Tishomingo County Man Charged with Capital Rape

A man with both a Tishomingo, MS, and a Sheffield, AL, address has been arrested by Tishomingo County authorities and charged with capital rape.

Deputy John David Murphy of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department reported that Jimmy Leroy Abington, of 1203 North Atlanta St., Apt. 1, Sheffield, AL, and also of Tishomingo, MS, was arrested on November 1. The 49 year-old Abington allegedly

had sex with a 12-year old family member. It was discovered that she was pregnant when she went for a basketball physical in July. At age 13, she had the baby.

Tishomingo County Sheriff David Smith said that there should be zero tolerance for this type of activity.

Abington is currently being held in the Tishomingo County jail on \$150,000 bond. The investigation into this case is continuing.

County Authorities Arrest Shoplifters

'Tis the season, and shoplifters should beware! All merchants, the police departments, and the sheriff's department in Tishomingo County are reporting an increase in shoplifting as the holiday season approaches, and they want the people to know that anyone caught shoplifting will be prosecuted to the fullest extent.

In the City of Iuka, last week, one merchant reported that he had caught three shoplifting suspects in a two-day period. The shoplifters were arrested, but names were unavailable at presstime. The Iuka merchant said he will prosecute anyone who is caught shoplifting in his business.

In the City of Belmont, two shoplifters were apprehended and arrested.

Investigator Donald Thomas of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department was called to Belmont last Friday to investigate shoplifting suspects at the Dollar General.

Officer Thomas responded to the call and waited for the suspects to leave the Dollar General. Thomas, assisted by Belmont Police officer, Harry Allen, made a stop behind the Piggly Wiggly store. After checking the vehicle, the officers found several items in the car, which matched the description of items taken from the Dollar General.

Arrested was Roy Dees, 52, of 301 Second Ave. NE, Red Bay, AL. Also arrested was his wife, Mary Ruth Dees, 44, of the same address in Red Bay.

Belmont Chief of Police Donald Reno charged Mary Ruth Dees with petit larceny. Tishomingo County Deputy Donald Thomas charged Roy Dees with DUI 1st offense, possession of whiskey, and petit larceny. Both were released after posting bonds of \$1,000 and \$2,000 respectively.

All law enforcement officers and merchants want the "would be shoplifters" in this area to know that they are on the lookout for them.

Home Economics Tips

VIEWPOINTS ON PARENTING: BABYPROOF YOUR HOME

With every passing day babies get more alert and curious about their surroundings. While nothing can replace adult supervision, simple changes like using security gates, cabinet locks, outlet covers, tub faucet protectors, toilet lid locks, and smoke and carbon monoxide detectors can help make your home safe for baby. In addition, simply keeping the following safety tips in mind can help prevent accidents at home.

KITCHEN

- Sometimes what may seem harmless could be potentially dangerous for your little explorer. For instance, a common household seasoning like salt can be dangerous to small children. Just 1 to 2 teaspoons ingested by a 25-pound child can cause irritability, lethargy, and possibly seizures; more than 1 tablespoon can be lethal. Keep all seasonings locked in cabinets or a pantry.
- Pots and pans should be stored in locked cabinets, too. If you allow your child to play with a pot, perhaps by calling it a drum, your toddler may wonder why it's ok to play with them on the floor, but not to reach up and pull them off the stove. Every time you cook, reinforce the concept "hot, don't touch."

BATHROOM

- Never leave an infant alone in the tub. Ignore telephone calls and doorbells. Remember, babies can drown in just an inch of water.
- Always keep toothpaste with fluoride out of reach of children under 6 years of age. If a child swallows more than a pea-sized amount (the recommended amount for kids under 6 years of age), seek professional help or contact a poison control center immediately. Toothpaste does not have a childproof cap, so never leave it out.
- Never leave children alone in a bathroom, as they could easily lock themselves in. Practice opening doors before you need to rescue a locked-in toddler. A draped towel over the top of the door not only stops the door from being inadvertently locked, but also protects little fingers from closing doors.

FAMILY ROOM

- Wicker items, such as baskets and chairs, can be choking hazards to small children. If you have these items in your home, check for loose pieces regularly and dispose of them safely.
- Keep purses and handbags off the floor and in a safe place. The contents and carrying straps present hazards for small children who like to

explore.

NURSERY

- Supermarket plastic bags can cause suffocation, and should not be used as wastebasket liners in homes with children.
- Don't forget to protect

electrical outlets behind the crib, as babies can reach through bars.

- Don't underestimate your toddler's strength. For instance, don't put a large (27- or 36-inch) TV on an unsafe or unsteady cart, because it can easily be pulled down.

AROUND THE HOUSE

- Tall lamps or coat racks can be pulled over onto babies. These should be removed or blocked by furniture to

prevent babies from getting to them. A broken bulb is broken glass, and halogen lamps are so not that, if tipped over, they can start a fire.

- Remove and throw away all dry cleaner bags immediately after bringing clothes home. They can pose a choking and suffocation hazard for small children. Also, the chemical used for dry cleaning will remain on the clothes unless you remove the bags.

- Hanging cords from phones, ladders, and appliances should be out of baby's reach.
- Tablecloths that hang over table edges can easily be pulled down and anything on top could fall on baby.
- Remove the gas jet key from the fireplace and place it out of reach so baby does not accidentally turn on the gas.
- If you use disposable baby bottle liners, tear the plastic tabs off before giving baby the bottle, as they can pose a choking hazard.

WILDLIFE DEPT. BUILDS BOAT RAMPS/FISHING PIERS

Mississippi has some of the best inland freshwater fishing in the Deep South. Within the past eight months, access to this good fishing has been made a lot easier for state anglers, according to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks.

In the last few months, the state wildlife department has worked closely with various county boards of supervisors, legislators, and local county and municipal officials in building boat ramps in the following areas: Neshoba County Lake, Neshoba County; Lake Mike Connor, Covington County; Eagle Lake, Warren County; Mantachie Creek on

the Tombigbee River, Itawamba County; Pickwick Lake at J.P. Coleman State Park, Tishomingo County; Mississippi River, Warren County; Leaf River, Forrest County; Bouie River in Forrest County.

Fishing piers were built at Great River Road State Park and Re-con lake in Bolivar County, Simpson Legion lake in Simpson County, and at the Forrest County Multipurpose Center in Forrest County.

"Fishing is one of the most wholesome family activities available to all Mississippians," Deputy Director Al Tuck said.

"Building these boat ramps and piers with the cooperation of so many local officials is one of the best ways for us to all work together and take advantage of this great natural resource available in our state."

Impact-Resistant

Every eyeglass and sunglass approved by the FDA must be impact-resistant. It must be able to withstand the impact of a 5/8" steel ball dropped from a height of 50 inches. This can afford you some degree of protection, but keep in mind that these impact-resistant glasses aren't shatter-proof or break-proof. You still have to protect your eyes and your glasses from accidents.

A lot depends on the care you give your glasses. Dropping them can sometimes loosen the lens. If you have scratched your glasses, you may have weakened them. Scratched or cracked glasses are easier to break or shatter.

It's important to have your glasses checked regularly. If needed, your optometrist can recommend quality lenses that meet the highest standards of impact-resistance. At the same time, your optometrist can check your eyes to make sure your glasses are giving you the best possible vision.

Looking After Baby's Teeth

Teeth are one part of the anatomy that many people take for granted. But some very special people - pregnant women - have two good reasons to be concerned with good oral health and dental hygiene.

Optimum oral hygiene habits - brushing, flossing, and dental visits - must be maintained throughout pregnancy. Why? The hormonal changes pregnancy may exaggerate the gums' response to formation of plaque on the teeth, causing unusually severe gingivitis or inflammation of the gums. Gingivitis is especially common during the second or eighth month of pregnancy and may cause red, puffy, or tender gums that tend to bleed when the teeth are brushed.

Some pregnant women avoid dental care during this special time of their lives. One reason may be their concern about the risk to the unborn baby from exposure to drugs and X-rays.

Most routine dental procedures can be done safely during the second trimester, or second trimester of pregnancy; however, X-rays should be postponed until after delivery.

During the first and third trimesters, emergency care and cleaning of the teeth are only procedures that should be performed. The baby's organs are forming during the first trimester and, in the third trimester, the mother may experience discomfort and should experience undue stress.

Respiratory Disease

When your dog is exposed to sick dogs at a kennel or dog show, it can catch kennel cough. Also referred to as "Canine Cough" or by its scientific name, Tracheobronchitis, this stubborn respiratory infection can keep dogs coughing for weeks or months.

Canine respiratory disease isn't usually fatal unless pneumonia develops. But it can cause appetite loss, lack of energy, and poor appearance, in addition to the coughing.

When infected dogs cough, disease-causing organisms get into the air and can easily infect other dogs. Animals kept at boarding kennels, shelters, pet shops, and veterinary clinics are considered at higher risk. So are those going to grooming shops and dog shows. They're often given extra vaccinations to protect them from canine respiratory disease.

A wide variety of viruses and bacteria can be involved in canine respiratory disease. The three most commonly involved are:

Canine Parainfluenza Virus.

Canine Adenovirus type 2 (CAV-2).

Bordetella Bronchiseptica Bacteria.

Vaccines against all three of these viruses or bacteria are available, sometimes in combination with vaccines against other diseases of dogs.
