the layer of tooth that is exposed when gums recede) cannot effectively be removed with air abrasion. This technology was recently approved by the Food and Drug Administration and is not yet widely available in dental offices.

"Tugger Bonds" Best Time To Spay Kitten...

Female kittens mature much faster than males. A female kitten capable of becoming pregnant during her heat period which occurs as early as months of age. If you to mate your kitten, should wait until she is at least one year old.

When a kitten is in her heat, she becomes restless and nervous. She may become more playful and demanding. Her behavior can be quite normal. Unlike dogs, normally come into heat every six months, sexually mature cat can in and out of heat repeatedly over a period of weeks or months.

There is no reason to postpone having a kitten spayed unless you plan to mate her. The time to spay a kitten is four to five months, before she has her first heat period. Young kittens spay very rapidly.

Once your kitten has been spayed, her disposition will not change except for the better. She may become less nervous, less noisy and more relaxed, playful and affectionate.

(Contrary to the wives' tale, neither cats nor dogs need to "have a litter" to be well adjusted. Spay and neuter your pet that you do not contribute to the millions of unwanted pets that are destroyed in this country every year.)

Changes As We Age

Time always causes some changes in our eyes. Even the older individual who still sees sharply has lost a bit. There will be more difficulty reading crowded and light printing. There is reduced contrast sensitivity causing objects not to stand out well from the backgrounds. The ability to clearly identify moving objects may be reduced even if there is no apparent change in the individual's ability to read an eye chart. This is known as dynamic visual acuity which is more like reality. As advances, we also lose some of our peripheral vision and our visual field area will be reduced - well as the ability to accommodate change from bright to dark. Glare is also greater in the older person because incoming light is scattered in the eye. There is difficulty identifying some colors particularly blue.

The changes noted here are very subtle in most cases and are normal. Certainly they do not indicate that the older individual is not capable of performing most activities in a normal way.

Once again the American Red Cross and Tishomingo County 4-H are offering a Babysitting Certification class to anyone 10 to 18 years of age. This class is also good for children who may spend time at home alone after school taking care of themselves and younger children.

The class will be held in the Iuka Public Library on Saturday, February 24 beginning at 9 a.m. and ending at 5 p.m. This year the cost will be \$28. This will cover the materials, and lunch. Checks should be made out to Tishomingo County 4-H Clubs. The deadline to register is February 15th.

To register call the Tishomingo County Extension Service office at 423-7016 by 5 p.m. February 15th.

The topics covered include child safety, CPR for infants and small children, record keeping, setting fees, feeding infants and small children, identifying safe toys, personal safety for the baby-sitter, and many other things.

State Leaders Propose 16th Section Bill

Secretary of State Eric Clark, Senator Tom King, and Rep. Ray Rogers are pushing a change in Mississippi law to assist local school boards managing timber on 16th section land.

"Strong 16th section land management is crucial in providing quality schools in our state," Clark said. "I'm pleased to be working with leaders like Sen. King and Rep. Rogers on this important issue."

As Secretary of State, Clark oversees more than a million acres of state-owned land. The 16th section land is owned in trust by the schoolchildren of the local

district, and managed by the local school board. All 16th section lease revenue stays in the local district, Clark said, keeping taxes down. Statewide, 16th section generates about \$50 million a year for education.

The bill would protect school board members with ties to the timber companies from any conflict of interest under state ethics laws. Under current law, some school boards are hamstrung in properly managing timber land when they have members working for timber companies. The bill provides that in the event a local school board was unable to make decisions on timber management questions due to ethics concerns, the Secretary of State would step in and execute the needed leases in the best interest of the

district.

Senate Bill No. 2938 is sponsored by Sen. King (Forrest and Perry counties); House Bill No. 1048 is sponsored by Rep. Rogers (Rankin county).

Clark's office will be following the bills closely during the 2001 legislative session, scheduled to end April 1.

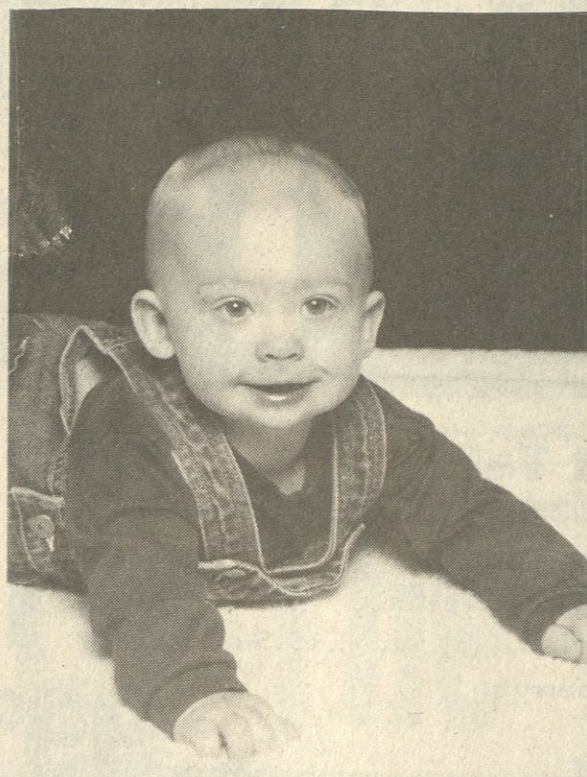

Admission is \$5 for each night. The performances begin at 7 p.m.

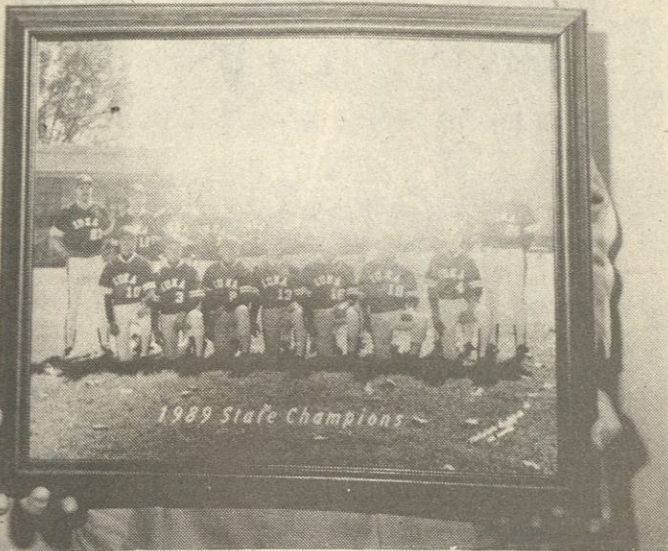

One female cat can be responsible for 450,000 kittens in 7 years.

One female dog can be responsible for 67,000 puppies in 7 years.

Can you imagine how many puppies and kittens 1 male dog and 1 male cat can be responsible for?

An estimated 20,000,000 animals were put to sleep last year in the USA. With these facts in mind we must be made aware of pet birth control.

Female cats can be spayed (ovariohysterectomy) when they reach at least 2 1/2 pounds of weight. This is before they come into heat.

Female dogs need to be spayed (ovariohysterectomy) before 6 months of age. Some dogs will begin their heat cycle at 6 months of age.

Male cats need to be neutered (castrated) as early as 7 months of age. Male dogs can be neutered (castrated) as early as 6 months of age.

Remember these ages are the earliest dog and cats need to be neutered (castrated or ovariohysterectomy). After these ages surgery can be performed at anytime or ask your veterinarian what is best for your cat or dog.

Just remember to be a responsible pet owner and not allow unwanted animals to be brought into the world.

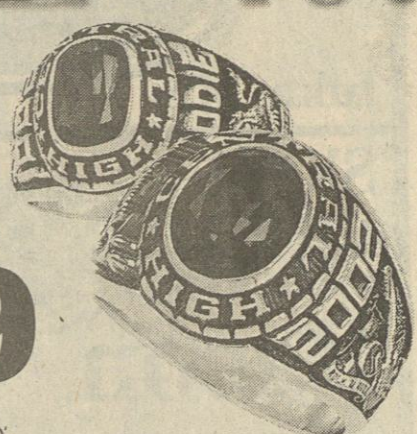

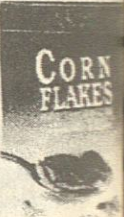

ONLY the working poor and the elderly, disabled or ill will be assisted. This money will be used wisely, in accordance with guidelines set

Project Homestead would also like for each city within Tishomingo County to participate, if possible. The funds collected through each city would be used to pay city utilities (gas, water etc.) in that city.
