Sheriff's Department Arrests luka Man On Fraud Charges

An Iuka man was arrested during the early morning hours Friday by a Sheriff's Department deputy while trying to fraudulently withdraw money from a Burnsville bank's Automated Teller Machine.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff David Smith, a local resident reported to the First American National Bank that money was being withdrawn from an account by someone other than the account holder. A bank official then contacted Deputy John David Murphy at the Sheriff's Department and informed him that money had been withdrawn from the bank's Burnsville branch ATM.

Deputy Murphy passed on \$20,000 bond.

this information to Deputy Scott Woodruff who watched the location during the time the suspect had been withdrawing the money on previous mornings.

At approximately 5:30 a.m. Friday, Deputy Woodruff arrested John R. Lovelace, 23, of Hwy. 25, luka, (formerly of Hwy. 365 Burnsville). According to the sheriff, the man was attempting to take more cash from the ATM when Officer Woodruff apprehended him.

Lovelace has been charged with four counts of false I.D. and four counts of fraudulently obtaining goods. At press-time, he was being held in the Tishomingo County Jail on \$20,000 bond.







ASK YOUR DOCTOR Contributed by Diane Davis, CFNP

Q. Why doesn't my twoyear-old son's pediatrician seem very concerned when he has a fever?

A. The definition of fever is body temperature more than 100.4 F (38.0 C) rectally; 100 F. (37.8 C) orally; or 99 F (37.2 6) axillary (under the arm). Infections are the most common cause of and most of these infections are viral. Fever by itself is not an illness. It is a sign that the body is fighting infection. In fact, a low-grade fever probably kills some of the invading viruses or bacteria. Your son's doctor is looking at other signs and symptoms along with the

The principal reason for treating fever is relief of discomfort. Medications to reduce fever do not alter the course or duration of a disease but could mask signs and symptoms of a serious disease and confuse the clinical pic-

Most doctors and nurse practitioners agree that medicines to reduce fever should be given in the following situations:

a) Fevers of 103 F or

b) Child has a history of febrile seizures

c) Children with chronic severe disorders

d) Children who are unable to rest due to fever dis-

LET THERE BE LIGHT

Proper illumination can be a big factor in helping to prevent eyestrain. The eyes need adequate lighting in order to see well, and we usually need more light as we get older. If you work at a desk, use a 100-watt light bulb in a floor lamp, or a 20-watt fluorescent bulb in a desk lamp. These provide more light than a ceiling fixture.

If possible, arrrange the light so that it comes over your shoulder onto your work. Of course, the rest of the office should be well lit also to elimate contrasts and resulting eyestrain.

Another way to avoid eyestrain is to rest your eyes occasionally. If you've been pounding away at the typewriter, or doing bookwork, look off at a distant object for a while. This allows the crystalline lens, which has been in a convex posture, to assume its normal relaxed posture, giving your focussing mechanism much needed rest. If these measures still result in eye fatigue, then it's time to see your family optometrist.

A dream has come true! when Afton Weaver Minga as just a senior in high school, the wrote a short story and read in front of her English class. love was born. She found hat she loved to write, and she reamed—even when she was rill in high school that one day he would write a book.

Today, after many years, er dream is a reality, and she able to hold her published ovel in her hands.

Afton Minga is the author of gaindrops and Sawdust-her ook that she has been working for some fifty years.

In her own words:

The year was 1942 and World War II was raging. I Afton) was fifteen (sixteen in March of that year) and a senior Amory, MS, High School. In my English class one day, the reacher's homework assignment for the students was to write a short story. The next day, to my complete surprise, I was selected by the teacher to read my story to the class as an example of how a short story should be written. That was the beginning of my abiding dream to be a writer some day. Up until then, my writing had only included a limited amount of poetry. However, it was not until 1971 that the dream would begin to materialize. In the time-span between graduation from high school and 1971, life was too involved to include

I went to work on the date I received my high school diploma as Secretary to the Superintendent of Amory City Schools. In October 1942, I resigned to accept an office position at a wartime shell loading

In 1944 I moved to Memphis, TN, to obtain some added business training at Draughon's Business College. I was embloyed by radio station WMPS when I met Tom Minga, my husband to be.

Afton Minga is holding a copy of her newly published book, Raindrops and Sawdust, an endeavor that she has been working on since 1971.

According to Afton, she and Tom reared two children to be grown and married. Some additional endeavors during this same time span for Afton were to complete two and one-half years at Memphis State University, serve as a church librarian for thirteen years, and teach adult Sunday School.

In the meantime, another aspiration had surfaced for her. She not only wanted to write a novel, but she wanted it to have a Christian influence—to be a witness to the saving power of Jesus Christ. Her heart's desire was to tell individuals who had made terrible mistakes in their lives, or committed horrendous crimes (such as, murder, adultery, or doubting the goodness of God) that they could be forgiven if they repented and accepted Christ as their Savior. She wanted to use her book to do this. She took pen in hand and began writing her novel in

From 1971 until the early 1980's Afton's life was filled with monumental challenges. First, in 1971, Tom bought property on Pickwick Lake and soon thereafter started building their retirement home. That was the same year their first grandson was born. In 1972, they became involved in summer mission work, sponsored by Iuka Baptist Church, at Coleman State Park. In 1976 Tom

In the following years there were frequent visits from family and five grandchildren, especially during summer vacations. However, Afton didn't give up on her dream this time. The setting and time period of her novel was Civil War days-and this required extensive research. She would often set the alarm for 3:00 a.m. in order to have some quiet time to work.

One morning in the 1980's, Tom awoke to hear her calling his name. She was kneeling by the side of his bed with tears trickling down her cheeks. "Tom," she sniffed, "I've finished my book."

Then came the frustrating years of not being able to get it published. Finally, she came to the conclusion that maybe God didn't want her to publish the book. After asking several Christian friends to read it and give her their honest opinions, she was provided with some much needed relief from that anxiety. Occasionally, she would mail it to another publisher—only to receive another rejection. Finally, after years of trying and failure, totally discouraged, she prayed: "All right, Lord, if it's not your will, then I give it up completely. If you want this book published, then you will have to send someone to me." (Afton had taken the time to have her book copyrighted.)

A month or two later, she received a letter from 1stBooks Library Publishers in Bloomington, IN. After checking with the Chamber of Commerce and the Better Business Bureau regarding 1stBooks' credibility, she signed a contract with

Although the plot of Raindrops and Sawdust and the characters are fictional, a vast majority of the personal problems they encountered, along with the devastating results experienced, are taken from reallife situations that have taken

Afton says that through her book she hopes people will realize that no matter what we do in life, God forgives us when we turn to Him.

Afton still lives at the lake with her husband, Tom, and both of them can be found at any Iuka Baptist Church service. Afton continues to work as a Church Librarian. Afton says the Lord and Tom are responsible for the publishing of Raindrops and Sawdust.
