DEADLY ATTACKS ON AMERICA

The "greatest tragedy on our il" were the words United tates Attorney General John shcroft used Tuesday evening describe the deadly attacks the World Trade Center's win Towers in New York ity and the U.S. Pentagon cilities in Washington earlier

The day of terror and disbef began around 8:45 a.m. ET esday morning, September 1, 2001 when a hijacked comercial airliner carrying 92 ssengers crashed into one of e twin towers of the World rade Center, the financial cenof the world. Eighteen min-

utes later, a second hijacked airliner carrying 175 passengers crashed into the second twin tower.

Some forty minutes later, another hijacked commercial airliner crashed into the Pentagon, the military center of the United States. The jet was described as a "guided missile" as it hit the southside of the sixstory building.

A fourth commercial jetliner crashed in a rural area of Pennsylvania. The exact destination of this hijacked jet is not known, but some believe it was headed for Washington or Camp David in Maryland.

Haunting cell phone calls to 911 from passengers on the planes have indicated that all four planes, two American Airline jets and two United Airline jets, were apparently hijacked by terrorists with knives. All four planes were flights from the East Coast to California.

The area around the World Trade Center was compared to a "war zone" as the mighty twin towers crumbled to the ground some two hours after the attacks. It is believed that some 200 firefighters and possibly 100 police officers may have perished in the crumbling buildings as they worked to rescue the 10,000 employees cilities were closed as were believed to have been in the building. Although the Trade Center employed some 50,000, people, many had not arrived for work when the attack occurred. The exact number of ballgames were canceled. dead will not be known for

As the terror continued through the morning, the United States government was put into the highest level of security or High Alert Status. At 9:18 ET the FAA shut down all commercial airlines and airports in the U.S. At 10:05 the Whitehouse was evacuated, as was the Capitol. All NASA fa- responsible."



According to Ricky Marlar, eutenant - Enforcement vision, New Albany District, A-Team Motorcycle vision of the Mississippi ghway Patrol assists regular ficers of the Mississippi ghway Patrol in enforcing state's traffic laws. The m travels from county to unty across the state of fississippi to make motorists

This team currently is made up of 14 officers with 4 more in training. The men rotate as they travel from location to location across the state. These men live in different areas of Mississippi.

According to Houston Dorr, the Director of the Motorcycle A-Team Division, this is the first time the division has been in North Mississippi and Tishomingo County. They have been traveling across the state for the past five months spotting and issuing tickets to motorists who are not obeying Mississippi's laws.

Patrolman Dorr added that inspection stickers and tags are much easier to read from a motorcycle than they are when traveling in a car. He also added that people do not recognize that the motorcycles are Highway Patrol cycles until it is too late for them to slow down. Dorr said that the cycles were easier and faster to turn around and that the cycles allow the officers a much quicker response time.

Even at the beginning of their stay in Tishomingo County, the troopers were impressed with the natural beauty of the area, and they hoped traffic offenders did not mar their impression of Tishomingo County.

They did say that drivers on the road need to be aware of the A-Teams' zero tolerance for speeding and breaking of traffic laws.

"This declaration does not mean our safety is jeopardized; rather, it gives the consumer some protection by the law against unfair and unnecessary hikes in fuel

Rumors of gas shortages across the state have prompted long lines at gas stations. There is no evidence of gas shortages, and any rumors should be treated as such.

"Our people are suffering today from an horrible attack on our country. They should not suffer further because of false rumors about fuel shortages," said Musgrove.

Home Economics Tips

WHEN YOU'RE **COOKING - COOK FOODS** THOROUGHLY

It takes thorough cooking to kill harmful bacteria, so you're taking chances when you eat poultry, fish, or eggs that are raw or only partly cooked. Rare and medium-rare steak, hamburger, and roast beef are also undercooked from a safety standpoint.

*Cook red meat to 160 degrees F; Cook Poultry to 180 degrees F. Use a meat thermometer to check that it's cooked all the way through.

*Salmonella, bacteria that cause food poisoning, can grow inside fresh, unbroken eggs. Cook eggs until the yolk and white are firm, not runny. Scramble eggs to a firm texture; don't use recipes in which eggs remain raw or only partially

*When you cook ahead, divide large portions of food into small, shallow containers for refrigeration. This ensures safe, rapid cooling.

SAFE MICROWAVING

A great timesaver, the microwave has one food safety disadvantage - it sometimes leaves cold spots in food. Bacteria can survive in these

*Cover food with a lid or plastic wrap so steam can aid thorough cooking. Vent wrap and make sure it doesn't touch the

Conservation Corner

A conservation buffer is a strip or parcel of land that exists next to environmentally sensitive areas such as wetlands, streams or rivers. Filter strips, field borders, grassed waterways, windbreaks, shelter belts, contour grass strips, and riparian (streamside) buffers all examples of conservation Conservation buffers conserve soil, enhance fish and wildlife habitat, conserve biodiversity, beautify the landscape and improve water quality.

According to Leila Wynn, Wildlife President of Mississippi, "As the original stewards of our land, farmers long have known that the best management practices include the use of conservation buffer strips to control runoff that impairs the quality of our Mississippi's waters.'

Homer Wilkes, State Conservationist for the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) stated, "NRCS and USDA's Farm Services Agency have several programs that provide incentive payments to farmers landowners establishing buffers, including the continuous sign-up option of the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) and the Environmental Incentives Program."

Land enrolled conservation buffers in CRP will receive an annual rental payment. This payment is

on the productivity of the soil type being offered and the average dry land cash rental rate for comparable land in the county. A 20 percent incentive is added to the annual rental rate for field windbreaks, grassed waterways, filter strips and riparian buffers. A 10 percent incentive is added to the annual rental rate for land within designated wellhead protection

Cost-sharing, at a rate of 50 percent, is available to establish the desired cover. Practices eligible for costsharing include but are not limited to, the following: sitepreparation, temporary cover until permanent cover is established, grading or shaping, seeds, trees or shrubs, plastic mulch and supplemental irrigation or fencing. Contracts under the continuous CRP signup are 10-15 years in length, depending on the practice.

Annual rental payments are made each year. Cost-share payments are made after the approved practices completed.

Other programs of USDA also can help with the cost of implementing buffer practices. These include the Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program and the Wetland Reserve Program.

To apply, contact your local USDA Service Center or conservation district office. You don't have to make a competitive offer as required of other programs. Your offer will be accepted if all eligibility requirements are met.

Girl Scouts Of Northeast Mississippi

Northeast Mississippi working with area schools to provide services to girls, ages 5 to 17-years-old, who are not being served by a traditional troop program.

In-School Day The program is being used in an estimated 40 schools in counties served by the Girl Northeast of Scouts Mississippi. The counties with In-School Day Programs are Alcorn, Benton, Chickasaw, Choctaw, Clay, Itawamba, Lee, Lowndes, Monroe, Noxubee, Oktibbeha, Pontotoc, Prentiss and Tishomingo.

The In-School program is an opportunity for young girls to experience the benefits for Girl Scouts during regular school hours, said Nancy Webb, director of Innovative Programs for the Girl Scouts of Northeast Mississippi.

"This is a partnership between Girl Scouts of Northeast Mississippi and a school," Webb said. "This program is not designed to replace a traditional Girl Scout troop, however, it does alleviate pressures and transportation allotments for both the parent and the girl."

The purpose of the program is to help girls develop leadership skills and self-

esteem while at the same time enhancing their educational experiences through offered activities and programs, Webb

Girls in the In-School program are registered Girl Scouts and are entitled to all of the same benefits, such as recognition and special events offered by the Council, as girls

in traditional troops. The size of the In-School troops, which also can be found in housing projects, ranges between 10 and 60 members. They meet in classrooms or locations within the school, Webb said.

Funding for the In-School program is through a grant from a Partnership for Healthy Mississippi and with Funding from the Girl Scouts of Northeast Mississippi. There is a \$10 registration fee.

The Girl Scouts of Northeast Mississippi has been offering the In-School program since 1995 to area girls.

Trained adults lead the troops in activities during the time they are with the girls.





Making High School Count

TV Producer, Writer, Actor Tim Steed Offers Advice

Freshmen at Tishomingo County High School received a special treat recently when Tim Steed spoke to them on "Making High School Count."

Steed presented a real-world look at how to succeed in and after high school. His program is presented in conjunction with Peterson's, and is sponsored by some of America's favorite companies and brands, including: Head & Shoulders, Monster.Com, Zest, Mentos, and PricewaterhouseCoopers. In most cases, the questions he made up were those questions that appeared on the test.

Steed encouraged freshmen to be more serious about their school opportunities as well as set career and educational goals themselves.
