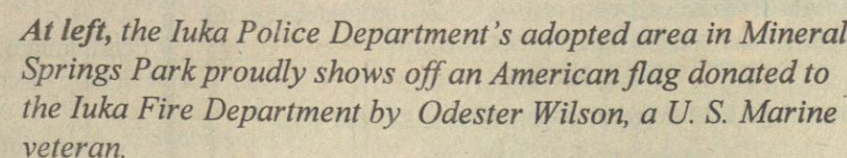

IMS's Ms. Wooten Wal-Mart's 2002 Teacher of the Year

Ms. Emily Wooten, a fifth-grade teacher at Iuka Middle School has been selected as the 2002 Wal-Mart Teacher of the Year for Tishomingo County in their seventh annual recognition program.

Wal-Mart is awarding \$1.69 million—\$500 to the school of every local winner—in this program. According to Jeff Jones, Manager of Iuka Wal-Mart #274, winning teachers were nominated by members of their local community including fellow teachers, principals, students, and parents. Associates at each local store selected the winning entry from all the nominees and presented the education grant to the teacher's local school.

Ms. Wooten teaches fifth-grade history and reading at Iuka Middle School. She is a graduate of both Northeast Mississippi Community College and the University of North Alabama. She began her school career as the Cafeteria Manager at Iuka Middle School; and after constant urging

from her mom and Dr. Stone, former Iuka Superintendent, Ms. Wooten decided to go back to get her degree. During the last ten years, she has taught all grades from kindergarten to eighth grade. She has taught a combination of every subject except English.

Ms. Wooten says her favorite subject to teach is history even though it is hard to get students interested in things from the past. She plans to spend the \$500 on maps, globes and some history software.

4-H Happenings For June

The Tishomingo County 4-H program has a lot of activities planned for the month of June, some of them in the county and some of them out of the county.

June 3 through 6 our senior 4-H members (ages 14-18) will be participating in State 4-H Club Congress. This is when they compete in contests with members from all over the state. We also have two members trying out for the State 4-H Awareness Team during this time.

On June 14th our junior members (ages 8-18) will be competing at the Northeast District Project Achievement Day in Houston, Mississippi. The Northeast District covers 21 counties. Members will be presenting Visual Presentations, Cloverleaf Exhibits and competing in judging and talent contests.

The third week of June, members can participate in the 4-H Day Camp. This will be held June 19 through the 21 at the Tishomingo County Fairgrounds. They will be making crafts, learning water safety and also get a chance to go swimming. This camp will go from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day.

I will be teaching crochet classes to young people June 24 through June 26 at the Families First Resource Center at Tishomingo County High School from 9 to 12 each day. Those attending this workshop will complete one crocheted project.

4-H members will also be working on their horse judging skills during June to get ready for the horse judging contests in July. Mr. Jackie Woodruff is coordinating these practices.

The Sportsman 4-H Club will be holding air rifle practices on June 7 and 21 beginning at the Fairgrounds. Anyone interested in this activity is welcome to attend. They will also be having an All You Can Eat Steak Dinner fundraiser on June 22 at the fairgrounds. For tickets you can contact the extension office.

The Modeling Squad met on June 3 and will meet again on June 17 at the fairgrounds as they prepare for the state Modeling Squad Showdown in July.

The 4-H Horse Club is planning a Horse Show at Trigger Creek Arena on June 15th. This show is open to all youth.

Those interested in 5K runs should register for the Run For the Clover on July 20 in Jackson. Registration forms may be picked up at the extension office. The entry deadline is July 12.

Let There Be Light

It amazes adults when they discover children reading a book or magazine in poor light or shadows. How can they do it? Young, healthy eyes can compensate for a lack of light because their focusing muscles are stronger and more flexible.

Still, that doesn't make it a good idea. Even young eyes can become strained if used too long in poor light. The eyes need light to see well. The more light, the better. This is especially true as we get older. When the light is right, most older people can do any difficult visual task, from fine needlework to reading the classified section of the newspaper.

The best kind of lighting is a diffused light that covers a large area and eliminates glare. It's also a good idea to have more than one light on in a room, so when you leave the brightly lit area you're not walking into shadows. Resting your eyes from time to time is another way to avoid eye fatigue. Give your eyes a break!



Q. What Purpose Does Toothpaste Serve?

A. Toothpaste typically contains a detergent compound to penetrate and loosen deposits and stains on tooth surfaces so they can be more easily removed during tooth brushing. Toothpaste also contains cleaning and polishing agents to produce a smooth, shiny tooth surface that can inhibit the accumulation and retention of plaque. In addition, flavoring agents found in tooth paste can make the mouth and breath feel clean, and toothpastes containing fluoride can help strengthen the teeth's hard outer layer - the enamel - to help prevent cavity formation. Some toothpastes have tartar control properties to minimize tartar (mineralized plaque) buildup others have special tooth whitening properties. Some help reduce tooth sensitivity and still others have antimicrobial properties to help control the bacteria responsible for gum disease. Inform your dentist or hygienist of the tooth paste you use so they can evaluate its effectiveness or make recommendations for changes based on your dental health.

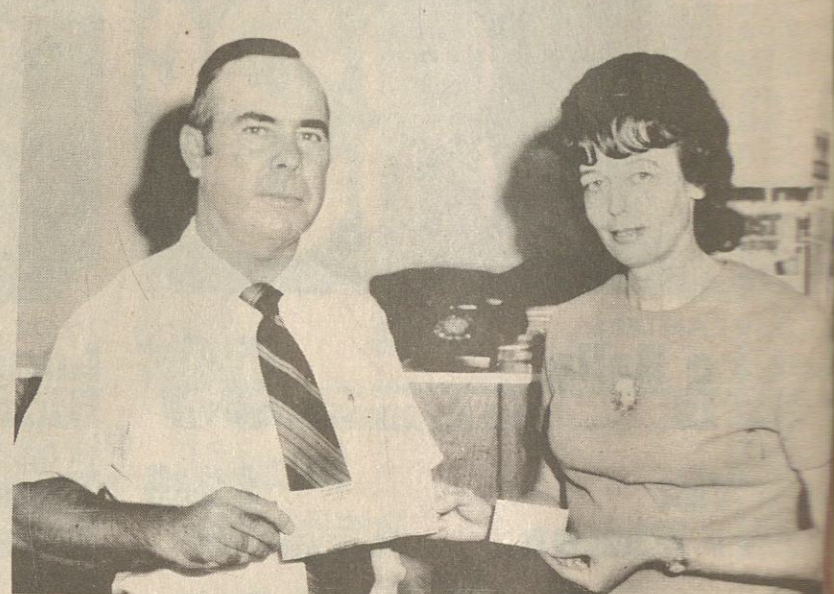

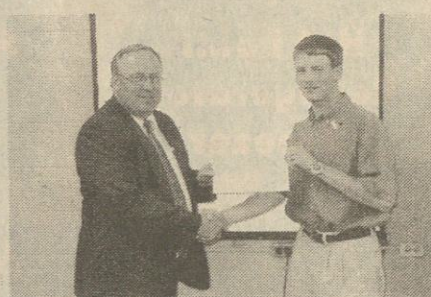

French Government Honors World War II Vets With Certificates

An Appreciation For Liberating Its Country

Fifty eight years ago on this June 6, 1944, the Allied forces began a campaign to liberate the Republic of France by pushing the German Army back into the Rhineland.

This Normandy invasion (D-Day), led by the Supreme Commander, General Dwight Eisenhower, was known as Operation Overlord, an assault on Hitler's "Fortress Europe."

The invasion began in the early hours of June 6 after months of planning. More than 10,000 transports dropped paratroopers to secure the beaches and beach exits of the assault area. Amphibious craft landed some 130,000 troops on the beaches along 50 miles of the Normandy Coast between the Cotentin Peninsula and the English River while the air forces controlled the skies overhead. The British and Canadians landed on GOLD, JUNO and SWORD Beaches. The Americans landed on the two beaches in the west — UTAH and OMAHA. As the Allies came ashore, they took the first steps on the final road to victory in Europe.

By nightfall on June 6, on "Bloody Omaha" alone, 3,000 Americans lay dead. The landing on OMAHA Beach was more difficult than expected. When the first wave landed at 6:30 a.m., the men found that naval gunfire and landing air bombardments had not softened the German defenses or resistance. As soldiers struggled, one leader told his men that two types of people would stay on the beach — the dead and those going to die — so they'd better get the hell out of there, and they did.

Slowly, as individuals and in groups, soldiers began to cross the fire-swept beach. Supported by Allied naval gunfire from destroyers steaming dangerously close to shore, the American paratroopers gained the heights and beach exits and drove the enemy inland. By day's end the Americans had a tenuous hold on the Normandy coast, and the force prepared for the next step on the road to Germany.

The invasion of Normandy and the liberation of France, which led to the end of World War II, left 40,000 casualties.

THANK YOU AMERICA!

Now, almost sixty years later, the French government announced last year that it planned to present certificates to WWII vets in appreciation of liberating its country. To be eligible, veterans had to have served on French territory, in French territorial waters or in French airspace between June 6, 1944, and May 8, 1945. The certificate would be available to both U.S. and Allied vets, and would not be issued to deceased veterans.

The 10 Consuls General of France in the United States located in Atlanta, Boston, Chicago, Houston, Los Angeles, Miami, New Orleans, New York, San Francisco and Washington, D.C.) are issuing



the documents on behalf of French authorities.

World War II Vet, Gene Haines Receives Certificate

Gene Haines, a native of Tishomingo County, a veteran of World War II, and a retired mail carrier in Iuka received his certificate of appreciation, "Thank You America Certificate," from the Consulate General of France on May 28, 2002.

According to Mr. Haines, he had seen a news article in the April 2001 issue of a VFW magazine about the planned certificates. He began the long process of "proving" he was in France from March 1945 until April 9, 1945 when he left for Germany. His determination paid off when he received the certificate in May. With the certificate was a letter from the Consulat General which reads:

Dear Mr. Haines,
June 6, 1944. A date when America remember its heroes - and France gives thanks to its liberators. Never has America deserved more to truly be called the Home of the Brave.

On a gray morning of 1943 in occupied Paris, Tristan Bernard, a Jewish novelist and playwright famous for his wit, turned to his wife to comfort her as they were being arrested by the Gestapo. He smiled sadly and said to her: "Before, we lived in fear, now we shall live in hope". This hope he was referring to, the only hope anyone could have then, was for an outside intervention.

It is that intervention, the landing of the Allied nations on the beaches of Normandy, and later in Provence, the ultimate sacrifice made by so many, to save so many more, that we commemorate on this day.

Just as the taking of the Bastille remains the symbol of the French Revolution, so the landing in Normandy will indeed remain forever the symbol of the final victory and peace yet to come over Europe. As Winston Churchill said, it marked the beginning of the end.

Yes, D-Day was the signal so long awaited by the oppressed peoples of Europe to rise with the strength of despair to join their liberators.

Let's not forget the lesson history teaches us time and again: that LIFE, LIBERTY and PEACE are based on the mutual respect of all human beings for one another, regardless of religion or race

and that we must wage a never ending battle so that these fundamental rights may exist.

As we give thanks to the heroes of the Battle of Normandy, the Provence landing and all those who fought for the Liberation of France and Europe, let's say to those who made the ultimate sacrifice that theirs was not made in vain - let's tell those who survived that their courage will serve as an example and assure that the future generations will never forget.

Trained For The Worst That Could Happen

Gene Haines is the first to tell you that he did not storm the beach at Normandy and did not participate in any heavy fighting. He believes that the certificates of appreciation should be going to the families of those who lost their lives on June 6, 1944 not just those who were lucky enough to come home from their service in France.

In fact, Gene Haines, who was drafted on July 3, 1943, was selected by the U.S. Army to serve in the Elite Army Special Training Program. Because of his exceptional IQ, found during testing at Camp Shelby, MS, the young man from Iuka was chosen to enter

the Brooklyn College in New York to study as an engineer. At the time it was believed that Germany was building an atomic bomb, and the most intelligent of the U.S. Army were put in college courses preparing for the long war ahead with Germany. He was in training for the worst that could happen - Hitler with his hands on an atomic bomb!

While at Brooklyn College, Mr. Haines roomed with Bob Dole. He also studied with Henry Kissinger and Gore Vidal.

After the threat of Germany building an atomic bomb was over, Gene Haines served in the U.S. Army as a Forward Observer with the 529th Field Artillery Battalion. He left New York Harbor on the 27th of February, 1945 aboard the SS Argentina, arriving in Le Havre, France on the 11th of March and moved immediately to Camp Lucky Strike that night. He stayed at Camp Lucky Strike about four weeks. There they got their



equipment, trucks and guns together, finally leaving for Germany on the 9th of April. On the 12th of April the 529th saw their first action and fired into the Ruhr Pocket at Dusseldorf, Germany.

The Ruhr Pocket surrendered and a few days later the 529th crossed the Rhine River and moved on into Germany where they took up occupation duties. Each battery was located in a different little town. They guarded bridges, ammunition dumps, road blocks, and rounded up German Nazis. They also spent time rounding up and guarding various kinds of displaced people of other nationalities. On the 16th of June the group moved to a training area near Baunholder, Germany. Hostilities with Germany had ended on the 8th of May.

The 529th continued to serve until they were deactivated on the 12th of February 1946.

Gene Haines returned home to his family and has never forgotten his fellow Americans who died on that dark day in June, 1944.

Let us too remember those who fell in battle, and those who returned home to live long lives as "old soldiers" with wonderful stories to share.

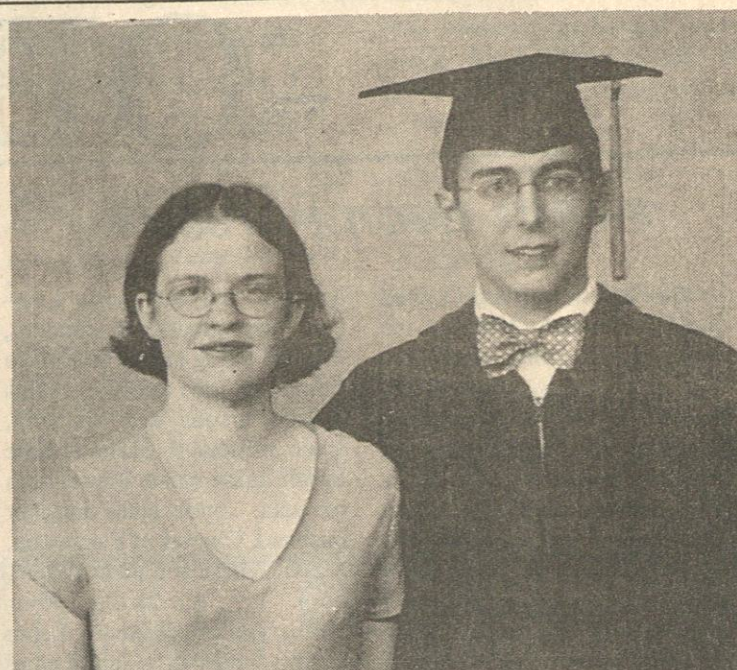
Student Registration Continues Limited Enrollment...

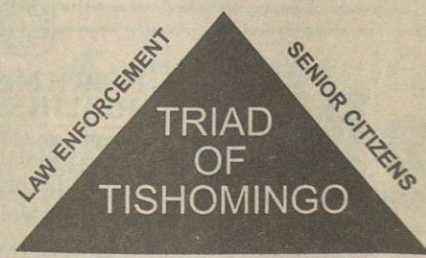

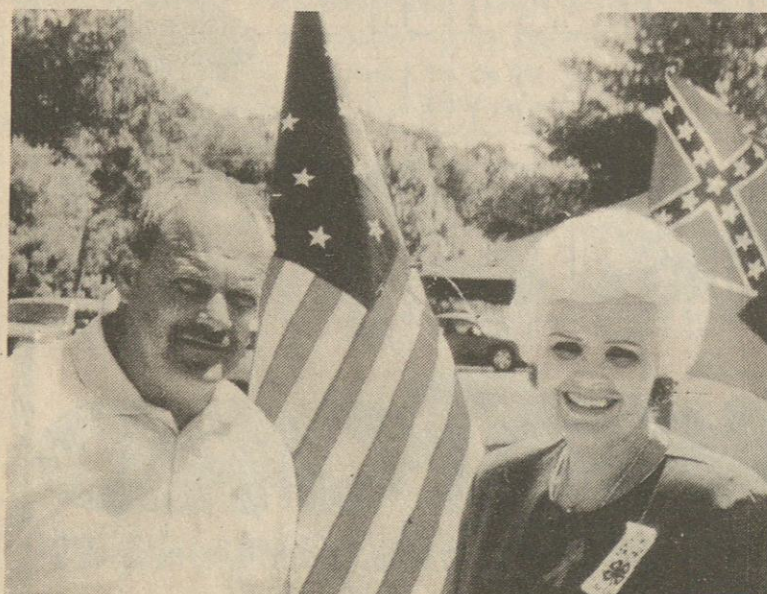

support of TCHS and its athletic programs in light of recent negative comments. Hathorn stressed that the view of some is not the opinion of all. He pointed out these positive aspects: departmentalized teaching in both elementary and high schools, coaches and teachers of good character, coaches who have genuine desire to win and do whatever is necessary (supervised weightlifting, camps, practices, etc.). Hathorn added that all parents are concerned and want sports and test records to improve. He also expressed concern about healthy, lack of community support, and negative support from community/parents. He encouraged others to be positive, just fair weather friends, to build positive/moral attitudes and to not add to controversy.

Personnel matters were the main items on agenda. The resignation of John Mullins and the hiring of a new superintendent and assistant were the main events of the meeting.

John Mullins, Tishomingo County Superintendent since 1998, resigned to take a similar position with the Arab City Schools in Arab, AL.

Obviously contemplating Mullins' resignation, the school board immediately hired John B. Moore, current Belmont High School principal as Mullins' replacement. The board also hired Nancy Parker, current Iuka Elementary School principal, as the Assistant Superintendent.

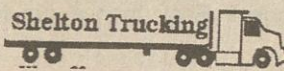



Old Tishomingo Traces

By June Bullard

This week's column was written by a TCHGS member Mr. R. C. Phillips, 367 Scenic Way, Wimberley, TX 78676. His story is about:

Clearing Up The Mystery of Rachel Phillips In Mississippi

When Lazarus and Rachel Phillips left Henderson County, Tennessee after the 1830 census, they left behind their son James Phillips and his wife, Mary Martha Rutledge. Accompanying Lazarus was his son, Terrell and family. They traveled south to Jacinto, Tishomingo County, Mississippi. Their travel time was three or four days by wagon going through what is now Shiloh National Battle Field. The farm land was much different. They moved from subsistence farming and cotton to cane sugar cultivation. Tishomingo County is hilly and forested, but Tippah County directly west is farm land and Alcorn County which insinuates itself between the two in the northern half of these two counties is much better farm land. General Nathan Bedford Forrest had a large cane plantation in Tippah County in 1850.

In the summer of 1833 Lazarus, unaccompanied, returned to Henderson County and died there as reported in a letter in the Katherine Reynolds collection in Houston, Texas. The letter writer refers to Uncle Lazarus but gives no specific details as to his death.

In the 1840 census of Tishomingo County Rachel Phillips is reported in the household of Silas Cheek. The Cheeks also were inhabitants of Chatham County, North Carolina. Rachel is in the 1845 Territorial and State Census Tishomingo with the notation 1-3 (1 male - 3 females in household). According to Katherine Reynolds' 3 generation FGS Rachel Sanders was born in 1775 and died between 1850 and 1860. Lazarus was also a direct ancestor of Katherine Reynolds, hence her

interest. Rachel was 58 years old when Lazarus died in 1833, in 1845 was 70 years old and in 1850 was 75 years old.

In the 1850 census of Tishomingo County there is reported

Lydia was a known daughter of Lazarus and Rachel.

Perhaps the census taker was confused, but there is in the 1845 census a Mary Phillips 4-4 (4 males - 4 females). At any rate the 10-year age differential in House #320 and the known age of our

Rachel certainly points to an error. There was another Phillips family in Tishomingo County when Lazarus went there. He was much more affluent.

Then we have another problem. In the Tishomingo, Mississippi Marriage Bonds and Ministers' Returns January 1842 - February 1861 is reported the marriage of Henry Taylor and

Rachel Phillips M. November 11, 1857 Surety: John H. Rinehart. If this were our Rachel Phillips, she would be 77 years old. It is a possible marriage, but unrealistic:

In the 1860 census this is clarified. In H/H #1576-Jacinto
Taylor Henry 21 GA
Rachel 20 MS
Edmond 4/12 MS

Rachel Taylor nee Phillips is not the elder wife of Lazarus. She would probably be a daughter of Terrell Phillips after he moved to Tishomingo. Henry was age 18 and Rachel age 17 at this marriage.
