The Grand Jury made the following report concerning grounds and property:

•The Tishomingo County Jail is badly in need of a new building or at least additional room. There is not enough room for the prisoners they house. The jail is in need of more funding so that it has adequate staff and equipment. The heating and cooling is inadequate and a monitor for viewing is needed.

•The Tishomingo County Courthouse's appearance has been greatly enhanced by recent landscaping work. This benefits not only the employees but also the citizens and visitors who come to the courthouse.

The courthouse was found to be clean and well maintained; however, the ceiling tiles need replacing throughout the courthouse. Flooring in the 911 Office needs to be replaced with new tile; covers are needed over the fire extinguishers; a digital mapping system for the tax assessor's office should be considered. Various offices, especially the Forestry & Human Resources Offices need painting.

Allsboro Road Wreck Takes Lives of Two Young Men in Late Friday Afternoon Accident

A late afternoon wreck on Allsboro Road Friday, May 10, took the lives of two young men and injured a third one. The wreck occurred on a curvy section of road as the car traveled north. According to the Alabama State Troopers, an investigation is continuing as to the cause of the accident.

Nathan Duane Nunley, 17, and Tyler Shawn Russell, 16, were both killed in the one-vehicle wreck on Colbert CR 1. Also traveling in the car was 15-year old Jesus A. Febles. Febles was a passenger in the back seat.

Alabama State troopers said that young Russell was driving the 1996 Chevrolet Geo. Nunley was a passenger in the front seat and Febles was in the back. None of the boys were reportedly wearing seatbelts. The accident occurred after the boys left the residence of Nunley's girlfriend.

Nunley was pronounced dead on the scene by Assistant Coroner Mike Morrison. Russell, who was pinned under Nunley, was transported to the Eliza Coffee Memorial Hospital by the AirEvac Helicopter. Young Russell later died at the hospital according to authorities. Febles was treated at the emergency room and later ad-

mitted to Helen Keller Hospital in stable condition.

A resident who lived near the scene of the accident reported the accident to authorities at 5:20 p.m.

The three young men were friends. Russell and Febles attended Sheffield High School together. Nathan Nunley was a resident of Cherokee.

Nathan Duanne Nunley, 17, died Friday, May 10, 2002, as the result of an automobile accident. His funeral was at 2 p.m. on Sunday, May 12, at the Morrison Funeral Home in Cherokee with burial in the Maud Cemetery. Ronald Choate and Mark West officiated at the funeral.

Nathan was a native of Colbert County where he attended Cherokee High School. He was a member of the Maud Church of Christ. Nathan is survived by his mother, Carrie Huddleston of Florence; his father, Ritchie Nunley of Sheffield; his brother, Jonathan, and sisters, Ashley and Shea, all of Maud; his grandparents, Vernon and Ann Nunley of Maud, Barbara and Cecil McBride of Sheffield and formerly of Iuka, Kay and Robbie Kilgo of Randolph, MS; and Robert Huddleston,

and several aunts, uncles, and cousins.

Pallbearers were Blake Burns, David Owens, Justin Nunley, Ramon Garcia-Vegas, Michael Powell, Kevin Nichols, Johnny Huddleston, and Shawn Purser. Honorary pallbearer was Joey Barrier.

Services for Tyler S. Russell, who was also killed in the Friday accident, were at 3:30 p.m. on Sunday, May 12, 2002, at Morrison Funeral Home with burial in Colbert Memorial Gardens.

More Stolen Property Recovered By Sheriff's Department

After learning about the recovery of stolen property by Tishomingo County Investigator Donald Thomas last week, Mrs. Eula Mae Stidham of Belmont, MS, became suspicious.

Mrs. Stidham's carpet had been cleaned by the same woman who was suspected of stealing from homes while demonstrating vacuum cleaners. Mrs. Stidham found that perfume and cosmetics were missing from her home.

After talking with Mrs. Stidham, Thomas contacted David Sheffield, Itawamba County Narcotics Officer. Sheffield, Itawamba Cty. officer Russ Gorden, and Thomas returned to Hope Wallace's residence at 645 Sump Johnson Rd, Golden, MS. Ms. Wallace granted the officers permission to search the premises, and they found the perfume and cosmetics allegedly taken from the Stidham residence. Before the search began, the officers also asked

Ms. Wallace if she had any drugs on the premises. At this time she revealed that she did have a small amount of marijuana.

Hope Wallace, 24, of the Golden address was again arrested. She was charged with Petty Larceny (less than \$250). The charge on possession of marijuana is pending. She was released on \$2,000 bond.

Tishomingo County Sheriff David Smith has contacted the particular vacuum cleaner distributors to let them know that although the vacuum cleaner business is not at fault, people in Tishomingo County are aware that a scam has been occurring and that people will not be letting salespeople into their homes. Sheriff Smith urges everyone to use extreme caution when answering your door and to notify the Tishomingo County Sheriffs' Department at 423-7000 of any suspicious people.

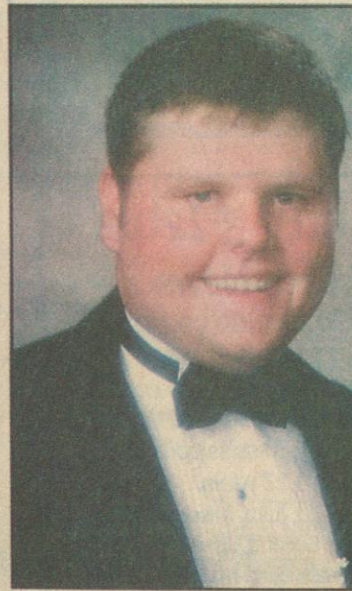
The annual Holcut reunion will be the 4th Saturday of May 11:00 to 1:00 at the Holcut Memorial Park.

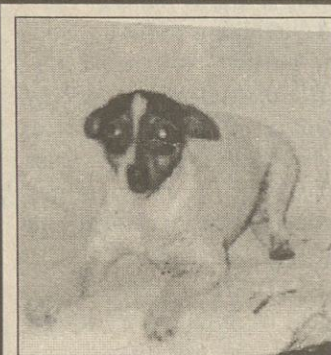

"Inny" Or "Outy" Lenses?

Do you know why your glasses are shaped the way they are? If the lens curves inward, this is a concave lens. It pushes the focused rays of light backward to the retina to correct for nearsightedness. If you didn't have those glasses, your eyes would be focusing too soon, causing your vision to blur.

If the lens curves outward, it's a convex lens. This is designed to push the focused rays of light forward to the retina, correcting for farsightedness. Without convex lenses, your eyes would focus too late also causing blurred vision.

For people with astigmatism (two points of focus instead of one), the lens will be either concave or convex, depending on the kind of astigmatism. It can be either farsighted or nearsighted.

If the problem is presbyopia (the inability to use the near-focusing muscles), the lens will be convex, just as it is for the farsighted person.

Broadway Wins State Championship! Lady Braves Gabriel & Stanley Capture 14th Place Team Finish

Matthew Broadway, a senior at Tishomingo County High School, completed an undefeated track season in the pole vault by winning the 4A State Championship at a height of 13' 6" on Friday, May 10 in Jackson. His three attempts at the 4A record of 14' 5" were all near misses. Mat leaves with a school record of 14' and a legacy of being extremely consistent in a very difficult event to master. The 10 points Mat earned gave the Braves a tie for 19th in the 4A team competition.

Andrea Gabriel, a Junior, ran an exceptional 1600 meter race in a time of 5:46.62 to earn a 2nd place finish and 8 points.

Andrea ran a courageous race by putting herself in a position to win, but Brandice Knowell of Pearl edged her with a time of 5:43.28. Andrea finishes the season holding school records in the 1600 meters and the 300 intermediate hurdles.

Freshman Alisha Stanley, competing in both the 3200 and the 1600 meter runs, earned a 4th in the 3200 with a time of 12:52.44 and a 7th in the 1600 in 6:01.60. Her place finishes earned her 7 points. Alisha holds school records in the 800 and the 3200 meter runs.

Andrea and Alisha's point total of 15 gave the Lady Braves a 14th place finish in the 4A Division.

Actions By The County School Board

The regular board meeting of the Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District was held Monday evening, May 13.

Jeff Clark, a parent with concerns about the sports programs at TCHS, spoke before the board. He noted that the school system is very successful in the scholastic testing of students, but falls far behind in the performance of sports. He stressed that this problem is not only in Tishomingo County but other counties. He spoke against coaches showing favoritism and hurting children because of who they are or how they look. Mr. Clark made many good points and was supported by other parents at the meeting.

Monday night's agenda contained several important issues which were considered and approved by the board.

Of special interest was the approval of Ronnie Riley as the new girls' basketball coach at Belmont High School. A native of Fulton, Mr. Riley has 23 years experience in education. He coached at Itawamba Agricultural High School from 1985-1996 and will come to Belmont from Southaven. He will replace Heather Deaton who recently resigned as coach.

APPROVAL OF FUND RAISERS

Approved: Belmont High School Baseball (Tony Sparks) to advertise by means of outfield

The board approved purchasing from the Expressed Product List the components necessary to build 120 computers. Superintendent John Mullins explained that this project of buying computer parts from the "state list" can save the school many dollars. A \$1,400 computer can be built for around \$700. The school now has around 1200 computers in the district. Some 10% of these are 9 or 10 years old and need to be removed. Using money from utility and gas funds (which were not depleted this year) and technology funds, the school can rebuild some 120 computers and replace the outdated ones.

The board approved and board president Harold Sparks signed the Federal Program Application, Assurances, and Budget Narratives. This means the system will receive around \$458,000 from the Federal Government.

The board approved the Summer Betterment Plan and noted several changes that will be made to the program this year. This program, which is a reinforcement for children needing help, will be held at a central location this summer. Having all the children gather at the Tishomingo School facility will help children of the same grade levels be grouped together for better learning. One bus will

run from Burnsville and pick up the Iuka students and one will run from Belmont. Parents will be responsible for getting the children to the bus pick-up site at the schools. A \$3,700 grant is being used for this program and students will pay on the basis of a sliding scale.

The board approved changing the May 27th Board Meeting to May 28th.

The board approved Cameron Lee Bernal and Ashley Nicole Austin to transfer from Burnsville to Tishomingo Elementary.

PERSONNEL

The board accepted the retirement resignation of Becky McNeely effective the end of June and approved Janet Fulton as Parent Educator and Lisa Holt as temporary Resource Clerk for the Families First Resource Center.

The board approved the non-certified personnel recommendations for 2002 and 2003; the following as substitute employees: Thomas Boyd, Gene Landis, Betty Robinson, and Steven Sanderson; Casey Wigginton and Chris Northington as temporary summer technology employees (to build computers); Jessica Luttrell, Sabrina Borden, Kara Foster, and Rachael Moyers Melton as temporary (summer) Child Care employees on an as needed basis.

Superintendent Mullins discussed the possibility of purchasing four used school buses for the district. He stated that at the end of the budget year, some \$50,000 in state sales tax money earmarked for transportation is available. Four 1992 model diesel, automatic shift buses with from 80,000 to 123,000 miles can be purchased at \$12,000 each. A new bus costs around \$45,000. The district

would like to purchase these "fairly new" buses to replace bus #77 at Pennywinkle, George's Yow's "old" bus, and number 84 and 85 in Burnsville. These buses are all gas guzzlers and need to be replaced. These four buses will be ordered, checked out by the district's mechanics, then a decision will be made concerning their purchase.

Gordo, 28-6, will now play Vincent in the State Championship round in Montgomery.

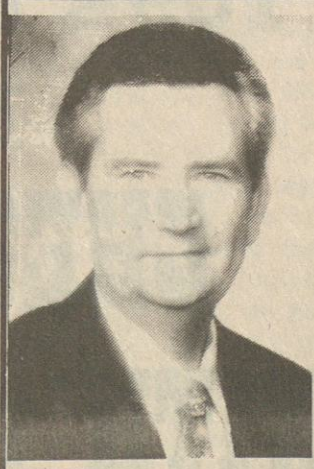

Funeral Services Held For David Flavous Lambert, Jr.

David Flavous Lambert, Jr., of Raymond, MS, a former Mississippi state legislator, state official, mayor, builder and schoolteacher, died Tuesday from injuries sustained when he was struck by a car while visiting his son in Alexandria, VA.

Mr. Lambert was born in Demopolis, AL, on June 22, 1925. He was a graduate of the University of Mississippi and a World War II veteran of the U.S. Navy. He was a member of the United Methodist Church.

From the early 1950's, Mr. Lambert, a contractor and builder, also was engaged in politics in Mississippi as a Democrat loyal to the national party during the turbulent civil rights struggles.

He was mayor of Belmont, Mississippi, until his election to the state senate in 1955. As a senator during the 1950's and 1960's, Mr. Lambert was a frequent critic of Mississippi's segregationist policies and was one of the few legislators who challenged state leaders' opposition to the enforcement of civil rights laws in the state. Mr. Lambert was noted for his strong support of other progressive politicians, including Governors J. P. Coleman and William Winter and Democratic presidential candidates John F. Kennedy and Lyndon B. Johnson. Ever the pragmatist, Mr. Lambert was also close to U.S. Senator James O. Eastland.

He was reelected to the senate in 1959, but defeated four years later when he sought another office, largely as a result of his views.

At that time, respected New York Times Reporter John Herbers wrote, "A move to purge Mississippi of white leaders who disagree with the state's rigid segregation policies has met with increasing success in recent months."

Herbers reported that Mr. Lambert, "who spoke out for individual liberties," was defeated when he sought another office in the 1963 elections. Herbers wrote, "There is no indication that any of the newly elected members of the Legislature will fill their

roles."

In his book, "Mississippi: The Closed Society," University of Mississippi history professor James W. Silver wrote of Mr. Lambert's position during the integration crisis at Ole Miss, "In a heated legislative debate after the riot, Senator Flavous Lambert charged that he had been told by either Senator John McLaurin or Senator George Yarbrough that they were going to provoke the Kennedys into sending troops into Mississippi."

As a senator, Mr. Lambert championed development of rural Mississippi, especially the economically-depressed northeastern portion of the state. He was a prime sponsor of state legislation that resulted in the development of the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway, which he saw as a great potential benefit to Mississippi. During his tenure, Mr. Lambert also sponsored important highway construction and education legislation and was the chief sponsor of the bill creating the J. P. Coleman State Park in Tishomingo County.

Mr. Lambert later served as Sergeant at Arms of the state senate, an official of the Mississippi Department of Public Welfare and a public relations consultant.

He resided in Raymond, MS, with his wife, Christine Lambert. His marriage to Jean Keeton Lambert ended in divorce.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by a daughter, Jean Lambert Aldridge of Athens, AL; sons David F. Lambert, III, of Alexandria, VA; Mark K. Lambert of Belmont, MS; and Christopher Lambert of Jackson, MS; and two grandchildren, Katye and JED Aldridge of Athens, AL.

He was the son of the late David F. Lambert and Lora Clement Lambert of Belmont, MS.

Memorial services were held Monday, May 13, 2002 at 11 A.M. at Belmont United Methodist Church. Burial was in Belmont City Cemetery. Deaton Funeral Home, Belmont, MS was in charge.

Richard H. Tuggle Jr. of Huntsville, a retired NASA engineer, died Sunday. He was 77.

Mr. Tuggle worked as a supervision aerospace engineer and was a World War II Army Veteran. He graduated from Vanderbilt University and was a member of Mayfair Church of Christ.

Survivors include his wife, Maxine Kennedy Tuggle; three daughters, Elizabeth Ann Tuggle, Mary Jane Tuggle Walker,

and Judge Susan Maria Tuggle Moquin, all of Huntsville; one brother, William Charles Tuggle of Nashville; and two grandchildren and one great-grandson.

Graveside services were Wednesday at 10 a.m. at Huntsville Memory Gardens with Hershel McFarland officiating.

NOTICE TO ALL ANIMAL OWNERS WITHIN THE CITY OF IUKA

This notice is to serve as a reminder to the citizens of the City of Iuka, that animals' running at large within the city limits of Iuka is against the law. Please read section 3 and 19 of the Animal Control Ordinance of the City of Iuka.

SECTION 3. ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE.

3.1. All animals shall be kept under restraint. It shall be unlawful for any person who may own or have in his possession or control or who may keep or harbor any animal or domestic fowl to intentionally, knowingly, carelessly, or negligently, permit such animals or domestic fowl to run or be at large at any time within the corporate limits of the City. It shall also be unlawful for any person who may own or have in his possession or control or who may keep or harbor any animal or domestic fowl to stake or tether such animal on any vacant property in the City adjacent to any street or sidewalk or so near thereto as to allow or permit such animal to be or go upon any street or sidewalk within the corporate limits of the City.

3.2. All animals not restrained and running at large may be immediately impounded as provided elsewhere in this Ordinance and every vicious animal, as determined by the Animal Control Department, shall be confined by the owner within a building or secure enclosure and shall be securely muzzled or caged whenever off the premises of its owner.

SECTION 19. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES.

19.1. Any persons violating any provisions of this Ordinance wherein there is not a specific penalty, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100.00 nor more than \$1,000.00, or imprisonment in the County Jail not to exceed ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, unless otherwise provided for in this Ordinance. Each days violation shall be deemed as a separate offense.

To avoid your pet(s) being picked up and having to pay unnecessary fees to get your pet back and possible being fined as stated in section 19, please keep all animals under restraint.

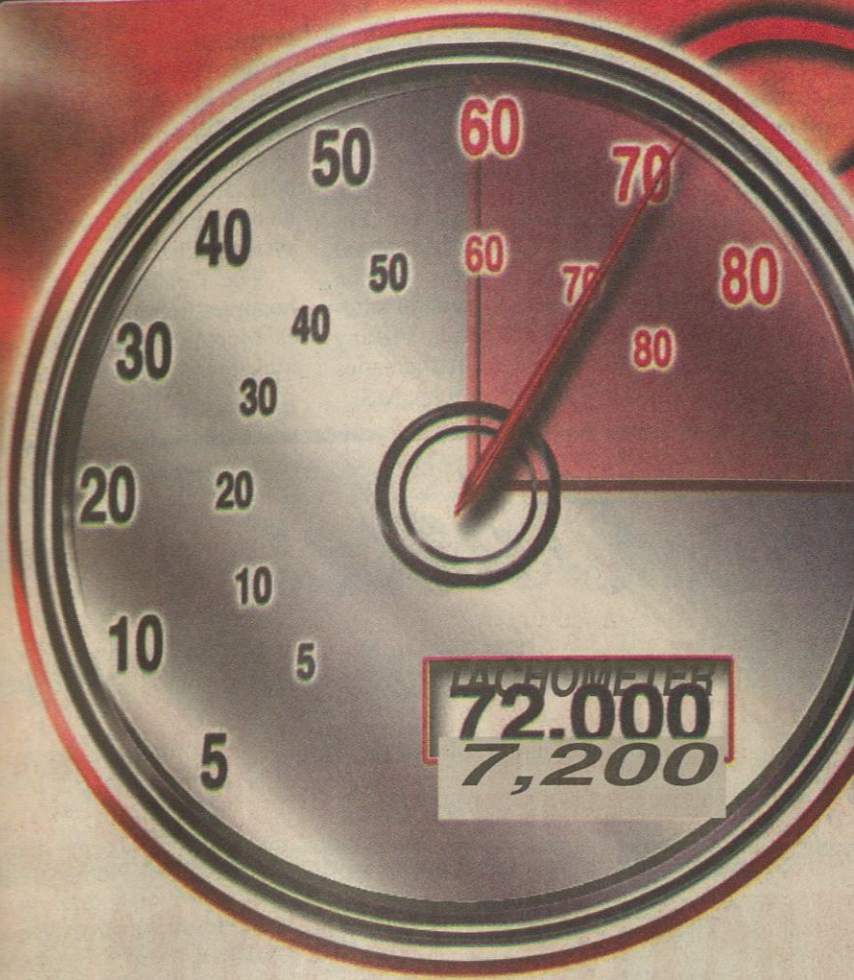

Manage Your Money Better - Be Money Smart

This week I met with some people to talk about ways to better manage money. I thought this information would be helpful to almost everyone. These are just a few things you should remember to be "Money Smart."

We all have a set income each month. This is the amount of money that we actually get to bring home after taxes are taken out. How we spend this money depends upon the needs and wants of your family. The amount of money that each of us has to spend is limited.

Each family has items on which the money needs to be spent. These are things like food, housing, utilities, transportation, medicine, childcare, insurance, clothing and credit. How much you pay for these expenses each month is decided by you.

The secret to being a good money manager is to make smart decisions about how much money to budget for the different things your family needs and wants. It's important to stick with your plan so that your family's needs and wants are met.

Decisions about spending

money are based on the values you have and the goals you set. Values are your personal strong beliefs of what is worthwhile and important in your life. Goals are the things you want, things that you are willing to work toward and save for.

Before you can begin to plan how you will spend your money, you must know how much you have to spend. All your family's sources of income should be counted. To find the amount of your income you can list it on a piece of paper.

After you know how much comes in, you can begin listing how much goes out. List all your expenses as either regular (those things that must be paid) or changing expenses. The regular expenses should not go unpaid because you want to spend the money on something else. Regular expenses include house or rent payment, insurance payments, utilities, and installment payments.

Other expenses change in amount from one payment to the next. If you need to cut spending, these are usually easier to change than your regular expenses. You can decide which of these expenses are more important to you as a family and which are less important.

After all the expenses are written down, add them all together. This tells you how much your family spends each month. The next step is to see how your income and expenses balance. Which is higher? If your income is higher than expenses then you have extra money to set aside for emergencies or for saving. If your income is the same as the expenses you are ready to build a budget. If your income is less than your expenses you should make changes to bring your

spending in line with your earnings.

Once your income and expenses balance and you know how much you will be spending for each of your expenses, you can set those amounts aside. Budgeting takes self-control on the part of each family member. Avoid impulse buying and keep close track of all spending, including the small things such as getting a drink and a candy bar with that

tank of gas.

Keeping track of what is earned is easier than keeping up with what is spent. However, knowing where our money goes puts us on the way to becoming money smart.

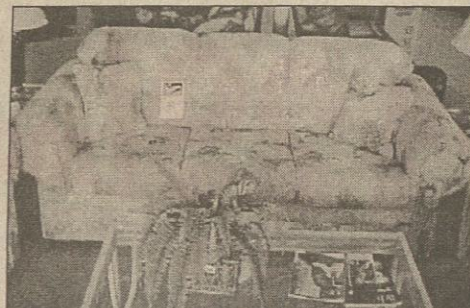

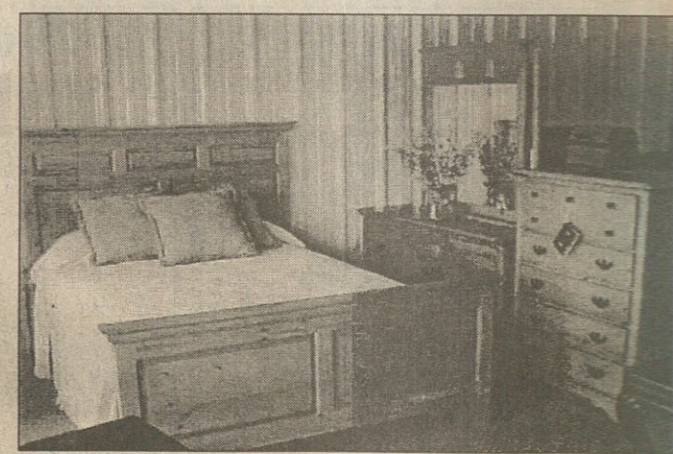

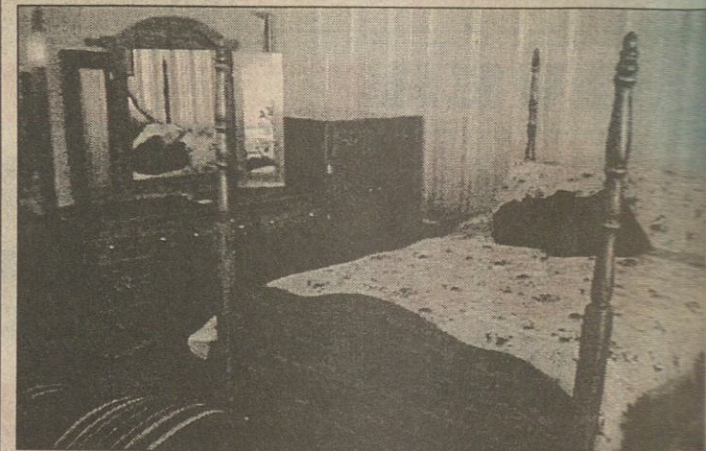
