## The Next Step In Diagnosing Heart Disease

Digital Diagnostic Imaging is a new service being offered at The Segars-Glynn Clinic in Iuka. When the results of a treadmill are positive or when a person is not able to walk a treadmill, the next step is nuclear scanning. By injecting a harmless radioactive material, the circulation to the heart can be evaluated. This would determine the presence of heart disease and if the disease can be treated medically or if surgery is required. A board certified cardiologist reads these tests the same day. 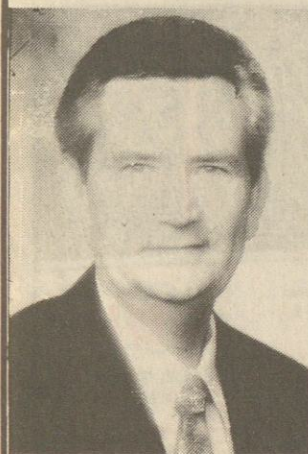

Toxic Hazards

It is sometimes said that because cats are finicky eaters they are less easily poisoned than dogs. However, with their curiosity and fastidious grooming, intoxication is unfortunately, not uncommon. Several factors predispose cats to becoming ill once they have been exposed to even a small amount of a poisonous substance. These include their small body size, their ability to hide so that exposure is not immediately evident, and because they lack certain liver enzymes necessary to decontaminate certain chemicals. It is because of these factors that when cats become poisoned they are less likely to recover than dogs.

How can a cat become poisoned?

Cats can be poisoned via a number of routes. Contamination of the digestive system can result from the direct ingestion of a toxic substance, ingestion of poisoned prey, or from grooming contaminated fur. Some toxins can even be absorbed through the skin of the cat (particularly the paws), and a few can gain entry in inhalation.

What clinical signs might warn me that my cat may have been poisoned?

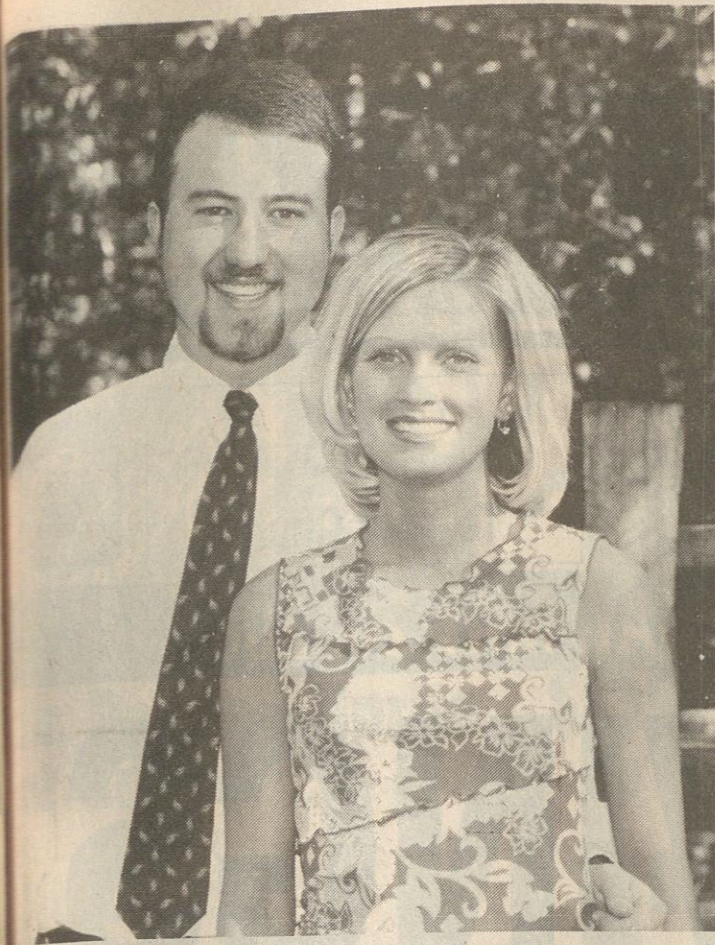
The clinical signs are variable and will depend on the particular poison concerned. Many toxins produce gastrointestinal signs (vomiting and diarrhea), others produce neurological signs (tremors, incoordination, seizures, excitability, depression, or coma), respiratory signs (coughing, sneezing, difficulty breathing), skin signs (inflammation, swelling), liver failure (jaundice, vomiting) or kidney failure (increased drinking, inappetence and weight loss). Some toxins act on more than one body system, and can produce any combination of the above signs. It is important to remember that while most cases of intoxication will cause acute problems, chronic intoxication can also arise, and often prove even more difficult to recognize and treat.

I think my cat has been poisoned, what should I do?

If you suspect your cat may have had access to a poisonous substance, it is important that it be taken to a veterinary hospital as soon as possible. If the cat is fractious it is usually best to wrap it in a towel and place it in a box to prevent it from hurting itself or you. This also prevents the cat from ingesting further contamination from its coat. It is NOT advisable to try to make the cat vomit since the cat may become asphyxiated (choke) or vomit. It is best to call the veterinary practice to tell them that you are coming and give them time to prepare any treatment your cat may need.

## Rabies Clinics Planned For Tishomingo County

Public health officials would like to remind pet owners that pets need their vaccinations, too. On Saturday, May 17, 2003, pet owners in Tishomingo County can get their dogs and cats vaccinated against rabies at several locations:

10 a.m. - North Crossroads Fire Department

11:30 a.m. - Berea Community, Old Bent and Dent Store.

Licensed veterinarians will administer the rabies vaccine for \$5 for each dog or cat. For safety, all animals must be on a leash or in a pet carrier. Mississippi state law requires the rabies vaccination to be given by a licensed veterinarian to all dogs and cats over three months of age, again at one year of age, and at least every three years thereafter.

The Mississippi State De-

partment of Health, the Mississippi Veterinary Medical Association, and the Mississippi Board of Animal Health are working together to encourage rabies vaccination of as many dogs and cats as possible in order to prevent spread of the disease.

The rabies virus continues to be identified in domestic and wild animals in the states that border Mississippi. According to health officials, 1965 was the last time rabies was identified in a Mississippi land animal such as a dog, cat, raccoon or fox; but, Mississippi continues to see at least two rabid bats on an annual basis - evidence that rabies is present in the state.

## U.S. Department Of Agriculture Farm Service Agency Consolidated Farm & Rural Development Act Authorizes Designation Of Tish. County To Receive FSA Disaster Loan Applications

Emergency loans for farmers, ranchers, and operators are available through the Tishomingo County Office of the Farm Service Agency, Harold Mills, FSA Farm Loan Manager, said today.

Mr. Mills said this authority is pursuant to President Bush's declaration on April 14, 2003, of a major disaster in Tennessee, caused by severe storms and flooding that occurred from February 14 through February 26, 2003. As a result of this disaster, Tishomingo County as a contiguous county in Mississippi is named as an area eligible for Federal Disaster assistance pursuant to Section 321 (a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act.

Applications for assistance in the disaster-stricken county will be accepted by FSA through December 14, 2003, on EM Disaster Designation #1456, Amendment #1.

Farmers qualifying for emergency loans may borrow up to 100 percent of their actual production loss or the amount needed to restore their operation to its pre-disaster condition, whichever is less. The new emergency loan and outstanding principal balance of any existing emergency loan owed by the applicant or any individual member of an entity cannot exceed \$500,000.00.

FSA emergency loans cover losses from designated disasters and are made to qualified farmers who cannot obtain credit from other lenders in the local area.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture, (USDA) prohibits

This wall commemorates his great-great-grandmother, Te-lah-nay, the only Indian woman known to have returned to her homeland alone and on foot. Mister Hendrix will be the guest speaker at the Friends lunch break on Tuesday.

## Voices from the Misty Past

In the Northwest corner of Alabama, a few miles south of the Alabama/Tennessee state line, there is a commemorative stonewall bordering the Natchez Trace Parkway. It was built (and is being built) by the guest speaker at the Friends' lunch break on Tuesday, May 20 at 12 noon. His name is Tom Hendrix, builder and author of *If the Legends Fade*.

Tom's book is based on fact. It's the story of a Yuchi Indian girl named Te-lah-nay, which means "Woman with the Dancing Eyes." She was born 'above the shoulderbone' in the valley of the Tennessee River in the 1800s and was forcibly taken from her home when her tribe was removed to the Indian Nations in Oklahoma.

The Yuchi people called the Tennessee River the "Singing River" because they believed that the river con-

tained a young woman who sang beautiful songs. When Te-lah-nay reached Oklahoma, the rivers and streams there were silent, and she knew she must return to her homeland and the Singing River.

If the Legends Fade, who will tell the story? Te-lah-nay had a recurring dream where her grandmother beckoned to her from a hill overlooking the Singing River. Alone and on foot, this young girl, 'a daughter of the Sun' undertook the arduous journey to return home.

Tom has been working on the commemorative stone wall for 13 years. Charlie Two Moons, a spiritual person, walked the length of the wall and told Tom, "When they come, some will ask, 'Why does it bend, and why is it higher and wider in some places than in others?' Tell them it is like (Te-lah-nay's)

journey, and their journey through life—it is never straight."

Te-lah-nay's great-great-grandson inherited this marvelous story and carries on her powerful tradition. His name is Tom Hendrix, builder of the wall, writer of the book and guest speaker at the Friends of the Iuka Library lunch break on Tuesday.

This is more than just a talk and a book signing. The flutist David Walton will accompany Tom Hendrix's presentation of this inspiring story of the only Indian woman known to have returned to her homeland alone and on foot.

Mollie lived in our house and was a wonderful friend and companion to our son, Alex. She went outside only to use the bathroom or when we were outside, too. She was not allowed to run freely throughout the neighborhood. When we went for a walk, she was on a leash.

Mollie may or may not have been the target of the poisoner. It doesn't really matter. It doesn't really matter that

Mollie was a valuable dog and that we'll have to travel hundreds of miles and pay up to a thousand dollars to replace her. The vet bill doesn't even matter. What matters is a little boy who can't understand why his dog got sick and who still thinks she's coming home.

You may be thrilled to be rid of the gorgeous black Giant who lived near you, but you didn't see the tears this family cried while their beloved dog suffered and you didn't have to answer a 4-year-old boy's questions about where his dog is now. You didn't see that little boy kneeling on the floor next to the cage at the vet, begging Mollie to get up, praying for her, telling her she would be all right. We wanted to keep the concept of death away from our son as long as possible, but because of your selfish act of cruelty, he's had to face it at a very young age. Thanks a lot.
