### Sawyer Brown's Lead Guitarist Flies To Iuka For Yearly Physical

Once a year, Duncan Cameron, lead guitarist for the well-known country group, Sawyer Brown, and a lot of his own private plane, flies to the Iuka Airport on his way to getting his yearly physical. The group Sawyer Brown is known for such hits as *Step That Step*, *Leona*, *I Did It For Love*, *Some Girls Do*, and *The Race is On*. Duncan, who is very personable and who was very easy to talk

to, said that Sawyer Brown had been on the road traveling by bus most of the last month. He was on his way to Flint, MI, by way of Iuka. He added that he was constantly traveling and Sawyer Brown had been especially busy this summer. They have just completed a new album that has three or four songs he thought were really good.

Duncan was very complimentary of Dr. Segars and his staff. He also said he is glad to have a place like Iuka to come and get his physicals quickly. He said getting into and out of doctors' offices in larger cities is not very convenient. He also added that he likes having someone pick him up and take him back to the airport.

### Tax Relief Plan Is Putting \$1,802,243.07 Back Into The Hands Of Tishomingo County Taxpayers

Tishomingo County taxpayers are estimated to receive \$1,802,243.07 in tax rebates thanks to President George W. Bush and the "Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001".

Ormet Corporation with headquarters in Wheeling, WV, employs approximately 3,000 people at nine facilities in seven states. The Iuka Lamination Division annually produces over 22 million pounds of high-quality laminated foil for the insulation, food packaging, gift wrap and label stock markets.

## Conservation Corner

The arrival of the hunting season is accompanied by more activity in the outdoors. Along with an increase in outdoor activity comes an increase in encounters with reptiles. And when it comes to my favorite reptile - ole no-shoulders everybody has their own story.

However, my column this week is not about how close I was to being bitten (because I was trying to catch a cottonmouth) or about my Grandfather (Arnold) Herring, when he was bitten by a chicken snake as he was gathering eggs one morning. It is about a type snake that is very common this time of year.

So whether you raise cattle, just own some land with a pond or stream on it, or just like to carry your grandkids fishing, keep reading.

The two most common types of snakes we see around water in Mississippi are the diamondback water snake and the cottonmouth. In fact, both of these snakes are sometimes called "water moccasins." Many times these two snakes are mistaken for each other. Below, we'll discuss the diamondback water snake (Nerodia rhombifera).

The diamondback water snake derives its name from the square to diamond-shaped dark bordered areas on its back. The border's dark lines are connected and constitute a chain-like configuration. For a non-poisonous snake, the diamondback water snake is very heavy bodied and can reach lengths of up to 63 inches. Males are slightly shorter than females.

Diamondback water snakes can be found in almost any type of wet area from slow flowing streams, rivers and bayous to non-flowing bodies of water such as cypress swamps, ponds, lakes and reservoirs. In the southern portion of Mississippi, diamondbacks can be found any time of the year. However, in the Northern parts of our state, it must hibernate. Hibernation occurs in banks (not the money kind) and in muskrat or beaver lodges.

The diamondback water snake primarily feeds at night, but occasionally during the day, especially during the spring and fall. In summer, activity during the day is primarily limited to basking in the sun on banks, logs or overhanging tree limbs.

Breeding usually begins in April, soon after hibernation. It is thought that males begin breeding at 2.5 years of age. Young are born August through October of the same year. The average size broods is from 17 to 25, although 62 young have been reported.

Diamondback water snakes are opportunistic feeders. Fish, primarily slow moving fish such as catfish, are their food of choice, though frogs make up a large portion of their diet. Crayfish and turtles are eaten occasionally.

Adult diamondback water snakes are preyed upon by cottonmouths, alligators, gars

and otters. Humans kill the largest amount since this species of snake is mistaken for

#### "Sneak Thief" Of Sight

An oversimplified explanation of glaucoma is an increased pressure of the fluid within the eyeball. If the pressure is not reduced, it destroys delicate structures within the eye.

A complete eye examination by your optometrist will include a simple test of the fluid pressure. If the disease is detected early, chances are it can be controlled and blindness prevented.



#### Oral Cancer - Cut Your Risk

Did you know that dentists are on the front line of oral cancer detection? They often spot early changes in their patients' oral tissues that could indicate cancer.

More than 30,000 people are diagnosed with oral cancer in the United States each year, and 8,000 die from this disease annually. The greatest hope in cancer prevention and cure lies in early detection, which improves a patient's chances of survival markedly.

Dentists receive training in the detection of cancerous lesions in dental school. Seeing a patient on a regular basis allows them to spot changes early. Dentists can easily tell which of their patients are smokers, and often see oral problems that are a direct result of smoking.

A high percentage of oral cancer patients share common characteristics. Twice as many men as women are diagnosed with oral cancer, and most are 50 and older. Oral cancer is directly linked to tobacco use, and excessive alcohol consumption can promote malignancy.

You can help protect yourself from oral cancer by living a tobacco-free lifestyle, maintaining a balanced diet, using good oral hygiene, performing regular oral self-examination and visiting your dentist regularly.

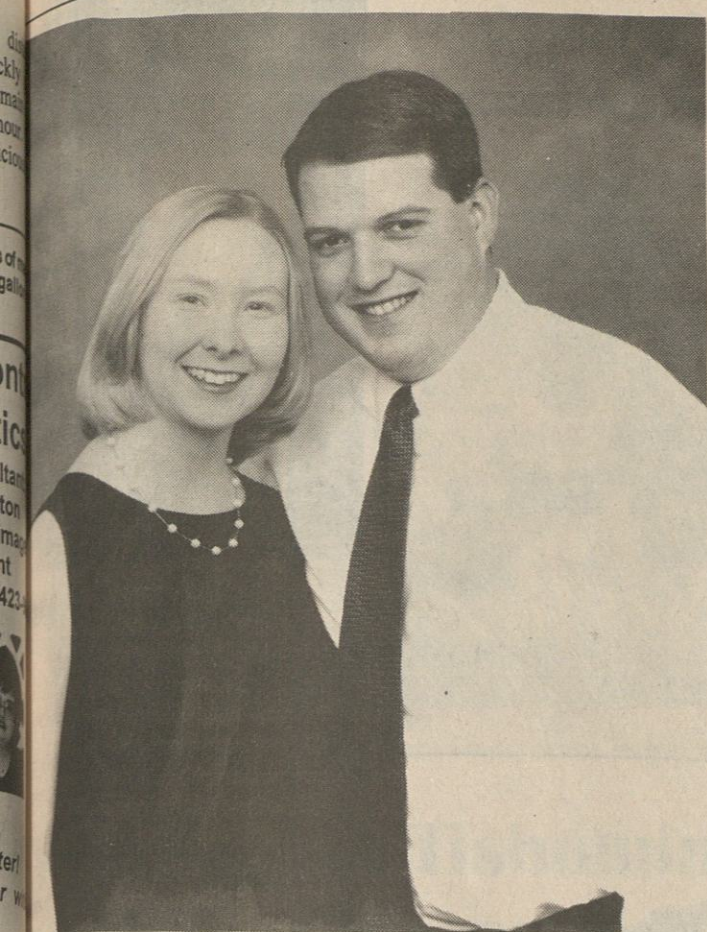

## Town Of Tishomingo, August 16th - Recessed Board Meeting Actions

The Mayor and the Board of Aldermen had a work session to start the meeting with the following items: Dog ordinance, the finishing touches was made and the finalized draft will be presented to the Board for approval at the September regular meeting on the first Tuesday and the budget was discussed for the new fiscal year that begins October 1.

The Board approved monies to be spent for the sewer system improvements grant upon receipt from the state; approved budget modifications for the same project; hired a full time police officer; purchased 100 MMBTU of Natural gas per day for the months of November - March at a fixed

## 2000-2001 Hunting Seasons Proposed

The news that hunters have waited for since last hunting season is finally out - the upcoming fall and winter hunting seasons have been set, according to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks.

At their regular monthly meeting in Jackson of April 25, the five-member Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks approved the following 2001-2002 hunting seasons and bag limits: **Frogs:** The season for taking frogs will be April 6, 2002 to September 22, 2002. **BAG LIMIT:** 25; **Possession Limit:** 50. Only twenty-five (25) may be taken in any one night. A valid hunting or fishing license is required.

**RACCOON:** June 30, 2001 - October 1, 2001. **BAG LIMIT:** One per party. **Possession Limit:** 2.

**OPOSSUM, RACCOON, AND BOBCAT:** October 2 - October 31, 2001; sport hunting with dogs and guns for food & sport. **BAG LIMITS:** 5 per day; 8 per party. **Possession Limit:** 10. November 1, 2001 - February 28, 2002, for food, sport and pelt. **BAG LIMIT:** No Limit.

**TRAPPING SEASON:** November 1, 2001 - February 28,

2002. **BAG LIMIT:** No Limit.

**WILD TURKEY: SPRING SEASON:** March 23, 2002 - May 1, 2002, in all counties except the following closed counties or parts thereof: Itawamba: north of Hwy. 78 and west of Hwy. 371 and Hwy. 363. Lee: entire county. Pontotoc: south of Hwy. 9 and west of Hwy. 15. Prentiss: east of Hwy. 145, north of Hwy. 370 and Hwy. 366, west of Hwy. 371, and south of Hwy. 30. **BAG LIMIT:** 1 adult gobbler or 1 gobbler with 6 inch or longer beard per day, 3 per spring season.

**FALL SEASON:** November 3 - November 11, 2001; December 8-16, 2001, in the counties of BOLIVAR - west of the main Mississippi River levee and those

lands east of the main Mississippi River levee known as 27 Break Hunting Club; COAHOMA, DESOTO, ISSAQUENA, TUNICA, and WASHINGTON - west of the main Mississippi River levee; and WARREN - only on Davis Island, King's Point and Brown's Point. **BAG LIMIT:** Two (2) turkeys per each fall season which may be of either sex.

**YOUTH TURKEY HUNT\*\*** - March 16 & 17, 2002 on Private

Lands Only in those areas open for turkey hunting. **BAG LIMIT:** 1 adult gobbler or 1 gobbler with 6 inch or longer beard per day \*\* Youth eligible to participate in this special hunt are those fifteen (15) years of age and younger. Each youth must be in the immediate vicinity and under the direct supervision of an adult twenty-one (21) years of age or older.

**WHITE-TAILED DEER:** Archery: October 1, 2001 - November 16, 2001.

Gun (with dogs): November 17, 2001 - December 1, 2001.

Primitive Weapon: December 2, 2001 - December 15, 2001.

Gun (without dogs): December 16, 2001 - December 23, 2001.

Gun (with dogs): December 24, 2001 - January 16, 2002.

Archery: January 17, 2002 - January 31, 2002.

Primitive Weapon: January 17, 2002 - January 31, 2002; Statewide on Private Lands Only.

**BAG LIMIT:** The bag limit on antlered buck deer is one (1) buck per day, not to exceed three (3) per license year. Only antlered buck deer with antlers of four (4) points or greater may be taken. The bag limit on antlerless deer is one (1) per day, not to exceed three (3) per license year; except that two (2) additional antlerless deer per license year may be taken with a bow and arrow. The annual bag limit on antlerless deer shall not apply to private lands under the deer management assistance program or the fee-based antlerless program as approved by the

department. However, all harvested antlerless deer that exceed an individual hunter's annual bag limit must be tagged prior to moving with a DMAP or FEMAP tag provided by the Department.

**BOBWHITE QUAIL:** November 22, 2001 - March 2, 2002. **BAG LIMIT:** 8 per day. **Possession Limit:** 16.

**RABBIT:** October 13, 2001 - February 28, 2002. **BAG LIMIT:** 8 per day. **Possession Limit:** 16.

**SQUIRREL:** Zone 1. Areas north of Highway 82 plus those portions of Sunflower County and Washington County south of Highway 82; September 29, 2001 - February 28, 2002. **BAG LIMIT:** 8 per day. **Possession Limit:** 16.

Zone 2. Areas between highway 82 and Highway 84 plus portions of the state south of

Highway 84 and west of I-55; October 13, 2001 - February 28, 2002. **BAG LIMIT:** 8 per day. **Possession Limit:** 16.

Zone 3. Areas south of Highway 84 and east of I-55; October 27, 2001 - February 28, 2002. **BAG LIMIT:** 8 per day. **Possession Limit:** 16.

**YOUTH SQUIRREL HUNTS:\*\*** - Private Lands Only.

Zone 1 - September 22 and 23, 2000

Zone 2 - October 6 and 7, 2000

Zone 3 - October 20 and 21, 2000

**BAG LIMIT:** 8 per day.

\*\*Youth eligible to participate in this special hunt are those fifteen (15) years of age and younger. Each youth must be in the immediate vicinity and under the direct supervision of an adult twenty-one (21) years of age or older.

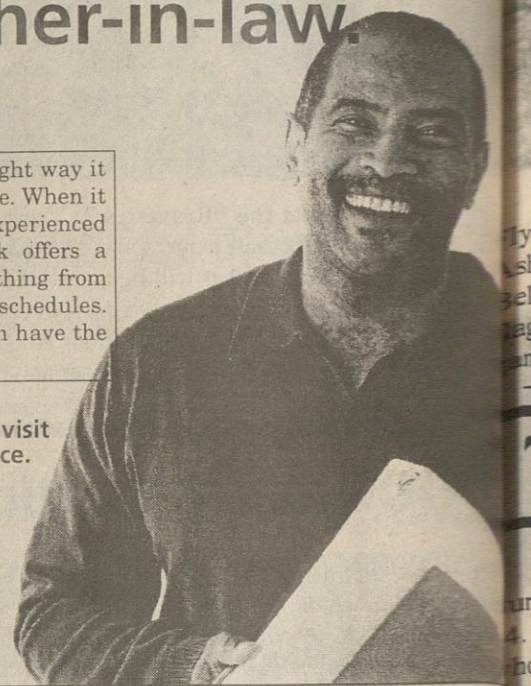

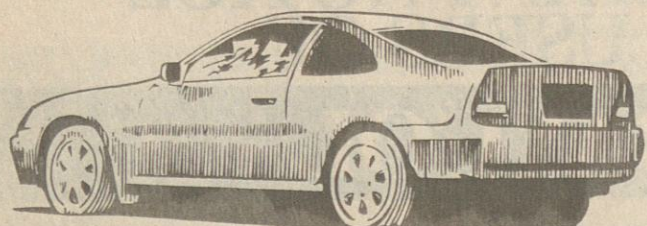

## UM Student Broadcasters Win Professional Awards

Breaking into a career without experience is tough, but some students at The University of Mississippi (UM) may be ahead in the game thanks to their recent showing in professional competition.

UM broadcast journalism students won 22 gold and silver awards at the summer meeting of the Mississippi Association of Broadcasters. The students work for the university's radio station WUMS 92.1 (Rebel Radio).

"Our students beat out professionals at commercially licensed stations, so these awards mean a lot," said Melanie Stone, radio station manager and an assistant professor of journalism. "Ole Miss is producing the next generation of broadcasters."

The student-run radio station is one of only two college radio stations in the state to be fully licensed by the Federal Communications Commission. The students produce news, daily shows and commercials, as well as generate revenue through advertising sales. Most college radio stations operate as nonprofit enterprises.

"We try to give students a broad view of the whole picture

rather than in just one area of broadcasting," Stone said. "They are well rounded in broadcasting experience."

As a result of the awards, a Mississippi Gulf Coast radio station has extended an offer for Ole Miss students to participate in an internship program. Because the radio station is a member of the media conglomerate Clear Channel Communications, its proposal could open a broad range of new doors for UM students, Stone said.

WUMS is only one segment of UM's Student Media Center. The second

largest media organization in the state, the Center also sponsors an award-winning daily newspaper, as well as a yearbook and two magazines, all operated by students.

Hugh Keeton of Iuka won the Gold Award for Promotion of a Sporting Game, Gold and Silver Awards for Broadcast of a Sporting Event, and Silver

Awards for Sports Coverage Announcement Promoting a Sporting Event and Sports Coverage of a Single Event.
