## Fire Destroys Tishomingo Gas Station, Threatens Surrounding Area



The BP Gas Station on Highway 25 north of the 4-way stop in Tishomingo was completely destroyed by fire Thursday morning, March 7.

Tony Jackson, owner, said he, and his son, Anthony, were working in the first bay area, and his nephew, Jason, was working in the second bay area when "something blew up" near the middle of the station. These bay areas were located close to the center of the building.

Immediately after the explosion, Mr. Jackson grabbed a fire extinguisher and tried to put the quickly-spreading fire out. Mr. Jackson received burns on both his arms and on one hand due to the extreme heat. Both his son and his nephew escaped without injury.

Fire Departments from Tishomingo, Midway, Paden, and Valley Grove responded to the scene to fight the fire which started between 10:30 and 11:00 a.m. Thursday morning. Firemen were on the scene until about 5:00 p.m. that afternoon.

As of presstime the investigation as to the exact cause of the fire is ongoing.

Although the firemen controlled the possibility of a gas explosion, people in the immediate area took precautions and stayed back from the building. Traffic was rerouted around the 4-way stop for several hours.

Tishomingo officials said, "The fire was a real scare for us and our citizens. We were proud of the immediate action of the volunteer fire departments and their quick work."

The BP Station in Tishomingo is somewhat of a landmark. A gas station at this location has been in existence for many years. The station was a Gulf Station before it changed to a BP Station, and it is believed to have been originally established by M. R. Whitehead.

Tony Jackson said that he has been at the location since 1983 and that he does plan to rebuild.

Photo at left shows that little could be done to save the BP Gas Station located at Tishomingo. The fire spread quickly thru the structure with heavy damage to the middle area.

## City of Iuka Board Actions

Mayor Jackie Bryant and the Iuka Board of Aldermen met on Tuesday, March 5, 2002. In addition to regular business, several items of interest included:

- \*Approved a land swap which cleared right-of-way concerns to allow work to begin on the \$600,000 project to replace the overhead railroad bridge on Wilmoth Street between Quitman and Eastport Streets. Plans call for a wider bridge at this location.

- \*Approved a bid for three tornado warning sirens from Federal Signal Corporation's bid of \$41,882 over a bid of \$42,880.45 from American Signal Corporation. The sirens are expected to be installed in

April or early May. Funds for the lease-purchase of these sirens is in the current budget. This system will be activated from the Iuka Fire Department, and the sirens will be positioned to provide complete coverage of the city.

- \*Discussed the possibility of creating an ordinance to allow the city to require properties containing old, dilapidated structures to be cleaned up. Mayor Bryant encouraged the board to give some thought to the ways which could be used to deal with dilapidated structures and not cause hardships for citizens. The city already has an ordinance that would allow it to order a property to be cleaned up at the owner's expense. Several areas, which included the charred remains of Louis' Fish Market, a dilapidated house on Fifth Street where many animals have been dropped, and several other unsightly structures were cited as being areas that need to be improved.

- \*Received notification that Galaxy Cable would increase monthly rates from \$27.50 to \$30 for basic service and from \$13.40 to 13.95 for HBO.

## Former Iuka Man and Son Die In Shooting Tragedy

Friends in the Iuka area were saddened to learn of the deaths of former Iuka residents, Paul Weekley, and his son, Allen, who were now residing in Hoover, AL, near Birmingham.

According to an article in *The Birmingham News* by Jon Anderson, "The apparent murder/suicide happened about 10:15 a.m. Monday, March 11, at The Grove at Riverchase Apartment Complex off Riverchase Parkway East.

According to police, the elder Mr. Weekley, age 82, apparently shot his 46-year old son inside the apartment they shared, and then called his daughter, who lives out-of-state, and the Hoover Police to tell them what he had done and that he was going to take his own life.

Within a couple of minutes one of the neighbors called to report a gunshot at the apartment complex. A call to the police from the daughter

immediately followed. When authorities arrived on the scene, they found the father in front of the apartment on the ground and the son on the floor of the dining room, according to the Shelby County, AL, coroner.

The Weekley's had been living at the Grove since August of 2001. They will be returned to Iuka for burial with Cutshall's in charge. At presstime no arrangements had been made.

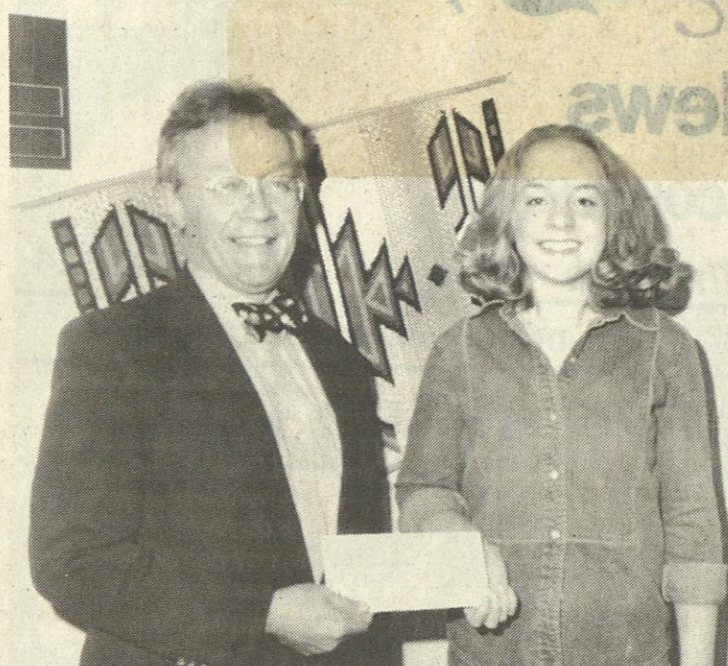

The quality of the entries reflects some very good student writers as well as an excellent school system." The first place entry appears in this week's edi-

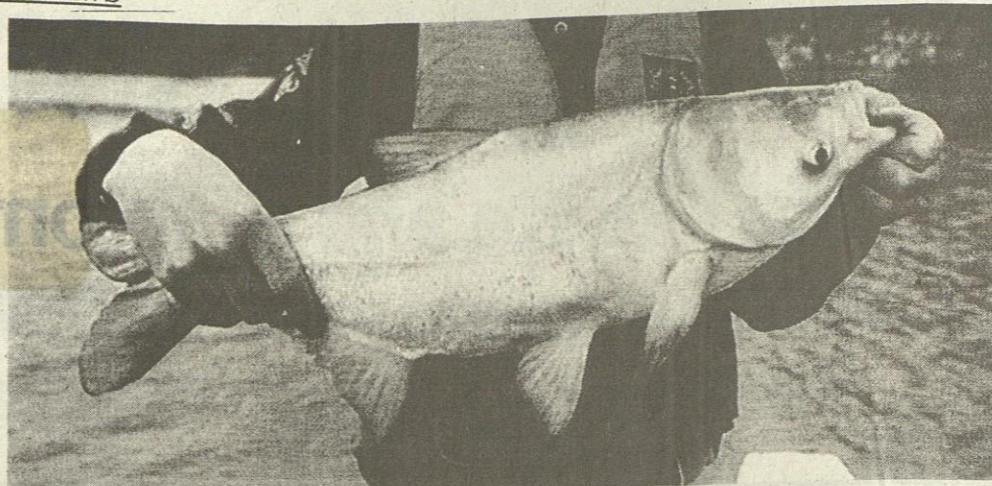
tion of *The Tishomingo County News*, and second and third place Carpe Diem's will be published in the next two editions of the paper.

## What Kind Of Fish Is That?

In the past two or three years I have had several calls from fishermen asking about an odd fish they caught. Some fishermen have been fishing around here all their life and have never seen anything like it.

It's probably a bighead carp. My first sighting was a few years ago and I had to contact the fisheries biologist and the Museum of Natural Science to find out what kind of fish it was.

The bighead carp is an ugly critter with his eyes low on the head near the angle of the jaw. He has a large mouth and small scales with irregular shaped dark blotches covering a gray body. His genus name is *Hypophthalmichthys* from the Greek, meaning underneath eye. The fish's large head and relatively small eyes, located forward and low on the head and seeming to focus downward, are keys to identifying the fish.

Mr. Big Head gets pretty big with a state record of 66 pounds at Lower Sardis Lake, although the species is known to get to 90 pounds and live as long as nine years in Russia.

Bighead carp have been documented from the Pascagoula drainage, and in the Mississippi and Yazoo Rivers, and now in the Tennessee River. The fish are being raised in at least nine fish farms in the state. They come from eastern

China and have been introduced for aquaculture purposes into at least 32 countries. It was introduced into the United States in the early 1970's by private fish farmers in Arkansas to control phytoplankton (algae) blooms. They are filter feeders like paddlefish (spoonbill) and a main part of their diet is algae. Following the 1991 flood, bighead carp have begun to show up in other waterways in the area.

The fact the bighead carp are filter feeders makes them useful to people who raise fish commercially. Catfish farm ponds often suffer from poor water quality because of accumulation of nutrients and waste products. Bighead carp, when added to these ponds, can significantly reduce an undesirable buildup of phytoplankton and other plants. The bighead carp, which doesn't eat artificial fish food,

helps the private fish farmer produce more catfish, and he can also sell the carp.

Bighead carp are not common fish, but are occasionally caught while fishing for other species. The fish is eatable but bony, and has

been marketed under various names including speckled amur, carp, and Chinese bass. There is some concern that they may be in competition with some of our native fish but are probably here to stay.

Some of the species are known to jump out of the water in the wake of a boat and sail through the air so watch for flying carp.

Detection of diabetes in a dental patient is also important because it may take longer for gum tissues to heal after surgery, with an increased likelihood of infection developing. Acute dental problems should be treated as soon as possible in a diabetic individual.

## 4-H TALK

### GET UP AND GET MOVING!

Often parents put emphasis on schoolwork and making the grades. One way to improve the mental capacity of children is to get them to improve their physical capacity.

Childhood is time of boundless energy that gives kids the ability to eat practically all they want and still stay slim. But when that energy is channeled into video games or suppressed by television viewing, children gain weight as easily as adults.

Kids need regular activity to form good habits of exercise they can carry the rest of their lives. Youthful inactivity leads to unhealthy weight gain and hurts future health.

Linda Patterson, Mississippi State University's Extension Service health education specialist, said most adults need at least 30 minutes of physical activity daily, but children need more.

"Adult fitness guidelines are for maintenance of health, not physical development," Patterson said. "For best aerobic and strength development, the ideal for children is to get three to four hours of vigorous physical activity each day."

U.S. Surgeon General Dr. David Satcher recently reported on the health threat that obesity and being overweight pose. The report found that just 3 percent of Americans regularly meet federal dietary guidelines and that 13 percent of children and 61 percent of adults are obese.

It further found that less than one-third of Americans engage in moderate physical activity and as many as 40 per-

cent don't exercise at all. A recent survey by the International Life Sciences Institute found that 75 percent of the nation's kids are not vigorously active for 20 minutes a day.

"Communities can help when it comes to health promo-

tion and disease," Satcher said. "When there are no safe places for children to play or for adults to walk, jog or ride a bike, that's a community responsibility."

Between schoolwork, television, video games and computers, most children don't have time to get active, but Patterson said parents need to help children make time for exercise. Set aside time before dinner and homework for your children to go outside. Turn off the TV and the video games and send them outside, weather permitting. One of the greatest joys I have is watching children at play. And sometimes, even becoming involved in that play myself. When that happens, oops - I've gotten some exercise myself.

There are no easy answers to this issue because school is important and other activities have their place," she said. "Parents need to be aware of their child's need for enough physical exertion to have the best physical health and mental capacity."

Exercise does not have to be work. Play, chores, sports, biking, yard work and physical education at school can all be part of an active life. The more active we are when we're young, the easier it is to stay that way as we grow into adults.

It's okay to have shorter periods of activity that add up to 30 minutes a day if one longer workout doesn't fit into your schedule. The key is to pick an activity you enjoy and stick with it. Check with your doctor before starting any exercise program.

**Watch your weight-** Research shows that losing as little as ten pounds can improve control of Type 2 diabetes. If you need to lose weight try making small changes at a time. Focus on eating smaller portions, eating less fat and more vegetables, and becoming more active.

**Today's guidelines to carbohydrates-** To better control your blood glucose levels, it's important to pay the most attention to the amount of

carbohydrates you eat. Choose nutrient rich carbohydrate food often (whole-grain products, fruits, vegetables, and low fat dairy products) and round out the rest of your meal plan with lean meat, fish, and poultry.

**Sugars are carbohydrates, too-** Prior to 1994, people with diabetes were told to avoid sugars. It was assumed that sugars raised blood glucose levels more than other foods like potatoes, rice or beans. Research has shown that the effect of different carbohydrates on blood glucose is more complex. Work with a registered dietician to learn how much carbohydrate to eat and how to fit in occasional sweet foods.

**Sugar free foods can help-** Although table sugar and other calorie-containing sweeteners are acceptable as part of the diabetes meal plan, you still want to use them sparingly. Sugar free foods and beverages generally provide fewer calories and carbohydrates and can be great tasting choices as part of your strategy for holding blood glucose levels in line.

**The facts about fat-** Today, eating less fat in your diet is easier than ever with a variety of great tasting food choices. By making lower fat and fat free choices, you can help limit your intake of total fat, saturated fat, cholesterol, and calories. Eating less fat especially less saturated fat is one way to lessen your risk for heart disease.

If you or a family member has diabetes, you have a new focus in your life to keep blood glucose levels as close to normal as possible. Making wise food choices and staying active will help.
