

man, Iuka started the first door-to-door pickup of garbage and door-to-door local mail service was begun. The city also obtained its very first police car for the city. Thorne served as the head of the street department; which was very fitting since he could remember when all the streets in uptown Iuka were still gravel.

In the early 80's Mr. Thorne got involved with helping decorate Mineral Springs Park for Christmas, and he still helps as much as he can. Local people, along with the city people, started this continuing tradition. At first there was no electricity in the park, and the first underground electrical lines were laid so that the areas on both sides of the diagonal sidewalk could be decorated.

New electrical outlets and additional lighting have been installed this year to aid in making the park even more user (decorator) friendly. Mr. Thorne has had to slow down in helping with the decorations for the last two years because of his health.

Diddler Thorne and his wife, Virginia, continue to try to make their hometown a better place to live in and look at. It is with great pleasure that Iuka honors Diddler Thorne as the 2002 Grand Marshall of the Iuka Christmas Parade.

An uninsured driver who is being sued for causing an accident will have to hire a defense attorney for the lawsuit. If he or she is found liable for causing damages to the suing party, a judgment will be entered by the court for a specific sum of money. The amount of this judgment will be based on the extent of the damage proved in the lawsuit. This could be a considerable amount, depending on the extent of the damage and the severity of the injuries. If the liable party is unable to pay the full amount of the judgment, the party who obtained the judgment becomes a creditor and could institute legal proceedings to collect the money.

Getting The Red Out

Many people concerned about red or "bloodshot" eyes, particularly since we are exposed to a great deal of advertising that implies that red eyes are a common and significant problem. The fact is that we all have small blood vessels in the membrane that covers the white of our eyes. In some people they are more pronounced than in others, making their eyes look redder. Your eyes can also become redder than is normal for you as a result of smoking, late hours, air pollutants, drinking, or long, strenuous use. In such cases, eliminating the cause will eliminate the problem.

There are no over-the-counter medicines that you need ever buy for red eyes. Such drops contain very weak decongestants, which constrict your eye blood vessels slightly for a few minutes - and nothing more. Either you do not need any medication at all for your eyes or you have a medical eye problem, in which case you need your doctor's advice and need a prescription from him.



Types Of Crowns

A crown is made of gold, other metals, or porcelain. It can also be made of resin or porcelain and metal. When choosing a crown, think about how it will look and how long it will last. Talk with your dentist about the type of crown that may be best for you.

Metal Crown - This crown is made of gold or other metals. It is very strong and won't break. Because this type isn't tooth-colored, it may not be the best choice for a front tooth.

Tooth-colored Crown - A tooth-colored crown is made of porcelain or reinforced resin. It comes in a range of shades to blend with your other teeth. This type of crown may be more likely to chip than a metal crown.

Combination Crown - Porcelain is fused on top of metal, making this crown appear tooth-colored. The metal at its base makes the crown stronger than a porcelain or resin crown. But it is not as strong as a metal crown.

level of immunity against

any of the preventable diseases has to be established by individual blood tests. Iuka Hospital Offers Diabetes Education Services

An estimated 17 million Americans have diabetes, a disease in which the body does not produce or properly respond to insulin. While an estimated 11.1 million have been diagnosed, almost 6 million more are unaware they have the dis-

Insulin is a hormone needed to convert sugar, starches and other food into energy needed for daily life. Over time, high blood sugar levels can severely damage the heart, blood vessels, kidneys, eyes and nerves. The cause of diabetes continues to be a mystery, but both genetics and factors such as obesity and lack of exercise appear to play roles.

"Diabetes is a chronic disease for which there is no cure," said Mary Ann Eley, a pharmacist with Iuka Hospital. "It is up to each individual to take the best care possible to avoid complications."

Iuka Hospital sponsors a Diabetes Support Group that meets the first Tuesday of each month for individuals with diabetes and their families. "Each quarter, the hospital also hosts a two-day intensive training Eley said. course," "Participants learn such skills as meal planning, blood sugar monitoring, medications and exercise to help better manage their diabetes."
