April's Azaleas Bring Color To Iuka

All over town azaleas are bursting into colorful bloom making Iuka a real showplace. Some of the showiest of these beautiful flowers can be found in the yard of Milton and Jean Price.

These lovely azaleas shown above are on Robin Lane in Iuka. The Price's have been growing azaleas since 1978 when they first came to Iuka from the Birmingham area. Mr. Price was a Project Manager for TVA

Yellow-Creek Nuclear Plant, and Mrs. Price worked at the Tishomingo County Hospital. They decided to stay in Iuka when they retired.

Mrs. Price tells the story that she planted some of her azaleas by flashlight when she was late getting home from work. She also states that at one time or another, they have probably planted at least 2,000 to 3,000 of the different varieties of azaleas. Currently, they have more than

1,000 of the plants.


Although some years have been good for the colorful flowers, some years have not been so good. Droughts and too much water affect the plants so the Prices plant and replant on a yearly basis. Mr. and Mrs. Price can be seen working in their azaleas in the early morning as well as in the late afternoon.

The Prices have named the different areas of their yards special names. Some of their

prettiest azaleas this year can be found in "the big ditch" and the "deep woods."

Mr. and Mrs. Price have two daughters, Jan and Kay. Jan lives in Evansville, IN, and she has one daughter, Jackie. Kay lives in Muscle Shoals, AL, and she has a son, Ray, and a daughter, April.

The Circuit Clerk's Office will be open 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Monday, April 29, through Friday, May 3rd, for voter registration. The office will also be open on Saturday, April 27th and Sunday, May 4th, 8:00 a.m. to noon. Anyone who has never registered to vote is urged to register during this week. Saturday, May 4th, will be the last day you may register in order to be eligible to vote in the 1st Primary Election on Tuesday, June 4, 2002. The election on June 4, 2002, will be for the Democratic nominee for United States Senator.

We ask that you please come by the office or call us at 423-7026 to update your voter registration information if your address has changed, if your name has changed, if you have moved from one supervisor's district to another, or from one precinct to another. It is very important that we have this information updated, so please,

take advantage of these extended hours to help us update our records. Your help in this will be greatly appreciated.

Voters who will be unable to go to the polls on June 4th for the 1st Primary Election may now apply for absentee ballots. You may call our office at 423-7026 to request the absentee, and an application will be mailed to you, or you may come to the office in person, make application, and vote your absentee ballot at that time. Absentee ballots will be available in the Circuit Clerk's Office until Saturday, June 1st, which is the last day to vote by absentee for the June 4th Election.

Iuka & Belmont Airports Get FAA Grants

Three area airports have been approved to receive more than \$550,000 in grants from the Federal Aviation Administration Airport Improvement Program, according to federal lawmakers this week.

Belmont, Iuka and Pontotoc will benefit from the \$550,000 in grants from the Federal Aviation Administration Airport Improvement Program.

The Iuka Airport will use their \$300,000 appropriation to clear obstructions and acquire additional land inside the runway protection zone.

Dr. Kelly Segars, chairman

of the Iuka Airport Board, states, "This is a much needed grant, and we would like to thank Rep. Roger Wicker, Sens. Thad Cochran, and Trent Lott, who worked hard to secure this grant."

The Belmont Airport will receive \$159,605 which will be used for land acquisition in the runway protection area.

The changes at both of the Tishomingo County Airports are needed to meet FAA design and safety standards. Money at the Pontotoc County Airport will be used to sealcoat the runway, taxiway an apron pavement, which will extend the life of the pavement and increase safety.

Former Iuka Resident Charged In Capital Murder in Booneville

Eric D. Miles, 20, of 160 CR 3401, Booneville, and Joseph Q. Bullock, 20, of 304 Hare Road, Booneville, are both charged with capital murder after a Tuesday, April 16 shooting which took the life of Jonathan Breedlove of 30 CR 2371 in the Hills Chapel Community in Prentiss County. Eric Miles is a former resident of CR 982, Iuka, in Tishomingo County.

Both Miles and Bullock are currently being held in the Prentiss County Jail without bond.

According to Lance Rinehart of the Prentiss County Sheriffs' Department, "An individual overheard a conversation and decided to act responsibly and inform us." This led to the arrest of Miles and Bullock.

Breedlove is believed to have been killed late Tuesday night. It is believed that his body was transported from the Burton Community all the way across Prentiss County to a vacant house in the Blackland Community via his own vehicle. This vehicle was later discovered abandoned in a

wooded area on CR 2120 near Breedlove's home in the Hills Chapel Community. After it was towed home, family members discovered blood in the vehicle. The Prentiss County Sheriff's Department immediately began the investigation process. Breedlove's body was discovered about midnight on Wednesday, April 17, according to Prentiss County Sheriff Randy Tolar.

Prentiss County authorities were assisted by the Mississippi Highway Patrol Criminal Investigation Bureau, and a crime lab team from Batesville, which was on the scene from 10:30 p.m. until 11 a.m. Thursday.

Five people were taken into custody for questioning, and Miles and Bullock were subsequently charged with capital murder.

On Monday, April 22, authorities from Prentiss, Tishomingo, and Alcorn Counties were still involved in locating a possible murder weapon in the vicinity of Crow's Neck on the Tenn-Tom Waterway in Tishomingo County. The investigation is continuing.



Stanley And Broadway Capture Firsts

Senior Matthew Broadway, and freshman Alisha Stanley turned in outstanding performances at the Daily Journal Relays in Tupelo on Saturday April 13th. Track athletes from thirty seven schools and 3 states took part in the all day event hosted by Tupelo High School.

This weekend Broadway and Stanley along with other members of the TCHS Track team will represent their school in the regional meet in Oxford.

Recently TC competed in Tupelo in Division II with schools of up to 760 students; the TCHS Girls team finished 6th, earning 37 points, and the boys 9th with 32.

Matthew Broadway vaulted 14 feet to finish first in the pole vault, breaking his

own school record. Alisha Stanley won first place honors in the 3200 meter in a time of 12:25.00, and placed 3rd in the 1600 meter run in a time of 5:47.88, both school records. Antony Allred placed second in the shot put with a throw of 41' 7", also a school record, and threw the discus 110' 5" for third.

Andi Gabriel's times of 6:07 in the 1600, and 54.06 in the 300 meter intermediate hurdles earned her 4th and 6th place finishes.

4-H TALK

The week of April 21 through 22 is National Volunteer Week. It is during this week that we pay tribute to all the hard work our Tishomingo County 4-H Volunteers do to improve the lives of our young people.

Currently, Tishomingo County claims thirty-two of the 3,316 4-H Volunteers in Mississippi. Most of these 32 volunteers serve as primary leaders for one of the fourteen 4-H clubs in the county. Others are resource leaders who serve members and youth from across the county or state and not just a specific club.

All of our leaders are important, as are the volunteers from across the state. On average, Mississippi 4-H volunteers give 220 hours of their time per year. They drive 300 to 400 miles in their privately owned vehicles. They spend 40 to 60 dollars for teaching materials

for club members. Their time is valued at \$6,000,000 per year.

Some volunteers serve as project club leaders. These are leaders that have an interest in a specific project such as Field and Stream, Clothing Selection, Clothing Construction or even Woodworking.

Other volunteers serve as general or community club leaders. These leaders meet with members with interest in many different projects. They usually meet with youth that live in their neighborhoods. Club meetings may be held in their homes or at a local meeting place like a library or a

the leader is comfortable working with.

The leader can meet the club as often as he or she likes. It may be weekly, monthly or some other amount depending on the projects the club has going on at the time. The number of meetings is left up to the

volunteer and the members of the club.

Who can be a volunteer? Anyone interested in helping young people become the adults they are meant to be. Volunteers must be at least 18 years old. To chaperone members on out of county activities they should be at least 21 years old. There is no maximum age to be a volunteer.

Responsibilities of a 4-H volunteer include accepting assignments, respecting the confidence of the public and 4-H, provide feedback to 4-H staff, use your time wisely, communicate your limits, to be considerate of others' abilities and to work as a team member.

Volunteers can expect support from the county and state Extension staff in the following ways: volunteer roles explained; volunteer training needs met; provide 4-H project materials for members; provide club meeting ideas; involve volunteers in planning county 4-H contests and programs; keep lines of communication open; and provide appropriate recognition.




4-H Share-The-Fun Talent Results...



The Arrival Of Sp

Unfortunately, the beginning of tick season for many dogs. The common disease caused by ticks is the disease that dogs get from ticks is the same that can affect humans, though we cannot get it from our dogs, nor can we get it from us.

The disease is transmitted when a tick bites and injects its saliva into the dog. The tick finds its way to the dog and causes lameness. It also causes red spots on the skin that usually go away in three weeks. Some simply will not go away and may develop into a chronic condition. The disease requires a veterinarian's help with treatment with antibiotics. Since Lyme disease is widespread, you should check with a veterinarian to see if it is prevalent in your area. If so, your veterinarian will prescribe a vaccine to protect your dog.

Tick paralysis is caused by the female tick injecting a toxin into the dog. Once the offending tick is removed, the paralysis clears up, but, consult your veterinarian for complications can occur.

In the tick infested areas, use a good flea and tick control product to keep ticks from biting your dog. If you find a tick on your dog and you cannot remove it, wear gloves. If the tick is carrying a disease, avoid exposing the open wounds on your dog to the blood. Some methods work to remove attached ticks.

The safest and most effective method is to spray the dog with a flea/tick spray.

Or, you can cover the tick with petroleum jelly and wait. (When it breathes, it lets go.)

Also, you can grab the tick close to the skin and pull slowly. The tick releases; however, this isn't the best method because the tick's head remains in the skin and become infected.

TCHS Seniors Registered To Vote

On Tuesday, April 16th, Donna H. Dill, Circuit Clerk for Tishomingo County, and Cindy Hinton, Deputy Circuit Clerk, were at Tishomingo County High School to register students to vote. All students who are 18 years of age or students who will be 18 years of age before the General Election on November 5, 2002, are eligible to register.

There will be a 1st Primary Election for the Democratic Party on Tuesday, June 4, 2002, for the United States Senate race. Candidates appearing on this ballot will be James W. "Bootie" Hunt of Starkville and Steven Douglas Turney of Bassfield.

There will be no Republican Primary because only one candidate qualified to run on this ticket for U.S. Senate. The candidate is incumbent Senator Thad Cochran of Jackson. Therefore, he will be the Republican nominee in the November General Election.

The Reform party nominee will be Shawn O'Hara of Hattiesburg. He will appear on the November ballot.

For the First District Congress there will be no party primaries as there is only one candidate for each party. The nominees for each party include: Incumbent Roger

Wicker of Tupelo for the Republican Party, Rex Weathers of Burnsville for the Democrat Party, Brenda Blackburn of Hattiesburg for the Reform Party, and Harold Taylor of Nesbit for the Libertarian Party. These candidates will appear on the November General Election Ballot.

Other candidates to be on the November General Election Ballots other than the U.S. Senator and U.S. Representative will be candidates for Supreme Court Justice, the Court of Appeals Judges, Chancery Court Judges, and Circuit Court Judges. These candidates have until May 10, 2002, to qualify; therefore, at this time we do not know who will be running for these offices.

Citizens of the 5th District of Tishomingo County will also elect a School Board Member for their district in November. The earliest date a person may qualify for school board is August 7 and the last day to qualify is September 6.

All citizens are encouraged to register to vote so that you may exercise your freedom in voting for the candidates of your choice.

RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO FORM THE TRI-COUNTY REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT

Alderman Biggs moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, due to the process of continually lowering water tables in the underground aquifers which supply the water to the areas of Alcorn County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Tishomingo County, Mississippi and surrounding areas, it has become necessary for the continued health and welfare of the citizens of the area to provide an alternative supply of water;

WHEREAS, based on numerous studies and data furnished by the Tennessee Valley Authority, Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality, Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality-Office of Land and Water Resources, and other agencies and engineering firms, it has been determined that the best and most economical source of such alternative water supply is the Tombigbee River and/or the Tennessee Tombigbee Waterway or some combination of each;

WHEREAS, a petition was forwarded to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District pursuant to Section 51-8-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, requesting that the existing district undertake to provide the alternative supply of water to Alcorn County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Tishomingo County, Mississippi;

WHEREAS, a response to that petition was received from the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District stating that the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District was unable to affirmatively respond to the petition pursuant to the requirements of the statutes;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of all citizens of the City of Corinth, Mississippi, the City of Booneville, Mississippi, the City of Iuka, Mississippi, Alcorn County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Tishomingo County, Mississippi to form a joint water supply district for the purpose of constructing the necessary facilities to supply the areas of Alcorn, Prentiss, and Tishomingo Counties, Mississippi with the alternative source of water;

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Mississippi, in particular, Sections 51-8-63 and 51-8-65, Mississippi Code of 1972, require that any efforts by the parties hereto to form an entity to acquire and assume any powers, duties, and responsibilities of a joint water supply district are subject to the prior approval by the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality and upon such terms and conditions as may be acceptable to the Mississippi Commission on

Environmental Quality after the required parties officially file a petition or petitions as required by law with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality. Although the parties have been in contact with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality, have informed the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality of the efforts, matters, and things contained herein, have briefed the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality of the reasons and justifications for forming the Tri-County Regional Water Supply District, and have a received a tentative and preliminary, but unofficial and non-binding, verbal indication from the appropriate personnel with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality that it will favorably receive the application for the formation of the entity, subject to applicable law, the final formation and approval of this Tri-County Regional Water Supply District is subject to a favorable ruling by the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality upon the filing of a proper petition or petitions with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality as required by law. However, the entities herein must approve the formation of the subject Tri-County Regional Water Supply District, as required by law, before any petition or petitions can be officially filed with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality; and

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Mississippi require that a public hearing be held on the question of whether the public convenience and necessity requires the creation of such a district and whether the creation of such a district is

economically sound and feasible.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Alderman of the City of Iuka, Mississippi ("Iuka") that is their intent to form a joint water supply district with the Board of Supervisors of the Tishomingo County, Mississippi ("Tishomingo County"), with the Board of Aldermen of the City of Corinth, Mississippi ("Corinth"), with the Board of Aldermen of the City of Booneville, Mississippi ("Booneville"), with the Board of Supervisors of Alcorn County, Mississippi ("Alcorn County"), and with the Board of Supervisors of Prentiss County, Mississippi ("Prentiss County") pursuant to section 51-8-1, et. seg. Miss. Code of 1972 as follows:

1. The name of the newly created water supply district shall be the Tri-County Regional Water Supply District ("Tri-County District").
2. The geographic boundary of said newly created water supply district shall be the geographic boundaries of Alcorn County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Tishomingo County, Mississippi.

3. The function of the Tri-County District will be to take all actions necessary to construct, erect, maintain, and operate facilities which would provide a source of water to the geographic areas served and to enter into all cooperatives, agreements, contracts, and other legally binding obligations with any and all other governmental agencies, firms or corporations in order to effectuate the construction, maintenance, and operation of such facilities.
4. The powers of the Tri-County District shall be fixed and exercised by a Board of Commissioners consisting of twelve (12) voting members. Said voting members shall consist of the following appointees and who otherwise meet the requirements of Section 51-8-25, Miss. Code of 1972, as now enacted or hereafter amended, and other applicable law:

- a. Two (2) members appointed by Corinth who shall each be a resident citizen in said municipality, two (2) members appointed by Booneville who shall each be a resident citizen in said municipality, and two (2) members appointed by Iuka who shall each be a resident citizen in said municipality,
- b. Two (2) members appointed by Alcorn County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Alcorn County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by appointed by said county, two (2) members appointed by Prentiss County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office,

be the same person as Prentiss County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by said county, and two (2) members appointed by Tishomingo County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Tishomingo County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by said county;

- c. As to the initial term of office regarding each county's appointee to the Board of Commissioners of the Tri-County District and who is said appointee by virtue of his appointment by such county to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District, the initial term of such three (3) members shall be for the duration of that person's term of appointment by said county to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District but in no event to exceed the maximum term of office of five (5) years as prescribed in the applicable joint water management districts' statutes being Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. Thereafter, the term for each of said three (3) members shall be for a term of four (4) years or until his successor is named and for so long as said person is that respective county's appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District but in no event to exceed the maximum term of office of five (5) years as prescribed in the applicable joint water management districts' statutes being Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. It is the intention herein that in the event that the county's representative to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District serves continuously for more than five (5) years that said person's tenure on the Board of Commissioners of the Tri-County District shall cease and terminate, and the said county shall take appropriate steps, as soon as practicable, to appoint a person to fill this position who likewise must be the county's appointee to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District. Furthermore, it is the intention herein that when said county appointee's term of office with Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District terminates and said person is not successively and without interruption reappointed to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District board, said person's term as a member of Tri-County District's Board of Commissioners shall likewise terminate. Furthermore, it is the intention herein that each county shall coordinate, to the extent practicable and to the extent allowed by law, the term of said county's appointment to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District as set forth in Section 51-13-105, Miss. Code of 1972, in and for such a term and manner so as to not exceed the statutory maximum term of the office of the county's appointment to the board of the Tri-County District's Board of Commissioners as set forth in Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. Nothing herein shall preclude each respective county, if it so desires, from reappointing the same person to the Board of Commissioners of the Tri-County District provided said person is likewise the county's appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District.

- d. The initial term of office of the remaining nine (9)

members of the board of the Tri-County District's Board of Commissioners appointed collectively by Corinth, Booneville, Iuka, Alcorn County, Prentiss County, and Tishomingo County shall be determined by random drawing in staggered terms with three (3) members serving five (5) year terms, three (3) members serving four (4) year terms, and three (3) members serving three (3) year terms. Thereafter, all terms shall be for five (5) years for any such members appointed by Corinth, Booneville, Iuka, Alcorn County, Prentiss County, and Tishomingo County to any of these nine (9) board positions.

- e. In addition to the aforesaid voting members which constitute the Board of Commissioners, the Board of Commissioners shall be, and hereby is, authorized and allowed to appoint one or more persons or representatives to an unofficial, non-voting advisory board as the Board of Commissioners may deem appropriate in the best interests of the Tri-County District.

5. The Board of Commissioners shall be responsible for the operation and management of the Tri-County District and it shall be their exclusive authority and they shall be empowered to do all acts necessary, proper, or convenient in the exercise of the powers granted by applicable law to such district, including but not limited to, the power and authority to acquire, construct, reconstruct, improve, better, extend, consolidate, maintain and operate facilities and to contract with any municipality, person, firm, or corporation for services and for a supply and distribution of water incident to the operation and maintenance of such system, and in addition to other powers, the Tri-County District hereby created and acting through its Board of Commissioners shall have the power to:

- a. To sue and be sued;
- b. To acquire by purchase, gift, devise, lease or any other mode of acquisition, and to hold or dispose of, real and personal property of every kind within or without the district;
- c. To make and enter into contracts, conveyances, mortgages, deeds of trust, bonds, leases or contracts for financial advisory services;
- d. To incur debts, to borrow money, to issue negotiable

bonds pursuant to Section 51-8-35 (1), Miss. Code of 1972, and to provide for the rights of the holders thereof as provided therein, and in addition to the powers and authority herein conferred upon the District shall also have the power to incur and borrow money to provide funds for water pollution abatement projects by issuing improvement water bonds, or combination improvement water bonds, or combination improvement water and sewer bonds as provided pursuant to Section 51-8-35 (2), Miss. Code of 1972, and to provide for the rights of the holders thereof as provided therein and in said event Booneville, Iuka, Alcorn County, Prentiss County, and/or Tishomingo County, as the case may be, shall have the authority and the obligation to make assessments against benefited properties pursuant to Sections 51-8-35(2) and 51-8-45, Miss. Code of 1972. To fix, maintain, collect and revise rates for services rendered by or through the such district, which rates and charges shall be subject to review or regulation by the Public Service Commission except in those cases where a city operating similar services shall obtain a certificate of convenience and necessity from the Mississippi Public Service Commission.

- f. To pledge all or any part of its revenues for the payment of its obligations and to exercise its powers authorized pursuant to Section 51-8-47, Miss. Code of 1972;

- g. To make such covenants in connection with the issuance of bonds or to secure the payment of bonds that a private business corporation can make under the general laws of the state;

- h. To use any right-of-way, public easement, or other similar property or premises necessary or convenient in connection with the acquisition, improvement operation or maintenance of the facilities of such district held by the political subdivision thereof which shall consent to such use;

- i. To enter into agreements with state or federal agencies for loans, grants, grants-in-aid, or forms of assistance, including, but not limited to, participation in the sale and purchase of those agreements authorized pursuant to Section 51-8-55, Miss. Code of 1972;

- j. To acquire by purchase, lease, gift, or otherwise existing works and facilities providing services which it was created, and any lands, rights, franchises and other property, real or personal, necessary to the completion and operation of such system upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon, and, if necessary as a condition of acquisition price, to assume the payment of outstanding notes, bonds or other obligations of such system; however, if any corporate agency or such facilities desires to continue providing services, the corporate agency shall not be required to do so later than ninety (90) days after the effective date of the creation of the district; the district shall thereupon relinquish its right to such services until and unless the corporate agency elects otherwise or fails to adequately provide services;

- k. To extend its services to areas beyond the boundaries (1) mile of the boundaries of such district, and such extension shall be made to an area occupied by another corporate agency providing the same service so long as such corporate agency continues to serve such areas. Areas outside of such district desiring to be served which are more than one-mile limit must be brought into the annexation proceedings;

- l. To be deemed to have the same status as other municipalities with respect to payment of taxes on purchases made by such districts;

- m. To borrow funds for interim financing from the receipt of funds as outlined in Section 51-8-33, Miss. Code of 1972.

- n. To choose a location within the district for the office of the district;

- o. To adopt a plan for management of the water of the district, provided that such plan is submitted to and approved by the Mississippi Commission on Natural Resources, now the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality, as consistent with the water management plan or objectives;

- p. To hire such personnel and contract for professional, technical, or other services as the Mississippi Commission on Natural Resources deems necessary for the district and fulfillment of its water management objectives;

- q. To secure connection to or participation in the water supply system provided by the district, including the power to enforce mandatory or prohibitory injunctive relief.

however, that the authority of the Mississippi Commission on Natural Resources, now the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality, to enforce such regulations and enforcement authority shall not be exercised in connection with the regulatory and enforcement authority of the Mississippi Commission on Natural Resources, now the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality, to enforce such regulations and enforcement authority.

- r. To acquire by condemnation all property, real, personal, or mixed, or any interest therein, within or without the boundaries of the district, for the projects and the exercise of the powers, privileges, and functions conferred upon the district according to the procedure provided by law for the condemnation of lands or other property for public use, rights-of-way or other purposes. This eminent domain to acquire any such property, including, but not limited to, lands, rights-of-way, easements, and other property, personal or mixed, as may be appropriate to the project and whenever public necessity and convenience requires is hereby authorized, given to, and shall be exercised by the Board of Commissioners of the Tri-County District under the option as provided in Section 51-8-33, Miss. Code of 1972. If the power of eminent domain is exercised by the Tri-County District in the name of the Tri-County District, the power shall be exercised in the manner provided by Section 51-27-5 1, Miss. Code of 1972, as now enacted or hereafter amended.

6. In addition, the Board of Commissioners of the Tri-County District shall have the power to adopt, promulgate, and repeal such rules and regulations as may be deemed appropriate for the management and operation of the district so long as said rules and regulations conform to the laws of the State of Mississippi.

7. The governing bodies of each of the local government units of Corinth, Booneville, Iuka, Alcorn County, and Tishomingo County shall have the authority to levy a special tax pursuant to Section 51-27-5 1, Miss. Code of 1972.

8. Any references herein to any provision(s) of the Mississippi Code of 1972 shall be construed to mean as said provision(s) now enacted or is hereafter amended; and

9. If any part of the powers or provisions herein shall be found to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, all other powers and provisions herein shall remain in full force and effect.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka, Mississippi, adopts this resolution declaring the intent to form the water supply district and do hereby set the boardroom at the City of Iuka, Mississippi, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., on the day 11th of March, 2002, time and place for a public hearing as to the question of public convenience and economic feasibility for the forming of such a district and is hereby directed to publish a legal notice of such public hearing pursuant to the laws of the State of Mississippi.

RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO FORM THE TRI-COUNTY REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT

Supervisor Price moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, due to the process of continually lowering water tables in the underground aquifers which supply the water to the areas of Alcorn County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Tishomingo County, Mississippi, and the surrounding areas, it has become necessary for the continued health and welfare of the citizens of the area to provide an alternative supply of water;

WHEREAS, based on numerous studies and data furnished by the Tennessee Valley Authority, Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality, Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality-Office of Land and Water Resources, and other agencies and engineering firms, it has been determined that the best and most economical source of such alternative water supply is the Tombigbee River and/or the Tennessee Tombigbee Waterway or some combination of each;

WHEREAS, a petition was forwarded to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District pursuant to Section 51-8-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, requesting that the existing district undertake to provide the alternative supply of water to Alcorn County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Tishomingo County, Mississippi;

WHEREAS, a response to that petition was received from the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District stating that the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District was unable to affirmatively respond to the petition pursuant to the requirements of the statutes;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of all citizens of the City of Prentiss, Mississippi, the City of Booneville, Mississippi, the City of Iuka, Mississippi, Alcorn County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Tishomingo County, Mississippi to form a joint water supply district for the purpose of constructing the necessary facilities to supply the areas of Alcorn, Prentiss, and Tishomingo Counties, Mississippi with the alternative source of water;

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Mississippi, in particular, Sections 51-8-63 and 51-8-65, Mississippi Code of 1972, require that any efforts of the parties hereto to form an entity to acquire and assume any powers, duties,

and responsibilities of a joint water supply district are subject to the prior approval of the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality and upon such terms and conditions as may be acceptable to the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality after the required parties officially file a petition or petitions as required by law with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality. Although the parties have been in contact with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality, have informed the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality of the efforts, matters, and things contained herein, have briefed the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality of the reasons and justifications for forming the Tri-County Regional Water Supply District, and have a received a tentative and preliminary, but official and non-binding, verbal indication from the appropriate personnel with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality that it will favorably receive the application for the formation of the entity, subject to applicable law, final formation and approval of this Tri-County Regional Water Supply District is subject to a favorable ruling by the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality upon the filing of a proper petition or petitions with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality as required by law. However, the parties herein must approve the formation of the subject Tri-County Regional Water Supply District, as required by law, before any petition or petitions can be officially filed with the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality; and

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Mississippi require that a public hearing be held on the question of whether the public convenience and necessity requires the creation of such a district and whether the creation of such a district is economically sound and feasible.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi that its intent to form a joint water supply district with the Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka, Mississippi, with the Board of Aldermen of the City of Corinth, Mississippi, with the Board of Aldermen of the City of Booneville, Mississippi, with the Board of Supervisors of Alcorn County, Mississippi, and with the Board of Supervisors of Prentiss County, Mississippi ("Prentiss County") pursuant to section 51-8-1, et. seg. Miss. Code of 1972, as follows:

- The name of the newly created water supply district shall be the Tri-County Regional Water Supply District ("Tri-County District").
- The geographic boundary of said newly created water supply district shall be the geographic boundaries of Alcorn County, Mississippi, Prentiss County, Mississippi, and Tishomingo County, Mississippi.
- The function of the Tri-County District will be to take all actions necessary to construct, erect, maintain, and operate facilities which would provide a source of water to the geographic areas served and to enter into all cooperatives, agreements, contracts, and other legally binding obligations

with any and all other governmental agencies, firms or corporations in order to effectuate the construction, maintenance, and operation of such facilities.

- The powers of the Tri-County District shall be fixed and exercised by a Board of Commissioners consisting of twelve (12) voting members. Said voting members shall consist of the following appointees and who otherwise meet the requirements of Section 51-8-25, Miss. Code of 1972, as now enacted or hereafter amended, and other applicable law:

- Two (2) members appointed by Corinth who shall each be a resident citizen in said municipality, two (2) members appointed by Booneville who shall each be a resident citizen in said municipality, and two (2) members appointed by Iuka who shall each be a resident citizen in said municipality,
- Two (2) members appointed by Alcorn County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Alcorn County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River

Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by appointed by said county, two (2) members appointed by Prentiss County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Prentiss County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by said county, and two (2) members appointed by Tishomingo County who shall each be a resident citizen in said county wherein one (1) of said appointees shall, by virtue of his office, be the same person as Tishomingo County's representative and appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and wherein the other appointee shall be some qualified person selected and appointed by said county;

- As to the initial term of office regarding each county's appointee to the Board of Commissioners of the Tri-County District and who is said appointee by virtue of his appointment by such county to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District, the initial term of such three (3) members shall be for the duration of that person's term of appointment by said county to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District but in no event to exceed the maximum term of office of five (5) years as prescribed in the applicable joint water management districts' statutes being Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. Thereafter, the term for each of said three (3) members shall be for a term of four (4) years or until his successor is named and for so long as said person is that respective county's appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District but in no event to exceed the maximum term of office of five (5) years as prescribed in the applicable joint water management districts' statutes being Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. It is the intention herein that in the event that the county's representative to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District serves continuously for more than five (5) years that said person's tenure on the Board of Commissioners of the Tri-County District shall cease and terminate, and the said county shall take appropriate steps, as soon as practicable, to appoint a person to fill this position who likewise must be the county's appointee to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District. Furthermore, it is the intention herein that when said county appointee's term of office with Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District terminates and said person is not successively and without interruption reappointed to the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District board, said person's term as a member of Tri-County District's Board of Commissioners shall likewise terminate. Furthermore, it is the intention herein that each county shall coordinate, to the extent practicable and to the extent allowed by law, the term of said county's appointment to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District as set forth in Section 51-13-105, Miss. Code of 1972, in and for such a term and manner so as to not exceed the statutory maximum term of the office of the county's appointment to the board of the Tri-County District's

Board of Commissioners as set forth in Section 51-8-21, Miss. Code of 1972. Nothing herein shall preclude each respective county, if it so desires, from reappointing the same person to the Board of Commissioners of the Tri-County District provided said person is likewise the county's appointee to the board of the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District.

- The initial term of office of the remaining nine (9) members of the board of the Tri-County District's Board of Commissioners appointed collectively by Corinth, Booneville, Iuka, Alcorn County, Prentiss County, and Tishomingo County shall be determined by random drawing in staggered terms with three (3) members serving five (5) year terms, three (3) members serving four (4) year terms, and three (3) members serving three (3) year terms. Thereafter, all terms shall be for five (5) years for any such members appointed by Corinth, Booneville, Iuka, Alcorn County, Prentiss County, and Tishomingo County to any of these nine (9) board positions.

- In addition to the aforesaid voting members which constitute the Board of Commissioners, the Board of Commissioners shall be, and hereby is, authorized and allowed to appoint one or more persons or representatives to an unofficial, non-voting advisory board as the Board of Commissioners may deem appropriate in the best interests of the Tri-County District.

- The Board of Commissioners shall be responsible for the operation and management of the Tri-County District and it shall be their exclusive authority and they shall be empowered to do all acts necessary, proper, or convenient in the exercise of the powers granted by applicable law to such district, including but not limited to, the power and authority to acquire, construct, reconstruct, improve, better, extend, consolidate, maintain and operate facilities and to contract with any municipality, person, firm, or corporation for services and for a supply and distribution of water incident to the operation and maintenance of such system, and in addition to other powers, the Tri-County District hereby created and acting through its Board of Commissioners shall have the power to:

- To sue and be sued;
- To acquire by purchase, gift, devise, lease or any other mode of acquisition, and to hold or dispose of, real and personal property of every kind within or without the district;
- To make and enter into contracts, conveyances, mortgages, deeds of trust, bonds, leases or contracts for financial advisory services;
- To incur debts, to borrow money, to issue negotiable bonds pursuant to Section 51-8-35 (1), Miss. Code of 1972, and to provide for the rights of the holders thereof as provided therein, and in addition to or in conjunction with the aforesaid funds, the Tri-County District shall also have the power to incur debts and to borrow money to provide funds for water supply or pollution abatement projects by issuing special improvement pollution abatement bonds, special improvement water bonds, or combinations of special improvement water and sewer bonds as authorized pursuant to Section 51-8-35 (2), Miss. Code of 1972, and to provide for the rights of the holders thereof as provided therein and in said event, Corinth, Booneville, Iuka, Alcorn County, Prentiss County, and/or Tishomingo County, as the case may be, shall

have the authority and the obligation to make assessments against benefited properties pursuant to Sections 51-8-35(2) and 51-8-45, Miss. Code of 1972;

- To fix, maintain, collect and revise rates and charges for services rendered by or through the facilities of such district, which rates and charges shall not be subject to review or regulation by the Mississippi Public Service Commission except in those instances where a city operating similar services would be subject to regulation and review; however, said district shall obtain a certificate of convenience and necessity from the Mississippi Public Service Commission for operating water and/or sewer systems;
- To pledge all or any part of its revenues to the payment of its obligations and to exercise all powers authorized pursuant to Section 51-8-47, Miss. Code of 1972;
- To make such covenants in connection with the issuance of bonds or to secure the payment of bonds that a private business corporation can make under the general laws of the state;
- To use any right-of-way, public right-of-way, easement, or other similar property or property rights necessary or convenient in connection with the acquisition, improvement operation or maintenance of the facilities of such district held by the state or any political subdivision thereof which shall or may consent to such use;
- To enter into agreements with state and federal agencies for loans, grants, grants-in-aid, and other forms of assistance, including, but not limited to, participation in the sale and purchase of bonds and those agreements authorized pursuant to Section 51-8-55, Miss. Code of 1972;
- To acquire by purchase, lease, gift, or otherwise, any existing works and facilities providing services for which it was created, and any lands, rights, easements, franchises and other property, real and personal, necessary to the completion and operation of such system upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon, and, if necessary as part of the acquisition price, to assume the payment of outstanding notes, bonds or other obligations upon such system; however, if any corporate agency owning such facilities desires to continue providing such services, the corporate agency shall so notify the district not later than ninety (90) days after the effective date of the creation of the district, and the district shall thereupon relinquish its right to provide such services until and unless the corporate agency elects otherwise or fails to adequately provide such services;
- To extend its services to areas beyond but within one (1) mile of the boundaries of such district; however, no such extension shall be made to areas already occupied by another corporate agency rendering the same service so long as such corporate agency desires to continue to serve such areas. Areas outside of the district desiring to be served which are beyond the one-mile limit must be brought into the district by annexation proceedings;
- To be deemed to have the same status as counties and municipalities with respect to payment of sales taxes on purchases made by such districts;
- To borrow funds for interim financing subject to receipt of funds as outlined in Section 51-8-35;
- To choose a location within the district as the central office of the district;
- To adopt a plan for management of the water resources of the district, provided that such plan first be submitted to and approved by the Commission on Natural Resources, now the Commission on Environmental Quality, as consistent with the state water management plan or objectives;
- To hire such personnel and contract for such legal, technical, or other services as the board of commissioners deems necessary for the operation of the district and fulfillment of its water management objectives;
- To secure connection to or participation in the services provided by the district, including the power to obtain mandatory or prohibitory injunctive relief, provided, however, that the authority of the board of commissioners shall not be exercised in conflict with the regulatory and enforcement authority of the Commission on Natural Resources, now the Commission on Environmental Quality; and
- To acquire by condemnation all property of any kind, real, personal, or mixed, or any interest therein, within or without the boundaries of the district, necessary for the projects and the exercise of the powers, rights, privileges, and functions conferred upon the district, according to the procedure provided by law for the condemnation of lands or other property taken for rights-of-way or other purposes. This power of eminent domain to acquire any such property including, but not limited to, lands, rights, rights-of-way, easements, and other property, real or personal or mixed, as may be appropriate wherever and whenever public necessity and convenience so requires is hereby authorized, given to, and vested in said Board of Commissioners of the Tri-County District under the option as provided in Section 51-8-33, Miss. Code of 1972. If the power of eminent domain is exercised by the Tri-County District and in the name of the Tri-County District, it shall be exercised in the manner provided by Sections 11-27-1 through 11-27-5, Miss. Code of 1972, as now enacted or hereafter amended.

- In addition, the Board of Commissioners of the Tri-County District shall have the power to adopt, promulgate, modify, and repeal such rules and regulations as it may deem appropriate for the management and operation of said district so long as said rules and regulations comply with the laws of the State of Mississippi.

- The governing bodies of each of the local governmental units of Corinth, Booneville, Iuka, Alcorn County, Prentiss County, and Tishomingo County shall have the separate authority to levy a special tax pursuant to Section 51-8-43, Miss. Code of 1972.

- Any references herein to any provision(s) of the Mississippi Code of 1972 shall be construed to mean as said provision is now enacted or is hereafter amended; and
- If any part of the powers or provisions herein is held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, all other powers and provisions herein, not inconsistent therewith, shall remain in full force and effect.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, adopts this resolution declaring the intent set out above to form the water supply district and do hereby set the boardroom at the Tishomingo County Courthouse, Iuka, Mississippi, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., on the 25th day of February, 2002, as the time and place for a public hearing as to the question of public convenience and necessity and economic feasibility for the forming of such a district and the Clerk is hereby directed to publish a legal notice of such public hearing pursuant to law.

Supervisor Sanders seconded the motion. A vote was taken with all members of the board voting "aye." The motion thus carried and the Resolution is adopted.




4-H Senior Rifle Team Competes At Northeast Invitational


