Mrs. Florence Smith Celebrated 105th Birthday on June 2, 2003

Iuka City officials, Police Officer Anita Mitchell, Mayor Jackie Bryant, and Police Chief Randy Stringer presented Mrs. Florence Smith with flowers and a certificate in observance of her 105th birthday.

Mrs. Florence Smith of 1515 Indian Creek Road in Iuka celebrated her 105th birthday on Monday, June 2, 2003.

She was born on June 2, 1898, to Josephine Brown and Nelson Coman, who provided her with three brothers and one sister. Mrs. Smith now lives with her daughter, Susie Rutland, and one of her granddaughters, Gloria Coman.

Miss Florence moved to Cherokee, AL, when she married the late Jessie Neil Smith, and they had four children. Their children were the late William Smith, John Robert Smith, who now lives in Cincinnati, OH; Evelyn Thompson, who lives in Brooklyn, NY, and Susie Rutland, who lives here with her mom in Iuka. There are 19 grandchildren, 26 great grandchildren and 13 great-great-

grandchildren in the family.

In later years she returned to Iuka where she had grown up. She still lives near "the homeplace."

Miss Florence has told her children and great-grandchildren many stories about activities concerning her life. She has recounted stories about the one-room school she attended near her home and

about using a rub-board to wash clothes. She washed and ironed clothes for the public to help make a living. Much to the delight of surrounding neighbors, she sang Christmas carols when she worked. Also of importance to Miss Florence was her attendance and serving as a Sunday School teacher at First Missionary Baptist Church.

She is currently the church's oldest living member.

According to granddaughter, Gloria Coman, her primary caregiver, Mrs. Smith spent her birthday dozing and watching television. However, she had been wide awake the night before—probably in anticipation of a history-making birthday.

Forgery Check Scam Halted Iuka PD Arrests Four in Two State Scam

According to Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer, a large forgery check scam has been brought to a halt. Four have been arrested to halt the two-state check scam operation.

Arrested in connection with the scam operation were Kayla Lynn Russell, 04-24-86, Red Bay, AL; Tracy Lynn Crosslin, 05-16-74, 170 Honer Rd, Hazel Green, AL; George Louis Cook, Jr., 06-19-83, 100th Ave., Red Bay, AL, and Gaylon Wesley Parker, 11-19-81, 100 6th Ave., Red Bay, AL.

The Iuka Police Department had been working with the Red Bay Police Department on this scam operation.

On Saturday, May 22, Iuka Policemen Jay Moyers and Jason Rickman arrested three people—Russell, Crosslin, and Cook—in the Wal-Mart parking lot in Iuka. The three had entered Wal-Mart and purchased items using a counterfeit check.

All three were arrested and charged with uttering a forged

instrument. They were transported and held in the Tishomingo County Jail.

Upon further investigation officers from the Red Bay Police Department were able to search the apartment of one of these suspects, where they recovered 35 to 40 checks already made out for several thousand dollars.

Still further investigation by Red Bay Police led to the arrest of Gaylon Wesley Parker. Parker was making checks on his computer. According to Red Bay Police Chief Boatrite, Parker was arrested and charged with 13 counts of forgery.

Iuka Police Chief Stringer urges everyone to use caution when accepting checks because computer generated checks are fairly easily made. The public needs to be very careful about checks. Check ID names, DOB, and the amount of the payroll checks, and familiarity of businesses/companies that issue checks in the area.

Local Man Dies From Wasp Sting

Michael Ray Dishman, 40, a resident of the South Crossroads Community, died Sunday, June 1, 2003, at the Iuka Hospital following a wasp sting at his home.

Dishman had been watching television Sunday evening when he was apparently stung by a black wasp.

According to a witness, Dishman swatted the wasp and jumped up from his chair and stepped on the wasp. He, then soon, began suffering respiratory distress. A call to 9-1-1 was made, and an ambulance was dispatched. Mr. Dishman was transported to the Iuka Hospital.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner, Mack Wilemon, Dishman was unresponsive upon arrival at the hospital after apparently suffering the symptoms of anaphylaxis. (Anaphylaxis is the often severe and sometimes fatal systemic reaction in a susceptible individual upon exposure to a specific antigen after previous sensitization.) It is characterized by respiratory symptoms, fainting, and itching. Coroner Wilemon ruled Dishman's

death as accidental due to an insect sting.

Michael Dishman was a native of Virginia and a construction worker for 20 years. His survivors include: one daughter Amber Lynn Dishman of Aurora, IL; two sons Dave Dishman of Geneva, IL, and Ryan Dishman of Midway; his father Ralph Dishman and his wife Charlene of Belmont; his mother Shelby Lawson of Geneva, IL; one sister Debbie Dishman of Geneva IL; two brothers Steve Dishman of St. Charles, IL and Richard Dishman of San Diego, CA; and his companion Elaine Tippit of Midway.

Pallbearers will be Randall Credille, Earl Credille, and Daniel Credille. Services will be held on June 7 at 1:00 p.m. at Deaton Funeral Home in Belmont with Bro Ed Kinder officiating. Burial will be in Belmont City Cemetery.

Visitation will be on Friday from 6 until 9 p.m. and until service time on Saturday. Deaton Funeral Home of Belmont is in charge of the arrangements.

Legal Update

OLD ENOUGH TO KNOW BETTER?

Because young children do not understand risks the way adults do, the same standards of care expected of adults cannot be applied to minors when assessing legal liability for the accidents they cause. Very young children are generally not held liable for accidental injuries they cause because they are too young to understand that they have been careless. Their parents or legal guardians, however, might be held liable for their negligence in failing to control the child. Once children are old enough to know right from wrong, they can be held liable for the intentional injuries they cause. Older children are generally held liable for negligent conduct if they do not behave as carefully as other children their age.

After determining that another person's negligence has caused injury, the issue becomes infinitely more complicated if the negligent person happens to be a minor. Consulting a legal professional is essential in a matter like this. About Oral Piercing

Oral piercing involving the tongue, lips or cheeks has become a popular practice. Many side effects, ranging from discomfort to serious health hazards, can result from these procedures. Anyone thinking about oral piercing should consider whether the benefits outweigh the risks.

Oral piercing is usually done without anesthetic. In tongue piercing, a needle is used to insert a barbell-shaped piece of jewelry through the middle of the tongue. At first a temporary, oversized piece of jewelry is used to accommodate swelling. After several weeks, a barbell is inserted into the hole and a ball is screwed onto the stem. If no complications develop, healing takes four to six weeks.

Patient-Doctor Communication

During an eye examination, you expect the optometrist to ask about the nature of your visual complaint, but you should also be prepared to answer a number of other relevant questions - particularly on a first visit.

The nature of your occupation, for instance, may help to determine how you use your eyes. It is also possible that your eye problem or symptoms might be job-related. Furthermore, the final lens prescription should take your job into consideration.

You should also expect general health questions. Certain physical conditions can, and do, affect your vision. Remember to mention all medications you are taking. Some drugs have side reactions which may affect your eyes. It might be good to prepare a list at home with all the names and dosages. Certain eye conditions are hereditary, and you should not be reluctant to provide your optometrist with the relevant family information.

Canine Whipworms

What are whipworms?

Whipworms are intestinal parasites which are about 1/4 inch (6 mm) long. They live in the cecum and colon of dogs where they cause severe irritation to the lining of those organs. This results in watery, bloody diarrhea, weight loss, and general debilitation. They are one of the most pathogenic worms found in dogs.

How did my dog get whipworms?

Whipworms pass microscopic eggs in the stool. The eggs are very resistant to drying and heat so they can remain viable in the dog's environment for years. They mature and are able to reinfect the dog in 10-60 days. The eggs are swallowed and return to the lower intestinal tract to complete the life cycle.

How is whipworm infection diagnosed?

Whipworms are diagnosed by finding eggs with a microscopic examination of the stool. However, multiple samples are often required because these parasites pass small numbers of eggs on an irregular basis. Any dog with chronic diarrhea can be reasonably suspected to have whipworms regardless of several negative stool examinations. It is an accepted practice to treat chronic diarrhea by administering a whipworm dewormer. Response to treatment is an indication that whipworms were present but could not be detected on fecal examination.

How are whipworms treated?

There are several drugs that are very effective against whipworms. Two treatments are needed at a 3-4 week interval, because reinfection is such a problem, it is advisable to treat again every 3-4 months or to put the dog on a heartworm preventive product that contains an ingredient that prevents infection with whipworms. Whipworms are not nearly as common today because of widespread use of these heartworm preventive products.

Can I get whipworms from my dog?

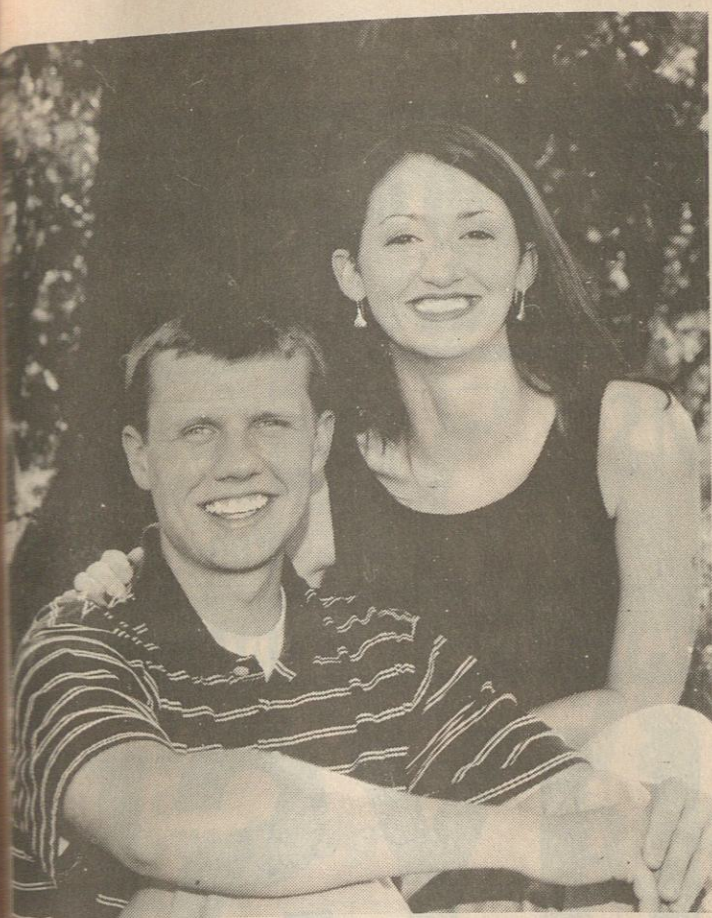

After the honeymoon they will reside in Oxford, Mississippi.

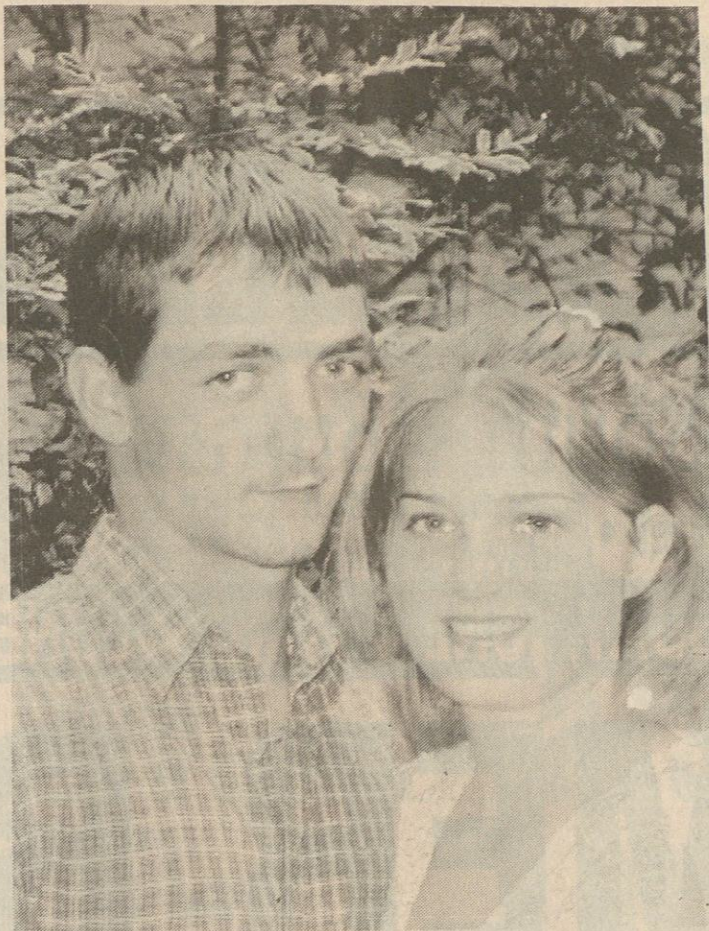
Project Homestead

apy or other causes are also at higher risk.

At the moment, there is no effective treatment for West Nile disease. A vaccine is years away. But you can protect yourself and your family from West Nile virus by eliminating places where mosquitoes breed and by protecting skin from mosquito bites when outdoors.

To reduce mosquito populations around your home:

- Keep rain gutters clean and free of standing water.
- Don't allow water to accumulate for more than a few days in any container, including bird baths, dog bowls, swimming pool covers, saucers under potted plants, wading pools and wheelbarrows.

The most effective way to reduce mosquito bites is to remain inside when mosquitoes are most active - at dusk and throughout the evening. If you go outdoors, wear mosquito repellent on exposed skin.

Deet is generally acknowledged to be the most effective mosquito repellent available. It has been used by millions of people worldwide for decades, and it's considered safe when used according to directions, says Consumer Reports. Non-deet repellents, some using plant oils such as citronella, soybean and coconut, provide little if any protection.

In areas affected by West Nile virus, the risk of adverse effects from deet, including minor

skin reactions, is almost certainly much lower than the risk of catching the potentially devastating disease.

To use deet safely, use it correctly:

- Don't use a stronger product than you need. Products with higher concentrations of deet may be appropriate for adults for prolonged protection in an area where bugs are known to carry disease. Lower concentrations of deet may offer adequate protection for short outings or low-risk situations.
- Follow the application instructions on the product. Using more than the specified amount won't give you extra protection but may increase your risk.
- Don't apply deet near eyes

or mouth, or on broken skin.

- Don't apply deet under clothing.
- When you come back inside, wash the repellent off your skin.
- Take precautions with young children. Don't apply deet to infants under 2 months of age. Don't let a young child apply or handle the product, and don't apply repellent on a child's hands. Experts say deet concentrations of up to 30 percent are safe for adults and for children over the age of 2 months.

All problems become smaller if you don't dodge them, but confront them. Touch a thistle timidly, and it pricks you; grasp it boldly, and its spine crumbles.

Protect Your Family Against West Nile Virus

The threat of West Nile virus is heating up in Mississippi and across the country as people spend more time working and playing outdoors. Carried by mosquitoes, West Nile virus can infect humans, birds and animals.

Last summer more than 10,000 cases of West Nile virus were reported in 39 states, including Mississippi, reports Consumer Reports magazine. A total of 274 victims died, and many others were left with seemingly permanent disabilities, including a polio-like paralysis, severe muscle aches and overwhelming fatigue, the magazine reports.

Of the 190 Mississippians infected with the virus in 2002, 12 died, according to the Mississippi State Department of Health Web site.

Public health officials estimate that 80 percent of people infected with the virus have no symptoms and never know they've had it. Almost all the rest come down with a syndrome called West Nile fever: a fever accompanied by headache, weakness and sometimes nausea or a skin rash. Most people recover in a few days and presumably have long-term immunity to the virus.

Battle of Brice's Crossroads Reenactment June 7-8

Soldiers, sutlers and craftsmen from several states will camp and reenact the Battle of Brice's Crossroads on June 7-8 at the battlefield near Baldwin.

In celebration of the 139th anniversary of the Battle of Brice's Crossroads, a living history encampment and reenactment will be staged all day Saturday and Sunday. The battlefield is located five miles west of Baldwin on Highway 370 west.

Public demonstrations on drill, weapons, tactics, camp life, artillery, cavalry and infantry will begin at 10 a.m. on Saturday and continue until 3 p.m. when a tactical skirmish will be demonstrated. At 9 a.m. on Saturday, the Brice's Crossroads National Battlefield Commission will host a preservation dedication. The ceremony will include the preservation dedication of 560 acres in Lee, Prentiss and Union Counties. Guest speaker will be Jim Lightizer, president of the Civil War Preservation Trust. CWPT is America's largest battlefield preservation organization. The ceremony will be held directly across from the monument.

On Sunday, camps will open to the public at 10 a.m. and demonstrations will be presented thru 1 p.m. At 2 p.m., troops will form up for the Battle of Brice's Crossroads.

Visitors can tour the camps for a glimpse of 19th century military life. Sutlers, vendors of civil war era merchandise, will be on hand in period dress and era craftsmen will demonstrate blacksmithing, leather work, popcorn making and candle making.

The 7th Tennessee Cavalry, Co. D., a long established living history group composed of veteran reenactors host the event. They, along with many other groups who will participate recreate actual military units that fought with

distinction at Brice's Crossroads in June 1864. The Natchez Trace Parkway, which administers the one-acre site at Brice's, will have a representative on hand.

Also sponsoring the event are the Brice's Crossroads Museum Commission, the Battlefield Commission, the Baldwin Rotary Club and the City of Baldwin.

The Brice's Crossroads Visitor and Interpretive Center, located at 607 Grisham Street, adjacent to Highway 45 in Baldwin, will be open at 9 a.m. both days.

Admission is \$3 for adults and \$1 for children under 12 years of age. The event will be a bi-annual celebration of the confederate victory. Activities at the battlefield will be free to

the public.

Visitors traveling from south of Baldwin can exit at the Highway 348 west exit off Highway 45 at Guntown and travel north on the Cambelltown Road. Those traveling from north of Baldwin can take the Highway 370 west exit in Baldwin at the intersection of Highway 45 and 370.

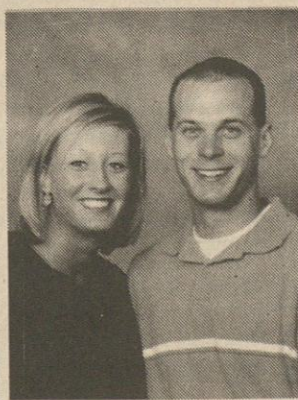
A 22-minute video introduced by Shelby Foote, civil war author and historian, is shown at the center. The permanent exhibit, entitled "Forrest's Finest Hour," interprets the battle and the personalities involved.

A temporary exhibit, containing items metal detected or excavated from area battlefields and campgrounds will be available for viewing. The items are loaned to the center by Dan Bailey of Guntown.

Ken Knopp, author of "Confederate Saddles and Horse Equipment" will be at the center both days to discuss and sign copies of his book and display rare Confederate horse equipment.

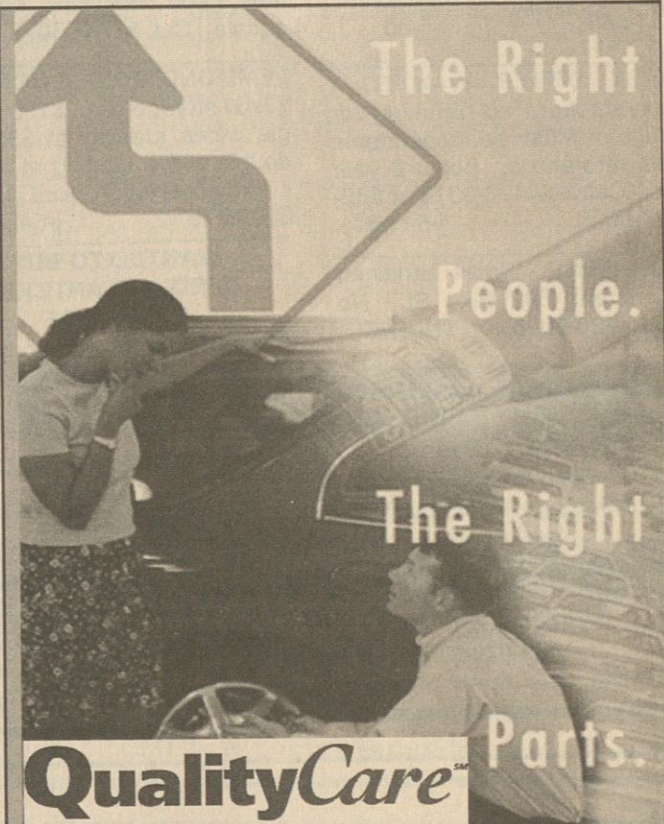

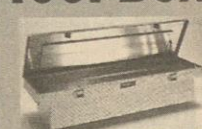
