Local Man Chased Through Russellville School After Routine Traffic Stop

According to an article in the *Times Daily* by Tom Smith, a Mississippi man was arrested Thursday morning, January 31, 2002, after he ran through an elementary school in Russellville, AL, and commandeered an occupied vehicle following a traffic stop.

Police Chief Donnie McGuire of Russellville said Eldridge Taron Johnson, 22, of Tishomingo, MS, is charged with disorderly conduct, driving without insurance, driving without a license, and not using a seat belt while driving.

It was determined that Johnson was also wanted on

three third-degree burglary charges by the Franklin County Sheriff's Department and on numerous traffic violations by the Florence and Red Bay police departments.

The ordeal began about 7:42 Thursday morning when Police Officer Ivie stopped Johnson on Clay Avenue in the parking lot of Russellville Elementary School. Chief McGuire said Johnson did not have a driver's license or any other kind of identification. When Officer Ivie did a criminal check on the suspect, he found out there were several outstanding warrants on Johnson. As Officer

Ivie was talking to Johnson, Johnson took off running and went behind the elementary school. He then ran into a back door of the school, through the building, and out the front door. As soon as Johnson left the school, he got into the back seat of a vehicle occupied by a woman and her daughter, and he told the woman to "drive!" Officers were able to stop the car at the intersection of School Drive and Clay Avenue, where Johnson was arrested without incident. He is being held in the Russellville City Jail without bail, and more charges are possible.

American Red Cross Needs Help of Tishomingo County Residents

After the 9-11 disaster, all Americans are much more conscious that disaster might occur at any time at any place. Here in Tishomingo County, the American Red Cross is involved in starting a program to train people to help provide relief shelters for victims of disasters.

Anytime there is a disaster—whether from tornadoes, fires, floods, ice storms—natural or man-made, people are likely to need a place to go or food to eat, or clothes to wear.

The Red Cross is now working with local fire departments and other interested persons to provide assistance for the communities in Tishomingo County so they can be prepared in case of a disaster.

This article is to see if there is enough interest among individuals, church groups, civic groups, and/or professional groups to set up classes to become Red Cross certified. The Tishomingo County Red Cross can offer classes to residents so they can become locally and nationally certified to deal with

disasters. To become certified, five classes are required. These classes are taught by Red Cross personnel and are provided free of charge. One must be Red Cross trained to work in Red Cross shelters.

People interested in becoming certified to deal with running shelters, damage assessment, or mass care in just your area or in other areas must have completed the five courses. If not Red Cross trained, one is not eligible to help in Red Cross facilities.

To show desire in starting classes, call Jerry Charbauskis, Red Cross volunteer, at 423-0087 or the Tishomingo County Red Cross Service Office at 438-7061. Jerry is nationally trained and is very interested in setting up disaster shelters in the Tishomingo County area.

Anyone who needs Red Cross assistance, which is totally free, should contact Jane Johnson, at the 438-7061 number. Since the beginning of 2002, the Red Cross has already provided assistance to three Tishomingo County families.

According to Luka fireman, Gene Gober, a passerby called the fire in to the 911 office at about 8:15 a.m.

When firemen arrived, the front wall of the structure was all that was standing. The back part of the house was

fully involved. The cause of the fire is unknown, and the Fire Marshall has been called in to investigate.

The Aday family was out of town visiting other family members at the time of the fire.

Everything they owned was completely destroyed by the flames.

The local American Red Cross Chapter has stepped in to help the Aday's with food and clothing. They also provided drinks for the firemen.

When the firemen from the Luka and North Crossroads Fire Departments arrived on the scene, it was spitting sleet and snow. The wet, cold, nasty weather greatly hindered the extinguishing of the fire.

Fireman Gene Gober said that the firemen from both departments were greatly appreciative to the local American Red Cross members and New Salem Baptist Church for the coffee and the Gatorade.

Letter To The Editor

A couple of nights ago, I was visited by my great uncle, a man whom I have dearly loved and admired my entire life. I went to him and hugged him and told him how proud that I was to see him, as I have done for 27 years. As I hugged him I became heart brokenly shocked. He was touching me inappropriately. At first I thought it was a mistake but after doing this three times followed by his words, "You don't mind if I do this, do you?" I felt quite frankly, nauseated, I didn't know whether to slap him or to cry. The way that I handled the manner was to push him away and give him the cold shoulder. Needless to say he left very

quickly without a word. I sat and cried for a while and then decided to call my grandmother for support. To add more shock and hurt to my night; she all but called me a liar after I had told her what happened. I am writing this letter to show how easily a child or woman who has been abused or molested, when they do reach out for help or support, they can just be pushed away, accused of lying and left feeling hurt and betrayed. I thank the Lord that I am a woman and not some innocent child. But no matter what my age I did not deserve to be touched in such an inappropriate manner. Parents, grandparents, caretakers listen

Male dogs can be neutered (castrated) as early as 6 months of age.

Remember these ages are the earliest dogs and cats need to be neutered (castrated or ovariohysterectomy). After these ages surgery can be performed at anytime or ask your veterinarian what is best for your cat or dog.

Just remember to be a responsible pet owner and not allow unwanted animals to be brought into the world.

"Lazy Eye" Must Be Caught Early

"LAZY EYE", also known as AMBLYOPIA, is a vision condition in which there is a loss of near and distance visual acuity (sharpness of vision) usually in only one eye. Normally, the images sent from both eyes to the brain are the same. In the case of lazy eye, one of the two eyes is sending out an image which is significantly less sharp. Eventually, the brain will begin to ignore this "inferior" picture. Because of disuse, the lazy eye will be further weakened, until it is all but useless.

Since the better eye "takes over" seeing for both, persons with lazy eye are often unaware that they have the condition. Periodic optometric examinations - beginning at the age of three or even before - are an excellent means of diagnosing lazy eye. It is a condition in which early diagnosis and treatment can usually make an important difference. This is a condition that is almost impossible for parents to notice on their own.

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BE PREPARED FOR AN ICE STORM

Snow, sleet and freezing temperatures can strike any during the winter months. That's why it is best to be prepared in case of an ice storm. Keep the following items together so they'll be at your fingertips if the lights go

A battery-operated radio. When outages occur or emergencies arise local radio stations will keep you informed with timely updates.

Flashlights, extra batteries, large candles, matches. Make sure there's a flashlight on every floor of the house and one for every family member. If you use candles for light, be sure to keep them away from children and from flammable objects.

Bottled water, non-perishable food items. Keep plenty of bottled water on hand in case of an emergency. (Count on one gallon per person per day.) Remember family members with special needs, such as baby formula.

Emergency numbers. Keep the numbers for emergency personnel, including your electric cooperative, posted near the telephone or another handy place. Before you call to report an outage, make sure you haven't a fuse or tripped a circuit. Also look outside to see if your neighbors' lights are off. Be prepared to tell if you heard any unusual sounds or can see downed lines in the neighborhood.

Remember, telephones with answering machines rely on electricity to operate. Use a phone connected directly to the phone line.

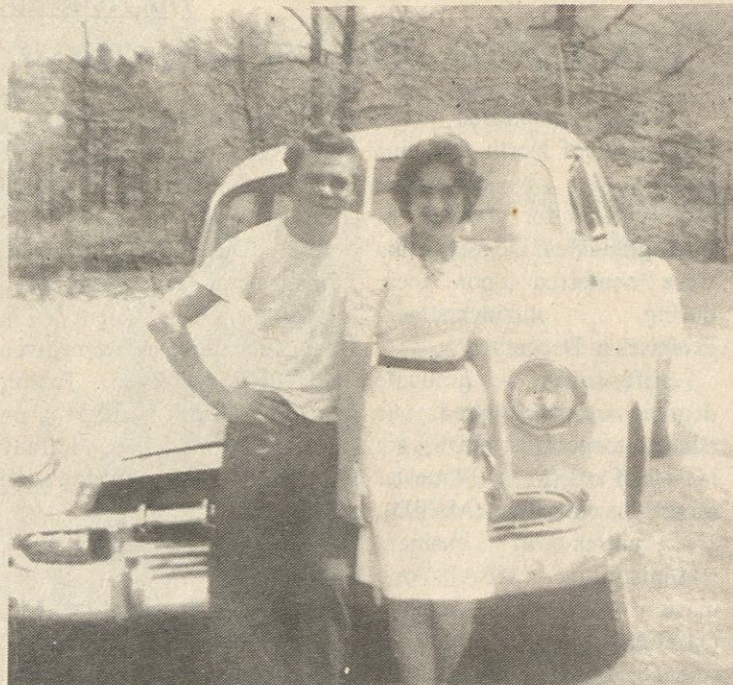

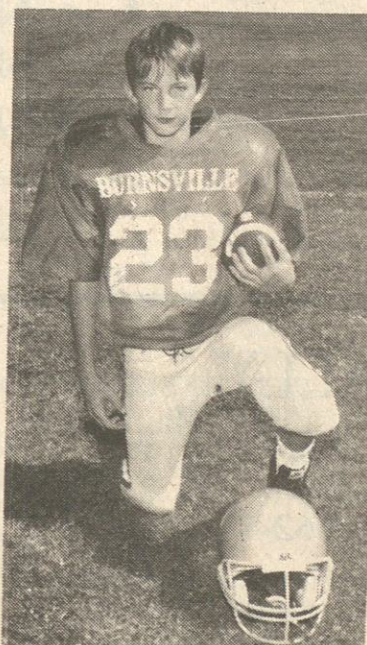

These presentations are an attempt to, not only affect children who are attending Head Start at the present, but to reach out to their siblings birth to age three.

A Nutrition Program, Getting Hooked on Healthy Eating, was presented at the Tishomingo Head Start Parent's Night on January 14, 2002. Topics covered in the program were: Eating Habits of the Nation's Youth, What is Healthy Eating? Benefits of Healthy Eating, Negatives of Unhealthy Eating, How Parents Can Help, and Benefits of Cooking with your Child.

Handouts were given on: a list of books about food and kids, that can be found in the

school and public library, Eating Habits of the Nation's Youth, recipes, Portion Distortion, tips for fostering

good eating habits, and the benefits of water versus soft drinks.

Cindy Wilbanks started the program by reading Gregory the Terrible Eater, a book that gives tips on how to help children eat foods that they do not like. Cindy and parent educator, Sue Kirkpatrick, completed the program by discussing the topics and providing the handouts. A Food Guide Pyramid refrigerator magnet was given

to each parent that attended. Also, each person present received a sample food snack, Gorp, that when eaten with milk provides all foods in the Food Guide Pyramid except vegetables.

Cindy Wilbanks and Sue Kirkpatrick also collaborated with Gaylena Rhodes, Iuka Hospital Registered Dietitian, on January 28, 2002, to present a nutrition program at Belmont Head Start Parent's Night.

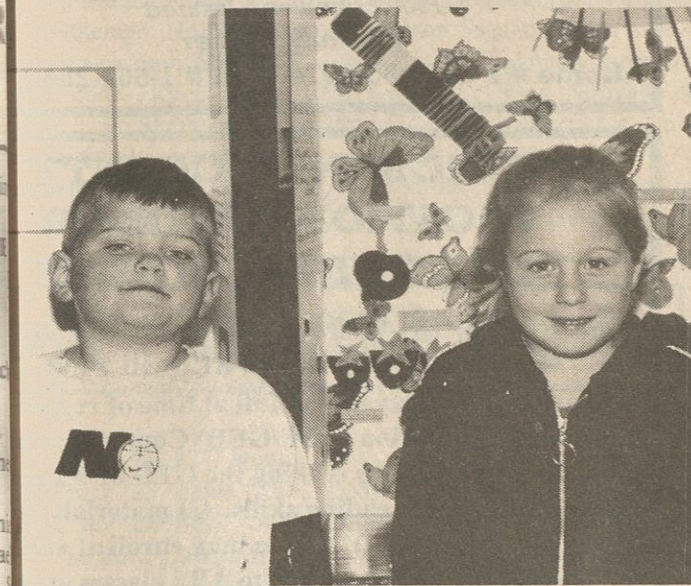

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is participating in an ongoing statewide effort to identify, locate and evaluate children, birth through the age of twenty-one, who have a physical, mental, communicative and/or emotional disability. Early identification of children in need of special education experiences is most important to each child. Furthermore, this information gathered from contacts with parents and other agencies will be used to help determine present and future program needs as progress is made toward the goal of providing a free appropriate public education to all children with a disability.

Information which could identify an individual child will be maintained by this agency and will be provided to other agencies only in accord with the Family Rights and Privacy Act and EHA-B. As a parent, you are guaranteed the right to inspect any such information about your child and to challenge its accuracy. Access to this information is forbidden to any unauthorized person without informed consent.

Please contact Betty Barnes, Child Find Contact Person for the Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District, if you know any children who may have a disability by calling 423-3206 or writing her at the following address: Tishomingo

County Schools, 1620 Paul Edmondson Drive, Iuka, MS 38852.

The Child Find Person implements child identification, location, and evaluation of children birth through twenty-one who have disabilities, regardless of the severity of their disability, and who are in need of special education and/or related services. The Child Find person works with the local Head Starts, Human Services, Health Department, and Mental Health Agencies, as well as local education agencies, physicians, and other individuals to identify and locate children out of school and in school who may be in need of special education services.

Once a referral is made, it is the responsibility of the Child Find Contact person to insure that the Referral-to-Placement Procedures are followed. She works with the Local Survey Committee at each school to implement these procedures. The following activities briefly describe the procedures.

As a part of Child Study, parents are invited to attend a Local Survey Committee Meeting to review a child's educational record and performance and determine a need for an evaluation. Prior to an evaluation, copies of the Parent Information Pamphlet and Procedural Safeguards are

given to the parents. District personnel explain these copies to the parents and insure that they understand the Procedural

Safeguards. This process will be reviewed at each parent meeting.

After parental consent for testing is obtained, a non-discriminatory evaluation is conducted. Students are evaluated in all areas related to the suspected disability by qualified personnel.

Parents are invited to attend the Eligibility Determination Conference by the Multidisciplinary Evaluation/Eligibility Team to determine if a disability exists. If the child meets eligibility criteria for special education services and/or related services, an Individualized Education Program is developed and the parents are invited to attend the meeting. Parents must sign permission for placement before a child can receive services. Parents, teachers and students participate in the process. All students receiving special education services are reassessed at least once a year and reevaluated at least once every three years.

We now have twenty-seven special education classes in our district which provide services to students who have a physical, mental, developmental, communicative, and/or emotional disability. It is the goal of the Tishomingo County School District to provide a free appropriate public education to all children with disabilities through age twenty-one.

February is "Strengthening Family Ties" Month At FFRC

Tishomingo County Families First Resource Center has designated February as "Strengthening Family Ties" month. The "Family Ties" program is dedicated to the memory of Jay Darwin, who used the symbol of a heart to communicate his feeling of love for his family and those close to him. If you received a heart from Jay, you knew that you were special to him and that he was thinking about you. At the time of Jay's death, many of his organs, including his heart, were donated so that others might live. In a strange coincidence, the young lady who received Jay's heart also liked to use the heart symbol to express love and concern for others.

Jay's mother Teresa Darwin is the volunteer coordinator for the school-based programs that are taking place this month throughout the entire county. Each child in grades K-3 has been asked to draw and/or color a picture that illustrates positive things that they do as a family, keeping in mind that all families are different and that every family member is important. The children in grade 4 have been asked to write a radio spot to promote the family for FUN 91 radio station. The winners will record their spots to be used on FUN

91 as a promotion for "Strengthening Family Ties"

month. In grades 5-8, students may enter an original poem concerning the positive aspects of a family. Students in grades 9-12 have been asked to write an original essay concerning fathers. The essay may be about his/her own father or father figure or a true story about an experience with a father, grandfather or foster father. Young men may also wish to write about what kind of father they want to be when the time comes. Volunteers will be going to each of the Head Starts in Tishomingo County during February to read "Love is a Family" by Roma Downey.

We ask that the minister of each church mention that February is "Strengthening Family Ties" month from the pulpit each Sunday in order to make everyone aware of the importance of strong families.

Please help us "strengthen family ties" by working in your own family. During the month of February, spent time with your children and so something together as a family. Everyone is busy and it is often hard to make time to spend together, but make the effort to do so during this month. Thanks for doing your part to strengthen the families of Tishomingo County.

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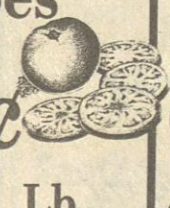



ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE CREATION OR MAINTENANCE OF A PUBLIC NUISANCE WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF PADEN, MISSISSIPPI

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Paden, Mississippi, that the following Ordinance be introduced for and by this Board pursuant to Section 21-13-1 et seq. of the Mississippi Code of 1972. That the purpose of this Ordinance is to forbid the creation or maintenance of a public nuisance, and for purposes of this Ordinance public nuisances shall be categorized as noise, smell, junk vehicles, free roaming dogs, or free roaming dogs and shall read as follows:

Section 1. That for the purpose of this Ordinance the following definitions shall apply when used herein.

The word "noise" shall mean loud sounds emitting from unnatural sources that disturb the peace and dignity of the Community.

The word "smell" shall include any odor offensive to the Community, but shall not be limited to garbage, sewer, and decaying animal wastes.

The words "junk vehicles" shall include any vehicle that is abandoned on an individual's property that is obviously unroadworthy and is not to serve no useful purpose to the owner.

The words "free roaming chickens" do not require a specific definition.

The words "free roaming dogs" do not require a specific definition. Section 2. That any member of the general public or member of the Board of Aldermen, who suspects a violation of this Ordinance may bring the matter to the attention of the Board, either in writing or in person, and that the Board notify the property owner or responsible party that a complaint has been filed alleging the existence of a public nuisance, and the letter shall spell out in specific details the particular offense that is alleged, and that the alleged offender may either remedy the nuisance or appear at the next regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen to defend the allegation. At that meeting the Mayor will sit as Municipal Judge and hear both the complainant and the alleged offender.

Section 3. That in the event the Mayor, sitting as Municipal Judge, finds that the accused offender is, in fact, guilty of creating or maintaining a public nuisance, then a fine in the amount of up to \$1,000, may be levied.

That this Ordinance shall be introduced at the regular September meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Paden on the 1st day of September 2001, whereupon it shall be posted on the front door of the Town Hall for a minimum period of two weeks, and a vote shall be taken at the October meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen upon a final vote shall be taken. In the event of adoption of this Ordinance, it shall be published as soon as possible in the Tishomingo County News for one time, and shall become effective thirty (30) days after the date of its adoption.

The foregoing Ordinance having first been reduced to writing and read and placed on the 8th day of January 2002, was read and considered by the Board, and each of said Sections were adopted by the following vote, to-wit:

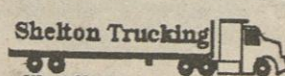

Tishomingo County has been chosen to receive \$17,546.00 to

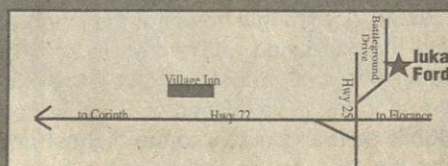
