## Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Officers Recover Stolen Merchandise and Seize Marijuana

Three Corinth residents have been arrested by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department in connection with the theft and sale of several items in both Mississippi and Alabama, according to Tishomingo County Sheriff David Smith.

The items, taken from the Lewis Hood residence at 32 CR 236, included an assortment of items such as figurines, pictures, weather vanes, decorative bottles, lights, tools, tree toppers, windmills, knives, commemorative knife sets, jacks, canister sets, vases, etc. Also taken were a Bronco and a 16-ft. trailer loaded with ladders and tools.

Sheriff Smith received information that a certain truck had been used in a theft, and the subsequent investigation

led to the three people involved.

Upon questioning by Tishomingo County Investigator, Donald Thomas, two people indicated they were involved and that there was another suspect. Arrested and charged were Shane Thomas Jackson and Sarah Poindexter of 7A CR 187, Corinth, and Michael Copening, also with a Corinth address.

According to Sheriff Smith, the three apparently went to the residence, loaded the merchandise into the Bronco and the truck. They then hooked a 16 ft. trailer loaded down with tools and ladders to the truck. Ms. Poindexter apparently served as a watch person while the merchandise was being loaded.

The merchandise was taken to Winfield, AL, where they

rented a booth at a flea market and sold part of the merchandise. After leaving the flea market, those involved found an auction business just down the road where they sold more of the merchandise.

Later, they sold the 16-ft. trailer to a man in Columbus, MS. The trio indicated they collected approximately \$2,800 from selling the \$10,000-to-\$14,000 worth of merchandise. The remaining merchandise is stored at the Tishomingo County Jail.

Copenig and Jackson have been charged with burglary (of a vehicle and building other than a residence) and grand larceny, and Poindexter has been charged as an accessory before the fact. All three remain in the Tishomingo County jail on \$25,000 bond.

## 17 Marijuana Plants Found Near Belmont

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department received information last week that marijuana was being manufactured at a residence on Valley Road near Belmont.

Tishomingo County Deputies were sent to secure the area while a search warrant was prepared. When these

officers arrived at the residence, marijuana plants could be seen growing on the property.

According to Sheriff Smith, Deputy Scott Hyde arrested Robert Matthew Elrod, 33, of 37 Valley Road, Belmont for manufacturing marijuana.

Elrod signed a search re-

lease allowing the officers to continue to search, however, no more marijuana was found on the premises. Elrod did lead the officers to a site where he had planted seven more plants, making a total of 17 marijuana plants. Elrod has been released on \$5,000 bond.

## Sentencing for June Term of Circuit Court

During the June term of Circuit Court, presided over by the Honorable Sharon Aycock and the Honorable Thomas J. Gardner over twenty were sentenced. Those sentenced included:

\*Anthony Vesico pled guilty to 2 counts of burglary/larceny of a dwelling and 1 count of burglary/larceny of a vehicle. In the burglary/larceny of a building, he was sentenced to 20 years with 10 suspended and 10 to serve. In the burglary of a vehicle, he was sentenced to 7 years to run concurrently. He also received 5 years of PRS (post release supervision), was fined \$1,000, and ordered to pay restitution of \$840 to Kathy Shelton, and \$350 to Wayne Smith.

\*Charles Stephen Hester pled guilty to 2 counts of uttering a burglary (1 in Tishomingo County and 1 in Prentiss County). He was sentenced to 10 years with 7 suspended and 3 to serve. Both cases run concurrently. He was also ordered to pay restitution of \$1,265.60 to the check owners.

\*Anthony D. Tensley pled guilty to 5 years with 4 suspended and 1 to serve. He was placed on 3 years of PRS and fined \$750.

\*Dalvalin DeVon Green pled guilty to aggravated assault and

burglary/larceny of a vehicle. He was sentenced to 15 years with 10 suspended and placed on 5 years of PRS. He received 5 years to run concurrently with the burglary/larceny of a vehicle in Alcorn County. He was fined \$1,000.

\*Stanley K. Akers pled guilty to DUI III. He was sentenced to 5 years and placed on House Arrest. He also received 4 years of PRS and was fined \$2,000.

\*Candace D. Powers pled guilty to 3 counts of forgery. She was sentenced to 10 years and placed in the RID Program. She also received 5 years of probation. She was ordered to pay a \$500 fine and restitution of \$110 to Piggly Wiggly and \$175 to Butch Hatcher.

\*Wesley Wheeler pled guilty to DUI III. He was placed on House Arrest for 5 years with 4 years of PRS. He was fined \$2,000.

\*William McVey pled guilty to burglary/larceny of a dwelling. He was sentenced to 8 years, all suspended. He was also placed on 5 years of probation and ordered to pay a fine of \$500.

All of the above must pay court costs.

The following pled guilty in open court under non-adjudication and must adhere to the following conditions plus pay court costs:

\*Peggy Sue Franks was placed on 1 year of supervised probation, and was fined \$400.

\*Jeremy Huffman was placed on 5 years of supervised probation, must graduate from school, must submit semester grades, was fined \$500, and ordered to pay restitution of \$1,790.

\*Alicia Medlin received 3 years of supervised probation, must pay restitution of \$25, and was fined \$500.

\*Patricia Dilworth was placed on supervised probation for 3 years, must obtain her GED, and was fined \$500.

\*Joshua Crane was placed on 3 years of supervised probation, must remain in college and submit semester grades, was fined \$3,000 plus restitution of \$25.

\*Dennis M. Brown, Jr. was placed under supervised probation, must attend After Care program on a weekly basis, must enroll in college, was fined \$3,000 and ordered to pay restitution of \$25.

\*Jacob Rice was sent to the RID program, was placed on 4 years of PRS, fined \$1,000 each for 2 counts of grand larceny, and must pay restitution jointly with co-defendant, Micah Bivins.

\*Micah Bivins, charged with 2 counts of grand larceny, pled under MS Law 991526. He and co-defendant Jacob Rice, were ordered to pay restitution of \$10,890 to the Progressive Insurance Company, \$4,060 to Dr. Mitchell Massey, was fined \$1,000 each for 2 counts of grand larceny.

## Attention Tishomingo County Voters and Prospective Voters

Donna Henry Dill, Circuit Clerk, announces that she and members of the Tishomingo County Election Commission will be at different locations in the county June 23rd through June 30th to assist with any questions regarding Tishomingo County voting precincts and the upcoming elections.

There have been changes in people's voting locations throughout the county. These locations will give citizens a chance to discuss any concerns they may have at a location closer to home without having to drive to the courthouse. Maps will be on display for all voting precincts, supervisors' districts, state senator's and state representative's districts, and justice court and constable districts.

Anyone who has never registered to vote may also register at this time if they meet the following qualifications:

If they (1) have been a resident of Tishomingo County for at least 30 days; (2) are a citizen of the United States; (3) are 18 years of age or above (or will be 18 by the date of the General Election, 2003); and (4) have never been convicted

of any crime listed in Section 241, Mississippi Constitution of 1890.

## Civil Defense Emergency Management/Homeland Security Agency Receives Grant Money

The Tishomingo County Civil Defense Emergency Management/Homeland Security Agency has recently received four grants totaling \$61,688 to use to help keep Tishomingo County prepared for any type of disaster—chemical spills as the result of plane/train/truck crashes, bombings, terrorists attacks, biological

spills, etc.

Proceeds from the grants will be used to improve homeland security in Tishomingo County. These grant moneys have been used to secure the lease of a vehicle for the agency, updating radio equipment for First Responders, updating towers for communications, purchase of chemical res-

cue suits and masks, and respirators, and the purchase of a propane generator, plus other improvements.

The money will be used to upgrade all the local agencies that are the first on the scene after a disaster occurs.

All of these improvements are at no cost to the county.

## Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act Authorizes Designation of Tishomingo County To Receive FSA Disaster Loan Applications

Emergency loans for farmers, ranchers, and operators are available through the Alcorn County Office of the Farm Service Agency, Harold Mills, FSA Farm Loan Manager, said today.

Mr. Mills said this authority is pursuant to President Bush's declaration on May 19, 2003, of a major disaster in Tennessee, caused by severe storms, tornadoes, and flooding that occurred from May 4, 2003, and continuing. As a result of this disaster, Tishomingo County as a contiguous county in Mississippi is named as an area eligible for Federal Disaster Assistance pursuant to Section 321 (a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act.

Applications for assistance in the disaster-stricken county will be accepted by FSA through January 20, 2004, on EM

Disaster Designation M1464, Amendment #2.

Farmers qualifying for emergency loans may borrow up to 100 percent of their actual production loss or the amount needed to restore their operations to its pre-disaster condition, whichever is less. The new emergency loan and outstanding principal balance

of any existing emergency loan owned by the applicant or any individual member of an entity cannot exceed \$500,000.00.

FSA emergency loans cover losses from designated disasters and are made to qualified farmers who cannot obtain credit from other lenders in the local area.

The U. S. Department of

## Laxson Reunion...

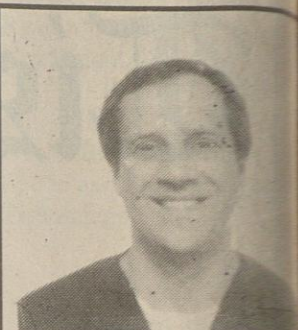
The descendants of J.O. and Ethel Laxson will hold their annual reunion the weekend of June 20-22, at the J.P. Coleman State Park.

## Risks Of Oral Piercing

Serious infections, such as hepatitis B and HIV, can be transmitted during oral piercings if the instruments have not been properly sterilized. Other risks include

### Pain and Bleeding

Because there are many blood vessels inside the tongue, piercing can cause prolonged bleeding. The nerve endings in your tongue and lips can cause severe pain in the pierced area.

In lip or cheek piercing, a cork is held inside the mouth to support the tissue as it is pierced with a needle. The needle is then replaced with a stud or hoop. Healing ranges from weeks to months.

## Vice Bonds

Continued From Last Week...

What are the clinical signs?

Tapeworms are particularly harmful to cats and few clinical signs are attributed to their presence. Usually, the cat is presented because of the owner's reaction to the presence of the crawling proglottids.

Rarely, tapeworms may cause debilitation or weight loss if they are present in large numbers. Also, a cat will occasionally scoot or drag its anus across the grass or carpet due to the irritation caused by the proglottids. However, this behavior is much more common in dogs than cats.

Occasionally, tapeworm will release attachment in the intestine and migrate to the stomach. When this happens, the cat may vomit an adult tapeworm several inches length.

How are tapeworms diagnosed?

Most common owners recognize that a cat has tapeworms and bring this to the attention of the veterinarian. When terminal segments of a tapeworm break off and pass into the cat's stool, they can be seen crawling on the surface of the feces. These proglottid segments look like grains of cooked white rice. Less commonly, they are seen crawling around the cat's anus. Because of these proglottid capsules, tapeworms are not readily diagnosed with routine fecal examination.

Because of this, you should notify your veterinarian when tapeworm segments are found in your cat's stool.

### AS REPORTED

If you were involved in an accident and a police officer responded at the scene, there was likely an accident report written up. In some cases, the police report will point to the fact that a driver violated a specific section of the Vehicle Code and that the violation contributed to the accident. It may even make mention of the fact that the officer issued a citation. In other cases, the responding officer may briefly note that there was negligent driving. In any case, if there is a police report that mentions a Vehicle Code violation or other evidence of careless driving, it can provide you with a great deal of support showing that the other driver was at fault.

The confusion and excitement that usually follows a car accident can make it difficult to rationally determine which steps to take. Remember to ensure that everyone involved is safe, to get the other driver's factual information, never to admit guilt, and to speak to your attorney immediately. 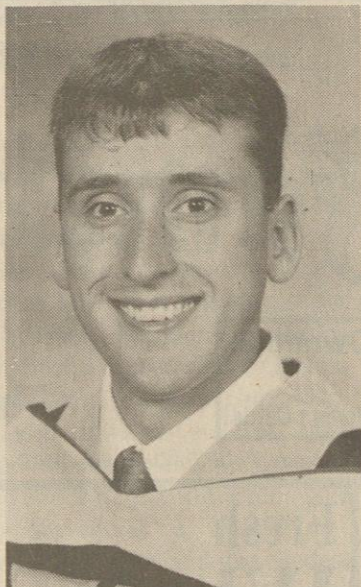
### Allison Green Graduates MS School For Mathematics & Science

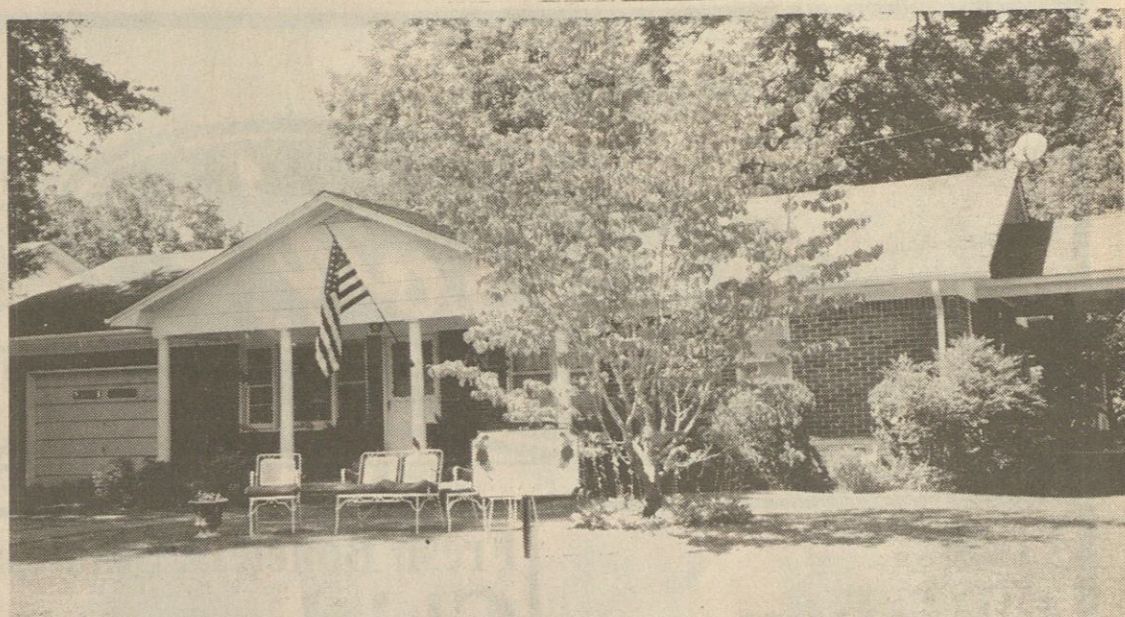

### Third Historical Ornament Available

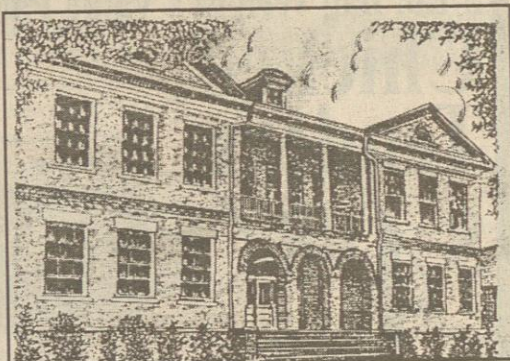
The Elizabeth Pyle Circle of Iuka United Methodist Church is taking orders on their third stained-glass Iuka Historic Commemorative ornament. Last year's sale of ornaments was very successful; so the group decided to continue the sale of these commemorative ornaments.

The third ornament in the series is "The Old Iuka High School." Built in 1910 for \$15,000, the Old Iuka High School served as the only school building until 1942. It was used as a classroom until 1960 at which time it was torn down and the present Iuka Middle School facility was built. The school was located on land originally owned by the Iuka Normal Institute, Mississippi's first Normal and one of the south's leading educational centers. Iuka Normal closed in 1902.

Proceeds from the sale will help fund the various service projects the circle undertakes in the community throughout the year.

The ornament is approximately 5"x 5" and the cost is \$20.00. For those requesting mail service, the ornament's cost is \$25.00, which includes shipping and handling.

The ornament is hand crafted by North Carolina artist, Tina Steenerson; and it is made using traditional stain glass materials and techniques. The ornament originated from a drawing done by the artist from old photographs of the school. After the drawing was transferred onto translucent white glass, it was hand tinted and kiln fired. The soldered lines with a copper patina were added.

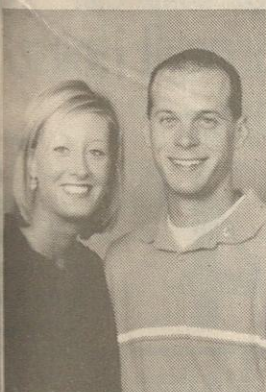

**KIDS HOME ALONE CAN EAT HEALTHY**

The school cafeteria may be closed for the summer, but children still need nutritious, balanced meals. With many parents and caretakers working full time, children are home alone for longer periods of time during the summer. While leaving children alone is not recommended, many parents must work and cannot afford childcare. The goal then becomes providing a safe, healthy environment in their absence.

One factor contributing to the level of obesity in our children is the high number of "latchkey kids" who prepare their own meals and cannot go outside to exercise because they are alone. Eliminating unhealthy foods and replacing them with nutritious options is the first step parents can take to help children make healthy food choices.

Kids like high-sugar, high-fat foods - cookies, cakes, chips, and soft drinks - and if they are available, kids will choose to eat them. Children don't need these unhealthy foods, and they drain the family's food budget. Parents can also prepare healthy meals to refrigerate before leaving the house for the day.

A healthy menu for children can be planned using the Good Guide Pyramid. The Pyramid, created by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, recommends daily consumption of six servings from the grain group, three vegetables, two fruits, two servings of milk or other dairy products, and two servings of lean meat. At the tip of the Pyramid is the fats and sweets category, which includes foods that should be eaten only on occasion. This is for children two to six years old. Older children should have the same food groups but more daily servings.

Healthy snack ideas for children include pre-washed, precut vegetables like baby carrots, celery sticks and cucumber slices coupled with low-fat dip. Containers of yogurt, fruit-juice Popsicle's, pretzels, whole-grain crackers and graham crackers are also good for snacking.

Kitchen safety is another health concern when children are home alone. Setting guidelines that are age- and maturity-appropriate is essential. Parents can teach children how to wash dishes correctly, use potholders, take lids off containers and clean up spills. The stove and microwave should not be used without parental supervision. Parents should consider rearranging the kitchen for the summer if kids will be home alone, placing often-used items within reach and moving dangerous objects out of reach.

Children also need at least one hour of exercise per day to be healthy. Without adult supervision, children should remain in the safety of their homes and not venture outside. Parents can teach children creative ways to use larger rooms to get some exercise. Providing children with soft-textured balls, jump ropes, an indoor bowling set or a small indoor trampoline will encourage movement and play.

After work hours, the whole family can engage in outdoor activities together, like going

on a walk, riding bicycles or going swimming. Exercising together keeps bodies healthy while providing quality time with family members.

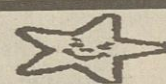

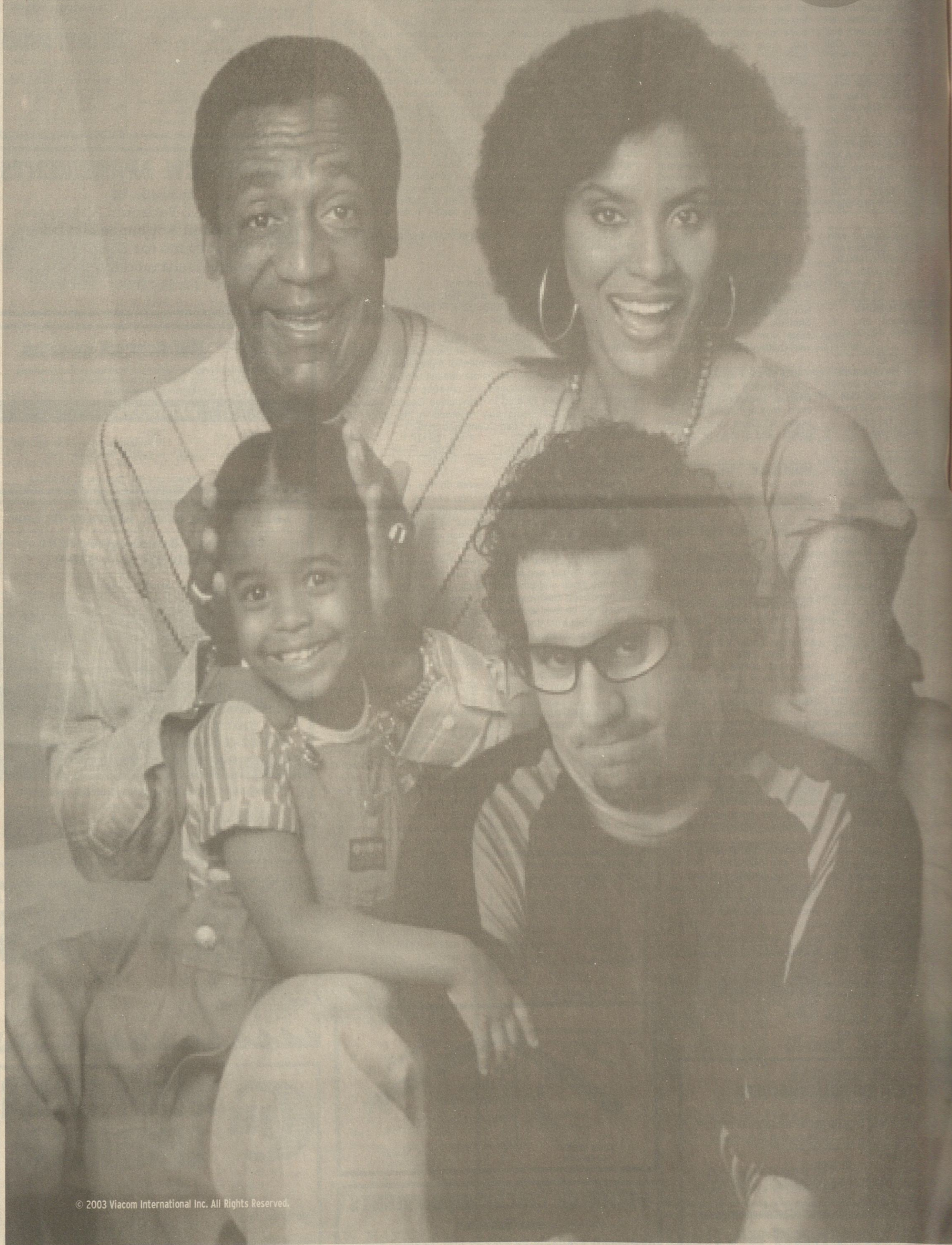
