## DEADLY ATTACKS ON AMERICA

The "greatest tragedy on our soil" were the words United States Attorney General John Ashcroft used Tuesday evening to describe the deadly attacks on the World Trade Center's twin towers in New York City and the U. S. Pentagon facilities in Washington earlier Tuesday.

The day of terror and disbelief began around 8:45 a.m. ET Tuesday morning, September 11, 2001 when a hijacked commercial airliner carrying 92 passengers crashed into one of the twin towers of the World Trade Center, the financial center of the world. Eighteen min-

utes later, a second hijacked airliner carrying 175 passengers crashed into the second twin tower.

Some forty minutes later, another hijacked commercial airliner crashed into the Pentagon, the military center of the United States. The jet was described as a "guided missile" as it hit the southside of the six-story building.

A fourth commercial jetliner crashed in a rural area of Pennsylvania. The exact destination of this hijacked jet is not known, but some believe it was headed for Washington or Camp David in Maryland.

Haunting cell phone calls to 911 from passengers on the planes have indicated that all four planes, two American Airlines jets and two United Airlines jets, were apparently hijacked by terrorists with knives. All four planes were flights from the East Coast to California.

The area around the World Trade Center was compared to a "war zone" as the mighty twin towers crumbled to the ground some two hours after the attacks. It is believed that some 200 firefighters and possibly 100 police officers may have perished in the crumbling buildings as they worked to

rescue the 10,000 employees believed to have been in the building. Although the Trade Center employed some 50,000 people, many had not arrived for work when the attack occurred. The exact number of dead will not be known for weeks.

As the terror continued through the morning, the United States government was put into the highest level of security or High Alert Status. At 9:18 ET the FAA shut down all commercial airlines and airports in the U.S. At 10:05 the Whitehouse was evacuated, as was the Capitol. All NASA fa-

cilities were closed as were other federal buildings. In Pennsylvania all historic landmarks were closed, Disneyworld and Disneyland were closed, and all professional ballgames were canceled.

President Bush was in Florida at the time of the attacks and immediately headed back to Washington. He was re-routed to Shreveport, LA and other military bases for security purposes. He safely landed in Washington Tuesday evening and addressed the American people, promising to "hunt down and punish those responsible."

The date, September 11, (9-11 or 9-1-1, "a call for help") is being compared to Pearl Harbor Day. It is a day that will never be forgotten, a day that young and old alike will always remember where they were and what they were doing when they heard the unbelievable news that someone had declared "war" on our peaceful homeland.

*A personal note:*

Lt. Col. Vincent Speece of Iuka, a U. S. Army personnel at the Pentagon, contacted his family on Tuesday. He reported that he was in Georgia at the time of the attack and was not in any danger.

## Moonshine Whiskey Found During Drug Raid, 7 Arrested

A raid looking for drugs in Tishomingo County netted eleven gallons of wildcat whiskey instead.

The raid was conducted by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Deputies and state ABC Agents. Seven were arrested as a result of the raid.

According to Deputy John David Murphy, ABC Agents secured a search warrant to look for drugs in the Carter's Branch Community at the residence of Vaughn Lee Johnson at 32 CR 958, near Tishomingo.

The ABC Agents and Tishomingo County Deputies

found the eleven gallons of whiskey along with beer on the premises. Johnson was charged with possession of wildcat whiskey, the sale of wildcat whiskey, and the possession of beer.

Also arrested were the following:

William E. Russell, 3284 CR 96, Tishomingo, MS, was charged with possession of beer.

Alfred A. Martin of 12 CR 423, Tishomingo, MS, was also charged with one count of possession of beer.

Thomas Brock of 146 CR 958, Tishomingo, MS, was charged with possession of

beer. Brock already had a warrant of capias forgery on him.

Eddie Lewis Southward, of 1323 W. Carpenter Rd., Flynt, MI, and 314 CR 958, Tishomingo, MS, was charged with possession of beer.

Horace E. Allen, P.O. Box 76, Tishomingo, MS, was charged with possession of beer.

Milton Johnson, 31 CR 116, Tishomingo, MS, was charged with possession of beer.

These arrests were made as a combined effort of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Deputies and the Alcohol Beverage Control Agents.

## A-Team in Tishomingo County Mississippi Highway Patrol's Aggressive Enforcement Motorcycle Brigade In County

The A-Team (Aggressive Enforcement Team), a Motorcycle Division of the Mississippi Highway Patrol, arrived in the area on Monday morning, September 10, 2001, to aid in the enforcement of traffic laws on the county's highways.

According to Ricky Marlar, Lieutenant - Enforcement Division, New Albany District, the A-Team Motorcycle Division of the Mississippi Highway Patrol assists regular officers of the Mississippi Highway Patrol in enforcing the state's traffic laws. The team travels from county to county across the state of Mississippi to make motorists more aware of the laws.

This team currently is made up of 14 officers with 4 more in training. The men rotate as they travel from location to location across the state. These men live in different areas of Mississippi.

According to Houston Dorr, the Director of the Motorcycle A-Team Division, this is the first time the division has been in North Mississippi and Tishomingo County. They have been traveling across the state for the past five months spotting and issuing tickets to motorists who are not obeying Mississippi's laws.

Patrolman Dorr added that inspection stickers and tags are much easier to read from a motorcycle than they are when

traveling in a car. He also added that people do not recognize that the motorcycles are Highway Patrol cycles until it is too late for them to slow down. Dorr said that the cycles were easier and faster to turn around and that the cycles allow the officers a much quicker response time.

Even at the beginning of their stay in Tishomingo County, the troopers were impressed with the natural beauty of the area, and they hoped traffic offenders did not mar their impression of Tishomingo County.

They did say that drivers on the road need to be aware of the A-Teams' zero tolerance for speeding and breaking of traffic laws.

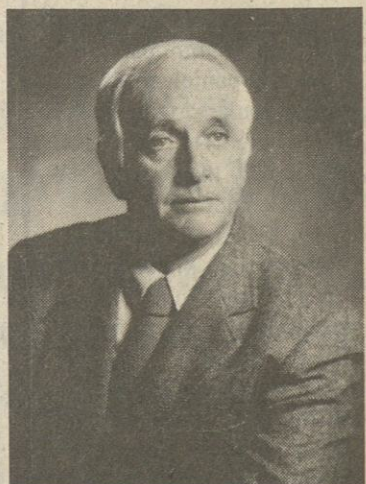
## Dr. Frank Henry To Speak At Library Friends Birthday BASH!

## State of Emergency To Curb Gas Prices

In an attempt to curb rising gas prices in response to Tuesday's terrorist attacks in New York and Washington, Governor Ronnie Musgrove has declared a state of emergency to protect consumers across the State of Mississippi.

"I am declaring this state of emergency to protect the people of Mississippi from those who would profit from this Tuesday's tragic attack by raising gas prices," Musgrove said. "This declaration does not mean our safety is jeopardized; rather, it gives the consumer some protection by the law against unfair and unnecessary hikes in fuel costs."

Rumors of gas shortages across the state have prompted long lines at gas stations. There is no evidence of gas shortages, and any rumors should be treated as such.

"Our people are suffering today from an horrible attack on our country. They should not suffer further because of false rumors about fuel shortages," said Musgrove.

Governor Musgrove issued an executive order for the American flag and the state flag to be flown at half-mast on all buildings and grounds of the state.

## Home Economics Tips

### WHEN YOU'RE COOKING - COOK FOODS THOROUGHLY

It takes thorough cooking to kill harmful bacteria, so you're taking chances when you eat poultry, fish, or eggs that are raw or only partly cooked. Rare and medium-rare steak, hamburger, and roast beef are also undercooked from a safety standpoint.

\*Cook red meat to 160 degrees F; Cook Poultry to 180 degrees F. Use a meat thermometer to check that it's cooked all the way through.

\*Salmonella, bacteria that cause food poisoning, can grow inside fresh, unbroken eggs. Cook eggs until the yolk and white are firm, not runny. Scramble eggs to a firm texture; don't use recipes in which eggs

remain raw or only partially cooked.

\*When you cook ahead, divide large portions of food into small, shallow containers for refrigeration. This ensures safe, rapid cooling.

### SAFE MICROWAVING

A great timesaver, the microwave has one food safety disadvantage - it sometimes leaves cold spots in food. Bacteria can survive in these spots. So...

\*Cover food with a lid or plastic wrap so steam can aid thorough cooking. Vent wrap and make sure it doesn't touch the food.

\*Stir and rotate your food for even cooking. No turntable? Rotate the dish by hand once or twice during cooking.

\*Observe the standing time called for in a recipe or package

\*Use the oven temperature

probe or a meat thermometer to check that a food is done. Insert it at several spots.

### WHEN YOU SERVE FOOD - NEVER LEAVE IT OUT MORE THAN 2 HOURS

\*Use clean dishes and utensils to serve food, not those used in preparation. Serve grilled food on a clean plate too, not one that held raw meat, poultry, or fish.

\*Never leave perishable food out of the refrigerator over 2 hours! Bacteria that can cause food poisoning grow quickly at warm temperatures.

\*Pack lunches in insulated carriers with a cold pack. Caution children never to leave lunches in direct sun or on a warm radiator.

\*Carry picnic food in a cooler with a cold pack. When possible, put the cooler in the shade. Keep the lid on as much as you can.

\*Party time? Keep cold food on ice or serve it throughout the gathering from platters from the refrigerator. Divide hot party food into smaller serving platters. Keep platters refrigerated until time to warm them for serving.

### WHEN YOU HANDLE LEFTOVERS - USE SMALL CONTAINERS FOR QUICK COOLING

\*Divide large amounts of leftovers into small, shallow containers for quick cooling in the refrigerator. Don't pack the refrigerator; cool air must circulate to keep food safe.

\*With poultry or other stuffed meats, remove stuffing and refrigerate in separate containers.

### REHEATING

\*Bring sauces, soups, and gravies to a boil. Heat other leftovers thoroughly to 165 degrees F.

\*Microwave leftovers using a lid or vented plastic wrap for thorough heating.

## Conservation Corner

A conservation buffer is a strip or parcel of land that exists next to environmentally sensitive areas such as wetlands, streams or rivers. Filter strips, field borders, grassed waterways, field windbreaks, shelter belts, contour grass strips, and riparian (streamside) buffers are all examples of conservation buffers. Conservation buffers conserve soil, enhance fish and wildlife habitat, conserve biodiversity, beautify the landscape and improve water quality.

According to Leila Wynn, President of Wildlife Mississippi, "As the original stewards of our land, farmers long have known that the best management practices include the use of conservation buffer strips to control runoff that impairs the quality of our Mississippi's waters."

Homer Wilkes, State Conservationist for the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) stated, "NRCS and USDA's Farm Services Agency have several programs that provide incentive payments to farmers and landowners for establishing buffers, including the continuous sign-up option of the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) and the Environmental Quality Incentives Program."

Land enrolled as conservation buffers in CRP will receive an annual rental payment. This payment is

based on the relative productivity of the soil type being offered and the average dry land cash rental rate for comparable land in the county. A 20 percent incentive is added to the annual rental rate for field windbreaks, grassed waterways, filter strips and riparian buffers. A 10 percent incentive is added to the annual rental rate for land within designated wellhead protection areas.

Cost-sharing, at a rate of 50 percent, is available to establish the desired cover. Practices eligible for cost-sharing include but are not limited to, the following: site preparation, temporary cover until permanent cover is established, grading or shaping, seeds, trees or shrubs, plastic mulch and supplemental irrigation or fencing. Contracts under the continuous CRP sign-up are 10-15 years in length, depending on the practice.

Annual rental payments are made each year. Cost-share payments are made after the approved practices are completed.

Other programs of USDA also can help with the cost of implementing buffer practices. These include the Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program and the Wetland Reserve Program.

To apply, contact your local USDA Service Center or conservation district office. You don't have to make a competitive offer as required of other programs. Your offer will be accepted if all eligibility requirements are met.

### Baby's Vision Problem

There isn't much a baby can see clearly when born. He doesn't have ability yet to focus or accurately. In the beginning, each eye has to act independently of other. It takes a while before he learns how both eyes to see well.

As time goes on, if still doesn't seem seeing well, he should have an eye examination. There are certain tell-tale signs you can watch for. Can your child find it difficult to pick up small objects? When he reaches for a toy does he miss it completely? When he starts to walk, is he stumbling over things he should have seen avoided?

Check to see if he is using both eyes to focus on an object. If he tilts his head, or squints or closes one eye to look closely at something, there may be a vision problem. An examination is the only way you can be sure.



Many people who suffer from such symptoms as headaches, ear pain, tenderness of the jaw joint, muscles or dull aching pain often share a common problem. These people suffer from a family of problems related to the muscles and the (temporomandibular) joint. These problems often referred to as disorders. The muscles joints may not function properly, resulting in pain and spasm. The cause of some TM disorders are well understood. Because this, there are varying opinions about diagnosis and treatment of these conditions.

The structure that makes possible to open and close mouth are very specialized work together when you speak and swallow. These structures include muscles, ligaments, as well as the discs which make up TM joints. The TM joint is one of the most complex in the body, especially because there are two of them working together. They are capable of making many different combinations of movements, including gliding action. A number of muscles allow you to open close your mouth. They control forward, backward, side-to-side movements of lower jaw.

When muscles and joints do not work properly, muscles will often go into spasm or cramp. This spasm can become part of a cycle, results in tissue damage, muscle tenderness and spasm.

"This is a partnership between Girl Scouts of Northeast Mississippi and a school," Webb said. "This program is not designed to replace a traditional Girl Scout troop, however, it does alleviate pressures of transportation and time allotments for both the parent and the girl."

The purpose of the program is to help girls develop leadership skills and self-

esteem while at the same time enhancing their educational experiences through offered activities and programs, Webb said.

Girls in the In-School program are registered Girl Scouts and are entitled to all of the same benefits, such as recognition and special events offered by the Council, as girls in traditional troops.

The size of the In-School troops, which also can be found in housing projects, ranges between 10 and 60 members. They meet in classrooms or locations within the school, Webb said.

Funding for the In-School program is through a grant from a Partnership for Healthy Mississippi and with Funding from the Girl Scouts of Northeast Mississippi. There is a \$10 registration fee.

The Girl Scouts of Northeast Mississippi has been offering the In-School program since 1995 to area girls.

Trained adults lead the troops in activities during the time they are with the girls.

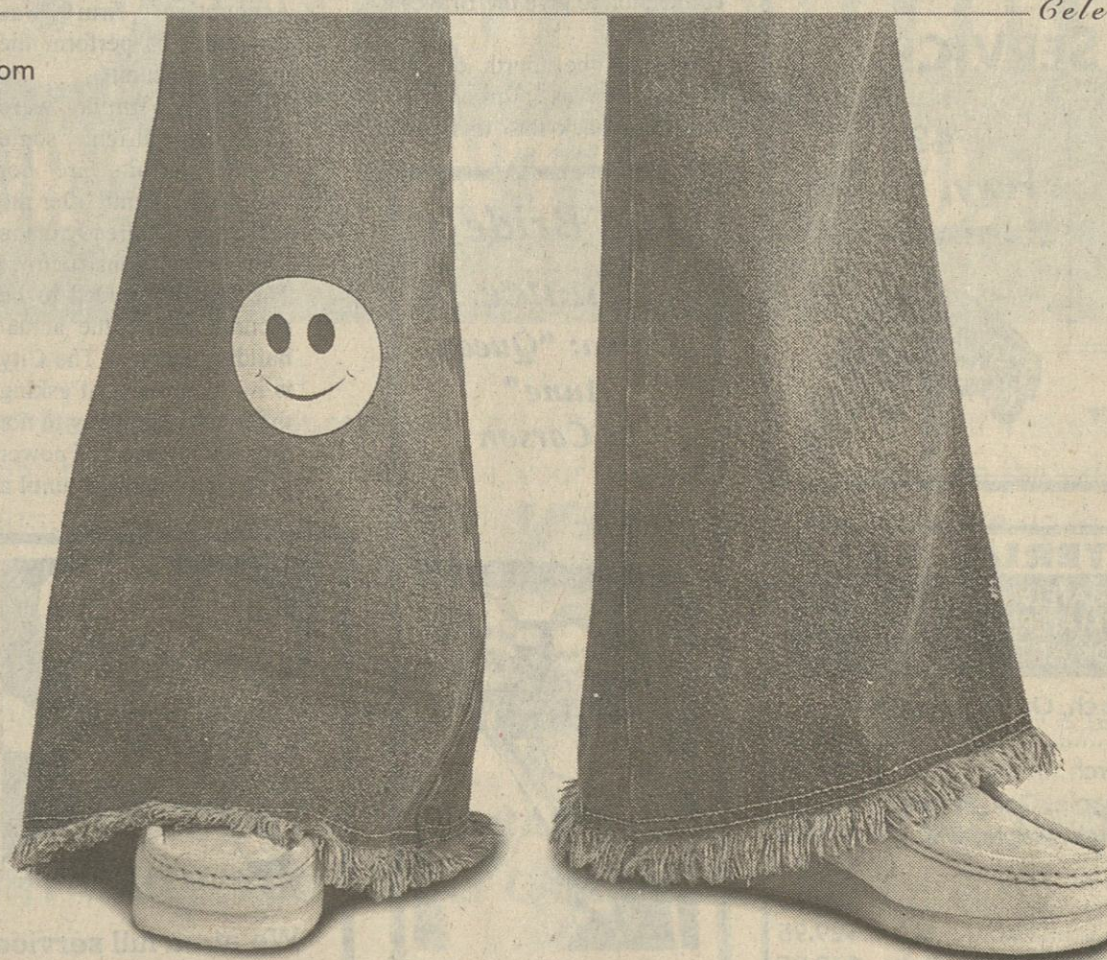

## Making High School Count

Freshmen at Tishomingo County High School received a special treat recently when Tim Steed spoke to them on "Making High School Count."

Steed presented a real-world look at how to succeed in and after high school. In most cases, the questions he made up were those questions that appeared on the test.

Steed encouraged the freshmen to be more serious about their school opportunities as well as set career and educational goals for themselves.

The TCHS freshmen enjoyed hearing Tim Steed, and they plan to apply some of his advice during their 800 hours in high school.

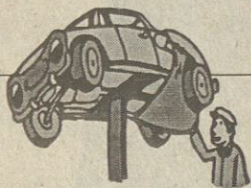
